WHEREAS by Clause No. 99 of the Land Regulations proclaimed on the second day of March, 1897, it is made lawful for the Governor in Council, by Order to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim any area of Crown lands therein described to be State Forests: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby proclaim that the cutting of all Currajong trees is prohibited within the boundaries of the Yilgarn, Coolgardie, North Coolgardie, North-East Coolgardie, East Coolgardie, Broad Arrow, and Mount Margaret Goldfields.

Stock Regulations.

“The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.”

Order in Council.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, the
12th day of January, 1898.*

WHEREAS by “The Stock Diseases Act, 1895,” the Governor may from time to time make, vary, alter or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the Colony of Western Australia, and for preventing the spreading of such disease: AND WHEREAS the cattle tick (*Ixodes Bovis*) is known to exist among the herds of the Kimberley District Eastward of the 127th meridian of longitude, and is an infectious disease within the meaning of the Act: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony declares the whole of the Kimberley District Eastward of the 127th meridian of longitude an infected area, and prohibits the introduction of all cattle within the boundaries of the said area to any other portion of the Colony of Western Australia: AND FURTHERMORE, prohibits the introduction of all hides from within the boundaries of the said area to any other portion of the said Colony, unless they have been treated and disinfected as follows:—

1. They shall be thoroughly salted in a proper pit, in which they shall remain for at least one week.
2. They shall be accompanied by the certificate from an Inspector of Stock to the effect that the requirements of these Regulations have been duly complied with.

**ADDITIONAL ACT MODIFYING THE INTERNATIONAL COPY-
RIGHT CONVENTION OF SEPTEMBER 9, 1886.**
SIGNED AT PARIS, MAY 4, 1896.

(Ratification deposited at Paris, September 9, 1897.)

[TRANSLATION.]

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India; His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, in the name of the German Empire; His Majesty the King of the Belgians; Her Majesty the Queen-Regent of Spain, in the name of His Majesty the King of Spain; the President of the French Republic; His Majesty the King of Italy; His Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Luxembourg; His Most Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco; His Highness the Prince of Montenegro; the Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation; His Highness the Bey of Tunis; being equally animated by the desire to protect in a more effective and more uniform manner the rights of the authors over their literary and artistic works, have resolved to conclude an Additional Act to the Convention, signed at Berne on the 9th September, 1886, respecting the establishment of an International Union for the protection of such works, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say:

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Empress of India, Mr. Henry Howard, Minister Plenipotentiary in Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy at Paris; Sir Henry G. Bergne, Head of the Commercial and Sanitary Department of the Foreign Office;

His Majesty the German Emperor, King of Prussia, His Excellency M. Paul Reichardt, Privy Councillor, Director in the Department of Foreign Affairs; His Excellency Professor Dr. Otto Dambach, Privy Councillor; Dr. Franz Hermann Dungs, Privy Councillor, Referee to the Department of Justice; M. Felix von Müller, Councillor of the German Embassy at Paris;

His Majesty the King of the Belgians, Baron Auguste d'Anethan, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Majesty the King of the Belgians to the French Republic; M. Jules de Borchgrave, Secretary of the Chamber of Representatives; Chevalier Edouard Descamps, Member of the Royal Academy of Belgium, Senator;

Her Majesty the Queen-Regent of Spain, in the name of His Catholic Majesty the King of Spain, the Marquis de Novalles, First Secretary of the Spanish Embassy at Paris;

The President of the French Republic, M. Charles de Saulce de Freycinet, member of the French Academy, Senator; M. Henri Marcel; Minister Plenipotentiary, Assistant in the Commercial Department in the Ministry for Foreign Affairs; M. Charles Lyon-Caen, Member of the Institute, Professor of the Faculty of Law of Paris; M. Eugène Pouillet, President of the Order of Barristers; M. Louis Renault, Professor of the Faculty of Law of Paris, Legal Adviser of the Ministry for Foreign Affairs;

His Majesty the King of Italy, Commandeur Luigi Roux, Doctor of Laws, ex-Deputy; Chevalier Georges Polacco, First Secretary of the Italian Embassy at Paris;

