GERARD SMITH. (L.S.) By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by the 17th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892" (55 Vict., No. 31), it is provided, amongst other things, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint proper places within any established Port to be legal landing places for lading and unlading of Goods: Now Therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint all that piece or parcel of Land in the City of Perth, containing one acrethree roods and twenty-seven perches, more or less, and known in the books of the Survey Office as Lot 70: Bounded on the Northward by three chains of Bazaar Street; on the Eastward by a Southerly line of six chains sixty-five links, in the same straight line with the Eastern boundary of Perth Town Lot L $15\frac{1}{2}$; on the Westward by a Southerly line of six chains fifteen links, in the same straight line with the Western boundary of Perth Town Lot L $15\frac{1}{2}$; and on the Southward by a straight line joining the Southern extremities of the Eastern and Western boundaries; such piece or parcel of land being within the limits of that portion of the City of Perth, described in the books of the Survey Office, and appointed by the Governor as a Warehousing Place, under Government Gazette Notice of the 16th August, 1892.

Municipal By-Laws.

III IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-Laws made by the Councils of the Municipalities of Coolgardie, Subiaco, Perth, and Bulong.

$\frac{6.6.3}{9.8}$ Municipality of Coolgardie.

By-Law No. 35 (amended).—For Licensing Hawkers.

- 1. Any person hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables within the Municipality, without having first obtained a license thereto from the Council and paying a license fee of £5 (payable 25s. quarterly) for the same, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.
- 2. Such license shall be of force and effect within any part of the Municipality other than Bayley Street, or within nine chains of Bailey Street, and under no conditions whatever shall any hawker, whether licensed or otherwise, ply his trade in any part of the above-named street; any person attempting so to do shall, for each such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
- 3. Every license, notwithstanding the date of issue, shall be in force until the 31st day of December then next ensuing, provided that it shall be at the discretion of the Council at any time to cancel or suspend any such license for sufficient cause shown.

By-Law No. 35, Gazetted 1st January, 1897, is hereby Repealed.

By-Law No. 35A .- For Regulating Movable Stalls.

- 1. Any person using any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street within the Municipality for the sale of meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise, without having first obtained a license thereto from the Council, and paying a license fee of £10 (payable £2 10s. quarterly) for the same, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.
- 2. Such license shall be of force and effect within any part of the Municipality other than Bayley Street, or within nine chains of Bayley Street, and under no conditions whatever shall any hawker, whether licensed or otherwise, ply his trade in any part of the above-named street, any person attempting so to do shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
- 3. Every license, notwithstanding the date of issue, shall be in force until the 31st day of December then next ensuing, provided that it shall be at the discretion of the Council at any time to cancel or suspend any such license for sufficient cause shown.

By-Law No. 43.—For Protecting Tree-guards.

Any person who shall carelessly or wilfully destroy or remove from its place any tree planted in any street, park lands, or other place belonging to or under the control of the Council, or who shall ride or drive against, or hitch or tie any horse or other animal to any tree-guard, fence, or other protection, shall for each such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

By-Law No. 44.—For Prohibiting the Camping of Camels within the Municipality.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to lead, keep, camp, or otherwise detain any camel or dromedary within the Municipality between the hours of sunset and sunrise, without having first obtained from the Council permission so to do.
- 2. Any person offending against the requirements of this By-Law shall for each such offence be liable to a fine not exceeding £2 per head per night.

By-laws to regulate Buildings, Alterations, &c., within the Municipality of Subiaco.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. The several words mentioned in Section two of "The Building Act, 1884," shall, where used in these By-laws, have the same construction as is provided for by such section.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO BUILD.

2. Every person intending to commence to build, take down, alter, add to, or repair any building, whether partially destroyed by fire or otherwise, or to do any act whereby any public street may be obstructed or rendered dangerous or inconvenient to persons passing over or near thereto, shall give three clear days' notice, in writing, to the Surveyor of his intention so to do, and shall deposit with such notice complete drawings and specifications of the proposed work, and also a plan of the locality showing the position of such buildings and their relative positions to each other.

Such notice shall be delivered at the Surveyor's Office, and shall contain particulars of the site and nature of the intended building, work, or other act.

The Surveyor, provided the license fee and the deposit as hereafter provided has been paid to him, shall forthwith grant a license in the Form "A" of the Schedule hereto, and also give such directions as he shall think fit for the erection of hoardings or fences, and platforms and handrail for the protection of passengers; and such directions shall be complied with to the satisfaction of the Surveyor before the commencement of such building, work, or act. In the event of the plans being incomplete or incorrect, they must be re-submitted for approval after the alterations have been properly effected, or if from any cause the Surveyor cannot then approve of them, they must then be submitted to the Works Committee of the Council.

Every breach of this By-law shall subject the person guilty of such breach to a fine or penalty of not exceeding £1, for each day the same continues, recoverable in a summary manner before Justices.

FEES FOR SPECIAL SERVICES NOT EXPRESSLY PROVIDED FOR.

For any service performed by the Surveyor which is required by the By-laws, but not comprehended under any of the foregoing heads, such fee not to exceed £5 5s., as the Council of the said Municipality by resolution duly arrived at may appoint and fix.

All fees payable under this By-law become the property and part of the ordinary income of the Municipality.

For preparing drainage plans and other special sanitary work, the Surveyor shall be paid such sum or sums as the Mayor and Council of the said Municipality shall decide.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO USE AREA IN PUBLIC STREET, &c., FOR THE DEPOSIT OF MATERIALS.

