By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the 49th Section of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," it is lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to establish on any Goldfield one or more Courts, to be presided over and holden by a Warden, and to be called a Warden's Court, and which shall be a Court of Record, and shall possess such jurisdiction as is conferred by Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient that a Warden's Court shall be established at Yerilla, North Coolgardie Goldfield: Now THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a Warden's Court at Yerilla, in the Yerilla District of the North Coolgardie Goldfield, such Court to be presided over and holden by the Resident Warden of the said Goldfield, or, in his absence, by the Acting Warden thereof

To take effect from the 24th August, 1896.

By-Laws of the Menzies Municipal Council.

W HEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," Section 99, it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws: Now therefore, pursuant to the powers contained in the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Menzies that the following By-laws shall form and be the By-laws of the Menzies Municipal Council.

By-Law No. 1.—Interpretation.

In these By-Laws, unless the context otherwise requires-

- 1. The word "Council" shall mean the Mayor and Councillors of Menzies.
- 2. The word "Municipality" shall mean the Town of Menzies.
- 3. The word "Mayor" shall mean the Mayor of the Municipality.
- 4. The words "public street" shall mean and include every public street, road, footway, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the Municipality.
- $\overline{\mbox{5.}}$ The word " person" shall include the plural, and also a body corporate.
- 6. The word "owner" shall apply to every person in possession or receipt either of the whole or of any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- 7. The word "occupier" shall mean the inhabitant occupier of any land, or if there is no inhabitant occupier, the person entitled to the possession thereof, and shall include leaseholder.
- 8. The word "Surveyor" shall mean the Surveyor for the Municipality or other officer authorised to act as such for the time being.
- 9. The words "Town Clerk" shall mean and include the Clerk of the Municipality, or any officer appointed to act as such for the time being.

By-Law No. 2.—Standing Orders—Order of Proceedings.

- 1. The business of the Council shall be conducted with open doors.
- 2. The Council shall commence business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes from the abovementioned hour there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the Council at that meeting.
- 3. Should the Mayor not be present, the meeting shall elect a Chairman from the Councillors present, who shall preside during the absence of the Mayor.
- 4. At all meetings of the Council when there is not a quorum present, or when the Council is counted out (which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than one-third of the members of the Council present, exclusive of the Mayor or Councillor chosen to preside in his absence), such circumstance, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book.
- 5. At all meetings of the Council the minutes of any preceding meeting, not previously confirmed, shall be read as the first business, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
- 6. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes the Mayor may make any communication to the Council which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or

questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall issue thereon on that time.

7. The ordinary business shall then be proceeded with.

Orders of Debate.

- 8. Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall, if the Mayor or other presiding Chairman so desire it, put it in writing and sign and deliver it after it has been duly seconded, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.
- 9. No member shall speak twice upon the same question, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried. Nevertheless, any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately before the mover rises to reply. The amendment of the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.
- 10. The Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
- 11. Any member moving a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.
- 12. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to any other member.
- 13. The Mayor or other presiding Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule and precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.
- 14. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but, upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.
- 15. Upon the adoption of any amendment, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted on as an original motion.
- 16. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year, unless by consent of at least four members of the Council
- 17. In case of an equality of votes, the Mayor or other presiding Chairman shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes and proceedings.
- 18. No By-law shall be finally passed or rescinded at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next or some subsequent meeting of the Council duly convened.
- 19. Any member of the Council may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given, in writing, to the Town Clerk at least three clear days previous to the meeting at which it is intended to consider the same, and the substance of such notice shall be communicated by the Town Clerk to the members of the Council in the notice paper for such meeting.
- 20. No resolution or motion affecting the receipt or expenditure of any portion of the municipal funds exceeding in amount the sum of £20 shall be considered by the Council, unless the same shall have been first notified on the notice paper.

By-Law No. 3.—Suspension of Standing Orders.

In cases of urgent necessity any standing order or orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least four members of the Council.

By-Law No. 4.—Election of Officers.

- 1. When any office is at the disposal of the Council, at least fourteen clear days' notice shall be given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers of the intention of the Council to fill such vacancy, and the same notice shall invite applications for the office to be sent in to the next meeting of the Council.
- 2. The salary or allowance attached to all offices at the disposal of the Council shall be fixed for the municipal year, and in all cases before proceeding to the election.
- 3. At the next meeting of the Council, after the notice as before mentioned has been given, all letters of application for the office shall be opened, and the names read aloud, and the appointment may then be made.

