WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*,

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from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea-coast in Western Australia, being "ports' within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby prohibit the introduction of imported stock into this Colony, except in conformity with, and subject to the Regu lations made under the sixth section of the above Act.

City of Perth.

By-Laws for the General Regulation of Traffic in and through the Streets and Footways of the City of Perth.

BY-LAWS.

IN pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in, under, and by virtue of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the City of Perth makes and ordains that the following By-laws for the general regulation of traffic in and through the streets and footways of the City of Perth, and for insuring the safety and cleanliness thereof, and the good rule and government of the Municipality, and the convenience and comfort of the inhabitants thereof be observed and enforced.

By-Laws.

1. These By-laws shall be known and cited as "The General Traffic By-laws."

Interpretation.

2. In the construction of these By-laws, unless the context shall otherwise indicate, the following terms in inverted commas shall bear the meaning and include the things hereinafter severally assigned and set against them. The Interpretation Clause (Section 3) of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," shall be read with and form part of these By-laws, so far as such clause can and does apply to the City of Perth, unless anything herein contained shall require a different meaning.

require a different meaning. "Footpath or Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed or otherwise.

Obstruction to Streets.

3. No person shall congregate with another or others, or by himself or with another or others behave, act, or stand in any street within the City, so as to obstruct the free passage and traffic through, along, or upon any part of the same.

4. Every person who, in the opinion of any Traffic Inspector, or other officer of the Council, or of any police constable, is obstructing by himself or with any other person or persons, the free traffic through, along, or upon any part of a street or footway shall, when so requested by such Inspector, officer, or constable, move on so as to remove such obstruction.

Obstruction of Footpath by placing Carriages, &c., thereon.

5. No person shall drive, ride, or place, or cause, permit, or suffer to be driven, ridden, or placed upon any footway in the said City, any wagon, cart, dray, sledge, bicycle, tricycle, or any other vehicle which may be driven, ridden, or drawn, or any wheel, wheel-barrow, hand-barrow, truck, hogshead, cask, barrel, or other article or thing, nor shall lead, drive, or ride any animal or animals whatsoever upon any of the footways aforesaid.

Not to allow any Material, Rubbish, &c., to remain in any Street.

6. No person, without the written consent of the City Council, shall place, or permit to be placed, or allow to remain, any material, article, rubbish, or thing, or any other substance of whatsoever kind upon any part of a street, nor without such consent make any hole or excavation, or permit the same to be made, or remain in or near any street or streets, and in any such case such consent shall cease and be of no effect unless the conditions thereof are strictly observed.

To prohibit the throwing of Orange Peel or other like dangerous substance on the Footpath.

- 7. (a.) No person shall throw or place any orange peel or any other vegetable substance, or any dangerous, offensive, or noxious substance, vegetable or otherwise, or throw any lighted match to remain on any footpath, and
 - (b.) No person shall sweep, throw, or place any rubbish, garbage, sweepings, litter, or refuse of any description on any footpath or street of the said City, or into any gutter or channel thereof, or cause or permit the same to remain therein.

- (c.) No person shall empty, throw, or discharge, or permit to be emptied, thrown, or discharged, any foul or offensive water or other liquid into or upon any street of the City or into any gutter or channel thereof.
- (d.) If any gutter or channel shall be choked, or the water running therein be prevented from taking its course, through the negligence or carelessness of any person, or through any neglect or breach by any person of any of these By-laws, such person shall, immediately upon being requested so to do by any officer of the Council or any police constable, remove such obstruction and cleanse such gutter.

To regulate the Driving of Unyoked Cattle and Unbroken Horses through the City.

8. No unyoked cattle nor any sheep or other stock, and no unbroken horse or horses, whether roped or not, shall be driven or ridden into or along any street of the City, except between the hours of 10 o'clock at night and 8 o'clock' of the morning during the months of May, June, July, August, and September, and except the hours of 11 o'clock at night and 6 o'clock in the morning during the months of October, November, December, January, February, March, and April, provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to any milch cow going to or returning from depasturing or watering.

(a.) No bull or stallion shall be driven, ridden, or led into or along any street of the City except the same be under the control of a safe keeper and be secured by proper reins so that the animal may be under the control of the said keeper.

To regulate Carriage Traffic in the Streets.

