W HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the Third Session of the Second Parliament of Western Australia to be holden under the provisions of the said Act and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Tuesday, the 7th day of July next, at the hour of three of the clock p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

# GENERAL ORDER.

EXCELLENCY the Governor desires to express his entire satisfaction with the discipline and appearance of the Local Forces paraded for the celebration of the Birthday of Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen.

The respective movements on Parade were carried out with correctness and precision, and testified to the careful training which the Local Forces are receiving.

The Queen's Colour, which was presented by His Excellency on that occasion, is the first ever presented on behalf of the Queen by any Governor of Western Australia, and the first that has been borne by the Local Forces of this Colony.

His Excellency trusts that the possession of it will be a source of constant pride and gratification to the Troops who march under it in discharge of their duty.

As the words which were spoken by His Excellency on the occasion of this presentation could be only imperfectly heard by all ranks, they are herewith appended for general information.

#### Committal.

In the name and on behalf of Her Most Gracious Majesty Victoria, Queen of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, I commit this banner to your keeping. Guard it with your life from destruction or capture. Live under its folds in purity and peace, that you may be able to answer with a good conscience when you relinquish it to other hands that you have faithfully discharged the sacred trust reposed in you, both in the sight of man and of Almighty God. Amen.

### Address.

It would occupy too much time were I to dwell upon the origin of flags as military symbols or rallying points, but it may not be out of place that I should very briefly describe to you the symbolical character of the flag you now carry.

It is that which we familiarly term the Union Jack, and its formation arises from a combination which is at once of historical and religious interest. On the latter aspect I will not touch.

The original flag of England was the banner of St. George, white, with a red cross vertically placed, and it so remained until the time when, in 1606, three years after James I. of Scotland ascended the throne of England, there was incorporated with it the banner of Scotland, viz., blue, with a white diagonal cross. This was the combination which first obtained the name of Union Jack, the word "Jack" being a corruption of Jacobus, or James.

Later, upon the union with Ireland, in 1801, the banner of Ireland, viz., white, with a diagonal red cross, was amalgamated with it, thus forming the present Union Jack.

Upon the flag you carry there is added the device of this Colony, a swan floating on the surface of a summer sea, which should symbolise to you peace and serenity in life, and also (if ancient legends may be trusted) sweetest harmony in death.

You will see, from what I have said, that the symbolical amalgamation of the various devices forming this Union Jack is of comparatively modern origin. Yet I may remind you that this is the flag which, throughout the civilised world, has been carried by British troops and British sailors to deeds of incomparable valour.

It was borne at the masthead by Nelson, Collingwood, Howe, and Camperdown, and flew on that memorable occasion at Trafalgar, when below it the signal was made that "England expects that every man this day will do his duty."

It is the same flag which, in the early days of this century—now drawing to a close—led Englishmen in actions of such imperishable fame as Badajoz, Vittoria, Barossa, St. Sebastian, Vimiera, Toulouse, and Waterloo, and, in later years, those of Alma, Balaclava, Inkerman, and Sevastopol.

It is, I earnestly trust, improbable that you may be called upon to follow this flag against the enemies of our beloved country, but, should such be the case, I feel confident you will, in doing so, emulate the glorious deeds of our forefathers in generations that have passed away.

In conclusion, I ask you to remember, and to impress upon all your comrades, that this flag, to be borne with true fidelity, must be at all times the landmark which points you to three special obligations:—

The first is that of quick and unquestioning obedience to all who are placed in authority over you.

The second consists in the recognition of that highest expression of the moral and social law, which men term honour.

The third is courage, whether in prosperity or adversity; for to bear even prosperity with courage and prudence is a duty we owe to ourselves and to our fellow creatures.

Relying then on your obedience, your honour, and your courage, I heartily wish all who march under these colours every happiness in life, and peace at the last.



Y virtue of the provisions of Section 4 of "The Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act, 1895," His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations:—

Regulations under "The Fertilisers and Feeding Stuffs Act, 1895."

1. The fee payable to the Agricultural Analyst by the buyer or seller of any article manufactured or found in the Colony of Western Australia, or imported from abroad, used for fertilising the soil, for an analysis of same shall be as follows:—

2. The fee payable to the Agricultural Analyst by the buyer or seller of any article used as food for live stock which has been artificially prepared or manufactured in the Colony of Western Australia, or imported from abroad, for an analysis of same shall be as follows:—

3. Every seller and every buyer of any article used for fertilising the soil shall be entitled, on payment to the analyst of the fee or fees in accordance with Regulation 1, to have the article analysed by the analyst and to receive from him, within fourteen days, a certificate of the result of his analysis.

The certificate of the analyst shall be in the following form:—

I, the undersigned, A.B., analyst, do hereby certify that on the day of , 18 , I received a sample, labelled [here state name of fertiliser, and of the manufacturer or importer, his place of business, trade mark, or figure (if any)], for analysis, the result of which is as follows:—

Percentage of nitrogen.
Percentage of soluble phosphates.
Percentage of insoluble phosphates.
Percentage of Potash.

- 4. Every seller and every buyer of any article used as food for live stock which has been artificially prepared or manufactured in the Colony of Western Australia or imported from abroad, shall be entitled, on payment to the analyst of the fee or fees in accordance with Regulation 2, to have the article analysed by the analyst and to receive from him, within fourteen days, a certificate of the result of his analysis.
- 5. The buyer, on receiving delivery of any fertiliser or feeding stuff and before otherwise breaking the bulk thereof, shall, in the presence of the analyst, a Justice of the Peace or a police constable, take three samples of the article and cause them to be marked with the date and place of sampling, the names of the persons present, the figures or trade mark on each package, sealed, and fastened up, and shall deliver or send by post (prepaid), one sample with the invoice or a copy thereof to the analyst, and shall deliver or send by post as aforesaid another sample to the seller, and retain the third sample for future comparison.
- 6. On the request of the buyer or seller of any fertiliser or feeding stuff, and on payment of the fee prescribed by Regulations Nos. 1 and 2, the analyst, or some person appointed by him in that behalf, before or at the delivery of the article, shall take the samples on behalf of the buyer.
