WHEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by proclamation in the *Gazette*, such grounds as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station near Drakesbrook: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station at Drakesbrook, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed 30 days from this date, that portion of land known as "McNeill's Paddock," situated 15 chains South-West from the Drakesbrook Railway Station.

WHEREAS by Clause 99 of the Land Regulations, proclaimed on the second day of March, 1887, it is made lawful for the Governor in Council, by Order to be notified in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim any area of Crown Lands therein described to be State Forests: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby proclaim the area contained in the Yilgarn, Coolgardie, East Coolgardie, North-East Coolgardie, North

Coolgardie, Broad Arrow, and Mount Margaret Goldfields to be a State Forest, and prohibits the cutting of all Currajong trees within such area.

The Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th ultimo is hereby rescinded.

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to establish the North-East Coolgardie Registry District for the purposes of "The Births, Deaths, and Marriages Act, 1894," and to fix the boundaries of the said districts as hereunder described; also, to amend the boundaries of the Coolgardie and East Coolgardie Registry Districts, as shown in the Schedules hereto:—

BOUNDARIES OF THE NORTH-EAST COOLGARDIE REGISTRY DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate about 17 miles 30 chains East of Survey Station R3; thence South about 29 miles 70 chains to the most Northerly corner of the East Coolgardie Goldfield; thence about $141^{\circ} 35'$ about 30 miles 53 chains to the North-East corner of Location 44; thence along the Eastern boundary of that Location to its South-East corner; thence about $162^{\circ} 10'$ about 1 mile 64 chains to the North-East corner of Location 45; thence along the Eastern boundary of that Location to its South-East corner; thence South to a point 7 miles 65 chains East from the South-East corner of Location 48; thence East about 27 miles 15 chains; thence South about 48 miles to the South-East corner of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence East to the 125th meridian of East Longitude; thence North along that meridian to a point East of Survey Station R3 aforesaid; thence West to starting point.

AMENDED BOUNDARIES OF THE COOLGARDIE REGISTRY DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from the North-East corner of the Yilgarn Goldfield (which is a point about 50 miles West from a cairn marked NB 1 near Wangine Soak) and extending South about 118 miles through a cairn H26 on Koorarawalye Granite Rock; thence East about 133 miles

through the summit of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; thence North about 48 miles to a point 35 miles East of the South-East corner of Hampton Plains Location 48; thence West 35 miles to the South-East corner of the above-mentioned Location; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of Location 48, Westerly 443 chains 91 links, Northerly 564 chains 87 links to the South-East corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries (surveyed) of that Location Westerly 160 chains, Southerly 60 chains, Westerly 119 chains 87 links to the South-West corner of Location 51; thence Northerly 400 chains along the Western boundary of Location 51 and the Eastern boundary of Location 53 to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence along a surveyed line $324^{\circ} 46'$ 36 miles 1,481 links; thence North 30 miles 47 chains 46 links along a surveyed line to a tree R3 near the Cane Grass Swamp on the 90-Mile Road; thence Westerly to a cairn marked NB 1 near Wangine Soak; thence Westerly about 50 miles to the starting point.

AMENDED BOUNDARIES OF THE EAST COOLGARDIE REGISTRY DISTRICT.

Bounded by lines starting from a Mile Post on the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield, 40 miles Southerly from Survey Station R3, and extending $144^{\circ} 46'$ 26 miles 62 chains 37 links along a surveyed line to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of Location 53 and the Western boundary of Location 51 to the South-West corner of Location 51; thence along the boundaries of that Location Easterly 119 chains 87 links, Northerly 60 chains, Easterly 160 chains to a point on the Western boundary of Location 48; thence along the surveyed boundaries of Location 48, Southerly 564 chains 87 links, Easterly 443 chains 91 links to the South-East corner of that Location; thence Easterly about 7 miles 65 chains to a point South of the South-East corner of Location 45; thence North to the said corner; thence North along the Eastern boundary of Location 45, 4 miles to its North-East corner; thence about $342^{\circ} 10'$ about 1 mile 64 chains to the South-East corner of Location 44; thence along the Eastern boundary of Location 44 to its North-East corner; thence about $321^{\circ} 35'$ about 30 miles 53 chains to a point bearing about $54^{\circ} 50'$ from the 40-Mile Post on the Eastern boundary of the Coolgardie Goldfield; thence about $234^{\circ} 50'$ about $14\frac{1}{2}$ miles to the starting point.

Municipal By-Laws.*Colonial Secretary's Office,

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Councils of the Municipalities of Bulong, Coolgardie, Southern Cross, and Leederville.

Bulong Municipal Council.³⁴⁷
95**By-Law No. 27.**

1. No buildings, houses, or structures composed wholly or partially of hessian, calico, canvas, brushwood, or any similar substance will be allowed to be erected or to remain within the boundaries of the Municipality of Bulong.

By-Law No. 28.

2. The occupier of any premises within the Municipality of Bulong, the chimney-flue of which shall take fire from having suffered to become foul with soot, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for each such offence; and if any defendant shall plead that such chimney-flue did not take fire through being foul, the onus of proof shall be with such defendant.

By-Law No. 29.

3. Every person who shall place or permit to be placed in any street, lane, yard, or place, whether public or private, within the Municipality of Bulong, any fire or combustible material of any kind, without the permission in writing of the Council's Inspector, or other officer appointed by the Council, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than 5s. or more than £5 for each such offence, and shall further be liable to a similar penalty for every day during which said offence shall be continued.

Municipality of Coolgardie.

By-Law No. 42.

