HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by proclamation in the Gazette, such grounds as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a temporary Quarantine Station near Drakesbrook: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Temporary Quarantine Station at Drakesbrook, for the purposes of the said Act, for a period not to exceed 30 days from this date, that portion of land known as "McNeill's Paddock," situated 15 chains South-West from the Drakesbrook Railway Station

Mestern Australia, By His Excellency Lieut. - Colonel to wit. Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

THEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things to declare any land adjoining a Municipality, but not being part of same, to be united with the same: Now THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby declare and proclaim that portion of land adjoining the Municipality of Mount Magnet, comprised within the following boundaries, to be united with and form portion of the Municipality of Mount Magnet:-

Bounded on the Northward and Westward by lines starting from a point situate about 108 chains South and about 72 chains East from Trigonometrical Station K 5 on the summit of West Mt. Magnet, and extending 97° 35′ about 110 chains, and 187° 35′ about 123 chains; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal. Excluding the present Municipality of Mt. Magnet.

The entire boundaries of the Municipality being as follows:

Bounded on the Northward and Westward by lines starting from a point situate about 108 chains South and about 72 chains East from Trigonometrical Station K 5 on the summit of West Mt. Magnet, and extending 97° 35′ about 110 chains, and 187° 35′ about 123 chains; the opposite boundaries being parallel and equal.

THE following Rules and Regulations of the Fremantle Public Hospital are published for general information.

Rules and Regulations of the Fremantle Public Hospital.

Whereas under the powers and provisions of "The Hospitals Act, 1894" (58 Vict., 20), the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by proclamation in the Government Gazette, declared the Fremantle Government Hospital to be a Public Hospital, and has also, with the advice of Marsayl and provided the French of Marsayl and the council and provided the second council and provided the second council and the second council the advice aforesaid, appointed a Board of Management of the said Hospital, to consist of the following members, that is to say:

AND WHEREAS the said Board have, under the provisions of the said Act, power to make By-laws and Regulations as therein mentioned: Now THEREFORE the said Board, with the approval of the Governor, do make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

- The Board of Mauagement shall meet at the Hospital on every alternate Friday, at 5 p.m., or at such other day, place, or hour as may be fixed at any meeting of the Board; five members to form a quorum.
- If a quorum be not present at fifteen minutes after the hour appointed for the meeting, those present may fix a day and hour to which the Board meeting shall stand adjourned, otherwise the meeting shall stand adjourned to the next day of meeting.
- 3. A Chairman and Vice-Chairman shall be elected annually by the Board, at the last meeting of the Board in the month of January in every year, and if neither be present at the time a meeting is constituted, any other member may be chosen to act as Chairman of such meeting by a majority of the members then present. The Chairman shall have a casting vote only. The Chairman shall sign all important correspondence, and shall be the medium of communication between the Board and the Government. He shall be empowered to explain any resolutions arrived He shall be empowered to explain any resolutions arrived at by the Board, and to give advice and instructions to the officials of the Hospital between the meetings of the Board. A vacancy occurring in the office of Chairman or Vice-Chairman shall be filled up at the next meeting of the Board after such vacancy has been declared, previous notice being given in the circulars convening the meeting. The Vice-Chairman shall act as Chairman during the absence of the Chairman
- At every meeting the minutes of the previous meeting of the Board shall be read and, if approved, confirmed, and the business proceeded with in the following order:
 - Business arising from the minutes read.
 - Business arising out of correspondence and reports.
 - III. Business of which notice has been given, and other such business as may require immediate attention.
- 5. At all meetings voting shall be by show of hands, unless in any case a ballot be called for by any three members present: *Provided* that the election of a Chairman or Vice-Chairman shall be by ballot only.
- 6. Special meetings may be convened at any time on 48 hours' written notice to the members, either at the request of the Chairman or of any three members of the Board.
- No resolution arrived at, or act, matter, or thing done or authorised by or at any meeting shall be rescinded or amended at any subsequent meeting unless notice of such intended rescission or amendment be given in the notice convening the meeting at which such rescission or amendment is proposed.
- 8. The conduct of every meeting shall be in the hands of the Chairman, whose decision on all points of order or as to procedure shall be final.
- 9. The Board may, from time to time, appoint a subcommittee or sub-committees of any number, with such powers, rights, and privileges, and subject to such con-ditions and restrictions as the Board may at such appointment or thereafter determine.

VOTES OF CONTRIBUTORS AND CONDUCT OF ELECTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

- 10. Every annual contributor of £1, or a life contributor of £10, shall have one vote. Every annual contributor of £5, or a life contributor of £30, shall have two votes. Every annual contributor of £10 and upwards, or a life contributor of £100 and upwards, shall have three votes.
- 11. The annual meeting of the contributors to the Hospital shall take place on the first Friday in January of every year, when the election of members of the Board shall take place.
- 12. The proposer of each candidate may act as scrutineer.
- Any person proposing a candidate shall produce such candidate's written consent to serve if elected.
- 14. The poll shall be taken by receipt of papers, per post or otherwise, containing the names of the candidates voted for, and the signature of the contributor voting. Any voter may vote for any one or more of the candidates
- 15. The secretary, in conjunction with the scrutineer of each candidate, shall take charge of the voting papers, and at the close of the poll shall draw up a minute of the result, which, when countersigned by the chairman, shall be entered in the minute book, and shall not be subject to any after dispute or inquiry, except as next mentioned.

- 16. If the validity of any election is disputed, all questions in dispute shall, within seven days of the election, be referred to and settled by the remaining members of the Board, or, in case of the first election, by the Colonial Secretary.
- 17. Special meetings can be called by the chairman or any three members of the Board. Due notice must be given of all elections.
- 18. The last preceding eight rules shall not come into force until the provisions of Section five of the said Act have been complied with.

