Bounded on the East by the East boundary of the Colony; on the North by a West line therefrom in direction of Mount Murchison, on the Murchison River; on the West by portion of a line extending South-South-Westwards from Mount Russell to a point situate 12 miles East and about 5 miles South from Trig. Station K 75, on Wyeman-doo Hill; on the South by a line extending East from the point situate 12 miles East and about 5 miles South from Trig. Station K 75, aforesaid, to the 125th meridian of East longitude, and along it South to a point due East from the highest summit of Wongan Hills, and thence due East,

shall be, and is hereby constituted a Magisterial District, to be known as

THE EAST MURCHISON MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

# Amended Regulations under "The Friendly Societies Act, 1894" (58 Vic., No. 23). $1\frac{6}{25}$

N pursuance of the powers and authorities conferred by *The Friendly Societies Act, 1894*, and of every other power and authority enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following amended Regulations in lieu of the existing Regulations numbered 27, 67, 74, and 77, which are hereby cancelled, that is to say:—

27. Every application for approval of change of name must be made, in duplicate, in Form W annexed hereto, and must be supported by statutory declarations, which may be in the Forms X and Y annexed hereto. If approved of by the Registrar, the word "approved" shall be written at the foot or end of each such copy, and the same shall be signed by the Registrar. [S. 21 (2), and s. 9 (3).]

67. No society or branch which contracts with any person for the payment at his death, or for defraying the expenses of his burial, or for any of the purposes of subsections 1 and 4 of section 7 of the Act, of a gross sum exceeding twenty-five pounds, or for a like payment on the death, or for defraying the expenses of the burial of a member's wife, or of any other person other than the member specified in subsection 1 of section 7 of the Act, of a gross sum exceeding fifteen pounds, shall be registered under the Act. Provided that a society or branch may provide for periodical payments under subsections 1 and 4 of section 7 of the Act, exceeding in the aggregate in any case twenty-five pounds. [S. 7 (3), s. 7 (4), and s. 44 (1, o).]

74. Each society and branch which is represented upon the Board shall (unless it desires to discontinue such representation), at the half-yearly or quarterly meeting of such society or branch immediately preceding the first day of February and August respectively, or at a special or ordinary meeting of the society or branch prior or subsequent to such first day of February and August, notice of which has been given as prescribed in Regulation No. 69 for a first election, elect one of its members to take the place of its representative retiring on such first day of February and August; and the member so elected shall, if registered, enter upon office on the first day of February or August as the case may be, or, if not then registered, on the date of such registration, and shall retain office until the expiration of eighteen months, dating from the first day of February or August as the case may be. The retiring representative shall, if otherwise qualified, be eligible for re-election. [S. 44 (1. e, h).]

77. A notice, in duplicate, in Form Ax annexed hereto, of the appointment of the Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, and three trustees, and of any subsequent change thereof, shall, within seven days after the meeting at which the election took place, be sent to the Registrar, signed by the officers named therein and the member presiding; and as soon as possible a statement of the names and occupations of the three trustees shall be lodged with the Registrar of Titles, together with any further particulars he may re-quire, and the fee, as provided by Section 41 of *The Friendly Societies Act, 1894* (hereinafter termed "The Act "). No person appointed as above shall be deemed to be a Trustee until his name has been registered as such by the Registrar and the Registrar of Titles, but the Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer shall hold office from the date of their registry by the Registrar. As provided in section 43 of the Act, all legal proceedings shall be instituted and carried on in the names of the Chairman or Secretary of the Board for the time being. [S. 41, s. 43, and s. 44 (1, f, h).

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

OF THE

# PERTH PUBLIC HOSPITAL,

# MADE UNDER THE 58 VICTORIA NO. 20.

W HEREAS under the powers and provisions of "The Hos-pitals Act, 1894" (58 Vic. 20), the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declared the PERTH GOVERNMENT HOSPITAL to be a public hospital, and has also, with the advice aforesaid, appointed a BOARD OF MANAGEMENT of the said Hospital, to consist of the following members, that is to say: SIR GEORGE SHENTON, Knt., and Messrs. GEORGE RANDELL, W. T. LOTON, W. TRAYLEN, H. D. HOLMES, B. C. WOOD, F. W. MOORHEAD, T. QUINLAN, RICE SAUNDERS, and WALTER JAMES, and Drs. KENNY, TRATMAN, KELSALL, HARVEY and O'CONNOR: AND WHEREAS the said Board have, under the provisions of the said Act, power to make By-laws and Regulations as therein mentioned : Now THEREFORE the said Board, with the approval of the Governor, do make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say :---

#### PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

The Board of Management shall meet at the Hospital on the last Friday in every month, at 4 p.m., or at such other day, place, or hour as may be fixed at any meeting of the Board ; five members to form a quorum.

