Proclaiming Act passed by Federal Council.

PROCLAMATION

Western Australia, } By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel

WHEREAS by "The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885," it is enacted that every Act of the Federal Council of Australasia, assented to in the first instance by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session of the Council in which such Act was passed was held, shall be proclaimed in the *Government Gazette* of that Colony, and shall also be transmitted by the Governor assenting thereto to the Governors of the several Colonies affected thereby, and shall be proclaimed by them within the respective Colonies of which they are Governors: AND WHEREAS the Sixth Session of the Federal Council of Australasia was lately held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: AND WHEREAS His Excellency the Right Honourable Jenico William Joseph Viscount Gormanston, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor of the said Colony of Tasmania, did, on the first day of February ultimo, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, assent to the following Act of the said Federal Council, passed in the said Sixth Session thereof, that is to say:—

"An Act to make provision for the Enforcement in certain cases within the Australasian Colonies, or some of them, of Orders of the Supreme Courts of such Colonies for the production of Testamentary Instruments."

and did by a Proclamation, bearing date the first day of February ultimo, proclaim the said Act in the *Hobart Gazette*, being the "Government Gazette" of

the said Colony of Tasmania: And Whereas the said Jenico William Joseph Viscount Gormanston, the Governor of the Colony of Tasmania aforesaid, has transmitted the said Act to me, the Governor of the Colony of Western Australia, which Colony is affected by the said Act: NOW, THEREFORE, I Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., the Governor aforesaid, in pursuance of the said first-mentioned Act, do, by this my Proclamation, notify, publish, and proclaim, within the Colony of Western Australia, the said Act of the Federal Council of Australasia, of which said Act a copy is annexed to this Proclamation. And all Her Majesty's subjects in Western Australia are to take notice of the said Act and govern themselves accordingly.

Given at Perth, under my hand and the Public Seal of the said Colony, this 20th day of March, in the year of our Lord 1897, and in the 60th year of Her Majesty's reign.

AN ACT to make provision for the Enforcement in certain cases within the Australasian Colonies, or some of them, of Orders of the Supreme Courts of such Colonies for the Production of Testamentary Instruments.

[1 February, 1897.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS the Legislatures of Tasmania, Western Australia, Victoria, and Queensland have, pursuant to the

provisions of "The Federal Council of Australasia Act, 1885," referred to the Federal Council the matter of the enforcement by the Supreme Court of one Colony of any process of the Supreme Court of another Colony directed to compelling the production in such last-mentioned Court of any unproved will or testamentary document in the possession of any person resident in such first-mentioned Colony when such will or testamentary document devises or bequeaths property situated in the Colony from the Supreme Court whereof the process issues, and is required for the purpose of obtaining probate of such will or testamentary document or registering the same in such last-mentioned Colony:

And whereas it is desirable that the enforcement of such process should be authorised in manner hereinafter provided:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Federal Council of Australasia, assembled at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited as "The Australasian Testamentary Process Act, 1897."

Interpretation.

2. In this Act—

The expression "testamentary instrument" means any paper or writing being or purporting or alleged to be testamentary; and

The word "order" includes any subpoena or other process requiring any person to produce or bring in any testamentary instrument.

Enforcement of testamentary process of any Colony by the Supreme Court of any other Colony.

3. Subject to the provisions of this Act, when a person required to produce any testamentary instrument or to bring the same into the Registry or other proper office of the Supreme Court of any Colony to which the provisions of this Act extend is or is believed to be in any other such Colony, a Judge or other officer of such Court who, if such person were within his jurisdiction, would have authority to issue an order requiring such person to produce and bring in such testamentary instrument, may issue such an order, and a Judge or other proper officer of the Supreme Court in any other such Colony, having similar jurisdiction in such other Colony, may, if he think fit, endorse the order with his signature. And the person required to produce and bring in such testamentary instrument on service in such other Colony of the order so endorsed shall produce and bring the same into the Registry or other proper office of the Supreme Court of such other Colony, and in default shall be liable in the Colony in which he is served to the like process of contempt as he would have been subject to if he had been a party to a suit or action in the Supreme Court of such Colony, and had been ordered by the Judge or other proper officer of such Court to do the act by the order so endorsed, required, or enjoined to be done.

Cases in which process may be so enforced.