9. The driver of any private vehicle taking up or setting down any person at any place of public worship, or public amusement, or at any public meeting, or who is waiting for such purpose, shall act under the direction of the officer of the Council or police constable who may be on duty at such place or places, and shall perform his duty in a quiet manner, and obey such directions.

To prevent Obstructions on the Footpaths of the Streets.

10. No person shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand firewood, goods, ware, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street or on any of the said footpaths of the said City after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing the same.

To provide for the turning of any Vehicle, Horse, or other animal in the Streets of the City

11. The driver of every vehicle, or the rider of every horse or other animal, turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any street in the City, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

To prevent the beating of Carpets, Sc., after 8 o'clock a.m.

12. No person shall beat or shake any carpet, rug, or mat in any street within the City between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and midnight.

To provide for the Cleansing of Paved Footways of the City.

13. The occupier of every building fronting, adjoining, or abutting on any street, the footpath of which is flagged, paved, asphalted, or in any other manner permanently formed, shall, once every day (Sundays, Christmas Days, and Good Fridays alone excepted), before 8 o'clock in the mornings, sweep and water, or cause to be swept and watered, the whole of the footpath or pavement adjoining such premises. The footpath is permanently formed if made of gravel, shell, or any other material, and kerbed. During the months from May to August, both inclusive,

During the months from May to August, both inclusive, no watering need be done, except the footpath, or any part of it, be covered wholly or in part by a verandah. If any building is unoccupied, the owner shall be deemed the occupier. If any building has more than one occupant, the owner shall be deemed the occupier.

To restrict the breaking in of any Horses in the Streets of the City.

14. No person shall break in any horse, mule, ass, or any other animal in any street of the City, either by leading, riding, or driving the same.

- (a.) No person shall lead or exhibit, or cause or suffer to be lead or exhibited, any entire horse through or in any street within the Municipality between the hours of 8 o'clock of the forenoon and 6 o'clock of the afternoon.
- (b.) No person in charge of any entire horse or bull shall cause, allow, permit, or suffer any such entire horse or bull to be turned loose in any

yard or other place with any animals for the purpose of covering, except in such yard, building, or other premises as shall be entirely screened from public view.

To prevent the improper exposure of Goods for Sale in the City of Perth.

15. No person shall place, hang up, or otherwise expose for sale within the City any goods, wares, merchandise matter, or thing whatsoever so that the same shall be and project upon, into, or over any footway.

To prevent accidents from riding, ξ c., of Bicycles, ξ c., within the City.

16. (1.) Throughout this By-law the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede, and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

(2.) No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footway within the City.

(3.) No person shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, ride a cycle in any street unless there is attached thereto a lamp, which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times be kept lighted.

(4.) Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

(5.) No person shall leave any cycle in or on any street or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested by any constable or officer of the Council.

(6.) No cyclist shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or other animal.

(7.) Where a cyclist meets any horse or animal, and such horse or animal becomes restive, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted until such horse or animal has been passed.

(8.) No person or persons shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any streets in the City, or across the intersection of any of the said streets, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

To prevent rate of Driving or Riding in certain Streets in the City of Perth.

17. No person shall ride or drive other than at a walking pace in any portion of Hay Street, between William and Barrack Streets, or in any portion of Barrack Street, between Murray and Hay Streets, between the hours of 7 and 11 post meridian, on Saturday evenings, or upon such other occasions as the Council may, by public notice, direct.

Direction as to Foot Passengers.

18. Every person using any footpath in any street shall keep to his or her right hand side.

Regulations as to Perambulators, &c.

19. (a.) Every person propelling or using any perambulator, or other form of vehicle in which children are usually conveyed, in or along any footpath, shall keep to his or her right hand side, and no such perambulator or vehicle shall be propelled or allowed to remain abreast or alongside any other such perambulator or vehicle.

(b.) No person shall leave any perambulator on any footpath, but shall place the same on the roadway next to the kerb.

To provide restrictions as to Hawkers.

20. (a.) No person shall hawk any fruit, fish, or vegetables within any part of the City without having first obtained a license from the Council.

