HEREAS under the provisions of "The Constitution Act, 1889," it is made lawful for the Governor of Western Australia for the time being to fix the place and time for holding the first and every other Session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly: Now Therefore I, Lieut. Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor of the said Colony, in exercise of the powers so vested in me, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do, by this my Proclamation, announce and proclaim that the Third Session of the Third Parliament of Western Australia, to be holden under the provisions of the said Act, "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Constitution Act Amendment Act, 1896," shall be holden for the despatch of business on Thursday, the 16th day of June next, at the hour of three of the clock, p.m.; the Session of the Legislative Council to be holden in the Legislative Council Chamber, St. George's Terrace, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Session of the Legislative Assembly to be holden in the Legislative Assembly Chamber, in Hay Street, in the City of Perth, in the said Colony; and the Members of the Legislative Council and the Members of the Legislative Assembly are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and places accordingly.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations in relation to persons brought into Western Australia for employment in the Pearl Shell Fisheries:—

G. F. ELIOT, Acting Under Secretary.

- 1. No person brought into the Colony for employment in the Pearl Shell Fisheries, shall land, or be permitted to land, except within a duly proclaimed port Northward of the 27th parallel of South latitude; and within two days of landing a written agreement for employment, in the form in Schedule "A" hereto, shall be entered into between the employer and the person employed before an Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries, or an Officer of Customs. The agreement shall be made in duplicate, one of which shall be retained by the Inspector or Officer of Customs, who shall indorse thereon a bond in the form in Schedule B hereto, which bond shall be duly executed by the employer.
- 2. Upon an agreement being entered into as aforesaid, particulars of the same shall be registered by an Inspector or an Officer of Customs in the form in Schedule C hereto, and a certificate shall be given to the person employed in the form in Schedule D hereto, which shall be renewed annually.
- 3. Every engagement shall be for the term stated in the agreement; but at the expiration of every term of service it shall be lawful for the person employed to re-engage himself to the same or another employer, provided that on every re-engagement an agreement shall be entered into and registered, and a certificate obtained, as herebefore provided in the case of an original engagement.
- 4. Forthwith, after entering into every agreement as aforesaid, the person employed shall be actually engaged in the fishery, and shall not land, or be permitted to land, or remain on shore during the engagement, except as hereinafter provided, that is to say:—
 - (a.) In case of sickness, or for other sufficient reason, in the discretion of an Inspector or an Officer of Customs, a person employed may, with permission in writing signed by an Inspector or Officer of Customs, go on shore within the limits of the port named in the permit, and there remain for a period limited by the permit.
 - (b.) A person employed may, at the expiration of his engagement, with the like permission go and remain on shore within the limits of the port for a period not exceeding three months.
 - (c.) With the like permission, an employer may employ labourers on shore, within the limits of the port, in the case of a vessel being laid up for the hurricane season or for repairs.
- 5. On the discharge of any person employed as aforesaid, the employer shall forthwith pay into the hands of an Officer of Customs the passage money of the person employed from the port of registration to Singapore, but in the event of the person employed

- duly entering into another lawful contract for employment within the Colony, instead of leaving the Colony, the said passage money shall be returned by the officer to the employer who shall have paid the same.
- 6. Any breach of these Regulations shall be deemed a contravention of the said Act within the meaning of section 17 thereof, and shall subject the person offending to a fine not exceeding £50, and to be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, until such fine is paid, or in addition to such fine, but not in any case for a period exceeding three months.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Broad Arrow.

Municipality of Broad Arrow.

Whereas by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, amend, or repeal By-laws. Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power given by the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Broad Arrow that the following shall form and be additional By-laws of the said Council:—

BY-LAW No. 29.

A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING OF CARTS AND VEHICLES UNDER "THE CART AND CARRIAGE LICENSING ACT, 1876."

