By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under the provisions of the 49th Section of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," it is lawful by the Governor, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to establish on any Goldfield one or more Courts, to be presided over and holden by a Warden, and to be called a Warden's Court, and which shall be a Court of Record, and shall possess such jurisdiction as is conferred by Part IV. of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that a Warden's Court shall be established at Murrin Murrin, North Coolgardie Goldfield: Now THERE-FORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a Warden's Court at Murrin Murrin, in the Mount Margaret District of the North Coolgardie Goldfield, such Court to be presided over and holden by the Resident Warden of the said Goldfield, or, in his absence, by the Acting Warden thereof.

To take effect from the 17th August, 1896.

## Municipality of Northam.

BY-LAW No. 1.

A BY-LAW of the Municipality of Northam, made under Section 123 of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," and numbered (1), for prescribing the materials and description of and for fences to be erected under the aforementioned Section.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Municipality of Northam order as follows :-

- That a fence, as laid down in Section 123 of "The (1.)Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," shall be of the following description, viz. :- 5in. x 4in. sawn posts, 4in. x 2in. sawn rails, 3in. x 3in. sawn pickets, spaced not more than 3in. apart. Fence to be not less than 4ft. in height from the surface of the ground, and erected in a substantial manner.
- (2.)That no fence erected under the Section referred to shall be of an inferior description to the foregoing.

Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law will be liable to a penalty of not exceeding Five pounds nor less than Five shillings.

Passed by special resolution of the Council, this 9th day of July, 1896. Confirmed by the Council, July 16th, 1896.

# City of Perth.

#### By-laws for the Management of Jetties and Wharves.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for the Regulation and Management of all Jetties, Piers, Wharves, or Landing Places within the City: It is therefore ordered by the Council of the City of Perth, by virtue of the provisions contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Victoria, No. 10), and by virtue of any other powers or authorities in that behalf exercisable by the said Council as follows :--

#### Interpretation.

1. In the construction of these By-laws (unless the context shall otherwise indicate) the following terms in inverted commas shall bear the meaning and include the things severally assigned or set against them :--

- "Owner."—The owner of any vessel, and, when more than one owner, then all such "owners."
- "Cargo."—All goods, wares, merchandise, chattels, and effects of whatsoever kind or description.
- "Vessel."—Any boat, flat, barge, dumb barge, or other vessel, whether propelled by steam, electricity, or otherwise.
- "Jetties."—All jetties, piers, wharves, or landing places, the property of the City Council, or which have been handed over by the Governor to the care and management of the Council.
- "Licensing Officer."—The Town Clerk of Perth, or any other officer of the Council authorised to discharge any duty or exercise any power or discretion hereby vested in the Licensing Officer.

#### By-laws.

2. These By-laws shall be known and may be cited as the Jetty By-laws.

## Every owner to apply to Council for License.

3. The owner of every vessel which carries to or from, deposits on, or takes from any jetty any cargo, shall make an application to the City Council for a license for such vessel, as set forth in Schedule A hereto.

#### License Fee.

4. The owner of such vessel shall pay in advance a fee of Twenty shillings per annum for such vessel if a steamer, and Ten shillings per annum for any other vessel.

#### Possession of License.

5. No cargo shall be landed or placed on or taken from any jetty except by a licensed vessel.

- (a.) The license of every vessel shall be in the continuous possession of the master or other person in charge of the vessel, and be produced at all times on demand to the Licensing Officer.
- (b.) The number of the license shall be painted on each bow of the vessel in clear and distinct figures, of not less than three inches in length, and of a colour in contrast to that of the vessel, and to be approved of by the Licensing Officer.
- (c.) Every licensed vessel shall, at all times, be in charge of a master whose name shall be endorsed on the license.

On every change, the name of the new master shall be forwarded in writing to the Licensing Officer, by the owner

#### Payment of Tolls, &c.

6. The owner of every such vessel shall be liable to, and shall pay the tolls or dues mentioned in Schedule B hereto, for all cargo discharged at, placed upon, or taken from, or loaded at any jetty, out of, or into such vessel, subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth.