4. All elections for offices at the disposal of the Council shall be effected by voting by ballot, and it shall be a general rule that the two candidates polling the largest number of votes be again put to the ballot until one of such candidates shall have polled the majority of the votes of the members present, every member present being required to record his vote.

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5. No member of the Council, nor any Auditor of the Municipality, nor any officer thereof, shall be received as surety for any officer appointed by the Council, or for any work to be done for the Council; and in all cases in which security for the due and faithful performance of any duty or contract is required, the expense of preparing such security shall be borne by the Council.

BY-LAW NO. 5,-MUNICIPAL RATES.

All municipal rates shall be payable half-yearly, and the Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall, at the commencement of each half-year, leave with the person liable to pay the same, or at his residence, or post to his last known address, or affix upon the property rated, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring payment thereof within fourteen days, and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of fourteen days the Council may take legal proceedings for its recovery.

By-Law No. 6.—Officers of the Council.

The Collector.

The Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall demand, collect, and receive all rates, assessments, license fees, fines, forfeitures, rents, tolls, and other sums due to the Council, and his receipt shall be a full and sufficient discharge for any sums paid to him; and all sums so received by the Collector shall by him be paid to the Clerk of the Council weekly.

The Clerk of the Council.

- 2. The Clerk of the Council shall keep the books of the Council, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minute-book minutes of all proceedings of the Council. He shall attend all meetings of the Council, issue notices of all meetings, and shall prepare for the Council or Mayor thereof, and in due time, the voters lists for the Municipality, and cause them to be affixed as by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," required, and shall supply copies thereof as by the said Act required; and shall make up and complete, under the direction of the Council, the rate book; and shall, under the like direction, prepare the annual estimates as by the said Act required. He shall also keep all such books of account as required by the said Act. He shall also, under the like direction of the said Council, cause the accounts of the said Council to be balanced half-yearly, as required by the said Act. He shall also, under the direction of the Council, prepare the annual financial statement or summary, and shall do and perform all such other acts as the Council or Mayor thereof may lawfully require him to do under or by virtue of the said Act, and shall attend the Council office during such hours as the Council may determine. Council, and shall duly keep and enter in a proper minuteas the Council may determine.
- 3. The custody of the journals, and all documents whatsoever (except such documents as are hereinafter whatsoever (except such documents as are neremater expressed to be kept by the Mayor) laid before the Council shall be in the care of the Clerk, who shall neither take, nor permit to be taken, any such journals or documents from the Mayor's or Council office, without the express leave or order of the Council.

The Mayor.

4. The Mayor shall have the custody of the common seal, and of all deeds and records of the Council, but he shall not affix the common seal to any corporate document without the express order of the Council.

The Treasurer.

- 5. The Treasurer shall receive weekly from the Clerk of the Council all sums stated to be received by him under By-law No. 6, Section 1; and give the said Clerk a receipt for such moneys.
- 6. The Treasurer shall (if required by the Council at any time so to do), give a bond, with two sureties, in a sum to be named by the Council, conditioned for the proper discharge of his duties.
- 7. The Treasurer shall pay all sums of money received by him into the credit of the Council's general account at a bank to be named by the Council once at least in every week.

Engineer and Surveyor.

8. The Engineer and Surveyor, for the time being duly appointed by the Council, shall have the immediate care, management, and direction of all buildings, lands, streets, paths, markets, posts, fences, works, drains, culverts, and all other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, and he shall, from time to time, report to the Council the state of, condition, or repair of the same, and the progress of any works going on therein or thereon, and the breach or violation of any By-law in connection therewith. He shall also have the immediate care and management of all parks, recreation grounds, commonages, trees, and plants, and is hereby authorised to impound any stray stock unlawfully being on any street or property of the Council, and to report the breach or violation of any By-law in connection

Officer of Health.

- 9. It is the duty of the Officer of Health to superintend the application of all sanitary measures ordered by the Local Board, and to advise them generally in all such matters.
- 10. The Officer of Health shall obey the orders of the Council.

BY-LAW No. 7.—SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

No slaughter-house shall be erected or used within the No shaughter-house shall be erected of used within the boundaries of the Municipality without the previous sanction, in writing, of the Council, and any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20.

By-Law No. 8.—Pigs.

