WHEREAS under the provisions of the 49th Section of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," it is lawful for the Governor, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to establish on any Goldfield one or more Courts, to be presided over and holden by a Warden, and to be called a Warden's Court, and which shall be a Court of Record and shall possess such jurisdiction as is conferred by Part IV. of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that a Warden's Court shall be established at Kunanalling, Coolgardie Goldfield: NOW THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby establish a Warden's Court at Kunanalling, in the Coolgardie Goldfield, such Court to be presided over and holden by the Resident Warden of the said Goldfield, or, in his absence, by the Acting Warden thereof; to take effect on 1st September, 1897.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, to alter the boundaries of a Municipality or Ward: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to alter the boundaries of the Municipality of Northam: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by virtue of the powers in me so vested, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the boundaries of the said Municipality, and do declare them to be, in future, as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the South corner of Avon Location P1, and extending South-Westerly along the North-Western boundary of Location P to the East corner of Location P5; thence North-Westerly along part of the North-Eastern boundary of said Location (being the South-Western side of Morrell Street) to its intersection with the South-Eastern side of Streatham Street; thence South-Westerly along same to the South-Western side of Burn Street; thence North-Westerly along same and its production crossing the Avon River to its left bank; thence along said bank downwards to the South-Western boundary of Location 2; thence North-Westerly along part of said boundary to the North-Western side of the Perth Road (gazetted as No. 105); thence North-Easterly along said side of road to the South-Western side of Robinson Street and along same North-Westerly to the production of the North-Western side of Kennedy Street; thence North-Easterly along said side of Kennedy Street to the South-Western side of Clarke Street and along same North-Westerly to the South-Eastern boundary of Sub. Lot P44; thence North-Easterly along the said boundary to its East

corner; thence North-Westerly along the North-Eastern boundary thereof and its production crossing the Avon River to the Southern side of York Road; thence Easterly along said side of road to the West corner of Sub. Lot N6 and South-Easterly along the South-Western boundary thereof to its South corner; thence South-Westerly along the production of the South-Eastern boundary of said Sub. Lot to the right bank of the Avon River and along it upwards to the Southern side of the road leading through Reserve 3303 from Suburban Road to the Goomalling Road; thence Easterly along said side of road to the Western side of York Road aforesaid and Southerly along same to the production of the Southern side of the Goomalling Road aforesaid; thence North-Easterly along said side of road and its production to the South-Western boundary of Location P1 aforesaid and along it South-Easterly to the starting point.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Goldfields Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 40) it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to divide any Goldfield or any part thereof into Districts, and to define the limits of such Districts, and to assign a name or designation thereto, and from time to time to alter, amend, and vary such limits, boundaries, and designations: Now THEREFORE I, Sir GERARD SMITH, Governor as aforesaid, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the Coolgardie Goldfield within the boundaries described hereunder shall form and be known as the

KUNANALLING DISTRICT OF THE COOLGARDIE GOLDFIELD.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield, which is a point about 50 miles North from a cairn marked NB 1 (at Wangine Soak), and extending South about 38 miles along the West boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence East by a line about 76 miles in length (passing through a point about 3½ miles South of Kunanalling Townsite) to the 43-mile post on the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence 324° 46' 12 miles 3254 links; thence North 30 miles 4746 links to a tree marked R 3, near the Cane Grass Swamp, 90-Mile Road; thence Westerly to a cairn marked NB1 (near Wangine Soak); thence Westerly about 50 miles to the starting point (excluding all townsites and fee simple lands within the said boundaries); to take effect from 1st September, 1897.

TRESPASS SCALE.

THE Council and Burgesses of the Municipality of Norseman do hereby, by virtue of the powers vested in them by the said Act (46 Viet., No. 7), make and publish the following scale of fines to be imposed on owners of cattle for trespass upon, and damage to land whereof the said Municipality is the owner, or upon land within the limits of the said Municipality, which is not enclosed by a sufficient fence.

The Scale above referred to.

For trespass on enclosed land, whether town or suburban, whereof the Municipality is the owner, or which is within the limits thereof, not being a public street or thoroughfare or Public Cemetery:—

- For every entire horse, ass, or bull, in the day time. } Not less than £2 nor more than £4.
- For every such horse, ass, or bull, in the night time. } Not less than £3 nor more than £5.
- For every other head of cattle, by night or day. } A sum not exceeding 20 shillings.

