By-Laws of the Cue Municipal Council.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895,"
Section 99, it is enacted that "every Council may
make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws";
and by the said Act it is further enacted that "such Bylaws should not be inconsistent with, or repugnant to any of the provisions of that Act or to any law in force, and when confirmed by the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and published in the Government Gazette, but not sooner or otherwise, should have the force of law:" Now, therefore, pursuant to the powers contained in the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Cue that the following By-laws, numbered 21 to 46 (Schedules A and B included), shall, from and after confirmation and publication as aforesaid, be By-laws of the Cue Municipal Council.

By-Law No. 21.—Officer of Health.

- 1. It is the duty of the officer of health to superintend the application of all sanitary measures ordered by the Local Board, and to advise them generally in all such
- 2. The officer of health shall make frequent examination of the district under his control, and see that the duties of the inspectors are efficiently performed, and report any neglect of those officers, and, if necessary, suspend any of them until such report and neglect has been considered by the Local Board.
- 3. He is, pursuant to the powers contained in the Public Health Act, 1886, to inspect premises that may be reported to him, or that he may have reason to believe are in a filthy or unwholesome condition and affecting health, and, if found so, to give a certificate in accordance with Section 60 of the Act. He is also required to examine premises where any process of manufacture causing effluvia is carried on, and, if necessary, furnish the Local Board with the required certificate, in accordance with Section 57. He is also to inspect and furnish a certificate, if necessary, of any houses built for habitation, or of any overcrowding, in accordance with Sections 66 and 67. He is also to assist the Board with his presence and advice, if necessary, in order to the carrying out of Section 31, referring to the sale of unwholesome food; and on all occasions to give them the benefit of his medical experience and skill.
- The officer of health is to report to the Local Board, with the least possible delay, any undue prevalence of disease in his district, whether generally or locally, and in the latter case it will be his duty to attract the attention of the Local Board to the locality, in order that remedial measures may be at once taken. He is also carefully to note the appearance in his district of any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, or any indications thereof, or any occurrence or circumstances affecting or likely to involve occurrence or circumstances affecting or likely to involve public health, and he shall immediately make a full report thereof to the Local Board, whose duty it will be immediately to forward his report to the Central Board, in accordance with Section 35; and the health officer is expected energetically to assist in carrying out and enforcing the regulations of the Central Board for mitigating, as far as possible, and preventing and checking the spread of epidemic and other diseases, as detailed in Section 38.
- The officer of health is to furnish the Local Board of his district monthly with a report on the health, cleanliness, and general sanitary state of his district for that period, making any remarks and observations he may think proper.
- 6. The officer of health shall, from time to time, issue to the inspector such orders and instructions as the said health officer may deem necessary; and the inspector, being placed under the control of the health officer, is required to report to him direct upon all matters or things appertaining to their respective duties and distric's. Any special matter contained in any such reports necessary to be brought under the notice of the Local Board shall be forwarded by the health officer to the Local Board in the usual manner.

- 7. The officer of health shall obey the orders of the Council.
- By-Law No. 22.—For Providing and Maintaining Suit-ABLE CLOSETS, AND FOR PROHIBITING CESSPITS.
- The owner of every house or premises within the Town of Cue shall cause to be constructed on said premises a suitable closet, provided with the sealed pans adopted by this Council. Such closet shall be maintained and ventilated to the satisfaction of the officers of the Council, and shall in no case be situated at a less distance than twenty by the express permission of the Council first obtained. Existing cesspits shall forthwith be carefully emptied, cleansed, re-filled with clean earth or stone, thoroughly rammed, and under no circumstances whatever shall new or additional cesspits be made in any place within the town
- Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-2. Every person who shall commit a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 nor less than 5s., and to a further penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s. for each day during which such breach or omission shall be committed or continued.
- By-Law No. 23.-For Preventing the Placing of any OFFENSIVE LIQUID OR ANY REFUSE MATTER ON STREETS OR LANES, ETC.
- 1. No foul or offensive water or other liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or any other refuse matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged into or upon any part whatever of any street or lane, whether public or private, within the limits of the Town of Cue.
- 2. No garbage, sweepings, or other refuse shall be scattered, heaped, or deposited within any yard or premises within the town, save in boxes or vessels, which, when filled, may be reasonably carried by one man, and which shall be specially provided by the occupier of the house or building to which such yard is attached, and shall be so placed and kept as to be readily accessible to the person employed by the Council for removing the same.

 3. For every offence against the provisions of this Bylaw the offender shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding

£10 and not less than 5s.

By-Law No. 24.—For Impounding and Disposing of STRAYING ANIMALS.