ADMISSION AND DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS.

- 19. Every contributor of £1 annually shall have the privilege of recommending one in-door patient; of £5 annually, three in-door patients; and of £10 annually shall have the privilege of always having one patient in the Hospital. Life contributors shall have the same privilege in proportion; their donations being estimated as annual contributions of one-tenth. It is to be distinctly understood that these recommendations are only to be given to persons who, on account of their poverty, and who are proper subjects for Hospital treatment in the opinion of the House Surgeon; and will have to be renewed at the expiration of six weeks from the admission of the patient.
- 20. Except in urgent cases applicants for admission to the Hospital, who desire to be attended free of charge, shall make a statutory declaration, in the form provided for that purpose, that they are unable to pay for medical attendance, and that they are not entitled to medical attendance from any benefit society or lodge. Any person making a false declaration will be liable to prosecution for perjury, and also to be proceeded against under Section 66, Sub-section two, of "The Police Act, 1892."
- 21. Except in cases of poverty every patient entering the Hospital shall be liable to pay 3s. per day for his maintenance, and shall as soon as possible after his admission sign a written agreement to pay such charge. The House Surgeon shall be at liberty (whether such agreement be signed or not) to deduct the amount due by any patient for maintenance, from any money belonging to the patient in the hands of the Board.
- 22. Every legally qualified medical practitioner, and every member of the Board of Management, may likewise recommend patients for admission. Severe accidents and cases of emergency may be admitted at all times by the House Surgeon.
- 23. The House Surgeon shall not, nor shall any other person admit as an in-patient—except in urgent cases :
 - Any pregnant female for the purpose of confinement.
 - 11. Any person suffering from an incurable disease.
 - III. Any person who has disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided, as lunatics, etc.
 - Iv. Any person who, requiring food and not medicine is more properly an object for a benevolent institution.
 - v. Any person whose admission might endanger the other patients.
 - vi. Any prisoner from the gaol, except an urgent case recommended by the principal Government Medical Officer.
 - vii. Any infant on account of the condition of the mother alone.

Provided that any case recommended by a medical officer may be admitted, whether such case be or be not within the above terms; but the House Surgeon shall forthwith report any admission to the Board.

- 24. The proper hours for patients to present their recommendations for admission to the Hospital are from 10 a.m. to 12 noon, except in cases of emergency, accident, and such like.
- 25. No patient shall be discharged from the Hospital without the consent of the Medical Officer in charge of the case, except when ordered by the Board, or in cases of misconduct or on the expiration of the term of their admission order.
- 26. Any case suitable for admission, in his opinion, may be admitted by the House Surgeon at any time.

MORAL AND RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

- 27. Patients are at liberty to receive the visits of ministers of, or members of any sisterhood in connection with, the religious denominations to which they respectively belong, and the professed religion of every patient shall be entered in the admission book on admission; ministers and such other persons as aforesaid, however, will not be allowed to remain in the wards (except in cases of the greatest emergency) during the professional visits of the medical officers; and they shall retire from the ward during such time as may be necessary for the medical officers to discharge their duties. It is also to be insisted upon that ministers of religion and such other persons as aforesaid, visiting the Hospital for the purpose of administering religious instruction to the patients, shall visit the patients of their denomination only, and shall so conduct their services as not to interfere with the repose and quiet of other patients in the near vicinity.
- 28. Any patient wishing any particular minister, sister, or friend to give religious counsel in case of dangerous illness, or apprehension of the approach of death, may signify the same to the nurse, who shall at once communicate with the House Surgeon or with the Secretary, who shall obtain the presence and services of the minister, sister, or person required, if possible.
- 29. It is not allowable to conduct public religious services in the sick wards of the Hospital.
- 30. A room in the Hospital shall, when practicable, be available for public worship among the convalescents of each religious persuasion.

VISITORS.

31. Any friends, not exceeding two at any one time or on any one day, unless prohibited by the resident medical officer, will be admitted to the wards to visit patients on Wednesdays, Saturdays, and Sundays, between the hours of two and four p.m., and shall leave the wards punctually at the latter hour. A bell will be rung five minutes before the hour for departure. Exceptions to the above rule will only be allowed by special permission of the House Surgeon, or, in his absence, the Secretary, in favour of near relations or friends of patients in a dangerous state, or to persons residing at long distances and who may be otherwise unable to visit their friends at the regular visiting hours. Visitors are strictly forbidden to introduce food, drink, or refreshment of any kind whatever, without the sanction of the House Surgeon; and to ensure the perfect observance of this rule, all parcels, &c., must be opened in the presence of the nurse on duty in the ward. Visitors must remain at the bedside of the patient they are visiting. Children in arms will not be admitted. Any person found on the Hospital premises, without special permission, at other times than those set apart for the reception of visitors, is liable to be prosecuted in terms of Clause 16 of "The Hospitals Act, 1894."

MAINTENANCE OF ORDER AND DISCIPLINE.