3. Every person wishing to deposit any stone, bricks, lime, rubbish, timber, iron, or other materials on any public street, or to make any excavation on any land abutting on, or adjoining, or contiguous to any public street shall first make application for and obtain from the Surveyor a license so to do.

Such license shall be given in the Form "A" in the Schedule hereto, specifying the time for which the same, when so crected and set up, may be continued, also the conditions to be observed by licensee, and giving such other directions as the Surveyor may think necessary.

Any infringement of this By-law shall subject the person guilty of such infringement to a fine of £5 for every day such infringement continues, to be recovered in a summary manner before Justices.

HOARDINGS TO BE KEPT IN REPAIR.

4. Every person who shall be required to erect any hoarding, fence, platform, or hand-rail, under the last two preceding clauses, shall keep the same in good and sufficient repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, so long as it shall, in his opinion, be necessary for the public safety; and every such person shall, immediately upon the receipt of notice from the Surveyor that such hoarding, fence, platform, or hand-rail is out of repair, and requiring him to repair the same, forthwith repair the same to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every day the same shall continue in disrepair after the receipt by him of such notice.

Hoardings, &c., to be Lighted.

5. Every person erecting such hoarding, fence, platform, or hand-rail, or obstruction of any kind in any public street, or any excavation as aforesaid, shall cause the same to be well and sufficiently lighted at night, with lamps glazed coloured glass, all in accordance with the directions and to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every night or part of a night on which the same is not so lighted.

POWER OF SURVEYOR TO ENFORCE PRECEDING BY-LAWS.

6. It shall be lawful for the Surveyor, without reference to the Council, to take immediate steps to enforce any of the preceding regulations, and he may cause any such hoarding or other obstruction that has been erected without his license, or which has been erected or continued in br ach of the conditions of any such license, to be removed, or any such excavations to be filled in, or injuries to the public street repaired, at the cost and expense of the person erecting or making the same, and such costs and expenses shall be recoverable from the person so making the same, as well as the penalties hereinbefore imposed, before Justices.

MATERIALS OF EXTERNAL WALLS FACING ANY STREET.

7. With regard to the component materials of any external walls within 15ft. of Broome or Rokeby roads, and also such other streets or roads as may hereafter be declared, every such wall must be built of brick or stone, or artificial stone together laid in, and with mortar or cement in such manner as to produce solid work.

MATERIALS TO BE USED IN REPAIR.

8. If any external wall or enclosure be at any time hereafter taken down or otherwise demolished, for the height of one story or for a space equal to one fourth of the whole surface of such external wall, then every part thereof not built in the manner and of the several materials by these regulations directed for external walls must be taken down; and the same must be rebuilt in such manner and of such materials for, and in all respects as by this By-law directed, for external walls hereinafter to be built according to the class and rate of the building to which such external wall or enclosure shall belong.

MATERIALS FOR MUTUAL, PARTY, OR PARAPET WALLS.

9. Mutual or party walls: In reference to the component materials thereof, every part of all such walls must be built of sound bricks, or stone, or artificial stone, or such bricks, or stone, or artificial stone laid in together, and with mortar or cement, and in such manner as to produce solid work, and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with the party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, brestsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partitions, heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof, and wood bricks may be laid into

the substance of a party wall; but no such beams, brest-summers, girders, partitions, head, or sill, nor any part of a roof being wood, nor any wood bricks, must be laid or placed within two inches of the centre of any party wall; and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or be run or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall; but if the ends of the timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoes or stone corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half the thickness of such wall; and the top of every such party wall must be carried to a height of at least one foot three inches above where the party wall and the roof adjoin with sound, hard bricks or stone, set in good mortar or cement, and finished with a suitable coping.

ROOFS TO BUILDINGS.

10. With regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building and any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop fronts, they must be so arranged and constructed and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water therefrom dripping on to or running over any public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

All iron pipes shall lead, if so required, from the front of the building under the footpath into the street side-channel; provided always that the pipe laid across the footway shall be at least 6in. below the surface and be of jarrah, cast or wrought iron piping of 4in. diameter, or in glazed earthenware, securely bedded in concrete, all as directed by the Engineer.

DRAINS TO BUILDINGS.

11. With regard to the drains of buildings of any class, and of every addition thereto, before the several walls of any such buildings shall have been built to the height of 10ft. from their foundations, the drains therefor must have been properly built and made good—that is to say, if there be within 100ft. from any front of the building a common sewer into which it is lawful and practicable to drain, then into such common sewer, and if there be not in such situation and within such distance any such common sewer, then to the best outlet that can be obtained, so as to render in either case drains available for the drainage of the lowest floor of such building or addition thereto, and also of its areas, privies, and offices; and every such drain must be laid to a sufficient fall or current, so as that the whole of every such drain within the walls of such building shall be wholly carried over under the lowest floor, independently thereof, and every such drain within the walls of such building must be constructed of sound laid bricks of best quality, laid wholly in cement mortar, or of best quality of glazed stoneware drain pipes jointed in cement, and not less than 4in. internal diameter, so as to render the drain air tight; all drains to be laid and built to the approval of the Surveyor.

Proper plans of such proposed drainage shall be submitted for the approval of the Surveyor; such plans showing the sizes of pipes, gradients, ventilating pipes, inspection chambers, &c., and the same must in every case be approved of in writing by the Surveyor, before the work or any part of the same is proceeded with.

Drains passing through or under any dwelling, shop, or other tenement, must be constructed in heavy cast iron u.g. pipes or earthenware pipes enclosed in concrete, and all drains must be disconnected from the sewer or other outlet.