No person shall keep any kind of living swine within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 9.—Fires in Chimney Flues.

The occupier of any premises within the Municipality whereof any chimney flues shall take fire, from having been whereof any crimines rules shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5: Provided that if any defendant shall plead that such chimney flue did not take fire in consequence of being foul, the onus of proof shall lie on such defendant.

By-Law No. 10.—Damaging Property, etc., of Municipality.

Any person who shall (without first having obtained the sanction, in writing, of the Council) break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove or carry away any footpath, tree, plant, post, fence, gate, drain, water-course, culvert, building, or other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 11.—TO PREVENT DANGER FROM FIRE.

Any person who shall (without first obtaining the permis-Any person who shall (without first obtaining the permission, in writing, of the Mayor) anywhere within the limits of the Municipality, light any unguarded fire, or set fire to any straw, wood, or rubbish, or make any bonfire, or let off any fireworks within the Municipality, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 12.—To prevent Danger from Firearms.

Any person who shall wantonly, or without lawful excuse, discharge any firearm in or near to or across any public street within the limits of the Municipality shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence. Any person carrying loaded firearms within the Municipality, without the written permission of the Council, shall also be liable, on conviction, to a similar penalty.

By-Law No. 13.—To prevent Danger from Inflammable MATERIALS.

- 1. Any person who shall stack any hay, straw, or other inflammable material within 75 feet of any house or other building, and who shall not remove the same within two hours after due notice from the Town Clerk, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.
- 2. No person shall permit in any yard, way, or other premises owned or occupied by him within the Municipality, any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, or other inflam-mable material whatever; and any person who, after two hours' notice from the Town Clerk, for the time being in that behalf, shall neglect or refuse to remove such inflam-mable material, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £20.
- 3. The captain for the time being of any fire brigade, or officer in command, or the Mayor, shall be authorised to employ such persons to assist the brigade in extinguishing fires as he may deem necessary. That the said captain or Mayor is hereby authorised to recover the expenses actually

incurred by the brigade employed at any fire from the owner or occupier of such premises, any sum or sums not exceeding those mentioned in the Schedule hereunto annexed, such charges being recoverable by action in the Level Count

BY-LAW NO. 14.—TO PREVENT DANGER TO PASSENGERS.

Any house or building the roof whereof shall overhang or project over any public street without having a proper gutter and pipe to carry off the rain, or which shall have any cornice, crane, or hoist, or any other fixtures or projection overhanging or projecting over any public street, without the sanction, in writing, of the Council therefor, shall be deemed to be a nuisance, and any owner of any such house or building who shall neglect or refuse to remove or abate such nuisance, within seven days after due notice by the Mayor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 15.—To prevent the Danger of Rapid Driving and Riding round Corners.

Any person who shall ride or drive any animal or animals, whether attached to any vehicle or not, round the corners formed by the junction of any street in the Municipality with any other street in the Municipality, at a pace exceeding a walking pace, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 16.—To prevent the Danger from the Driving of Vehicles at Night.

Any person who, between sunset and the following sunrise, shall in, upon, or along any of the public streets within the Municipality, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lanthorn securely fixed and lighted at the off side of the front of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 17.—To ensure Control over Vehicles and Horses.

Any person who, having the care of any vehicle in the public streets, shall be at such a distance from such vehicle as not to have the complete control over every horse drawing the same, and shall not have one wheel of such vehicle chained, or the horse securely tied, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 18.—QUARRIES AND TIMBER.

Any person who shall quarry stone, or fell or cut timber on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, for every such offence a penalty not exceeding £5.

By-Law No. 19.—Schedule of Licenses and Fees to be Paid Yearly, in advance, on or before 31st January or immediately on such Live Stock or Carriages being kept within the Municipality, or Hand-carts being used in the Streets thereof, or Slaughter-houses being opened therein.

For horned stock over 12 months old, 3s. per head. For horned stock over 6 months and under 12 months, 2s. 6d. per head.

For goats, 2s. 6d. per head. For every carriage of two wheels, 5s. each. For every carriage of four wheels, 10s. each. Hand-carts employed, if on the streets, 2s. 6d. each. For a slaughter-house license, £5.

By-Law No. 20.—For providing and maintaining suitable Closets and for Prohibiting Cesspits.