4. No order shall be endorsed in pursuance of the provisions of this Act unless the Court to which application for such endorsement is made has reason to believe that such testamentary instrument devises or bequeaths property situated in the Colony in which such order was issued, and is required for the purpose of obtaining probate thereof, or registering the same in such last-mentioned Colony, proof whereof may be made by affidavit filed in the Court to which such application is made.

And no such order shall be so endorsed upon any application made after the lapse of Twelve months from the date of such order unless the delay in applying for such endorsement shall be explained to the satisfaction of the Judge or other proper officer to whom such application is made.

Preliminaries to enforcement of order.

5. No proceeding shall be taken to enforce any such order under the provisions of this Act unless an affidavit is first filed in the Court in which such proceedings are intended to be taken, stating that the act required or enjoined to be done remains undone.

Person by whom affidavits are to be made.

6. Every affidavit filed in pursuance of the provisions of this Act shall be made by the person at whose instance the order was made, or by some other person cognizant of the facts of the case, and shall be sworn before a Commissioner of the Court in which the affidavit is to be filed.

Control of Court over proceedings.

7. The Supreme Court of every Colony shall, so far as relates to the enforcement of an order which has been endorsed by a Judge or other proper officer of such Court pursuant to the provisions of this Act, have and exercise the same control and powers over and in relation to such order and the costs of and incidental thereto as such Court would have and might exercise if the order had been originally issued out of such Court.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty the Queen, I assent to this Act.

Subiaco declared a Municipality.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation, to declare any town or locality containing rateable property capable of yielding, upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the annual value thereof calculated under the provisions of the said Act, a sum of Three hundred pounds, to be a Municipality, and to define the boundaries of such Municipality, and also to divide a Municipality into Wards and define the boundaries of such Wards; AND WHEREAS it is necessary, in order to determine the constitution of the Municipal Council, that the population of the town or locality to be proclaimed a Municipality shall be declared by the Governor; AND WHEREAS it is made to appear to the Governor in Executive Council that the locality of Subiaco (hereinafter described) contains rateable property capable of yielding the required amount levied as aforesaid, and should be proclaimed a Municipality: NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers so vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare the population of the said locality of Subiaco to be over One thousand and not exceeding Five thousand: And I do, with the like advice, by this my Proclamation declare and proclaim the said locality to be a Municipality, under the name, style, and title of "The Mayor and Councillors of Subiaco," and do divide the said Municipality into Three Wards, to be called "The South Ward," "The Central Ward," and "The North Ward," and do also declare and proclaim the boundaries of the said Municipality and Wards to be as follows:—

BOUNDARIES OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SUBIACO.

Bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the South side of the Eastern Railway Reserve with the North-West boundary of Perth Townsite, and extending Westerly along said side of Railway Reserve to a point due South from the South-East corner of Perthshire Location 121; thence North to the said South-East corner, and West, passing along the South boundaries of said Perthshire Locations 121, 119, and Ag, and Swan Location 388, to the East boundary of Perthshire Location A1; thence South to the North boundary of Reserve 2290; thence East to its North-East corner, and South 16 chains 50 links; thence East to the East side of said Eastern Railway Reserve, and along it Southward to the South side of Aberdare Road; thence East along said side of Aberdare Road to the West side of Thomas Street, and along it North-Easterly to the starting point.

SOUTH WARD.

All that portion of the Municipality South of the North side of Hamersley Road and its prolongation Westward and Eastward.

CENTRAL WARD.

All that portion of the Municipality bounded by lines starting from the North side of Hamersley Road at its intersection with the West side of Townshend Road, and extending along said side of Townshend Road to the North side of Barker Road; thence along said side of Barker Road to the West side of Rokeby Road; thence along said side of Rokeby Road to the Northern side of Railway Road; thence along said side of Railway Road to a point due South from the South-East corner of Perthshire Location 121; thence North to the said corner; thence West, passing along the South boundaries of said Perthshire Locations 121, 119, and Ag, and Swan Location 388, to the East boundary of Perthshire Location A1; thence South to the prolongation Westwards of the North boundary of Hamersley Road; thence along said prolongation, and the North side of Hamersley Road, to the starting point.

NORTH WARD.

All that portion of the Municipality bounded by lines starting from the intersection of the South side of the Eastern Railway Reserve with the North-West boundary of Perth Townsite, and extending Westerly along said side of Railway Reserve to the prolongation Northwards of the Western side of Rokeby Road; thence along said side of Rokeby Road to the North side of Barker Road; thence along said side of Barker Road to the West side of Townshend Road; thence along said side of Townshend Road to the North side of Hamersley Road; thence along said side of Hamersley Road, to the North-West side of Thomas Street; thence along said side of Thomas Street to the starting point.