COVERING FOOTPATHS, SCAFFOLDING, &C.

12. In the case of any building being erected abutting on the footpath of a public street, or of any plastering operations being intended to be performed above the first story of any building, the builder or other persons having charge of such buildings, or the plasterer, shall, before proceeding to build further than the first story of such building so being erected, or with any plastering as aforesaid, give notice thereof in writing to the Surveyor, who shall thereupon give directions to such builder, person, or plasterer, for the covering of such footpath as he shall think fit, and any builder, person, or plasterer who shall fail to give such notice, or shall proceed with such building or plastering without having complied in all respects with the directions of the Surveyor, or without keeping such scaffolding covering or other erection directed by him in an efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, shall incur a penalty of £5 for each day in which such default shall occur or continue.

If in the Engineer's opinion any scaffolding is unsafe or insufficient he may direct that the same shall be strengthened, altered, and made secure to his entire satisfaction.

BACK YARDS.

13. With regard to back yards or open spaces attached to dwelling houses, every house hereafter built or rebuilt must have an enclosed back yard or open space (according to Sec. 5, "The Building Act Amendment Act of 1887"), exclusive of any building thereon, unless all the rooms of such house can be lighted and ventilated from the street.

PRIVIES.

14. Every privy hereafter to be built must have a door and be properly enclosed, screened, and fenced from public view, and every house or other building hereafter to be erected shall have attached to it a privy of the following construction, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor:—The size above floor internally to be not less than 3ft. 9in. x 4ft. 6in., and not less than 6ft. 6in. high, in clear height on the lowest side. It must also be sufficiently ventilated, the walls to be contructed of $4\frac{1}{2}$ brickwork lime-washed or plastered, jarrah or galvanized corrugated iron, and not to be erected closer than 3ft. to the boundary of the adjoining allotment nor nearer than 20ft. to any dwellinghouse, and all must have proper provision for the removal and replacing of the pans. If the roof is of iron the ceiling must be matchboarded. The pan must be the regulation pattern and a metal tray at least 2in. deep with sufficient flushing apertures must be fitted behind the riser for its reception, or it may be composed of concrete, slate, or some non-absorbent material, having a proper fall towards the service door.

ROOMS-WITH REGARD TO HEIGHT.

15. With regard to rooms in other parts of the buildings, in reference to the height thereof, every room used, or intended to be used, for the purposes of habitation, must be at the least the height of 9ft. from floor to ceiling, and no sleeping room shall have a cubical area of less than 500ft. to each person.

VENTILATION OF ROOMS.

16. Every room used for the purposes of habitation, or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, by the insertion of air-bricks below the floor, and by openings in the sleeper walls, also by ventilators in the ceilings or at the top of the walls thereof, according to the size of such rooms.

VERANDAHS.

17. Awnings or verandahs to be erected over footpaths are to be in accordance with drawings and specification approved of by the Surveyor, and accordingly adopted by the Council. The minimum height is to be 8ft. 6in. clear from the footpath, and the posts must not be less than 5in. x 5in. if in Jarrah, with a minimum of 3½in. if in east iron. The verandah to be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, who shall have power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor observing the necessity of removal or repair, such must be commenced within seven days of the receipt of notice from the Surveyor, and must be completed within 14 days from such notice, or otherwise the verahdahs will be removed as nuisances, the cost of such removal to be borne by the owner or occupier, and to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

Brestsummers.

18. All brestsummers to be either of iron or approved wood, and be loaded to one-third only of their breaking weights.

FIREPLACES.

19. Every fireplace constructed of iron shall be lined with brick or stone built up to a height of 3ft. from the level of the fire-rest, and not less than 4½in, thick, and the hearth of every such fireplace or chimney must be laid and bedded wholly on brick, or stone, or other incombustible substance. Such hearth to consist of a slab or slabs of brick, tile, stone, slate, iron, or other proper and sufficient substance at least 12in, longer than the opening of the chimney when finished, and at least 18in, in front of the arch over the same.

Notice to remove Dangerous Buildings.

20. When any building shall, in the opinion of the Surveyor, be ruinous or dangerous, or unfit for human use or habitation through defects in its construction or surroundings, under the meaning of Clause 16 of "The Building Act, 1884," the Surveyor shall give notice to the owner thereof to remove or renovate the same, and every such owner shall forthwith comply with such order, under a penalty of not more than £20 per month for noncompliance.

TEMPORARY BUILDINGS.

21. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Council for a period to be stated for the erection of temporary buildings, all the walls of which may be of wood or iron.

PROHIBITING FOR HUMAN HABITATION.

22. No building, or any part thereof not originally built as and for a dwelling house within the limits of the Municipality, whether built before or after the adoption of this By-law, shall be converted into or used as a dwelling house without the previous consent of the Council, who may grant such consent upon and subject to such conditions as they may see fit or in their discretion may refuse the same.

Builder to keep responsible man in charge.

23. Any builder or any other person erecting any building under those By-laws shall at all times during working hours, during the progress of such work, be himself or keep a responsible man on the scene of such work to take any orders from the Surveyor relative to such building, and the plans and specifications of such building shall at all times be thereon in the custody of such person for production to the Surveyor, and any infringement of this By-law shall subject the person guilty to a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

CROSSING PLACES.