All vehicles whether kept for hire or otherwise and used upon any road within the Municipality of Broad Arrow, shall be licensed under "The Cart and Carriage Licensing Act, 1876," and any person keeping any cart or carriage and failing to take out a license shall be guilty of an offence against the above-mentioned Act, and shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10, in addition to the full fee payable for any such license required to be taken out.

BY-LAW No. 30.

VEHICLES TO BE LICENSED.

1. From and after the passing of this By-Law no vehicle of any description whatever shall be permitted to ply for hire within the limits of the Municipality of Broad Arrow for the conveyance of goods or merchandise until the same shall have been duly licensed by the Town Clerk of the said Municipality by a license in the form in Schedule "A" hereto; and every owner of every vehicle who shall cause, allow, or permit the same to ply for hire in carrying goods or merchandise, without having first obtained such license, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding £5.

DRIVERS TO BE APPROVED BY TOWN CLERK.

2. No person shall ply for hire within the limits of the Municipality of Broad Arrow with any licensed vehicle for the conveyance of goods or merchandise until he shall have been approved of by the Town Clerk of the said Municipality as a fit and proper person to be a licensed driver, and shall have registered his christian and surname, and also his place of abode, in the office of the Town Clerk, and shall have received from the Town Clerk a Certificate of Approval in the form of the Schedule hereto marked "B."

Drivers not to be Changed without the Approval of the Town Clerk.

3. In the event of the owner of any vehicle licensed to convey goods or merchandise within the Municipality being desirous of changing the driver of such licensed vehicle, the owner thereof shall give notice to the Town Clerk of such proposed or intended change, and previous to any change shall produce to the Town Clerk the license for such vehicle, in order that the Licensing Officer may, upon approval, insert thereon the Christian and surname, and also the place of abode, of the person intended to be registered for the time being as the driver of such vehicle.

LICENSED VEHICLES AND HORSES, ETC., TO BE IN PROPER WORKING ORDER.

4. The owner of every vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise within the said Municipality shall at all times, when plying for hire, have and keep the same in good and serviceable order, and the harness in sufficient and proper condition, the driver competent, and the horse or horses attached or harnessed to such licensed vehicle fit and capable of performing any engagement that may be reasonably required.

JESTRUCTING OFFICERS.

5. No owner or driver of any vehicle, or any other person shall obstruct or hinder any officer of the Municipality or police constable in the execution of his duty.

NAME OF OWNER AND LICENSE NUMBER TO BE PAINTED ON VEHICLE.

6. Every vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise, and plying for hire within the town, shall have legibly painted in Roman letters of not less than one inch in length, and a proportionate breadth, upon the right or off side of such vehicle, the name of the owner thereof, and the number of the license, and shall keep the same at all times legible and conspicuous, and failing so to do shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Two Pounds.

DRIVER TO BE IN ATTENDANCE ON VEHICLE.

7. The driver of every vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall be, when plying for hire or under engagement, in constant attendance on his vehicle, and whilst in charge of such vehicle shall be and remain sober and orderly, and shall not wilfully do or cause, or suffer to be done any damage to the person or property of any one, or be guilty of any breach of the peace, misconduct or misbehaviour whatever; and in the event of any owner or driver in charge of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise using any insulting or abusive language to any other driver or other person, or so conducting himself as to create any noise, disturbance or obstruction, it shall be lawful for the Town Clerk to deprive such owner or driver, as the case may be, of his license, who upon complaint before any Justice of the Peace shall be found guilty thereof.

NO PERSON BUT DRIVER TO PLY FOR HIRE.

8. No person whatever except the licensed driver of any wagon, dray, or other vehicle shall solicit or ply for hire with the same, nor shall any driver leave his vehicle to ply for hire, or tout, or solicit hire for any vehicle.

VEHICLE NOT TO STAND ACROSS STREET.

9. The driver of any vehicle licensed, to carry goods or merchandise shall not suffer the said vehicle to stand across or in any way obstruct any street longer than is absolutely necessary for loading or unloading purposes, nor alongside any other licensed vehicle; neither shall he hinder or prevent the driver of any other licensed vehicle in taking up or setting down any goods or merchandise; nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent or endeavour to prevent any such driver from taking any employment tendered to him.

