W HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things to declare any land adjoining a Municipality, but not being part of the same, to be united with the same : Now THEREFORE I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that portion of land adjoining the Municipality of Bulong, comprised within the following boundaries, to be united with, and form portion of the Municipality of Bulong :--

Bounded by lines starting from the East corner of North-East Coolgardie Gold Mining Lease 507 \times , and extending South 2 chains, East 30 chains 80 links, North 38 chains, West 30 chains 80 links, passing along the South-East and North boundaries of the present Municipality; thence North about 25 chains; thence East about 97 chains to the North-West corner of Reserve 3912 (water); thence 167° 28' 40 chains to its South-West corner; thence South about 69 chains; thence West about 119 chains to the South-East corner of Gold Mining Lease 1807 \times ; thence in a general Northerly direction passing along the Eastern boundaries of said Gold Mining Lease 1807 \times , portion of Gold Mining Lease 1442 \times , to the South-West corner of Gold Mining Lease 589 \times ; thence Easterly passing along the Southern boundary of said Gold Mining Lease 589 \times ; and thence in a general Northerly direction, passing along the Eastern boundaries of said Lease 589 \times ; Gold Mining Lease 496 \times , and said Lease 507 \times to the starting point.

The entire boundaries of the Municipality being as follows:—

Bounded by lines starting from the East corner of North-East Coolgardie Gold Mining Lease 507x, and extending North about 61 chains; thence East about 97 chains to the North-West corner of Reserve 3912 (water); thence $167^{\circ} 28'$ 40 chains to its South-West corner; thence South about 69 chains; thence West about 119 chains to the South-East corner of Gold Mining Lease $1807_{\rm E}$; thence in a general Northerly direction passing along the Eastern boundaries of said Gold Mining Lease $1807_{\rm E}$, portion of Gold Mining Lease $1442_{\rm E}$, to the South-West corner of Gold Mining Lease $589_{\rm Y}$; thence Easterly passing along the Southern boundary of said Gold Mining Lease $589_{\rm Y}$; and thence in a general Northerly direction, passing along the Eastern boundaries of said Lease $589_{\rm Y}$, Gold Mining Lease $496_{\rm Y}$, and said Lease $507_{\rm Y}$ to the starting point.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," W it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by proclamation in the Gazette, such grounds as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station near Drakesbrook: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station at Drakesbrook, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed 30 days from this date, that portion of land known as "McNeill's Paddock," situated 15 chains South-West from the Drakesbrook Railway Station.

Stock Regulations.

"The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, the 12th day of January, 1898.

> Present : The Honourables-The Colonial Treasurer (presiding), The Minister of Mines, The Minister of Education, The Attorney General.

W HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," VV the Governor may from time to time make, vary, alter or revoke such Regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for providing for the steps to be taken in case of any disease breaking out among any stock in the Colony of Western Australia, and for preventing the spreading of such disease: AND WHEREAS the cattle tick (Ixodes Bovis) is known to exist among the herds of the Kimberley District Eastward of the 127th meridian of longitude, and is an infectious disease within the meaning of the Act: Now, THEREFORE, His Excel-lency the Governor of the said Colony declares the whole of the Kimberley District Eastward of the 127th meridian of longitude an infected area, and prohibits the introduction of all cattle within the boundaries of the said area to any other portion of the Colony of Western Australia: AND FURTHER-MORE, prohibits the introduction of all hides from within the boundaries of the said area to any other portion of the said Colony, unless they have been treated and disinfected as follows :-

- 1. They shall be thoroughly salted in a proper pit, in which they shall remain for at least one week.
- 2. They shall be accompanied by the certificate from an Inspector of Stock to the effect that the requirements of these Regulations have been duly complied with.

W HEREAS by Clause 99 of the Land Regula-tions, proclaimed on the second day of March, 1887, it is made lawful for the Governor in Council, by Order to be notified in the Government Gazette, to proclaim any area of Crown Lands therein described to be State Forests: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby proclaim the area contained in the Yilgarn, Coolgar-die, East Coolgardie, North-East Coolgardie, North Coolgardie, Broad Arrow, and Mount Margaret Goldfields to be a State Forest, and prohibits the cutting of all Currajong trees within such area.

The Order in Council published in the Government Gazette of the 28th ultimo is hereby rescinded.

89. If any person, being the applicant for or holder of a gold mining lease, or the holder of a miner's right or business license, desires to object to the issue of a lease to the applicant therefor, he shall, within thirty days after the application to lease has been lodged with the Mining Registrar, lodge with the said Registrar, and also serve such applicant with a notice, in the form of Schedule 28, of every objection intended to be taken by him against the issue of such lease. Such notice shall be sufficiently served if transmitted by post to the address of the said applicant, or posted on the datum point of the land applied to lease; provided always, that the Warden may order that personal service shall be effected. When any objections shall have been lodged within the prescribed time, the Warden shall fix a day for the hearing of such objections in the Warden's Court, and shall take evidence on oath, which shall be signed by the person giving it. Such evidence shall immediately be forwarded to the Minister by the Warden, accompanied by his recommendation as to whether the application should be granted or refused; but no application for a lease shall be recommended by the Warden until after the time for lodging objections has expired, and every recommendation shall be made subject to the due compliance with regulations as to survey, and to all such alterations in boundaries or otherwise which on receipt of the surveyor's plan and report may appear to be necessary.

REGULATION 43.

All ground held under a Mineral Lease, except in the case of a lease granted for Coal mining, shall be worked in accordance with Clause 55 of these Regulations by not less than one man for every ten acres or fraction of ten acres, unless exemption from work has been granted; Provided nevertheless, that the labour to be employed on any area held under lease or an application for a lease, which has not before been either wholly or in part the subject of an application for a lease by any person, for the first twelve months after the date upon which the approval of the Governor shall have been notified in the *Government Gazette*, may be two men for every fifty acres or fraction of fifty acres.

In the case of a lease granted for Coal mining the ground shall be worked after the expiration of six months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every sixty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of twelve months from date of approval by not less than one man for every thirty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of eighteen months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every twenty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease; subject, however, to any exemption which may have been granted at any time.




