By-Law No. 24.

For suppressing the keeping of houses of ill-fame within the Municipality of Albany.

(Sub-sec. 8 of Sec. 99 of 59 Vict., No. 10.)

- 1. Any person acting as proprietor, keeper, one having the control or management, or any person being the occupier of any brothel within the Municipality of Albany shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.
- 2. Any person purposely letting, or who knowingly suffers or continues to allow any house or premises to be used by the tenant or occupier as a brothel shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

The foregoing By-law 24 was duly made and passed by the Council of the Municipality of Albany this 1st day of February, 1898.

Municipality of Broad Arrow.

Whereas by "The Municipal Institutions Act," 1895, it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, amend, or repeal By-laws: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power given by the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Broad Arrow that the following shall form and be additional By-laws of the Council of the Municipality of Broad Arrow:--

By-Law No. 26.—Sanitary.

- 1. The owner of any house or premises, business or otherwise, shall cause to be constructed, for the proper convenience of such house or premises, a suitable closet, constructed of stone, wood, brick, or iron, provided with the pans adopted by the Council, to be kept free from leaks and holes, and in good condition, and such closet shall be constructed and built in such a place and position as to be easily accessible to the nightman, and so that the nightman shall in no case be required or obliged to carry the pan through any building; and shall be maintained and ventilated to the satisfaction of the officers of the Council, with a proper outlet for the removal of the cesspan, and shall in no case, except with the express written authority of the Council, be situated at a less distance than 30 feet from any dwelling-house or place of business. The floor upon which the cesspan stands shall be made level, and otherwise, to the satisfaction of the Council; and no dwelling-house, shop, or place of business shall be allowed to be occupied or used unless these conditions are complied with.
- 2. Every hotel, lodging-house, and boarding-house shall have proper and sufficient urinal accommodation on the premises, and all the urinals in the Municipality shall be constructed, located, kept, and maintained clean, and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Council or their officers, as they shall deem necessary for the preservation of health.
- 3. No cesspit or cesspools, earth-closets, buildings, or other receptacles not authorised by the Council shall be used as places for the disposal (temporarily or otherwise) of feecal matter; and all such receptacles now in existence shall forthwith be closed or otherwise removed to the satisfaction of the Council.

- 4. In the case of hotels, boarding-houses, and other places of business, manufacture, or otherwise, where a large number of persons are employed, the Council shall from time to time, and when they shall think necessary, have power to direct and order the owner or owners, occupier or occupiers thereof, to provide such additional closets, with pan accommodation, as they shall deem necessary. Separate closets to be provided for males and females.
- 5. The Council shall arrange for the emptying of all cesspans within the Municipality, and for that purpose shall have power to enter into any contract with any persons or person, and to decide in each case as the circumstances may require as to the frequency and times of the emptying of such cesspans, and shall have power to fix the rate or sum to be paid for each pan so emptied, which sum shall be paid by the owner or occupier of such premises when demanded by the authorised collector of same, and shall be recoverable in a summary manner before one or more Justices of the Peace, together with all costs incurred.
- 6. No owner, occupier, or other person, unless duly authorised by the Council, shall remove any nightsoil or urine from any closet or cesspan within the Municipality.
- 7. The occupier of any building or premises shall keep disinfected and purified all closets, cesspans, and urinals in or on their premises to the satisfaction of the Council or their officers.
- 8. Every owner or occupier of any premises shall provide the regulation pans for each and every closet, and shall procure same from the Municipal Council, who will charge the cost price for each pan so supplied, which sum shall be paid by such owner or occupier before such cesspan has been used.
- 9. No closet shall be used for any other purpose than for the deposit of feeal matter or urine.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10 for each offence.

BY-LAW No. 27.—RUBBISH ON PREMISES.

- 1. The owner or occupier of every dwelling-house or premises, business or otherwise, shall forthwith clean up and remove from every back yard or land attached to such premises, all rubbish of whatever nature soever, and shall at all times keep such yard and premises clean and free from any rubbish whatever, to the approval of the Council or its officers
- 2. Each owner or occupier as aforesaid shall provide suitable boxes or other receptacles, and shall keep same in some convenient position on his premises as will afford easy access to the Sanitary Contractor, and shall place all dry rubbish in same, so that it may be removed by the said contractor on his periodical visit to such premises.

Any person oflending against this By-law shall, on conviction, for feit and pay a sum not exceeding $\pounds 5$ for each offence.

BY-LAW No. 28.—SLAUGHTER-HOUSES.

