**W**HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the THIRD SESSION OF THE THIRD PARLIAMENT OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1896," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 16th day of June next, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.; the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, St. George's Terrace, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Hay Street, in the CITY OF PERTH, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

**W**HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895,"  
the Governor is empowered, by Order in  
Council to be published in the *Government Gazette*,  
from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such  
regulations under this Act as may be deemed ex-  
pedient for the purpose of subjecting any stock to  
such restrictions or remedial measures as may be  
deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or  
spread of disease: **AND WHEREAS** there is a danger  
of the cattle tick (*Ixodes Bovis*) being introduced  
and spread throughout the clean districts of the  
Colony by vessels engaged in the live stock trade  
between East Kimberley and foreign ports if  
permitted without restriction to trade with live  
stock between the clean ports of the Colony: **NOW,**  
**THEREFORE,** His Excellency the Governor of the  
said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive  
Council, prohibit vessels engaged in the cattle trade  
between Wyndham and foreign ports from trading  
with live stock between the clean ports of the Colony  
of Western Australia until such vessels have been  
disinfected and shall have not carried stock for three  
months.

## CIRCULAR.

SIR, Downing Street,  
15th March, 1898.

With reference to my Circular despatch of the 15th December last, enclosing a Parliamentary Paper containing an Additional Act signed at Paris on the 4th May, 1896, modifying certain Articles of the Convention concerning the creation of an International Union for the protection of Literary and Artistic Works signed at Berne on the 9th September, 1886, I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the Colony under your government, copies of an Order of Her Majesty in Council, dated 7th March, 1898, for giving effect to the Additional Act of Paris above referred to.

WHEREAS on the 9th day of September, 1886, a Convention (hereinafter called the Berne Convention) with respect to the protection to be given by way of copyright to the authors of literary and artistic works was concluded between Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the foreign countries following, that is to say :—

Belgium,	Hayti,	Switzerland,
France,	Italy,	and
Germany,	Spain,	Tunis.

And whereas on the 5th day of September, 1887, the ratifications of the said Convention were duly exchanged between Her Majesty the Queen and the aforesaid countries :

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 28th day of November, 1887, and made under the authority committed to Her Majesty by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, Her Majesty was pleased to make provision for giving rights of copyright throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the authors of literary and artistic works first produced in any of the said foreign countries (therein referred to as the foreign countries of the Copyright Union), and otherwise giving effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions to the terms of the said Berne Convention, and an English translation of the said Convention was set out in the First Schedule to the Order in Council now in recital :

And whereas since the date of the said Order in Council hereinbefore recited, the foreign countries following, namely, Luxembourg, Monaco, Montenegro, and Norway have acceded to the said Berne Convention, and by Orders in Council dated respectively the 10th day of August, 1888, the 15th day of October, 1889, the 16th day of May, 1893, and the 1st day of August, 1896, and made under the authority aforesaid, the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, have been extended to the last-mentioned foreign countries, respectively, and the last-mentioned foreign countries, together with the foreign countries comprised in the said Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, now constitute the foreign countries of the Copyright Union within the meaning of the said Order in Council :

And whereas an additional Act to the said Berne Convention, of which additional Act an English translation is set out in the Schedule to this Order, has been agreed upon between Her Majesty and the foreign countries next hereinafter mentioned for the purpose of varying the provisions of the hereinbefore recited Convention of the 9th day of September, 1886 :

And whereas on the 9th day of September, 1897, the ratifications of the said additional Act were exchanged between Her Majesty and the foreign countries following, that is to say :—

Germany,	Italy,	Switzerland,
Belgium,	Luxembourg,	and
Spain,	Monaco,	Tunis.
France,	Montenegro,	

And whereas Her Majesty in Council is satisfied that the foreign countries named in the body of this Order, and parties to the said additional Act, have made such provisions as it appears to Her Majesty expedient to require for the protection of authors of works first produced in Her Majesty's dominions.

Now, THEREFORE, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority committed to Her by the International Copyright Acts, 1844 to 1886, doth order, and it is hereby ordered as follows :—

1. The additional Act to the Berne Convention set forth in the Schedule to this Order shall, as from the commencement of this Order, have full effect throughout Her Majesty's dominions, and all persons are enjoined to observe the same.