2. If a quorum be not present at fifteen minutes after the hour appointed for the meeting, those present may fix a day and hour to which the Board meeting shall stand adjourned, otherwise the meeting shall stand adjourned to the next day of meeting.

3. A Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected annually by the Board, at the last meeting of the Board in the month of January in every year, and if neither be present at the time a meeting is constituted, any other member may be chosen to act as Chairman of such meeting by a majority of the members then present. The Chairman shall have a casting vote only.

The Chairman shall sign all important correspondence, and shall be the medium of communication between the Board and the Government. He shall be empowered to explain any resolutions arrived at by the Board, and to give advice and instructions to the officials of the Hospital between the meetings of the Board.

A vacancy occurring in the office of Chairman or Vice-Chairman shall be filled up at the next meeting of the Board after such vacancy has been declared, previous notice being given in the circulars convening the meeting.

The Vice-Chairman shall act as Chairman during the absence from Perth or the illness of the Chairman.

4. At every meeting the minutes of the previous meeting of the Board shall be read and, if approved, confirmed, and the business proceeded with in the following order :-

- Business arising from the minutes read.
- 11.
- Business arising out of correspondence and reports. Business of which notice has been given, and such other III. business as may require immediate attention.

5. At all meetings voting shall be by show of hands, unless in any case a ballot be called for by any three members present: *Provided* that the election of a Chairman or Vice-Chairman shall be by ballot only.

6. Special meetings may be convened at any time on 48 hours' vritten notice to the members, either at the request of the Chairman or of any five members of the Board.

7. No resolution arrived at, or act, matter, or thing done or authorised by or at any meeting shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting unless notice of such intended rescission or amendment be given in the notice convening the meeting at which such rescission or amendment is proposed.

8. The conduct of every meeting shall be in the hands of the Chairman, whose decision on all points of order or as to procedure shall be final.

9. The Board may, from time to time, appoint a sub-committee or sub-committees of any number, with such powers, rights, and privileges, and subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.

#### VOTES OF CONTRIBUTORS AND CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS.

10. Every annual contributor of £1, or a life contributor of £10, shall have one vote.

Every annual contributor of £5, or a life contributor of £50, shall have two votes.

Every annual contributor of £10 and upwards, or a life contributor of £100 and upwards, shall have three votes.

11. The annual meeting of the contributors to the Hospital shall take place on the first Friday in January of every year, when the election of members of the Board shall take place.

12. The proposer of each candidate shall act as scrutineer.

13. Any person proposing a candidate shall produce such candidate's written consent to serve, if elected.

14. The poll shall be taken by receipt, per post or otherwise, of papers containing the names of the candidates voted for, and the signature of the contributor voting. Any voter may vote for any one or more of the candidates.

The Secretary, in conjunction with the scrutineer of each 15 candidate, shall take charge of the voting papers, and at the close of the poll shall draw up a minute of the result, which, when countersigned by the Chairman, shall be entered in the minute book, and shall not be subject to any after dispute or inquiry, except as next mentioned.

16. If the validity of any election is disputed, all questions in dispute shall, within seven days of the election, be referred to and settled by the remaining members of the Board, or, in case of the first election, by the Colonial Secretary.

The last preceding eight rules shall not come into force until the provisions of Section 5 of the said Act have been complied with.

### ADMISSION AND DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS.

18. Every contributor of £1 annually shall have the privilege of recommending one in-door patient; of £5 annually, three in-door patients; and of £10 annually shall have the privilege of always having one patient in the Hospital.

Life contributors shall have the same privilege in proportion; their donations being estimated as annual contributions of onetenth.

It is to be distinctly understood that these recommendations are only to be given to persons who, on account of their poverty, are proper subjects for Hospital treatment; and will have to be renewed at the expiration of six weeks from the admission of the patient.

Applicants for admission to the Hospital who desire to be 19 attended free of charge shall make a statutory declaration, in the form provided for that purpose, that they are unable to pay for medical attendance, and that they are not entitled to medical attendance from any benefit society or lodge. Any person making a false declaration will be liable to prosecution for perjury, and also to be proceeded against under Section 66, Sub-section 2, of "The Police Act, 1892."

20. Every legally qualified medical practitioner, and every member of the Board of Management, may likewise recommend patients for admission; severe accidents and cases of emergency may be admitted at all times by the Resident Medical Officer.