For trespass on a public street or thoroughfare, or in an enclosed Public Cemetery:—

- For every entire horse, ass, or bull. } Not less than £3 nor more than £5
- For every other head of cattle. } A sum not exceeding 40 shillings

POUNDAGE FEES.

THE Council and Burgesses of the Municipality of Norseman do hereby, by virtue of the powers vested in them by the said Act (46 Vict., No. 7) specify and frame the following Table of Fees to be taken by the Keeper of the Public Pound in the said Municipality for cattle impounded therein:—

In addition to the above fees, the Poundkeeper shall be entitled, if requested so to do by the person or persons impounding stock, and upon being satisfied as to the correctness of the distance such stock shall have been driven, to demand and receive a further sum of One shilling per mile (not exceeding ten miles) for each mob of stock, being the property of the same owner, or for each head of stock (if driven singly) so driven, including camels, but not including sheep or goats, such mileage to be payable to the person or persons impounding such stock or camels; provided that no greater sum than Five pounds shall be demanded in respect of any number of stock impounded at any one time.

And the said Council and Burgesses do also, with the like consent, appoint and fix the following prices which it shall be lawful for the Keeper of the said Pound to charge and receive for the sustenance of cattle impounded in the said Pound:—

The above sustenance rates shall be charged for each day of 24 hours; half rates only shall be charged for not more than 12 hours, and no charge shall be made for less than three hours, or for suckling animals of any kind.

THE Government of Western Australia gives notice that on and after the 20th July, 1897, a light will be exhibited from the New Lighthouse on the summit of Babbage Island.

The light will be 4th order occulting, and will show a single flash every twenty seconds; duration of flash fifteen seconds; eclipse five seconds.

The light will show white between the bearings of N. 30° E. and S. 41° E., visible about 15 miles in clear weather.

The light will also show red between the bearings of N. 30° E. and N. 15 W., and between the bearings of S. 41° E. and S. 15 E.

The tower is a square wooden structure, 87ft. high from base to vane.

The focal plane of the light is 101ft. 6in. above high water level.

THE Commissioner of Railways, appointed under an Act passed in the 42nd year of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 31, intituled "The Railways Act, 1878," doth hereby publish and declare that the following are the particulars of the several Offences for which any Penalty is imposed by the said Act, or by "The Railways Amendment Act, 1879," or by "The Railways Amendment Act, 1881," or by "Railways Act Amendment, 1892," or by any By-law of the Commissioner affecting other persons than the Railway Officers or Servants, and of the amount of every such Penalty.

Penalties imposed by Statute.

- 1.—Any person omitting to shut and fasten any gate set up at either side of the Railway as soon as he and the carriages, cattle, or other animals under his care have passed through the same, is liable to forfeit for every such offence any sum not exceeding £20. (44 V., No. 17, s. 12.)
- 2.—Any person wilfully pulling down or defacing any board upon which the list of tolls to be taken for goods or passengers carried or conveyed by the Railway is published, or any mile stone or post on the line of such Railway, is liable to forfeit for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5. (44 V., No. 17, s. 5.)
- 3.—Every person being the owner, or having the care of any goods passing or being upon the Railway who shall fail, on demand, to give the collector of tolls, at the places where he attends for the purpose of receiving goods or of collecting tolls for that part of the Railway on which such goods may have travelled or be about to travel, an exact account in writing, signed by him, of the number or quantity of goods which have to be conveyed, and of the point of the Railway from which such goods have set out, and at what point the same are intended to be unloaded; and, if the goods conveyed or brought for conveyance as aforesaid be liable to the payment of different tolls, shall not specify the respective numbers or quantities thereof liable to each or any such tolls; or who shall fail to produce his way-bill or bill of lading to such collector or other officer or servant of the Commissioner demanding the same; or who shall give a false account, or shall unload, or take off any part of his loading or goods at any other place than shall be mentioned in such account, with intent to avoid the payment of any tolls payable in respect thereof—is liable for every such offence to forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £10 for every ton of goods, or for any parcel not exceeding one hundredweight, and so in proportion for any greater quantity of goods than one hundredweight (as the case may be) which shall be upon any such carriage; and such penalty will be in addition to the toll to which such goods may be liable. (44 V., No. 17, ss. 7 and 8.)

