With reference to the Marquess of Ripon's Circular Despatch of the 12th April, 1893, forwarding copies of Orders in Council, dated the 18th August, 1892, and the 30th January, 1893, modifying the Regulations for the prevention of Collisions at Sea, I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of a letter from the Board of Trade (B.T., 9th March, 1896), with its enclosures, from which you will observe that the Order in Council of the 30th January, 1893, has been revoked by the new Order in Council of 8th February last, which should be published in the Colony under your Government.

Copies of the Report of the Committee on the screening of Ships' Side Lights referred to in the Board of Trade

letter are enclosed, but it has not been considered necessary to forward to you the Minutes of Evidence and Appendices which form a separate and somewhat bulky volume.

SIR,
With reference to the letter from this Department of the 29th March, 1893, forwarding copies of an Order in Council of the 30th January, 1893, explanatory of Articles 3 and 5 of the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea as regards the screening of Ships' Side Lights, I am directed by the Board of Trade to state, for the information of Mr. Secretary Chamberlain, that a Committee was appointed by Mr. Bryce, on the 18th March, 1895, to report on the Screening of Ships' Side Lights, and I am to transmit, herewith, a copy of their Report, together with the Minutes of Evidence and Appendices.

The Board, upon the issue of the Report, decided to adopt forthwith the recommendations numbered 1 to 4, in page 17, and issued interim instructions to their Surveyors on the subject, copies of which are forwarded herewith.

Subsequently Her Majesty was pleased, by an Order in Council of the 8th ultimo, to rescind the Order in Council of the 30th January, 1893, above referred to, and I am to transmit, herewith, copies of the rescinding Order in question, and to suggest for Mr. Chamberlain's consideration that the various Colonial Governments may be so informed, and that the copies of the Board's Instructions to Surveyors and of the Order in Council which accompany this letter may be forwarded to them for their information.

I am to add that the Board of Trade propose shortly to revise their General Instructions to Surveyors, with respect to Ships' Lights, on the lines of the suggestions made by the Committee, and that copies of the revised Instructions will be forwarded to you as soon as they are published.

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made in pursuance of the Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1862, and dated the 11th day of August, 1884, Her Majesty, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, was pleased to direct that on and after the 1st day of September, 1884, the Regulations contained in the Schedule thereto should, so far as regards British ships and boats, be substituted for the Regulations contained in the First Schedule to an Order in Council made as aforesaid, and dated the 14th day of August, 1879:

And whereas by two Orders in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated respectively the 30th day of December, 1884, and the 21st day of June, 1885, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, as regards British fishing vessels and boats:

And whereas by another Order in Council made in pursuance of the said Act, and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated the 18th day of August, 1892, certain modifications and additions were made to the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said recited Order in Council of the 11th August, 1884, as regards steam pilot vessels:

And whereas by the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, it is, amongst other things, provided as follows:

Art. 3.—A seagoing steamship, when under way, shall carry

- (a.) On or in front of the foremast, at a height above the hull of not less than 20 feet, and if the breadth of the ship exceeds 20 feet, then at a height above the hull not less than such breadth, a bright white light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship, viz., from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on either side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least five miles.

(b.) On the starboard side, a green light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the starboard side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(c.) On the port side, a red light, so constructed as to show an uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to two points abaft the beam on the port side, and of such a character as to be visible on a dark night, with a clear atmosphere, at a distance of at least two miles.

(d.) The said green and red side lights shall be fitted with inboard screens projecting at least three feet forward from the light, so as to prevent these lights from being seen across the bow.

And whereas by another Order in Council, made in pursuance of the said Act and on such joint recommendation as aforesaid, and dated the 30th day of January, 1893, the said Regulations contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, were further modified by the addition to the said recited Article 3 of the provisions contained in the Schedule to the said Order in Council now in recital and set out in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas the Admiralty and the Board of Trade have jointly recommended to Her Majesty that the said recited Order in Council of the 30th day of January, 1893, should be rescinded to the intent that the modifications and additions made to the said recited Article 3, and set out in the Schedule hereto, should no longer continue in operation:

And whereas Her Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, on the 12th day of December, 1895, by a *Provisional Order* within the meaning of The Rules Publication Act, 1893, to rescind the said Order in Council of the 30th January, 1893.