- 32. Patients, when able, and when so desired, shall help the nurses in the needful duties of the wards, and shall attend upon other patients whose weakness and wants are greater than their own, and do such light work as the House Surgeon may direct.
- -33. Patients admitted suffering from syphilitic or venereal disease must, if required, sign an engagement to remain until discharged by the Medical Officer in charge of the case, and the infraction of this rule will prevent the patient being admitted at any future time. Patients in the ward in which such cases are treated are not allowed to receive visitors, except by permission of the House Surgeon.
- 34. Any patient found gambling or using profane or indecent language, or being intoxicated, or committing any breach of any Rule or By-law or any order of the Board or of any Medical Officer, or refusing to obey any request as by the last preceding Rule mentioned, shall be liable to instant dismissal by the House Surgeon, who may exercise that power, and afterwards report the case to the House Committee. The House Surgeon shall at the same time inform such patient of the day of the next meeting of the Committee.
- 35. Patients are not allowed to leave the precincts of the Hospital without the special permission of the House Surgeon, given by "pass," which must be left with the porter; and all parcels brought back by patients on their return shall be examined by the nurse.
- 36. Patients are to take their meals at the ward table, except in cases of necessity. They are to keep their beds neat and tidy, the bedclothes properly arranged, and attend scrupulously to personal cleanliness. They shall also observe a quiet and respectful demeanour towards the officers of the Hospital, the nurses, and each other. Any patient having cause of complaint shall submit the same to the House Surgeon, or Matron, or to a member of the House Committee.

- 37. On the admission of any patient into the Hospital, his address, and that of his immediate relatives, and the name of the professed religion of the patient, shall be taken by the Secretary. The effects of the patient shall be taken charge of by the nurse, who shall hand them to the custody of the Matron; but it must be distinctly understood that, though the Board give positive instructions that every care shall be taken of effects so given in charge, they will not be responsible for any loss or deficiency arising from errors of quantity or description, or from any other cause whatever.
- 38. On no account shall any officer, servant, or patient be allowed to keep a dog within the precincts of the Hospital.
- $39.\,$ Patients shall observe all Rules, By-laws, or Orders made from time to time by the Board.
 - 40. No smoking to be allowed in the Hospital wards.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

- 41. The Board shall elect a House Committee, which shall consist of the Chairman of the Board, as an ex officio member, and three others, to be elected annually.
- 42. The Committee shall meet at the Hospital at least once in every fourteen days; two members to form a quorum, but with power to one member, if no more be present, to inspect the Hospital, and convene another meeting at such time as may appear to him needful to consider any matter requiring immediate attention.
- 43. The Committee shall regulate the several departments of the Hospital in accordance with the Regulations or any By-laws or directions of the Board, and more particularly in reference to all sanitary affairs, and shall take immediate steps to rectify any defects that may require prompt attention, subject in all cases to the same being reported to the Board.
- 44. The Committee may suspend, upon sufficient cause, any salaried officer or servant other than the House Surgeon, until the decision of the Board can be obtained; with power in the meantime to employ some other properly qualified person to officiate in the place of the officer or servant so suspended.
- 45. The Committee may order any repairs or alterations which they consider require immediate attention.
- 46. The Committee shall hear all complaints that may be made by patients, officers, or servants, and take such action as they may deem necessary in the matter, until the decision of the Board can be obtained, and shall see that the various duties are performed by all the salaried officers and servants of the Hospital.
- 47. The Committee shall keep a book recording the visits of the members, and in which a note shall be made of all matters in connection with their office.
- 48. The Committee shall examine and pass all accounts and may pay any account of less than £5, which requires immediate payment.
- 49. The Committee may nominate all necessary officers or servants whose nominations are not required to be made by the Board, and may fix the remuneration and term of service.
- 50. The members of the Committee shall hold office for one year only, and be appointed at the last meeting of the Board held in January in each year. The Board may remove any member of the Committee, and fill any vacancy caused by death, resignation, removal, or otherwise.
- 51. The Board may, at any time, enlarge, add to, modify, rescind, or restrict any or all of the powers or duties of the Committee, or any orders given, or acts done by the Committee.

PUBLICATION OF ACCOUNTS.

- 52. Immediately after the second Friday in each year, the Secretary shall prepare and cause to be published in the Government Gazette, and to be forwarded by circular to all contributors, a statement of account, to be countersigned by the Chairman, by order of the Board, showing:—
 - The amount of annual contributions, including 10 per cent. of all life contributors' donations.
 - II. The average annual expenditure of the Hospital for the three preceding years.
 - III. The number of elected members of the Board to be chosen by the contributors.
 - IV. The number of attendances during the year of each member of the Board of Management.

MEDICAL STAFF.

- 53. The Medical Staff of the Hospital shall be nominated by the Board, and shall consist of five medical officers and a House Surgeon, and in case of a vacancy occurring on the staff, a two years' residency in Fremantle will be necessary before a candidate can be eligible for election, unless by the unanimous wish of the Board.
- 54. All nominations to vacancies occurring in the staff shall be made by the Board at a subsequent meeting to that at which the vacancy is declared.
- 55. Medical officers shall take cases in fixed rotation until the beds are filled.
- 56. The Board may nominate for appointment, as Honorary Consultant, any member of the medical profession who is the principal Medical Officer of the Government for the time being, or who has heretofore held, or may hereafter hold, office as a Medical Officer to the Hospital for a period of ten years. Such consultant shall attend at the Hospital when summoned for consultations or operations.
- 57. The Medical Staff shall hold office during the pleasure of the Board.

RULES OF THE MEDICAL STAFF.