His Royal Highness the Grand Duke of Luxembourg, M. Henri Vannernus, Chargé d'Affaires of Luxembourg at Paris;

His Most Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco, M. Hector de Rolland, Councillor of State, Advocate-General of the Superior Court of Monaco; M. Louis Mayer, Head of the Cabinet of His Most Serene Highness the Prince of Monaco;

His Highness the Prince of Montenegro, M. Henri Marcel, Minister Plenipotentiary, Assistant in the Commercial Department of the French Ministry for Foreign Affairs;

The Federal Council of the Swiss Confederation, M. Charles Edouard Lardy, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of the Swiss Confederation to the French Republic;

His Highness the Bey of Tunis, M. Louis Renault, Professor of the Faculty of Law of Paris;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The International Convention of the 9th September, 1886, is modified as follows:—

1. Article II.—The first paragraph of Article II. shall run as follows:—

"Authors belonging to any one of the countries of the Union, or their lawful representatives, shall enjoy in the other countries for their works, whether unpublished, or published for the first time in one of those countries, the rights which the respective laws do now or shall hereafter grant to nationals."

A fifth paragraph is added in these terms:—

"Posthumous works are included among those to be protected."

2. Article III.—Article III shall run as follows:—

"Authors not belonging to one of the countries of the Union, who shall have published or caused to be published for the first time their literary or artistic works in a country which is a party to the Union, shall enjoy, in respect of such works, the protection accorded by the Berne Convention, and by the present Additional Act."

3. Article V.—The first paragraph of Article V. shall run as follows:—

"Authors belonging to any one of the countries of the Union, or their lawful representatives, shall enjoy in the other countries the exclusive right of making or authorising the translation of their works during the entire period of their right over the original work. Nevertheless, the exclusive right of translation shall cease to exist if the author shall not have availed himself of it, during a period of ten years from the date of the first publication of the original work, by publishing or causing to be published in one of the countries of the Union, a translation in the language for which protection is to be claimed."

4. Article VII.—Article VII. shall run as follows:—

"Serial stories, including tales, published in the newspapers or periodicals of one of the countries of the Union, may not be reproduced, in original or translation, in the other countries, without the sanction of the authors or of their lawful representatives."

"This stipulation shall apply equally to other articles in newspapers or periodicals, when the authors or editors shall have expressly declared in the newspaper or periodical itself in which they shall have been published that the right of reproduction is prohibited. In the case of periodicals it shall suffice if such prohibition be indicated in general terms at the beginning of each number."

"In the absence of prohibition, such articles may be reproduced on condition that the source is acknowledged."

"In any case, the prohibition shall not apply to articles on political questions, to the news of the day, or to miscellaneous information."

5. Article XII.—Article XII. shall run as follows:—

"Pirated works may be seized by the competent authorities of the countries of the Union where the original work is entitled to legal protection."

"The seizure shall take place conformably to the domestic law of each State."

6. Article XX.—The second paragraph of Article XX. shall run as follows:—

"Such denunciation shall be made to the Government of the Swiss Confederation. It shall only be effective as regards the country making it, the Convention remaining in full force and effect for the other countries of the Union."

ARTICLE II.

The Final Protocol annexed to the Convention of the 9th September, 1886, is modified as follows:—

1. No. 1.—This clause shall run as follows:—

"As regards Article IV., it is agreed as follows:

"(A.) In countries of the Union where protection is accorded not only to architectural plans, but also to the architectural works themselves, these works shall be admitted to the benefits of the Berne Convention and of the present Additional Act."

"(B.) Photographic works and works produced by an analogous process shall be admitted to the benefits of these engagements in so far as the laws of each State may permit, and to the extent of the protection accorded by such laws to similar national works."

"It is understood that an authorised photograph of a work of art shall enjoy legal protection in all the countries of the Union, as contemplated by the Berne Convention and by the present Additional Act, for the same period as the principal right of reproduction of the work itself subsists, and within the limits of private arrangements between those who have legal rights."

