Rottnest New Light.

THE West Australian Government desire to give notice that the New Lighthouse on Rottnest Island will be lighted on the 17th March inst., after which the light hitherto shown from the Old Tower will cease.

The Rottnest Island permanent light is a revolving light of the first order, showing a single flash of white light every twenty seconds. Duration of flash about 3 seconds, eclipse about 17 seconds.

The Light is elevated about 264 feet above high water, and should be visible from a vessel's deck in clear weather at a distance of 23 miles.

The Tower is circular in form, built of sandstone, and is of a natural grey colour.

- 4. Before the Bonus will be paid the applicant will be required to prove, to the satisfaction of the Government, that not less than 100 tons of Tin have been properly smelted at the works.
- 5. Upon the completion of the works, they will be inspected by an officer appointed by the Government for that purpose, and, if approved by the Government, the Bonus will be paid.
- 6. Application for the Bonus must be made before the 31st day of January, 1897, and will be considered by the Government, in Executive Council, whose decision shall be final.

¹²²/₉₆ By-Laws of the Geraldton Municipal Council.

HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," Section 99, it is enacted that "every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws," for the purposes in the said section particularly named; and by the said Act it is further enacted that "such By-laws shall not be inconsistent with or repugnant to any of the provisions of that Act or to any law in force, and when confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and published in the *Government Gazette*, but not sooner or otherwise, should have the force of law": Now therefore, pursuant to the powers contained in the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton that the following By-laws shall, from and after confirmation and publication as aforesaid, be By-laws of the Geraldton Municipal Council, and all previously existing By-laws be null and void.

By-LAW NO. 1.-Interpretation.

In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires— 1. The word "Council" shall mean the Mayor and Councillors of Geraldton.

2. The word "Municipality" shall mean the town of Geraldton.

3. The word "Mayor" shall mean the Mayor of the Municipality.

4. The words "public street" shall mean and include every public street, road, footway, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the Municipality.

5. The word "person" shall include a body corporate.

6. The word "owner" shall apply to every person in possession or receipt either of the whole or of any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.

By-LAW NO. 2.-STANDING ORDERS.-Order of Proceedings.

1. The Council shall meet at the Town Hall on the first Monday in every month, at the hour of eight p.m., for the transaction of their ordinary business, and the business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors.

2. The Council shall commence business so soon after the above-mentioned hour as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes from the above-mentioned hour there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Council at that meeting.

3. Should the Mayor not be present, the meeting shall elect a Chairman from the councillors present, who shall preside during the absence of the Mayor.

4. At all meetings of the Council when there is not a quorum present, or when the Council is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than one-third of the members of the Council present, exclusive of the Mayor or Councillor chosen to preside in his absence) such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

5. At all meetings of the Council the minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

6. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes the Mayor may make any communication to the Council which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall issue thereon on that time.

7. The ordinary business shall then be proceeded with.

Orders of Debate.

8. Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall, if the Mayor so desire it, put it in writing, and sign and deliver it to the Mayor or other presiding Chairman for the time being, after it has been duly seconded, and the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.

9. No member shall speak twice upon the same question, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply. The amendment of the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

10. The Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.

11. Any member moving a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.

12. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to any other member.

13. The Mayor or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

15. Upon the adoption of any amendment such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted on as an original motion.

16. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year unless by consent of at least four members of the Council.

17. In case of an equality of votes the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes and proceedings.

18. No By-law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed nor until the next or some subsequent meeting of the Council duly convened.

BY-LAW NO. 3 .- Suspension of Standing Orders.

In cases of urgent necessity, any standing order or orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least four members of the Council.

BY-LAW NO. 4.- Election of Officers.

1. When any office is at the disposal of the Council, at least ten clear days' notice shall be given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers of the intention of the Council to fill such vacancy, and the same notice shall invite applications for the office to be sent in to the next meeting of the Council.

2. The salary or allowance attached to all offices at the disposal of the Council shall be fixed for the municipal year, and in all cases before proceeding to the election.

3. At the next meeting of the Council, after the notice as before mentioned has been given, all letters of application for the office shall be opened, and the names read aloud, and the appointment may then be made.

4. All elections for offices at the disposal of the Council shall be effected by voting by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that the two candidates polling the largest number of votes be again put to the ballot until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of the votes of the members present, every member present being required to record his vote.

[MAR. 6. 1896.

5. No member of the Council, nor any auditor of the Municipality, nor any officer thereof, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council or for any work to be done for the Council, and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the Council.

By-LAW No. 5.-Municipal Rates.

All municipal rates shall be payable half-yearly, and the collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall, at the commencement of each half-year, leave with the person liable to pay the same, or at his residence, or post to his last known address, or affix upon the property rated, a notice of the amount due by such person and requiring payment thereof within fourteen days, and shall afterwards apply personally for payment of the same, and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of fourteen days after such application, shall take legal proceedings for its recovery.

By-LAW No. 6.—Officers of the Council. THE COLLECTOR.

1. The Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him. And all sums so received by the Collector shall by him be paid to the Treasurer of the Council weekly.

THE CLERK OF THE COUNCIL.

2. The Clerk of the Council shall keep the books of the Council, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minute book minutes of all proceedings of the Council. He shall attend all meetings of the Council issue notices of all meetings, and shall prepare for the Council or Mayor thereof, and in due time, the voters' lists for the municipality, and cause them to be affixed as by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" required, and shall supply copies thereof as by the said Act required, and shall make up and complete, under the like direction, prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep all such books of account as required by the said Council, cause the accounts of the said Council, cause the accounts of the said Council, cause the account of the Council half-yearly as required by the said Act. He shall also, under the direction of the shall also, under the direction of the sail statement or summary, and shall do and perform all such other acts as the Council or Mayor thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Council of the said Act, and shall attend the Council office during such hours as the Council may determine.

3. The custody of the journals, and all documents whatsoever (except such documents as are hereinafter expressed to be kept by the Mayor), laid before the Council shall be in care of the Clerk, who shall neither take, nor permit to be taken, any such journals or documents from the Mayor's or Council Office, without the express leave or order of the Council.

The Mayor.

4. The Mayor shall have the custody of the common seal, and of all deeds and records of the Council, but he shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the Council.

The Treasurer.

5. The Treasurer shall receive weekly from the Collector all sums stated to be received by him under By-law No. 6, Section 1, and give the Collector a receipt for such moneys.

6. The Treasurer shall (if required by the Council at any time so to do) give a bond, with two sureties, in a sum to be named by the Council, conditioned for the fair and diligent discharge of his duties.

7. The Treasurer shall, out of the moneys received by him as the Treasurer of the Council, pay all accounts duly and lawfully passed by the Council at its ordinary monthly meetings, and shall make all other payments which the Council may lawfully pass and order for payment.

8. The Treasurer shall pay all sums of money received by him into the credit of the Council's general account at a bank to be named by the Council, once at least in every week.

Supervisor and Surveyor.

9. The Supervisor and Surveyor for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall have the immediate care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, jetties, wharves, markets, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, and he shall, from time to time, report to the Council the state of, condition, or repair of the same, and the progress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith.

Ranger.