- 58. The Committee shall have power to recover at law payment from any patient who in their belief is capable of paying, or who belongs to a benefit society.
- 59. It shall be the duty of the staff to see and prescribe for the in-patients, as hereinafter mentioned.
- 60. No patient who has been in the Hospital under the treatment of one of the staff shall be placed in the bed of another for treatment for the same disease, except by mutual arrangement.
- 61. Each member of the staff shall visit his wards at least twice a week, and shall, as far as possible, adhere to the appointed days and hours.
- 62. The days and hours of attendance of the Medical Officers shall be decided upon at a meeting of the Officers, held every year in the month of March, and the days and hours shall be selected by the Officers according to seniority.
- 63. In the unavoidable temporary absence of any member of the staff it shall be his duty to arrange for the discharge of his duty by a member of the staff.
- $64.\ \,$ All capital operations to be performed on a day fixed by a majority of the staff.
- $65.\ \,$ Any member of the staff present in the Hospital shall attend any emergency case.
- 66. The stuff respectively, or, subject to their control, the House Surgeon, shall, from time to time, order in writing on the diet card the particular diet to be supplied to each patient, and no diet except what is ordered on the diet card shall be issued.
- 67. When a consultation is called, or an operation about to be performed, the House Surgeon shall instruct the Secretary to send notices of the same to the members of the Medical Staff and to the Medical Members of the Board.
- 68. No important operation shall be performed without the previous consent of the patient, if in a position to give it, nor without a consultation by the staff.
- The result of each consultation shall be entered in the Consultation Book, to which all the officers present shall attach their signatures.
- 69. There shall be a book called the "Medical Officers' Attendance Book," which shall show the actual attendance of each Medical Officer.
- 70. The Honorary Dental Surgeon shall attend at the Hospital for services at a time to be fixed by the Board.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

- 71. The House Surgeon shall be appointed by the Governor, on the recommendation of the Board, and be a duly qualified practitioner, resident in the Hospital, and unmarried, and shall be Resident Head of the Hospital.
- 72. He shall be responsible for the general supervision of the Hospital, and shall have the entire control of all patients and of all salaried officers and servants of the Hospital.
- 73. He shall have power to suspend any officer or servant, subject to immediate report to the Chairman of the House Committee.
- 74. In the absence of the Medical Officers he shall be the principal Medical Officer of the Hospital, with full powers to interpose in the treatment of patients in cases in which urgent circumstances appear to him to render his interference necessary.

- 75. He shall have the sole charge of the Operating Book, and shall keep an accurate record of all operations performed, with results.
- 76. He shall have the charge of, and be responsible for, the surgical instruments and apparatus, and may cause ordinary repairs to be effected thereto, and on taking office shall sign the inventory in proof of the correctness thereof. No new instruments shall be ordered, and no alteration or additions to any instrument or apparatus shall be made, except on his written direction, or that of one or more of the Medical Staff, subject to the approval of the Board.
- 77. He shall immediately summon the police to take charge of any case of attempted suicide or criminal violence, and shall not be responsible for the detention of the patient.
- 78. He shall not, unless required by these Rules, or by the Board, or a Medical Officer, undertake any routine medical or surgical work in the wards; but by general supervision see that all officers and servants strictly perform their respective duties, and carry out the instructions of the staff, and also keep a thorough and complete record of all cases treated in the Hospital.
- 79. He shall have full power to admit or refuse to admit the friends of any patient, as he may think fit, and may, at his discretion, prevent the admission of visitors to a ward at any time.
- 80. On the death of any patient he shall intimate the same to the Medical Officer under whose care the patient shall have been, and on receiving intimation of the time at which a post mortem will be convenient, he shall communicate with the Staff.
- 81. He shall visit the wards, if desired, every morning and evening, he shall accompany the Members of the Staff during their visits to the wards on their appointed days and hours, and see that the orders of the Medical Officers are carried out, that the medicines are of proper quality and properly administered, and shall give particular attention to the temperature and ventilation of the wards.
- 82. He shall sign all certificates awarded to nurses who may have gone through a course of training in the Hospital, which must be countersigned by the Chairman of the Board.
- 83. He shall devote his entire time to the service of the Hospital, and shall not engage in private practice.
- 84. He shall afford the Board and House Committee every information, and furnish them with reports on all matters within his control as may to him seem necessary.
- 85. In all correspondence on Hospital business, except such as occurs directly with the Staff, the House Surgeon shall transmit the same through the office, so that a permanent record may be kept.
- 86. He shall conduct all correspondence with the outside public in reference to the condition of patients, and no communication shall be made except with his consent or on his directions.
- 87. It shall be his duty to make all necessary communications to the Press touching cases of accident or assault admitted to the Hospital at his discretion.
- 88. He shall be responsible for, and, with the assistance of the Medical Staff and Secretary, shall prepare the Annual Report, in so far as the medical portion is concerned.
- 89. He shall always be on duty on the days of the Board or House Committee meetings, and also during the hours of attendance of the Medical Officers, except by special permission of the Chairman of the House Committee.
- 90. In the absence of the Secretary, all matters which in the ordinary way would be referred to him shall be referred to the House Surgeon.
- 91. He shall have two weeks' leave of absence annually, the taking of which shall be compulsory. Any further leave of absence must be arranged for through the Board.
- 92. Leave of absence for more than twenty-four hours at other than the times above mentioned must be arranged for with the Chairman of the House Committee.
- 93. In case of his illness the House Surgeon shall report to the Chairman of the Board, who shall arrange for the discharge of his duties.
- 94. The House Surgeon shall, in the intervals between the visits of the staff, take charge of the patients who have been seen by them; but he shall not alter the treatment or diet adopted by the staff except when such a change of symptoms occurs as shall make it absolutely necessary to do so. In every case of emergency he shall at once communicate with the Medical Officers.