24. Wherever it shall be necessary to make any crossing over a public footpath in any street into any private premises, such crossing place shall be made by the Council, and shall be properly laid and channelled with wood, stone sets, or other suitable material as the Council may deem fitting, and half the cost of such making shall be borne by the owner of such premises, and shall be paid by him within one month from the completion of the work, and in case of any repairs being necessary to such crossing the same shall be made by the Council, and the cost of same shall be borne and paid by such owner.

PROHIBITING USE OF SPIKES, BARBED WIRE, &c.

25. Iron spikes or other projections, broken glass, or barbed wire shall not be placed or fixed on any premises abutting upon a street.

Wooden Buildings.

26. Outside the area of Broome and Rokeby Roads (subject to Clause No. 7) wooden buildings of approved construction may be erected, but in every such case subject to such restrictions and regulations as may from time to time be imposed by the Council and their Surveyor. In no part of the Municipality shall wooden buildings be allowed to be erected nearer than 3ft. (on either side) to the boundary line.

CONTRACTORS' SHEDS.

27. Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractors' or builders' temporary office, sheds and workshops from being erected of wood or iron on any building site during building operations, provided that special application be made to and permission be granted by the Surveyor.

COMPULSORY FENCING.

- 28. The Council may at any time order any part of any street boundary not already built upon to be fenced or walled, as they may see fit, within three months from such notice. In such cases the fence must be constructed of iron or wood to a plan that must be submitted to and obtain the approval of the Surveyor. If walled, the construction thereof must be in accordance with the provisions of Bylaws, and should the owner or occupier neglect or refuse to comply the Council may proceed with the work after one month's written notice, subject to the provisions contained in By-laws.
- 29. Every chimney shaft or flue hereafter built, raised or repaired, must be carried up in brick or stonework all round at least 4in. thick to a height of not less than 3ft. above the highest part of such portion of the roof, flat, or gutter adjoining thereto, measured at the point of junction. And as to any chimney shaft (except that of a steam engine, brewery, distillery, or manufactory) the brick or stonework of such shaft or flue must not be built higher than 8ft. above the slope, flat or gutter of the roof which it adjoins, measured from the highest point of junction, unless such chimney shaft shall be built of increased thickness or be built with and bonded to another chimney shaft, or be otherwise rendered secure. And as to the chimney shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam engine, or for any brewery, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height so that it be built in such manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the Surveyor upon special application in each case.

And be it enacted that every owner or user of any chimney shaft of any mill, manufactory, or other similar building shall, if the Surveyor deem it necessary, construct the fireplace or furnace to such chimney shaft in such manner as effectually to consume the carbonaceous matters or gases arising from the fuel used therein, or shall affix proper and suitable apparatus to such fireplace or furnace so as to cause the same to consume such carbonaceous matter or gases as aforesaid; and any such owner or user who shall neglect or refuse to construct such fireplace or furnace in the manner hereinbefore prescribed, or who, being thereto required in writing by the Surveyor, shall, after the lapse of 10 days, neglect or refuse to affix such proper and suitable apparatus to such fireplace or furnace as aforesaid, shall, on conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than Five Pounds.

And be it enacted that if any such owner or occupier, or any fire stoker or other person in charge of such fireplace or furnace, shall not well and properly use such fireplace or furnace or any apparatus put up or affixed to such fireplace or furnace for the purpose of causing such carbonaceous matters or gases to be consumed, or shall use the same or any of them negligently so as to permit or suffer such carbonaceous matters or gases of an opaque colour (ordinarily called smoke) to issue therefrom except for the period of thirty minutes after the commencement of lighting such fires on any day, every person so offending shall, on conviction thereof before any Justice of the Peace, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

CHIMNEY POTS.

30. As to earthen or metal chimney pots, tubes, funnels, or cowls of any description whatsoever.—If such pot, tube, funnel, or cowl be higher than 4tt. above the brick or stone work of the flue upon which the same shall be placed, then it must be fixed 2ft. at the least into the brick or stone work of the flue on which it shall be placed, or otherwise fixed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

DISPUTES.

31. If any dispute shall arise between the Surveyor and any person or persons respecting the meaning or operation of any of the conditions of these By-laws, the question shall be referred by the Surveyor to the Council for their adjudication.

FEES, PENALTIES, &c.

32. All fees, penalties, and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws or any of them shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Council, and shall become the property of and part of the ordinary income of the Municipality.

Power to Surveyor to enter and remove.

- 33. And generally, where anything shall have been done, or omitted to be done, in contravention to these regulations, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and remove, or cause to be removed, any buildings or other thing which have been erected in contravention thereof, or to do, or cause to be done, any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the costs of so doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person in addition to any penalties to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these regulations.
- 34. The building line in any street within the Municipality shall be fixed by the Surveyor, and all buildings hereafter to be erected shall be built to this line and be kept parallel thereto, and to the alignment of the street, and within the curtilage of the allotment.
- 35. All survey levels, bench marks, or other marks denoting the same, shall be carefully preserved, and any person removing, obliterating, or causing or permitting same to be removed or obliterated, shall be liable to a penalty of £10, and to pay all costs incurred in replacing same.
- 36. All walls erected within 2ft. of the boundary of allotment must have parapet or mutual walls with copings, the walls in every case being carried up as per clause No. 9 of these By-laws.
- 37. No cornice or other ornament shall project beyond the alignment of the street more than 18ins., and must not be lower than 15ft. above the level of pavement.
- 38. No cellar will be allowed under the pavement of a street, and authority for fixing prismatic or other lights on the pavement must be obtained in writing from the Building Surveyor before being fixed.
- 39. No balcony supported wholly from cantilevers or corbelled out from the wall will be permitted, unless specially authorised in writing by the Council.