- 1. No slaughter-house shall be erected or used within the boundaries of the Municipality, but may, with the written license of the Council, be erected on the reserve set apart for such purpose, on payment of an annual fee of £2; and every person who slaughters any animal except at a licensed slaughter-house shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law.
- 2. Every occupier of a licensed slaughter-house shall keep the same in a clean and proper state, and shall remove all filth and refuse at least once in every 24 hours, and shall provide such slaughter-house with a sufficient quantity of water to cleanse same.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, for every offence or for every day during the continuance of such offence, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers given by the said Acts, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Northam that the following shall form additional By-laws of the Northam Council.

By-Law No. 31.—For Regulating and Providing for the Disposal of Refuse.

1. The Council may, at their discretion, provide, in proper and convenient situations, boxes or other conveniences for the temporary deposit and collection of dust, ashes, and rubbish. The occupier or occupiers of any premises within the limits as may from time to time be fixed by the Council, shall provide a proper box or other convenience for the temporary deposit and collection of dust, ashes, and rubbish produced upon such premises, and the Council may themselves undertake or contract with any person for the proper cleansing of such receptacles and the removal of house refuse from any premises, either for the whole or any part of the Municipality, and a charge for such removal shall be made at the rate of sixpence for each six cubic feet or portion thereof, such charge to be paid to the contractor officer of the Council at the time of performing the service, by the owner or occupier of such premises.

2. And whosoever deposits or causes to be deposited any filth, dust, ashes, or rubbish in any place except such boxes or other conveniences shall for every such offence, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5), and to repay to the Council the cost which such Council shall have incurred in the remedying of such

wilful or negligent damage.

By-Law No. 32.—For regulating and licensing Chimney Sweeps within the Town of Northam.

- 1. No person shall follow the occupation of a chimney sweep, or sweep any chimney or flue for hire or reward, in the town of Northam, unless and until he shall have first received from the Town Clerk of the said town a license authorising him to follow and exercise the occupation of a chimney sweep within the said town.
- 2. The Town Clerk shall, on or before the 31st day of January in each and every year, issue and grant licenses to sweep the chimneys and flues thereof throughout the said town.
- 3. Every person applying for a license to follow the occudation of a chimney sweep shall, at the time of making application, lodge with the Town Clerk a certificate signed by six resident householders within the Town of Northam, testifying from personal knowledge to the honesty of character and steadiness of habits of such applicant, and the Council before whom such application may be laid, may, on being satisfied on the truth of the matters stated in such application, direct the Town Clerk to issue a license accordingly.
- 4. The Council may, at their pleasure, suspend, or revoke, and withdraw the license whensoever and as often as occasion may require, or the dishonesty of character, or impropriety of conduct of the person or persons to whom the same may have been granted shall justify the same being done.
- 5. No licensed chimney sweep shall use any broom, brush, or other contrivance for the purpose of sweeping chimneys, without first having submitted the same to the Surveyor for his approval, and having such approval indersed on the license issued to such chimney sweep.

6. Each and every person receiving such license shall pay to the Town Clerk of the said town therefor at and after the following rates:—

Rates.

- (a) For the license of a master sweep, granted to himself, the sum of Twenty shillings per year.
- (b) For the license of each and every man or boy employed by him the sum of Ten shillings per year.
- 7. All licensed chimney sweeps shall be under the superintendence of the Surveyor, and it shall be their duty to obey all orders and instructions of the said Surveyor relating to sweeping chimneys.
- 8. The following shall be, and the same is hereby established, as the tariff or rates of fees to be allowed and exacted by each and every licensed sweep or sweeps for thoroughly cleansing and sweeping the chimneys and flues thereof:—
 - In a one-storey house, not to exceed 5s. for the first chimney and 2s. 6d. for each subsequent chimney in the said house.
 - For sweeping each chimney or flue thereof in a twostorey house, the ground-floor chimney not to exceed 5s. for the first chimney and 2s. 6d. for each subsequent chimney on the ground floor of such house. The upper-floor chimney not to exceed 4s. for the first chimney and 2s. for each subsequent chimney on the upper floor of such house.
 - For sweeping each chimney or flue thereof in a threestorey house, the lower-floor chimney not to exceed 5s. for first chimney and 2s. 6d. for each subsequent chimney on the lower floor of such house. The first-floor chimney not to exceed 4s. for the first chimney and 2s. for each subsequent chimney on the first floor of such house. The upper-floor chimney not to exceed 3s. for the first chimney and 1s. 6d. for each subsequent chimney on the upper floor of such house.
- 9. Every licensed chimney sweep shall wear and exhibit in a conspicuous place, on the outside of his cap or hat, so as easily to be seen, a brass plate or badge, on which shall be engraved or stamped a number corresponding to the number of his license; and it shall be unlawful for any person to wear or exhibit any plate or badge purporting to be, resembling, or similar to the plate or badge of a licensed chimney sweep; and no licensed chimney sweep shall permit any other person to wear his plate or badge, or use his name in any way whatever, in performing the duties or seeking to perform the duties of a licensed chimney sweep.
- 10. Any licensed chimney sweep or other person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10 and be liable to have his license forthwith cancelled.