Margaret District: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the

business of the said Court at Murrin Murrin, in the Mt. Margaret District aforesaid, shall be transacted at Mt. Margaret in the said District instead of at Murrin Murrin as aforesaid: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a Warden's Court at Mt. Margaret, in the Mt. Margaret District of the Mt. Margaret Goldfield, instead of at Murrin Murrin as aforesaid: such Court to be presided over and holden by the Resident Warden of the said Goldfield, or in his absence by the Acting Warden thereof.

Malcolm, in the Mt. Malcolm District of the Mt. Margaret Goldfield; at Niagara, in the Niagara District of the North Coolgardie Goldfield; at Peak Hill, in the Peak Hill

Goldfield; at Mt. Mortimer, in the Ashburton Goldfield; and at Bangemall, in the Gascoyne Goldfield: Such Courts to be presided over and holden by the Resident Wardens of the said goldfields, or, in their absence, by the Acting Wardens thereof.

Imported Dog Regulations.

“The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.”

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 3rd day of March, 1897.

WHEREAS by “The Stock Diseases Act, 1895,” the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to prohibit the introduction or importation into the Colony, either by sea or land, of any stock from any country or place; or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea coast in Western Australia, being “ports” within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby prohibit the introduction or importation of Dogs into Western Australia from beyond the limits of the Australasian Colonies and New Zealand, except in conformity with and subject to the following Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

(1.) No dog shall be landed in the Colony of Western Australia at any place other than within the ports of Albany and Fremantle.

(2.) The quarantine ground in the port of Albany shall be Geakes' Island, and the quarantine ground for Fremantle shall be the enclosure set apart for that purpose on Rottneest Island.

(3.) No dog will be allowed in the quarantine ground except for the purpose of quarantine, and any dog found trespassing on the quarantine ground may be destroyed or subjected to quarantine by an Inspector.

(4.) All dogs imported into the ports of Albany or Fremantle, or any other port in the Colony of Western Australia, which the master of any vessel shall certify in the notice required by the Regulations issued under “The Stock Diseases Act, 1895,” on August 28, 1897, as being only ship's dogs, or dogs in transit to other colonies not requiring to be landed, such dogs, if healthy, shall be detained on board such vessel, and shall be securely chained whilst within any port in the Colony, except as may be otherwise authorised by an Inspector.

(5.) Any master, or owner, or consignee who shall refuse or neglect to have any dog securely chained as directed by an Inspector, or who shall neglect to carry out any order or direction given by an Inspector for the care or security of any dog, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £50.

(6.) Any dog from the shore found or allowed to stray on board a ship on which an imported dog is detained may be destroyed or detained in quarantine at the expense of the owner, and any person taking or allowing a dog to be on board a ship where an imported dog is detained shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20. Any master, mate, or member of the crew of a ship who shall permit or suffer a dog to go on board their ship during the time any dog shall be detained on such ship shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20 for each breach of this regulation.

(7.) A deposit of £10 for every dog to be landed shall be paid on demand to the Chief Inspector, to meet the expenses liable to be incurred in the quarantine and treatment of such dog.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the City of Perth hereby enacts the following By-law as an addition to the By-laws for "The General Regulation of Traffic in and through the Streets and Footways of the City of Perth:—

BY-LAW 32.

Any person who shall ride or drive any animal or animals, whether attached to any vehicle or not, at more than a walking pace round the corners formed by the junction of any public or private street in the City of Perth with any other street in the said City, or across the intersections of any of the streets of the City, or along or across the Railway Bridge, shall for every offence forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding Ten Pounds. Provided always, that this By-law shall not be in force unless the Council shall cause to be placed, in some conspicuous place at or near the corner of any such public or private street, a printed notice requiring the public to ride or drive round such corner at a walking pace.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Victoria, No. 10), it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for any of the purposes enumerated in the said section 99, subsection 20: And whereas pursuant to the powers contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act,

1871," the Council of the City of Perth did enact certain By-laws, Nos. 7 and 8, for the regulation of licensed public vehicles, and it is deemed expedient to repeal the same, and make other provisions in lieu thereof :

Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Council of the City of Perth, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers in that behalf, that the said By-laws numbered 7 and 8 henceforth shall be and are hereby repealed, and the following By-laws shall be the By-laws of the said City of Perth, in lieu thereof, in respect of the matters hereinafter mentioned :—

1. In the construction of these By-laws, except where the context shall require a different construction, the following terms in inverted commas shall have the respective meanings hereunto affixed to them, that is to say—

"Omnibus" shall mean a vehicle used for the purpose of plying for hire in any public street or place for passengers to be carried at separate fares.