1. The owner of every house or premises within the town of Menzies shall cause to be constructed on said premises a suitable closet, provided with the sealed pans adopted by the Council. Such closet shall be constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the officers of the Council, and shall in no case be situated at a less distance than 20ft. from any dwelling-house or place of business, except by the express permission of the Council being first obtained. Existing cesspits shall forthwith be carefully emptied, cleansed, refilled with clean earth or sand, and thoroughly rammed, and under no circumstances whatever shall new or additional cesspits be made in any place within the town boundaries.

2. Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 5s., and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s. for each day during which such breach or omission shall be committed or continued.

BY-LAW NO. 21.—ERECTION OF TENTS, PAVILIONS, ETC.

Any person who shall erect, or cause to be erected, any pavilion, tent, shed, or other structure of canvas or other inflammable material within the Municipality, and which, in the opinion of the Council, constitutes a menace to the convenience, comfort, or safety of the inhabitants, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty of £10. And any person who, after receiving notice to remove such structure as aforesaid, shall not have removed same within 24 hours from the service of such notice, shall be liable to a penalty of £5 for every day during which he shall have neglected to comply with such notice.

BY-LAW No. 22.—For regulating the Storing and keeping of Gunpowder and Explosive Substances.

- 1. Except as to an amount not exceeding five pounds in weight, the keeping of powder or other explosives in or upon any premises not licensed for that purpose within the Municipality of Menzies is absolutely prohibited.
- 2. Every person keeping explosives in contravention of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.
- 3. Every person intending to apply for a license for the storage of gunpowder or other explosive substances, shall give three clear days' notice, in writing, to the Town Clerk, in which he will specify his Christian name and surname, and present residence, and fully describe the place in which it shall be proposed to keep any gunpowder or other explosive substance, which place shall be approved by the Council: Provided that in no case shall one license entitle the holder thereof to keep at one time on his licensed premises an amount of gunpowder or blasting powder exceeding 100lbs., or an amount of dynamite exceeding ten cases, or an amount of caps or detonators exceeding six boxes, or any other explosives exceeding such limit as the Council may from time to time determine.
- 4. Every person keeping fireworks in excess of the aforesaid limit of five pounds in weight shall, in all particulars, comply with the requirements of this By-law, and, in case of any breach of the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
- 5. The fees to be paid to the Town Clerk for the licenses required under this By-law shall be as follows:—For every license for registered premises, Ten shillings; for every license to sell fireworks, Five shillings. The fee to be paid for every year, or any part of a year, in advance.

By-Law No. 23.—Horses.

No person shall break in any horse in the main streets, either by leading, riding, or driving.

By-Law No. 24.—Sign Boards, etc.

- 1. Any person who shall erect or place any signboard, signs, awnings, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway without first obtaining the consent of the Council in writing, shall forfeit and pay on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.
- 2. Any person wishing to erect any balcony, verandah, or signboard over any part of a street or footway shall obtain permission of the Council, in writing, before so doing; and any balcony, verandah, or signboard so erected by the consent of the Council shall be at least eight feet clear above the street or footway over which it is erected, and shall be built in a substantial manner, and shall be subject to the approval of the Council, both with respect to its strength and appearance; and, further, the Council will have power to remove, or cause to be removed, any balcony, verandah, or signboard now erected, or that may be hereafter erected over any street in the Municipality, not being erected in conformity with this By-law: Provided that the owner or occupier of the premises to which any such balcony, verandah, or signboard is or may be attached, shall have received fourteen days' notice, in writing, from the Council, to remove such balcony, verandah, or signboard. Any owner or occupier failing to remove such balcony, verandah, or signboard after having received the said notice, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10, together with all expenses (if any) incurred by the Council in removing any such balcony, verandah, or signboard.

By-Law No. 25.—Obstruction of Streets and

1. Any person who shall obstruct any street or footway within the Municipality, by placing thereon any stone, bricks

timber, or iron, or any other building material, packing cases, or any other things, without first obtaining permission of the Council, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

- 2. And any person causing any damage to any footpath or roadway shall be liable to pay the cost of repairing the said footpath or roadway so damaged.
- 3. And any person placing any stone, bricks, timber, or any other building material on any footway or roadway without keeping sufficient light or lights affixed thereto, from sunset to sumrise, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 26.—Hoardings.

