By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now THEREFORE I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the Third Session of the Third Parliament of Western Australia, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1896," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 16th day of June next, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.; the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, St. George's Terrace, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Hay Street, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to make, vary, alter, or revoke such regulations under this Act as may be deemed expedient for the purpose of subjecting any stock to such restrictions or remedial measures as may be deemed necessary to prevent the introduction or spread of disease: And whereas there is a danger of the cattle tick (Ixodes Bovis) being introduced and spread throughout the clean districts of the Colony by vessels engaged in the live stock trade between East Kimberley and foreign ports if permitted without restriction to trade with live stock between the clean ports of the Colony: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony does, with the advice of the Executive Council, prohibit vessels engaged in the cattle trade between Wyndham and foreign ports from trading with live stock between the clean ports of the Colony of Western Australia until such vessels have been disinfected and shall have not carried stock for three months.

Regulations to allow the Bicycles of Visitors to Western Australia to be admitted Duty Free.

VISITORS will be allowed to introduce their secondhand Bicycles into Western Australia, temporarily for their own use, free of duty upon production of a certificate, as under—

(a.) In the event of their being residents of a customs port in the colony from whence they come, from the local Collector of Customs, to the following effect:—

(b) Should the visitor not reside at a customs port in the colony from whence he comes, a statutory declaration made before a Justice of the Peace, or other person authorised to take such declarations in such colony, to the same effect, will be accepted by this Department on arrival here.

Failing the production of one of the above-mentioned certificates, the visitor will be required to make the usual declaration, undertaking to export or pay duty on the machine within a specified time.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulation under section six of "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

Any person who, without the written authority of the Chief Inspector of Stock, carries, collects, keeps, or sends through the Post Office or otherwise, or is in any way knowingly concerned in the carriage, collection, keeping, or sending of any ticks or eggs of ticks shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds on conviction.

II IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

- 1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony that have formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.
- 2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within two years, by eight equal instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.
- 3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within one year from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.

Regulations for the Control and Management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.

- IS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, 13th December, 1893, and 19th June, 1896, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof:—
- 1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of £4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.
- 2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days from date thereof it shall be lawful for the Inspector to cancel such license. Provided that, in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block irrespective of the area.
- 3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.
- 4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.
- 5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.
- 6. No person shall destroy or preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.
- 7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.
- 8. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.
- 9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.
- 10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so-called "Pick-up banks."

- 11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand, or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.
- 12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year; the exact dates to be named in such notice.
- 13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.
- 14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.
- 15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.
- 16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.
- 17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

The Inspector may seize and remove any shell so obtained, and any other shell that may be found in possession of any person who may be found collecting shell by dredging or otherwise from any Government Reserve, and any person so found shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

- 18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.
- 19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed two square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of £1.

In all applications for exclusive licenses, the length of the licensed area shall not exceed twice its width.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas.

- 21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may, in open Court, refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.
- 22. All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a bonû fide manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting, and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.
- 23. The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.
- 24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.
- 25. It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be final.

PENALTIES.

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

Regulation under "The Fishery Act, 1889."

Department of Lands and Surveys, 12,032 Perth, 7th March, 1898.

W HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- 1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea, within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- 2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.
- "And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine during a period of two (2) years from the date of publication hereof, in any part of the waters of the Vasse and Wonnerup estuaries, and that portion of the sea into which those estuaries immediately discharge, within the limits hereunder described and coloured red on plan on exhibit at the Court House, Busselton:—

Bounded on the *North* by a West line extending from the Northern end of the Dead water; on the *South-East* by the shore of Geographe Bay; on the *West* by the continuation North of the West boundary of Wonnerup Townsite.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

The notice published in the Government Gazette of the 28th January, 1898, and dated 25th January, 1898, is hereby cancelled.

- 1. Application for leases of the natural surface of any lots within the prescribed area to a depth of 20ft. may be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands. through the Warden, by any male person above the age of 18 years, upon the following terms:—
- 2. The application shall be in the form prescribed, and shall be lodged with the Warden, and shall set forth the number, area, and position of the lot applied for.
- 3. The rent payable in respect of each lot shall be £1 per annum, which shall, in the first instance, be lodged with the application, and subsequently paid annually on the first day of March, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 101 of the Land Regulations. When paying the annual rent the holder of each lot shall make a statutory declaration that the conditions of residence hereinafter set forth have been complied with or fulfilled. A fee of £1, in addition to the first year's rent, shall accompany each application.
- 4. The Warden shall forward the application, together with his recommendation thereon, to the Commissioner of Crown Lands immediately after receipt thereof, and he may thereupon deliver to the applicant an approval notice in the form hereinafter provided, and the production of such notice shall be sufficient evidence of the right of the holder thereof to occupy the lot therein mentioned under these regulations, pending the decision of the Commissioner of Crown Lands thereon. - 7. No person who shall have surrendered or forfeited a lot shall be eligible to select another lot within a mile of the lot originally held by him, until six months shall have elapsed from the date of surrender or forfeiture of such lot.