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of The Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

NOW, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to rescind the said recited Order in Council of the 30th day of January, 1893, and to direct that from the date of this Order the provisions contained in the Schedule to the last-mentioned Order and to this Order shall cease to be in operation, and the said recited Article 3 of the said Regulations contained in the said Order in Council of the 11th day of August, 1884, shall have effect as if the said Order in Council of the 30th day of January, 1893, had never been made.

SCHEDULE.

(c.) To ensure that the red and green side lights shall show an uniform light from right ahead of the ship to two points abaft the beam on the port and starboard sides respectively, and shall not show across the bow of the ship itself, the said lights must be fixed and the screens fitted so that the rays from the red and green lights shall cross the line of the ship's keel projected ahead of the ship at a reasonable distance ahead of the ship.

With regard to all vessels whose lights are inspected by the officers of the Board of Trade, the red or green side light will not be deemed to be fixed and fitted in accordance with the Regulations unless it is so fixed and screened that a line drawn from the outside edge of the wick to the foremost end of the inboard screen of such light shall make an angle of 4 degrees, or as near thereto as may be practicable, with a line drawn parallel with the keel of the ship from the outside edge of the wick.

The fixed red light on Fort Denison is visible 5 miles, and is arranged so as to guide vessels coming up or going down harbour.

It cannot be seen—through a small sector—to the Southward, owing to there being two lanterns, one of which shows up the harbour and the other down.

SHARK BAY, OUTER BAR.

The best passage over the outer bar is indicated by two beacons, having triangles on their ends. The two kept in line will lead over the outer bar in four fathoms.

The passage between the outer and inner bars is also buoyed. Three iron buoys with staff and cage are placed on the Southern edge of the bank, skirting the North side of the channel, and should all be left on port hand on entering.

The buoys are painted black.

The deepest water over the inner bar (sand) is also marked with a wooden cask buoy, which should be left on starboard hand on entering.

This buoy is painted red.

THE West Australian Government deſire to give notice that the New Lighthouse on Rottneſt Island will be lighted on the 17th March inſt., after which the light hitherto ſhown from the Old Tower will ceaſe.

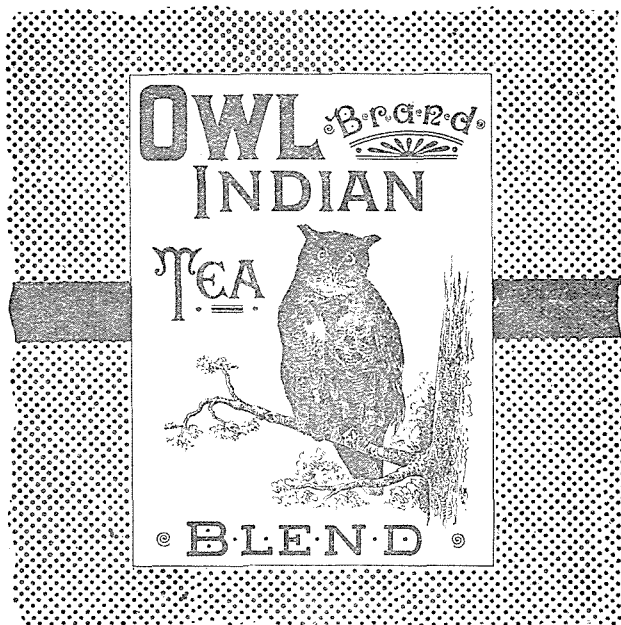

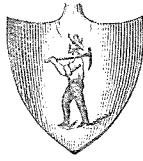

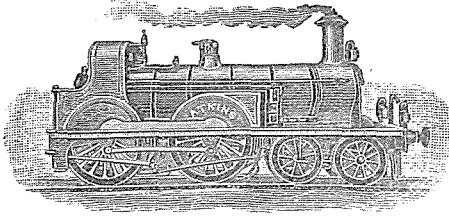

By-Laws of the North Fremantle Local Board of Health.