4.—Any person who shall travel, or attempt to travel, in any carriage employed on the Railway, without having previously paid his fare, and with intent to avoid payment thereof; and any passenger by any Railway not producing or delivering up his ticket when required; and any person who having paid his fare for a certain distance shall knowingly and wilfully proceed in any such carriage beyond such distance, without previously paying the additional fare for the additional distance, and with intent to avoid payment thereof; and any person who shall knowingly and wilfully refuse or neglect, on arriving at the point to which he has paid his fare, to quit such carriage, is liable for every such offence to forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £2. (44 V., No. 17, s. 13.)

5.—Any person who shall send by Railway any aquafortis, oil of vitriol, gunpowder, lucifer matches, or any other goods of a dangerous nature, without distinctly marking their nature on the outside of the package containing the same, or otherwise giving notice, in writing, to the Book-keeper or other servant of the Commissioner with whom the same are left, is liable to forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £50. (44 V., No. 17, s. 15.)

6.—Any person who shall wilfully obstruct any person acting under the authority of the Commissioner, in the lawful exercise of his power in setting out or in making any line of Railway, or who shall remove or pull up any poles or stakes driven into the ground for the purpose of so setting out any line of Railway, or deface or destroy any marks made for the same purpose, is liable to forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, for every such offence, a sum not exceeding £20. (44 V., No. 17, s. 16.)

7.—Any person who shall wilfully obstruct or impede any Officer or Agent of the Government or of the Commissioner in the execution of his duty upon any such Railway, is liable for every such offence to forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £20. (44 V., No. 17, s. 16.)

8.—Any person who shall wilfully trespass upon any such Railway, or on any of the stations or other works or premises connected therewith, is liable for every such offence to forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £20. (44 V., No. 17, s. 16.)

9.—Any person who shall pull down or injure any board put up or affixed as required by any of the above-mentioned Acts, for the purpose of publishing any By-Laws or Penalty, or shall obliterate any of the letters or figures thereon, is liable to forfeit for every such offence a sum not exceeding £5, and shall defray the expenses attending the restoration of such board. (44 V., No. 17, s. 18.)

10.—Any person who shall obstruct or interfere with the Commissioner, or the person or persons employed by him, or his or their assistants, while entering on and surveying any land with a view to constructing a railway, or of ascertaining where a railway might more advantageously run, and any person who shall wilfully or negligently move, break, throw down, alter, deface, injure, or conceal any peg, post, or other land mark which shall be erected for any such purpose as aforesaid, shall forfeit to the Commissioner, on behalf of Her Majesty, a sum not exceeding £10. (42 V., No. 31, s. 9.)

11.—Whosoever shall drive, or attempt to drive, any vehicle, machine, or animal across, or shall cross, or attempt to cross, or shall be on any Railway line when an engine is approaching, and within a distance of a quarter of a mile of such engine, shall, on conviction before any two or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and, in default of payment, may be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, for any time not exceeding six calendar months, unless the penalty be sooner paid. (55 V., No. 34, s. 4.)

12.—It shall be lawful for any officer or agent of the Commissioner, and all persons called by him to his assistance, to seize and detain any person who shall have committed any offence against the provisions of this Act, or of the By-laws made under the authority hereof, and whose name and residence shall be unknown to such officer or agent, and give him in charge to a police constable, who shall convey him with all convenient despatch before some Justice of the Peace without any warrant or other authority than this Act, and such Justice shall proceed with all convenient despatch to the hearing and determining of the complaint against such offender. (42 V., No. 31, s. 35.)

Penalties imposed by the By-Laws.

THE Commissioner of Railways does hereby declare that the following By-laws, having been approved by the Governor in Executive Council, are the By-laws for regulating the use of the Government Railways, to be observed henceforth by all parties:—

BY-LAWS.

