WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the THIRD SESSION OF THE SECOND PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA to be holden under the provisions of the said Act and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Tuesday, the 7th day of July next, at the hour of three of the clock p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

WHEREAS a certain townsite is about to be proclaimed a townsite, under the name and style of "Great Boulder," such townsite consisting of land bounded as hereafter mentioned in the Schedule hereto: AND WHEREAS such townsite is included in and forms portion of the East Coolgardie Goldfield: AND WHEREAS, under the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," power is given to the Governor of the said Colony, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to except from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, any specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, except such townsite from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, such townsite being a specific portion of Crown Lands within a Goldfield, to wit, "The East Coolgardie Goldfield." And I do order all persons from and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to take notice hereof, and govern themselves accordingly.

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any Stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the Sea-coast in Western Australia, being "Ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the introduction of imported stock into this Colony, except in conformity with and subject to the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. All stock imported into Western Australia shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration of the owner or breeder of the stock, or manager of the farm or station from which they come (in addition to the certificate of a veterinary surgeon, as required by "The Stock Diseases Act of 1895") to the effect that such stock were at the time of departure from their farm or station, and had been for three months immediately preceding, free from disease, and had not, for such period, been in contact with diseased animals, and shall perform quarantine for the following periods, that is to say:—

If coming from beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies and New Zealand.

Sheep	14 days
Horses	14 days
Cattle	30 days
Camels	40 days
Pigs	30 days
Dogs	6 months
Goats, Deer, Llama, & Antelopes	30 days.

If coming from any of the Australian Colonies or New Zealand.

Sheep (except for slaughter)	...	7 days
Cattle (except for slaughter)	...	30 days
Camels	...	40 days

And if, during the period of quarantine, any signs of disease be exhibited, then, if not ordered to be

destroyed, such stock shall be kept in quarantine for such period as the inspector shall direct, and treated as he shall deem necessary.

2. All sheep and cattle intended for immediate slaughter may be landed on the permit of an inspector, and removed to such place as he may direct, and shall not be again removed alive without his written permission.

3. No stock which may lawfully be imported shall be landed at any Port other than Fremantle, Albany, Champion Bay, Cossack, and Esperance, unless they shall have been first inspected and passed by an inspector of stock at any one of the aforesaid ports.

4. All stock found on arrival by an inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be forthwith destroyed or kept and treated in quarantine, as such inspector shall direct.

5. No person shall enter or leave a quarantine ground without the permission of an inspector, *in writing*, and every person who shall enter shall, if the inspector shall so direct, disinfect himself and his clothes in such a manner as the inspector shall order.

6. All expenses of landing, removing to, maintaining, and keeping in quarantine, and of disinfecting or otherwise treating any stock, and all expenses in connection therewith shall be paid by the owner or consignee of such stock to the inspector upon demand, and before such stock shall be removed from quarantine.

7. All expenses of destroying any stock, or of disinfecting or destroying any fodder or fittings, shall be paid by the owner or consignee thereof to an inspector upon demand.

8. The owner or consignee of any stock, fodder, or fittings shall deposit with the inspector, upon demand, such sum of money as shall be deemed by such inspector sufficient to defray all the expenses of inspection, maintenance, disinfection, medicine, attendance, transshipment, or conveyance to or from the quarantine ground of such stock, fodder, or fittings respectively; of disinfecting the vessel or conveyance in which such stock, fodder, or fittings shall have been conveyed to the Colony, or to or from a quarantine ground; veterinary surgeon's fees for inspection, and all costs, charges, and expenses of every description in connection with or attendant upon the introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings. If such sums be not forthwith paid on demand, as aforesaid, such stock, fodder, or fittings may be sold by an inspector for the purpose of defraying such expenses, fees, costs, and charges.

9. Any stock found at any time to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or suspected by the inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or affected with tick or lice, or any parasite, may be seized by an inspector and placed in quarantine, and there treated as the inspector may direct, at the owner's expense, until clean; or if the disease should be of such a nature that, in the opinion of the inspector, such stock should be destroyed, the inspector shall report the case to the Minister, who may order the destruction of such stock at the owner's expense.

Provided that the whole amount of fees for inspection of any one shipment by the same owner shall not exceed £5.

11. The Chief Inspector of Stock may give permission in writing to any occupier of land in Western Australia, who is also the occupier of land in South Australia adjoining such first mentioned land, for stock to be brought from such land to adjoining land within the Colony, for the purpose of depasturing or being kept on such land for any period therein mentioned, not exceeding six calendar months at any one time, provided that such stock shall not by reason of such permission become "introduced" stock, nor allowed to be on any land in Western Australia, except on land mentioned in such permission.

12. Any owner intending to introduce any cattle by land into Western Australia shall give notice thereof in writing to the inspector of stock in the district into which they are to be introduced, in the form in Schedule A hereto, such notice to be delivered not less than seven days before the introduction of such cattle, and shall produce a certificate of a duly qualified Government inspector that such cattle have been successfully inoculated against pleuropneumonia immediately prior to their departure for Western Australia.