21. The Resident Medical Officer shall not nor shall any other person admit as an in-patient-

- I. Any pregnant female for the purpose of confinement.
- Any person suffering from an incurable disease. II.
- Any person who has disorders for the cure of which ш. other establishments are provided, as lunatics, etc.
- Any person who, requiring food, and not medicine, is more properly an object for a benevolent institution. IV.
  - Any person whose admission might endanger the other v. patients.
  - Any prisoner from the gaol, except an urgent case VI. recommended by the principal Government Medical Officer.
- Any infant on account of the condition of the mother VII. alone.

Provided that any case recommended by a medical officer shall be admitted, whether such case be or be not within the above terms, but the Resident Medical Officer shall forthwith report such admission to the Board.

22. The proper hours for patients to present their recom-mendations for admission to the Hospital are from 10 a.m. to 12 noon, except in cases of emergency, accident, and such like.

No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without 23.the consent of the Medical Officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board, or in cases of misconduct or on the expiration of the term of their admission order.

# OUT RELIEF.

24. Contributors of  $\pounds 1$  annually shall have the privilege of recommending six out-door patients for relief from the Dispensary; contributors of  $\pounds 5$ , twelve patients; contributors of  $\pounds 10$ , fifteen patients. Life contributors shall have the same privilege in proportion, their donations being estimated as annual contributions of one-tenth. It is to be distinctly understood that these recommendations are only to be issued by the contributors to persons who, on account of their poverty, are proper subjects for Hospital treatment, and who are not entitled to medical attendance from any benefit society or lodge.

#### MORAL AND RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

25. Patients are at liberty to receive the visits of Ministers of, or members of any sisterhood in connection with, the religious denominations to which they respectively belong, and the professed religion of every patient shall be entered in the admission book on admission; ministers, and such other persons, as aforesaid, however, will not be allowed to remain in the wards (except in cases of the greatest emergency) during the professional visits of the medical officers; and they shall retire from the ward during such time as may be necessary for the latter-named gentlemen to discharge their duties.

It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion and such other persons, as aforesaid, visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patients, shall visit the patients of their denomination only, and shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in the near vicinity.

26. Any patient wishing any particular minister, sister, or friend to give religious counsel in case of dangerous illness, or apprehension of the approach of death, may signify the same to the nurse, who shall at once communicate with the Resident Medical Officer, or with the Secretary, who shall obtain the presence and services of the minister, sister, or person required, if possible.

27. It is not allowable to conduct public religious services in the sick wards of the Hospital.

28. A room in the Hospital shall, when practicable, be available for public worship among the convalescents of each religious persuasion.

#### VISITORS.

29. Any friends, not exceeding two at any one time on any one day, may, unless prohibited by the Resident Medical Officer, be admitted to the wards, to visit patients on Wednesdays and Sundays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and shall leave the wards punctually at the latter hour. A bell will be rung five minutes before the hour for departure. Exceptions to the above rule will only be allowed by special permission of the Resident Medical Officer, or, in his absence, the Secretary, in favour of near relations or friends of patients in a dangerous state, or to persons residing at long distances and who may be otherwise unable to visit their sick friends at the regular visiting hours. Visitors are strictly forbidden to introduce food, drink, or refreshment of any kind whatever, without the sanction of the Resident Medical Officer; and to insure the perfect observance of this rule, all parcels, &e., must be opened in the presence of the nurse on duty in the ward.

Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting. Children in arms will not be admitted.

Any person found on the Hospital premises, without special permission, at other times than those set apart for the reception of visitors, is liable to be prosecuted in terms of Clause 16 of "The Hospitals Act, 1894."

#### MAINTENANCE OF ORDER AND DISCIPLINE.

30. Patients, when able, and when so desired, shall help the nurses in the needful duties of the wards, and shall attend upon other patients whose weakness and wants are greater than their own, and do such other light work as the Resident Medical Officer may direct.

31. Patients admitted suffering from syphilitic or venereal disease must (if required) sign an engagement to remain until discharged by the Medical Officer in charge of the case, and the infraction of this rule will prevent the patient being admitted at any future time.

Patients in the ward in which such cases are treated are not permitted to receive visitors, except by permission of the Resident Medical Officer.

32. Any patient found gambling or using profane or indecent language, or being intoxicated, or committing any breach of any Rule or By-law or any order of the Board or of any Medical Officer, or refusing to obey any request as by the last preceding Rule mentioned, shall be liable to instant dismissal by the Resident Medical Officer, who may exercise that power, and afterwards report the case to the House Committee. The Resident Medical Officer shall at the same time inform such patient of the day of the next meeting of the Committee.

33. Patients are not allowed to leave the precincts of the Hospital without the special permission of the Resident Medical Officer, given by "pass," which must be left with the porter; and all parcels brought back by patients on their return shall be examined by the nurse.