2. No. 4.—This clause shall run as follows:—

"The common agreement contemplated in Article XIV. of the Convention is established as follows:—

"The application of the Berne Convention and of the present Additional Act to works which have not fallen into the public domain within the country of origin at the time when these engagements come into force, shall operate according to such stipulations on this head as may be contained in special Conventions either actually existing or to be concluded hereafter."

"In the absence of such stipulations between any of the countries of the Union, the respective countries shall regulate, each for itself, by its domestic legislation, the manner in which the principle contained in Article XIV. is to be applied."

"The stipulations of Article XIV. of the Berne Convention and of the present clause of the Final Protocol shall apply equally to the exclusive right of translation, in so far as such right is established by the present Additional Act."

"The temporary stipulations noted above shall be applicable to countries which may hereafter accede to the Union."

ARTICLE III.

The countries of the Union which are not parties to the present Additional Act, shall at any time be allowed to accede thereto on their request to that effect. This stipulation shall apply equally to countries which may hereafter accede to the Convention of the 9th September, 1886. It will suffice for this purpose that such accession should be notified in writing to the Swiss Federal Council, who shall in turn communicate it to the other Governments.

ARTICLE IV.

The present Additional Act shall have the same force and duration as the Convention of the 9th September, 1886.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Paris, in the manner adopted in the case of that Convention, as soon as possible, and within the space of one year at the latest.

It shall come into force as regards those countries which shall have ratified it three months after such exchange of ratifications.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

[TRANSLATION.]

Circumstances having prevented action being taken within the period of delay originally fixed for the exchange of the ratifications of the Additional Act of the 4th May, 1896, modifying Articles II., III., V., VII., XII., and XX. of the Convention of the 9th September, 1886, and clauses 1 and 4 of the Final Protocol annexed thereto, as well as of the Declaration interpreting certain stipulations of the Convention of Berne on the 9th September, 1886, and of the Additional Act signed at Paris on the 4th May, 1896, it has been unanimously agreed that that period should be prolonged until this day.

In consequence whereof, the Undersigned have met together in order to deposit the instruments in question.

Germany, Belgium, Spain, France, Italy, Luxemburg, Monaco, Montenegro, Switzerland, and Tunis have ratified both engagements.

Great Britain has ratified the Additional Act alone, on behalf of the United Kingdom, as well as of all the British Colonies and Possessions.

Norway has only ratified the interpretative Declaration.

The respective ratifications having been produced and found to be in good and due form, have been handed to the French Minister for Foreign Affairs, in order that they may be deposited in the archives of the Ministry, such deposit to be held equivalent to an exchange of ratifications.

In faith of which the Undersigned have prepared the present Record of deposit, to which they have affixed their seals.

CIRCULAR.

SIR,—With reference to Lord Carnarvon's Circular despatch of the 2nd November, 1875, enclosing a copy of the General Convention between the Governments of Great Britain and Tunis of the 19th July, 1875, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Convention between Great Britain and France relative to Tunis, which was signed at Paris on the 18th September, 1897, and ratified in that City on the 15th October, 1897. It will be observed that under Article 1 of this Convention the Treaties and Conventions of every kind in force between the United Kingdom and France are extended to Tunis.

I also enclose a copy of the Decree of the Bey of Tunis declaring the abrogation of the Treaties and Conventions of every kind concluded with Great Britain relative to Tunis other than this Convention and the Arrangement of 31st December, 1889, which had already extended to Tunis the provisions of the Anglo-French Extradition Treaty of 14th August, 1876. The text of that arrangement is contained in the Order in Council of the 1st May, 1890, for giving it effect, which was enclosed in Lord Knutsford's Circular despatch of the 27th May, 1890.

I take this opportunity to state that the wish expressed by the Premier of the Colony whose Government you administer and the Premiers of the other Self-governing Colonies except Newfoundland, at the Conference of Colonial Premiers on the 5th July last, that their Colonies should not be included in the most favoured nation stipulations of the Convention was communicated to the Foreign Office on the 9th of that month, and that effect was given to that view in the subsequent negotiations.