- 8. The Governor may at any time exempt from the operations of these regulations any portion or portions of any town or suburban lands so set apart, which may be required for mining or other purposes.
- 9. Any lot or lots or portions thereof that may have been granted as a residential lot may be resumed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, on the payment to the holder of such lot or lots the fair value of any improvements existing on such lots at the time of resumption, such value to be ascertained in the like manner as prescribed by Clause 6 hereof. PROPOSED BY-LAWS.

- 1. The Board shall meet for general business in the Working Men's Association Hall, immediately after the conclusion or the Council meeting, on the first Wednesday in each month, and special meetings may be called at any time by the Chairman or any two members of the Board; three, inclusive of the Chairman, to form a quorum.
- 2. All moneys shall be placed in the West Australian Bank, Busselton, to the credit of the Board, and none shall be drawn therefrom except by cheque, signed by the Chairman and one member, and countersigned by the Secretary.

DUTIES OF MEDICAL HEALTH OFFICER.

- It is the duty of the Officer of Health to superintend the application of all sanitary measures ordered by the Local Board, and to advise them generally in all such matters.
- 4. The Officer of Health shall make frequent examination of the district under his control, and see that the duties of the Inspector are efficiently performed, and report any neglect to the officer, and, if necessary, suspend him until such report and neglect have been considered by the Local Board.
- 5. He is, pursuant to the powers contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," to inspect premises that may be reported to him, or that he may have reason to believe are in a filthy or unwholesome condition and affecting health, and, if found so, to give a certificate in accordance with Section 60 of the Act. He is also required to examine premises where any process of manufacture causing effluvial is carried on, and, if necessary, furnish the Local Board with the required certificate in accordance with Section 57 with the required certificate, in accordance with Section 57. He is also to inspect and furnish a certificate, if necessary, of any houses built for habitation, or of any overcrowding, in accordance with Sections 66 and 67. He is also to assist the Board with his presence and advice, if necessary, in order to the carrying out of Section 31, referring to the sale of unwholesome food, and on all occasions to give them the benefit of his medical experience and skill.
- The Officer of Health is to report to the Local Board, with the least possible delay, any undue prevalence of disease in his district, whether generally or locally; and, in

- the latter case, it will be his duty to attract the attention of the Local Board to the locality, in order that remedial measures may be at once taken. He is also carefully to note the appearance in his district of any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, or any indications thereof, or any occurrence or circumstances affecting or likely to involve public health, and he shall immediately make a full report thereof to the Local Board, whose duty it will be investigated to former the the Central Board. in accordance with Section 35; and the Health Officer is expected energetically to assist in carrying out and enforcing the regulations of the Central Board for mitigating, as far as possible, and preventing and checking the spread of epidemic and other diseases, as detailed in Section 38.
- 7. The Officer of Health is to furnish the Local Board of his district, during the months of January and July in each year, with the report of the health, cleanliness, and general sanitary state of his district for that period, making any remarks and observations he may think proper.
- The Officer of Health shall, from time to time, issue to the Inspector such orders and instructions as the said Health Officer may deem necessary, and the Inspector being placed under the control of the Health Officer is required to report to him direct upon all matters or things appertaining to their respective duties and districts. Any special matter contained in any such reports necessary to be brought under the notice of the Local Board shall be forwarded to the Local Board in the usual manner.
- 9. The Officer of Health shall obey the orders of the Board.

HEALTH INSPECTOR.

- 10. The duties of the Health Inspector shall be to visit the town, and, if necessary, give advice to the occupiers of premises as to the prevention of nuisances and the deodorising of offensive matter; to keep a monthly record of all notices issued to abate nuisances and the result thereof, and to do such other things as the Board may require.
- On receiving notice of any nuisance existing in the municipality, or of the breach of any By-law, he shall, as early as possible, visit the spot and inquire into the alleged nuisance or breach of By-law.
- 12. He shall report to the Secretary any noxious or offensive business, trade, or manufacture, and the breach or non-observance of any By-law made in respect of the same.
- He shall, from time to time, and forthwith upon any complaint, visit and inspect the shops kept and used for the sale of butchers' meat, poultry, fruit, fish, corn, vegetables, bread, or flour, and in case any such article appears to him to be intended for the food of man, and to be unfit for such food, he shall immediately report the same to the Medical Health Officer.
- 14. He shall, at irregular periods, visit all yards and butchers' establishments and dairies, and shall forthwith report to the Medical Health Officer any case of private slaughtering contrary to law.
- 15. He shall give immediate notice to the Secretary of the occurrence of any contagious disease of a dangerous nature, and he shall attend to the instructions of the Medical Health Officer with respect to any measures which can be lawfully taken by him for the prevention of the spread of any such disease.
- $16. \ \, \text{He}$ shall immediately report to the Secretary any case of over-crowding in any house.
- He shall immediately communicate to the Medical Health Officer, whenever it appears to him that the intervention of that officer is necessary in consequence of the existence of any nuisance injurious to health.
- 18. The occupier of every house shall, after seven days' notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle which the Inspector may deem to be worn out or
- 19. Any person who shall lay, cast, or throw, or shall cause, permit, or suffer to be laid, cast or thrown, any bottles, broken glass, china, crockery, empty tins or other refuse or rubbish, in or upon any carriage way, footway, street, beach, reserve, or other public or private places within the district of the said Local Board, or otherwise than at the place appointed by such Local Board, shall, upon conviction thereof, before one or more Justices of the Peace for the district, forfeit and pay 5s. for each such offence. offence.