34. Patients are to take their meals at the ward table, except in cases of necessity. They are to keep their beds neat and tidy, the bedclothes properly arranged, and attend scrupulously to personal cleanliness. They shall also observe a quiet and respectful demeanour towards the officers of the Hospital, the rurses, and each other. Any patient having cause of complaint shall submit the same to the Resident Medical Officer, or Matron, or to a member of the House Committee.

35. On the admission of any patient into the Hospital, his address and that of his immediate relatives, and the name of the professed religion of the patient, shall be taken by the Secretary. The effects of the patient shall be taken charge of by the nurse, who shall hand them to the custody of the Matron; but it must be distinctly understood that, though the Board give positive instructions that every care shall be taken of effects so given in charge, they will not be responsible for any loss or deficiency arising from errors of quantity or description, or from any other cause whatever.

 $36.\,$  On no account shall any officer, servant, or patient be allowed to keep a dog within the precincts of the Hospital.

37. Patients shall observe all Rules, By-laws, or Orders made from time to time by the Board.

# HOUSE COMMITTEE.

38. The Board shall elect a House Committee, which shall consist of the Chairman of the Board, as an *ex-officio* member, and five others to be elected annually.

39. The Committee shall meet at the Hospital at least once in every fourteen days; three members to form a quorum, but with power to one member, if no more be present, to inspect the Hospital, and convene another meeting at such time as may appear to him needful to consider any matter requiring immediate attention.

40. The Committee shall regulate the several departments of the Hospital in accordance with the Regulations or any By-laws or Directions of the Board, and more particularly in reference tc all sanitary affairs, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention, subject in all cases to the same being reported to the Board.

41. The Committee may suspend, upon sufficient cause, any salaried officer or servant other than the Resident Medical Officer, until the decision of the Board can be obtained; with power in the meantime to employ some other properly qualified person tc officiate in the place of the officer or servant so suspended.

42. The Committee may order any repairs or alterations which they consider require immediate attention.

43. The Committee shall hear all complaints that may be made by patients, officers, or servants, and take such action as they may deem necessary in the matter, until the decision of the Board can be obtained, and shall see that the various duties are performed by all the salaried officers and servants of the Hospital

44. The Committee shall keep a book recording the visits of the members, and in which a note shall be made of all matters in connection with their office.

45. The Committee shall examine and pass all accounts and may pay any account of less than  $\pounds 5$ , which requires immediate payment.

46. The Committee may nominate all necessary officers or ser vants whose nominations are not required to be made by the Board, and may fix the remuneration and term of service.

47. The members of the Committee shall hold office for one year only, and be appointed at the last meeting of the Board held in January in each year.

The Board may remove any member of the Committee, and fill any vacancy caused by death, resignation, removal, or other wise.

48. The Board may, at any time, enlarge, add to, modify rescind or restrict any or all of the powers or duties of the Com mittee, or any orders given, or acts done by the Committee.

# PUBLICATION OF ACCOUNTS.

49. Immediately after the second Friday in each year, th Secretary shall prepare and cause to be published in the *Govern* ment *Gazette*, and to be forwarded by circular to all contributors a statement of account, to be countersigned by the Chairman, by order of the Board, showing :—

- The amount of annual contributions, including 10 per cent. of all life contributors' donations.
- 11. The average annual expenditure of the Hospital for the three preceding years.
- III. The number of elected members of the Board to be chosen by the contributors.
- The number of attendances during the year of each member of the Board of Management.

#### MEDICAL STAFF.

50. The Medical Staff of the Hospital shall be nominated by the Board, and shall consist of nine, namely:—One senior physician, one physician, one senior surgeon, one surgeon, one obstetric physician and surgeon, one ophthalmic surgeon, one assistant physician, and one assistant surgeon, more particularly referred to as Medical Officers, and a Resident Medical Officer.

51. All nominations to vacancies occurring in the staff shall be made by the Board at a subsequent meeting to that at which the vacancy is declared.

52. Medical Officers (other than the Resident Medical officer) shall take, in weekly rotation, under medical treatment, all patients admitted during such weekly term of duty, subject to such arrangements as may from time to time be directed by the Board, and shall carry out all such duties and observe all such regulations as may be by these or any future rules defined, or as may hereafter from time to time be required by the Board.

53. The Board may nominate for appointment, as Honorary Consulting Surgeon or Physician, any member of the medical profession who is the principal Medical Officer of the Government for the time being, or who has heretofore held, or may hereafter hold, office as a Medical Officer to the Hospital for a period of ten years. Such surgeons or physicians shall attend at the Hospital when summoned for consultations or operations.

54. The Medical Staff shall hold office during the pleasure of the Governor.

#### RULES OF THE MEDICAL STAFF.

(1.)-HONORARY PHYSICIANS AND SURGEONS.