CONVENTION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND FRANCE
RELATIVE TO TUNIS.

Signed at Paris, September 18, 1897.

Ratifications exchanged at Paris, October 15, 1897.

With a view to determine the relations of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and France in the Regency of Tunis, and to clearly define the position as established by Convention of the aforesaid United Kingdom in the Regency, the Undersigned, duly authorised by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:—

ARTICLE I.

The Treaties and Conventions of every kind in force between the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and France are extended to the Regency of Tunis.

The Government of Her Britannic Majesty will abstain from claiming for its Consuls, its subjects, and its establishments in the Regency of Tunis other rights and privileges than those secured for it in France.

Moreover, the treatment of the most favoured nation, which is secured on either side by the aforementioned Treaties and Conventions, and the reciprocal enjoyment of the lowest Customs Tariff are guaranteed to the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland in the Regency of Tunis and to the Regency of Tunis in the United Kingdom for a period of 40 years from the date of the exchange of ratifications of the present Agreement.

All merchandise and all manufactured goods, the produce of the United Kingdom, imported into the Regency of Tunis, either directly, or after transhipment at Malta, shall enjoy the advantages conceded by the present Article.

It is further understood that the treatment of the most favoured nation in the Regency of Tunis does not comprise the treatment enjoyed by France.

ARTICLE II.

Cotton goods, the produce of the United Kingdom and of British Colonies and possessions, shall not be subject in the Regency of Tunis to import duties higher than 5 per cent. *ad valorem* at the port of discharge. They shall not be charged with any other tax or impost whatsoever.

This provision shall remain in force until the 31st December, 1912, and, after that date, until the expiration of six months from the day on which one of the Contracting Parties shall have notified to the other its intention of terminating its operation.

ARTICLE III.

The present Agreement shall be ratified, and the ratifications thereof shall be exchanged at Paris as soon as possible.

It shall come into force immediately after the exchange of ratifications.

The existing Customs Tariff on imports into the Regency of Tunis shall, however, continue to be applied until the 31st December, 1897.

DECRET DU 16 OCTOBRE, 1897.

NOUS, ALI-PACHA-BEY, POSSESSEUR DU ROYAUME DE TUNIS,

Vu la déclaration échangée entre le Gouvernement français et les Gouvernements suédois et norvégien, le 5 mai 1897, et les arrangements intervenus avec le Gouvernement britannique les 31 décembre 1889 et 18 septembre 1897.

Avons pris le décret suivant.

ARTICLE PREMIER.

Sont et demeurent définitivement abrogés les traités et conventions de toute nature relatifs à la Tunisie conclus avec les Gouvernements suédois, norvégien et britannique antérieurement aux déclarations précitées.

ART. 2.

Sont étendus à la Tunisie et y seront appliqués, sans autre promulgation que celle du présent décret, les traités et conventions en vigueur entre la France, d'une part, les Royaumes-Unis de Suède et de Norvège et le Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, d'autre part.

Le délai de quatorze jours stipulé à l'article 9 de la convention franco-anglaise d'extradition du 14 août 1876 est porté à deux mois en Tunisie.

SIR,—With reference to Lord Ripon's Circular Despatch of the 31st December, 1894, enclosing a copy of the Treaty of Commerce and Navigation between Great Britain and Japan concluded on the 16th July, 1894, and to my Circular Despatch of the 17th February, 1896, enclosing copy of a Convention supplementary to that Treaty concluded on the 16th July, 1895, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of a Protocol between Great Britain and Japan respecting Patents, Trade Marks and Designs signed at London on the 20th October last.

PROTOCOL BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND JAPAN
RESPECTING PATENTS, TRADE MARKS, AND DESIGNS.

Signed at London, October 20th, 1897.

