With reference to Lord Knutsford's Circular Despatch of the 13th August, 1889, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your Government, copies of an Order of the Queen in Council, dated the 22nd February last, respecting the tonnage measurement of ships of the German Empire.

Present :
THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 23rd day of July, 1889, made by Her Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862, Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct as follows :—

1. As regards sailing ships, that merchant sailing ships of the German Empire, the measurement whereof after the 1st day of January, 1873, has been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such sailing ships, testified by the date thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in such registers and other national papers in the same manner and to the same extent, and for the same purpose in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British sailing ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships.

2. As regards steamships, that merchant ships belonging to the said German Empire, which are propelled by steam or any other power requiring engine room, the measurement whereof shall, after the said 1st day of January, 1873, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such steamships, testified by the dates thereof, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted on such registers or other national papers in the same manner and to the same extent, and for the same purpose, in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the Certificate of Registry of British ships is deemed to be the tonnage of such ships. Provided, nevertheless, that if the Owner or Master of any such German steamship desires the deduction for engine room in his ship to be estimated under the rules for engine room measurement and deduction applicable to British ships instead of under the German rule, the engine room shall be measured and the deduction calculated according to the British rules; and that, in the event of any such steamship possessing a certificate of tonnage or other national paper issued as aforesaid on or after the 20th day of June, 1888, denoting the net registered tonnage of such ship under the British rules, the ship shall be deemed to be of the tonnage so denoted thereon.

And whereas by Section 84 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that, whenever it appears to Her Majesty the Queen in Council that the tonnage regulations of that Act have been adopted by any foreign country, and are in force there, Her Majesty in Council may order that the ships of that country shall, without being re-measured in Her Majesty's dominions, be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty in Council that the tonnage regulations of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, have been adopted by the Government of His Majesty the German Emperor, and such regulations are now in force in the German Empire, having come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1895:

And whereas there still are or may be ships belonging to the German Empire to which the hereinbefore recited Order of the 23rd July, 1889, may apply, and it is expedient not to revoke the same, but to let the said recited Order remain in force so long as there are any ships to which the same may so apply:

And whereas the provisions of Section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty (in pursuance and exercise of the powers hereinbefore mentioned) is hereby pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to direct that the merchant ships of the German Empire the measurement whereof shall, after the 1st day of July, 1895, have been ascertained and denoted in the registers and other national papers of such ships, shall be deemed to be of the tonnage denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers in the same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes as the tonnage denoted in the certificate of registry of a British ship is deemed to be the tonnage of that ship.

1.—PORT JACKSON, SYDNEY.

The fixed red light on Fort Denison is visible 5 miles, and is arranged so as to guide vessels coming up or going down harbour.

It cannot be seen—through a small sector—to the Southward, owing to there being two lanterns, one of which shows up the harbour and the other down.

SHARK BAY, OUTER BAR.

The best passage over the outer bar is indicated by two beacons, having triangles on their ends. The two kept in line will lead over the outer bar in four fathoms.

The passage between the outer and inner bars is also buoyed. Three iron buoys with staff and cage are placed on the Southern edge of the bank, skirting the North side of the channel, and should all be left on port hand on entering.

The buoys are painted black.

The deepest water over the inner bar (sand) is also marked with a wooden cask buoy, which should be left on starboard hand on entering.

This buoy is painted red.

CARNARVON.

The coal hulk, from which a light was formerly displayed, has been removed, and a lighthouse is being erected on the Western edge of Babbage Island, nearly in the centre from North to South.

COSSACK.

Cossack Creek, which is tidal and nearly dry at L.W. springs, has the best channel marked by buoys. Three iron buoys, with staff and cage, have been placed on the Western side of the channel, and should be left on starboard hand by small craft going up the creek.

The height of the lighthouse tower on Jarman Island is 30 feet, and not 50 feet, as stated on page 276 of the Directory.

KING SOUND.

An iron buoy, with staff and cage, is moored in 4 fathoms L.W. Springs, off the N.W. end of the Elbow Shoal, rather further South than the chequered fairway buoy shown on the chart, which latter has been removed.

The Elbow Shoal buoy, which should be left on the port hand on entering, is painted black.

The buoy shown on the same chart off the end of Point Torment Spit, has been removed.

The Mary Island anchorage of five fathoms at L.W. is marked by a wooden cask buoy, painted white.

The jetty stated on page 238 of Directory to extend into the Amur Pool does not do so, as it lies considerably to the Southward. The words, "into Amur Pool," should therefore be erased.

The jetty at Derby lies nearly due West of Derby townsite, as shown on the chart.

WYNDHAM, CAMBRIDGE GULF.
