WHEREAS by Section Six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

- (1.) To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine;
- (2.) To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease;

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit for any breach of such Regulations:

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine in any part of the waters of—(1.) The Kalgan and King Rivers; (2.) that portion of Oyster Harbour into which these Rivers immediately discharge; and (3.) the entrance to Oyster Harbour, as hereunder described, during a period of two years from the date of publication hereof.

1. *Kalgan and King Rivers.*2. *Portion of Oyster Harbour.*

"Every owner of infected stock or of stock suspected to be infected shall, within twenty-four hours of the time when he shall have discovered or suspected such stock to be infected, give written notice thereof to the nearest Inspector, and shall thenceforth keep such infected or suspected stock from coming into contact with other stock until otherwise ordered by an Inspector."

And also to Clause 9 of the Stock Regulations, which provides that—

"Any stock found at any time to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or suspected by the Inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or affected with tick, or lice, or any parasite, may be seized by an Inspector and placed in quarantine, and there treated as the Inspector may direct, at the owner's expense, until clean; or if the disease should be of such a nature that, in the opinion of the Inspector, such stock should be destroyed, the Inspector shall report the case to the Minister, who may order the destruction of such stock at the owner's expense."

The principal feature of the month was its remarkable mildness as far as Perth, at any rate, is concerned. (We are not yet in a position to compare the results for other stations with past years.) The average temperature, both day and night, in Perth Gardens, was 2° below the normal, the monthly mean being only 66.5. It is curious to notice that the mean maximum at the Observatory was 3.7 lower, and the mean minimum 1.0 higher than in the Gardens. This variation in daily range is strongly accentuated as between a seaport and an inland town. Compare, for instance, Cape Leeuwin, mean maximum 67.9, mean minimum 56.7, with York, mean maximum 79.6, mean minimum 48.1. The mean monthly temperatures are nearly the same, but York has a daily range of 31.5, whereas Cape Leeuwin has only 11.2.

The average temperature on the fields was from 9° to 13° higher than in Perth. In the far North, it was, of course, very hot, the mean maximum at Cossack being 101.0, and the mean minimum 75.0. A remarkable difference in night temperature is noticed between this station and the one next below it, Onslow, where the mean minimum was only 60.3, the daily range being 37.2, and the extreme range for the month 63.6. Another remarkable variation is noticed between the maximum day temperature of Onslow and Carnarvon, the mean of the former station being 97.5, and at the latter 82.0. A similar thing was noticed last month, and is, doubtless, due to the refreshing sea-breeze which, the observatory states, blows every afternoon. The coolest place for the month was the Leeuwin, where the highest reading was only 76.0, less than the mean minimum at Derby and Broome. Such are some of the vicissitudes of climate in this immense Colony.