10. The Ranger for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, and is hereby authorised to impound any stray stray stock unlawfully being on any street or property of the Council, and to report the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith.

By-LAW No. 7.-Slaughter Houses.

No slaughter house shall be erected or used within the boundaries of the Municipality without the previous sanction in writing of the Council, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20.

BY-LAW No. 8.-Pigs.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within 100 feet of any inhabited dwelling house, public street, or roadway within the Municipality, and shall not, in any case, keep such swine so as to be a nuisance to any person, or injurious to public health, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-LAW NO. 9 .- Fires in Chimney Flues.

The occupier of any premises within the Municipality whereof any chimney flues shall take fire from having been suffered to become foul shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 5$. Provided that if any defendant shall plead that such chimney flue did not take fire in consequence of being foul, the onus of proof shall lie on such defendant.

Bx-LAW No. 10 .- Damaging Property, etc., of Municipality.

Any person who shall (without first having obtained the sanction in writing of the Council) break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove or carry away any footpath, tree, plant, post, fence, gate, drain, watercourse, culvert, jetty, wharf, building, dead bush in use for the purpose of arresting drift sand, or other property belonging to or in charge of or under the possession, control, or power of the Council shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 11.-To Prevent Danger from Fire.

Any person who shall (without first obtaining the permission in writing of the Mayor), anywhere within the limits of the Municipality, light any unguarded fire, or set fire to any straw, wood, or rubbish, or make any bonfire, or let off any fireworks within the Municipality, shall forfiet and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 12.—To Prevent Danger from Firearms.

Any person who shall wantonly or without lawful excuse discharge any firearm in, near to, or across any public street within the limits of the Municipality shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 13.—To Prevent Danger from Inflammable Materials.

1. Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within 75 feet of any house or other building, and who shall not remove the same within 48 hours after due notice by the Mayor, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

2. Any person who (without the consent in writing of the Council) shall stack more than 20 cords of firewood in one open or uncovered spot, within the limits of the Municipality, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty of $\pounds 5$ for every such offence.

3. And whereas great danger to life and property, by reason of fire, arises from the practice of allowing the accumulation of dangerous quantities of shavings, sawdust, straw, paper, and other inflanmable materials in and upon the yards, ways, and other premises within the Municipality: Be it ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton that, if after one week's notice given by the Supervisor served upon the occupier, owner, or agent of the premises, such inflammable materials (being in dangerous quantities as aforesaid) shall not be removed, then the said occupier, owner, or agent shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5.

4. And whereas it is necessary that proper means be adopted for extinguishing fires that may occur within the Municipality, and to facilitate the extinguishing of such fires: Be it further ordered and directed that the captain for the time being of the fire brigade shall, at any fire, have the command of the brigade engaged, and also of all appliances employed in extinguishing such fire. That the said captain, or officer in command of the brigade, shall be empowered to enter upon or through any premises whilst in the execution of his duties, and to direct the action of the brigade through or upon such premises. The captain shall be ampound further to take write a first shall be empowered further to take water, either from tanks, reservoirs, or wells nearest or most convenient to the fire, and otherwise to do any other matter or thing which he shall deem expedient for the purposes aforesaid.

5. That the said captain, or officer in command, or the Mayor, shall be authorised to employ such persons to assist the brigade in extinguishing fires as he may deem necessary. That the said captain or Mayor is hereby authorised to recover the expenses actually incurred by the brigade employed at any fire, from the owner or occupier of such premises, any sum or sums not exceeding those mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed, such charges being recoverable by action in the Local Court.

BY-LAW NO. 14.-To Prevent Spoiling or Encumbering Sea-Beach.

Any person who (without the previous consent in writing of the Mayor) shall take away or remove from the sea-beach any sand or sea-weed, or shall make any excavation therein, or shall put or place, or cause to be put or placed any timber or other goods or materials or rubbish on the sea-beach, and keep the same or any portion thereof thereon for a longer period than seven days, and shall not remove the same within forty-eight hours after due notice by the Mayor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

By-LAW No. 15.-- To Prevent Danger to Passengers.

Any house or building the roof whereof shall overhang or project over any public street without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or which shall have any cornice, crane, or hoist, or any other fixtures or pro-jection overhanging or projecting over any public street, without the sanction in writing of the Council therefor, shall be deemed to be a nuisance, and any owner of any such house or building who shall neglect or refuse to remove or abate such nuisance, within seven days after due notice by the Mayor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence,

BY-LAW NO. 16 .- To Prevent the Danger of Rapid Driving and Riding round Corners.

Any person who shall ride or drive any animal or animals, whether attached to any vehicle or not, round the corners formed by the junction of any street in the Municipality with any other street in the Municipality at a pace exceeding a walking pace, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence,

BY-LAW NO. 17 .- To Prevent the Danger from the Driving of Vehicles at Night.

Any person who, between any sunset and the following sunrise, shall in, upon, or along any of the public streets within the Municipality drive any vehicle constructed for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, without having a lamp or lanthorn securely fixed and lighted at the having a lamp of labeled rescuriely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, or any vehicle con-structed for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, wares, and merchandise, or of persons only, without having a lamp or lanthorn securely fixed on each side of the front of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 18 .- To ensure control over Vehicles and Horses.

Any person who, having the care of any vehicle in the public streets, shall be at such a distance from such vehicle as not to have the complete control over every horse drawing the same, and shall not have one wheel of such vehicle chained, or the horse securely ticd, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

By-LAW NO. 19 .- Quarries and Timber.

1. Any person who shall quarry stone on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

BY-LAW No. 20.-Schedule of Licenses and Fees to be paid yearly in advance on or before 31st January, or immedi-ately on such live stock or carriages being kept within the Municipality, or hand-carts being used in the streets thereof, or slaughter-houses or bathing places being opened therein.

For horned stock over 12 months old, 3s. per head. For horned stock over 6 months and under 12 months, 2s. 6d. per head.

For goats, 2s. 6d. per head. For sheep, 25s. per 100 head. For every carriage of two wheels, 10s. each.

For every carriage of four wheels, 20s. each.

Handcarts employed, if on the streets, 5s. each. For a Slaughter-house License, £5. For a Bathing House, Shed, or Machine License, £5.

Provided that if any such Slaughter-house, Bathing House, Shed, or Machine shall not be opened before the 1st day of July in any year, then the License Fee in respect thereof for that year shall be £2 10s. only.

Any person failing to pay the License as stated in the above Schedule shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 2$ for each offence.

BY-LAW NO. 21.-Number of Stock to be run on Commonage. No person or business firm shall run a greater number of Stock than the numbers stated below :-

Any person who shall run more Stock on the Geraldton Commonage than is allowed by this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every offence.

By-LAW No. 22.-Bathing.

1. No person shall bathe in the sea near the sea-beach adjoining the municipality, situated between Burges Street in the West Ward and Phelps Street in the East Ward, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., nor at any time unless dressed in proper bathing costume, that is, suitable bathing clothes covering the body from the shoulders to the knees.

