WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the THIRD SESSION OF THE SECOND PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA to be holden under the provisions of the said Act and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Tuesday, the 7th day of July next, at the hour of three of the clock p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

The fixed red light on Fort Denison is visible 5 miles, and is arranged so as to guide vessels coming up or going down harbour.

It cannot be seen—through a small sector—to the Southward, owing to there being two lanterns, one of which shows up the harbour and the other down.

SHARK BAY, OUTER BAR.

The best passage over the outer bar is indicated by two beacons, having triangles on their ends. The two kept in line will lead over the outer bar in four fathoms.

The passage between the outer and inner bars is also buoyed. Three iron buoys with staff and cage are placed on the Southern edge of the bank, skirting the North side of the channel, and should all be left on port hand on entering.

The buoys are painted black.

The deepest water over the inner bar (sand) is also marked with a wooden cask buoy, which should be left on starboard hand on entering.

This buoy is painted red.

CARNARVON.

COSSACK.

KING SOUND.

An iron buoy, with staff and cage, is moored in 4 fathoms L.W. Springs, off the N.W. end of the Elbow Shoal, rather further South than the chequered fairway buoy shown on the chart, which latter has been removed.

The Elbow Shoal buoy, which should be left on the port hand on entering, is painted black.

The buoy shown on the same chart off the end of Point Torment Spit has been removed.

The Mary Island anchorage of five fathoms at L.W. is marked by a wooden cask buoy, painted white.

The jetty stated on page 238 of Directory to extend into the Amur Pool does not do so, as it lies considerably to the Southward. The words, "into Amur Pool," should therefore be erased.

The jetty at Derby lies nearly due West of Derby townsite, as shown on the chart.