VICIOUS HORSES TO BE MUZZLED.

10. The driver of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall muzzle any vicious horse employed by him whilst such horse is harnessed to his licensed vehicle.

NAME OF DRIVER TO BE GIVEN UPON DEMAND.

11. The owner of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise shall, on request made by the Town Clerk or any police officer or other authorised person requiring the same, declare the name and place of abode of the driver of such vehicle.

Who shall be deemed to be Owner.

12. The owner of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchandise within the Municipality who shall hereafter dispose of such licensed vehicle shall register in the office of the Town Clerk of the Municipality the christian and surname of the person, and his place of abode, and shall transfer to such purchaser the license of such vehicle, and failing to do so shall still be deemed to be the owner of such licensed vehicle, and subject as such to all the provisions of this By-law as fully as if no change of ownership had taken place; and the person or persons in whose name or names a license shall appear to have been obtained shall be deemed to be the owner or owners of the licensed vehicle in respect of which the said license shall have been issued, and subject in all respects to the provisions of this By-law, until such time as the transfer shall have been duly and properly registered.

PENALTIES.

13. For every offence against any provision of this By-law (except such as are specified in any of the preceding sections) the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and shall pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, together with such costs and expenses as the Justice or Justices before whom the case is heard may in his or their discretion deem fit to order, to be recovered in a summary way

before any Justice of the Peace; provided that where by this By-law any penalty is imposed upon the owner or driver of any vehicle licensed to carry goods or merchan-dise for one and the same offence, only one prosecution at one and the same time shall be had or maintained for the recovery of such penalty against such owner or driver, at the option of the person prosecuting the same.

BY-LAW No. 31.

FOR PREVENTING THE PLACING OF ANY OFFENSIVE LIQUID O OTHER REFUSE MATTER ON STREETS OR LANES, ETC.

- 1. No foul or offensive matter or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other refuse matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged into or upon any part whatever of any street, lane, or yard, whether public or private, within the limits of the town of Broad Arrow.
- 2. No garbage, sweepings, food, or other refuse shall be scattered, heaped, or deposited within any yard or premises within the town, save in boxes or vessels approved of by the Council, which, when filled, may be reasonably carried by one man, and which shall be specially provided by the occupier of the house or building to which such yard is attached, and shall be so placed and kept as to be readily accessible to the person employed by the Council for removing the same.
- 3. For every offence against the provisions of this By-law the offender shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 32.

REGULATING THE KEEPING OF GOATS.

- No person shall be allowed to keep any goat within the Municipality of Broad Arrow unless such animal has been registered by the Town Clerk at the office of the Municipal Council.
- 2. The fees to be paid for each goat to the 31st day of December next ensuing the date of such registration shall be as under:

For each he-goat ... Ten shillings.
For each she-goat ... Ten shillings and sixpence.

3. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit for each offence a sum not exceeding £5.

BY-LAW No. 33.

TO PREVENT DAMAGE TO FOOTPATHS AND OTHER COUNCIL PROPERTIES.

No person, without having first obtained the written sanction of the Council, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, injure, or deface any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, tree-guard, plant, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other properties of the Council of the Municipality of Broad Arrow, or under the control thereof.

2. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit for each offence a sum not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 34.

TO RESTRAIN THE KEEPING OF HOUSES OF ILL-FAME WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY OF BROAD ARROW.

- 1. Any person acting as the proprietor, and any person having chief control or management, or being the occupier of any brothel within the said Municipality of Broad Arrow, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £20.
- 2. And any person letting any house, knowing that such house is about to be used by the tenant thereof as a brothel, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £10.

BY-LAW No. 35.

FOR MAKING CROSSINGS OVER CHANNELS AND FOOTPATHS.