The Mayor shall be empowered to instruct any officer of the Council or other person to drive, lead, or otherwise convey any horse, camel, ass, mule, goat, swine, or otherwise convey any horse, camel, ass, mule, goat, swine, or other animal found straying in any street, lane, or other public place within the Municipality of Cue to the pound or other appointed place, and there to detain the same until claimed, or, if not claimed, until the expiry of seven days from the date of impounding. Prior to the release of any animal claimed the owner shall pay all reasonable charges of advertising, driving, and sustenance of said animal to the time of release. Animals not claimed within the specified time may be said upon the order in vertices of the Mayor. time may be sold upon the order in writing of the Mayor, and the proceeds of such sale shall be chargeable with penses attending sale, and with fees for, in, and about the impounding and sustenance of animals so sold.

By-Law No. 25.—For Preventing Obstructions to Streets, Footways, or Water-Channels, and other MATTERS.

Any person who shall make, or cause to be made, any Any person who shall make, or cause to be made, any hole or excavation in any street, lane, or public place, or who shall encumber or obstruct any street, footway, or watercourse within the Town of Cue, by placing thereon or therein any article or material whatsoever, without having previously obtained a written permit from the Council so to do, or having obtained such permit shall neglect to remove the order of the council of the counci move such article or material when ordered by the Council so to do, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

- By-Law No. 26.—For the Punishment of any Contractor or other Person who shall Deposit, or cause to be Deposited, any Rubbish or Materials on the Surface of any Street or Roadway in the TOWN OF CUE, AND OTHER MATTERS.
- Any person who shall place, lay, deposit, shoot, or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street or roadway or public reserve within the town without having first obtained from the Council a permit so to do, shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding £10.
- 2. Every person shall, after having received from the Council, as in the next preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any street, have and keep a sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to sunrise during the time such rubbish or material shall remain and continue so deposited.
- 3. Where any building materials, rubbish, or other things shall be laid, or any hole or excavation shall be

made, in any street or lane within the town, the person depositing or causing such materials or other things to be so laid, or the said hole or excavation to be made, shall, at his own expense, cause a sufficient light to be fixed in a proper place upon or near the same, and continue such light every night from sunset to sunrise during the time such materials, hole, or excavation shall remain; and such person shall, at his own expense, cause such materials, rubbish or other things, hole or excavation, to be sufficiently fenced and enclosed until such materials and other things shall be removed, and the hole or excavation filled up or otherwise made secure; and in case such person shall refuse or neglect so to light, fence, or enclose such materials or other things, or such hole or excavation, he shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW NO. 27.-TO PREVENT CATTLE STRAYING IN THE STREETS OF THE TOWN OF CUE.

- 1. No person shall suffer any kind of swine, or any horse, ass, mule, bull, steer, sheep, goat, camel, or other cattle belonging to him or under his charge, to be at large in any street or public place within the Municipality of Cue.
- 2. Every person who shall offend against this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.
- By-Law No. 28.—To Prevent Obstructions to the FOOTPATHS OF THE STREETS WITHIN THE TOWN OF Cue.

Every tradesman, merchant, or other owner who shall permit any goods, wares, merchandise, boxes, cases, coal, ferewood, or other articles, to remain or be on any footway, or any portion thereof, of any street in the town for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing the same, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW NO. 29.—FOR PREVENTING BROKEN BOTTLES, EARTHENWARE, ETC., BEING THROWN ON THE STREETS OF THE TOWN OF CUE.

Any person or persons placing or having placed, or causing or having caused to be placed or broken, in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Town Council, any glass, metal, or earthenware, bottles, or utensils, without having first obtained the consent of the said Council so to do, shall be liable, beyond the cost and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding £10, in addition to amount of damage caused thereby.

By-Law No. 30.—For Preventing Animals or Vehicles BEING LEFT IN THE STREET, OR OBSTRUCTING ANY PORTION OF ANY STREET.

No person shall leave any horse, ass, mule, camel, ox, cow, or goat, or any vehicle to which there may or may not be attached and harnessed any animal, unattended in any street or at any place of public resort or entertainment, and any corporation officer or police-constable may seize and remove any such animal or vehicle to the nearest public pound, police pound, or town hall yard, and the person so leaving such animal or vehicle shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £2, in addition to any pound fees which may have become due and payable by reason of such impounding.

By-Law No. 31.—To Restrict the Breaking-in of Horses or other Animals in the Streets of Cue.

No person shall break-in any horse, mare, gelding, pony, mule, ass, or camel in any street or thoroughfare of the town of Cue either by leading, riding, or driving the same.

By-Law No. 32.--Regulating Signboards.