No person shall bathe in the sea near the sea-beach adjoining the Municipality situated between Burges Street adjoining the Municipality situated between Burges Street and Point Moore, and between Phelps Street and Bluff Lighthouse, unless dressed in proper bathing costume. Provided that any person may bathe within any bathing house duly licensed by the Council. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 23.-Baths.

1. No person shall erect or use, on or near the sea-beach adjoining the Municipality, any bathing house, shed, or machine, without first having received the consent, in writing, of the Council.

All rules and regulations for the management of baths licensed under these By-laws, and the fees to be paid for the use thereof, and for the division of such baths so as to afford sufficient separate accommodation for the sexes and private baths for either sex, must be submitted to the Council for approval. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 24 .- Erection of Tents, Pavilions, etc.

Any person who shall erect a tent, pavilion, shed, or other structure of canvas or inflammable material within the Municipality, without first receiving the consent of the Mayor or Council, in writing, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 2$ for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 25.-Horses.

1. No person shall break in any horse in the main streets, either by leading, riding, or driving.

2. No entire horse shall be led or exhibited through or in the streets or public places within the Municipality within the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., and further, no person shall allow any mare to be covered by an entire horse, except in yards properly enclosed, without the consent of the Council in writing. Any person offending against any portion of this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding \pounds 5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 26. -Sign Boards, etc.

1. Any person who shall erect or place any sign boards, signs, awnings, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 2$ for every such offence.

2. Any person wishing to erect any balcony, verandah, or signboard over any part of a street or footway shall obtain permission of the Council, in writing, before so doing; and any balcony, verandah, or signboard so erected by the consent of the Council shall be at least eight feet clear above the street or footway over which it is erected, and shall be built in a substantial manner, and shall be subject to the approval of the Council, both with respect to its strength and appearance; and further, the Council will have power to remove or cause to be removed any balcony, verandah, or signboard now erected, or that may be hereafter erected in conformity with this By-law, provided that the owner or occupier of the premises to which any such balcony, verandah, or signboard is, or may be attached, shall have received 14 days' notice, in writing, from the Council, to remove such balcony, verandah, or signboard, and any owner or occupier failing to remove such balcony, verandah, or signboard, after having received the said notice, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, together with all expenses (if any) incurred by the Council in removing any such balcony, verandah, or signboard.

BY-LAW NO. 27.—Obstruction of Streets and Footpaths.

1. Any person who shall obstruct any street or footway within the Municipality, by placing any stone, bricks, timber, or any other building material, packing cases, or any other things, without first obtaining permission of the Council, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

2. And any person using any footpath or roadway by placing any stone, bricks, timber, or any other building material thereon, and thereby cause any damage to the said footpath or roadway, shall be liable to pay the cost of the said footpath or roadway so damaged.

3. And any person placing any stone, bricks, timber, or any other building material on any footway or roadway without keeping sufficient light or lights affixed thereto, from sunset to sunrise, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 28 .- Hoardings.

1. The Council may grant permission to any person to erect and use hoardings over or upon any street or footway, and any person obtaining such permission shall pay to the Council the following fees, viz. —One penny per lineal foot of street or pathway over or upon which such hoarding may be erected or used per month, or any part of a month, or a minimum fee of 2s. 6d. per month; and any person erecting or using any such hoarding shall keep a sufficient light or lights affixed thereto, in a conspicuous place, from sunset to sunrise; and any person who shall make any excavation on or near any footway or roadway shall creet a sufficient hoarding for the safety of the public, and shall affix sufficient light or lights thereto from sunset to sunrise.

2. Any excavation, cellar, opening, or gutter made under any footway shall be made secure from danger to the public, or filled in, as may be directed by the Council, by the person making any such excavation, opening, or gutter. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding 'Two pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 29.-Lamp Posts, etc.

All lamp posts, bridle posts, telegraph, telephone, and electric-lighting poles and flagstaffs shall not be erected by any person in any street without the written consent of the Council, and shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, as may be directed by the Council, and the Council may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 30.-Processions and Bands.

1. No procession, other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street within the Municipality without first having obtained the written permission of the Mayor or Council.

2. No band or person shall be allowed to play any musical instrument in any of the streets within the Municipality without first obtaining permission of the Mayor or Council. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 31.—Wharves and Jetties.

All wharves and jetties adjoining the Municipality shall be properly lighted to insure the safety of the public, between sunset and sunrise.

Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 32.- Walls and Fences.

1. No person shall erect any fence with bush, or other dangerous or inflammable substance, abutting on any public street, without first obtaining permission of the Council in writing.

2. Any fence or wall erected and abutting on any public street will be subject to the approval of the Council, and the owner of any such fence or wall shall keep and maintain such fence or wall in good order and repair, and shall remove the same if not so approved, and upon the Council ordering the removal of the same.

3. No person shall erect a fence of barbed wire abutting on any public street within the Municipality.

Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 33 .- Velocipedes, etc.

A person who shall ride or place a bicycle or other velocipede upon any footpath, and any person riding or placing a bicycle or velocipede upon any street, between sunset and sunrise, without carrying a lighted lamp and an alarm bell attached to the front part of such bicycle or velocipede, and sounding the bell in ample time to allow foot passengers and others to protect themselves from danger, and any person riding a bicycle or other velocipede in or upon any street or roadway in a furious manner shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

Bx-LAW No. 34.—Unyoked Cattle and Unbroken Horses.

Any person who shall drive any unyoked cattle or unbroken horses through the streets between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., without the permission of the Mayor or Council in writing, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds for every such offence.

Br-LAW No. 35.—Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

Any person who shall throw any orange-peel, vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any footpath within the Municipality, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding One pound for every such offence.

Bx-LAW No. 36.—Vehicles not having Springs.

Any person who shall cause any wagon, cart, or other carriage not having springs, or drive any animal attached thereto, at any faster rate, speed, or pace than a common walk shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

By-LAW NO. 37.-Goods left in the Streets.

Any person who shall allow any goods, merchandise, coal or firewood to remain in any street for a longer period than necessary for housing or removing the same, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Two pounds. Any officer of the Council or any police constable may seize and remove any animals or vehicles left unattended in any street, or obstructing any portion of any street, and the owners of any animals so seized or removed shall be liable and, upon conviction, shall pay any expenses incurred in such seizure or removal, and shall also pay all expenses incurred in the care and keep of any such animals or vehicles after such seizure and removal, and shall pay a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

Bx-LAW No. 39.—Impure water or liquid matter not to flow on any street.

Any owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within the Municipality, who shall allow any impure water or any liquid matter of any description to flow from such house, land, or premises, into or upon any street, footway, or gutter, and any person who shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any liquid matter of any description, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

By-LAW No. 40.-Temporary Stalls.

The Council may grant permission to any person to fix and use temporary stalls in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise, for such time and such places as the Council may think fit, provided that the general traffic is not obstructed by any such stalls, and that such permission may be withdrawn by the Mayor or Council at any time by written notice : And the Council shall charge the person using a fee not exceeding £5, and any person erecting or using any such stall in or near any street for the above purposes, without first obtaining such permission of the Council, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and be subject to a penalty of £5 for each offence.

BY-LAW No. 41.—No Glass, etc., to be affixed to Walls.

