By His Excellency Lieutenaut-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

To His Honour Sir ALEXANDER CAMPBELL ONSLOW, Knight, Chief Justice of Western Australia.

W HEREAS by Clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the Office of Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 25th August, 1890, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government, or from the Colony, he may in every such case, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Colony, constitute and appoint our Lieutenant-Governor, or if there be no such Officer, then any other person, to be his Deputy during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by these Our Letters Patent as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others : Provided, nevertheless, that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than We may at any time hereafter think proper to direct;

AND WHEREAS I, the said Governor, purpose to absent myself temporarily from the said Colony as authorised;

AND WHEREAS there is no Lieutenant-Governor of the said Colony;

Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this Instrument under the Public Seal of the Colony constitute and appoint His Honour Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the said Colony and during such absence, to exercise, perform, and execute, for and on my behalf as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

HEREAS a certain block of land, consisting of land bounded as hereafter mentioned in the Schedule hereto, has been added to the Townsite of Goongarrie: AND WHEREAS the said block of land is included in and forms portion of the North Coolgardie Goldfield: AND WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Gold-fields Act, 1895," power is given to the Government the said Colony by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to except from occupation for mining purposes or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License any specific portion of Crown Land within a Goldfield : AND WHEREAS the Townsite of Goongarrie as originally declared has been so excepted: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to except the addition since made thereto: Now, THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, do, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, except the said block of land from occupation for mining purposes or for residence or business under any Miner's Right or Business License, the said block of land being a specific portion of Crown Lands within a goldfield, to wit, North Coolgardie Goldfield: AND I do order all persons, from and after the date of the publication of this my Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to take notice hereof and govern themselves accordingly.

1.-SAND CAY IN LENGO CHANNEL-SOLONON ISLANDS.

The position of a sand cay has been fixed by observations taken by H.M.S. "Pylades" and lies inside the portion marked on the chart "Sand banks and reefs." It is about 6ft. high and 20ft. long, extending in an East and West direction, and forms a useful mark for fixing a ship's position when in this neighbourhood.

#### The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

 $4\frac{91}{96}0$ 

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 8th October, 1896.

W HEREAS by Section 6 of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such Regulations as may be deemed expedient for regulating the conditions upon which any stock may be introduced or imported into the Colony: Now therefore I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following Regulations :-

1 No hides or skins of stock shall be imported or introduced into this Colony unless they shall have been thoroughly salted in a proper pit, in which they shall have remained for at least one week.

2. Any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, and the hides or skins with respect to which the offence shall have been committed shall be destroyed or otherwise disposed of as the Minister shall direct.

#### "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 15th September, 1896.

THE attention of Stock Owners is drawn to Section XI. of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," which requires "Every owner of infected stock, or of stock suspected to be infected, shall, within twenty-four hours of the time when he shall have discovered or suspected such stock to be infected, give written notice thereof to the nearest Inspector, and shall thenceforth keep such infected or suspected stock from coming into contact with other stock until otherwise ordered by an Inspector;" and also to Clause 9 of the Stock Regulations, which provides that :---

"Any stock found at any time to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or suspected by the Inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or affected with tick, or lice, or any parasite, may be seized by an Inspector and placed in quarantine, and there treated as the Inspector may direct, at the owner's expense, until clean; or if the disease should be of such a nature that, in the opinion of the Inspector, such stock should be destroyed, the Inspector shall report the case to the Mising and the man when the destruction of the larger the Minister, who may order the destruction of such stock at the owner's expense."

HEREAS by Section 6 of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things "to regulate the size of the meshes of nets to be used for the capture of any species of fish, and to impose such reasonable penalties not exceeding £20 and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such regulations : "

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net of less than  $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch mesh or gauge in the waters of Princess Royal Harbour, Oyster Harbour, and King George's Sound.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than £20, and shall forfeit the net used and all fish which he shall have taken.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR THE LICENSING AND CONTROL OF LUG-GAGE PORTERS ON THE FREMANTLE SEA JETTIES.

Approved by the Governor in Executive Council on the 30th September, 1896.

#### Porters to be licensed.

No person shall ply for hire as a porter unless duly licensed by the Commissioner for that purpose, and every porter shall, when so plying for hire, wear a badge specifying his number, in such a position that the same may be easily seen and recognised. No licensed porter shall transfer or lend his license or badge to any person whomsoever.