2. This Order shall extend to the foreign countries following, that is to say :—

Germany,	Italy,	Switzerland,
Belgium,	Luxembourg,	and
Spain,	Monaco,	Tunis.
France,	Montenegro,	

3. The fourth Article of the hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to apply to the foreign countries to which this Order extends.

4. The hereinbefore recited Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, shall continue to be of full force and effect, save in so far as the same is varied by this Order.

5. Nothing contained in this Order shall prejudicially affect any right acquired or accrued before the commencement of this Order, by virtue of the said Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1887, or otherwise, and any person entitled to such right shall continue entitled thereto, and to the remedies for the same in like manner, as if this Order had not been made.

6. The author of any literary or artistic work first produced before the commencement of this Order shall have the rights and remedies to which he is entitled under section 6 of the International Copyright Act, 1886.

7. This Order shall be construed as if it formed part of the International Copyright Act, 1886.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the date hereof, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

And the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders herein accordingly.

## SCHEDULE.

## ADDITIONAL ACT.

The following is an English translation of the Additional Act with the omission of the formal beginning and end :—

## Article I.

The International Convention of the 9th September, 1886, is modified as follows :—

1. Article II.—The first paragraph of Article II. shall run as follows :—

“ Authors belonging to any one of the countries of the Union, or their lawful representatives, shall enjoy in the other countries for their works, whether unpublished, or published for the first time in one of those countries, the rights which the respective laws do now or shall hereafter grant to nationals.”

A fifth paragraph is added in these terms :—

“ Posthumous works are included among those to be protected.”

2. Article III.—Article III. shall run as follows :—

“ Authors not belonging to one of the countries of the Union, who shall have published or caused to be published for the first time their literary or artistic works in a country which is a party to the Union, shall enjoy, in respect of such works, the protection accorded by the Berne Convention, and by the present Additional Act.”

3. Article V.—The first paragraph of Article V. shall run as follows :—

“ Authors belonging to any one of the countries of the Union, or their lawful representatives, shall enjoy in the other countries the exclusive right of making or authorising the translation of their works during the entire period of their right over the original work. Nevertheless, the exclusive right of translation shall cease to exist if the author shall not have availed himself of it, during a period of ten years from the date of the first publication of the original work, by publishing or causing to be published in one of the countries of the Union, a translation in the language for which protection is to be claimed.”

4. Article VII.—Article VII. shall run as follows :—

“ Serial stories, including tales, published in the newspapers or periodicals of one of the countries of the Union, may not be reproduced, in original or translation, in the other countries, without the sanction of the authors, or of their lawful representatives.

“ This stipulation shall apply equally to other articles in news papers or periodicals, when the authors or editors shall have expressly declared in the newspaper or periodical itself in which they shall have been published that the right of reproduction is prohibited. In the case of periodicals it shall suffice if such prohibition be indicated in general terms at the beginning of each number.

“ In the absence of prohibition, such articles may be reproduced on condition that the source is acknowledged.

“ In any case, the prohibition shall not apply to articles on political questions, to the news of the day, or to miscellaneous information.”

5. Article XII.—Article XII. shall run as follows :—

“ Pirated works may be seized by the competent authorities of the countries of the Union where the original work is entitled to legal protection.

“ The seizure shall take place conformably to the domestic law of each State.”

6. Article XX.—The second paragraph of Article XX shall run as follows :—

“ Such denunciation shall be made to the Government of the Swiss Confederation. It shall only be effective as regards the country making it, the Convention remaining in full force and effect for the other countries of the Union.”

## Article II.

The final Protocol annexed to the Convention of the 9th September, 1886, is modified as follows :—

1. No. I.—This clause shall run as follows :—

“ As regards Article IV., it is agreed as follows :

“ (A.) In countries of the Union where protection is accorded not only to architectural plans, but also to the architectural works themselves, these works will be admitted to the benefits of the Berne Convention and of the present Additional Act.

“ (B.) Photographic works and works produced by an analogous process shall be admitted to the benefits of these engagements in so far as the laws of each State may permit, and to the extent of the protection accorded by such laws to similar national works.

"It is understood that an authorised photograph of a work of art shall enjoy legal protection in all the countries of the Union, as contemplated by the Berne Convention and by the present Additional Act, for the same period as the principal right of reproduction of the work itself subsists, and within the limits of private arrangements between those who have legal rights."