55. The Obstetric Physician and Surgeon shall attend not less than twice in each week in the forenoon for the treatment of in-patients.

56. The Ophthalmic Surgeon shall attend on the patients affected with diseases of the eye on Tuesday and Friday in each week.

57. It shall be the duty of the Physicians and Surgeons to see and prescribe for the in-patients, and for the out-patients, as hereinafter mentioned.

58. Each Physician to in-patients and each Surgeon to inpatients shall have a taking in week once in every two weeks. He shall receive all ordinary cases, except such as bring with them an order countersigned by any Medical Officer. In the latter case they shall be placed in a bed of the officer so signing.

59. All cases of diseases of the eye and of women shall be placed in the wards (if any) specially assigned to them.

60. No patient who has been in the Hospital under the treatment of one Physician or Surgeon shall be placed in the bed of another for treatment for the same disease, except by mutual arrangement.

61. In the case of there being no vacant beds belonging to the Physician or Surgeon of the week, they shall be placed in any vacant bed, and removed to the ward of the attending Physician or Surgeon as soon as possible.

62. Each Physician and Surgeon shall visit his wards at least twice a week, and shall, as far as possible, adhere to the appointed days and hours.

63. The days and hours of attendance of the Medical Officers shall be decided upon at a meeting of the Officers, held every year in the month of March, and the days and hours shall be selected by the Officers according to seniority.

64. In the unavoidable temporary absence of any Physician or Surgeon, it shall be his duty to arrange for the discharge of his duty by an Assistant Physician or an Assistant Surgeon: and, in the event of any difficulty in so arranging any vacancy in his office, he shall notify it to the Resident Medical Officer, who shall act for him.

65. In the absence from Perth of any Physician or Surgeon, or during his illness or incapacity, or any vacancy at his office, his duties shall be performed by the Assisting Physician or Surgeon.

66. In the absence of the Ophthalmic Surgeon or the Obstetric Physician and Surgeon, the Assistant Surgeon or the Resident Medical Officer shall undertake his duties. 67. The transfer of patients from the medical to the surgical side of the Hospital, or vice versa, or to a Special Department, or vice versa, shall be made to the corresponding Physician or Surgeon, by mutual consent, and the name of the Physician or Surgeon to whom such transfer is to be made shall be endorsed on the bed ticket, and the patient so ordered to be removed shall be transferred with the least possible delay, and notice shall be given to the Medical Officer to whom the case is transferred.

68. The Physician and Surgeon respectively, or, subject to his control, the Resident Medical Officer, shall, from time to time, order in writing on the diet card the particular diet to be supplied to each patient, and no diet except what is ordered on the diet card shall be issued.

69. When a consultation is called, or an operation about to be performed, the Resident Medical Officer shall instruct the Secretary to send notices of the same to the members of the Medical Officers and to the Medical Members of the Board.

70. In arranging the list of operations the Medical Officers shall follow one another in their order of seniority, and, in cases where the assistants are acting, the officers shall have precedence in operating, and the assistants shall follow in the order of seniority of the men for whom they act.

71. No important operation shall be performed without the previous consent of the nation or his friends, nor without a consultation by the Surgical Officers, and, in case of difference, by such officers and the Consulting Surgeon, and at which a majority shall be favourable thereto. The result of each consultation shall be entered in the Consultation Book, to which all the officers present shall attach their signatures.

72. There shall be a book called the "Medical Officers' Attendance Book," which shall show the actual attendance of each Medical Officer.

73. Each Physician and each Surgeon shall attend at the Out-patients' Department twice a week, namely, on Mondays and Thursdays, Tuesdays and Fridays, at such times as may be mutually arranged by the Medical Staff.

#### (2.)—Assistant Physicians and Surgeons.

74. It shall be the duty of the Assistant Physician and Surgeon, in the absence of the Medical Officers, to see and prescribe for the out-patients and the in-patients.

75. Each Assistant Physician and each Assistant Surgeon shall attend at the Out-patients' Department twice a week, viz.: on Wednesdays and Saturdays, at such times as may be mutually arranged by the Medical Staff.

76. The Assistant Surgeon shall attend all operations, and render such assistance as may be required.

77. In the absence of a Physician or Surgeon, his duties shall be performed by the Assistant Physician or Surgeon.

78. In case of the unavoidable absence of the Assistant Physician or Surgeon he shall make arrangements with the Resident Medical Officer for the performance of his duties.

#### RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

79. The Resident Medical Officer shall be appointed by the Governor, on the recommendation of the Board, and be a duly qualified practitioner, resident in the Hospital, and unmarried, and shall be Resident Head of the Hospital.