NOTICE is hereby given that the following By-laws for the Municipality of North Fremantle, under the Public Health Act (50 Vic., No. 19), have been confirmed by the Central Board of Health, and will come into operation from the date of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

Under the provision contained in Section 24 of the Public Health Act (50 Vic., No. 19), the Local Board of Health for North Fremantle, by the powers therein conferred, doth hereby make the following General By-laws for the abatement and prevention of nuisances, and for securing the healthfulness of the inhabitants of the Town of North Fremantle.

BY-LAWS.

Section 1.—The Local Board of Health, or the Chairman, may, from time to time, appoint any place or places within the Town of North Fremantle, or elsewhere, for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive refuse, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector of the said Board may at all times have free ingress and egress upon the said places, and such place or places shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the said Board; and it shall be lawful for the said Board to receive compensation from the owner of such place or places for such deposit, and the money so received shall be applied by the said Board in carrying out the above-mentioned Act.

Section 2.—No person shall exercise or practise the business of a nightman or drive any night-cart within the limits of the town of North Fremantle, until and unless he shall have obtained a license to do so from the Inspector of the Local Board of Health.

Section 3.—Every person desirous of carrying on the business of a nightman, whether as master or labourer, shall make an application for license to do so at the Inspector's office, which application shall be in writing, and shall be signed by two or more respectable householders, certifying the fitness of the applicant to hold such license; and such license he shall, upon presentation of such certificate and registry being made of his true personal and family name and place of abode, be entitled to receive. Provided that it shall be lawful for the Inspector to refuse to issue such license to any person who shall have been convicted of any offence against the provisions herein contained.

Section 4.—Nightmen's licenses shall be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto annexed marked A, or to the like effect, and shall be numbered in such manner as shall be approved by the said Local Board.

Section 5.—Nightmen's licenses shall be of two kinds, namely:—Masters' Licenses and Labourers' Licenses; and any person applying for a license before the 1st July shall be liable to pay a yearly license; but one taken out after that date shall only be considered and charged as a license for the half-year, but every license shall terminate on the 31st day of December: Provided that, apart from or in addition to any penalty which may be inflicted under the provisions hereof, it shall be lawful for the said Local Board, upon being satisfied of the misconduct of any licensed nightman whilst engaged in the business for which he shall be so licensed, to cancel such license, or to suspend the operation thereof for any such time as the said Local Board may think proper; and if any such nightman shall, after such cancellation, or during the period of such suspension of his license, practise such business as if under the authority of such license, he shall be subject to and liable, upon conviction thereof before any one or more Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Section 6.—Any owner of property who is desirous of moving nightsoil, &c., from his own premises or the premises of his tenants, and shall conform with these By-laws, shall be permitted to so cleanse his premises, and shall not be liable to the 7th Section of these By-laws, and his license for private use shall be endorsed.

Section 7.—Every licensed master nightman shall, within twenty-four hours of demand made for that purpose, properly clean any cesspit, or earth closet, or buckets kept for the reception of nightsoil, dustbin, or other offensive matter, and shall be entitled to receive and charge therefor, from the occupier or owner of the premises, or person

living therein, the sum set out in the schedule of these By-laws, which sum shall be recoverable in a summary manner before one or more Justices of the Peace. If any licensed master nightman, except holders of private licenses, shall, without good, just, or lawful excuse, neglect, decline, or refuse to properly cleanse any such cesspit, earth closet, bucket, dustbin, or other offensive matter as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws under this Act, and may be proceeded against for every such offence before any Justice or Justices of the Peace.

Section 8.—Whenever any licensed nightman shall change his place of abode, he shall, within two days next after such change of abode, give notice thereof in writing to the Inspector, specifying his place of abode, and shall at the same time produce his license to the Inspector, who shall endorse thereon his change of residence.