WHEREAS, by Treaty, Her Britannic Majesty has jurisdiction in relation to her subjects within the dominions of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan;

Whereas, by Article XVII. of a Treaty signed between Great Britain and Japan on the 16th July, 1894, it is stipulated as follows: "The subjects of each of the High Contracting Parties shall enjoy in the dominions and the possessions of the other the same protection as native subjects in regard to patents, trade marks, and designs, upon fulfilment of the formalities prescribed by law;"

Whereas, by Article XX. of the same Treaty, it is agreed that, from the date on which such Treaty comes into force, the jurisdiction then exercised by British Courts in Japan shall cease, and that such jurisdiction shall be assumed and exercised by Japanese Courts;

And whereas it has been agreed between the Governments of Great Britain and Japan that the provisions of the above-mentioned Article XVII. shall come into force at once;

The undersigned, duly authorised for that purpose by their respective Governments, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

Her Britannic Majesty consents to renounce all extra-territorial jurisdiction at present exercisable by British Courts in Japan for the judicial hearing and determination of matters in difference between British subjects and subjects of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, or for the repression of crimes or offences committed by British subjects, in so far as it applies to the protection of patents, trade marks, and designs.

ARTICLE II.

The foregoing Article shall not take effect until all other Powers which enjoy similar benefits to those conferred by Article XVII. of the Treaty between Great Britain and Japan of the 16th July, 1894, and which possess extra-territorial jurisdiction in Japan, shall similarly have renounced their right to exercise such jurisdiction between their own subjects or citizens respectively, and subjects of His Majesty the Emperor of Japan, as well as for the repression of crimes or offences committed by their own subjects or citizens respectively, in so far as it applies to the protection of patents, trade marks, and designs.

In witness whereof the Undersigned have signed the above Protocol, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 99 of the Goldfields Act (59 Vict., No. 40), has been pleased to cancel Regulation 89, gazetted on the 15th day of April, 1896, and to substitute the following Regulation in lieu thereof.

Act, Section 38.

89. If any person, being the applicant for or holder of a gold mining lease, or the holder of a miner's right or business license, desires to object to the issue of a lease to the applicant therefor, he shall, within thirty days after the application to lease has been lodged with the Mining Registrar, lodge with the said Registrar, and also serve such applicant with a notice, in the form of Schedule 28, of every objection intended to be taken by him against the issue of such lease. Such notice shall be sufficiently served if transmitted by post to the address of the said applicant, or posted on the datum point of the land applied to lease; provided always, that the Warden may order that personal service shall be effected. When any objections shall have been lodged within the prescribed time, the Warden shall fix a day for the hearing of such objections in the Warden's Court, and shall take evidence on oath, which shall be signed by the person giving it. Such evidence shall immediately be forwarded to the Minister by the Warden, accompanied by his recommendation as to whether the application should be granted or refused; but no application for a lease shall be recommended by the Warden until after the time for lodging objections has expired, and every recommendation shall be made subject to the due compliance with regulations as to survey, and to all such alterations in boundaries or otherwise which on receipt of the surveyor's plan and report may appear to be necessary.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred upon him by Section 48 of "The Mineral Lands Act, 1892" (55 Vict., No. 3), has been pleased to amend Regulation 40 by substituting, in line 6 thereof, the words "fifty acres" for "forty acres," and by substituting, in lines 8 and 9 thereof, the words "one hundred and fifty acres" for "one hundred and sixty acres" and to repeal Regulation 43 and substitute the following regulation in lieu thereof.

REGULATION 43.

All ground held under a Mineral Lease, except in the case of a lease granted for Coal mining, shall be worked in accordance with Clause 55 of these Regulations by not less than one man for every ten acres or fraction of ten acres, unless exemption from work has been granted; Provided nevertheless, that the labour to be employed on any area held under lease or an application for a lease, which has not before been either wholly or in part the subject of an application for a lease by any person, for the first twelve months after the date upon which the approval of the Governor shall have been notified in the *Government Gazette*, may be two men for every fifty acres or fraction of fifty acres.