40. The floors of every bakehouse shall be constructed of concrete, wood blocks, bricks, asphalte, or other impervious matter, authorised and approved by the Surveyor.

By-Laws of the Council of the Municipality of the City of Perth, made under "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," for regulating the hawking of fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, and the licensing of persons for the hawking of fruit, fish, and vegetables, and for movable or temporarily fixed stalls, in or near any street, for the sale of meat, fruit, vegetables, drink, eatables, or articles of merchandise.

- All By-laws relating to hawkers, made and passed by the said Council heretofore, are hereby repealed.
- 2. No person shall hawk in the City of Perth for the purpose of selling any fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables, or have any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise, without a license authorising him to do so, signed by the Town Clerk of the said City, and every such license shall be numbered and registered, and may be in the form contained in the Schedule hereto, and shall be in force for the term therein stated, and no longer.
- Every person licensed as a hawker shall, whilst engaged in hawking, carry the license so granted with him, and upon being required by any officer of the Municipal Council or Police Officer produce and show the same.
- Every licensed hawker shall, whilst hawking, have fixed on some conspicuous part of his cart, barrow, basket, vehicle, bundle, bag, or package, or tray, a board or plate bearing his name, and the words "Licensed Hawker" legibly painted thereon in letters not less than one inch in
- 5. There shall be paid for such license to the Town Clerk the following fees:-
 - For hawking with hand basket, or tray, bundle, bag, or package, the sum of 5s. per month.
 - For hawking with wheel-barrow or hand cart, or any other kind of movable cart, 10s. per month.
 - For hawking with a vehicle drawn by a horse or any other animal, 20s. per month.
- 6. No person shall occupy a movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise unless such person shall obtain a license for such purpose.
- 7. The license for the sale of meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise shall be as follows :-

For movable and temporarily fixed stalls within the radius of Zone A, 60s. per month.

Within the radius of Zone B, 20s. per month.

Within the radius of Zone C, 10s. per month.

- Zone A shall be bounded as follows:—On the South by the River Swan, on the West by William Street, on the East by Pier Street, on the North by Wellington Street.
- Zone B shall be bounded as follows:—From the junction e B shall be bounded as follows:—From the junction of William Street and the River Swan to Spring Street, along Spring Street to the junction of Mount Street, along Mount Street to the junction of Milligan Street, along Milligan Street and Melbourne Road to Russell Square, along Palmerston Street to the junction of Newcastle Street, along Newcastle Street to Lord Street, along Lord Street to the River Swan, and thence to the corner of Pier Street.
- Zone C shall mean and include the remainder of the area of the Municipality of Perth, not included in Zones A and B.
- 8. Every person who shall commit a breach of these By-laws shall, for every such breach or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The Roads Act, 1888.

By-laws of the South Perth Roads Board.

THE South Perth Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws.

Whereas by the Roads Act, 1888, and the Amendment Acts 1889 and 1894, the Board of any District is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Acts mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the South Perth District, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said district from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

INTERPRETATION.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- "The Act."—The Roads Act of 1888, and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter as far as the Act allows;
- "District."—The South Perth Roads Board District;
- "Board."—The South Perth Roads Board:
- "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as chairman of the Board;
- "Member."—A member of the Board;
- "Secretary."—The secretary of the Board;
- "Road or Reserve."—A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board;
- "Street" shall mean and include every public street, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district under the control of the Board which the public are permitted to use;
- "Footpath or Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed, or otherwise;
- "Owner."—Any person m possession or receipt either of the whole or of any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land or tenement;
- "Occupier."—Any person who shall have occupied any ratable property within the District during the period specified in the Act;
- "Cycle."—A bicycle, tricycle or other velocipede;
- "Cyclist."—A person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle;
- "Person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate;
- "Masculine" shall include the feminine;
- "Permission of the Board."—The consent of the Board given in writing;
- "Jetty."—Any jetty under the control of the Board;
- "Vehicle."—Any cart, dray, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, or other conveyance (not being a hand-cart) with or without springs.

APPOINTMENTS.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board

DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

To attend all Board meetings.

To attend committees when considered necessary.

To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports of committees.

To conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.

To answer all questions on the Board's business.

To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheets prepared and printed yearly.

To supervise the preparation of the rate books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also, to attend all courts of revision or appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.

To summon the members to Board and committee meetings.

The secretary shall keep the cash-book, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board; the said books shall be kept written up every fortnight ready for the inspection of the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.

He shall check all accounts sent into the Board and see that all accounts for works (exceeding Five pounds in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that, with all returns made, the heels of the receipt books accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; he shall report to the Board at their next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.

He shall pay into the bank, within forty-eight hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.

He shall have the eash book and bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board; and shall produce them at each meeting thereof; should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time during office hours the secretary shall produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the secretary. The secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

At each meeting of the Board an approximate balance sheet shall be produced showing as nearly as possible the financial position of the Board as regards payments already made, its present assets and liabilities, which latter shall specify and include moneys voted for special purposes which have not yet been undertaken or contracted for, and no further expenditure of any nature shall be incurred unless this balance sheet shall be then produced.

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

Notice of Meetings.

Notice shall be given by the chairman or secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least seven days before such meeting and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days. The chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be) shall preside.

Meetings

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the chairman and any three members of the Board to exclude the public when in their opinion it is expedient to do so, provided the business before the Board warrants such action being taken.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time and in the manner prescribed by the 9th section of the Act, but the chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at an ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present, and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called.