Section 9.—If any person, for the purpose of securing a nightman's license, shall use or employ, or cause to be inserted in such license, any false or fictitious name or description of his place of abode, he shall be subject to the penalty described herein for offences against the provisions hereof, and any license so obtained, having such falsehood therein, shall be cancelled.

Section 10.—Every licensed nightman, whenever or so long as he shall be engaged in removing any night-soil or other offensive matter or thing, or in driving any night-cart, or otherwise in conducting the said business, shall carry with or about him his license, and shall produce and show the same whenever required by any ratepayer to do so; and such license he shall, on no pretence whatever, lend or part with to any person.

Section 11.—Every licensed nightman, before using any cart or other carriage as a night-cart, shall register the same in such manner as the said Local Board may direct, in the office of the Inspector, and shall receive a memorandum of the number assigned to such cart: Provided that no such registration of any night-cart shall be made unless and until such cart has been inspected by the Inspector or other officer appointed for that purpose by the Local Board of Health, and certified by him to be fit and suitable for the purpose of a night-cart.

Section 12.—Every licensed nightman shall, whilst using any cart or other carriage as a night-cart, have painted and kept at all times conspicuous, on the right or off side thereof, white upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman" in letters no less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and the number assigned to such night-cart in figures not less than four inches in length and of proportionate breadth.

Section 13.—For every such offence against any of the provisions of these By-laws to which no fixed penalty is herein attached, the offender shall, upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Section 14.—For the purpose of this By-law the word "nightman" shall be understood to mean any person who is licensed to remove, or assist to remove, any nightsoil, or other foul or offensive matter or thing whatever; and the words "night-cart" shall mean any cart or other carriage of any description whatsoever, used by any nightman for the conveyance of any night-soil, ammoniacal liquor, or other offensive liquid or substance.

Section 15.—The occupier or occupiers of premises whereon earth closets or buckets are kept for the reception of night-soil shall keep the same clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause them to be cleansed at least once every three days, and any person neglecting or refusing to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Section 16.—Each house shall be provided with a dustbin of a size to be approved by the Inspector, and shall be kept clean and free from offensive smell, and shall be cleansed at least once every month, or so often as the Inspector may direct.

Section 17.—Any licensed master nightman or licensed labourer or other person who shall ask or demand or receive from any person or persons, for work done by him, a sum greater than that fixed by the Schedule to these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

Section 18.—Every bucket or pan kept for the reception of night-soil shall be first approved by the Inspector, and shall be free from leaks and holes, and shall have affixed thereto a handle working on a pivot at each side.

Section 19.—Whenever in these By-laws any act, deed, matter or thing is directed to be done, or any act, deed,

matter or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, comply, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing or prevent being done, any act, deed, matter or thing, shall be deemed guilty of an offence under these By-laws; it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person is the occupier or owner.

Section 20.—All penalties recoverable under these By-laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance 50 Victoria, Number 19. Wherever in these By-laws the word Inspector is used, it shall be taken to mean the Inspector for the time being of the said Local Board or any one acting in his place.

Section 21.—Every closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the contents being carried through any dwelling house; and every person building a closet contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

Section 22.—No closet shall be erected except in such position as shall be approved by the Inspector of Nuisances, or other officer appointed by the Local Board of Health; and any person being guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

Section 23.—Any person who shall lay, cast, or throw, or shall cause, permit, or suffer to be laid, cast, or thrown, any bottle, bottles, broken glass, china, crockery, empty tins, or other refuse or rubbish, in or upon any carriage-way, footway, street, beach, reserve or other public places within the district of the said Local Board shall, upon conviction thereof before one or more Justices of the Peace for the district, forfeit and pay for the first offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings or less than Ten shillings; for the second offence, a sum not exceeding Five pounds or less than Twenty shillings; and for the third and subsequent offences, a sum not exceeding Ten pounds or less than Thirty shillings for each such offence.

Section 24.—It shall be within the power of the Board to refuse to issue any further licenses should the Board have made satisfactory arrangements, by contract or otherwise, with one or more nightman to carry out the scavenging of the Town in accordance with the By-laws.