In the case of a lease granted for Coal mining the ground shall be worked after the expiration of six months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every sixty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of twelve months from date of approval by not less than one man for every thirty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of eighteen months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every twenty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease; subject, however, to any exemption which may have been granted at any time,

The temperature at Perth during January was about normal, the mean of the maximum readings was slightly below, and the mean of the minimum slightly above the averages for the previous years. It compares to our advantage with that for Adelaide, where the great heat has continued. The mean maximum at the Observatory, 83.8, was 6.3 below that at the Adelaide Observatory, and our mean minimum, 64.2, was 2.2 higher. But whilst we have been favoured with ordinary warm summer weather, other parts of the Colony have not been so fortunate. The figures showing the mean maximum readings on the Murchison fields and Menzies speak for themselves—102.3 at Yalgoo, 105.0 at Cue, 102.0 at Lawlers, and 100.1 at Menzies. Be it remembered that these are not the records for one day, but the average of the maximum readings for the month, and that they represent the standard shade temperature. The highest record for the month exceeded 110 at a great number of the stations, the maximum being 117.0 at Onslow. The South Coast is a greatly favoured district in the summer; the mean maximum at the Leeuwin was 74.2, at Albany 73.3, and at Breaksea 69.3. The highest reading was only 81.6 at the Leeuwin, 82.8 at Albany, and 76.1 at Breaksea.

There were two interesting weather disturbances during the month, both of tropical origin. The first appeared on the N.W. Coast on the 12th, producing great heat and heavy dust-storms on its advancing side, especially in the Far North; it travelled overland to Eucla, reaching there on the 17th, and lying south of Adelaide next day. Cloudy weather, with a moderate cool change, followed its passage, but there was very little rain. The second disturbance was noticed in the N.W. on the 24th; great heat was experienced on its advancing, and heavy rain on its following side. It apparently started overland in the track of the former one, but meeting with an obstacle to its farther progress, backed out to the N.W. Cape, and got fairly under way on the 26th, moving down the Coast, passing Perth on the afternoon of the 27th. The Observatory anemometer showed that the wind had travelled as much as 500 miles between 10.10 a.m. and 8 p.m., and 797 in the twenty-four hours. Rain was general near the Coast, barely reaching the Goldfields. It was very heavy between Beaconsfield and the Leeuwin, Karridale recording nearly 1½ inches in one hour.

Brunswick Local Board of Health.

WHEREAS by "The Public Health Act Amendment Act, 1895," the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time appoint a Local Board of Health for any locality to be defined in such Order. And whereas by an Order in Council, made the 29th day of July, 1897, a Local Board of Health was appointed for the locality known as Brunswick comprised within an area of six miles from the Agricultural Hall at the Brunswick. And whereas, by "The Public Health Act, 1886," it is enacted that every Local Board of Health may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws. Now THEREFORE in pursuance of the powers given by the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Brunswick Local Board of Health that the following By-laws shall form and be the By-laws of the Brunswick Local Board of Health:

BY-LAW No. 1.—INTERPRETATION.

1. In the construction of these By-laws, except when the subject matter or context otherwise requires the several terms mentioned and referred to in the 2nd Section of "The Public Health Act, 1886," shall, when used in these By-laws, have the same meaning as that assigned to them in that section, and apply to the Brunswick Local Board of Health. The word person shall include a body corporate.

2. These By-laws shall come into operation immediately they are published in the *Government Gazette*, and be in force throughout the district of the Brunswick Local Board of Health.

BY-LAW No. 2.—HEALTH OFFICER.

1. The Health Officer shall superintend the application of all sanitary matters ordered by the Local Board, and shall advise the board generally in all such matters.

2. The Health Officer shall visit and inspect and report upon the district under his control as and when required by the Local Board, and shall see that the duties of the inspector are efficiently carried out, and shall report to the Local Board any neglect of that officer, and, if necessary, suspend him until such report and neglect has been considered by the Local Board.

3. The Health Officer shall, pursuant to the powers contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," inspect premises that may be reported to him, or that he may have reason to believe are in a filthy or unwholesome condition, and affecting health. He shall also assist the Board with his presence and advice, if considered necessary, in order to the carrying out of the provisions of "The Public Health Act," and he shall on all occasions give to the Board the benefit of his medical experience and skill.

