WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Con-stitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly : Now THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the THIRD SESSION OF THE SECOND PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA to be holden under the provisions of the said Act and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Tuesday, the 7th day of July next, at the hour of three of the clock p.m.: the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, in St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.