Section 25.—No scavenger shall remove any night-soil within the limits of the town except between the hours of 11 o'clock p.m. and 5 o'clock a.m. Anyone infringing this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

UNDER the provisions contained in Section 24 of the Public Health Act (50th Vic., No. 19), and amendments thereto, the Local Board of Health of Beverley, by the powers therein contained, do hereby make the following By-laws for the abatement and prevention of nuisances, and for securing the healthfulness of the Municipality of Beverley.

GENERAL BY-LAWS.

1. Words used in these By-laws and having meanings assigned to them by the 50th Vic., No. 19, Section 2, as amended by 55 Vic., No. 22, shall have the same meaning in these By-laws.

2. The Local Board of Health may, from time to time, appoint any place or places within the Municipality of Beverley, or elsewhere, for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive or refuse matter, and may, at any time, cancel or vary such appointment; and the Inspector of the said Board may, at all times, have free ingress and egress upon the said places, and such place or places shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose by the said Board; and it shall be lawful for the said Board to receive compensation from the owner of such place or places for such deposit, and the money so received shall be applied by the said Board in carrying out the above mentioned Act.

3. No person shall deposit, place, or put any nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive or refuse matter whatsoever, from any house, stable, cow-house, lane, yard, or other premises in the Municipality of Beverley, in any place within the said Municipality other than the place or places appointed by the Local Board of Health for such purpose under the last Section, except in such box or receptacles as the Board may from time to time authorise.

4. No person shall exercise, or practise, or be in any manner concerned in the business of a nightman, or drive any night-cart within the limits of the Municipality of Beverley until after and unless he shall have obtained a license to do so from the Inspector of the Local Board of Health.

5. Every person desirous of carrying on the business of a nightman, whether as master or labourer, or otherwise, shall make an application for a license so to do, at the Inspector's office, which application shall be in writing, and shall be signed by two or more respectable householders, certifying the fitness of the applicant to hold such license; and such license he shall, upon presentation of such certificate, and registry being made of his true name and place of abode, be entitled to receive: Provided it shall be lawful for the Inspector to refuse to issue such license to any person who shall have been convicted of any offence against the provisions herein contained.

6. Nightmen's licenses shall be in the form contained in the Schedule annexed (marked A), or to the like effect, and shall be numbered in such manner as shall be approved by the said Local Board.

7. Nightmen's licenses shall be of two kinds, viz., master's licenses and labourer's licenses; and every license, of whatever description, and at whatever period of the year the same be granted, shall remain in force only until the thirty-first day of December next ensuing: Provided that, apart from or in addition to any penalty which may be inflicted under the provisions hereof, it shall be lawful for the said Local Board, upon being satisfied of the misconduct of any licensed nightman whilst engaged in the business for which he shall be so licensed, to cancel any such license or to suspend the operation thereof for any such time as the said Local Board may think proper; and if such nightman shall, after such cancellation or during the period of such suspension of his license, exercise the duties of a nightman, he shall be subject to and liable, upon conviction thereof before two Justices of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

8. If any person, for the purpose of securing a nightman's license, shall use or employ, or shall cause to be inserted in such license any false or fictitious name, or description of his place of abode, he shall be subject to the penalty described herein for offences against the provisions hereof, and such license shall be cancelled.

9. Whenever any licensed nightman shall change his place of abode, he shall, within two days next after such change of abode, give notice thereof in writing to the Inspector, specifying his new place of abode, and shall at the same time produce his license to the Inspector, who shall endorse thereon a memorandum specifying the particulars of such change.

10. Every licensed nightman, whenever or so long as he shall be engaged in removing any nightsoil, or other offensive matter or thing, or in driving any night-cart, or otherwise in conducting the said business, shall carry with and about him his license, and shall produce and show the same whenever required by any person to do so, and such license he shall, on no pretence whatever, lend or part with to any person.