BY-LAW No. 3.—SECRETARY.

The duties of the Secretary shall be to carry out the provisions of "The Public Health Act, 1886," and the amendments thereto, under instructions from the Board; to keep a record of all accounts, notices issued to abate nuisances and the results thereof, and minutes of the Board meetings; to prepare the annual balance sheet, and to perform such other duties as may be necessary.

BY-LAW No. 4.—HEALTH INSPECTOR.

The duties of the Health Inspector shall be to visit occasionally and at uncertain times such parts of the district as the Board may deem necessary, and to advise the occupiers of premises as to the prevention of nuisances and the deodorising of offensive matter; to keep a monthly record of all notices issued to abate nuisances and the result thereof; to attend the meetings of the Board when required by the Board, and to do such other things as the Board may require or the Health Officer may direct.

BY-LAW No. 5.—CLOSETS AND CESSPITS.

1. The occupier of every house or premises, whether temporary or otherwise, and whether erected upon fee simple lands, leased lands, reserves, or Crown lands shall, if and when required by the Board, cause to be constructed for the proper convenience of such house or premises a suitable closet, such closet to be subject to the approval of the Health Inspector, and shall cause such closet to be emptied at such times as may be directed by the Health Inspector.

2. No closet shall be erected at a less distance than 30 feet from any dwelling house or other inhabited premises, or 30 feet from a public road.

3. Every closet shall be constructed, located, kept, and maintained clean and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Board or its officers, as they shall deem necessary for the preservation of health.

4. Every cesspit, cesspool, earth-closet, or other receptacle now in use for the temporary or permanent disposal of faecal matter shall, if and when required by the Board, be closed or otherwise removed to the satisfaction of the Board.

5. The contents of all closets and closet pans shall be emptied and treated at such a distance from inhabited premises, and in such a position and covered and disposed of in such a manner as the Board shall direct.

BY-LAW No. 6.—RUBBISH AND REFUSE.

1. Every occupier of any building or premises within the district of the Board shall provide for the proper disposal of all urine, liquid, filth, or refuse produced in or upon the same, and shall keep and maintain the said building or premises in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Board.

2. The occupier of every house or temporary premises shall cause an excavation to be made at the rear of such premises for the deposit of all refuse matter other than excreta, and such excavation shall be filled in and covered over from time to time, and other excavations made for receiving such deposits to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.

3. No rubbish or other debris shall be deposited in any place within the district of the Board other than those places set apart for and approved by the Board for such purpose.

BY-LAW No. 7.—STABLES, ETC.

The occupier of any land within the district of the Board on which there shall be erected any stable, cowshed, cattle-shed, sheep-pen, or pigsty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dung, soil, or manure produced or accumulated thereon, to be collected in one place on such premises, and shall keep the same until removed or required for use, in an inoffensive condition, and so as not to be productive of any nuisance.

BY-LAW No. 8.—WATERCOURSES.

1. No person shall erect or occupy any tent or other structure within 33 feet of any watercourse the water whereof is used for human consumption within the district of the Board.

2. No person shall permit any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs, or fowls, to trespass within two chains of the source of the water supply of the Harbour Works Quarry, Collie, or of any tributary thereof.

BY-LAW No. 9.—GENERAL.

1. Whenever in these By-laws any act, deed, or thing is directed to be done, or any act deed or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, or cause to be done or perform, or refrain from doing or prevent being done, any act, deed, or thing, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws; and in determining the responsibility of the person or persons against whom any action may be taken under these By-laws, it shall be necessary only to prove that such person or persons was or were, at the date of the offence, the occupier or occupiers of the premises whereon the offence was committed, or the owner or owners of the animals trespassing.

2. In the case of any breach, non-performance, or non-observance of any of the foregoing By-laws, the person or persons guilty of such breach, non-observance, or non-performance, shall, on conviction, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than 5s.

3. All penalties recoverable under these By-laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 129 of the the Ordinance 50 Victoria, No. 19.
