WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the FIRST SESSION OF THE THIRD PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1896," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Tuesday, the 17th day of August next, at the hour of 2:30 of the clock, p.m.; the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Howick Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the eighth day of May, 1895, under the hand of the Governor and the Public Seal of the Colony, the said Governor did set apart such ground as was then described for a Quarantine Station at Esperance, under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895": AND WHEREAS the said Proclamation was published in the *Government Gazette* of the tenth day of May, 1895: AND WHEREAS the said ground is no longer required for a Quarantine Station at Esperance: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the powers vested in me, do hereby annul the setting apart of such ground for a Quarantine Station at Esperance so described and published as aforesaid.

WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient by the Council of the City of Perth that certain Roads and Streets in the said City should be re-named: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby approve of the Roads and Streets named in the schedule hereto being re-named accordingly, and do direct that from and after the 1st day of August proximo the said Roads and Streets shall be known by the names as set forth in the schedule hereunder:—

SCHEDULE.

NEWCASTLE STREET.—Newcastle Street from Trevarton Street to Lake Street, and Ellen Street from Lake to Stirling Streets, and Mangles Street from Stirling to Lord Streets, shall be in future known as "Newcastle Street."

WILLIAM STREET.—William Street from the Esplanade to Roe Street, and Hutt Street from Roe to Brisbane Streets, shall be in future known as "William Street."

STONE STREET.—Stone Street from Trevarton to Havelock Streets, and Smith Street from Havelock to Duke Streets, shall be in future known as "Stone Street."

CLEAVER STREET.—Smith Street from Duke to Newcastle Streets, and Cleaver Street from Newcastle to Leeder Streets, shall be in future known as "Cleaver Street."

FENNELL STREET.—Cleaver Street from Leeder Street to Vincent Street, shall be in future known as "Fennell Street."

WELLINGTON STREET.—Wellington Street from Plain to Melbourne Streets, and Douro Street from Melbourne to Thomas Streets, shall be in future known as "Wellington Street"

HAY STREET.—Hay Street from Thomas to Barrack Streets, and Howick Street from Barrack Street to the River Boundary of the City, shall be in future known as "Hay Street."

MURRAY STREET.—Murray Street from Havelock to Barrack Streets, and Goderich Street from Barrack Street to Victoria Square, shall be in future known as "Murray Street."

GODERICH STREET.—Goderich Street from Victoria Square to Plain Street shall still be known as "Goderich Street."

BEAUFORT STREET.—Beaufort Street from Forrest to Lincoln Streets, and Burt Street from Lincoln to Walcott Streets, shall be in future known as "Beaufort Street."

PIER STREET.—Pier Street from St. George's Terrace to Wellington Street, and Mackie Street from Wellington to Mangles Streets, shall be in future known as "Pier Street."

JAMES STREET.—Hardinge Street from Charles to Lake Streets, and James Street from Lake to Mackie Streets, shall be in future known as "James Street."

ABERDEEN STREET.—Aberdeen Street from Charles to Lake Streets, and Lamb Street from Lake to Beaufort Streets, shall be in future known as "Aberdeen Street."

JOHN STREET.—John Street from Charles to Shenton Streets shall still be known as "John Street."

FRANCIS STREET.—John Street from Parker to Lake Streets, and Francis Street from Lake to Beaufort Streets, shall be in future known as "Francis Street."

BULWER STREET.—Bulwer Street from Vincent street to the intersection of Brisbane Street, and Brisbane Street from the intersection of Bulwer Street to Old Guildford Road, shall be in future known as "Bulwer Street."

PADBURY STREET.—Brisbane Street from Beaufort Street to the intersection of Bulwer Street, shall be in future known as "Padbury Street."

BRISBANE STREET.—Brisbane Street from Palmerston Street to Beaufort Street shall still be known as "Brisbane Street."