11. Every licensed nightman, before using any cart or other carriage as a night-cart, shall register the same, in such manner as the Local Board may direct, in the office of the Inspector, and shall receive a memorandum of the number assigned to such cart; provided that no such registration of any night-cart shall be made unless and until such cart shall have been inspected by the Inspector, or other officer appointed for that purpose by the Local Board of Health, and certified by him to be fit and suitable for the purpose of a night-cart.

12. Every licensed nightman shall, whilst using any cart or other carriage as a night-cart, have painted, and kept at all times conspicuous on the right side thereof, white upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman" in letters not less than two inches in length and of proportionate breadth, and the number assigned to such cart in figures of not less than four inches in length, and of proportionate breadth.

13. Every night-cart shall be kept by the owner thereof watertight and free from leakage, and shall be provided with covering so as effectually to prevent any splashing or spilling of anything carried therein.

14. Every licensed nightman shall, within twenty-four hours of demand made for that purpose by the person responsible for such cleansing, as hereinafter mentioned, or by any person authorised in that behalf by the Local Board, properly cleanse any cesspool or earth closet, or bucket kept for the reception of nightsoil, dustbin, or other offensive matter, and shall be entitled to any charge therefor from the occupier of the premises, the sum that shall be fixed by the Local Board from time to time, of which due notice shall be given in, at least, one local paper.

If any licensed master nightman shall, without good, just, or lawful excuse, neglect, decline, or refuse to properly cleanse any such cesspool, earth closet, bucket, dust bin, or other offensive matter as aforesaid, he shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws and may be proceeded against for every such offence before two Justices of the Peace for the district.

15. Any licensed master, nightman, or licensed labourer, or other person who shall ask or demand, or receive from any person or persons, for work done by him, a sum greater than that fixed by the Local Board from time to time provided in Section (14) shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

16. No privy or cesspool shall be emptied, nor any night-soil carted away, nor any offensive liquor or matter of any kind whatever pumped out of or removed from any house or premises whatever within the said Municipality between the hour of 5 a.m. and the hour of 11 p.m. of any day.

17. The word "nightman" shall be understood to mean any person who, for remuneration, shall remove, or assist to remove, any nightsoil or other foul or offensive matter or thing whatever, and the words night-cart shall mean any cart or other carriage of any description whatsoever used by any nightman for the conveyance of any night-soil, ammoniacal liquor or other offensive liquor or substance.

18. The occupier or occupiers of premises whereon earth closets, or buckets, or other receptacles above ground are kept for the reception of night-soil, shall keep the same clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause them to be cleaned at least once a week, and any person refusing or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

19. Every bucket or pan or other receptacle, kept for the reception of night-soil, shall be first approved by the Inspector, and shall at all times be free from leaks and holes, and shall have affixed thereto a handle working on each side.

20. Every closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the contents being carried through any dwelling house or occupied building, and every person having or building a closet contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

21. No closet shall be erected except in such a position as shall be approved by the Inspector or other officer appointed by the Local Board of Health; and any person being guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds.

22. Any person who shall lay, cast, or throw, or shall cause, permit, or suffer to be laid, cast, or thrown, any bottle, bottles, broken glass, china, crockery, empty tins, or other rubbish or refuse in or upon any carriage-way, foot-way, street, reserve, or other public place within the district of the said Local Board shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more Justices of the Peace for the District, forfeit and pay, for the first offence a sum not exceeding Forty shillings, for the second offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds, and for the third and subsequent offences not exceeding Ten pounds for each such offence.

23. Whenever in these By-laws any act, deed, matter, or thing is directed to be done, any person who shall not comply with, do, comply, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing, or prevent being done, any act, deed, matter, or thing shall be guilty of an offence under these By-laws; and in determining the responsibility of the person against whom any proceedings may be taken under the By-laws it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person is the occupier of the premises whereon the offence is committed.

24. For every offence against any of the provisions of these By-laws to which no fixed penalty is attached herein, the offender shall, upon conviction before two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

25. All penalties recoverable under these By-laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance 50 Vic., No. 19.

Whenever in these By-laws the word "inspector" is used, it shall be taken to mean the inspector for the time being of the said Local Board, or anyone acting in his place.