1.—Tickets are not transferable; and any person using or attempting to use a transferred ticket, or a ticket the time for the proper use of which has expired, with intent to defraud, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

2.—Any person knowingly, and with intent to defraud, travelling upon any railway in a carriage of a superior class to that for which he is provided with a ticket, or altering a return or other ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

3.—Tickets, whether single or return, shall be used by passengers only to convey them to the Station named thereon, or to a Station short of that destination. In no case, however, shall any "cheap-excursion" ticket be used for any other Station than that named thereon, nor for any other train than that for which such ticket is issued. Any person using or attempting to use a ticket in violation of this By-law, with intent to defraud, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

4.—No ticket will be recognised by any servant of the Commissioner unless the number, date, and names of the Stations written or printed on such ticket shall be perfectly legible. The holder of any ticket who shall wilfully deface his ticket or render it illegible in any of the above particulars, with intent to defraud, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

5.—Any person not duly authorised by the Commissioner who shall sell or offer for sale any free pass, ticket, or portion of a return ticket, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

6.—No male passenger is allowed to enter any waiting room or carriage set apart for the accommodation of females; and any person remaining in any such room or carriage, after being warned to leave the same, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

7.—Any person, not being a servant of the Commissioner, who shall open any carriage for the purpose of entering the same, after the tickets have been examined and the carriage doors locked by the person appointed for that purpose, or who shall let himself out of any carriage, or attempt to do so, at any Station, or at any time during the journey, by the use of a private key or other instrument, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

8.—No person shall, without the consent of the Commissioner, travel outside a carriage on the Railway; or get into, or upon, or quit any part of the train whilst the same is in motion; and any person doing so, or attempting to do so, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

9.—Smoking is strictly prohibited in any of the Railway sheds, offices, or waiting rooms, or upon any station platforms; and any person found so smoking shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

10.—Smoking is strictly prohibited in any Railway carriage except those set apart for the purpose; and any person found smoking in a carriage not set apart for the purpose shall forfeit a penalty not exceeding £10, and may be removed from the carriage by any Railway servant, and shall forfeit his fare.

11.—Dogs will be conveyed and charged for according to printed conditions, but will not on any account be allowed to accompany passengers in the carriages. Any person taking a dog into a passenger carriage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

12.—No gratuity is, under any circumstances, allowed to be received by a Railway servant, on pain of dismissal. Any person giving or offering a gratuity to any such servant shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

13.—Any person found in or upon any Railway carriage or station, or premises, in a state of intoxication, or making use of obscene, insulting, abusive, indecent, or blasphemous language, or writing any obscene words or figures, or committing any nuisance, or gambling, or wilfully interfering with the comfort of any passenger, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 and to removal from such carriage, station, or premises, as soon as shall be practicable.

14.—No driver or conductor of any hackney carriage, omnibus, or other public vehicle shall ply for hire within Railway premises without a license in writing from the Commissioner; and any person offending contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

15.—Every driver or conductor of an omnibus, cab, carriage, or other vehicle shall, while in or upon any station, yard, or other premises of the Railway Department, obey the directions of the Railway officers and employees duly authorised on that behalf; and every person offending against this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

16.—Any person who shall make use of the means of communication between the passengers and the Railway servants in charge of a train, or apply any brake without reasonable and sufficient cause, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding £10.

17.—No person will be allowed to come upon any Railway premises for the purpose of removing any passenger or luggage, unless required by a passenger and engaged by him for such purpose; and no person will be allowed to come upon any Railway premises for the purpose of soliciting custom or hire. Any person attempting to evade, or being guilty of a breach of this Regulation, or not quitting the premises when required by a Station Master or other Railway servant, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

18.—Any person found washing, bathing, or swimming, or otherwise polluting the water in any reservoir or tank belonging to the Railway, or any unauthorised person drawing water therefrom, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding £10.

19.—Any person, unless authorised by the Commissioner, who shall post or stick any placard or bill within or on any of the Railway property or premises, shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding £10.

20.—Firearms shall not, under any circumstances, be taken into or placed upon or carried in any carriage used for the conveyance of passengers upon the Railway, nor shall loaded firearms be brought upon the Railway premises, and every person offending against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

21.—Any person who shall wilfully injure, wholly or in part, any of the linings or blinds or break or deface any of the windows, or remove or injure any number, plate, or advertisement, or remove or extinguish any of the lamps or otherwise damage any Railway carriage, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, in addition to the payment of the amount of damage done.

22.—No article shall be sold on any Railway premises without the consent of the Commissioner; and every person offending against this By-law shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £10.

23.—The word "fare" in these By-laws shall be held to mean the rate of toll or sum of money approved by the Governor in Council and published under the authority of the Railways Amendment Acts, 1879-1881, and other Acts; and the words "Railway carriage" shall include every passenger carriage, goods truck, horse box, meat van, or other vehicle used on the Railway.