At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less then a quorum present, such circumstance, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

Order of Business.

The ordinary business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say :— $\,$

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meetings, if any;
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes;
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto;
- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment;
- (e.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and committee reports, and consideration thereof;
- (f.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts;
- (g.) Ordinary business of the Board.

No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of any clerical error.

Immediately after confirmation of the minutes the chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

Voting.

Each member including the chairman shall have one vote, and such chairman shall in case of eqality of votes have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

Minutes of Meeting.

In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by the 10th Section of the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which all items of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there noted by the secretary, and subsequently entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book.

Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matters of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

Speaker must not Digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments.

A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by the consent of the Board.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.

 Λ motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover nor put by the chairman.

In submitting a motion or amendment, the chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with

APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES.

The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee shall comprise two members.

FINANCE ACCOUNTS.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the chairman at the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be so initialled by him and paid by cheque.

An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by Government) shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the chairman and countersigned by another member of the Board or by the secretary.

All moneys shall, within two days after they have come into the hands of the Board or of any officers, servants, or clerks, for the use of the Board, be paid into such bank.

Money granted by Government shall be paid to Board's credit at the Treasury, and shall only be operated upon to pay actual creditors for work executed on the specific object for which the money was granted.

URGENT WORK.

The chairman with one member may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5, but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

Unauthorised Expenditure.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

Offences, Omissions or Neglects.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

- (1.) Riding or driving horses, cattle or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage upon or along any footway.
- (2.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel surface drain, or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (3.) Burning any shavings or other materials or matter in any footway, carriage road, or open or public place, or any private place, to the annoyance of the public.
- (4.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (5.) Allowing the dripping of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway.
- (6.) Flacing any advertisement board, placard, or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof, or if on property under the control of the Board, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (7.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (8.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance, by offensive smell or otherwise, is caused.
- (9.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, football, catapult, air gun or fire arm, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footway or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footway or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.

- (10.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person or property.
- (11.) Having any awning, verandah or blinds on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being of the full width of 10ft., and 8ft. clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning, verandah, or blinds, over the footway; or erecting any sign-board, sign awning, blind, overhanging lamp, or other thing over or near any footway or road, without first having obtained the permission of the Board.
- (12.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber, in or near any public place, without permission of the Board and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (13.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (14.) Making a cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (15.) Any carter plying for hire without a license.

GENERAL REGULATION OF TRAFFIC.

Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

No person between sunset and the following sunrise shall, in, upon, or along any of the public roads or streets within the district, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on the off side of the front of such vehicle.

No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road or street at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour.

The driver of every vehicle or the rider of every horse or other animal turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction or turning the corner of any road in the district shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

No person having the care or control of any horse or other animal or of any vehicle shall allow the same to remain in any road or street of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road or street for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the same. Provided that where suitable bridle posts are available a horse may be securely fastened thereto for any time not exceeding half an hour, and that immediately upon the request of any officer of the Board or police constable such horse shall be removed.

STALL LICENSES.

No person shall keep, manage or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise, unless such person be licensed by the Board.

Licenses for stalls shall be in the Form A in the Schedule.

No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license or between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.

The following fees shall be paid for licenses for stalls, and shall be paid in advance on the first Monday in every month, and if payment be not made when due the license shall be void:—

For every stall, 20s. per month.

Every licensed stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the traffic inspector or other authorised officer of the Board.

No person to whom a stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself.

CYCLES.

Every cyclist within the district shall observe the rules of the road laid down for vehicular traffic.

No cyclist shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footway within the district.

No cyclist shall between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached to such cycle a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, which lamp shall at all times be kept lighted.

Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot, or on horseback, or any vehicle is being approached or passed.

No person shall leave any cycles in or on any road, street or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested by any constable or officer of the Board.

No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.

When a cyclist meets or overtakes any horse or other animal and such horse or animal becomes restless or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount and shall remain dismounted as long as may be necessary to avoid accident.

No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads or streets in the district, or across the intersection of any road or street at a pace exceeding three miles an hour.

TO PREVENT DESTRUCTIONS ON THE FOOTWAY OF THE STREETS.

No person without having first obtained the permission of the Board shall allow any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, ware, merchandise or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street, footway or jetty (under the control of the Board) within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing same.

No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, read, footway, jetty or public reserve within the district, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.

Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any street, road footway, jetty or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise during the time such rubbish or materials shall remain and continue so deposited.

TO PREVENT DAMAGES TO FOOTWAYS AND OTHER BOARD PROPERTY.

No person, without having first obtained the permission of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footway, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, kerbing, gate, fence, post, lantern, lump-post, implements, materials, buildings or other properties of the said Board, or under the control thereof.

PRESERVATION OF TREES, &c.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant standing in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty of not more than £10.

THROWING DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES ON FOOTWAYS.

Any person who shall throw vegetable substances or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substance upon any footway within the District shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing or causing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without having first obtained the consent of the said Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the costs and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal, or earthenware, to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby.

TO PREVENT RUBBISH BEING DEPOSITED ON THE FORESHORE OR IN THE RIVER.

No person shall deposit any bottles, broken glass, crockery, empty tins, rubbish, or offensive matter, solid or liquid, on the foreshore or in the river within the boundaries of the District.

Park Lands, Reserves, and Recreation Grounds.

All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the District, for holding public sports or amusements to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.

No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park land or recreation ground without the written permission of the Board.

All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves, shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation ground, or reserve without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.