By-Law No. 33.—To regulate Buildings, &c., within the Town of Northam.

Interpretation Clause.

1. The several words mentioned in Section 2 of "The Building Act, 1884," shall, where used in this By-law, have the same construction as is provided for by such section.

Notice of intention to build.

2. Every person intending to commence to build, take down, alter, add to, or repair any building, or to do any other act whereby any public street may be obstructed or rendered dangerous or inconvenient to persons passing over or near thereto, shall give three clear days' notice, in writing, to the Surveyor, of his intention so to do, and shall deposit drawings and specifications of the proposed work.

Such notice shall be delivered at the Surveyor's office, and shall contain particulars of the date and nature of the intended building, work, or other act.

The Surveyor shall, provided the license fee and deposit as hereinafter provided have been paid to the Town Clerk, thereupon grant a license in the Form "A" of the Schedule hereto, and also give such directions as he shall think fit for the erection of hourdings, or fences, and platforms and hand-rail for the protection of passengers; and such directions shall be complied with to the satisfaction of the Surveyor before the commencement of such building, work, or act.

Every breach of this By-Law shall subject the person guilty of such breach to a fine or penalty of not exceeding £5, and a further penalty of not exceeding £1 for each day the same continues, recoverable in a summary manner before Justices.

Provision for Conserving Water.

3. All buildings erected after the passing of these Bylaws, and to be used or capable of being used as a dwelling-house, shall have proper provision made for the conservation of water by properly constructed tanks and pipes leading thereto from roof of such building. The capacity of the tanks to be in proportion of 100 gallons for each 50 square feet of roof.

Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Notice of Intention to use Area in Public Street for Deposit of Materials.

4. Every person wishing to deposit any stone, brick, lime, rubbish, timber, iron, or other materials on any public street, or to make any excavation on any land abutting on or adjoining or contiguous to any public street shall first make application for and obtain from the Surveyor a license so to do.

Such license shall be given in the form "A" in the Schedule hereto. Having paid the fees and deposits stated in the said form, he may then occupy the site, subject to the conditions stated in such license. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Hoardings to be kept in repair.

5. Any person who shall be required to erect any hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail under these By-laws shall keep the same in good and efficient repair, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, so long as it shall in his opinion be necessary for public safety; and every such person shall, immediately upon receipt of notice from the Surveyor that such hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail is out of repair, and requiring him to repair the same, forthwith repair the same to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every day the same shall continue in disrepair after the receipt by him of such notice.

Hoardings, etc., to be lighted.

6. Every person erecting such hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail, or obstruction of any kind in any public street, or any excavation as aforesaid, shall cause the same to be sufficiently and well lighted at night, in accordance with the directions and to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every night or part of a night on which the same is not lighted.

Power of Surveyor to enforce preceding By-Laws.

7. It shall be lawful for the Surveyor, without reference to the Council, to take immediate steps to enforce any of the preceding regulations, and he may cause any such hoarding, or other obstruction that has been erected without his licence, or which has been erected or continued in breach of the conditions of any such license, to be removed, or any such excavations to be filled in, or injuries to the public streets repaired at the cost and expense of the person erecting or making the same, and such costs and expenses shall be recoverable from the person so making the same, as well as the penalties hereinbefore imposed, before Justices.

Materials of External Walls facing any Street.

8. With regard to the component materials of any external walls that front upon or face towards any public street, every such wall must be built of brick or stone, or artificial stone, or such brick or stone or artificial stone together, laid in and with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work. The Council shall have power by resolution to extend provisions of this section to any part or parts of the Municipality named in such resolution.

Materials to be used in repair.

9. If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished, for the height of one storey or for a space equal to one-fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by these Regulations directed for external walls, must be taken down; and the same must be rebuilt in such manner and of such materials for, and in all respects as by this By-law directed, for external walls hereinafter to be built according to the class and rate of the building to which such external wall or enclosure shall belong.

Materials for Party Walls.