No person shall affix any broken glass, glass bottles, iron spikes, or barbed wire, to any wall, fence, or building abutting on any street or roadway within the Municipality, unless at a height of five feet above such street or roadway, and the owner of any spikes placed in any fence, wall, or building, at a lower height, but so protect the same as to prevent danger to the public. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 42.—Regulation of Street Traffic on special occasions.

The Council may, in its discretion, regulate or prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways of any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement.

Bx-LAW No. 43.—Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

1. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws.

2. The Council shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the Municipality, for holding public sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons, for any time not exceeding three days, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees upon or inclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Council a fee to be fixed; but the public will have the right to enter upon such lands, provided they do not in any way interfere with sports or amusements being carried on.

3. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed upon any park land or recreation ground without the written permission of the Mayor or Council.

4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the corporation.

5. The Council may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

6. No person shall sell, or expose for sale, any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, without first having obtained the

written consent of the Mayor or Council, and shall pay a fee; the amount of such fee not to exceed Ten pounds.

7. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 44.-Dairies.

1. Any person or persons carrying on the trade of cow keepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the Municipality shall register their names and addresses with the Town Clerk, and shall keep their milk stores, shops, or dairies, or milk vessels used for containing milk for sale, and every place used in connection therewith, in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of an officer appointed by the Council.

2. No person shall contaminate or adulterate in any way any milk offered for sale within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for every such offence.

By-Law No. 45.—Camels.

Any person who shall, in, upon, or along any of the public streets within the Municipality, hereinafter named, that is to say:—Greenough Road, Back Street, Chapman Road, Marine Terrace, Ord Street, Eastern Road, George Road, Crowther Street, Augustus Street, ride, drive, or lead any camel or dromedary, without the sanction of the Council in writing, shall pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence, and any person depasturing camels or dromedaries on the park lands, commonage, or other lands within the boundaries, or under the control of the Municipality, without the sanction of the Council in writing, shall pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding One pound for every animal so depastured.

By-LAW No. 46.—A By-law for Regulating Hackney Carriages, and Vehicles Licensed to carry Passengers and Plying for Hire, and the Owners and Drivers thereof, within the Municipality of Geraldton.

1. The Licensing Officer of the Municipality shall issue licenses only to such owners, conductors, and drivers of hackney carriages, vehicles, and cabs as, in his discretion, are fit to be intrusted therewith, and such licenses may be on the forms contained in Schedule C and D respectively. A driver's license shall entitle the owner thereof, during the existence of license, to drive any licensed carriage, vehicle, or cab within the Municipality of Geraldton. A carriage license shall permit and allow the carriage, vehicle, or cab therein referred to, during the existence of the license, to be used for the carriage of the number of passengers mentioned in such license in the Municipality of Geraldton, when driven by a licensed driver; but such license shall not entitle the owner to become the driver unless he is a licensed driver under the preceding section.

2. The Licensing Officer shall not license any person as driver of any licensed vehicle, unless and until he is satisfied the person so offering himself as a driver is fit and competent for the duties of a licensed driver, but he may, at his option, grant to such applicant a temporary license for a term not exceeding seven days by the way of testing his competency for the position of licensed driver.

3. The Licensing Officer shall not license any carriage or vehicle to ply for hire unless he is satisfied that it is a vehicle fit for the purpose for which it is sought to be licensed.

4. Licensed vehicles known as "hansom cabs," when plying for hire within the Municipality, shall not be allowed to carry more than two passengers at one time.

5. Every passenger vehicle plying for hire, or engaged after sunset and before sunrise, shall be provided with a lamp or lamps inside such vehicle, so placed as to give a convenient and sufficient light inside, and the driver shall keep the same lighted while so plying or engaged for hire.

6. The number of the license, and the number of persons to be carried inside and outside, shall be painted on the outside of every carriage in figures of not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, in such position as the Licensug Officer may direct, and such number shall be kept legible and undefaced during all the time the carriage shall ply and be used for hire.

7. The number of the license of every licensed carriage on a plate eight inches by four inches, painted in clear legible figures, together with the number of passengers which such carriage is licensed to carry inside and outside, and a printed card, to be provided by the Council, showing a table of fares fixed for time or distance, shall be affixed at the upper part of the front pannel, or in such place as the Inspector may direct inside of such carriage, and such plate and such card respectively shall be kept so affixed, conspicuous, legible, and undefaced during all the time the carriage shall ply or be used for hire.

8. No licensed carriage shall ply for hire or carry passengers unless at the time of such plying or carrying, such carriage be drawn by at least the number of horses proportioned to the number of passengers which such carriage or omnibus shall have been licensed to carry, as follows, that is to say —If licensed to carry six, or any less number of persons, one horse; if licensed to carry more than six, and not more than fifteen persons, two horses; if licensed to carry more than twenty-seven persons, three horses; if licensed to carry more than twenty-seven persons, three horses; if licensed to carry more than twenty-seven persons, three horses; if licensed to carry more than twenty-seven persons, three horses; and not more than thirty-nine persons, four horses; and so on in the same proportion for any greater number of persons.

9. (a.) Omnibuses shall ply for hire along the several routes named on their respective licenses.

- (b.) No omnibus will be allowed to carry more than the number of passengers for which it is licensed.
- (c.) Omnibuses must run according to time-tables approved by the Council.
- (d.) The charge for each passenger shall in no case exceed threepence (children in arms not included). This payment shall be inclusive of all charges for luggage, not exceeding 14lbs, weight for each passenger.
- (e.) No vchicles, other than omnibuses, shall be allowed to ply for hire off the stands as published.
- (f.) The number of passengers to be carried shall be clearly painted both on the outside and inside of each omnibus.
- (g.) In all other respects omnibuses will be subject to the regulations contained in this By-law and to the penalties set forth herein.
- (h.) Any infringement of Clause (e.) of this Section shall subject the driver to a penalty of £1 for the first offence, and cancellation of his license as driver for 12 months for a repetition of such offence.

[10. It shall not be necessary, except upon request, and at the first licensing of any vehicle, to deliver to the owners of licensed carriages or vehicles a printed copy of the By-law regulating licensed hackney carriages and vehicles.

11. No hackney carriage of any description whatsoever shall ply for hire within the Municipality until and unless the same be duly licensed by the said Licensing Officer.

12. No driver or conductor of a licensed vehicle shall lend or part with his license, nor shall the proprietor of any such vehicle employ an unlicensed person as driver or conductor thereof.

13. No person shall act as driver of any licensed vehicle who shall not be of the full age of seventeen years, neither shall any person act as conductor of any licensed vehicle who is not of the full age of fourteen years.

14. The driver of every licensed carriage shall be constantly attendant on the same when plying for hire, and shall remain with it, and shall not stand on the footways near the stands, and shall not place any carriage, or stand, or ply for hire in any part of the streets or roadways within the Municipality other than on one of the stands; and shall not be drunk whilst driving or plying for hire; and shall not use any abusive language to any other driver, or to any person hiring or applying to hire any carriage, or conveyed in the same; and shall not loiter with any carriage in any of such streets or roadways.