- 95. He shall, on admission of all patients into the wards, enter or cause to be entered in the case-book a full report of their previous history and their present condition.
- 96. He shall enter into the case-books a daily report of the progress and treatment of every patient under the care of the Medical Officers.
- 97. He shall undertake any investigation calculated to clucidate the history and symptoms which he has to report, and especially such investigations as the Medical Officers may direct.
- 98. He shall not publish the report of any case without the written permission of the Staff under whose care the patient has been.
- 99. He shall not perform any operation without the consent of the Medical Officer having charge of the case, except in cases of special emergency.
- 100. He shall administer anæsthetics subject to the instruction of the Medical Staff. No anæsthetics shall be administered in the Hospital except in the presence of a Medical Officer.
- 101. The House Surgeon shall, in the event of a member of the Staff requiring any special instrument, notify the same to the Chairman of the House Committee.
 - 102. In respect to the operating theatre he shall see-
 - That the windows and ventilators, etc., are in proper working order.
 - II. That there is a good supply of various antiseptic lotions, dressings, bandages, etc.
 - III. That all instruments, bandages, dressings, and other appliances be neatly and carefully arranged in proper and suitable places.
 - iv. That it be thoroughly, regularly, and completely cleaned.
 - v. That it be kept locked.
 - vi. That previous to operations it be properly warmed.
 - VII. That there is a plentiful supply of hot water.
 - viii. That all instruments likely to be required are laid out in readiness, thoroughly aseptic, and in good working order.
 - IX. That all sponges have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected.
 - x. That immediately after an operation all the instruments used, when permissible, be scalded, cleansed, rendered aseptic, and replaced in their proper places in the operating case.
 - xI. That immediately after any operation all marble slabs, basins, etc., be thoroughly scrubbed and cleaned.
- 103. He shall see that the following weekly reports, with such others as may be ordered, are submitted to the Chairman of the House Committee:—
 - 1. Return of all in and out-patients.
 - 11. Return of cases of typhoid fever.
 - III. Return of cases of infectious and contagious diseases.
 - IV. Return of patients in Hospital more than six weeks, and reason for detention.
- 104. All cases of infectious diseases to be notified at once to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health.
- 105. Misconduct on the part of the House Surgeon shall render him liable to suspension by the Chairman of the Board.

DISPENSER AND SECRETARY.

- 106. The Secretary shall be nominated by the Board, and, subject to any written agreement, hold office during the pleasure of the Governor, and shall devote the whole of his time to the service of the Hospital, and shall not be engaged, directly or indirectly, in any business or profession.
- 107. He shall conduct the correspondence, and have the charge of all documents relating to the Hospital. He shall summon and attend all meetings of the Board and of Committees, and shall keep minute books, in which all the proceedings of these meetings shall be respectively inserted, and shall see, as far as practicable, that all resolutions or orders passed at such meetings are forthwith carried into effect, not having reference to patients.
- 108. He shall, under the direction of the Board, keep the books, forms, and accounts of the Hospital, and shall submit his account books to the Board and the House Committee whenever required.

- 109. He shall issue and be accountable for the clothing, bedding, linen, glass, crockery, cutlery, and cooking and kitchen utensils, and make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which he shall regularly enter the receipt and expenditure of such articles; and he shall, in the months of June and December of each year, prepare and submit to the Trustees a list of such things as may be required in his department for the ensuing half-year.
- 110. He shall, under the direction of the Board, order and receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors and tradesmen, and see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity with the tenders and orders; and in case they do not so correspond he shall have power to return the same, and shall be responsible for the due issue thereof.
- 111. He shall see that a sufficient quantity of stores be provided for the use of the Hospital.
- 112. He shall not procure any stores from other tradesmen than those appointed by the Board.
- 113. He shall carefully examine all the tradesmen's bills for provisions and other articles, and make up the accounts for presentation to the House Committee at their next monthly meeting.
- 114. He shall receive all moneys paid at the Hospital and enter the same in the cash book, and pay the same into the bank, and obtain a receipt in due form from the bank for the amount paid in.
- 115. He shall keep a separate account in the bank for money received from patients, which shall be banked biweekly, all cheques to be signed by the Secretary and countersigned by the House Surgeon.
- 116. He shall present a copy of the By-laws to every employé, relating to his or her office, who may be appointed, immediately after his or her appointment, and obtain his or her signature to a duplicate copy, which he shall keep in the office for that purpose. He shall keep an interleaved book containing the By-laws, and shall insert any new By-law or order as soon as it shall have been passed by the Board, and shall at once communicate it to the person or persons to whom it may relate.
- 117. He shall not issue stores of any kind except for use in the Hospital, and shall be responsible that no portion of the property in his charge be wasted or removed from the Institution.
- 118. He shall see that all parts of the Hospital grounds are kept in a proper state of cleanliness and order.
- 119. He shall report to the House Committee any repairs which may be necessary, and give attention to the same during the progress of any works. He shall also see that all fittings and appliances are in an efficient state.
- 120. He shall receive all property and moneys from patients on admission, and enter particulars thereof in a book to be kept for the purpose, giving the patient a receipt therefor, and on the discharge of the owner he shall return the same, taking a proper receipt.
- 121. In the event of the death of a patient he shall, when practicable, communicate immediately with the relations or friends.
- 122. He shall be responsible for handing over all unclaimed bodies to the undertaker for decent interment, and shall hand over all those claimed to the friends of the decensed.
- 123. He shall prepare a paper for the Chairman at every meeting of the Board or a Committee, giving an outline of the business for consideration, and he shall make a report of the manner in which he has acted upon the orders and resolutions of the preceding meeting, whether the same have, or have not, been fully carried out.
- 124. He shall, on the day following each Board or Committee Meeting, transcribe into the minute book fair copies of the minutes taken at such meeting.
- 125. He shall balance the cash book at the end of each month, noting whether such balance agrees with that shown by the bank book, and if not agreeing, explain the cause of the difference.
- 126. He shall not lend any books or papers belonging to the Hospital, or permit them to be inspected or removed, without the express permission of the Board.
- 127. He shall keep the contributors' book, and shall enter therein, and in the cash book, all subscriptions and donations received, and shall report the same at the next meeting of the House Committee.