10. Party Walls.—In reference to the component materials thereof, every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or artificial stone, or such bricks or stone or artificial stone laid in together, and with mortar or cement, and in such manner as to produce solid work, and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with the party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, breast-summers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partitions, heads, and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks may be laid into the substance of a party wall, but no such beams, breast-summers, girders, partitions, head, or sill, nor any part of a roof being wood, nor any wood bricks must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall, and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or be run or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall, but if the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or stone corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be carried to a height of at least three feet above where the party wall and the roof adjoins, with sound hard bricks, or stone set in good mortar or cement.

Roofs to Buildings.

11. With regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building and any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop-fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water therefrom dripping on to or running over any public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

All iron pipes shall lead, if so required, from the front of the building under the footpath into the street side channel; provided always that the pipe laid across the footway shall be at least six inches below the surface, and be of cast or wrought iron piping, or earthenware of not less than four inches diameter.

Drains to Buildings.

12. With regard to the drains of buildings of any class, and of every addition thereto, before the several walls of any such buildings shall have been built to a height of 10ft, from their foundations, the drains thereof must have been properly built and made good—that is to say, if there be within 100ft, from any front of the building a common sewer into which it is lawful and practicable to drain, then into such common sewer, and if there be not in such situation and within such distance any such common sewer, then to the best outlet that can be obtained, so as to render in either case drains available for the drainage of the lowest floor of such building or addition thereto, and also of its areas, privies, and offices; and every such drain must be laid to a sufficient fall or current so as that the whole of every such drain within the walls of such building shall be wholly carried over under the lowest floor independently thereof, and every such drain within the walls of such building must be constructed of sound laid bricks of best quality laid wholly in cement mortar, or of best quality of glazed stoneware drain pipes, jointed in cement and not less than 4in internal diameter, so as to render the drain air tight. All drains to be laid and built to the approval of the Surveyor.

Covering Footpaths, &c.

13. In the case of any building being erected abutting on the footpath of a public street, or of any plastering operations being intended to be performed above the first storey of any building, the builder or other persons having charge of such buildings, or the plasterer, shall, before proceeding to build further than the first storey of such building so being erected, or with any plastering as aforesaid, give notice thereof in writing to the Surveyor, who shall thereupon give directions to such builder, person, or plasterer, for the covering of such footpath as he shall think fit, and any builder, person, or plasterer who shall fail to give such notice or shall proceed with such building or plastering without having complied in all respects with the directions of the Surveyor, or without keeping such covering or other erection directed by him in an efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, shall incur a penalty of not exceeding £5 for each day in which such default shall occur or continue.

Back Yards.

14. With regard to back yards, or open spaces attached to dwelling-houses, every house hereafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space (according

to Sec. 5, "The Building Act Amendment Act of 1887") exclusive of any building thereon, unless all the rooms of such house can be lighted or ventilated from the street.

Privies.

15. Privies at present built or hereafter to be built:-Every privy as to situation, size, and construction is to be to the satisfaction of the Surveyor or Inspector of the Local Board of Health. It shall be sufficiently ventilated, and shall not be erected nearer than two feet to an adjoining boundary, and no privy or urinal shall open on the public street without the special permission of the Council. Under the seat the floor is to have a metal tray, or to be composed of concrete stone, or some non-absorbent material, with a proper fall.

Rooms, with regard to height.

16. With regard to rooms in other parts of the buildings, in reference to the height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used for the purposes of habitation, must be at least the height of nine feet from floor to ceiling.

Ventilation of Rooms.

Every room used for the purposes of habitation, or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, by the insertion of air bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceilings or at the top of the walls thereof, and according to the size of such rooms.

Verandahs.

18. Awnings or verandahs to be erected over footpaths are to be in accordance with drawings and specification approved by the Surveyor, and accordingly adopted by the Council. The minimum height to be eight feet, the verandah to be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, who shall have power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of the receipt of notice from the Surveyor, and must be completed within fourteen days from such notice, or otherwise the verandahs will be removed as nuisances, the cost of such removal to be borne by the owner or occupier, and to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

Breast Summers.

- 19. All breast summers to be of either iron or jarrah wood.
- Every fireplace constructed of iron shall be lined 20. with either brick or stone, built up to a height of three feet above the level of the fire-rest and not less than four and a half inches thick, and the hearth of every such fireplace or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick or stone or other incombustible substance. Such hearth to consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least twelve inches longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least eighteen inches in front of the arch over the same.

Notice to remove dangerous Buildings.

