HEREAS by the 4th Section of "The Goldfields Licensing Act, 1888" (52 Vic., No. 13), it is enacted that whenever it shall appear to the Governor in Council that it is expedient that the provisions of the Act shall no longer apply to any Goldfield, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to direct that the said provisions shall no longer apply thereto, and upon publication of such Proclamation the provisions of the said Act shall no longer apply to such Goldfield: And whereas it has been made to appear to the Governor in Council that it is expedient that the provisions of the said Act shall no longer apply to the Murchison Goldfield: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, do hereby direct that from the pubilcation of this my Proclamation in the Government Gazette, the provisions of the said Act shall no longer apply to the Murchison Goldfield.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the 49th Section of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," it is lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to establish on any Goldfield one or more Courts, to be presided over and holden by a Warden, and to be called a Warden's Court, and which shall be a Court of Record, and shall possess such jurisdiction as is conferred by Part IV. of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient that a Warden's Court shall be established at Nullagine, Pilbarra Goldfield: Now THEREFORE I, Lieut. Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a Warden's Court at Nullagine, in the Pilbarra Goldfield, such Court to be presided over and holden by the Resident Warden of the said Goldfield, or, in his absence, by the Acting Warden thereof.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette from time to time, to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any Stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the Sea coast in Western Australia being "Ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby prohibit the introduction or importation of all Stock from South Africa into the Colony, as a preventative against Rinderpest.





ADE in pursuance of the powers and authorities contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Amendment Act, 1892," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Further Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Public Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1895."

- 1. In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws words having a meaning assigned to them by "The Public Health Act, 1886," and any amendment thereof, shall have the like meaning with the following additions thereto:
 - "District" shall mean the locality known as Subiaco as defined by the Governor by Order in Council dated the 20th day of May, 1896.
 - "Board" shall mean the Local Board of Health appointed by the Governor by the said Order in Council, and the persons hereafter from time to time duly appointed as members of the Board for the District.
 - "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector for the time being of the Board, or any person lawfully acting in his place and stead.
 - "Nightman" shall mean any person who for reward shall remove or shall assist to remove any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, and also any person driving any night cart.
 - "Night Cart" shall mean any dray, cart, barrow, or other carriage whatsoever used by any nightman for the conveyance of any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter.
- 2. These By-laws shall, immediately they are published in the *Government Gazette*, come into operation and be in force in the District.
- 3. The Board hereby provides and declares that all that piece of land bounded on the North by Aberdare Road, on the South by Government land, on the East by Location 728, and on the West by Smyth Street, and containing ten acres more or less, shall be the place for the deposit of nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter.
- 4. No person shall deposit any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter in any place whatsoever other than the place provided by By-law No. 3, and no person shall transport or deposit such nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter from any place within the district to the said place so provided as aforesaid, unless he be a nightman duly licensed as hereinafter provided.
- 5. Every house or tenement within the district shall have a privy or earth closet erected in such position as shall be approved by the Inspector, and such privy or earth closet shall in all cases be not less than twenty feet from such house or tenement.
- 6. Every such privy or earth closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the necessity for carrying the nightsoil or other refuse matter contained therein through any house.

Any owner or occupier of a house or tenement who shall not comply with, or shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this or the preceding By-law, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five shillings nor more than Five pounds.

- 7. All existing cesspits shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within one calendar month of notice to that effect being given by the Inspector to the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such cesspit shall be, and no cesspit shall hereafter be opened or maintained within the district.
- 8. Every privy and earth closet shall, within one month after the publication of these By-laws, be supplied by the occupier of the house to which it belongs with a pan or receptacle for nightsoil, which shall be constructed of iron, oval in shape, the length being 18 inches, width 13 inches, and the height 15 inches, and shall have two fixed handles thereto.
- 9. The occupier of any premises whereon any earth closet or privy is erected, shall keep the same and the pans and receptacles for nightsoil clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause such earth closet and privy to be cleaned once in every week at the least, and the said pans and receptacles to be emptied once in every week at the least.
- 10. No privy nor cesspit nor any pan or other receptacle for nightsoil shall be emptied, nor any blood, offal, or other refuse matter whatever pumped out of any house or premises within the district between the hours of five

o'clock in the morning and eleven o'clock in the evening of any day. And no nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse matter shall be transported or deposited in the district between the aforesaid hours.