#### Applications for licenses.

Applications for licenses must be in writing and signed by the applicant, and addressed to the Commissioner, and licenses may be issued on payment of the prescribed fee.

#### Conduct of porters.

When a vessel just arrived in the port shall cometo on the outside of another vessel lying at any wharf, no carters, porters, or drivers of cabs, carriages, or any other vehicles shall stand on the top of

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the paddle boxes or bridges, or on the side of the inner vessel, but they shall arrange themselves in the middle of the inner vessel. But if the vessel just arrived shall occupy an inside berth, they shall then arrange themselves on the wharf, at least five feet from the edge thereof, until regularly called and passed on board by an officer of the vessel so arriving; and no carter, porter, or driver of any cab, carriage, or other vehicle, on being engaged to carry luggage, shall attempt to transfer it to another, but shall himself accompany his employer agreeably to his engagement. The use of wheelbarrows on the wharf is strictly prohibited.

#### Riotous behaviour.

No porter plying for hire shall go in an unseemly, noisy, or disorderly manner on board of any vessel, nor take hold of or seize any passenger's luggage or article of any kind until first hired to carry same, nor use any abusive or insulting language to any passenger.

#### License to be produced.

Every licensed porter, when required by any constable on duty, or by any officer of the Commissioner, or by any persons wishing to hire or having hired him, shall produce his license for the inspection or the person so requiring same.

"14. If the monthly return of Fees and the amount thereof does not reach the Education Department, Perth, by the 14th day of the month, the rebate of 10  $^{\circ}/_{\circ}$  will not be allowed. In the case of 'Special Schools' this rule may be relaxed."

### Minimum width of Private Streets, &c.

No person shall hereafter make or lay out any new street within a Municipality, unless the same, being a carriage road, be at least thirtythree feet wide, or, not being a carriage road, be at least twenty feet wide, or any alley or court unless of the last-mentioned width.

ADE in pursuance of the powers and authorities contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Amendment Act, 1892," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Further Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Public Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1895."

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws words having a meaning assigned to them by "The Public Health Act, 1886," and any amendment thereof, shall have the like meaning with the following additions thereto:

- "Municipality" shall mean within the limits of Leederville Municipality.
- "Board" shall mean the Local Board of Health, and the persons hereafter from time to time duly elected as Chairman or Mayor and Councillors for the Municipality. "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector for the time
- "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector for the time being of the Board, or any person lawfully acting in his place and stead.
- "Nightman" shall mean any person who for reward shall remove or shall assist to remove any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, and also any person driving any night cart.
- "Night Cart" shall mean any dray, cart, barrow, or other carriage whatsoever used by any nightman for the conveyance of any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter.

2. These By-laws shall, immediately they are published in the *Government Gazette*, come into operation and be in force in the Municipality.

3. This Board may, from time to time, appoint any place or places within its Municipality for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or any other rubbish or offensive matter, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.

4. No person shall deposit any nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter in any place whatsoever other than the place provided by By-law No. 3, and no person shall transport or deposit such nightsoil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter from any place within the district to the said place so provided as aforesaid, unless he be a nightman duly licensed as hereinafter provided.

5. Every house or tenement within the Municipality shall have a privy or earth closet erected in such position as shall be approved by the Inspector, and such privy or earth closet shall in all cases be not less than twenty feet from such house or tenement.

6. Every such privy or earth closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the necessity for carrying the nightsoil or other refuse matter contained therein through any house.

Any owner or occupier of a house or tenement who shall not comply with, or shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this or the preceding By-law, shall be hable to a penalty of not less than Five shillings nor more than Five pounds.

7. All existing cesspits shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within one calendar month of notice to that effect being given by the Inspector to the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such cesspit shall be, and no cesspit shall hereafter be opened or maintained within the district.

8. Every privy and earth closet shall, within one month after the publication of these By-laws, be supplied by the occupier of the house to which it belongs with a pan or receptacle for nightsoil, which shall be constructed of iron, 14 inches diameter, and the height 15 inches, and shall have two fixed handles thereto, the said pan to be obtained from the Board at a cost of 7s. 6d. each.

9. The occupier of any premises whereon any earth closet or privy is erected shall keep the same and the pans and receptacles for nightsoil clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause such earth closet and privy to be cleaned once in every week at the least, and the said pans and receptacles to be emptied once in every week at the least.