- (b.) Any person who travels and trades on foot, or with any vehicle or animal, or otherwise carrying to sell, or expose or offer for sale, within the limits aforesaid any of the articles or things aforesaid shall be deemed to hawk the same.
- (c.) No person shall keep, manage, or conduct at any moveable or temporarily fixed stall, in or near any street, for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise, unless such person be licensed.
- (d.) Licenses for "Hawkers" shall be in the form "X" in the Schedule, and for "Stalls" in the form "Z" in the Schedule.

- (e.) Every hawker, whilst employed in hawking, shall produce his license upon being required by any constable or any officer of the Council, and shall at all times have affixed to some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, or dray, a board or plate bearing his name and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly painted thereon in letters not less than one inch in length.
- (f.) No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.
- (g.) The following fees shall be paid for licenses to hawkers or stalls, and shall be paid in advance on the first Monday in every month, and if any payment be not paid when due the license shall be void.

Hawkers' Licenses.

- For every hawker with hand-basket or tray, 2s. 6d. per month.
- For every hawker with wheel-barrow or hand-cart, 5s. per month.
- For every hawker with vehicle drawn by a horse or other animal, 7s. 6d. per month.

Stall Licenses.

For every stall, 20s. per month.

- (h.) Every licensed hawker and stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the Traffic Inspector or other authorised officer of the Council.
- (i.) No person to whom a hawker's or stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself.

Prohibiting Animals or Vehicles being left in the Street.

21. No person having the care or control of any horse or other animal, or of any vehicle, shall allow the same to remain in any street of the City, or to obstruct any portion of such street for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the same : Provided that where suitable bridleposts are provided the horse may be securely fastened thereto for any time not exceeding ten minutes, but immediately upon the request of any officer of the Council or police constable such horse shall be removed.

Restriction as to Furious Driving.

22. No person shall drive or ride furiously or carelessly in any street, nor be drunk while driving or riding, and no person shall drive at a rapid pace at or round the intersection of any of the streets.

To prevent the Danger from the Driving of Vehicles at night without Lights.

23. No person shall, between sunset and sunrise, in, upon, or along any street within the City, drive any vehicle constructed or used for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise, without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted at the off side, nor any vehicle constructed or used for the conveyance of persons as well as goods, wares, and merchandise, or of persons only, without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on each side of the front of the said vehicle.

Regulating the passing of Advertising Vans and throwing Handbills in the Streets.

24. No person shall, without the written consent of the Town Clerk, drive or cause to be driven through any street of the said City, any cart, carriage, van, or other vehicle with advertisements posted thereon, used or intended solely for advertising purposes.

For Prohibiting[°]_eor Regulating Processions in the Streets of the City.

25. No procession of persons, with or without vehicles (except for funeral, military, or police purposes), shall parade or pass through any street unless and until the previous consent, in writing, of the Mayor or, in his absence, of the Town Clerk, shall be first had and obtained, and then only by the route or at the place or places specified in such consent, nor until the recipient of such consent shall, if required, have paid the cost of giving public notice by advertisement setting forth the particulars of such route.

(j.) No person shall throw or discharge any handbills or other printed matter in or upon any street, or in or upon any premises adjoining any street.

Regulation as to Bill Posting in the City.

Every person who is desirous of posting handbills or 26.other form of advertisement on the walls or other parts of the City where the same may be allowed must make application to the City Council for a license for so doing, and the same, if the party is approved of by the City Coun-cil, shall pay a monthly fee of 5s. (Five shillings) for such permission; but in no event shall it be lawful for any bill-poster to post any bills or other form of advertisement on any public fence or the walls of any public buildings in the said City, nor upon the walls of any private houses, unless he shall first obtain the consent of the owner or occupier of such house or other premises.

Regulation as to driving Camels through the Streets of the City.

27. No camel shall be driven, riden, or lead along, or across any street, except by special permission first had and obtained from the Town Clerk, which shall embody the conditions as to the route to be observed by the owner, driver, or other person or persons who may have the charge of such camel.

To prevent damage to Footpaths and other Council property.

28. No person, without first having obtained the written 28. No person, without first having obtained the written sanction of the Council, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other property of the said City Council or under the control thereof thereof.

Penalties.

29. Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Council to perform the same, and charge the costs and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

(a.) Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable to a fine or penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, nor less than Ten shillings for every such offence.

Penalties to be paid to the Council.

30. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Council, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the Municipality.