- 1. No person shall cross over any channel or footpath with any horse, mule, ass, camel, or bullock, or with any vehicle, unless at such place as the Council, by its written authority, shall permit, and unless a proper crossing, approved of by the Municipal engineer, has been made over the channel.
- No person shall make or permit or cause to be made or erected any crossing over any channel on any street or lane of the Municipality unless he has previously obtained permission in writing from the Municipal Engineer to do so, as well as his approval of the design and materials of which such crossing is proposed to be made, together with the Council's permission to make such crossing.
- 3. Any person offending against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £5.

Regulations for the Control and Management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.

² 0.5 3 Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 12th May, 1898.

IS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, 13th December, 1893, and 19th June, 1896, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof:—

- 1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of £4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.
- 2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days from date thereof it shall be lawful for the Inspector to cancel such license. Provided that, in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block irrespective of the area.
- 3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.
- 4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.
- 5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.
- 6. No person shall destroy or preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.
- 7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.
- 8. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.
- 9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.
- 10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so-called "Pick-up banks."

- 11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand, or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.
- 12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year; the exact dates to be named in such notice.
- 13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.
- 14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.
- 15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.
- 16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.
- 17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

The Inspector may seize and remove any shell so obtained, and any other shell that may be found in possession of any person who may be found collecting shell by dredging or otherwise from any Government Reserve, and any person so found shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

- 18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.
- 19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed two square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of £1.

In all applications for exclusive licenses, the length of the licensed area shall not exceed twice its width.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that, an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas.

- 21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may, in open Court, refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.
- 22. All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a bonâ fide manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting, and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.
- 23. The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.
- 24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.
- 25. It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be final.

PENALTIES.

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

- 2. Any person or persons interfering with the caretaker or an authorised officer while in the execution of his duty will, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).
- 3. Any person taking water from the well, without first having paid the authorised fee to the caretaker or an authorised officer, will, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds (£2).

Orders under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880."

T is hereby notified, for general information, that under the powers conferred upon him by "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44th Vict., No. 5), His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to authorise the publication of the following Orders regulating the importation and disinfection of vine cuttings, buds, grapes, trees, plants, cuttings (other than vines), grafts, buds, seeds, pits, scions, and fruits respectively.

Orders regulating the Importation and Disinfection of Vine Cuttings Buds and Grapes.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall within forty-eight hours of the arrival of such vine cuttings at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or a Local Inspector appointed in that behalf. In the event of the consignee or his agent failing to deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the said vine cuttings. If upon such seizure the said vine cuttings are found to be infected with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or vines or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said vine cuttings are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall dip the said vine cuttings as per Order 5 and hold the same to the order of the consignee or his agent for seven clear days from the time of disinfection.
- 2. The importation of vines with roots or of vines that have had their roots cut off is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited except as hereinafter provided and subject to these regulations which shall be strictly observed.
- 3. Grapes may be imported from South Australia subject to the regulations in force for the time being for the examination and disinfection of imported fruits.
- 4. Vine cuttings or buds may be imported from South Australia—provided that all such cuttings and buds shall be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed.
- 5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings and buds required by the preceding order shall be effected by dipping the same in a solution of one pound of Sulphide of Lime to twenty gallons of water the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings or buds shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in the Schedule hereunder.

6. After the vine cuttings have been dipped they shall if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen days for further disinfecting or if found to be infected with injurious insects which cannot in the opinion of the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be destroyed by the treatment required by Order No. 5 the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire.