2. No. 4.—This clause shall run as follows:—

"The common agreement contemplated in Article XIV. of the Convention is established as follows:—

"The application of the Berne Convention and of the present Additional Act to works which have not fallen into the public domain within the country of origin at the time when those engagements come into force, shall operate according to such stipulations on this head as may be contained in special Conventions either actually existing or to be concluded hereafter.

"In the absence of such stipulations between any of the countries of the Union, the respective countries shall regulate, each for itself, by its domestic legislation, the manner in which the principle contained in Article XIV. is to be applied.

"The stipulations of Article XIV. of the Berne Convention and of the present clause of the Final Protocol shall apply equally to the exclusive right of translation, in so far as such right is established by the present Additional Act."

"The temporary stipulations noted above shall be applicable to countries which may hereafter accede to the Union."

#### Article III.

The countries to the Union which are not parties to the present Additional Act, shall at any time be allowed to accede thereto on their request to that effect. The stipulation shall apply equally to countries which may hereafter accede to the Convention of the 9th September, 1886. It will suffice for this purpose that such accession should be notified in writing to the Swiss Federal Council, who shall in turn communicate it to the other Governments.

#### Article IV.

The present Additional Act shall have the same force and duration as the Convention of the 9th September, 1886.

It shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Paris, in the manner adopted in the case of that Convention, as soon as possible, and within the space of one year at the latest.

It shall come into force as regards those countries which shall have ratified it three months after such exchange of ratifications.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following amended Rules made by the Medical Board under the provisions of "The Medical Act, 1894."

#### INTERPRETATION.

In the construction of these rules Section three of the Act shall apply.

#### MEETINGS.

1. Monthly meetings of the Board shall be held on the first Wednesday in each month, at 3.30 p.m.; and special meetings shall be held at such times as the president or any two members of the Board may require.

Any monthly meeting of the Board may be postponed to and held at such hour and place as the Board may by resolution direct.

2. Special meetings shall be convened by the Registrar, at the request of the president or any two members of the Board, by posting or delivering to each member 48 hours' written notice stating the time and place of such meeting.

The omission to post or deliver any such notice, or the non-receipt thereof, shall in no manner affect or prejudice anything done or agreed to at any such meeting.

3. If a quorum of members be not present within fifteen minutes of the time appointed, the meeting may be adjourned to such time and place as those present shall determine.

4. At all meetings voting shall be by a show of hands, unless a ballot is called for by any member present.

5. No resolution passed, or any act, matter, or thing done or authorised by or at any meeting shall be rescinded, amended, cancelled, or revoked at any subsequent meeting; unless prior notice of such intended rescission, amendment, cancellation or revocation has been given in the notices convening the meeting.

6. Minutes of every meeting shall be kept by the Registrar, and shall, when signed by the president or chairman of the same or any subsequent meeting, be binding and conclusive for all purposes.

#### REGISTRATION.

7. Every applicant for registration as a medical practitioner shall, at least five clear days before the then ordinary monthly meeting of the Board, lodge with the Registrar—

- (1.) All diplomas by virtue of which he claims to be registered;
- (2.) A declaration in the Form A in the Schedule; and
- (3.) The sum of ten guineas.

8. Every applicant for registration shall attend in person before the Board at any or every meeting when his application is being considered, and at such other meetings as the Board may require, and answer all such questions as may be put to him, and shall also supply in writing all such information and evidence as the Board may from time to time require.

The Board may require any applicant to answer questions, or supply information or evidence on any matter, either verbally or in writing, under oath or affirmation or otherwise.

9. Every person applying to have his name restored to the register, under Section 10, Sub-section (4) of the Act, shall supply such written or verbal explanation as the Board may require, and pay a fee not exceeding two guineas.

10. Every person applying, under Section 14 of the Act, to have a higher degree of qualification registered, shall supply such evidence of such higher degree or qualification as the Board may require, and pay a fee of five shillings.

#### REGISTER.

11. The register shall be kept by the Registrar in the manner and form contained in Schedule B hereto.

12. Any person may, on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. inspect the register at any time between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m., at the office, or (if there be no office) at the residence of the Registrar.