- No person shall place or suspend in any street or lane in the Municipality of Cue any signboard or other sign, showbill, or showboard, which shall project more than three feet from the building line, or be at a lesser height than eight feet in the clear from the ground, except by permission of the Council.
- 2. Every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

By-Law No. 33.—Prohibiting Slaughtering of Certain Animals, and Regulating Sale of Meat.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to slaughter cattle or sheep within the limits of the Municipality of Cue, save and except for the sole use of himself and his family.

 2. No person shall bring or cause to be brought or carried through any street or lane in any cart or other vehicle any
- butcher's meat or carcass of meat for food unless such meat shall be duly protected from the sun and dust.

3. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, shall be kept in a clean and healthy state.

4. Every person offending, by neglect or otherwise, against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a fine of not less than £1 nor more than £5 for every such offence.

By-LAW NO. 34 - BUILDING OF HOUSES, ETC.

- Every person intending to erect any house, shop, fence, or other structure abutting upon the building-line of any street or lane, whether public or private, within the Municipality of Cue, shall give to the Town Clerk seven days' clear notice of such intention, describing the nature and situation of such proposed erection, and, if required by the Council, shall furnish for their inspection a copy of plans and specifications proposed to be adopted for such erection.
- Every person intending to build, take down, alter, or repair any house, shop, fence, or other structure abutting upon the building-line of any street or lane, whether public or private, within the Municipality of Cue, shall cause such hoarding or other protection to be put up to separate such work from the street as shall be required by any authorised officer of the Council, and shall duly light the same by night, and maintain such light to the satisfaction of such officer.
- 3. Every person who, by neglect or otherwise, shall offend against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £1 nor more than £20.

By-Law No. 35.—Encroachments or Obstructions to be REMOVED.

- 1. On the order of the Council the Town Clerk or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under control of the Council.
- 2. In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Council to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall not be less than 5s. nor more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed herein.

BY-LAW No. 36.—To COMPEL THE USE OF DISINFECTANTS.

- 1. The owner, occupier, or any person having the management or control of any house or premises, whether public or private, within the Municipality of Cue, shall cause to be kept, in every closet belonging thereto, a box containing dry earth, ashes, sawdust, or such other material as the Council or their officer may approve, and cause all as the content of their older may approve, and cause an night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or receptacle in such closets to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of deodorant or disinfectant sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorise or disinfect the contents of such pan or receptacle.
- 2. Every person who shall refuse or neglect to comply with the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and not less than 10s., upon conviction of such offence; and to a further penalty not exceeding £5, nor less than 5s., for each day during which such refusal or neglect shall occur or be continued.

By-Law No. 37.

- 1. Every nightman, prior to his carrying on his business, shall obtain from the inspector a license so to do in the form of Schedule A hereto. Such license shall be subject to the conditions contained in Sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 of this By-law, and shall be obtained upon an application in writing, which shall contain the true name and address of the applicant, and shall be accompanied by a certificate from two or more householders in the district certifying to the fitness of the applicant to hold such license. The inspector shall keep a register of all licenses granted by him, with the true name and address of the licensees. The inspector shall not be bound to issue a license to any person, and shall not, without the consent of the Board, issue a license to any person who has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws.
- 2. Every such license shall remain in force only to the 31st day of December next ensuing the issue thereof. Subject, however, to the condition that the Board may (whether the nightman has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws or not), upon being satisfied that a nightman has been guilty of any misconduct or impropriety whilst engaged in his business, or any offence against these By-laws, at any time cancel such license, or suspend the eration of the same for such period as the Board may think fit.

- 3. If a nightman shall change his abode during the currency of his license he shall, within two days next after making such change, give to the inspector notice in writing of such change, and specifying his new address, and shall, at the same time, produce his license to the inspector, who shall endorse a memorandum therein specifying the new address of the licensee.
- Every nightman shall at all times, when engaged in carrying on his business, have his license with him, and shall be bound, upon demand, to produce the same to the inspector or other person lawfully authorised to demand such production, and shall also at no time part with the custody or possession of his said license.
- 5. Every nightman shall, before using any nighteart, produce the same for examination by the inspector, who shall, upon being satisfied of its fitness, register the same as a nightcart with a number in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall hand to the nightman a memorandum of the number of such nightcart upon the register. No cart, dray, barrow, or carriage shall be used as a nightcart until so registered.
- 6. Every nightman shall have painted, and at all times keep conspicuous upon the right side of any nightcart used by him, in white letters not less than two inches in length, and of a proportionate breadth upon a black ground, his name, together with the words "Licensed Nightman," and together also with the registration number of the cart in figures of not less than four inches in length, and of a proportionate breadth.
- Every nightman shall keep any nightcart used by him watertight and free from leakage, and such cart shall be provided with a cover so as effectually to prevent the splashing out or spilling of any of the contents thereof, or the escape of any offensive smells therefrom. Every night-man shall, within 24 hours after being requested so to do by the owner or occupier of any premises whereon are any receptacles for night-soil requiring emptying or cleansing, or any cesspit requiring emptying and filling up, or by any person appointed by the Board in that behalf, properly cleanse and fill up any cesspit, and cleanse any privy or earth closet, and remove the contents of any receptacle for night-soil, and the nightman shall be entitled to charge, in respect of such cleansing, filling up, and removal, such sum and sums of money as are mentioned in the Schedule hereto.
- Any nightman who shall be guilty of a breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and his license may be forfeited or suspended by the Board.