#### Liability of Owner violating By-law.

7. The owner of any vessel who shall in any way violate or fail to observe, or permit any violation, or neglect of the conditions of any By-law herein contained, or whose employés, or any of them, shall be guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws, shall be liable to have the license of such vessel cancelled or suspended by the Licensing Officer.

8. No owner, master, or person in charge of a vessel shall, after taking in any cargo at any jetty, cast off or leave such jetty (except for temporary purposes), or permit or suffer such vessel to be cast off or leave such jetty until he has delivered a certificate in writing to the Licensing Officer, setting forth the full particulars of all cargo on board such vessel, and until he has paid all fees and tolls due in respect thereof, as mentioned in Schedule B, and obtained a receipt therefor.

- (a.) Every owner, master, or person in charge of any vessel shall, before discharging or permitting the discharge from such vessel of any cargo at any jetty, deliver a certificate, in writing, to the Licensing Officer, setting forth the full particulars of all cargo contained in such vessel, and of the amount (if any) discharged from such vessel since its place of departure, and shall pay all dues payable in respect of such cargo as mentioned in Schedule B, and obtain a receipt therefor.
- (b.) No cargo shall be discharged before compliance with By-law No. 8, and no cargo shall be taken in after compliance with By-law No. 8.

#### Council may repair Jetties, Sc.

9. The City Council may, at any time, repair any jetty, and may for such purpose place any bars or other erections or barriers across or along the same.

### Regulation as to Vessels at William Street Jetty.

10. No vessel shall be fastened to any part of the William Street Jetty, except to such ring-bolts or other fastenings as are or may be provided for that purpose, and no vessel or boat shall lie alongside such jetty unless so fastened.

Boats not to be fastened for any period longer than necessary. 11. No vessel shall be so fastened as aforesaid to the William Street Jetty, except for the purpose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period than shall be necessary or reasonably required for such purposes.

12. Any and every vessel made fast to, or lying alongside the William Street Jetty shall, on the approach of any passenger steamer, immediately be hauled off to a sufficient distance, or its position shifted to a sufficient distance, and there remain until all passengers shall have disembarked or embarked.

No Stone, &c., to be loaded or unloaded at William Street Jetty.

13. No stone, bricks, sand, lime, firewood, timber (either round or square), or manure, shall be loaded or unloaded on the said William Street Jetty (except sawn scantling not exceeding forty-eight (48) square inches at the ends, nor twenty (20) feet in length): Provided, however, that firewood may be carted on the jetty for the use of steamers, but must be taken direct from the carts to the steamers, unless by special consent of the Licensing Officer first had and obtained.

#### Officer of Corporation to have supervision of Jetties, &c.

14. The Licensing Officer shall, at all times, have the supervision and control of all traffic on the jetties, and direct the movements, position, speed, or otherwise, of earts, wagons, or other vehicles passing to or from any of the jetties: And in case of the refusal of any driver to obey the instructions or command of such officer, he shall be deemed to have committed an offence against these By-laws.

#### No Vessel shall make fast or lie alongside Jetly to discharge or take cargo after sunset or before sunrise.

15. No vessel shall make fast or lie alongside any jetty for the purpose of discharging or taking in any cargo, after sunset or before daylight, unless by written permission of the Licensing Officer.

## Every Vessel shall occupy space allotted.

16. On the arrival of any vessel at any jetty, it shall be berthed at such place or places as may be directed by the Licensing Officer.

#### Licensing Officer to assi n berths for vessels.

17. Every vessel shall be removed to such berth or berths, position or positions, as the Licensing Officer may from time to time direct.

#### Liability of owner for loss or damage.

18. The owner of every vessel shall be personally liable for all loss or damage to any jetty, and any crane, bolt, or other fixture or fitting thereon, done or occasioned by any person employed in such vessel or in the loading or discharging thereof.

(a.) All such repairs may be done and effected by the Council, and unless the amount be paid within seven days after demand, the same may be recovered by the Council summarily or other-wise, and all licenses must be applied for, and will be granted only on the conditions that the owner agrees to accept this liability.

No fishing nets shall be hung on or spread about any part of any Jetty.