80. He shall be responsible for the general supervision of the Hospital, and shall have the entire control of all patients and of all salaried officers and servants of the Hospital.

81. He shall have power to suspend any officer or servant, subject to immediate report to the Chairman of the House Committee.

82. In the absence of the Medical Officers he shall be the principal Medical Officer of the Hospital, with full power to interpose in the treatment of patients in cases in which urgent circumstances appear to him to render his interference necessary.

83. In the absence of any Assistant Staff he shall, if required by them, make arrangements for, or himself undertake the discharge of their duties.

84. He shall have the sole charge of the Operating Book, and shall keep an accurate record of all operations performed, with results.

85. He shall have the charge of, and be responsible for, the surgical instruments and apparatus, and may cause ordinary repairs to be effected thereto, and on taking office shall sign the inventory in proof of the correctness thereof. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no alteration or additions to any instrument or apparatus shall be made, except on his written direction, or that of one or more of the Medical Staff, subject to the approval of the Board.

86. He shall summon the police to take charge of any case of attempted suicide or criminal violence, and after such time shall not be responsible for the detention of the patient.

87. He shall not, unless required by these Rules, or by the Board, or a Medical Officer, undertake any routine medical or surgical work in the wards; but by general supervision see that all officers and servants strictly perform their respective duties, and carry out the instructions of the staff, and also keep a thorough and complete record of all cases treated in the Hospital.

88. He shall have full power to admit or refuse to admit the friends of any patient, as he may think fit, and may, at his discretion, prevent the admission of visitors to a ward at any time.

89. On the death of any patient he shall intimate the same to the Medical Officer under whose care the patient shall have been, and on receiving information of the time at which a *post mortem* will be convenient, he shall communicate with the Staff.

90. He shall visit the wards every morning and evening, at 8.80 a.m. and 7 p.m., he shall accompany the Members of the Staff during their visits to the wards and see that the orders of the Medical Officers are carried out, that the medicines are of proper quality and properly administered, and shall give particular attention to the temperature and ventilation of the wards.

91. He shall, with the aid of the Secretary, as far as possible, satisfy himself that every applicant is deserving of relief; but all cases recommended for admission by members of the Board and Staff shall not come under this Rule.

92. He shall, during the winter, deliver a course of lectures to the Nursing Staff, attendance at which shall be compulsory.

93. He shall sign all certificates awarded to Nurses who may have gone through a course of training in the Hospital, which must be countersigned by the Chairman of the Board.

94. He shall devote his entire time to the service of the Hospital, and shall not engage in private practice.

95. He shall perform such other professional duties as may from time to time be determined by the Board.

96. He shall afford the Board and House Committee every information, and furnish them with reports on all matters within his control as may seem to him necessary.

97. In all correspondence on Hospital business, except such as occurs directly with the Staff, the Resident Medical Officer shall transmit the same through the office, so that a permanent record may be kept.

98. He shall conduct all correspondence with the outside public in reference to the treatment or condition of patients, and no communication shall be made except with his consent or on his directions.

99. It shall be his duty to make all necessary communications to the Press touching cases of accident or assault admitted to the Hospital.

100. He shall be responsible for, and, with the assistance of the Medical Staff and Secretary, shall prepare the Annual Report, in so far as the medical portion is concerned.

101. He shall always be on duty on the days of the Board or House Committee meetings, and also during the hours of attendance of the Medical Officers, except by special permission of the Chairman of the House Committee.

102. In the absence of the Secretary, all matters which in the ordinary way would be referred to him, shall be referred to the Resident Medical Officer.

103. He shall have two weeks' leave of absence annually, the taking of which shall be compulsory. Any further leave of absence must be arranged for through the Board.

104. Leave of absence for more than twenty-four hours at other than the times above mentioned must be arranged for with the Chairman of the House Committee.

105. He shall not be out of the Hospital at any time during the absence of the Dispenser, nor on any night later than 12 o'clock, unless he has obtained from the Chairman of the House Committee special leave.

106. In case of his illness the Resident Medical Officer shall report to the Chairman of the Board, who shall arrange for the discharge of his duties.

107. The Resident Medical Officer shall, in the intervals between the visits of the Physicians and Surgeons, take charge of the patients who have been seen by them; but he shall not alter the treatment or diet adopted by the Physicians and Surgeons, except when such a change of symptons occurs as shall make it absolutely necessary to do so. In every case of emergency he shall at once communicate with the Medical Officers.

108. He shall, on admission of all patients into the wards, enter or cause to be entered in the case-book a full report of their previous history and their present condition.

109. He shall enter into the case-books a daily report of the progress and treatment of every patient under the care of the Medical Officers.