"Cab" shall mean and include as well a hansom cab as any hackney carriage, wagonette, or other passenger vehicle other than an omnibus.

"Dray" shall mean and include any van, dray, wagon trolley or other vehicle used for the removal, cartage or conveyance of goods, merchandise, furniture produce or other wares.

2. No person shall keep or use, for the purpose of standing or plying for hire within the City of Perth, any omnibus, cab or dray, without having first obtained a license therefor as hereinafter provided.

3. Any person desirous of obtaining a license for any omnibus, cab or dray, shall apply for the same to the Licensing Officer, and shall pay the fee set forth in Schedule H. Such license shall, if granted, be in such of the forms in Schedule A as shall be applicable.

4. No license for any omnibus or cab shall be granted or renewed, unless such vehicle, and the horse or horses, or other animals and harness shall have been inspected and examined by the Inspector or other officer appointed for that purpose, and reported by him to be in a fit state to be licensed, and no license shall be granted for any cab, hackney carriage, or passenger vehicle which, in the opinion of the Licensing Officer, shall be unsafe, in bad repair, or otherwise unfit for the accommodation or conveyance of passengers.

5. No license shall hereafter be granted for any cab unless the same shall be of at least the following dimensions, viz. :

Height inside from bottom of floor thereof to roof (in front of seat) 4 feet 10 inches, height inside from top of seat to roof 3 feet 6 inches, width of seat room 1 foot 4 inches for each passenger which the vehicle is licensed to carry, depth of seat 1 foot 2 inches.

6. The number of the license granted for every licensed cab shall be painted in plain figures of not less than 4 inches in height, and of proportionate breadth, of a colour of a clear contrast with the colour on which it shall be painted outside on the panel of each door of such cab, and on the back of the boot, and the inside of the dash of any such cab; and upon the outside of each lamp of such cab the same number shall be painted in black. All the aforesaid numbers shall be kept legible and undefaced during the time such cab shall ply or be used for hire.

7. The driver of every licensed cab shall have the number of the license thereof, and the table of fares now or hereafter to be fixed and determined by the City Council, printed in large, legible, and conspicuous figures, on a card firmly fixed to the back panel of the said cab, and such card shall be so affixed, legible, and undefaced during the time such cab shall ply or be used for hire.

8. The driver of every licensed cab shall, whilst plying for hire, keep affixed to the right hand side under the window of such vehicle a leather satchel, of a type to be approved of by the City Council; and such satchel shall contain at least two clean and unfolded copies of a ticket, containing a table of the fares payable for the hire of such cab according to Schedule J, with the number thereof, and the owner's name and residence written or printed in clear and legible characters. Such satchel shall always be kept in such manner that the hirer may, without difficulty, obtain and take one of such printed tables.

9. The driver of any licensed cab shall not carry, or permit to be carried in, or upon such cab, any person other than the hirer thereof, except with the consent of such hirer.

10. The owner of every licensed cab shall provide the driver with at least two clean and unfolded copies of a ticket table, containing a list of the fares payable for the hire thereof, the number of the vehicle, and the owner's name and residence, written or printed thereon in clear and legible characters.

11. Every cab standing or being on a public stand shall be deemed to be plying for hire, and the driver thereof shall be bound to take immediately any fare notwithstanding any pre-engagement. Provided, however, that no driver shall be bound to take such fare, unless such fare shall, upon demand, pay the legal fare for the required hiring there and then. And it is further ordered that, if at any other place than a public stand the driver of a licensed cab shall solicit engagement by word of mouth or sign, he shall be bound to take any fare then offering, subject to the same conditions as before mentioned as to right to demand payment in advance.

12. The places mentioned in Schedule L are hereby appointed as public stands, and no licensed cab shall stand for hire at any other place within the City of Perth. The driver of any licensed cab standing for hire at any other place within the City of Perth, other than those mentioned in the said schedule, shall be liable to a penalty under these By-laws.