10. No privy nor cesspit nor any pan or other receptacle for nightsoil shall be emptied, nor any blood, offal, or other refuse matter whatever pumped out of any house or premises within the Municipality between such hours as the Board may from time to time direct. And no nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse matter shall be transported in the Municipality as aforesaid.

11. Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil, blood, offal, or other refuse matter shall be removed, and from the owner of any premises on which any cesspit shall have been cleansed and filled up as aforesaid, such sum or sums of money as are mentioned in Schedule B hereto; and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

12. Every nightman, prior to his carrying on his business, shall obtain from the Inspector a license so to do in the form in Schedule A hereto. Such license shall be subject to the conditions contained in By-laws Nos. 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18, and shall be obtained upon an application in writing, which shall contain the true name and address of the applicant, and shall be accompanied by a certificate from two or more householders in the Municipality certifying to the fitness of the applicant to hold such license. The Inspector shall keep a register of all licenses granted by him, with the true name and address of the licensees. The Inspector shall not be bound to issue a license to any person, and shall not, without the consent of the Board, issue a license to any person who has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws.

13. Every such license shall remain in force only to the thirty-first day of December next ensuing the issue thereof. Subject, however, to the condition that the Board may (whether the nightman has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws or not), upon being satisfied that a nightman has been guilty of any misconduct or impropriety whilst engaged in his business, or any offence against these By-laws, at any time cancel such license or suspend the operation of the same for such period as the Board may think fit.

14. If a nightman shall change his abode during the currency of his license he shall, within two days next after making such change, give to the Inspector notice in writing of such change, and specifying his new address, and shall, at the same time, produce his license to the Inspector, who shall endorse a memorandum therein specifying the new address of the license.

15. Every nightman shall, at all times when engaged in carrying on his business, have his license with him, and shall be bound, upon demand, to produce the same to the Inspector or other person lawfully authorised to demand such production, and shall also at no time part with the custody or possession of his said license.

16. Every nightman shall, before using any nightcart, produce the same for examination by the Inspector, who shall, upon being satisfied of its fitness, register the same as a nightcart with a number in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall hand to the nightman a memorandum of the number of such nightcart upon the register. No cart, dray, barrow, or carriage shall be used as a night-cart until so registered.

17. Every nightman shall have painted, and at all times keep conspicuous upon the right side of any nightcart used by him, in white letters not less than two inches in length and of a proportionate breadth, upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman," and together also with the registration number of the cart in figures of not less than four inches in length and of a proportionate breadth.

18. Every nightman shall keep any nighteart used by him watertight and free from leakage, and such cart shall be provided with a cover so as effectually to prevent the splashing out or spilling of any of the contents thereof, or the escape of any offensive smells therefrom. Every nightman shall, within twenty-four hours after being requested so to do by the owner or occupier of any premises whereon are any receptacles for nightsoil requiring emptying or cleansing, or any cesspit requiring emptying and filling up, or by any person appointed by the Board in that behalf, properly cleanse and fill up any cesspit, and cleanse any privy or earth closet, and remove the contents of any receptacle for nightsoil, and the nightman shall be entitled to charge, in respect of such cleansing, filling up, and removal, such sum and sums of money as are mentioned in the Schedule hereto.

19. Any nightman who shall be guilty of a breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of 'I'en pounds, and his license may be forfeited or suspended by the Board.

20. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, empty bottles, or tins, or other rubbish in any street or other place within the Municipality, other than those places set apart for that purpose, shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing same, be subject also to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

21. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offal, manure, or other offensive substance within the limits of the townsite of Leederville, or closely adjacent thereto, if such burning or destroyal creates, or is likely to create, a nuisance, except as in such cases as in the opinion of the Inspector or any member of the Board any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt, when such Inspector or Member of the Board may give permission verbally or otherwise for such rubbish, offal, manure, etc., to be burnt.

22. In event of any death or accident necessitating the slaughter of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals within the limits of the Municipality, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the limits of the townsite of Leederville and thoroughly burned and destroyed to the satisfaction of the Inspector or any Member of the Board, by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be subject, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Five Shillings and not more than Ten Pounds.

23. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Board, keep any swine within the Municipality.

24. Except where otherwise provided, any person committing a breach of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds.

25. All penalties under these By-laws shall be recovered in the manner directed by Section 123 of " The Public Health Act, 1886."

26. This Board shall meet for the transaction of general business on the second Thursday in each month, at 8 p.m. Special meetings may be called at any time deemed necessary by the Chairman or any two Members of the Board.