- 128. He shall copy in a press copy-book all letters written on the business of the Institution, and shall execuet all orders he may receive from the Board, or any Committee, or the Chairman thereof.
- 129. He shall have control of the Hospital Library, and shall not lend any books or papers therefrom.
- 130. He shall, whenever practicable, instruct and drill the male employés in hose practice and the use of the fire-saving appliances, and in the event of fire shall assume supreme command.
- 131. The Secretary shall act as Dispenser in the Hospital, and shall dispense all medicines ordered, and shall superintend, keep in good working order the dispensary, and shall notify the Resident Medical Officer all necessary requirements for same.
- 132. He shall be responsible for all medicines, drugs, and other articles entrusted to his care, and shall make an inventory of same in a book called the "Drug Book."
- 133. He shall prepare at the beginning of each month an estimate of drugs and sundries required for the month, and shall submit the same to the House Committee.

MATRON.

- 134. The Matron shall be nominated by the Board, and, subject to any written agreement, hold office during the pleasure of the Governor, and reside in the quarters provided for her, and shall devote the whole of her time and attention to the superintendence and general management of the Nursing Staff of the Hospital. She shall also take the entire charge of the domestic affairs of the Nurses' Home and of the Hospital generally, and have full control over all Nurses and female employés attached to the Institution; and in case of disobedience to orders, misconduct or neglect of duty on the part of any Nurse or female employé, she shall have power to suspend such Nurse or female employé, reporting fully thereon in writing through the Secretary at the earliest opportunity.
- 135. She shall see that all Nurses strictly carry out the directions of the Medical Staff and Resident Medical Officer relative to the treatment of the patients.
- 136. She shall report in writing all resignations, vacancies, leave of absence, promotions, and defects in the Nursing Staff to the House Committee through the Secretary; and she shall furnish fortnightly to the House Committee a report as to the efficiency or otherwise of the Nursing Staff.
- 137. She shall be careful to see that all articles of clothing, bedding, etc., are kept in thorough repair; and that all articles of bedding (including mattresses) in use in the wards are frequently changed and regularly aired in the airing ground provided for such purposes, and that no bedding which has been in use be stored away without previous airing.
- 138. She shall inculcate strict economy in the use of fuel, gas, etc., and see that all unnecessary lights are dispensed with during the night, and that order, cleanliness, and punctuality prevail throughout the establishment.
- 139. She shall visit each ward at least twice every day, carefully supervising all that appertains to the nursing and home departments, or that may contribute to the comfort and welfare of the patients and to the efficiency of the Hospital generally.
- 140. She shall receive from the Secretary (on requisition made in writing) all clothing, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, crockery, utensils, and appliances of every kind required for the use of the Hospital, and for the care and custody of which she shall be responsible.
- 141. She shall be responsible for the internal economy and general management of the Nurses' Home, the quality, quantity, and preparation of the food, the state of the dormitories, and the comfort generally of the Nurses; and shall guard as far as possible against irregularities of conduct on the part of Nurses and Servants, such as late hours, absence without leave, etc., and by the maintenance of a wholesome discipline on her part, and among her subordinates, and by impressing upon them the high sense of the responsibilities devolving on them, secure to the Institution an efficient and reliable Nursing Staff.
- 142. She shall be responsible that no ward be left without the presence of a Nurse or Junior Nurse.
- 143. She shall not less than once a week as arranged by the House Surgeon, give such practical and theoretical instruction as may be necessary for the training of the Nurses; and in addition to the ordinary instruction shall see that all Nurses be practically instructed in all branches of cooking for the sick, such as making beef-tea, arrowroot, gruel, chicken-broth, puddings, etc.

- She shall take care that the Nurses attend the lectures and other forms of instruction given in accordance with the By-laws, by the Medical Staff and House Surgeon.
- 145. She shall report on the character and conduct of the Nurses prior to their discharge, and the issue to them of a certificate of efficiency.
- She shall take care that the Wards and patients are in a proper state of order and cleanliness
- 147. She shall keep a journal, in which shall be recorded all breakages and events of importance connected with the Nursing Staff or her duties as Matron, which shall be submitted to the House Committee at its weekly meetings.
- 148. She shall submit to the House Committee, through the Secretary, such minor rules as she may deem necessary for the discipline of all persons placed under her control; copies of which, when approved, shall be hung up in various parts of the Institution.
- 149. She shall see that all lights are extinguished in the Nurses' bedrooms by $10 \cdot 30~\mathrm{p.m.}$

ADDITIONS TO BY-LAW No. 16.

Whereas by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Victoria, No. 10), it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for the purposes enumerated in the said Section 99, Sub-section

And whereas pursuant to the powers contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the Municipality of Northam did enact certain By-law No. 16, for the regulation of licensed public vehicles, and it is deemed expedient to amend the same, and make further provision in respect thereof:

Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Northam, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, that the By-law numbered 16 be amended by the sections in addition thereof, in respect of the matters hereinafter mentioned.