BY-LAW NO. 38.—DAMAGING PROPERTY, ETC., OF MUNICIPALITY.

Any person who shall (without first having obtained the sanction, in writing, of the Council) break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure, or remove or carry away any footpath, tree, plant, post, fence, gate, drain, watercourse, culvert, building, or other property belonging to, or in charge of, or under the possession, control, or power of the Council, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 39. Exection of Tents, Pavilions, etc.

Any person who shall erect, or cause to be erected, any pavilion, tent, shed, or other structure of canvas or other inflammable material within the Municipality, and which, in the opinion of the Council, constitutes a menace to the convenience, comfort, or safety of the inhabitants, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty of £10. And any person who, after receiving notice to remove such structure as aforesaid, shall not have removed same within 24 hours from the service of such notice, shall be liable to a penalty of £5 for every day during which he shall have neglected to comply with such notice.

BY-LAW NO. 40.—LAMP POSTS, ETC.

No lamp posts, bridle posts, and flagstaffs shall be erected in any street without the written consent of the Council, and shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted at least once in every three years, as may be directed by the Council, and the Council may order the

removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 41.—Processions and Bands.

- 1. No procession, other than a funeral procession, shall pass through any street within the Municipality without first having obtained the written permission of the Mayor or Council.
- 2. No band or person shall be allowed to play any musical instrument in any of the streets within the Municipality without first obtaining permission of the Mayor or Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 42.—VELOCIPEDES, ETC.

Any person who shall ride or place a bicycle or other Any person who shall ride or place a bicycle or other velocipede upon any footpath, and any person riding or placing a bicycle or velocipede upon any street, between sunset and sunrise, without carrying a lighted lamp and an alarm bell attached to the front part of such bicycle or velocipede, and sounding the bell in ample time to allow foot passengers and others to protect themselves from danger, and any person riding a bicycle or other velocipedel in or upon any street or readyway in a fuvious manyor shall in or upon any street or roadway in a furious manner, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 43.—Temporary Stalls.

The Council may grant permission to any person to fix and use temporary stalls in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables or articles of merchandise, for such time and such places as the Council may think fit: Provided that the general traffic is not obstructed by any such stalls, and that such permission may be withdrawn by the Mayor or Council at any time by written notice: And the Council shall charge the person using a fee not exceeding £5; and any person erecting or using any such stall in or near any street for the above purposes, without first obtaining such permission of the Council, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and be subject to a penalty of £5 for each offence.

By-Law No. 44.—Regulation of Street Traffic on Special Occasions.

The Council may, in its discretion, regulate or prohibit the traffic in or along all or any of the foot and carriage ways of any street during times of public interest, amusement, or excitement, or during repairs to such street.

By-Law No. 45.—Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation GROUNDS.

- All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws.
- The Council shall have the power to grant the 2. The Council shall have the power to grant the exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves within the Municipality for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons for any time not exceeding three days, and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Council a fee to be fixed; but the public will have the right to enter upon such lands, provided they do not in any way interfere with sports or amusements being carried on. amusements being carried on.
- No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed upon any park land or recreation ground without the written permission of the Mayor or Council.
- 4. All persons using or being upon any park lauds, re-creation grounds, or reserves, shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Corporation.
- 5. The Council may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.
- 6. No person shall sell, or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise, in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves without first having obtained the written consent of the Mayor or Council, and shall pay a fee; the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.
- 7. No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

By-Law No. 46.—Dairies.

Any person or persons carrying on the trade of cowkeepers, dairymen, or purveyors of milk within the Munici-

pality shall register their names and addresses with the Town Clerk, and shall keep their milk stores, shops, or dairies, or milk vessels used for containing milk for sale, and every place used in connection therewith, in a thoroughly clean condition, to the satisfaction of an officer appointed by the Council.

2. No person shall contaminate or adulterate in any way any milk offered for sale within the Municipality. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such