13. No license shall be granted for any omnibus unless the same shall be of at least the dimensions, and shall be provided with the fittings and furniture following, that is to say :

From floor to roof, to line with front of each seat, not less than 5 feet. From top of seat of cushion to roof not less than 3 feet 6 inches.

Each seat shall not be less than 14 inches wide. Space from seat to seat between the inside seats not less than 2 feet. The outside seats, when not of rustic pattern, and all inside seats, shall be furnished with sound and serviceable cushions.

A bell or check string to warn the driver to stop when required.

Two lamps shall be placed outside, one on each side of the omnibus, and one inside, of the colours which shall be prescribed by the City Council for the line of road on which it shall ply.

Springs or contrivances shall be provided to all window frames, of an approved pattern, so as to prevent noise.

Waterproof aprons, to be approved of by the City Council, for the use of and sufficient to cover the legs of outside passengers.

The floor of every omnibus shall be covered with rope or coir mats, or some other proper material to be approved of by the City Council. In wet weather clean straw may be used.

The headpiece of every omnibus shall be painted of a colour prescribed by the City Council for the line of road on which it shall ply.

The number of the license shall be painted in black in figures 2 inches high, and of a proportionate width, on the outside lamps.

The number of the license shall also be painted in figures 2 inches high, and of proportionate width, upon or near the driver's seat, and upon the panel of the door on the outer side.

The fare, and the name of the owner, and the licensed number, shall be painted on the outside door. The name of the stands between which it shall be licensed shall appear on each external side, clear of the wheels.

14. On the front panel, inside every omnibus, and in a conspicuous place, shall appear the names of the stands or places between which it shall be licensed to ply, the number of passengers for which it is licensed, the time of journey the fare, the licensed number, and the name of the owner, except where otherwise directed by the City Council. All the words and figures above mentioned shall be not less than 2 inches in length, free from flourishes or intricate designs, and of a colour in clear contrast with the ground on which they shall be painted; no alteration shall be made in any omnibus in any of the above respects until notice in writing thereof shall have been given by the owner of such omnibus to, and permission shall have been obtained from, the Traffic Inspector of the City Council of Perth.

15. The owner of every omnibus plying for hire shall provide the driver or conductor with at least two clean copies of a ticket containing the fares chargeable for each journey, the licensed number, and the name of the owner of such omnibus, and such other particulars as the Council may from time to time direct.

16. Every omnibus shall start from its stand and complete the journey and the parts thereof to the other stand as directed from time to time by the City Council or its officer, without turning round or leaving the proper line of road from one stand to the other, provided that the officer duly appointed by the City Council shall be at liberty to grant permission to the owner or driver of any omnibus to leave the line of road for which the same is licensed and ply the same from or to any place not being an appointed stand. In no case shall any owner or driver of any omnibus without such permission permit or suffer the same to leave the line of road for which the same is licensed, without the permission of such officer of the said City Council of Perth. A written application for permission to leave the line of road must be left with the Town Clerk three days at least before such permission is required.

17. Every licensed omnibus and cab shall be provided with a lamp inside, and one on each side on the outside, and the driver of the same, when plying for hire between sunset and sunrise, shall light and keep such lamps lighted.

18. The charge for each passenger to be carried in any omnibus licensed under these By-laws shall in no case exceed Threepence (children in arms not to be charged for), and such charge shall entitle the passenger to carry 14lbs. weight of luggage. All luggage over 14lbs. weight shall be paid for at the rate of Threepence for each package.

19. Licensed vehicles known as "hansom cabs," when plying for hire, shall not be allowed to carry more than two passengers at any one time. The number of persons to be carried inside and outside of every other licensed omnibus or cab shall be painted, on the outside of the same, in figures of not less than 2 inches in length, and of proportionate breadth, in such position as the Inspector or other officer duly appointed for that purpose may direct, and such number shall be kept legible and undefaced during the whole of the time such omnibus or cab shall ply for hire, and in no case shall such number of passengers be exceeded. Any person who shall force himself or herself in or upon any licensed vehicle after the licensed number is therein or thereon shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and may be removed therefrom by the driver or any Inspector, officer, or police constable. No omnibus or cab shall be licensed to carry more passengers than the same will accommodate, upon fit seats properly cushioned, allowing for each passenger to be seated on the inside a space of 16 inches, and for each passenger to be seated on the outside a space of 15 inches, measuring in a straight line lengthwise on the front of each seat. Provided that no child under five years of age sitting on the lap shall be deemed to be a passenger within the meaning of these By-laws. No person shall be allowed to carry more than one child without paying for the same.