19. No fishing nets shall be hung on or spread about any part of any jetty.

No fishing allowed off any Jetty except with rod or line.

No fishing shall be allowed from or off any jetty 20.except with a rod or line, and then only at such times and places as will not interfere with the traffic or work on such jetties, and subject at all times to be restricted or prevented by the Licensing Officer.

# No bathing allowed off or near the Jetty after 7 a.m., nor before 8 p.m.

No person shall, between the hours of seven (7) a.m. 21 and eight (8) p.m., bathe within one hundred feet of any jetty, and no person shall bathe within the hours aforesaid without suitable bathing costume or clothing.

All goods to be moved from Jetties within 24 hours.

22. All cargo must be removed from any jetty within twenty-four hours of the time it is deposited there, unless by special permission of the Licensing Öfficer.

No bullock teams allowed on William Street Jetty.

23. No bullock teams shall be allowed on the William Street Jetty.

Damage to Jetties.

Any person wilfully or negligently damaging any of 24.the said jetties, or any crane, bolt, or other fixture thereon, shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws.

No gunpowder, dynamite, or other combustibles to be landed on Jetty.

No explosive as defined by Section 4 of the 59 Vic-25.No. 38, shall be landed on any of the jetties except by special written consent of the Licensing Officer first had and obtained, and subject to the provisions of the said Act, 59 Vic., No. 38.

No stones or substances to be thrown into the water.

26. No stones, rubbish, or any other substance what-soever shall be thrown into the water from any jetty, or from any vessel lying alongside or within one hundred feet of any jetty.

No fires to be lit on Jetty, or Jetties.

27. No fire shall at any time be lit or made on any jetty. All cargo to be carefully removed from carts to the vessels.

28.All cargo carted on to any jetty shall be carefully removed from the vehicles carrying the same into the vessels receiving the same, and shall in no case be shot from such vehicle on to the jetty : Provided that this By-law shall not apply to sand, stone, gravel, soil, or manure which is carefully loaded or unloaded on any jetties or wharves other than the William Street Jetty.

29. The owner of any cargo shall remove the same from the jetty where the same is within twenty-four hours of the deposit thereon or in default, shall become liable to and shall pay a rent therefor at the rate of sixpence per ton per day or part of a day during which such cargo shall remain on the jetty after such twenty-four hours, and such rent shall be summarily recoverable by the Council.

- (a.) The Council may remove, or cause to be removed, such cargo at the cost and expense of the owner thereof, the same to be summarily recoverable by the Council.
- (b.) The Council shall have a first lien upon all cargo for all rent as aforesaid, and for the costs of any removal thereof as aforesaid, and no person shall remove any such cargo until such lien is satisfied.
- (c.) In default of payment of any moneys due on any such lien, after twenty-four hours' notice in writing from the Licensing Officer shall have been given to the owner, the Council shall have the power and authority to sell such cargo by public auction or private contract, and after the payment of the expenses incurred by such sale, shall retain, out of the proceeds thereof, the full amount due as aforesaid, and pay the balance (if any) to such owner. The receipt of the City Council shall be a valid receipt to any purchaser or purchasers of such cargo.

(d.) For the purposes of this By-law, the owner of the vessel from which cargo is placed on the jetty shall be deemed the owner of such cargo, and be liable as such.

Regulation as to stacking Cargo on Jetties.

30. No cargo shall be stacked or placed on any jetty except in such places as the Licensing Officer may from time to time appoint.

## Penalties.

31. Where any person or persons under the foregoing By-laws, or any of them, are required to do or perform any act or thing, and any such act or thing remains undone or unperformed, the Council may perform the same and charge the cost and expenses against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

32. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and, on conviction, be liable for every offence, breach, or neglect to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds nor less than Twenty shillings, in addition to all costs and expenses to which he is or may be liable be liable.

### Penalties to be paid to Council.

All penalties and other sums recovered under the 33. provisions of these By-laws, or any of them, shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Council, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Municipality.