Where any building shall, in the opinion of the Surveyor, be ruinous or dangerous under the meaning of Clause 16 of "The Building Act, 1884," the Surveyor shall give notice to the owner thereof to remove or renovate the same, and every such owner shall forthwith comply with such order, under a penalty of not more than £20 for noncompliance.

Temporary Buildings.

22. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Council, for a period to be stated, for the erection of temporary buildings, all the walls of which may be of wood or iron.

Power to Surveyor to enter and remove.

23. And, generally, where anything shall have been done, or omitted to be done, in contravention to these regulations, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any on the premises and remove or cause to be removed any buildings or other thing which has been erected in contra-vention thereof, or to do or cause to be done any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the costs of so doing shall be paid and borne by such owner or other person, in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these regulations.

Addition to the Building By-Laws.

24. No building or part thereof not hitherto used for the purpose of human habitation or not originally built for that purpose, shall be used or converted into use as a human habitation without first obtaining the written consent of the Council.

Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding section, no room or part of a room in which meat, fish, game, fruit, or vegetables are stored shall be used as a place of habitation within the meaning of these By-laws.

Harding and Ganqway.—Shall be strong and securely constructed of materials, and to a design, to be approved of by the Surveyor, and maintained in good condition throughout the currency of this license, and at any time the Surveyor may, if he think fit, order any alteration or addition to be made to the hoarding for the better protection and convenience of the public.

Lighting.—A sufficient light shall be displayed and maintained at the exterior angles of the hoarding each night from sunset to surrise.

Advertising.—No advertisement, sign, placard, or device shall be posted or written on any hoarding without the written consent of the Council.

Obstructions.—The gangway and water channel shall at all times be kept clear throughout.

Sanitary.—Before commencing to build, a privy shall be erected for the use of the workmen, and all the requirements of the sanitary authorities strictly complied with.

authorities strictly compiled with.

Re-instatement.—At the expiration of the period for which this license is granted, or sooner if possible, the hoarding shall be cleared away, and the footpath, kerbing, channeling and roadway made good to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

Deposit.—As additional security for the satisfactory performance of the last-named condition, the licensee has deposited the sum of £2 with the Town Clerk.

1. The Public Pound for the Municipality of Northam shall be in Wellington Street, or such place as may be from time to time fixed by the Council, and the following trespass fees shall and may be charged and taken by the Poundkeeper.

- 2. In addition to the sums mentioned in the two preceding sections, compensation shall be paid for any damage done by such cattle to any pathway, fence or gate, or to any tree or shrub planted or growing within the Municipality.
- 3. The sums specified in the trespass scale and compensation (if any) shall be paid to the Council of the Municipality of Northam, and shall become part of the ordinary revenue of the said Council.

By-Law No. 35.—For Regulating Lodging and Eating Houses within the Municipality of Northam.

- 1. For the purpose of this By-law the words "lodging house" shall mean any dwelling of any kind, any house, tent, or other structure, whether permanent or otherwise (other than the licensed premises of any licensed victualler), in which persons are lodged for payment for any term less than a week at a time, or where any six persons or more are boarded or lodged for payment from week to week or for more than a week.
- 2. "Eating house" shall mean any dwelling of any kind, any house, tent, or other structure, whether permanent or otherwise (other than the licensed premises of any licensed victualler), in which meals are served to the public for payment.
- 3. Every person keeping or about to keep a lodging or eating house within the Municipality of Northam shall give, at the office of the Municipal Council, at least four clear days notice of his intention to apply for the annual registration of such house, specifying its situation and the number of lodgers accommodated or intended to be accommodated therein, and shall pay an annual license fee according to Schedule herein, payable in advance, to the Northam Municipal Council.

Provided always that any premises registered after the 30th day of June in any year shall be liable for half the fees prescribed in the aforesaid schedule.

Any person who, after the 31st day of January, 1898, shall keep, have charge of, or manage any lodging or eating house, not duly registered, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10, and an additional penalty not exceeding £2 for every day during which the offence is continued.

4. Every application as above shall be duly reported upon by the Health Officer or Health Inspector as to situation, number, and dimensions of rooms, ventilation, sanitation, and cleanliness of the premises.

On receipt of such report the Council may proceed to specify the terms and conditions upon which such house shall be registered, or an existing registration shall be renewed. Provided always, that the Council may at any time refuse any application or revoke or cancel any registration upon sufficient cause being shown.

- 5. All annual registrations granted (unless revoked or cancelled by the Council) remain in force until the 31st December in each year.
- 6. Every keeper of a lodging-house shall put up and keep exhibited, in each sleeping apartment in which lodgers are accommodated, a card signed by an officer of the Board of Health, or by an officer of the Council, stating the number of persons permitted to be accommodated in that particular apartment, provided that upon any such room being altered in size, or upon any new room being added, the Inspector may (upon being applied to) furnish amended cards to meet the altered conditions of space.