- 1A. In the construction of these By-laws, except where the context shall require a different construction, the following terms in inverted commas shall have the respective meanings hereunto affixed to them; that is to say "Cab" shall mean and include as well a hansom cab as any hack-ney carriage, wagonette or other passenger vehicle; "Dray" shall mean and include any van, dray, wagon, trolley or other vehicle used for the removal, cartage or conveyance of goods, merchandise, furniture, produce or other wares, plying for hire.
- 2A. No license for any cab shall be granted or renewed unless such vehicle and the horse or horses and harness shall have been inspected and examined by the Inspector, or other officer appointed for that purpose, and reported by him to be in a fit state to be licensed, and no license shall be granted for any cab which, in the opinion of the Licensing Officer, shall be unsafe, in bad repair, or other-wise unfit for the accommodation or conveyance of passengers.
- The driver of any licensed cab shall not carry or permit to be carried in or upon such cab any person other than the hirer thereof, except with the consent of such
- 6. Every licensed cab shall be provided with a lamp inside, and one on each side on the outside, and the driver of the same, when plying for hire between sunset and sunrise, shall light and keep such lamps lighted.
- 7. No person shall drive, or be in charge of, or act as conductor of any licensed cab or dray, whilst standing or plying for hire within the Municipality of Northam, without having first obtained a license therefor, as hereinafter provided, nor during the suspension nor after the cancellation of such license.
- 8. No driver or other person having the care and charge of any licensed dray, drawn by one or more horses, shall ride thereon unless he shall be provided with good and sufficient reins, and no vehicle without springs shall be allowed to proceed out of a walking pace within the Municipality of Northam.
- The rates which may be lawfully charged for the hire of any licensed dray by the driver or owner thereof are set out in the Schedule D. No owner or driver of any licensed dray shall permit or suffer any person to be carried thereon or therein as a passenger.
- The number of horses required to draw any licensed cab shall be determined by the Northam Municipal Council at the time of the application by any owner for a license, and such number shall be inserted in the license of such cab, and no person or persons shall drive any licensed cab drawn by a less number of horses than shall be specified in such license. All licensed vehicles drawn by more than two horses or other animals shall be provided by the owner thereof with a conductor, except where otherwise directed
- 11. No driver or conductor shall smoke tobacco or other things whilst driving or conducting any licensed cab engaged by any fare, and no smoking shall be allowed inside any cab.
- 12. No owner or driver of any licensed cab shall carry or permit to be carried in or upon such vehicle any corpse or coffin containing the corpse of any person or persons above the age of two years, or of any person who shall have died of any contagious or infectious disease, or any substance of a dangerous or offensive nature, or of such dimensions as to incompade other passangers. dimensions as to incommode other passengers.
- 13. No person suffering from or recovering from an infectious disease shall ride in or upon any licensed cab. In the event of any such person being carried in or upon any such vehicle, the owner or driver of such vehicle shall, upon being cognisant of such fact, immediately give notice thereof to the Town Clerk, or other officer, and shall not permit any other person to ride therein or thereon until it shall have been thoroughly cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of such officer of the Council. satisfaction of such officer of the Council.
- 14. No owner, driver, or conductor of any licensed cab shall at any time place, or suffer or permit to be placed on the outside of any such vehicle, any notice, advertisement, or printed bill, or any names, letters, devices, designs, pictures or numbers, without the written consent of the Municipal Council previously obtained.
- No driver of any licensed cab or dray shall furiously or recklessly drive any such vehicle, or wilfully or negligently do, or cause to be done, any damage to the person or

property of anyone, or be guilty of any breach of the peace, misconduct, or misbehaviour, or be intoxicated, or make use of any threatening, obscene, abusive, or insulting language, or behave in a threatening or insulting manner; and no driver shall cruelly beat, ill-treat, over-drive, abuse or torture any horse in his charge, but shall at all times be sober and careful in the discharge of his duties.

16. No licensed driver or conductor shall demand more than the legal fare fixed by these By-laws from any passenger, and if any person pay the driver or conductor, on demand, any sum exceeding the legal fare, he may recover the same summarily, and the driver or conductor shall be liable to a penalty under these By-laws, and his license be liable to be forthwith cancelled. Any person who shall be a passenger by any licensed vehicle, and who shall refuse to pay the fare for the hire thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and liable to a penalty accordingly.

17. Every licensed driver shall, whilst engaged in taking up or setting down any passengers, or in loading or unloading, place his vehicle as near as conveniently may be to the kerb or footpath on the left of the street in a line parallel thereto.

18. Every driver who shall feed any horse whilst waiting for hire shall use a nosebag to contain the forage, and shall not remove such horses winkers during the time of feeding.

19. The rates and fees to be charged by the owners and drivers of licensed cabs shall be those set out in Schedule "F" hereto, or as may be fixed by the Muncipal Council of Northam from time to time, and shall be deemed the rates and fares which may be lawfully demanded and received by such owners and drivers; provided that such rates and fares shall be inclusive of all charges for luggage up to 28lbs. weight for each passenger. All luggage carried by a passenger in excess of 28lbs. weight shall be paid for at the rate of sixpence for every 28lbs. excess, irrespective of the distance the same shall be carried.

20. The rates to be charged for goods and merchandise by any driver or owner of any licensed dray plying for hire within the Municipality shall be those which are described in Schedule hereto marked "C."

21. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £10.

Regulations for Shipment of Ships' Stores.