## Government Railways of Western Australia.

# BY-LAWS.

THE Commissioner of Railways does hereby declare that the following By-laws, having been approved of by the Governor in Executive Council, are the By-laws for regulating the use of the Government Railways, to be observed henceforth by all parties :---

## BY-LAWS.

1.—If any person travel or attempt to travel in any carriage employed on the railway without having previously paid his fare, and with intent to avoid payment thereof, or if any passenger by any railway do not produce or deliver up his ticket when required, or if any person having paid his fare for a certain distance knowingly and wilfully proceed in such carriage beyond such distance without previously paying the additional fare for the additional distance and with intent to avoid payment thereof, or if any person knowingly and wilfully refuse or neglect on arriving at the point to which he has paid his fare to quit such carriage, every such person shall for every such offence forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £2.

2.—Tickets are not transferable; and any person using or attempting to use a transferred ticket, or a ticket the time for the proper use of which has expired, with intent to defraud, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

**3.**—The Commissioner will not receive for conveyance any luggage or parcels unless the name of the owner and the destination be distinctly marked thereon.

**4.**—Any person knowingly, and with intent to defraud, travelling upon any railway in a carriage of a superior class to that for which he is provided with a ticket shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 2$ .

5.—Tickets, whether single or return, shall be used by passengers only to convey them to the station named thereon, or to a station short of that destination. In no case, however, shall any "cheap-excursion" ticket be used for any other station than that named thereon, nor for any other train than that for which such ticket is issued. Any person using or attempting to use a ticket in violation of this By-law, with intent to defraud, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 2$ .

**6.**—No ticket will be recognised by any servant of the Commissioner unless the number, date, and names of the stations written or printed on such ticket shall be perfectly legible. The holder of any ticket who shall wilfully deface his ticket or render it illegible in any of the above particulars, with intent to defraud, will be hable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 2$ .

7.—Where passengers are booked at any intermediate station for any train, the condition that there is room in such train shall in all cases be implied; and where there is not sufficient room for all such passengers, those booked for the longest distances shall have the preference, and those booked for the same distance shall have priority according to the order in which they are booked. **8**,—Any person not duly authorised by the Commissioner who shall sell, or offer for sale, any free pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, in order to enable any other person to travel therewith, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

**9.**—No male passenger is allowed to enter any waiting room or carriage set apart for the accommodation of females; and any person remaining in any such room or carriage, after being warned to leave the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 10$ .

10.—Any person, not being a servant of the Commissioner, who shall open any carriage for the purpose of entering the same, after the tickets have been examined and the carriage doors locked by the person appointed for that purpose, or who shall let himself out of any carriage, or attempt to do so, at any station, or at any time during the journey, by the use of a private key or other instrument, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

11.—No person shall, without the consent of the Commissioner, travel outside a carriage on the railway; or get into, or upon, or quit any part of the train whilst the same is in motion; and any person doing so, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 10$ .

12.—Smoking is strictly prohibited in any of the railway sheds, offices, waiting rooms, or upon any station platforms; and any person found so smoking shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 10$ .

13.—Smoking is strictly prohibited in any railway carriage except those set apart for the purpose; and any person found smoking in a carriage not set apart for the purpose shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 10$ , and may be removed from the carriage by any servant of the Commissioner.

14.--Dogs will be conveyed and charged for according to printed conditions, but will not on any account be allowed to accompany passengers in the carriages. Any person taking a dog into a passenger carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

15.—No gratuity is, under any circumstances, allowed to be received by any servant of the Commissioner, on pain of dismissal. Any person giving or offering a gratuity to any such servant shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 10$ .

16.—Any person found in or upon any railway carriage or station, or premises, in a state of intoxication, or making use of obscene, insulting, abusive, indecent, or blasphemous language, or writing any obscene words or figures, or committing any nuisance, or gambling or wilfully interfering with the comfort of any passenger, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and to removal from such carriage, station, or premises, as soon as shall be practicable.

17.—Any person driving or attempting to drive sheep or cattle, or attempting to ride or drive any horse across the railway, either at any authorised crossing-place or elsewhere when a train is in sight, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 50$ .