- 1. The Council may grant permission to any person to erect and use hoardings over or upon any street or footway, and any person obtaining such permission shall pay to the Council the following fees, viz.:—One penny per lineal foot of street or pathway over or upon which such hoarding may be erected or used per month, or any part of a month, or a minimum of 2s. 6d. per month; and any person erecting or using any such hoarding shall keep a sufficient light or lights affixed thereto, in a conspicuous place, from sunset to sunrise; and any person who shall make any excavation on or near any footway or roadway, shall erect a sufficient hoarding for the safety of the public, and shall affix sufficient light or lights thereto from sunset to sunrise.
- 2. Any excavation, cellar, opening, or gutter made under any footway shall be made secure from danger to the public, or filled in, as may be directed by the Council, by the person making any such excavation, opening, or gutter. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

BY-LAW NO. 27.-LAMP POSTS, ETC.

No lamp posts, bridle posts, and flagstaffs shall be erected in any street without the written consent of the Council, and shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, as may be directed by the Council, and the Council may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 28.—Processions and Bands.

- 1. No procession, other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street within the Municipality without first having obtained the written permission of the Mayor or Council.
- 2. No band or person shall be allowed to play any musical instrument in any of the streets within the Municipality without first obtaining permission of the Mayor or Council. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 29.—Walls and Fences.

- 1. No person shall erect any fence with bush or other dangerous or inflammable substance, abutting on any public street, without first obtaining permission of the Council in writing.
- 2. Any fence erected and abutting on any public'street will be subject to the approval of the Council, and the owner of any such fence shall keep and maintain such fence in good order and repair, and shall remove the same if not so approved and upon the Council ordering the removal of the same.
- 3. No person shall erect a fence of barbed wire abutting on any public street within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 30.—Velocipedes, etc.

Any person who shall ride or place a bicycle or other velocipede upon any footpath, and any person riding or placing a bicycle or velocipede upon any street, between sunset and sunrise, without carrying a lighted lamp and an alarm bell attached to the front part of such bicycle or velocipede, and sounding the bell in ample time to allow foot passengers and others to protect themselves from danger, and any person riding a bicycle or other velocipede in or upon any street or roadway in a furious manner, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 31.—Throwing Dangerous Substances on Footpaths.

Any person who shall throw any orange-peel, vegetable substances, or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous

substance upon any footpath within the Municipality shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 32.—Vehicles not having Springs.

Any person who shall cause any wagon, cart, or other carriage not having springs, or drive any animal attached thereto, at any faster rate, speed, or pace than a common walk shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2.

By-Law No. 33.—Goods left in the Streets.

Any person who shall allow any goods, merchandise, coal, or firewood to remain in any street for a longer period than necessary for housing or removing the same, shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2.

By-Law No. 34.—Removal of Vehicles or Animals left on the Street.

Any officer of the Council, or any police constable, may seize and remove any animals or vehicles left unattended in any street, or obstructing any portion of any street, and the owners of any animals so seized or removed shall be liable, and, upon conviction, shall pay any expenses incurred in the care and keep of any such animals or vehicles after such seizure or removal, and shall pay a penalty not exceeding £2.

By-Law No. 35.—Impure Water or Liquid Matter not to flow on any Street.

Any owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within the Municipality who shall allow any impure water or any liquid matter of any description to flow from such house, land, or premises, into or upon any street, footway, or gutter; and any person who shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any liquid matter of any description, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

By-Law No. 36.—Temporary Stalls.

The Council may grant permission to any person to fix and use temporary stalls in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise, for such time and such places as the Council may think fit: Provided that the general traffic is not obstructed by any such stalls, and that such permission may be withdrawn by the Mayor or Council at any time by written notice: And the Council shall charge the person using a fee not exceeding £5; and any person erecting or using any such stall in or near any street for the above purposes without first obtaining such permission of the Council, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and be subject to a penalty of £5 for each offence.

By-Law No. 37.—Regulation of Street Traffic on Special Occasions.

The Council may, in its discretion, regulate or prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways of any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to such street.

By-Law No. 38.—Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

- 1. All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws.
- 2. The Council shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the Municipality for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three days, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Council a fee to be fixed; but the public will have the right to enter upon such lands, provided they do not in any way interfere with sports or amusements being carried on.
- 3. No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed upon any park land or recreation ground without the written permission of the Mayor or Council.
- 4. All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Corporation.
- 5. The Council may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

- 6. No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, without first having obtained the written consent of the Mayor or Council and shall pay a fee: the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.
- 7. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 39.—Dairies.