PY virtue of the powers conferred on me by the 147th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892" (55 Vict., No. 31), I hereby direct that the following Regulations shall be observed in connection with the Shipment of Ships' Stores:-

- 1. The master of every ship of the burden of thirty (30) tons, or upwards, departing from any port in Western Australia upon a voyage to parts beyond the seas, may, upon due application made by him to the Collector of Customs at such port, receive an order for the shipment of dutiable goods, as ships' stores, duty free, in accordance with the scale prescribed in Schedule "A" hereto, for each day of the voyage, the duration being estimated by the Collector of Customs, and such other general stores, in reasonable quantities, with the exception of frozen or chilled meat, as the Collector shall deem necessary.
- 2. On receipt of an application in the form of Schedule "B," and previous to the passing of an entry for any stores required by any vessel as aforesaid, the master of such vessel, or his agent, must give security by bond, in the form shown in Schedule "C" hereto, with one or more sureties, for double the amount of duty payable on any goods so required, and that they are duly shipped and exported.
- 3. The Collector of Customs at any port in Western Australia may permit dutiable goods to be delivered as ships' stores, free of duty, on board vessels in such port, for the use of the crew, in such quantities as he may deem requisite.

Regulation under "The Fishery Act, 1889."

Department of Lands and Surveys, 12,0,3 2 Perth, 7th March, 1898.

WHEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- 1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea, within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- 2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.
- "And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine during a period of two (2) years from the date of publication hereof, in any part of the waters of the Vasse and Wonnerup estuaries, and that portion of the sea into which those estuaries immediately discharge, within the limits hereunder described and coloured red on plan on exhibit at the Court House, Busselton:—

Bounded on the North by a West line extending from the Northern end of the Dead water; on the South-East by the shore of Geographe Bay; on the West by the continuation North of the West boundary of Wonnerup Townsite.

- Application for leases of the natural surface of any lots within the prescribed area to a depth of 20ft, may be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands through the Warden by any person above the age of 18 years, upon the following terms:
- The application shall be in the form prescribed, and shall be lodged with the Warden, and shall set forth the number, area, and position of the lot applied for.
- The rent payable in respect of each lot shall be £1 per annum, which shall, in the first instance, be lodged with the application, and subsequently paid annually on the first day of March, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 101 of the Land Regulations. - The Warden shall forward the application, together with his recommendation thereon, to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, immediately after receipt thereof, and he may thereupon deliver to the applicant an approval notice in the form hereinafter provided, and the production of such notice shall be sufficient evidence of the right of the holder thereof to occupy the lot therein mentioned under these regulations, pending the decision of the Governor in Executive Council thereon. Should the application be approved, a lease in the form prescribed will be issued to the applicant on the surrender by him of the approval notice, but should the application be refused, notice of such refusal will be gazetted, and the rent paid will be refunded to the applicant on application to the Warden.
- The area leased shall be used solely as the habitual abode of the holder or members of his family for at least six months in each year, and for no other purpose whatever. On proof satisfactory to the Warden that this condition has not been complied with, the Warden may declare the lot liable to forfeiture, and in such case he shall report the matter to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, by whom the lot may be declared forfeited. Should the person re-applying object to the value set upon the improvements by the original holder, a valuation shall be made by two arbitrators, one appointed by each party, and in

- accordance with the provisions of "The Arbitration Act, 1895," the Warden being the umpire in case of disagreement, and the cost of such arbitration shall be borne by the original holder or the person re-applying, as the arbitrators may direct.
- No person who shall have surrendered or forfeited a free area shall be eligible to select another free area within a mile of the lot originally held by him, until six months shall have elapsed from the date of surrender or forfeiture of such lot.
- 8. The Governor may at any time exempt from the operations of these regulations any portion or portions of any town or suburban lands so set apart, which may be required for mining or other purposes
- 9. Act, Section 38.

89. If any person, being the applicant for or holder of a gold mining lease, or the holder of a miner's right or business license, desires to object to the issue of a lease to the applicant therefor, he shall, within thirty days after the application to lease has been lodged with the Mining Registrar, lodge with the said Registrar, and also serve such applicant with a notice, in the form of Schedule 28, of every objection intended to be taken by him against the issue of such lease. Such notice shall be sufficiently served if transmitted by post to the address of the said applicant, or posted on the datum point of the land applied to lease; provided always, that the Warden may order that personal service shall be effected. When any objections shall have been lodged within the prescribed time, the Warden shall fix a day for the hearing of such objections in the Warden's Court, and shall take evidence on oath, which shall be signed by the person giving it. Such evidence shall immediately be forwarded to the Minister by the Warden, accompanied by his recom-

mendation as to whether the application should be granted or refused; but no application for a lease shall be recommended by the Warden until after the time for lodging objections has expired, and every recommendation shall be made subject to the due compliance with regulations as to survey, and to all such alterations in boundaries or otherwise which on receipt of the surveyor's plan and report may appear to be necessary.

Regulations under "The Water Supply Act, 1893."

Public Works Department, Perth, 25th January, 1898.

IS Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations by virtue of Section six of "The Water Supply Act, 1893."

- 1. No person shall bathe in any lake, lagoon, swamp, reservoir, tank, dam, stream, creek, well, spring, or other water situate within any reserve, made by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, or cause or permit any animal to go therein.
- 2. No person shall encamp upon any waste land of the Crown reserved by virtue of the provisions of the said Act, or permit any animal to remain on such land any longer than is necessary for the purpose of taking water.
- 3. No person shall bring or deposit into or upon any reserve made by virtue of the said Act, any rubbish, dirt, filth, or other noisome thing, or wash or cleanse, in any water within any such reserve, any cloth, wool, leather, or skin of any animal, or any other material or thing whatsoever.

4. Any person who shall cause or permit the water of any mining shaft, or of any sink, sewer, drain, or cesspit, or other filthy water to find its way into any stream, catch-drain, tank, reservoir, dam, lake, lagoon, soak, spring, or other water situate within any such reserve aforesaid, or shall do any act or thing whereby the water shall be fouled, shall for each such offence be liable to the penalty imposed by these Regulations.

PENALTY.

Every person committing a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £100.