15. No driver of any hackney carriage shall suffer the same to stand for hire across any street or alongside of any other hackney carriage, nor obstruct the driver of any other carriage in taking up or setting down any person, nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other carriage from taking a fare.

16. No driver or conductor shall, at any time, whilst loading, unloading, or attending any licensed carriage, wilfully or negligently do, or cause or suffer to be done, any damage to the person or property of anyone, or be guilty of any breach of the peace, misconduct, or behaviour whereby a breach of the peace may be occasioned in any respect in such employment. 17. Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.

18. Every driver, whilst engaged in taking up or setting down any passenger, shall, during such taking up or setting down, place his carriage as near as conveniently may be to the kerb at that side of the street at which the taking up or setting down is required.

19. No owner or driver shall, while having the care of, or being attendant upon, any licensed carriage, drive the same furiously, wantonly, or carelessly.

20. No owner or driver of any licensed carriage shall refuse or delay to admit and carry in and by his carriage the number of persons painted or marked thereon, or specified in the license granted in respect thereof.

21. No owner or driver of any licensed carriage, or other licensed vehicle, having agreed to take any fare at any time, or from any place, shall delay, neglect, or refuse to fulfil such agreement.

22. No driver shall carry, or knowingly permit to be carried, in any licensed carriage, except to some police office or watchhouse, any drunken or intoxicated person, or any person so violently or noisily conducting himself, or otherwise so misbehaving, as to occasion any public annoyance, or annoyance to the passengers of such vehicle, or disturb the public peace.

23. No driver shall smoke any pipe or cigar whilst driving any licensed carriage; nor shall any passenger smoke inside any hackney carriage, or whilst a passenger therein; nor shall any passenger smoke if he is an outside passenger of any vehicle, should any passenger by such vehicle object to such smoking.

24. Any driver found asleep in his vehicle while such vehile is on the stand and plying for hire, shall be deemed not to be in attendance thereon.

25. No owner or driver of any licensed carriage shall carry, or permit to be carried, in or upon any such carriage, any coffin containing the deceased body of any person.

26. The driver of every hackney carriage shall place a muzzle upon the head of any vicious horse employed by him and harnessed to such carriage, and keep the same thereon whilst on the stand waiting for hire.

27. Every driver who shall feed any horse whilst on the stand waiting for hire shall use a nosebag to contain the forage, and shall not remove such horse's winkers during the time of feeding.

28. No driver of any hackney carriage shall allow any person to ride on the box or in or upon any part of such carriage, without the permission of the person hiring the same.

29. No owner or driver of any carriage, or any other person, shall obstruct any officer of the Corporation in the execution of his duties.

30. The driver of every licensed carriage driving the same by any place of public worship during the hours of divine service therein, on any Sunday, shall drive such carriage whilst passing such place of public worship at a walking pace.

31. The driver of any carriage or licensed vehicle shall, on being requested by an officer of the Corporation, police constable, or any passenger or intended passenger, give to such officer, police constable, passenger or intended passenger, his name and number of licensed carriage or vehicle.

32. No driver shall, except whilst standing on an appointed stand, permit his vehicle, with or without horses, to stand in any part of the Municipality longer than may be absolutely necessary for loading or unloading, or for taking up or putting down passengers, nor shall cause any obstruction in any part of the Municipality.

33. No driver or conductor of any licensed carriage shall wilfully deceive any person in respect to the route of destination thereof, or for the purpose of taking up or setting down a passenger, or except, in case of accident, or other unavoidable necessity, stop such a carriage upon any place where foot passengers usually cross the carriage way.

34. No proprietor shall be at liberty to lend his license to any person.

35. No proprietor shall be at liberty to part with his licensed vehicle without registering the name of the purchaser in the books of the Licensing Officer, and on the license granted for such vehicle; and any proprietor who shall part with his vehicle without such registry shall still be deemed the proprietor thereof, and subject as such to all the provisions of this By-law as fully as if no change of ownership had taken place; and the purchaser of such vehicle who shall allow the same to be used or to ply for hire without such registry, shall be subject to the same penalty as is imposed by this By-law on a person for plying without a license; and the person or persons in whose name or names a license shall appear to have been obtained, shall be deemed the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the same shall be taken out, until the transfer shall have been duly made.

36. Whenever any person named as the proprietor, or one of the proprietors of a licensed vehicle, shall change his place of abode, he shall, within seven days next after any such change, give notice thereof in writing, signed by him, to the Licensing Officer, specifying his new place of abode, and the same shall be duly indorsed upon the license granted to such proprietor.

37. Every owner licensed under the provisions hereof shall, at the time of his first obtaining a license, have delivered to him, without any charge, a printed copy of this By-law; and every such owner or driver, respectively, shall, at all times, have such copy of this By-law ready to produce, and shall, upon request, produce the same for perusal to any person using or hiring such carriage.

38. The owner of every licensed carriage shall at all times, when plying or employing such carriage for hire, have the same in good order, with the harness sufficient, perfect, and in good condition, and the whole ready and sufficient for duty, with the driver and horse or horses competent to perform any drive or distance that may be reasonably required.

39. Every licensed carriage applying for hire, or engaged after sunset and before sunrise, shall be provided with two proper carriage lamps, and the driver shall keep the same lighted while so plying or engaged for hire.

40. Every owner or driver of a hackney carriage standing or plying for hire at any public stand appointed by the said Council shall, unless previously engaged (the proof of which engagement shall be on such owner or driver), be bound to take immediately any fare not exceeding the number of persons which his carriage is licensed to carry; and no owner or driver of any hackney carriage shall refuse to carry thereby a reasonable quantity of luggage for any person hiring or desiring to hire such carriage, nor shall refuse to drive the same to any place within the Municipality, nor for any time not exceeding six hours, if so required by any person hiring or intending to hire such carriage nor shall fail to drive the same at a reasonable speed, not less than six miles an hour, unless unavoidably delayed or required by the hirer to drive at any slower pace, reasonable time being allowed for food or bait for the horses.

41. Every owner or driver of a hackney carriage or other licensed vehicle, or of a waggon, dray, cart, or other vehicle carrying goods or merchandise, standing or plying for hire at any appointed public stand shall, on engaging to take a fare, either by time or distance, perform such engagement, whether the distance to be travelled shall be within or without the bounds of the Municipality. And every owner or driver of a licensed vehicle, or of a waggon, dray, cart, or other vehicle aforesaid, standing or plying for hire as aforesaid shall, unless previously engaged (the proof of which engagement shall be on such owner or driver), be bound to take immediately (or provide a substitute for) any employment tendered to him for the hire of and suitable for his vehicle.

42. The owner of any hackney carriage shall, upon request made by any person, or by the Inspector, or by any police constable, declare to the person, Inspector, or constable requiring the same, the name and place of abode of the conductor or driver thereof.