- 1. Any person or persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the Municipality shall register their names and addresses with the Town Clerk, and shall keep their milk stores, shops, or dairies, or milk vessels used for containing milk for sale, and every place used in connection therewith, in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of an officer appointed by the Council.
- 2. No person shall contaminate or adulterate in any way any milk offered for sale within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 40.—Camels.

No person shall be allowed to camp any camel or dromedary within a radius of one mile of the town boundary, for a longer period than is necessary for the loading or unloading of such camel or dromedary, without the sanction of the Council in writing, and any person offending against this By-law shall pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence, and any person depasturing camels or dromedaries on the park lands, commonage, or other lands within the boundaries or under the control of the Municipality, without the sanction of the Council in writing, shall pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 per day or part of a day for every animal so depastured.

D. 195 General Orders.

THE Defence Force Regulations, 1895, have been amended as follows:—

Part II., paragraph 20.—Cancel the word "discharged," in first line, and insert, after the word "soldier," "on completion of his service;" also add to end of paragraph—"A soldier, under other circumstances, has no statutory right to be sent free of expense to any place on discharge, though in some cases he may be allowed a free conveyance as a matter of favour."

Part II., paragraph 26.—After the word "Bombardier," in scale of pay, insert—"Paid Acting Bombardier, 3s."

Part II., paragraph 41.—Foot-note to paragraph—After the word "officers" insert "and officers mess."

Part II., paragraph 55.—Cancel sub-paragraphs c, d, and all words after "uniform," in sub-paragraph f. Table g.—Cancel first paragraph in column for remarks, and substitute—"The date of joining being considered as the date fixing periods of issue."

In sub-paragraphs cancel the letters "e" and "f," and insert "c" and "d."

Part II., paragraph 23.—In second line, cancel "and 2," also "and allowance return;" after "as" insert "a," and strike out "s" from the word "vouchers."

Part II., paragraph 68.—Name of Forms.—Cancel "P. 2. Allowance and Working Pay."

Part III., paragraph 23.—Add to end of paragraph:—"A number will be entered opposite each man's name in this book, which will be the member's corps number, and will be entered in front of every non-commissioned officer or man's name in all returns and documents."

Part III., paragraph 47.—Cancel paragraph, and substitute:—"To qualify as an efficient, a volunteer must have attended at least 12 Commanding Officer's Drill Parades during the year (attendance at paid parades, church parades or funerals not to be included), and have fired 40 rounds of ball ammunition at class firing under proper supervision, the latter being certified by the Annual Musketry Return and Registers, rendered on the 30th June each year. Nevertheless, the Commandant shall have power to direct any volunteer to be classed as a non-efficient for want of proficiency whether in drill instruction or a knowledge of the special duties of his position.

The musketry qualification is not necessary in the case of Artillery Volunteer Corps.

Part III, paragraph 51.—The last line of paragraph.—Cancel "an officer," and insert "the officer commanding the corps, or an officer deputed by the Commandant."

Part III.—Cancel paragraph 64, and substitute "The capitation allowance will be drawn by corps half-yearly as follows:—One-third for the half-year ending 31st December, and two-thirds for the half-year ending 30th June in each year. One-fifteenth of the yearly allowance will be allowed for each attendance at Commanding Officer's Parades (recruit drills not included), in accordance with paragraph 47 of these Regulations. For the half-year ending 30th June, one-third of the capitation allowance will be drawn for every effective member who has fired 40 rounds of ball ammunition in class firing during the year under the supervision of an officer, and certified in accordance with paragraph 47 of these Regulations."

Part III., paragraph 65.—In the third line from the end, cancel "of the past," and insert "of the Corps Fund for the year ending 30th June, with a detailed statement of the."

Part III., paragraph 108.—Cancel paragraph and substitute "Best Shot in Force.—The best shot in the Infantry Force—being a marksman, to wear a badge of cross rifles and a crown, worked in silver, on the left fore-arm above the cuff. Aggregate scores recorded on 'Form A' at all ranges to count in determining the best shot."

Best Shot in Company.—The best shot in Company, being a marksman, to wear a badge of cross rifles, worked in silver, on the left fore-arm above the cuff.

"Marksmen.—Marksmen to wear a badge of cross rifles, worked in silk, on the left fore-arm above the cuff."