No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

QUARRIES AND TIMBER.

Any person who shall quarry or remove stone or other materials on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

BATHING.

The Board shall have power of authorising or sanctioning the erection of bathing-houses, sheds, or machines, and all rules and regulations appertaining to the same shall be submitted to the Board for their approval or otherwise before such authority or sanction is given.

All bathers shall have the body clothed from the waist to the thighs with bathing trunks.

Any person or persons contravening any of the provisions of this By-law shall on conviction thereof forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5; and it shall be lawful for any constable or officer of the Board, without warrant, to arrest any person so offending, and to carry him before any Justice of the Peace to be dealt with according to law.

Any person wilfully exposing himself when undressing for the purpose of bathing, or before dressing after having bathed, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

BARBED WIRE FENCES.

No person shall erect a fence of barbed wire abutting on any public street within the district.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 5.$

CONSTRUCTION OF FOOTWAYS, CROSSING PLACES.

It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any street or public way requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footway, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the consent of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse shall ride, or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any bicycle, velocipede, or tricycle upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon and by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum, not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the footway, kerbing or channel, as the Justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

Lamps, Posts, &c.

No lamp-post, bridle post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole, or flag staff, shall be erected by any person in any street without the written consent of the Board, and shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted once at least in every three years, as may be directed by the Board; and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

PRESCRIBING THE REMOVAL OF VERANDARS AND BALCONIES, &C., AT EXPENSE OF OWNER OR OCCUPIER.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board; and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction shall pay a sum not exceeding £10.

Encroachments or Obstructions to be Removed.

On the order of the Board the secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall be not more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed herein.

JETTIES, &c.

- 1. All jetties, wharves, piers, and landing places of the Swan River, constructed out of the funds of the Board, shall henceforth be under the control of the Board.
- 2. No person shall land at, use, or enter upon any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place, except in accordance with these regulations.
- 3. No vessel or boat (except small rowing boats) shall come alongside or remain fastened to any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place unless in charge of a competent person, and all passenger steamers also shall carry a duly certificated engineer.
- 4. No vessel or boat shall be moored or made fast to any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place, or any part thereof except to such mooring piles, ring bolts or other fastenings as are or may be provided, and no vessel shall be alongside any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place unless so fastened.
- 5. No vessel or boat loading or discharging cargo shall come alongside any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place until the cargo is ready to be loaded, or vehicles are ready to receive delivery in the case of a vessel discharging, and no vessel or boat shall occupy a berth at any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place while waiting to load or discharge cargo, but only when actually occupied in loading or discharging, and between sunrise and sunset, and on week days, except by the written permission of a duly authorised officer of the Board.
- 6. No vessel or boat shall be fastened to or remain alongside any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place longer than is necessary, and shall immediately be removed therefrom on the master or person in charge of such vessel receiving orders to that effect from the Board or officer duly authorised by the Board.
- 7. All cargo or other material must be removed from any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place within 24 hours of the time it is deposited there, or immediately upon the receipt of notice from the Board or officer appointed by the Board.

- 8. Any cargo remaining on any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place over night must remain at the owner's risk for any damage done by or thereto.
- 9. In the event of any person or persons refusing or neglecting to remove any cargo or other material from any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place when required so to do by the Board or its representative, such cargo or material may be ordered to be removed, and the cost of removal shall be borne by the party or parties responsible, who shall, in addition to such cost, be liable to the penalty prescribed for breach of these regulations.
- 10. The owner or owners of every vessel shall be personally liable for all damage to any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place, done or occasioned by any person employed in such vessel, or in the loading or discharging thereof, also for any penalties incurred by the master or crew or person employed on or in connection with such vessel, and any repairs rendered necessary may be executed by the Board, and the cost of such repairs shall be paid by the owner or owners liable for such damage within seven days after demand, and may be recovered by the Board summarily or otherwise, and any default in payment shall render such owner or owners liable to the penalty provided for contravention of these regulations.
- 11. In case of two steamships approaching the same jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place at the same time from opposite directions, the steamship bound down the river shall give way to the steamer bound up the river.
- 12. In case of two steamers approaching the same jetty, or landing place at the same time, in the same direction, the steamship on the outer course shall give way to the steamship on the inner course.
- 13. Steamships landing or shipping passengers at any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place shall provide suitable gangways of not less than 2ft. 6in. in width, having a handrail on both sides, and after sunset these gangways shall be sufficiently lighted.
- 14. No vessel or boat, except small rowing boats, shall approach any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place after sunset without burning the lights usually used by steamers or sailing vessels when under way.
- 15. No raft shall be moored within 100 yards of any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place over night, nor shall any raft be moored in the fairway by day or by night, and any raft moored over night shall burn two bright lights from sunset to sunrise, one at each end, and fixed at least 8ft. above water level.
- 16. No vessel or boat, except small rowing boats or boats under $2\frac{1}{2}$ tons displacement, shall moor or anchor, within 500ft of any jetty, wharf, pier, landing place, beacon, or fairway without burning a riding light from sunset to sunrise.
- 17. No person shall bathe within 500ft. of any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place after 7 a.m. or before 8 p.m., nor without suitable bathing costume or clothing.
- 18. No fishing nets shall be hung on nor spread about any part of any jetty, wharf, pier, landing place, or beacon.
- $19.\;$ No bullock team shall be allowed on any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier, or landing place.
- 20. No person or persons shall remove, damage, or destroy any life-buoy on any jetty, wharf, pier, landing place, or beacon, or use the same for any purpose other than saving life.
- 21. No explosives, as defined by Section 4 of the statute 59 Vict. No. 38, shall be landed or discharged on any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier, or landing place without the permission of the Board or officer duly authorised by the Board.
- 22. No stones, rubbish, ashes, or any other substance shall be thrown into any part of the river or discharged upon any jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier, or landing place, except at such places, if any, as may be defined for such purpose.
- 23. No advertisement, notice, or placard shall be exhibited upon any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier, beacon, or landing place without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- 24. No person shall, under any pretext whatever, light, place or keep a fire upon, or so near as to endanger, any jetty, pier, wharf, culvert or other work of the like nature, being public property under the control of the Board, constructed wholly or partially of wood, and any person so offending shall, upon conviction of every such offence, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £10.