20. No person shall drive, or be in charge of, or act as conductor of any licensed omnibus, cab, or dray, whilst standing or plying for hire within the City of Perth, without having first obtained a license therefor, as hereinafter provided, nor during the suspension nor after the cancellation of such license.

21. Every person desirous of obtaining a license as a driver or conductor of a licensed omnibus, cab, or dray shall make application therefor in the form prescribed in Schedule B, accompanied by a certificate in the form prescribed in the said Schedule B, signed by two respectable householders and ratepayers of the City of Perth. The fee for such license to be paid at the time of application therefor is set forth in Schedule I.

22. The license for a driver or conductor of an omnibus or cab shall be in the form of Schedule C, and shall be issued in duplicate. One copy thereof, to be called the "original," shall be lodged by the driver or conductor with his employer at the time of his being employed, and shall be retained by such employer during the time of such employment, and the other copy of such license, to be called the "duplicate," shall be retained by the driver or conductor, who shall not lend or otherwise part with the same.

23. No person shall be licensed as a driver under these By-laws who shall be under the age of 17 years, nor as a conductor under the age of 13 years.

24. No driver or other person having the care and charge of any licensed dray drawn by one or more horse or horses or other animals shall ride thereon unless he shall be provided with good and sufficient reins, and no vehicle without springs shall be allowed to proceed out of a walking pace within the City of Perth.

25. In every case where goods and merchandise shall be left on any licensed dray, or with the driver thereof, by any person or persons having hired or used the same, such property shall be delivered up to such person or persons, or shall be taken within 18 hours in the state and condition in which it shall have been found to the offices of the City Council, and deposited in such place as the Town Clerk or other officer shall appoint.

26. The number of the license granted for any licensed dray shall be painted in a colour to contrast with the ground on which it shall be so painted on the panels on each side of the dray, in figures not less than 2 inches in height, and of proportionate breadth, with the letters "P.C.C." of the same colour immediately above the figures, and the owner of such dray shall at all times keep the same legible and undefaced.

27. The rates which may be lawfully charged for the hire of any licensed dray by the driver or owner thereof are set out in Schedule K. No owner or driver of any licensed dray shall permit or suffer any person to be carried thereon or therein as a passenger.

28. The driver of every licensed omnibus or cab taking up or setting down a passenger at any place of public worship or public amusement, or any public meeting within the City, or who is waiting for such purpose, shall act under the direction of the Inspector, officer, or police constable who shall be on duty at such place or places, as to the taking up or setting down or waiting for any passengers, and as to the order or place in which any such vehicle shall stand, and shall perform his duty in a careful and quiet manner, and shall not push into or get out of the line or position fixed for any such vehicle so as to endeavour to arrive at his place of appointment before any other vehicle the driver whereof from its position would have a prior right to take up or set down passengers. Every driver whilst engaged in taking up or setting down any passenger shall place his vehicle as near as may be to the kerb or footpath at the side of the street at which the taking up or setting down is required, and every cabdriver shall assist such passenger with the loading and unloading of his luggage.

29. The number of horses or other animals required to draw any licensed omnibus or cab shall be determined by the City Council at the time of the application by any owner for a license, and such number shall be inserted in the license of such omnibus or cab, and no person or persons shall drive any licensed omnibus or cab drawn by a less number of horses or other animals than shall be specified in such license. All licensed vehicles drawn by more than two horses or other animals shall be provided by the owner thereof with a conductor, except where otherwise directed.

30. The driver of every licensed omnibus or cab shall carefully examine the same immediately after setting down his fare, and whenever any property shall have been left in any such omnibus or cab by any person having used or hired the same, the driver shall, within 12 hours thereafter, deliver the same at the Town Clerk's office, or to any officer appointed by the City Council of Perth, or at the Central Police Station of the said City. And no owner of any licensed omnibus or cab shall detain any property delivered to him by any driver or conductor in his employment longer than the time before mentioned, but shall deposit the same at any one of the places before referred to. If any property so found in any one of the said vehicles be not claimed within three months, and proved to the satisfaction of the Town Clerk or other officer to belong to the claimant, the same shall be sold either privately or by public auction, and the proceeds (after paying the incidental expenses) shall be paid to the general revenue of the Council. Provided that in every case the person returning such property shall be entitled to be paid out of the proceeds thereof an amount to be ascertained as follows, that is to say, a sum equal to 2s. 6d. in the £ on the amount of such money, or the value of such property to be valued by the Town Clerk or other officer appointed by the Council for that purpose.