Repeal of previous By-laws.

Such of the By-laws or Regulations mentioned or 31. set forth in Schedule Å, hereunder, are repealed as from the date of the publication of these By-laws in the Government Gazette.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

Regulations for the Better Organisation and the Classification and Payment of the Government Railways Service.

IN THE MATTER OF "The Railways Amendment Act, 1879" (43 Vict., No. 10) and the 55 Vict., 34.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by "The Railways Amendment Act, 1879" (43 Vict., No. 10), and an Act intituled "An Act to further amend the Railways Act, 1878" (55 Vict., No. 34), and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, Frederick Henry Piesse, Commissioner of Railways for the Colony of Western Australia, with the approval of the Governor in Executive Council, hereby make the following Regulations, which shall supersede the Regulations issued on the 6th day of July, 1892.

Conditions of Service applicable to the whole Staff.

1. No person over the age of thirty-five (35) years shall be permanently appointed to any grade in the Railway Service without the special authority of the Commissioner of Railways; and no one having once left the Service (otherwise than in consequence of reduction in Staff) will be re-admitted except upon similar authority.

2. Applicants should send their applications to the head of the branch in which they desire employment.

The applications to be accompanied by not less than three testimonials of character, one of which should be from the last employer if applicants have been previously employed.

3. Candidates may be required, by a Board of Examiners, to undergo an examination such as may from time to time be prescribed by the Commissioner of Railways for the class of service for which the candidates apply.

4. The Board of Examiners shall consist of the General Traffic Manager, the Engineer-in-Charge of Existing Lines, and the Locomotive Superintendent. Two to be a quorum.

5. All appointments will be made on probation only. After a period of probation, and upon production of certificates of fitness from the Officers at the head of the respective branches in which probationers are employed, the Commissioner of Railways may make the appointments permanent.

6. It will be necessary that every probationer, before being permanently appointed, shall produce a certificate from a registered medical practitioner of Western Australia that he is in sound bodily health and free from mental infirmity, and that his eyesight and hearing are perfect.

7. Every employé in the Railway Department will hold his appointment conditionally on his being subject to and strictly observing the Rules and Regulations established from time to time for his guidance, whether published with the General Rules and Regulations or otherwise: and every employé must consider all rules of general application equally as binding upon him as those specially pertaining to his own particular position or duties.

8. Promotion and increases of pay in all grades of the several branches will be made, except where scales are in operation, according to merit and subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Railways, on the recommendation of the heads of the branches interested, and accompanied by a certificate of good conduct and efficiency. 9. The annual advances of pay, where scales are in operation, will be dependent and continued upon a certificate of efficiency and good conduct being given.

10. No employé will be permitted, unless under very exceptional circumstances, and then only on special authority from the Commissioner of Railways, to engage in any business or employment outside the duties of his office.

11. All employés in the Railway Service shall retire from the service at the age of sixty years. The Commissioner of Railways may, however, if he thinks fit, and with the cousent of the parties interested, require any of the employés to continue in the service after the age of sixty years, if it appears that their retention would be of advantage to the service.

12. Sons of employés in the Railway Service are not to be employed at stations or in offices where their fathers are engaged, except in the case of youths receiving salaries reaching £80 per annum, who, when their salaries exceed that amount, shall be removed to some other stations or offices.

13. The Commissioner of Railways may transfer any employé from one branch of the service to another.

14. Employés shall repair to any part of the line where they may be ordered by a superior officer.

15. No person in the permanent employment of the Commissioner of Railways will be allowed to leave the service until the expiration of fourteen days' notice, unless with the consent of the head of the branch in which he is employed. Notice of resignation must be given in writing; and a similar notice will be given to those whose services are no onger required, except in the case of any employé dismissed for breach or neglect of duty.

16. No permanent employé shall be dismissed without the consent of the Commissioner being first obtained.

In the event, however, of gross neglect of duty or insubordination, or drunkenness, or such like, such employé can be suspended as hitherto, pending the Commissioner's decision as to whether he be finally dismissed or not.

17. The term "permauent employé" herein is to be understood to mean any employé who has been engaged for continuous service, and whose appointment has been approved by the Commissioner, as distinct from persons engaged for merely temporary service. The latter can, of course, be discharged or dismissed at any time by the officer who engaged them, without reference to the Minister.

18. Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Commissioner of Bailways shall have power to appoint to any position or grade, if he thinks fit, and without the examination herein mentioned, any person of known ability or possessing special qualifications.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE.

19. Annual leave will be granted, at times convenient to the department, to all permanent employés who have been in the service for twelve months and upwards. (See Regulation No. 23 for details.)

20. The following gazetted holidays, viz., Christmas Day and Good Friday, will be held as holidays to the "Wages Staff." Employés required to work on these holidays will be paid therefore at the ordinary rate of pay, in addition to their wages.

21. Leave on any other gazetted holidays will only be granted at discretion to employés who have been in the service twelve months and upwards. 22. Labourers and others, only temporarily employed, will not be entitled to annual holidays unless such employment shall have been continuous for twelve months, when the employés will come under the foregoing regulations.

23. The officers and employés in the service are divided into three classes, and the period of leave attached to each class will be as follows:---

Class I.

14 Days, and the holidays referred to in Regulation No. 20, if not required for duty.

Class II.

9 Days, exclusive of the holidays referred to in Regulation No. 20.

Class III.

6 Days, exclusive of the holidays referred to in Regulation No. 20.

Class I.

Cashiers, Chief Clerks, Goods Agents, Pay Masters, Resident Engineer's Assistants, Travelling Auditors, Station Masters, Surveyors, Cadets, Clerks, Draughtsmen, Inspectors (Traffic, Locomotive and Maintenance), Running Shed Foremen, Workshop Foremen.

Class II.

Apprentices, Assistant Guards, Brakesmen, Car Drivers, Chainmen, Engine Drivers, Examiners, Firemen, Fitters, Foremen Porters, Gangers, Guards, Horse Drivers, Lampmen, Lavatory Attendants, Machinists, Messengers, Platelayers, Pumpers, Shunters, Signalmen, Strikers, Tradesmen, Under Foremen, Weighbridge Attendants.

Class III.

Crossing Keepers, Engine Cleaners, Labourers, Porters, Watchmen.

24. All claim for annual leave will lapse at the end of each financial year, viz., on 30th June.

FREE PASSES.

25. Every person on the Permanent Staff, when on leave, may be granted a free pass for himself, his wife, and his family, if dependent upon him for support, and are under the age of eighteen years.

26. Holiday free passes will not be granted to employés who, through misconduct, are not deserving of such indulgence.

27. Free passes may be issued to the employés at the discretion of the head of the branch.

SICK LEAVE.

28. One week's sick leave will be granted, during any year, to any permanent employé who has been in the service for twelve months and upwards, but such leave will count against the authorised leave referred to in Classes 2 and 3, Regulation No. 23.

29. Applications for leave on account of illness will only be considered when accompanied by a certificate from a properly registered medical practitioner; but should the sickness not be of a sufficiently serious character to need the services of a doctor, and the absence only extended over one day, a medical certificate will not be required. Employés not observing this regulation will be treated as absent without leave and have their pay stopped.

Allowances to Injured Employes.

30. Any employć injured while in the execution of his duty, and incapacitated for work by any cause other than his own want of care, shall receive not less than three-fourths of his pay, if his rate is six shillings per day or under, and five-eighths pay if above that rate from the date of the accident, for any period not exceeding four weeks, provided he sends a report of the accident to his superior officer within twelve hours of the occurrence, and a medical certificate within three days which must be renewed weekly during absence.

Allowances for Travelling Expenses.

31. The following will be the allowances, subject to the conditions named below :—

32. The whole daily allowance will be granted when an officer is travelling, or absent from his usual location a day and a night.

Walking Gangers.

Walking Gangers 7s. 6d. when absent from Head Quarters a day and a night; 3s. 9d. if away from Head Quarters all day.

PAY SHEETS.

36. The head of each branch will see that a proper system of time-keeping is in operation, and that the pay-sheets are correctly prepared and certified.

37. The names of the employés are to be entered on the pay-sheets distinctly, the surname appearing first and the Christian name or names next, the latter in full or so abbreviated as to be unquestionable.

38. The whole amount due to each wage employé for services rendered and travelling expenses during the pay period must be included in the ordinary paysheets for that period. The sick and injury allowances must be shown on the pay-sheets separately.

UNIFORMS.