No lodging-house keeper by himself or his servants shall ring or cause to be rung any bell, gong, or other instrument in any street or public place, or otherwise tout for custom.

- 7. In every lodging-house the rooms, passages, stairs, verandah, balcony, and offices of every kind shall be kept daily swept and cleaned to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.
- 8. The yard of every lodging-house shall be kept thoroughly clean and free from all slop-water and rubbish, and the privy or privies shall be kept clean and constantly supplied with a suitable disinfectant; they shall be sufficient in number, no fewer than one for every 20 persons, lodgers permitted, in addition to that of the lodging house keeper and his family, and separate rooms for different sexes; the pans shall be emptied as often as may be necessary, and all sanitary appliances shall be kept and used to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector. A sufficient supply of water, with accommodation for washing, shall be provided in each sleeping apartment, or in a room specially fitted and set apart for this purpose.
- 9. All beds, blankets, rugs, or covers used in any lodging-house shall be kept in a clean and wholesome condition.
- 10. Unless in tempestuous weather, the doors and windows in all sleeping apartments shall be, as far as possible, kept open from nine (9) o'clock in the morning until five (5) o'clock in the evening.
- 11. Rooms of any of the following descriptions will not be registered, and must not be used as sleeping apartments:—
 - (a.) Any room wholly or in part below the surface of the ground.
 - (b.) Any room used as a living room, kitchen, or scullery.
 - (c.) Any room not having a window for the admission of light and fresh air.
 - (d.) Any room not so ventilated as to provide for the escape of foul air from the top of the room and the ingress of air near the bottom of the room.
 - (e.) Any room not suitably furnished with bed or mattress, and blankets or rugs suitable to the season of the year.
- 12. Unless otherwise specified above, any person committing any breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10, and at the discretion of the Council to the suspension or revocation of the registration of his lodging-house, and a further penalty of £2 for every day during which the offence is continued.

By-Laws of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," for the Annual Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk, and for prohibiting the Adulteration of Milk, and for the granting of Licenses.

1. In the construction of these By-laws the word "Person" shall include a "Corporation." $\,$

The "masculine" gender shall be deemed and taken to include "females," and the "singular" the "plural," and the "plural" the "singular."

2. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk in the City of Perth shall, on or before the first day of April in every year, make application to be registered in manner following, that is to say: by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk of the said City an application in the following form, or to the like effect. Every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of One pound sterling.

Regulations for Shipment of Ships' Stores.

BY virtue of the powers conferred on me by the 147th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892" (55 Vict., No. 31), I hereby direct that the following Regulations shall be observed in connection with the Shipment of Ships' Stores:-

- 1. The master of every ship of the burden of thirty (30) tons, or upwards, departing from any port in Western Australia upon a voyage to parts beyond the seas, may, upon due application made by him to the Collector of Customs at such port, receive an order for the shipment of dutiable goods, as ships' stores, duty free, in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule "A" hereto, for each day of the voyage, the duration being estimated by the Collector of Customs, and such other general stores, in reasonable quantities, with the exception of frozen or chilled meat, as the Collector shall deem necessary.
- 2. On receipt of an application in the form of Schedule "B," and previous to the passing of an and previous to the passing of an entry for any stores required by any vessel as aforesaid, the master of such vessel, or his agent, must give security by bond, in the form shown in Schedule "C" hereto, with one or more sureties, for double the amount of duty payable on any goods so required, and that they are duly shipped and exported.
- 3. The Collector of Customs at any port in Western Australia may permit dutiable goods to be delivered as ships' stores, free of duty, on board vessels in such port, for the use of the crew, in such quantities as he may deem requisite.

WHEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- 1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea, within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- 2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.
- "And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine during a period of two (2) years from the date of publication hereo', in any part of the waters of the Vasse and Wonnerup estuaries, and that portion of the sea into which those estuaries immediately discharge, within the limits hereunder described and coloured red on plan on exhibit at the Court House, Busselton:—

If any person, being the applicant for or holder of a gold mining lease, or the holder of a miner's right or business license, desires to object to the issue of a lease to the applicant therefor, he shall, within thirty days after the application to lease has been lodged with the Mining Registrar, lodge with the said Registrar, and also serve such applicant with a notice, in the form of Schedule 28, of every objection intended to be taken by him against the issue of such lease. Such notice shall be sufficiently served if transmitted by post to the address of the said applicant, or posted on the datum point of the land applied to lease; provided always, that the Warden may order that personal service shall be effected. When any objections shall have been lodged within the prescribed time, the Warden shall fix a day for the hearing of such objections in the Warden's Court, and shall take evidence on oath, which shall be signed by the person giving it. Such evidence shall immediately be forwarded to the Minister by the Warden, accompanied by his recommendation as to whether the application should be granted or refused; but no application for a lease shall be recommended by the Warden until after the time for lodging objections has expired, and every recommendation shall be made subject to the due compliance with regulations as to survey, and to all such alterations in boundaries or otherwise which on receipt of the surveyor's plan and report may appear to be necessary.

All ground held under a Mineral Lease, except in the case of a lease granted for Coal mining, shall be worked in accordance with Clause 55 of these Regulations by not less than one man for every ten acres or fraction of ten acres, unless exemption from work has been granted; Provided nevertheless, that the labour to be employed on any area held under lease or an application for a lease, which has not before been either wholly or in part the subject of an application for a lease by any person, for the first twelve months after the date upon which the approval of the Governor shall have been notified in the Government Gazette, may be two men for every fifty acres or fraction of fifty acres.

In the case of a lease granted for Coal mining the ground shall be worked after the expiration of six months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every sixty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of twelve months from date of approval by not less than one man for every thirty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of eighteen months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every twenty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease; subject, however, to any exemption which may have been granted at any time.

Regulations under "The Water Supply Act, 1893."

Public Works Department, Perth, 25th January, 1898.

III Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations by virtue of Section six of "The Water Supply Act, 1893."

- 1. No person shall bathe in any lake, lagoon, swamp, reservoir, tank, dam, stream, creek, well, spring, or other water situate within any reserve, made by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, or cause or permit any animal to go therein.
- 2. No person shall encamp upon any waste land of the Crown reserved by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, or permit any animal to remain on such land any longer than is necessary for the purpose of taking water.
- 3. No person shall bring or deposit into or upon any reserve made by virtue of the said Act, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing, or wash or cleanse, in any water within any such reserve, any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any other material or thing whatsoever.
- 4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water of any mining shaft, or of any sink, sewer, drain, or cesspit, or other filthy water to find its way into any stream, catch-drain, tank, reservoir, dam, lake, lagoon, soak, spring, or other water situate within any such reserve aforesaid, or shall do any act or thing whereby the water shall be fouled, shall for each such offence be liable to the penalty imposed by these Regulations.

PENALTY.

Every person committing a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £100.

The principal features of the month were a week of sultry weather between the 7th and the 13th, and a general rain on the 21st. The sultry weather was due to the persistence of a "high" South or South-East of Albany, and the presence of the normal tropical "low" off the N.W. coast. The general rains were very unevenly distributed as to quantity, and were of the nature of electrical disturbances, although very few thunder-storms were reported. They were followed by pleasant weather till the end of the month.

The temperature of Perth was decidedly above the normal; the mean maximum was 1.6, and the mean minimum 3.0 above the average for previous years. Cue, as usual, was very hot, the mean maximum 1000 being the highest throughout the Colony; the minimum was 72.6, or 6.6 higher than at Perth. This is quite contrary to the popular belief which assigns beautiful cool nights to these inland plains, as a set-off against the roasting days. Coolgardie, on the other hand, compares most favourably with the Metropolis, the mean maximum being the same, and the mean minimum 2.6 lower than in the Perth Gardens. The same cause that made the temperature at Perth and Northwards above the normal brought comparatively cool weather to Coolgardie, viz., the persistence of the "highs" near Albany, giving cool Southerly winds to the Eastern Fields. York has the unenviable distinction of recording the highest temperature for the whole Colony, viz., 115.6, on the 6th.

It is interesting to note the change in the mean of the maximum day temperatures from Rottnest Eastwards—thus Rottnest, 82·4; Fremantle, 85·0; Perth Observatory, 87·2; Perth Gardens, 89·3. The night temperatures are almost the same at all these places. The Southern stations, as usual, show their climatological advantages to those who appreciate cool weather in summer time. At Breaksea Island the temperature did not rise above 81° thoughout the month, and the mean of the maximum readings was only 69·9.

The rainfall was very irregular, varying from nil at Katanning to 262 points at Albany and 556 at Hamelin Pool, whilst in the tropics it reached a maximum of 1086 at Broome.