43. The owner or driver of any hackney carriage. wherein any property whatever shall be left by any person hiring or using such carriage, shall, within eighteen hours next after the same shall have so left, restore such property, in the state in which the same shall have been found, to the owner thereof, or if the owner cannot be traced, shall deposit such property in the office of the Licensing Officer, and if any owner or driver shall make default herein, he shall forfeit such sum, not exceeding Five pounds, as the justice or justices before whom such complaint shall be made shall award for an offence against the provisions of this By-law, and when any such property shall be deposited as aforesaid, the officer receiving the same shall give an acknowledgment to the depositor, and make an entry and record thereof, and the property so deposited shall be returned to the person who shall prove ownership to the satisfaction of the said Council, such person previously paying all expenses incurred. And if any property so found and deposited shall not be claimed by the owner thereof within one year after the date of deposit, the property having been advertised in such manner as the said Council may direct, such property shall be sold by public auction, and the proceeds thereof disposed of according to law.

44. All owners of carriages, or drivers, or other persons attending any such carriages, shall bring his or their carriage for inspection when the same shall be ordered.

45. If by any unavoidable accident any carriage shall become unfit for use, and also during such reasonable time as any such carriage may be undergoing repair, it shall be lawful for the owner, subject to the approval of the Inspector, to use a spare carriage; but the same shall, in all respects, except as to a license, be subject to these By-laws in the same manner as if a license had been granted for the same; and the person using such spare carriage shall be liable in the same manner for any non-compliance with these By-laws in respect thereof, as if the same had been licensed. Before using such spare carriage the owner shall give notice thereof in writing at the office of the Inspector, stating the true cause of the carriage being disused, and the period during which such spare carriage will be required, and no such spare carriage will be used until it has been inspected and approved of by the Inspector, nor for a longer period than that stated in a certificate to be signed by the Inspector and delivered to the owner; but any carriage may be used for the purpose of finishing a journey which may have been interrupted by accident.

46. The license of any owner, driver, or conductor may, for any misconduct, be revoked, cancelled, or suspended by the Licensing Officer as he shall deem right after notice given to such owner, driver, or conductor to show cause why the same should not be revoked, cancelled, or suspended, and opportunity thereupon given to him to show such cause.

47. The Licensing Officer may refuse to issue a license to any person he shall think disqualified therefor; and he shall refuse to issue a license to any person against whom several complaints may have been made to the Licensing Officer, or to the Council, or informations laid before a Justice.

48. In the event of any license being refused, revoked cancelled, or suspended, it shall be lawful for the person affected to appeal to the Mayor and Council against the decision of the Licensing Officer, who shall inquire into the matter of such appeal, and, at their discretion, confirm the decision of the Licensing Officer or direct the issue or continuance of a license, and their decision shall be final.

49. No licensed vehicle shall pass any other licensed vehicle in the Municipality proceeding in the same direction to or from the stand if the latter be proceeding on its journey at the rate of six miles an hour, and no licensed vehicle shall immediately precede or follow another licensed vehicle, or nurse or shepherd the same to the danger or annoyance of the passengers of either vehicle.

50. No agreement whatever made with the owner or driver of any hackney carriage for the payment of any more than his proper fare, as fixed or limited by law, shall be binding or held to authorise any overcharge whatever where such vehicle is engaged on and removed from the stand under such agreement; and in case any person shall be required to pay, and shall pay, to such owner or driver, whether in pursuance of any agreement or not, any sum exceeding the proper fare, the person paying the same shall be entitled, on complaint made against such owner or driver before any Justice, to recover back the sum paid beyond the proper fare: And such owner or driver shall further, for such exaction, be liable to a penalty for an offence against the provisions hereof.

51. The rates and fares to be charged by the owners and drivers of hackney carriages and all licensed public vehicles plying for hire within the Municipality shall be as set forth in the Schedule hereto, marked A, and shall be deemed to be the rates and fares which may be lawfully demanded, received, or taken by any hackney carriage or public vehicle, owner or driver, as aforesaid : Provided that such rates and fares shall be inclusive of all charges for luggage not exceeding twenty-five pounds weight for each passenger.

52. No child under four years of age shall be counted as a passenger unless there shall be more than one, in which case two of such children shall be considered as one passenger, and so on in respect of every two such children. Children at the breast shall not be considered as passengers in any case.

53. Any person having hired or used a licensed carriage, and refusing to pay the legal fare at the termination of the

journey or engagement, or when demanded, shall on conviction before any Justice or Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

54. The places set forth and described in the Schedule 54. The places set forth and described in the Schedule hereto, marked B, are public stands, where all hackney carriages and vehicles shall ply for hire, and such stands or such other stands in such other places as the Council of the Municipality may from time to time appoint (due notice of which shall be given by public advertisement in the *Government Gazette*, or in one or more of the Geraldton newspapers), shall be and continue the public stands of the Municipality for the purpose aforesaid; and no person shall draw up or station his carriage or vehicle at any other place to ply for hire, and all carriages and vehicles shall be considered nying for hire if on any appointed stand considered plying for hire if on any appointed stand.

Hackney carriages shall take their station on the stand in the order of their arrival, and when any carriage shall be called or driven off any stand, the carriage im-mediately behind shall draw up to the place vacated, and all other carriages behind shall draw up in the like order.

The Council or the Mayor for the time being of the 56.said Municipality may appoint such and so many places in the Municipality as from time to time they or he shall deem necessary as temporary stands, where hackney carriages and vehicles may ply for hire in addition to the usual and published stands; but such additional places shall be public stands only for such time as shall be set forth in an advertisement in one or more newspapers published in the said Municipality.

At every fourth vehicle on every stand there shall be left a space of eight feet at least for foot passengers to pass through.

The distance for which any charge shall be made shall be computed from the stand or place where the carriage was hired, but in case the carriage shall be taken taring when the public and the mean of public building the distance shall be computed from such last-mentioned place or building, and not from the stand where the carriage may usually ply.

59. Every licensed vehicle plying from and to fixed places without the Municipality shall have painted in letters at least four inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and in a colour different from and opposite to the colour of the ground on which such letters shall be painted, upon some conspictous part of such vehicle, so that the same shall be at all times plainly and distinctly visible and legible, the name or names of the extreme place or places from which and to which such licensed vehicle shall be licensed to travel and go.

licensed to travel and go. 60. The words "Town Clerk," where used in this By-law, shall be understood to mean the Town Clerk of the Muni-cipality of Geraldton; the words "Inspector of Vehicles," or "Licensing Officer," shall be understood to mean the Inspector of Vehicles or Licensing Officer for the Muni-cipality; the word "Owner" shall signify every person possessed of a beneficial interest in any hackney carriage; the words "hackney carriage," when used in this By-law, shall signify and mean every description of public vehicle plying for hire within the municipality, and licensed to carry passengers; "Conductor" shall mean and include every director or other person, except the driver, who shall attend upon the passengers in any licensed carriage. And whenever in this By-law, with reference to any person, animal, matter, or thing, any word or words is or are used importing the singular number or the masculine gender only, such word or words shall be understood to include several importing the singular number of the mascaline gutter only, such word or words shall be understood to include several persons or animals as well as one person or animal, females as well as males, bodies corporate or politic as well as indi-viduals, and several matters or things as well as one matter or thing, unless it be otherwise specially provided, or there be something in the subject or context repugnant thereto.

61. Nothing in this By-law contained shall apply or be held to apply to carriages which shall be let for hire only when previously ordered or bespoken at the residence of their owners, and which shall never be permitted to apply for hire in any street or place off the premises of their respective owners, or the owners or drivers of such carriages.