39. Every employé is required to come on duty clean and neat in his person and dress. If provided with uniform, to appear in it in proper order.

40. When an employé leaves the service, the uniform supplied by the department must be given up in a clean and proper condition. The final payment of wages will be withheld until this is done. 41. The following clothing will be supplied by the Commissioner of Railways :---

Station-masters—1 cap and 1 helmet every two years, 1 summer suit (consisting of jacket, vest, and trousers), 1 winter suit (consisting of jacket, vest and trousers).

APPEALS.

42. In any case where an employé considers he has been unjustly dealt with, he must, in the first instance, appeal to the head of his branch for redress, and then, if he still considers he has not been redressed after such appeal, he has the right of appealing to the Commissioner of Railways, such appeal to pass through his departmental head.

The decision of the Commissioner of Railways shall be final.

43. Employés must not, under any circumstances, make their appeals to any of the members of the Assembly or the Council. To take such a course will tend to defeat the object which the appellant may have in view, and lead to disorganisation and disloyalty. Appellants are therefore warned that appeals so made will be followed with suspension from duty.

55. The minimum pay of Shunters will be 7s. per day, and the maximum 9s. per day. After twelve months continuous service as Shunters, an increase of 6d. per day per annum will be granted until the maximum is reached.

Porters.

56. Third Class 6s. per day for first six months; 6s. 6d. for second six months; 7s. after 12 months. Second Class 7s. 6d. per day. First Class and Leading Porters 8s. per day. Head Porters 8s. 6d. to 10s. per day—increases of 6d. per day per annum.

YOUTH PORTERS.

57. For Youth Porters the following scale of pay will apply :—

LABOURERS.

58. The pay of Labourers over 20 years of age will be from 6s. to 8s. per day, according to the nature of the work performed and the prevailing pay given for casual labour in the various districts served by railways in which casual labourers are required. Members of the Wages Staff at Southern Cross, Yalgoo, and stations East thereof will be allowed 1s. per week day in addition to the ordinary rate of pay for Goldfields allowance.

SUNDAY DUTY.

59. The *exact time* on duty will be paid for at the rate of 50 per cent. more than the rate for week day duty.

FIFTY-FOUR HOURS TO THE WEEK.

60. Fifty-four hours' actual work will be considered a week's duty for Foremen, Signalmen, Shunters, Porters, and Labourers, and overtime at the ordinary rate of pay will be paid for work beyond that time; but the Commissioner reserves the right to book a man off, provided such "booking off" can be arranged in the same week.

61. Fifty-four hours' work will be considered a week's duty for a Guard, Brakesman, and Assistant Guard; and overtime will only be allowed if more than fifty-four hours' work is performed in the week. Half time will be allowed for detention at stations *i.e.*, if a Guard runs a trip of four hours, waits five hours and then returns, running four hours more, he will be paid for $10\frac{1}{2}$ hours. Less than 30 minutes overtime will not be reckoned, but over 30 minutes will be reckoned one hour.

LOCOMOTIVE BRANCH (WORKSHOPS).

Foremen, Tradesmen, Mechanics, and Labourers.

62. The rate of wages of Foremen, Tradesmen, &c., will be governed by those prevailing in private establishments in Western Australia for work similar to that which they are required to perform.

Apprentices.

63. Apprentices over 14 years of age and under 18 years will be admitted into the mechanical workshops on the following conditions :—

- Main Line Enginemen will be allowed 45 minutes in which to prepare their engines previous to going on to trains.
- Firemen on Main Line engines will be allowed $1\frac{1}{4}$ hours to prepare their engines previous to going on to trains.
- Drivers and Firemen will be allowed 30 minutes for stabling engine after train working ceases.
- A district rate of 6d. per day will be paid to Engine-drivers and Firemen stationed at Northam.
- A district rate of 1s. per day will be paid to Engine-drivers and Firemen stationed at Southern Cross or at Stations East thereof, or at Yalgoo or Stations East thereof.

68. Promotion to the class of Engine-driver will be made from the grade of 1st class Firemen, if any qualified.

Cleaners.

69. Cleaners will be paid from 6s. 6d. per day of 9 hours.

A district rate of 6d. per day will be allowed to Cleaners stationed at Southern Cross, Yalgoo, and Stations East thereof.