31. Any person claiming property left in a licensed vehicle within the said period of three months shall, on obtaining the same, pay a charge of 1s. to the Town Clerk, who shall hand over the same to the driver or the conductor by whom such property was delivered.

32. The driver of every licensed omnibus or cab shall be constantly on attendance on the same when standing on a public stand or plying for hire, and no driver or conductor shall, whilst in charge of any such omnibus or cab standing on a public stand or plying for hire, be at such a distance from the horse or horses or other animals attached thereto as to prevent his having proper control over the same, nor shall the driver or the conductor at any time stand by or remain on the footway or pavements of any of the streets, lanes, or public places next adjoining any public stand, but every driver and conductor, when not actually employed in or about his vehicle, or in feeding or watering his horses, shall remain on the driving box or step of such vehicle, and not elsewhere. The driver shall not be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law if actually engaged in loading or unloading, providing such driver safely and securely locks the wheels of such vehicle. No person or persons except the driver or conductor of a licensed omnibus or cab (duly authorised by the owner thereof and licensed by the Council) shall drive or conduct the same. No licensed driver or conductor shall suffer or permit any other person to act as driver or conductor of any licensed vehicle in his charge, or leave the same whilst plying for hire, and no person shall tout or solicit passengers for hire, nor shall the driver of any such vehicle as aforesaid having agreed to take a fare from place to place at any time delay, or neglect, or refuse to do so.

33. No driver or conductor shall smoke tobacco or other things whilst driving or conducting any licensed omnibus or cab engaged by any fare, and no smoking shall be allowed inside any omnibus.

34. No conductor shall permit any person to stand on the steps or monkey board whilst he shall be conducting, and any person other than a conductor riding on the step or any other part of any licensed omnibus, not being a seat duly provided for passengers, shall be liable to a penalty under these By-laws.

35. No owner, driver, or conductor of any licensed omnibus or cab shall at any time place or suffer or permit to be placed on the outside of any such vehicle any notice, advertisement, or printed bill, or any names, letters, devices, designs, pictures, or numbers without the written consent of the City Council previously obtained.

36. No owner or driver of any licensed omnibus or cab shall carry or permit to be carried in or upon such vehicle any corpse, or coffin containing the corpse of any person or persons above the age of two years or of any person who shall have died from any contagious or infectious disease, or any substance of a dangerous or offensive nature, or of such dimensions as to incommode other passengers.

37. No person suffering from or recovering from any infectious disease shall ride in or upon any licensed omnibus or cab. In the event of any such person being carried in or upon any such vehicle, the owner or driver of such vehicle shall, upon becoming cognisant of such fact, immediately give notice thereof to the Town Clerk or other officer, and shall not permit any other person to ride therein or thereon until it shall have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of such officer of the Council.

38. No licensed driver shall carry in or upon any licensed omnibus or cab any person in a state of intoxication, or who noisily or violently conducts himself so as to occasion annoyance to any other passenger or to disturb the public peace.

39. No driver or conductor shall sleep in or upon any licensed omnibus or cab, or use the same for eating his meals therein.

40. No driver of any licensed omnibus, cab, or dray shall furiously or recklessly drive any such vehicle, or wilfully or negligently do or cause to be done any damage to the person or property of anyone, or be guilty of any breach of the peace, misconduct, or misbehaviour, or be intoxicated, or make use of any threatening, obscene, abusive, or insulting language, or behave in a threatening or insulting manner; and no driver shall cruelly beat, ill-treat, over-drive, abuse or torture any horse or other animal in his charge, but shall at all times be sober and careful in the discharge of his duties.

41. Any person, not being a licensed driver or conductor, who shall loiter with any vehicle upon any public stand, or refuse to depart therefrom when requested so to do by the Inspector or other authorised officer or a police constable, shall be guilty of an offence under these By-laws and liable to a penalty.

42. No licensed driver or conductor shall demand more than the legal fare fixed by these By-laws from any passenger, and if any person pay the driver or conductor on demand any sum exceeding the legal fare he may recover the same summarily, and the driver or conductor shall be

liable to a penalty under these By-laws, and his license be forthwith cancelled. Any person who shall be a passenger by any licensed vehicle, and who shall refuse to pay the fare for the hire thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws and liable to a penalty accordingly.