62. For every offence against any provision of this By-law, except wherein a penalty is provided for, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, to be recovered in a summary way before any Justice of the Peace: Provided that, where by this By-law any penalty is imposed upon the owner and driver of any licensed carriage for one and the same offence, only one prosecution shall be had or maintained for the recovery of such penalty against such owner or driver at the option of the person prosecuting the same.

Lodging-Houses.

WHEREAS it is necessary and expedient to make provisions for registration and proper management of lodging-houses: It is therefore ordered and directed by the Local Board of Health for Perth, by virtue of "The Public Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1895," and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. In the construction of these By-laws, "Lodginghouse" shall bear the same meaning as set forth in Section 14 of the said Act (59 Vic., No. 35).

 $2. \$ These By-laws shall come into force on the first of March, 1896.

3. Any person desirous of keeping a lodging-house shall make written application to the Board, stating the locality of the premises proposed to be registered and the number and sizes and dimensions of all rooms, and the number of rooms to be used for sleeping purposes, and the maximum number of beds to be used and persons to sleep in each such room, and shall, together with such application, send a ground plan of the premises and a certificate of character in the form "A" in the Schedule, signed by six respectable inhabitant householders and ratepayers of the City of Perth.

4. No registration shall be granted until the applicant lodges with the Council a written certificate by the Health Officer and City Surveyor that the premises are properly and securely built, properly ventilated and drained, and in a sanitary state, and that the provisions of these By-laws have been complied with.

5. (1.) There shall be no greater number of lodgers or other persons permitted to occupy any sleeping apartment, or to sleep in any apartment in the said premises, than the number which can be accommodated with space according to the following conditions :—

- (1.) In every apartment one person for each space of not less than 500 cubic feet contained in such apartment.
- (2.) Two children under ten years of age shall be counted as one person.
- (3.) In the case of any apartment the walls of which do not reach from floor to ceiling, the amount of space in such apartment shall not be deemed greater than if such walls did reach from floor to ceiling.

(2.) No room shall be registered or used as a sleeping apartment if it be in the basement or below the level of the ground, or if it be used as a kitchen, scullery, dining, or general sitting room, nor unless such room have a window admitting light and capable of being opened for the admission of fresh air.

(3.) No premises shall be registered unless the same be healthily situated and watertight, and otherwise in repair inside and out, and unless the same have—

- (a) A supply of water and all conveniences for cooking and washing; and
- (b) A yard attached, open to the sky, properly drained, so as to run dry and effectually take off all waste water; and
- (c) A dust-bin in the yard of sufficient size to contain the dust, ashes, and household garbage and refuse likely to accumulate during two weeks; and
- (d) A separate closet or privy for each twenty lodgers of each sex; and
- (e) Provision to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector for the collection and disposal of household slops, waste water, etc.

(4.) Nothing herein contained shall authorise any lodging-housekeeper to permit any apartment to be used as a sleeping apartment except such as is specified in his application, and to the number so specified.

6. The Local Board may refuse to register any premises, without being required to assign reasons.

7. If any application is granted the applicant shall, on payment of a fee of 5s., be entitled to a certificate of registration in the form "B," subject to such conditions (if any) as the Board may determine, and on such certificate being issued (and while it remains uncancelled) the premises shall be duly registered.

8. The keeper of every lodging-house shall put up and keep exhibited, in a conspicuous place in each sleeping apartment, a notice signed by the Town Clerk stating the number of persons allowed to sleep in such room.

9. No alteration shall be made to any licensed premises unless with the previous consent of the Town Clerk.

10. The keeper of every lodging-house shall, whenever required by any police constable or officer or any officer or servant of the Local Board, produce his certificate of registration for inspection.

11. Persons of different sexes shall not occupy the same sleeping apartment, except married couples or parents with their children under ten years of age, or except children under ten years of age.

12. More than one married couple shall not occupy the same sleeping apartment.

- 13. The keeper of every lodging-house shall-
 - (a) Linnewash or otherwise cleanse, to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector, the walls and ceilings of all sleeping apartments, in the first week of each of the months of April and October in every year;
 - (b) Cause the floors of all rooms, apartments, passages and stairs of such premises to be kept at all times clean, to be swept and cleansed from dust once at least daily, before ten o'clock in the forenoon, and the floors to be scrubbed and washed once at least every week;
 - (c) Cause the yard and out premises to be swept daily, and to be kept at all times clean and free from filth; the seats and floor of all closets or privies to be scrubbed and washed daily, and the walls to be limewashed at least every month;
 - (d) Cause all house refuse, garbage, dirt, ashes, and other matter to be emptied into a watertight and sufficient dust-bin, and to cause such to be emptied and disinfected at least once a week;
 - (e) Provide sufficient washstands and fittings with a supply of water, soap, and clean towels in every sleeping apartment for females or married couples, and shall for male lodgers provide sufficient accommodation and appliances, soap, and towels for washing, either in the sleeping apartments of such lodgers or in a convenient room set apart and fitted for the purpose;
 - (f) Keep all beds, blankets, rugs, covers, and sheets, and all towels and house linen clean, free from vermin, and in a wholesome condition;
 - (g) Wash every sheet and all household linen at least once every seven days;
 - Cause every sleeping apartment to be at all times furnished with toilet utensils and a bedstead and sufficient bedding, that is to say, a bed or mattress, two sheets, a rug, and not less than one blanket in winter for each lodger;
 - (i) Cause the fireplace and chimney and other apertures for ventilation in every sleeping apartment to be kept open, and the doors and windows of all such apartments to be kept open from nine o'clock in the forenoon to five o'clock in the afternoon of every day, unless during such time as injury might result because of wet or tempestuous weather, or while there be any person sick in such apartment;
 - (j) Forthwith comply with and carry out all such directions as he may receive from the Health Inspector or Health Officer, and which may in the opinion of such Officer or Inspector be advisable in the interests of health or to secure the observance of these By-laws.

14. No keeper of a lodging-house shall suffer or permit any immoral conduct or behaviour on the registered premises.

15. In the absence of the registered keeper from the premises, the person apparently in charge shall be deemed for all purposes the agent of the keeper, and such person and the keeper, or either of them, may be held responsible and proceeded against for any breach of or neglect to perform or observe any of these By-laws or of the provisions of the Act.

16. The Board may forthwith cancel and revoke the registration of premises whereon there has been, in the opinion of the Board, with or without the knowledge of the keeper thereof, any breach or non-performance of any of these By-laws or of any of the provisions contained in the said Act.

17. No registration shall remain in force after the first day of January following the grant thereof.

18. All applications for renewals of registration shall be made on or before the first day of November in each and every year.

19. The Board may, in its discretion, refuse to renew any registration without being required to assign reasons.

20. The Town Clerk shall keep a register in accordance with Section 17 of the 59 Vic., 35, in the Form "C" in the Schedule. Such register shall be open to inspection on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each search.

21. Every person applying for registration or for renewal of registration shall pay 5s. on each such application.

22. In the case of lodging-houses where lodgers are not taken for a day or less, the Board may exempt any such houses from the operation of any of these By-laws.

