Thrushes: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir
GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said
Colony, do hereby extend the provisions of "The
Destructive Birds and Animals Act, 1893," to
Starlings, Blackbirds, and Thrushes.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place: AND WHEREAS that fearful scourge called "Tick" is known to exist to a large extent amongst cattle in Northern Queensland and the Northern Territory of South Australia: NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the importation or introduction of cattle into this Colony from North of the 21st Parallel of South Latitude in Queensland, and from the Northern Territory of South Australia, except as provided by No. 12 of the Regulations bearing date 15th January, 1896, gazetted in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th of January, 1896: PROVIDED NEVERTHELESS that this Order in Council shall not apply to cattle from the "Wave Hill" stations, situated about 80 miles from the Eastern boundary of Western Australia, for a period of six months from the date thereof; such cattle, however, being subject to inspection by an Inspector on introduction or importation.

12. The Chief Inspector of Stock may give permission in writing to any occupier of land in Western Australia, who is also the occupier of land in South Australia adjoining such first mentioned land, for stock to be brought from such land to adjoining land within the Colony, for the purpose of depasturing or being kept on such land for any period therein mentioned, not exceeding six calendar months at any one time, provided that such stock shall not by reason of such permission become "introduced" stock, nor allowed to be on any land in Western Australia, except on land mentioned in such permission.

REGULATION FOR THE DISINFECTION OF IMPORTED FRUIT.

Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must, before removal from the first port or place of debarkation, be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector, and if found infected with insect or insects, or their germs, or with any fungi, blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees, will be destroyed, or otherwise treated as the Bureau of Agriculture may direct. If the fruit on examination is found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects, or their germs, or with any fungi, blight, or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit, to fruit trees, or to other trees, the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate to that effect, after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit is packed have been disinfected, as provided by Order 6, and on the receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection as prescribed in the Schedule gazetted on the 15th March, 1895. Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector will, if such fruit is found to be free from disease, issue a certificate to that effect upon payment of the fee as prescribed in the Schedule gazetted on the 15th March, 1895.

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that a Bonus of One Thousand Pounds, for the erection of Tin Smelting Works on the Greenbushes Tinfields, is offered by the Government; to be competed for under the following conditions:—

1. The whole of the works, including the smelting hereinafter mentioned, are to be begun and completed within the year 1896.
2. Any person desirous of competing for the Bonus must notify to the Government the commencement of the works, giving such information as to locality, plans, and general details as will enable the Government to have the works inspected and reported upon whenever they think it right to do so.
3. Not less than £3,000 shall be expended, to the satisfaction of the Government, upon the buildings, structures, plant, and machinery, and if a lesser sum than £3,000 be expended the Bonus will be reduced in proportion.

4. Before the Bonus will be paid the applicant will be required to prove, to the satisfaction of the Government, that not less than 100 tons of Tin have been properly smelted at the works.
5. Upon the completion of the works, they will be inspected by an officer appointed by the Government for that purpose, and, if approved by the Government, the Bonus will be paid.
6. Application for the Bonus must be made before the 31st day of January, 1897, and will be considered by the Government, in Executive Council, whose decision shall be final.