- 11. Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse matter shall be removed, and from the owner of any premises on which any cesspit shall have been cleansed and filled up as aforesaid, such sum and sums of money as are mentioned in Schedule B hereto; and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.
- 12. Every nightman, prior to his carrying on his business, shall obtain from the Inspector a license so to do in the form in Schedule A hereto. Such license shall be subject to the conditions contained in By-laws Nos. 13, 14, 5, 16, 17, and 18, and shall be obtained upon an application in writing, which shall contain the true name and address of the applicant, and shall be accompanied by a certificate from two or more householders in the district certifying to the fitness of the applicant to hold such license. The Inspector shall keep a register of all licenses granted by him, with the true name and address of the licenses. The Inspector shall not be bound to issue a license to any person, and shall not, without the consent of the Board, issue a license to any person who has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws.
- 13. Every such license shall remain in force only to the thirty-first day of December next ensuing the issue thereof. Subject, however, to the condition that the Board may (whether the nightman has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws or not), upon being satisfied that a nightman has been guilty of any misconduct or impropriety whilst engaged in his business, or any offence against these By-laws, at any time cancel such license or suspend the operation of the same for such period as the Board may think fit.
- 14. If a nightman shall change his abode during the currency of his license he shall, within two days next after making such change, give to the Inspector notice in writing of such change, and specifying his new address, and shall, at the same, time produce his license to the Inspector, who shall endorse a memorandum therein specifying the new address of the licensee.
- 15. Every nightman shall at all times, when engaged in carrying on his business, have his license with him, and shall be bound, upon demand, to produce the same to the Inspector or other person lawfully authorised to demand such production, and shall also at no time part with the custody or possession of his said license.
- 16. Every nightman shall, before using any nightcart, produce the same for examination by the Inspector, who shall, upon being satisfied of its fitness, register the same as a nightcart with a number in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall hand to the nightman a memorandum of the number of such nightcart upon the register. No cart, dray, barrow, or carriage shall be used as a nightcart until so registered.
- 17. Every nightman shall have painted, and at all times keep conspicuous upon the right side of any nightcart used by him, in white letters not less than two inches in length, and of a proportionate breadth upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman," and together also with the registration number of the cart in figures of not less than four inches in length, and of a proportionate breadth.
- 18. Every nightman shall keep any nightcart used by him watertight and free from leakage, and such cart shall be provided with a cover so as effectually to prevent the splashing out or spilling of any of the contents thereof, or the escape of any offensive smells therefrom. Every nightman shall, within twenty-four hours after being requested so to do by the owner or occupier of any premises whereon are any receptacles for nightsoil requiring emptying or cleansing, or any cesspit requiring emptying and filling up, or by any person appointed by the Board in that behalf, properly cleanse and fill up any cesspit, and cleanse any privy or earth closet, and remove the contents of any receptacle for nightsoil, and the nightman shall be entitled to charge, in respect of such cleansing, filling up, and removal, such sum and sums of money as are mentioned in the Schedule hereto.
- 19. Any nightman who shall be guilty of a breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds, and his license may be forfeited or suspended by the Board.

- 20. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Board, keep any swine within the district.
- 21. Except where otherwise provided, any person committing a breach of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
- 22. All penalties under these By-laws shall be recovered in the manner directed by Section 123 of the Public Health Act, 1886.

By-Laws of the Gullawa Local Board of Health.

IN accordance with the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1886" (subject to amendments), the following By-Laws have been framed to regulate the business of the above Board.

BY-LAWS.

- 1. This Board shall meet for the transaction of general business every alternate Monday, at 7 p.m. Special Meetings may be called at any time deemed necessary by the Chairman or any two Members of the Board.
- 2. All moneys belonging to the Board shall be placed in a Bank to the credit of the Board, and none shall be drawn therefrom except by cheque signed by the Chairman or any Member of the Board and countersigned by the Treasurer and Secretary.
- 3. The duties of the Secretary shall be to attend and take minutes of all meetings of the Board, keep accounts, and perform all other clerical work that may be necessary.
- 4. The duties of the Health Inspector shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the Public Health Act at present in force, and to carry out its provisions under instructions from the Board; to visit occasionally—not less than once a month—the various portions of the Board's District, and, if necessary, give his advice or instructions to occupiers of premises as to the abatement or prevention of nuisances or removal of offensive matter, to keep a record of all such instructions given to abate nuisances, etc., and to furnish the Board at each fortnightly meeting with a written report of all such nuisances abated, and the general sanitary state of District.

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- 5. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other premises shall be kept and maintained in such sanitary condition as shall satisfy the Inspector, and all orders given by the Inspector for the removal or abatement of any nuisance shall be complied with by the owner, occupier, or agent of the premises on which the nuisance is located.
- 6. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other premises shall be provided by the owner, occupier, or agent thereof, with a sufficient number of subtantially constructed closets, each closet to be fitted with a pan, bucket, or other receptacle as may be ordered by the Board, and all such pans, buckets, or as the case may be, shall be emptied at least once a week, or oftener if required by the Inspector, and any person refusing or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-Laws.
- 7. Every pan, bucket, or other receptacle of nightsoil shall be free from leakage, and must be to the approval of the Inspector.
- 8. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, empty bottles, or tins, or other rubbish in any street or other place within the Board's District, other than those places set apart for that purpose, shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing same, be subject also to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.
- 9. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offal, manure, or other offensive substance within the limits of the townsite of Gullawa, or closely adjacent thereto, if such burning or destroyal creates, or is likely to create, a nuisance, except in such cases as in the opinion of the Inspector or any Member of the Board any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt, when such Inspector or Member of the Board may give permission verbally or otherwise for such rubbish, offal, manure, etc., to be burnt.
- 10. In event of any death or accident necessitating the slaughter of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals within the limits of the Board's District, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the limits of the townsite of Gullawa and thoroughly burned Member of the Board, by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-Law shall be subject, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Five Shillings and not more than Ten Pounds.
- 11. This Board may, from time to time, appoint any place or places within its District for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or any other rubbish or offensive matter, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment and the Inspector shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.
- 12. Wherever in these By-Laws the word "Board" is used, it shall be taken to mean the "Gullawa Local Board of Health," and the word "Inspector" shall be taken to mean the "Inspector of Nuisances" for the time being, or any other person duly appointed to act in his stead.
- 13. Whenever in these By-Laws any act, deed, or thing is directed to be done, or any act, deed, or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing, or prevent being done, any act, deed, or thing, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-Laws, and in determining the responsibility of the person or persons against whom any action may be taken under these By-Laws it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person or persons is the occupier, or are the occupiers, of the premises whereon the offence is committed.
- 14. In case of any breach, non-observance, or non-performance of any of the foregoing By-Laws, the person or persons guilty of such breach, non-observance, or non-performance of these By-Laws shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not less than Five Shillings or more than Ten Pounds.
- All penalties recoverable under these By-Laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the Ordinance 50 Victoria, No. 19.