1. Any person, whether owner, landlord, tenant, or agent, letting or sub-letting, or causing or permitting to be let or sub-let, the whole or any part of any house or premises within the Municipality, any part of which is used by any person or persons as a brothel, shall, upon receipt of seven days' notice from the Council's Inspector, close up such house, and shall no longer permit the same to be used for any such purpose.

2. Any person acting as proprietor, manager, or agent, or exercising any control over or occupying the whole or any part of any house or premises used as a brothel shall, upon receipt of seven days' notice from the Council's Inspector, cease to use, keep, manage, or occupy, or permit to be used, kept, managed, or occupied such house or premises for any such purposes as aforesaid.

3. For the purposes of this By-law, any person receiving rent for the use for all or any portion of any brothel, or house of ill-fame and repute, shall be deemed to be the owner of the same.

4. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each such offence.

5. Nothing in this By-law shall prevent any number of persons being proceeded against simultaneously, and either together or separately, as owners, landlords, agents, tenants, proprietors, managers, or occupiers of such premises for any breach of any provision of this By-law.

Municipality of Southern Cross.

By-Law No. 8.

Clause 4 is hereby rescinded, and the following substituted:—

"The Treasurer shall pay all moneys received by him to the credit of the Council's General Account at The West Australian Bank, Southern Cross, once at least a week."

Municipality of Leederville.

BUILDING BY-LAWS.

Made in pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in "The Building Act of 1884" (48 Vict., No. 15), and Amendments thereto.

By-Law No. 45.—BUILDINGS, DEPOSIT OF PLANS, &c.

1. Every person intending to erect any building, or to alter or add to any building now erected, abutting on any macadamised street or road within the Municipality of Leederville, shall, seven days before commencing to erect, or add, or alter the same, deposit with the Surveyor drawings showing plans, elevations, and sections of such proposed buildings, together with the full and complete specification thereof, and also a plan of the locality showing the position of such building, and shall also therewith pay to the Council the fees provided therefor in the Schedule hereto.

2. All wood and iron buildings about to be erected shall be built at least three feet from the dividing line on each side of lot, and subject to such restriction and regulations as may from time to time be imposed by the Council. Any person or persons guilty of any offence under these By-laws shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not exceeding £20, in addition to all costs and expenses to which he or she is thereby liable.

By-Law No. 46.—HAWKERS' LICENSES.

Made in pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in "The Hawkers' Act of 1892" (55 Vict., No. 35), and "The Municipal Institution Act of 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), Clause 99, Sub-section 13.

1. Any person hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables within the limits of this Municipality without first obtaining a license from this Council (and such license may be on the form as contained in Schedule E), shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace in Petty Sessions, be liable for a first offence to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and for any subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, or to imprisonment for any term not exceeding six calendar months with hard labour.

SCHEDULE E.

License for Hawkers.

A is hereby licensed as a Hawker for the sale of all commodities within the limits of Leederville Municipality, and paying for such license the sum of 20s. per annum. This license will remain in force until the 31st day of December, 1898, unless sooner revoked, cancelled, or suspended by the Licensing Officer. This license cannot be transferred.

5. The buyer, on receiving delivery of any fertiliser or feeding stuff, and before otherwise breaking the bulk thereof, shall, in the presence of the analyst, a Justice of the Peace, or a police constable, take three samples of the article and cause them to be marked with the date and place of sampling, the names of the persons present, the figures or trade mark on each package, sealed, and fastened up, and shall deliver or send by post (prepaid) one sample with the invoice or a copy thereof to the analyst, and shall deliver or send by post, as aforesaid, another sample to the seller, and retain the third sample for future comparison.

6. On the request of the buyer or seller of any fertiliser or feeding stuff, and on payment of the fee prescribed by Regulations Nos. one and two, the analyst, or some person appointed by him in that behalf, before or at the delivery of the article, shall take the samples on behalf of the buyer.

"And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations."

89. If any person, being the applicant for or holder of a gold mining lease, or the holder of a miner's right or business license, desires to object to the issue of a lease to the applicant therefor, he shall, within thirty days after the application to lease has been lodged with the Mining Registrar, lodge with the said Registrar, and also serve such applicant with a notice, in the form of Schedule 28, of every objection intended to be taken by him against the issue of such lease. Such notice shall be sufficiently served if transmitted by post to the address of the said applicant, or posted on the datum point of the land applied to lease; provided always, that the Warden may order that personal service shall be effected. When any objections shall have been lodged within the prescribed time, the Warden shall fix a day for the hearing of such objections in the Warden's Court, and shall take evidence on oath, which shall be signed by the person giving it. Such evidence shall immediately be forwarded to the Minister by the Warden, accompanied by his recommendation as to whether the application should be granted or refused; but no application for a lease shall be recommended by the Warden until after the time for lodging objections has expired, and every recommendation shall be made subject to the due compliance with regulations as to survey, and to all such alterations in boundaries or otherwise which on receipt of the surveyor's plan and report may appear to be necessary.

REGULATION 43.

All ground held under a Mineral Lease, except in the case of a lease granted for Coal mining, shall be worked in accordance with Clause 55 of these Regulations by not less than one man for every ten acres or fraction of ten acres, unless exemption from work has been granted; Provided nevertheless, that the labour to be employed on any area held under lease or an application for a lease, which has not before been either wholly or in part the subject of an application for a lease by any person, for the first twelve months after the date upon which the approval of the Governor shall have been notified in the *Government Gazette*, may be two men for every fifty acres or fraction of fifty acres.

In the case of a lease granted for Coal mining the ground shall be worked after the expiration of six months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every sixty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of twelve months from date of approval by not less than one man for every thirty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of eighteen months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every twenty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease; subject, however, to any exemption which may have been granted at any time.