43. No driver of any licensed vehicle shall, except whilst on an appointed stand, permit his vehicle to stand or loiter in any part of the City longer than may be absolutely necessary for loading or unloading or for taking up or setting down passengers, nor shall he at any time cause any obstruction, or wilfully or wrongfully or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent the driver of any other vehicle from taking a fare.

44. Every licensed driver shall, whilst engaged in taking up or setting down any passengers, or in loading or unloading, place his vehicle as near as conveniently as may be to the kerb or footpath on the left of the street, in a line parallel thereto.

45. The driver of any licensed omnibus or cab shall stop the same upon demand by the Traffic Inspector or any other duly authorised officer of the Corporation of the City of Perth requiring to count the number of passengers, or to ascertain the name of any person who may be offending against any of these By-laws, or to examine any horse or horses or other animals attached to any such vehicle which may then appear to be receiving ill-treatment, or to be unfit for use, or for any other purpose, and any driver not stopping when so called on shall be liable to a penalty hereunder.

46. The owner of any licensed omnibus, cab, or dray shall at all reasonable times allow any Traffic Inspector, or any other duly authorised officer of the Corporation of the City of Perth, free and uninterrupted access to his stable, yard, or other premises wherein any horse or vehicle may be, for the purpose of serving any notice or legal process, or for any other reasonable, legal, or proper purpose.

47. The owner of any licensed omnibus, cab, or dray shall, at the request of the Traffic Inspector or any other duly authorised officer of the City Council, make known the name and address of the licensed driver or conductor thereof, and upon any refusal so to do shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

48. When the owner of any licensed omnibus or cab shall dismiss his driver or conductor for misconduct, or shall for any other reason discontinue the engagement, he shall immediately inform the Town Clerk or other duly authorised officer of the fact, and upon the appointment of any other driver or conductor shall forward his name and address to the Town Clerk; and in the event of the owner changing his address he shall in like manner notify the Town Clerk, so that the same may be duly and properly registered.

49. No licensed vehicle of any description shall pass any other licensed vehicle proceeding in the same direction, if the latter be proceeding on its journey at the rate of eight miles per hour, and no licensed vehicle shall nurse or shepherd any other licensed vehicle.

50. Every driver who shall feed any horse whilst on the stand waiting for hire shall use a nosebag to contain the forage, and shall not remove such horse's winkers during the time of feeding.

51. The rates and fares to be charged by the owners and drivers of licensed cabs shall be those set out in Schedule J hereto, and shall be deemed the rates and fares which may be lawfully demanded and received by such owners and drivers, provided that such rates and fares shall be inclusive of all charges for luggage up to 28lbs. weight for each passenger. All luggage carried by a passenger in excess of 28lbs. shall be paid for at the rate of sixpence for every 28lbs. excess, irrespective of the distance the same shall be carried.

52. It shall be lawful for the Licensing Officer at any time, by a notice in the form of Schedule D, to require the owner of any licensed omnibus, cab, or dray to produce the same for his inspection, and if the same shall not be so produced, or if after such inspection it shall appear that such vehicle is unfit for the purpose for which it was licensed, it shall be lawful for such Licensing Officer, by notice in the form of Schedule E, to suspend or cancel such license.

53. It shall be lawful for the Licensing Officer at any time to order the driver or owner of any licensed vehicle to remove such vehicle, or the horse or horses drawing the same, from the public stands or the streets of the City, if the same shall in his opinion be so dirty, or otherwise in such a state or in such condition as to be unfit for the service for which the same shall have been licensed. Any driver or owner who shall refuse or neglect to forthwith comply with any such order shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

54. If any driver or conductor licensed under these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence against By-law No. 40, it shall be lawful for the Town Clerk, by a notice in the form of Schedule F, to require such driver or conductor to attend before the City Council to show cause why his license shall not be suspended or cancelled, and if such driver or conductor fail to attend pursuant to such notice, or if he shall not show good cause to the contrary, the said Council may, by a notice in the form of Schedule G, suspend or cancel the license of such driver or conductor.

55. For any offence against the provisions of these By-laws, or any of them, the offender or offenders shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20, to be summarily recovered from such offending person or persons.

56. All fines or penalties recovered and received under any of the preceding By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided in the said Act, be paid to the Town Clerk or Treasurer of the Municipal Corporation of Perth, and applied as from time to time they may direct.
