WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation

in the *Gazette*, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a Temporary Quarantine Station near Guildford: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in the exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart, as a Temporary Quarantine Station, near Guildford, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed two months from this date, the locality known as "The Piggery and Yard on Helena Location 7."

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Lands Resumption Act, 1894," it is made lawful for the Governor in Council to take any lands that may be required for opening, altering, or diverting roads: AND WHEREAS it is deemed necessary to take the lands in the Schedule hereto attached for opening a road from Cape Leeuwin to the landing place: NOW THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare his intention to take the said lands for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned.

SCHEDULE.

Part of Sussex Location 11, as registered in the books of the Office of Titles in Vol. XXV., Folio 330, in the name of Maurice Coleman Davies.

A strip of land, one chain wide, starting from a point situate about 25 chains North from Cape Leeuwin, and extending in an Easterly direction to a point about 122 chains 80 links South from the South-West corner of Augusta Townsite; as shown on plan Sussex 47, Department of Lands and Surveys.

Perth Park By-laws.

UNDER the provisions of "The Parks and Reserves Act, 1895," the Board appointed to control and manage the Perth Park has, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, made the following By-laws:—

Park to be Open.

1. The Park shall be open for the public from sunrise to 10 p.m. throughout the year.

Persons not to Drive over the Park.

2. No person shall drive upon or over the said Park, or any part thereof (other than a carriage-way), without permission from the Board first obtained.

3. No vehicle, team, cart, or wagon used for carrying any goods, timber, bricks, stone, wood, iron, or merchandise of any kind, nor any camel, pack-horse, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, shall be allowed to enter or pass through the Park.

Injuring or Destroying Trees.

4. No person shall injure, cut, break, deface, pull up, remove, or destroy any tree, shrub, or plant growing on the said Park.

Injuring the Soil, or Surface, or Fences, &c.

5. No person shall cut up, or damage, or disfigure, or interfere with the soil or turf or surface of any part of the said Park, or the roads or footways across, around, or over the same, or with any part of the fences, buildings, water cocks, or seats around or upon the same, or pollute or interfere with any ornamental water therein, or interfere with or destroy any birds or animals therein, in any manner whatsoever.

Persons misconducting themselves.

6. No person shall misconduct himself in any way by indulging in any riotous or indecent conduct, or make use of any indecent or improper language, or commit any nuisance on the said Park.

Lodging on the Park in the Open Air.

7. No person shall camp, lodge, or tarry overnight, or frequent for the purpose of camping, lodging, or tarrying overnight on the said Park, or shall sleep during the day on the said Park.

Posting Bills.

8. No person shall post, stick, stamp, stencil, paint, or otherwise affix or cause to be posted, stuck, stamped, stencilled, painted, or otherwise affixed any placard, hand-bill, notice, advertisement, or any document whatsoever upon any tree, fence, post, gate, wall, flagging, road, path, or any place whatever on the said Park.

Shooting, etc., on the Park.

9. No person or persons shall shoot or discharge any firearms, or throw or discharge any stone or other missile, or set off any fire balloon, or throw or set fire to any fire-works, or kindle or make any fire, on any portion of the Park unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

Selling Goods on the Park.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, merchandise, or things on any portion of the said Park unless the consent in writing of the Board shall be previously obtained.

Races, etc., forbidden.

11. No racing matches with horses, dogs, or otherwise, nor any game of polo, nor any game which may be considered dangerous by the Board, or may be calculated to interfere with the safety or comfort of the general public,

or likely to injure the surface of the ground, shall be allowed on the said Park, except on such portions as may be specially set apart for such purposes, and shown thereon by boundary posts, such boundary posts to be fixed and renewed from time to time as the Board may deem necessary.

Waste Litter of Picnics to be removed.

12. When any person, party, company, society, club, or organisation of any kind shall play any game, or picnic on the Park, he or they (as the case may be) shall immediately, prior to leaving the ground, collect and remove, or cause to be collected and removed, all waste material, bottles, broken glass, scraps, paper, litter, or rubbish of any kind brought or made upon the ground by them.

Cricket and other Games.