18.—No driver or conductor of any hackney carriage, omnibus, or other public vehicle shall ply for hire within any railway premises without a license in writing from the Commissioner; and any person offending contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

19.—No person will be allowed to come upon any railway premises for the purpose of removing any passenger's luggage, unless required by a passenger and engaged by him for such purpose; and no person will be allowed to come upon the railway premises for the purpose of touting or soliciting custom or hire. Any person attempting to evade, or being guilty of a breach of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

**20.**—Any person found washing, bathing, or swimming, or otherwise polluting the water in any reservoir or tank belonging to the railway, or any unauthorised person drawing water therefrom, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

21.—Any person, unless authorised by the Commissioner, who shall post or stick any placard or bill within or on any of the railway property or premises, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

22.—All goods and merchandise arriving by train at any station shall be removed from the platform or sheds within twelve hours; and any goods or merchandise not removed by that time may be stored at the risk and expense of the consignees or owners, and shall then become subject to the payment of the sum of sixpence per ton per diem, or one penny per package per diem, at the option of the Commissioner; and all goods, luggage, merchandise, and parcels unclaimed by the owner for the space of six months after arrival may be sold by the Commissioner, and after deducting what may be due to the Commissioner for carriage, storage, and charges (including expenses of sale), the surplus (if any) paid over to the owner on demand.

23.—Where it shall be the duty of the owner or consignee of goods brought into any railway station (whether by him or in vehicles of the department) to load such goods into the railway vehicles, he shall load such goods within six working hours after arrival; and in case of default the servants of the Commissioner may load such goods at the risk of the owner or consignee, who shall be liable for the cost of such loading, in addition to the freight and other charges paid or payable.

24.—No claim for loss or damage will be recognised unless the particulars of such claim be lodged with the Commissioner within four days after date of consignment, or the removal from the railway premises of the goods alleged to have been damaged; and the delivery of goods shall be considered complete when notice of arrival has been given to the consignee, or, where his address is not known, after such goods shall have been at the receiving station twelve hours. All goods will be subject to the printed conditions of carriage.

25.—The Commissioner will not be responsible for articles left by passengers at any station unless the same be registered, for which a charge of twopence per article may be made, and a ticket given in exchauge. And if such article be not removed within three days, an additional charge of threepence per week will be made, until the same is claimed and paid for or otherwise disposed of. No article will be given up without the production of such ticket, or satisfactory evidence of the ownership being adduced; and any article will be delivered to the bearer of the ticket, unless previously delivered to the owner. The Commissioner will not be responsible for any package exceeding the value of £10.

26.—Firearms shall not, under any circumstances, be taken into or placed upon or carried in any carriage used for the conveyance of passengers upon the railway, nor shall loaded firearms be brought upon the railway premises, and every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 10$ .

27.—The Commissioner may refuse to carry any person who has any infectious disorder. If any person who has, or may reasonally be supposed to have any such disorder is found upon the railway premises, or travels or attempts to travel on the railway without the special permission of the Commissioner, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2, and in addition shall forfeit any fare which he may have paid, and he may be removed at the first opportunity from the railway premises. Any person who has charge of any person suffering from an infectious disorder while upon the premises of the Commissioner, or travelling or attempting to travel on the railway, or who aids or assists any person suffering from such disorder in being upon the railway premises, or travelling or attempting to travel on the railway, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2, unless the person suffering from such disorder be travelling with the special permission of the Commissioner.

**23.**—No person shall be entitled to require any single article of goods to be conveyed by railway exceeding the weight of four tons, exclusive of the carriage, or six tons including the carriage, or which from its excessive bulk would be inconvenient to transport; but no objection on account of weight or bulk shall be taken to any boiler or piece of machinery if the same can be transported on any single carriage, or upon two or more carriages joined together, and it be offered for transport at least twenty-four hours before the time fixed for starting. But nothing herein shall prevent the Commissioner or his officers from carrying such goods if they think fit.