- 7. Vine cuttings may be imported from any country or province other than South Australia provided that any person about to import such cuttings shall at the time of ordering the same furnish a duplicate of such order to the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and provided also that such cuttings shall not be imported for at least one month after the duplicate of such order shall have been so furnished as aforesaid.
- 8. All vine cuttings so imported pursuant to the next preceding order shall be absolutely surrendered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the port of debarkation for the purpose of being quarantined as hereinafter provided.
- 9. All vine cuttings imported as aforesaid from any country or province other than South Australia shall be quarantined by the Department of Agriculture for a period of not less than 12 months nor longer than two years upon such grounds as from time to time shall be set apart by the said Department by advertising in the Government Gazette as quarantine stations. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings as aforesaid shall at the time of delivering the same to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of being quarantined pay to the Secretary a sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 cuttings so delivered and at the expiration of the period of quarantine shall upon taking delivery of his rooted vines pay the further sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 rooted vines so delivered to him.
- 10. Any vine cuttings imported from any country or province other than South Australia which shall in the opinion of the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be affected with insects fungi blight or other diseases injurious to grape vines or other trees or plants shall be destroyed under the direction of the said Inspector and the expense connected therewith shall be borne by and recoverable from the importer of such vine cuttings.
- 11. The Department of Agriculture shall not be liable for any loss resulting from the destruction of any cuttings under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs or by reason of the infertility of any such cuttings while in or after leaving their custody or whilst under their control.

Orders regulating the Disinfection of Imported Trees Plants Cuttings (other than Vines) Grafts Buds Seeds Pits Scions and Fruits.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings or buds) seeds pits or scions shall within forty-eight (48) hours after the arrival of any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the same to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and in the event of any such consignee or his agent failing to so deliver any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions within forty-eight (48) hours as aforesaid the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the same. If upon such seizure the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to vines or fruit trees or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall treat the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions as may be directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and hold same until applied for by the consignee or agent provided that if the same be not applied for within seven clear days from time of seizure the same may be destroyed.
- 2. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees or plants they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests or their eggs larvæ or pupæ.

- 3. All peach nectarine apricot plum prune almond and all trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots and all peach or other pits cuttings buds or scions raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.
- 4. The importation of the fruits—apples pears and quinces into any port in Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude is absolutely prohibited.
- 5. The importation of fresh fruits of every description from the Province of Queensland is absolutely prohibited.
- 6. Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must before removal from the first port or place of debarkation be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and if found infested with insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees or to other trees shall be destroyed or otherwise treated as the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture may direct. If the fruit on examination be found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate to that effect after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit was packed has been disinfected as prescribed by Order 7 and on receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection prescribed in the Schedule I. hereto. Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall if such fruit is found to be free from disease issue a certificate to that effect upon payment of the fee for inspection prescribed in the said schedule.
- 7. Transportable material of any kind used for packing or surrounding fruit is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation or from being offered for sale gift distribution or transportation until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping the same and keeping it continually submerged for a period of not less than two (2) minutes in boiling water containing in solution not less than one pound (11b.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.
- 8. Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 7 before removal from the first port or place of debarkation.
- 9. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be disinfected by being dipped in a solution of one pound (11b.) of whale oil soap (80 per cent.) to each and every gallon of water such whale oil soap solution being kept at a temperature of 115 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit. The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall remain in said solution not less than two (2) minutes. After the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been so disinfected they shall if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection or for further disinfection and if said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are then found to be infested they shall be destroyed by
- 10. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be further disinfected by fumigation with hydrocyanic acid gas as follows:—The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall be covered with an air-tight box and for each and every one hundred (100) cubic feet of space therein there shall be used:—

For plants in pots and in leaf—

400 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and a half (1½) ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

For fruit trees and shrubs-

530 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and three-quarter $(1\frac{3}{4})$ ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

The cyanide of potassium shall be placed in a generator and the chamber immediately closed tightly when the sulphuric acid shall be added. The chamber shall remain closed for not less than sixty (60) minutes. After the said

trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been treated with the hydrocyanic acid gas as above directed they shall (if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector) remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection and further treatment or destruction by fire if necessary.