13. No person or organised club shall play cricket, football, baseball, racket, or any game of like nature, on any portion of the Park, except on such portion as shall have been or hereafter may be set apart for their peculiar purposes by the Board; neither shall any such games as aforesaid be played on those portions of the Park as are or may be set apart for these peculiar purposes, unless and until the person or club shall have first obtained from the Board a permit in writing so to do.

14. The Board may, if it thinks fit, fix the day or days upon which, and the bounds or limits within which any games or gymnastics may be permitted to take place upon the Park; or they may prohibit any games or gymnastics from taking place upon the said Park.

Cattle not to be Depastured.

15. No person shall cause, allow, or suffer any horse, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs to be or to depasture upon the Park Lands without the special approval of the Board in writing.

Penalty.

16. Every person offending against any of the provisions of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, such sum as may be awarded, not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Boundaries.

17. The boundaries of the Perth Park are as follows:—

DESCRIPTION OF 1720, PERTH PARK RESERVE. 1011 ACRES.

Bounded on the West by 63 chains 64 links of Ferdinand Street, on the North-West by 104 chains 14 links of Thomas Street, on the North-Eastward by 56 chains 56 links of Brooking Street, on the South-Eastward by Bellevue Terrace, part of the Southern boundary of Perth Town Lot L 57, the Western and Southern boundaries of Perth Town Lot L 74 and the Perth-Fremantle Road; and excluding allotment 14/25, Reserve A 588, that part of Perth Suburban Lot B within these boundaries, Perth Suburban Lots 136, 135, 134, 133, 184, 131, 130, 129, 128, and 127, and a public road on the Western boundary of said Lot 184.

1. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business on the first Wednesday of every month, and shall have power to adjourn to any intermediate period; provided that, if the first Wednesday be a public holiday, the Board shall meet on the following Wednesday.

2. At the first meeting of the Board, which shall be held in the month of January in each year, the members present shall choose one of their number to be the Chairman for the ensuing year, but the omission to choose a Chairman at such meeting shall not invalidate any act done by the Board.

3. The Chairman shall have power to call a special meeting for the consideration of any business which he may wish to submit to the Board.

4. The Chairman, or, in his absence, the Secretary, shall convene a special meeting of the Board, upon the written requisition of three members setting forth the objects for which the meeting shall be called, within three days after the receipt of the requisition.

5. Twenty-four hours' notice in writing, at least, shall be given of any special meeting of the Board to every member of the same, and shall be sent by post to, or delivered at, the address of such member.

6. At every meeting of the Board the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and, in his absence, a Chairman shall be chosen by a majority of the members present.

7. Any member of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of one guinea for attendance at any meeting convened in accordance with these Regulations.

8. Any member who shall not be present at any Board, within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for the meeting of the same, shall not be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance.

9. All questions which shall be proposed or considered at any meeting of the Board shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present; each member to have one vote, and in case of an equal division of the votes, the Chairman shall have a casting vote besides his ordinary vote.

10. All proceedings of the Board shall be entered in a journal to be kept for the purpose, and at each meeting of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read and confirmed or amended, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as confirmed or amended.

11. All moneys received by the Board shall be placed to its credit at such bank as the members may from time to time direct, and all payments shall be made by cheques on such account, signed by one member of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary for the time being.

12. The Secretary shall attend every meeting and enter minutes of all the proceedings of the Board, and keep all the books and accounts, conduct the correspondence under the direction of the Chairman, and transact any other business the Board may require. He shall keep a register in which he shall enter the names of all Licensed Surveyors, with the particulars of their certificates, and shall cause such register to be revised forthwith after the issue, cancellation, or suspension of any license. 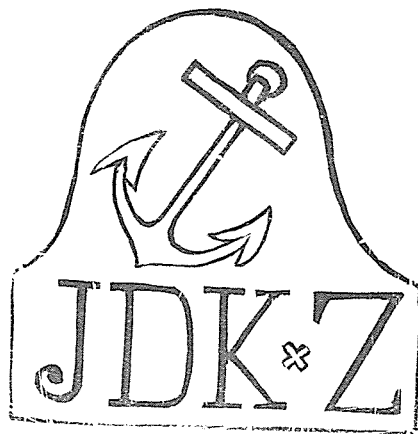
