Stock Regulation.

"The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor may from time to time make, vary, alter or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the Colony of Western Australia, and for preventing the spreading of such disease: AND WHEREAS the cattle tick (*Ixodes Bovis*) is known to exist among the herds of the Kimberley District Eastward of the 127th meridian of longitude, and is an infectious disease within the meaning of the Act: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony declares the whole of the Kimberley District Eastward of the 127th meridian of longitude an infected area, and prohibits the introduction of all cattle within the boundaries of the said area to any other portion of the Colony of Western Australia: AND FURTHERMORE, prohibits the introduction of all hides from within the boundaries of the said area to any other portion of the said Colony, unless they have been treated and disinfected as follows:—

1. They shall be thoroughly salted in a proper pit, in which they shall remain for at least one week.
2. They shall be accompanied by the certificate from an Inspector of Stock to the effect that the requirements of these Regulations have been duly complied with.

Department of Lands and Surveys,

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WHEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea, within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.
3. "To regulate the size of the meshes of nets to be used for the capture of any species of fish.

"And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:—

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine during a period of two (2) years from the date of publication hereof, in any part of the waters of the Vasse and Wonnerup estuaries, and that portion of the sea into which those estuaries immediately discharge, within the limits hereunder described and coloured red on plan on exhibit at the Court House, Busselton:—

Bounded on the North by a West line extending from the Northern end of the Dead water; on the South-East by the shore of Geographe Bay; on the West by the continuation North of the West boundary of Wonnerup Townsite.

Also, for any person to fish by means of any net of less than three inches mesh or gauge (the mesh to be measured from point to point when stretched out) in Geographe Bay, outside the area hereinbefore described as coloured blue on plan on exhibit at the Court House, Busselton.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

All ground held under a Mineral Lease, except in the case of a lease granted for Coal mining, shall be worked in accordance with Clause 55 of these Regulations by not less than one man for every ten acres or fraction of ten acres, unless exemption from work has been granted; Provided nevertheless, that the labour to be employed on any area held under lease or an application for a lease, which has not before been either wholly or in part the subject of an application for a lease by any person, for the first twelve months after the date upon which the approval of the Governor shall have been notified in the *Government Gazette*, may be two men for every fifty acres or fraction of fifty acres.

In the case of a lease granted for Coal mining the ground shall be worked after the expiration of six months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every sixty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of twelve months from date of approval by not less than one man for every thirty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of eighteen months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every twenty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease; subject, however, to any exemption which may have been granted at any time.

89. If any person, being the applicant for or holder of a gold mining lease, or the holder of a miner's right or business license, desires to object to the issue of a lease to the applicant therefor, he shall, within thirty days after the application to lease has been lodged with the Mining Registrar, lodge with the said Registrar, and also serve such applicant with a notice, in the form of Schedule 28, of every objection intended to be taken by him against the issue of such lease.