THE Local Board of Health for the City of Perth, in the Colony of Western Australia by virtue of the powers contained in "The Health Act, 1886," and the Amending Acts thereof, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Acts and the Amending Acts into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following By-laws of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws the word "Person" shall include a Corporation. The "Masculine" gender shall be deemed and taken to include "females," and the "singular" the "plural," and the "plural" the "singular." "Board" shall mean the "Local Board of Health for the City of Perth."
- 2. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall begin to occupy as a dairy or cowshed any building not previously so occupied, unless and until he first makes provision to the satisfaction of an officer of the Board for the lighting, ventilation, including air space and cleansing, drainage and water supply of the same while occupied as a dairy or cowshed.
- 3. No person shall begin so to occupy any such building without first giving one month's notice, in writing, to the Board of his intention so to do.
- 4. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall occupy as a dairy or cowshed any building, whether so occupied previous to this By-law or not, if and as long as the lighting and the ventilation, including air space and the cleansing, drainage and water supply thereof are not such as are necessary and proper—
 - (a.) For the health and good condition of the cattle therein ;
 - (b.) For the cleanliness of milk vessels used therein for containing milk for sale;
 - (c.) And for the protection of the milk therein against infection or contamination.
- 5. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall permit any water closet, earth closet, privy, cesspool, or urinal to be within, communicate directly with, or ventilate into any dairy or any room used as a milk store or milk shop.

- 6. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily with washing soda and boiling water, and then washed with clean water.
- 7. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall keep in a proper state of repair all spouting, water pipes, and drains, and shall frovide sufficient tanks to carry off all liquids, which shall be emptied daily.
- 8. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, or purveyor of milk to use a milk shop or milk store in his occupation, or permit or suffer the same to be used as a sleeping apartment, or for any purpose incompatible with the proper preservation of the cleanliness of a milk store or milk shop, and of the milk vessels and the milk therein, or in any manner likely to cause contamination of the milk therein.
- 9. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep any swine in any cowshed or other building used by him for keeping cows, or in any milk store or other place used by him for keeping milk for sale.
- 10. All cattle in dairies shall be inspected by a veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board at least once in every six months, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board as aforesaid.
- 11. All stables, cowyards, and cattle sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, and all yards and enclosures connected therewith, shall be constructed of suitable materials, and paved or flagged with brick, stone pitchers, or flagging, or be completely floored or covered with cement, asphalt, or other impervious material, and shall have such impervious drains and receptacles so that no liquid, offal, dung, or other filth, refuse, or drainage shall stagnate or lodge therein, and in connection with every such stable, cowyard, cattle shed, or enclosure there shall be provided a fit and sufficient box or bin for the reception of such dung or refuse arising in such stable, cowyard, or cattle shed, as the Health Officer shall decide. Every such stable, cowyard, cattle shed, and enclosure, shall be swept and cleansed twice daily, and all manure, dung, or other refuse arising in or in connection therewith, if not removed immediately, shall be placed in such box or bin as aforesaid, and the said box shall be emptied and cleansed once at least in every week, and such box or bin as aforesaid shall be removed to a distance of at least ten yards from such stable or cattle shed. Every such stable or cattle shed shall, within the time given by any order to such effect from the Health Officer or Health Inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.
- 12. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Secretary of the Board the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease, including consumption, in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.
- 13. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, nor any person under his direction or control whilst suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk, nor in any way take part or assist in the conduct of the business of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or occupier of a milk store or milk shop as far as regards the extraction, distribution, or storage of the milk, until all danger of the communication of infection to the milk or of contamination thereof shall have ceased, and he shall have furnished a satisfactory medical certificate to the Health Officer that such danger no longer exists; and he shall not mix the milk of a diseased cow with other milk.
- 14. Any person carrying on the business of a baker shall have all the inside walls or rooms of such bakehouse, and all the ceilings or tops of such rooms, whether such walls, ceilings, or tops be plastered or not, and all the passages and outplaces of such bakehouse, either painted with oil or varnished, or washed with lime or some other

wash material or liquid approved of by the Health Officer, or be partly painted or varnished, and partly washed. Where painted with oil or varnished there shall be three coats of paint or varnish, and the paint or varnish shall be renewed as required, and shall be washed with hot water and soap once at least in every six months. Any person keeping a bakehouse in contravention of this By-law shall be deemed to be committing an offence.

15. No place on the same level with any bakehouse, and forming part of the same building, shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is constructed as follows, that is to say:—

Unless such sleeping place is effectively separated from the bakehouse by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and unless there be an external glazed window of at least 9 superficial feet in area, of which at least 4½ superficial feet are made to open for ventilation.