110. He shall undertake any investigation calculated to elucidate the history and symptoms which he has to report, and especially such investigations as the Medical Officers may direct. 111. He shall not publish the report of any case without the written permission of the Physician or Surgeon under whose care the patient has been.

112. He shall not perform any operation without the consent of the Medical Officer having charge of the case, except in cases of special emergency.

113. He shall administer anæsthetics subject to the instruction of the Medical Staff; no anæsthetics shall be administered in the Hospital except in the presence of a Medical Officer.

114. The Resident Medical Officer shall, in the event of a member of the Staff requiring any special instrument, notify the same to the Chairman of the House Committee.

- 115. In respect to the operating theatre he shall see :---
  - I. That the windows and ventilators, etc., are in proper working order.
  - 11. That there is a good supply of various antiseptic lotions, dressings, bandages, etc.
  - III. That all instruments bandages, dressings and other appliances be neatly and carefully arranged in proper and suitable places.
  - IV. That it be thoroughly, regularly, and completely cleaned.
  - v. That it be kept locked.
  - vi. That previous to operations it be properly warmed.
  - VII. That there is a plentiful supply of hot water.
  - viii. That all instruments likely to be required are laid out in readiness, thoroughly aseptic and in good working order.
  - That all sponges have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.
  - x. That immediately after an operation all the instruments used, when permissible, be scalded, cleansed, rendered aseptic and replaced in their proper places in the operating case.
  - xI. That immediately after any operation all marble slabs, basins, etc., be thoroughly scrubbed and cleaned.

116. He shall see that the following weekly reports, with such others as may be ordered, are submitted to the Chairman of the House Committee :—

- 1. Return of all in and out patients.
- 11. Return of cases of typhoid fever.
- 111. Return of cases of infectious and contagious diseases.
- Return of patients in Hospital more than six weeks, and reason for detention.

117. He shall examine and prescribe for out-patients when required by the Board or House Committee, accidents and emergencies being attended to at any time.

118. Misconduct on the part of the Resident Medical Officer shall render him liable to suspension by the Chairman of the Board.

#### SECRETARY.

119. The Secretary shall be nominated by the Board, and, subject to any written agreement, hold office during the pleasure of the Governor, and shall devote the whole of his time to the service of the Hospital, and shall not be engaged, directly or indirectly, in any business or profession.

120. He shall conduct the correspondence, and have the charge of all documents relating to the Hospital. He shall summon and attend all meetings of the Board and of Committees, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of these meetings shall be respectively inserted, and shall see, as far as practicable, that all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect.

121. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms, and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board and the House Committee whenever required.

122. He shall issue and be accountable for the clothing, bedding, linen, glass, crockery, cutlery, and cooking and kitchen utensils, and make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which he shall regularly enter the receipt and expenditure of such articles; and he shall, in the months of June and December of each year, prepare and submit to the Trustees a list of such things as may be required in his department for the ensuing half-year.

123. He shall, under the direction of the Board, order and receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and tradesmen, and see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity with the tenders and orders; and in case they do not so correspond, he shall have power to return the same, and shall be responsible for the due issue thereof.

124. He shall see that a sufficient quantity of stores be provided for the use of the Hospital.

125. He shall not procure any stores from other tradesmen than those appointed by the Board.

126. He shall make out a daily diet roll, by which the number of patients on each diet may be known.

127. He shall see to the daily delivery to the cook of the proper quantity of provisions for the day's consumption, according to the diet roll, and shall weigh, measure, and deliver to the Wardsman and Nurses the groceries and medical comforts for those patients for whom they are ordered.

128. He shall carefully examine all the tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles, and make up the accounts for presentation to the House Committee at their next monthly meeting.

129.He shall receive all moneys paid at the Hospital, and enter the same in the cash book, and pay the same into the Bank, and obtain a receipt in due form from the Bank for the amount paid in.

130. He shall present a copy of the By-laws to every employé who may be appointed, immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he shall keep in the office for that purpose. He shall keep an interleaved book containing the By-laws, and shall insert any new By-law of order as soon as it shall have been passed by the Board, and shall at once communicate it to the person or persons to whom it may relate.

He shall not issue stores of any kind except for use in the 131.Hospital, and shall be responsible that no portion of the property in his charge be wastel or removed from the Institution.

132. He shall see that all parts of the Hospital grounds are kept in a proper state of cleanliness and order, and that the employés generally do their duty.

133. He shall report to the House Committee any repairs which may be necessary, and give attention to the same during the progress of any works. He shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in an efficient state.

134. He shall receive all property and moneys from patients on admission, and enter particulars thereof in a book to be kept for the purpose, giving the patient a receipt therefor, and on the discharge of the owner he shall return the same, taking a proper receipt.