- 25. All cargo carted or conveyed on to any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place, shall be carefully removed from the vehicles carrying the same into the vessel receiving the same, and shall in no case be thrown from such vessel on to the jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place; provided that this regulation shall not apply to sand, stone, gravel, soil or manure, which is carefully loaded on any such jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place by special permission of the Board.
- 26. When any goods, merchandise, or plant of any description are placed on any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place for shipment or ex-ship, the removal of the same shall proceed concurrently with the delivery on such jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place.
- 27. No person or persons shall in any way whatsoever make use of any jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier or landing place under construction or before the same shall have been opened to the public.
- 28. No person or persons shall obstruct any officer of the Board in carrying out the repairs, construction, or additions to any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place.
- 29. The Board may at any time temporarily or permanently close any jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier or landing place for repairs, alterations, additions, inclemency of weather, or for any other cause whatever, by posting a notice on same to that effect, or otherwise publicly declaring such jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier or landing places to be closed.
- 30. No drains for other than storm waters shall be led into the river without the written consent of the Board, and any existing drains shall be removed within three months from date of publication of these regulations, unless the permission to retain same shall be obtained from the Board in the meantime.
- 31. No person or persons shall remove or cause to be removed from any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier, or landing place, or the approaches thereto, any gravel, stone, timber, trees, shrubs, grasses, or other material without the written permission of the Board or officer duly authorised by the
- 32. No jetty, wharf, pier or landing place shall be deemed open for public use until notice thereof shall have been published in the *Government Gazette*.
- 33. No person or persons shall erect any bench, shear legs, crane, stocks, or other plant whatever, or in any way obstruct any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.

PENALTIES.

- 34. Where any person or persons by the foregoing By-laws, or any of them, are required to do or perform any act or thing, and any such act or thing remains undone, the Board may cause the same to be performed, and charge the cost and expenses against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.
- 35. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these By-laws shall, on conviction for every offence, breach, or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except when otherwise provided) the sum of £20.
- 36. Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the costs and expenses against such persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.
- 37. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable, when not otherwise provided for, to a fine or penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

PENALTIES TO BE PAID TO THE BOARD.

- 38. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the District, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

Regulation under "The Fishery Act, 1889."

Department of Lands and Surveys, 12.05.2 Perth, 7th March, 1898.

W HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- 1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea, within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- 2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.
- "And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine during a period of two (2) years from the date of publication hereof, in any part of the waters of the Vasse and Wonnerup estuaries, and that portion of the sea into which those estuaries immediately discharge, within the limits hereunder described and coloured red on plan on exhibit at the Court House, Busselton:—

Bounded on the North by a West line extending from the Northern end of the Dead water; on the South-East by the shore of Geographe Bay; on the West by the continuation North of the West boundary of Wonnerup Townsite.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

Act, Section 38.

89. If any person, being the applicant for or holder of a gold mining lease, or the holder of a miner's right or business license, desires to object to the issue of a lease to the applicant therefor, he shall, within thirty days after the application to lease has been lodged with the Mining Registrar, lodge with the said Registrar, and also serve such applicant with a notice, in the form of Schedule 28, of every objection intended to be taken by him against the issue of such lease. Such notice shall be sufficiently served if transmitted by post to the address of the said applicant, or posted on the datum point of the land applied to lease; provided always, that the Warden may order that personal service shall be effected. When any objections shall have been lodged within the prescribed time, the Warden shall fix a day for the hearing of such objections in the Warden's Court, and shall take evidence on oath, which shall be signed by the person giving it. Such evidence shall immediately be forwarded to the Minister by the Warden, accompanied by his recommendation as to whether the application should be granted or refused; but no application for a lease

shall be recommended by the Warden until after the time for lodging objections has expired, and every recommendation shall be made subject to the due compliance with regulations as to survey, and to all such alterations in boundaries or otherwise which on receipt of the surveyor's plan and report may appear to be necessary.

REGULATION 43.

All ground held under a Mineral Lease, except in the case of a lease granted for Coal mining, shall be worked in accordance with Clause 55 of these Regulations by not less than one man for every ten acres or fraction of ten acres, unless exemption from work has been granted; Provided nevertheless, that the labour to be employed on any area held under lease or an application for a lease, which has not before been either wholly or in part the subject of an application for a lease by any person, for the first twelve months after the date upon which the approval of the Governor shall have been notified in the Government Gazette, may be two men for every fifty acres or fraction of fifty acres.

In the case of a lease granted for Coal mining the ground shall be worked after the expiration of six months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every sixty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of twelve months from date of approval by not less than one man for every thirty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease, and after the expiration of eighteen months from the date of approval by not less than one man for every twenty acres or fraction thereof comprised in the lease; subject, however, to any exemption which may have been granted at any time.