13. The crossing place for stock in the Kimberley District, *via* South Australia, shall be at the Ord Station; and the crossing place for stock in the Eucla District, *via* South Australia, shall be where the present road from South Australia crosses, about 8 miles North-East from Eucla.

14. No cattle adjudged by an inspector to be diseased shall cross the Border into Western Australia, and any person so introducing such diseased cattle shall be subject to a penalty of Five pounds per head.

15. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two hundred pounds, or imprisonment not exceeding six months where not otherwise provided.

16. Whenever any expenses, fees, costs, or charges have been incurred by an inspector under these Regulations, he may sell the stock, fodder, or fittings in respect of which the same were incurred for the purpose of defraying all or any such expenses, fees, and charges.

17. The Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 17th January, 1896, are hereby cancelled.

Regulations for the Control and Management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

Perth, 10th June, 1896.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vic., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, and 13th December, 1893, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof:—

1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of £4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.

2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of March in each year. Provided, that in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block, irrespective of the area.

3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.

4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.

5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.

6. No person shall destroy or preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.

7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.

8. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.

9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.

10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so called "Pick-up banks."

11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.

12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year; the exact dates to be named in such notice.

13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.

14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.

15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.

16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.

17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.

19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed 2 square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of £1.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas.

21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may in open Court refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.

22. All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a *bonâ fide* manner to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.

23. The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.

24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.

25. It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be final.

PENALTIES.

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

Yalgoo Local Board of Health.

IN accordance with the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1886" (subject to amendments), the following By-laws have been framed to regulate the business of the above Board:—

1. This Board shall meet for the transaction of general business on alternate Tuesdays, at 8 p.m. Special meetings may be called at any time deemed necessary by the Chairman or any two members of the Board.

2. All moneys belonging to the Board shall be placed in a bank to the credit of the Board, and none shall be drawn therefrom except by cheque signed by the Chairman or any member of the Board, and countersigned by the secretary and treasurer.

3. The duties of the secretary shall be to attend and take minutes of all meetings of the Board, keep accounts, and perform all other clerical work that may be necessary.

4. The duties of the Health Inspector shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the Public Health Act at present in force, and to carry out its provisions under instructions from the Board; to visit occasionally, not less than once a month, the various portions of the Board's district, and, if necessary, give his advice or instructions to occupiers of premises as to the prevention or abatement of nuisances or removal of offensive matter; to keep a record of all such instructions given to abate nuisances, etc., and to furnish the Board, at each fortnightly meeting, with a written report of all such nuisances abated, and the general sanitary state of the district.

5. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other places shall be kept and maintained in such sanitary condition as shall satisfy the Inspector; and all orders given by such Inspector for the removal or abatement of any nuisance shall be complied with by the owner, agent, or occupier of the premises on which the nuisance is located.

6. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other premises shall be provided by the owner, occupier, or agent thereof with a sufficient number of substantially constructed closets, each closet to be fitted with a pan, bucket, or any other receptacle as may be ordered by the Board, and all such pans, buckets, or as the case may be, shall be emptied at least once a week, or oftener if required by the Inspector, and any person refusing or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

7. Every pan, bucket, or other receptacle of nightsoil shall be free from leakage, and must be to the approval of the Inspector.

8. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, empty bottles, or tins, or other rubbish in any street or other place within the Board's district, other than those places set apart for that purpose, shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing same, be subject also to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

9. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offal, manure, or other offensive substance within the limits of the townsite of Yalgoo or closely adjacent thereto, if such burning or destruction creates, or is likely to create a nuisance, except in such cases as in the opinion of the Inspector or any member of the Board any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt, when such Inspector or member of the Board may give permission, verbally or otherwise, for such rubbish, offal, manure, etc., to be burnt.

10. In event of any death or accident necessitating the slaughter of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals within the limits of the Board's district, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the limits of the townsite of Yalgoo and thoroughly burned and destroyed to the satisfaction of the Inspector or any member of the Board, by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, or sheep, as the case may be. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be subject, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Five shillings, and not more than Ten pounds.

11. This Board may from time to time appoint any place or places within its district for the reception of night-soil, manure, offal, or any other rubbish or offensive matter, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.

12. Wherever in these By-laws the "Board" is used, it shall be taken to mean the "Yalgoo Local Board of Health," and the word "Inspector" shall be taken to mean the Inspector of Nuisances for the time being, or any other person duly appointed to act in his stead.

13. Whenever in these By-laws any act, deed, or thing is directed to be done or any act, deed, or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, or cause to be done, any act, deed, or thing shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and in determining the responsibility of the person or persons against whom any action may be taken under these By-laws, it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person or persons is the occupier or are the occupiers of the premises wherein the offence is committed.

14. In case of any breach, non-observance, or non-performance of any of the foregoing By-laws, the person or persons guilty of such breach, non-observance, or non-performance of these By-laws shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not less than Five shillings or more than Ten pounds.

15. All penalties recoverable under these By-laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance 50 Victoria, No. 19.