135. In the event of the death of a patient he shall, when practicable, communicate immediately with the relations or friends.

136. He shall be responsible for handing over all unclaimed bodies to the undertaker for decent interment, and shall hand over all those claimed to the friends of the deceased.

137. He shall prepare a paper for the Chairman at every meeting of the Board or a Committee, giving an outline of the business for consideration, and he shall make a report of the manner in which he has acted upon the orders and resolutions of the preceding meeting, whether the same have, or have not, been fully carried out.

138. He shall, on the day following each Board or Committee Meeting, transcribe into the Minute Book fair copies of the minutes taken at such meeting.

139. He shall balance the cash book at the end of each month, noting whether such Balance agrees with that shown by the bank book, and if not agreeing, explain the cause of the difference.

140.He shall not lend any books or papers belonging to the Hospital, or permit them to be inspected or removed, without the express permission of the Board, which permission shall be duly minuted.

141. He shall keep the contributors' book, and shall enter therein and in the cash book all subscriptions or donations received, and shall report the same at the next meeting of the House Committee.

142. He shall copy in a press copy-book all letters written on the business of the Institution, and shall execute all orders he may receive from the Board or any Committee or the Chairman thereof.

143. He shall have control of the Hospital Library, and shall not lend any books or papers therefrom.

144. He shall, whenever practicable, instruct and drill the male employés in hose practice and the use of the fire saving appliances, and in the event of fire shall assume supreme command.

#### MATRON.

145. The Matron shall be nominated by the Board, and, subject to any written agreement, hold office during the pleasure of the Governor, and reside in the quarters provided for her, and shall devote the whole of her time and attention to the superintendence and general management of the Nursing Staff of the Hospital. She shall also take the entire charge of the domestic affairs of the Nurses' Home and of the Hospital generally, and have full control over all Nurses indof the hispital generally, and have line contaction; and in case of disobedience to orders, misconduct, or neglect of duty on the part of any Nurse or female employé, she shall have power to suspend such Nurse or female employé, reporting fully thereon in writing through the Secretary at the earliest opportunity.

146. She shall see that all Nurses strictly carry out the directions of the Medical Staff and Resident Medical Officer relative to the treatment of the Patients.

147. She shall report in writing all resignations, vacancies, leave of absence, promotions, and defects in the Nursing Staff to the House Committee through the Secretary; and she shall furnish fortnightly to the House Committee a report as to the efficiency or otherwise of the Nursing Staff.

148. She shall be careful to see that all articles of clothing, bedding, etc., are kept in thorough repair; and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and regularly aired in the airing ground provided for such purposes, and that no bedding which has been in use be stored away without previous airing.

149. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of fuel, gas, etc., and see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order, cleanliness, and punctuality prevail throughout the establishment.

150. She shall visit each Ward at least twice every day, carefully supervising all that appertains to the nursing and home departments, or that may contribute to the comfort and welfare of the patients and to the efficiency of the Hospital generally.

151. She shall receive from the Secretary (on requisition made in writing) all clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital, and for the care and custody of which she shall be responsible.

152. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the Nurses' Home, the quality, quantity, and preparation of the food, the state of the dormitories, and the comfort generally of the Nurses; and shall guard as far as possible against irregularities of conduct on the part of Nurses and Servants, such as late hours, absence without leave, etc., and by the maintenance of a wholesome discipline on her part, and among her subordinates, and by impressing upon them a high sense of the responsibilities devolving on them, secure to the Institution an efficient and reliable Nursing Staff.

153. She shall be responsible that no Ward be left without the presence of a Nurse or Junior Nurse.

154. She shall give such practical and theoretical instruction as may be necessary for the training of the Nurses; and in addition to the ordinary instruction shall see that all Nurses be practically instructed in all branches of cooking for the sick, such as making beef-tea, arrowroot, gruel, chicken broth, puddings, etc.

155. She shall take care that the Nurses attend the lectures and other forms of instruction given in accordance with the By-laws by the Medical Staff and Resident Medical Officer.

156. She shall report on the character and conduct of the Nurses prior to their discharge, and the issue to them of a certificate of efficiency.

157. She shall take care that the Wards and Patients are in a proper state of order and cleanliness.

158. She shall keep a journal, in which shall be recorded all breakages and events of importance connected with the Nursing Staff or her duties as Matron, which shall be submitted to the House Committee at its fortnightly meetings.

159. She shall submit to the House Committee, through the Secretary, such minor rules as she may deem necessary for the discipline of all persons placed under her control; copies of which, when approved, shall be hung up in various parts of the Institution.

160. She shall see that all lights are extinguished in the Nurses' bedrooms by 10.30 p.m.