- 11. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first port or place of debarkation and if found infested with injurious insects which cannot be destroyed by the remedies required by Rules 9 and 10 of these Orders they shall be seized and destroyed by fire.
- 12. Consignees must deliver within forty-eight (48) hours of arrival the fruit fruit trees packages and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection consignees or their agents must repack the fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material that have been disinfected and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.
- 13. Any fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection and not disinfected within forty-eight (48) hours by reason of the default of the consignee to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacking may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.
- 14. Agents and other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of fruits and of fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings) or buds seeds pits and scions shall pay for the inspection and if necessary the disinfection thereof the fees set out in Schedules I. and II. respectively:—

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

- 1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony that have formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.
- 2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within two years, by eight equal instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.

Rothesay Local Board of Health By-Laws.

- 1. This Board shall meet for the transaction of General Business on alternate Tuesdays, at 8 p.m. Special meetings may be called at any time deemed necessary by the Chairman or any two members of the Board.
- 2. All moneys belonging to the Board shall be placed in a bank to credit of the Board, and none shall be drawn therefrom, except by cheque signed by Chairman, Secretary, and countersigned by a member of the Board.
- 3. The duties of the Secretary shall be to attend and take minutes of all meetings of the Board, keep accounts, and perform all other clerical work that may be necessary.
- 4. The duties of the Health Inspector shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the Public Health Act at present in force, and to carry out its provisions under instructions from the Board; to visit occasionally, not less than once a week, the various portions of the Board's district, and, if necessary, give his advice or instructions to occupiers of premises as to the abatement or prevention of nuisances or removal of offensive matter; to keep a record of all such instructions given to abate nuisances, etc., and to furnish the Board at each fortnightly meeting with report of all such nuisances abated and the general sanitary state of the district.

- 5. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other premises shall be kept and maintained in such a sanitary condition as shall satisfy the Inspector; and all orders given for the removal or abatement of any nuisance shall be complied with by the owner, occupier, or agent of such premises on which the nuisance is located.
- agent of such premises on which the nuisance is located.

 6. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other premises shall be provided by the owner, occupier, or agent with a sufficient number of substantially built closets, each closet to be fitted with a pan, bucket, or other receptacle, as may be ordered by the Board, and all such pans, buckets, as the case may be, shall be emptied at least once a week, or oftener, as the case may be, if required by the Inspector, and any person neglecting or refusing to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.
- 7. Every pan, bucket, or other receptacle of night-soil shall be free from leakage, and must be approved of by the Inspector.
- 8. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, empty bottles, tins, or other rubbish in any street or other place within the Board's district other than those places set apart for that purpose, shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing same, be subject also to a penalty not less than 5s. and not exceeding 40s.
- 9. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offal, or manure within the limits of the townsite of Rothesay, or closely adjacent thereto, if such burning or destroyal creates or is likely to create a nuisance, except in such cases as in the opinion of the Inspector or any member of Board any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt, when such Inspector or member of the Board may give permission, verbally or otherwise, for such rubbish, offal, manure, etc., to be burnt.
- 10. In the event of any death or accident necessitating the slaughter of any horses, cattle, sheep, or any other animals within the Board's district, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the limits of the townsite of Rothesay, and thoroughly burnt or destroyed, to the satisfaction of the Inspector or any member of the Board, by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not less than 5s. and not exceeding 40s.
- 11. This Board may from time to time appoint any place or places within the district for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or any other rubbish or offensive matter, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.
- 12. Whenever in these By-laws the word "Board" is used, it shall be taken to mean "The Rothesay Local Board of Health," and the word "Inspector" shall be taken to mean "The Inspector of Nuisances," for the time being, or any other person appointed to act in his stead.
- 13. Whenever in these By-laws, any act, deed, or thing is directed to be done, or any act, deed, or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing, or prevent being done, any act, deed, or thing, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and in determining the responsibility of the person or persons against whom the action may be taken under these By-laws, it shall be necessary to alone prove that such person or persons is occupier or are the occupiers of the premises whereon the offence is committed.

In case of any breach, non-observance, or non-performance of any of the foregoing By-laws, the person or persons guilty of such preach, non-observance or non-performance of these By-laws shall, on conviction before any Justice of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not less than 5s. and not exceeding £10.