- 20. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horse or other beast of burden, or any cattle may be kept, shall provide, in connection with such building or premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of any such animal in such building or upon such premises.
- 21. He shall not allow such receptacle to overflow or become offensive.
- 22. He shall, once at least in every week, remove, or cause to be removed, from the receptacle provided in accordance with the requirements of this By-law all dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter, produced in or upon such building or premises and deposited in such receptacle.
- 23. The Inspector of the Board may at all times have free ingress upon or from any place appointed as a depôt to receive nightsoil, manure, offal, or other offensive matter, or upon any private property whatsoever, in carrying out the duties of his office. All places upon which any offensive matter whatever may be deposited shall be registered in a book kept for that purpose, and it shall be lawful for the Board to receive compensation from the owner of such place or places for such deposit, where on private property; and the money so received shall be applied by the Board in carrying out the Public Health Act and all amended Public Health Acts.

CLEANSING EARTH CLOSETS, ETC.

- 24. Pans for closets will be provided by the Board at a cost of 10s. per pair, and one lid at 2s. for same, to be paid for within seven days of delivery.
- 25. The double-pan system, covered when being removed, shall be adopted by this Board, and no other will be permitted.
- 26. The occupier of any premises shall, once at least in every month, at such times as the Inspector may appoint, permit to be cleansed every ashpit belonging to such premises, and used only as a receptacle for ashes, dust, and dry refuse.
- 27. Every closet shall be built in such a position that the same may be emptied without the contents being carried through any dwelling house, and every person building a closet contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s.
- 28. No closet shall be erected except in such position approved of by the Inspector of Health, or other officer appointed by the Board of Health; and any person being guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s.
- 29. The Local Board of Health shall have power to give notice (30 days) to all owners of property in this district to clean out, disinfect, and fill in all cesspits, and cause earth closets to be substituted in their place.
- 30. No scavenger or nightman shall remove any night-soil, or bring any nightcart or other conveyance within the limits of the municipality, except between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m. Anyone found infringing this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s.
- $31.\,$ No buckets or pans shall be used except those provided and authorised by the Board.
- 32. All work under this head shall be carried out by the authorised contractor to the Board, and by no other person.

STORAGE OF BONEDUST, MANURE, ETC.

33. Persons desirous of storing bonedust, animal manure, or other offensive matter, or lime, within the Municipality of Busselton, shall first make application to the Local Board for permission to do so.

KEEPING ANIMALS DEEMED A NUISANCE.

- 34. It shall not be lawful for any person to breed or keep any kind of living swine, or any goat, or camel anywhere within the district, save and except at such place or places as may be appointed by the Board.
- 35. No person shall keep within the Municipality any animal or animals whatsoever which shall be deemed a nuisance either to neighbours or the public, or which may be deemed injurious to health by the Medical Health Officer.

GENERAL DISPOSAL OF DEAD ANIMALS.

- 36. Whereas it frequently happens that cows, dogs, horses, bullocks, and other animals are drowned, poisoned, or otherwise killed or maimed, and thrown on the beach or other part of the municipality, and no provision made for the burial of the carcases, in consequence of which a nuisance, highly offensive and injurious to the health and comfort of the inhabitants is occasioned: Be it therefore enacted that any person so offending, and convicted before any one or more Justices of the Peace, shall pay all expenses attendant on the proper burial of any horse, cow, dog, bullock, or other animal, and shall, for every such carcase, pay a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s.
- 37. Any person burying any carcase within the municipality, without first giving notice to the Inspector of his his intention so to do, shall, on conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay, for every such carcase, a penalty not exceeding £2, and shall pay all expenses attending the re-burial of same, and any expenses therewith.
- 38. For every offence against the provision of these Bylaws, to which no penalty is herein attached, the offender shall, upon conviction before any one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 nor less than 5s.