29.—No person shall be entitled to carry, or to require the Commissioner to carry, upon the railway any aquafortis, oil of vitriol, gunpowder, lucifer matches, or any other goods which, in the judgment of the Commissioner or his officers, may be of a dangerous nature, and if any person send by railway any such goods without distinctly marking their nature on the outside of the package containing the same, or otherwise giving notice in writing to the bookkeeper or other servant of the Commissioner with whom the same are left at the time of so sending, he shall forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £50 for every such offence, and it shall be lawful for the Commissioner to refuse to take any parcel that he may suspect to contain goods of a dangerous nature, or require the same to be opened to ascertain the fact.

**30.**—Any person who shall wilfully injure, wholly or in part, any of the linings or blinds, or break or deface any of the windows, or remove or injure any number, plate, or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any of the lamps, or otherwise damage any railway carriage, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10,

in addition to the payment of the amount of damage done.

**31.**—No article shall be sold on any railway premises without the consent of the Commissioner; and every person offending against this By-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £10.

**32.**—The word "fare" in these By-laws shall be held to mean the rate of toll or sum of money determined upon by the Governor in Council and published under the authority of the Railways Amendment Acts, 1879 and 1881; and the words "railway carriage" shall include every passenger engine, carriage, goods-truck, horse-box, meat-van, or other vehicle used on the railway.

**33.**—Horses and carriages will not be forwarded unless they arrive at the station forty-five minutes before the time named for the departure of the train by which they are to be sent. The Commissioner is not, however, bound to take them unless there is proper rolling stock on the line for the purpose.

**34.**—The owners of horses or other live stock will have to take all risks of loading, conveyance, and delivery. The Commissioner will not be responsible for any damage, however caused, occurring to horses or other live stock upon the railway, or at any of the stations (unless such damage be caused by wilful act or negligence of the servants of the Commissioner). And no horse or other live stock will be carried, unless the Contract Book in which these conditions will be stated as included in the contract of conveyance be previously signed by the consignor or owner. All live stock must be loaded by the sender, and unloaded by the consignor or owners at their risk, respectively.

**35.**—Parcels will be received at the stations daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and proclaimed holidays excepted); and if received not later than forty-five minutes before the departure of any passenger train, will be sent by it. All parcels must be prepaid.

**36.**—All parcels and packages under 112lbs. weight each, unless they form part of a consignment exceeding that weight, will be conveyed by passenger trains exclusively at the authorised parcel rates; but all packages weighing above 112lbs. each, or forming part of a consignment exceeding 112lbs., will be forwarded by goods trains and charged at goods rates, unless specially marked to go otherwise.

**37.**—A demurrage charge, as set forth in the Tariff Book, per truck per day may be made for all trucks not loaded up or unloaded within six hours after arrival.

**38.**—The authorised charges upon all live stock, goods, or parcels must be paid on demand; and in default of payment being made, such live stock, goods, or parcels may be sold by order of the Commissioner within the railway premises, and the freight and charges deducted from the proceeds thereof; and no credit will be given unless under special arrangement with the Commissioner. All goods from whomsoever received, or to whomsoever belonging, are subject to a lien, not only for the freight of the particular goods, but also for any general balance that may be due from the consignees. If in one month after the Commissioner, his clerks, or agents first received the goods for transmission by this railway, the money due be not paid, they will be sold by auction, and the proceeds applied towards satisfaction of such lien and expenses.

**39.**—The Commissioner will not be liable for any damage to goods of the special class, nor for goods of any class, unless at Commissioner's risk, and the freight paid accordingly; nor for goods of any class not delivered or mis-delivered in consequence of the same not being properly directed, described, or packed; nor for damage or loss sustained through improper packing, leakage, fermentation, or fire.

**40.**—The Commissioner will not be responsible for the loss of or any damage done to goods above the value of  $\pounds 5$ , unless they be properly described and the value declared at the time of booking, and the insurance rate at Commissioner's risk has been paid in addition to the authorised rates.

**41.**—The goods warehouses will be open for the receipt and delivery of goods from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., daily (Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and proclaimed holidays excepted); and except that on Saturdays they will be closed at 2 p.m.

42.—Fresh meat, fish, poultry, dairy produce, eggs, fruit, vegetables, and other perishable articles will be conveyed, when practicable, by the next train, whether passenger or otherwise, but in all cases at the owner's risk; and if not promptly removed from the railway premises will be disposed of or destroyed.