23. Every person offending against any of the foregoing By-laws shall, for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5, and a further penalty not exceeding 10s. for every day during which the offence continues.

W HEREAS it is necessary and expedient to make provision for the regulation, management, and licensing of Private Hospitals, it is therefore ordered by the Local Board of Health for Perth, by virtue of "The Public Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1895," and by the authority of the same, as follows :-

1. In the construction of these By-laws, the term "Hospital" shall mean a private hospital as defined by Section 24 of the 59 Vic., 35.

These By-laws shall come into force on the first day of April, 1896.

3. Any person desiring to open, occupy, or conduct, or to keep open, occupied, or conducted any hospital within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Perth, shall make written application to the Board stating :

- (a) The locality of the premises proposed to be registered.
- (b) The number of patients to be taken in and the minimum number of nurses to be constantly employed.
- (c) What provision is made for the sanitary arrangements, including the collection and disposal of all filth, house-refuse, slops, etc., etc.
- (d) The name and address of the applicant, and the qualifications possessed by him or her.

4. Such application shall be accompanied with a plan of the premises proposed to be registered, and also with a certificate signed by the Health Officer that the premises are in every way fit to be registered, and that due and proper provision has been made to observe these By-laws, and also accompanied with a certificate, signed by the Health Inspector, that the sanitary arrangements are in every way satisfactory.

5. Within seven days after the application aforesaid is lodged with the Town Clerk, the applicant shall advertise notice in two daily papers published in Perth, in Form A in the Schedule. Such advertisement shall be inserted in seven issues of each of the said papers, and copies of such issues lodged with the Town Clerk.

No registration shall be granted for or in respect of premises situated within the following area, namely:

On the West by Spring Street, Mount Road, Milligan Street, and Melbourne Road ; thence

On the North by Hardinge, James, Mackie, and Moore Streets.

On the East by Hill Street, and

On the South by the Swan River.

7. No registration shall be granted in respect of any premises when any part of the buildings on such premises are within 20 feet of any other building or erection.

8. No person shall apply for or be granted registration unless the Health Officer shall certify in writing that the applicant is in every manner qualified to be the keeper of a hospital.

9. The Board may refuse to register any premises without being required to assign reasons.

If an application is granted the applicant shall receive from the Town Clerk a certificate of registration in the Form B in the Schedule, subject to such conditions as the Board may impose.

11. No registration shall remain in force after the 1st day of January next following the date thereof.

12. There shall be no greater number of patients or other persons permitted to occupy or be in the said premises than the number which can be accommodated with space according to the undermentioned conditions:

- Each patient must have at least 500 cubic feet of air, and each fever patient must have at least 1,000 cubic feet of air.
- No patient shall be placed or permitted to be in any part of the premises other than those which are specified in the application to be used by or for patients only.
- No patient shall be put or allowed to remain in any part of the premises which the Health Officer may at any time deem unfit for patients or such patient.
- Every fever, contagious, or infectious case shall be kept isolated from all other patients.

13. No alteration shall be made to any registered premises, or any part thereof, unless with the approval of the Health Officer and the written consent of the Town Clerk.

Persons of different sexes shall not occupy the same apartment, unless married couples or children under the age of ten years. More than one married couple shall not occupy the same room.

The keeper of every hospital shall :--15.

- (a) At all times give access to the premises to the Health Officer and Health Inspector and other servants or persons authorised by the Board, and permit the Health Officer to see and examine all patients.
- (b) Forthwith report to the Inspector, in writing, all cases of fever or other infectious or contagious cases.
- (c) Cause all refuse, rags, etc., to be burnt on the premises, with appliances to be approved by the Health Officer.
- (d) Provide separate plans for the collection and removal of all excrementitious matter from fever, infectious, and contagious cases.
- (e) Forthwith provide, and at all times keep, all such material and appliances as the Health Officer may deem advisable for the use of patients or Medical Practitioners in charge of patients.

- (f) Forthwith carry out all such orders and directions as the Health Officer may from time to time give relating to the sanitation, drainage, and good management of the premises, and the care and comfort of the patients or any of them at any time occupying the premises
- (g) Forthwith carry out all such orders and directions which may be given from time to time by the Health Inspector, relating to the sanitary arrangements and the collection and disposal of all nightsoil, house-refuse, rags, slops, waste water, and other matters.
- (h) At all times keep a register showing the name At all times keep a register showing the name and address of each patient admitted, the place from which he comes, and if the illness was contracted in Perth, the street where the patient resided, the complaint from which he is suffering, and the medical practitioner under whose care the patient is, the date of admission and the date of leaving, and whether the patient is discharged cured or otherwise, and, in case of death, the cause of death. Such in case of death, the cause of death. Such register shall be signed by the practitioner in charge of the case, and provision shall be made in such register to enable patients and prac-titioners to record (if they so desire) any complaints against the hospital or his or her treatment therein.
- (i) Every register as aforesaid shall be the absolute property of the Board, and be at all times open to the inspection of the Health Officer, and also of any medical practitioner attending any case where it is open at all times to inspection by such persons, and, when filled, shall be handed to the Town Clerk.
- (j) Shall not at any time permit or suffer to be on the premises or employ or engage any person to nurse, assist, or attend any patient, unless such person is a duly certificated nurse or attendant as hereinafter mentioned, or unless such person is a relative of the patient.
- (k) Shall not be absent from the registered premises for more than one week at a time without the written consent of the Health Officer.
- (l) Shall not transfer the said premises, or permit any other person to carry on the business of a hospital in the said premises, unless such other person has first applied for and obtained a certificate of registration as keeper of the said premises.
- (m) At all times exercise a personal supervision over the premises and the persons employed therein, and see that all directions given by the medical practitioner in charge of any patient are faithfully and diligently carried out.
- (n) At all times keep the said premises, and the yard attached thereto, and all outhouses and buildings, closets, and privies, and all household linen, beds, and bedding appliances and material thoroughly cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer.
- (o) Provide at least one certificated nurse for every patient, and at all times keep employed and on the said premises the minimum number of certificated nurses or attendants inserted in the certificate of registration.

16. The Board may forthwith cancel any registration if the keeper of the premises or any person employed by such keeper or permitted to be on the premises shall commit any breach of or shall neglect or fail to observe any of these By-laws or any of the provisions of the Health Acts or any order or direction given by the Health Officer or Inspector or other competent officer of the Board.

17. All applications for renewal of registration shall be lodged with the Board on or before the first day of November in each year, and the Board may, in its discretion, refuse any such renewal without being required to assign reasons.

18. Any person desiring to be qualified to become a nurse or attendant in any hospital may apply for a certificate to the Health Officer, who may direct the Town Clerk to grant or refuse such certificate, and may require the applicant to pass such examination as the officer thinks fit.

Any certificate granted by the Town Clerk shall be in the Form C, and may be cancelled at any time in the discretion of the Health Officer, but until so cancelled the person named therein shall be qualified to nurse or assist in any hospital registered under these By-laws.

19. These By-laws shall apply to the whole of the district of the Perth Board of Health, and to every hospital whether heretofore or hereafter established.