#### COMPLAINTS.

13. The name of any medical practitioner who is convicted of any felony or misdemeanour, under section 12 of the Act, shall be erased from the register on proof to the Board, by production of a certified copy of the conviction, or of an affidavit, or declaration or certificate from any officer of the court or tribunal before which such medical practitioner was so convicted.

14. The name of every medical practitioner convicted of any offence other than felony or misdemeanour as aforesaid, and which in the opinion of the Board renders him unfit to practise, shall be erased from the register, unless such medical practitioner shall personally show cause to the contrary to the satisfaction of the Board.

15. Every medical practitioner charged by the Board of infamous conduct in a professional respect shall have served upon him personally, or posted to him to his address in the register, or if there be no such address to his last known address in Western Australia, notice of the nature of the charge and of a date (not being less than 14 days from such service or posting) when such charge will be heard by the Board and considered.

The president may, upon the application of any medical practitioner so charged, extend the time for hearing such charge.

16. At the meeting of the Board at which such charge is heard, the same may thereupon be dealt with forthwith, or the Board may from time to time adjourn the hearing to such dates and hours and places as to it may seem meet.

17. Every medical practitioner so charged may apply to the Registrar to issue a summons for the attendance or production of any person or documents whom or which it may be desired to call or produce. Such summons shall be in one of the Forms C and D in the Schedule.

**Regulations for the Control and Management  
of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.**

**H**IS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, 13th December, 1893, and 19th June, 1896, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof:—

1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of £4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.

2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days from date thereof it shall be lawful for the Inspector to cancel such license. Provided that, in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block irrespective of the area.

3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.

4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.

5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.

6. No person shall destroy or preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.

7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.

8. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.

9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.

10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so-called "Pick-up banks."

11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand, or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.

12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year; the exact dates to be named in such notice.

13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.

14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.

15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.

16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.

17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

The Inspector may seize and remove any shell so obtained, and any other shell that may be found in possession of any person who may be found collecting shell by dredging or otherwise from any Government Reserve, and any person so found shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.

19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed two square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of £1.

In all applications for exclusive licenses, the length of the licensed area shall not exceed twice its width.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas.

21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may, in open Court, refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.

22. All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a *bonâ fide* manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting, and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.

23. The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.

24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.

25. It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be final.

#### PENALTIES.

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

#### Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony that have formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.

2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within two years, by eight equal instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.

3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within one year from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.

Alteration of Regulations.

Education Department,  
Perth, May 6th, 1898.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by Section 22 of "The Elementary Education Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1893," has been pleased to cancel Regulations 204 and 205, approved in Executive Council on the 16th day of February, 1898, and to substitute therefor the following Regulations:—

Regulation 204.

District Boards are expected to use every endeavour to induce parents to send their children regularly to school before proceedings are taken against the parents under the Compulsory Clauses of the Act.

Regulation 205.

After an order has been made by the Governor under the Compulsory Clauses of the Act, a Compulsory Officer may be appointed to carry out the provisions of the same. This Officer shall act under the direction of the Department, but he must at once report to the District Board all cases recommended for prosecution, so that they may, if they wish, advise the Department. Any suggestions must be sent in promptly.

### BY-LAW No. 28.

**T**HE Local Board of Health for the Town of Leederville, in the Colony of Western Australia, by virtue of the powers contained in "The Health Act, 1886," and the Amending Acts thereof, and every other power enabling the said Local Board in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Acts and the Amending Acts into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board, doth hereby make the following By-laws of the said Local Board of Health, that is to say:—

1. In the construction of these By-laws the word "Person" shall include a Corporation. The "masculine" gender shall be deemed and taken to include "females," and the "singular" the "plural," and the "plural" the "singular." "Board" shall mean the "Local Board of Health for the Town of Leederville."

2. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall begin to occupy as a dairy or cowshed any building not previously so occupied, unless and until he first makes provision to the satisfaction of an officer of the Board for the lighting, ventilation, including air space and cleansing, drainage, and water supply of the same while occupied as a dairy or cowshed.

3. No person shall begin so to occupy any such building without first giving one month's notice, in writing, to the Board of his intention so to do.

4. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall occupy as a dairy or cowshed any building, whether so occupied previous to this By-law or not, if and as long as the lighting and the ventilation, including air space and the cleansing, drainage, and water supply thereof are not such as are necessary and proper—

- (a.) For the health and good condition of the cattle therein;
- (b.) For the cleanliness of milk vessels used therein for containing milk for sale;
- (c.) And for the protection of the milk therein against infection or contamination.

5. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall permit any watercloset, earth closet, privy, cesspool, or urinal to be within, communicate directly with, or ventilate into any dairy or any room used as a milk store or milk shop.

6. Every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman shall cause every milk store or milk shop in his occupation or under his management or control, and every milk vessel used by him for containing milk for sale, to be kept thoroughly clean. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily with washing soda and boiling water, and then washed with clean water.

7. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or being the occupier of a milk store or milk shop, shall keep in a proper state of repair all spouting, water pipes, and drains, and shall provide sufficient tanks to carry off all liquids, which shall be emptied daily.

8. It shall not be lawful for any person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, or purveyor of milk, to use a milk shop or milk store in his occupation, or permit or suffer the same to be used as a sleeping apartment, or for any purpose incompatible with the proper preservation of the cleanliness of a milk store or milk shop, and of the milk vessels and the milk therein, or in any manner likely to cause contamination of the milk therein.

9. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep any swine in any cowshed or other building used by him for keeping cows, or in any milk store or other place used by him for keeping milk for sale.

10. All cattle in dairies shall be inspected by a veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board at least once in every six months, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such veterinary surgeon or officer appointed by the Board as aforesaid.

11. All stables, cowyards, and cattlesheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, and all yards and enclosures connected therewith, shall be constructed of suitable materials, and paved or flagged with brick, stone pitchers, or flagging, or be completely floored or covered

with cement, asphalt, or other impervious material, and shall have such impervious drains and receptacles so that no liquid, offal, dung, or other filth, refuse, or drainage shall stagnate or lodge therein; and in connection with every such stable, cowyard, cattle shed, or enclosure there shall be provided a fit and sufficient box or bin for the reception of such dung or refuse arising in such stable, cowyard, or cattle shed, as the Health Officer shall decide. Every such stable, cowyard, cattleshed, and enclosure shall be swept and cleansed twice daily, and all manure, dung, or other refuse arising in or in connection therewith, if not removed immediately, shall be placed in such box or bin as aforesaid, and the said box shall be emptied and cleansed once at least in every week, and such box or bin as aforesaid shall be removed to a distance of at least ten yards from such stable or cattle shed. Every such stable or cattle shed shall, within the time given by any order to such effect from the Health Officer or Health Inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

12. Every person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, and every person having the management of any such trade, shall forthwith report, in writing, to the Secretary of the Board the occurrence of any disease in any of his milch cows, or of any contagious or infectious disease, including consumption, in man or animal upon the premises upon which such trade is carried on.

13. No person following the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, nor any person under his direction or control, whilst suffering from any infectious, or contagious disease, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, shall milk any cow or handle any vessel used for containing milk, nor in any way take part or assist in the conduct of the business of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or occupier of a milk store or milk shop as far as regards the extraction, distribution, or storage of the milk, until all danger of the communication of infection to the milk or of contamination thereof shall have ceased, and he shall have furnished a satisfactory medical certificate to the Health Officer that such danger no longer exists; and he shall not mix the milk of a diseased cow with other milk.

14. Any person carrying on the business of a baker shall have all the inside walls or rooms of such bakehouse, and all the ceilings or tops of such rooms, whether such walls, ceilings, or tops be plastered or not, and all the passages and outplaces of such bakehouse either painted with oil or varnished or washed with lime or some other wash material or liquid approved of by the Health Officer, or be partly painted or varnished and partly washed. Where painted with oil or varnished there shall be three coats of paint or varnish, and the paint or varnish shall be renewed as required, and shall be washed with hot water and soap once at least in every six months. Any person keeping a bakehouse in contravention of this By-law shall be deemed to be committing an offence.

15. No place on the same level with any bakehouse, and forming part of the same building, shall be used as a sleeping place, unless it is constructed as follows, that is to say:—

Unless such sleeping place is effectively separated from the bakehouse by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and unless there be an external glazed window of at least 9 superficial feet in area, of which at least  $4\frac{1}{2}$  superficial feet are made to open for ventilation.

16. Every person who shall commit a breach of these By-laws shall, for every such breach or neglect, be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £10 nor less than 5s., or to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