TRAFALGAR ROAD.—Trafalgar Road from Wickham Street to the Claisebrook, and Robinson Street from the Claisebrook to Suburban Road, and Trafalgar Road from Suburban Road to Lot 62 Belvedere, shall be in future known as "Trafalgar Road."

LINDSAY STREET.—Parker Street from Ellen to Moore Streets, Gordon Street from Moore Street to Robinson Avenue, and Passmore Street from Robinson Avenue to Brisbane Street, shall be in future known as "Lindsay Street."

RUTH STREET.—Mary Street from Lake Street to Perth Town Lot N 105, shall be in future known as "Ruth Street."

MONGER STREET.—Moore Street from Hutt to Beaufort Streets, shall be in future known as "Monger Street."

POND STREET.—Cecil Street, off Lake Street, shall be in future known as "Pond Street."

GERARD STREET.—Ord Street from Suburban Road to Kennedy Street, shall be in future known as "Gerard Street."

FITZROY STREET.—Roy Street, off Fitzgerald Street, shall be in future known as "Fitzroy Street."

MUSEUM STREET.—Limbo Street from James to Lamb Streets shall be in future known as "Museum Street."

KENSINGTON STREET.—Suburban Road from Claisebrook Road to the River shall be in future known as "Kensington Street."

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, such grounds as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station near Cookernup: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station near Cookernup for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed six weeks from this date, that portion of land described as under:—

The South-Eastern section, consisting of 96 acres of lease 48/951 in the Harvey Agricultural Area; bounded on the North by Clifton Road and block 650; on the East by blocks 416 and 417, and on the South by block 121.

Eastern extreme of Low Clifty Point 97° 30', Green Light Steamer Pier, 25° 52' gate of boathouse, on extreme of Government House Pier.

The top mark will be painted with luminous paint, and a light will be shown occasionally from the beacon when large vessels are leaving the port.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LLOYD'S SIGNAL STATION—BREAKSEA ISLAND.

THE Government of Western Australia desire to give notice that Breaksea Island Lighthouse, King George's Sound, is now established as a Lloyd's Signal Station, and the ensuing routine should be followed by vessels:—

1. Any vessel desiring to be reported should, after approaching to within signalling distance, hoist the vessel's number or distinguishing signal on the Code List in a conspicuous position, or where best seen.

2. As soon as it is seen from the Signal Station that a signal is being made by a passing vessel, the International Code answering pennant will be hoisted at the "Dip."

3. When the first hoist is read and understood at Breaksea the answering pennant will be hoisted right up, *i.e.*, to the touch of flagstaff.

4. When the first hoist is hauled down on board the vessel, the answering pennant at the lighthouse will be lowered to the "Dip."

5. The second hoist having been made on board the vessel, the answering pennant will still be kept at the "Dip" at the lighthouse until the signal is read and its meaning looked out and clearly understood, when, and not before, the pennant will be again hoisted close up.

6. On the second hoist being hauled down on board the vessel, the answering pennant will be again dipped, and so on.

7. Should the signalmen at Breaksea not understand the meaning of a signal made on board a vessel, the answering pennant should be kept at the "Dip," and the signal "C.W.H." hoisted on another pair of halliards, meaning: "Last hoist of signal is

not understood," when the ship should look out the signal again, and, if necessary, substitute another hoist or repeat the same.

8. When finished the ship should hoist the ensign at same place signal was made from, to denote the completion of the signal, and Breaksea will reply by also hoisting the ensign in token of farewell.

Every area of land hereafter applied for as a lease shall, at the expiration of thirty days from the date upon which the application shall have been recommended by the Warden to the Minister for approval, be efficiently and continuously worked on every working day (not being a bank or public holiday) except during such period of exemption from work as the Warden or Minister may grant.

- (a.) The labour to be so employed on any such area shall be in the case of an area which has not before been either wholly or in part the subject of an application for a lease by any person, not less than two men during the first twelve months after the date upon which the approval of the Governor shall have been notified in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after the expiration of the said period of twelve months, at the rate of not less than one man for every six acres or fraction thereof contained in the approved application.
