By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c.,

HEREAS by Proclamations dated respectively the 7th day of June, 1892, the 4th day of July, 1893, the 4th day of April, 1894, and the 27th day of September, 1894, issued under "The Game Act, 1892," various birds therein mentioned were in some instances preserved for a certain season in each year, and in other instances strictly preserved, and their destruction in any way wholly forbidden: And WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to strictly preserve all birds on the Abrolhos Islands: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all birds on the Abrolhos Islands to be strictly preserved, and their destruction in any way wholly forbidden; AND WHEREAS by "The Game Act, 1892," it is further provided that the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, may, by like Proclamation, declare any portion of the Colony or locality a Reserve for Native Game: Now, THERE-FORE, I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare the Abrolhos Islands a Reserve for Native Game, and all shooting, and taking or destroying eggs within the limits of such Islands are strictly prohibited.

Alteration of Boundaries of Broad Arrow Municipality.

GERARD SMITH. (L,S,)

HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, amongst other things to alter the boundaries of any Municipality: Now Therefore, I the Governor of the said Colony, with the advice aforesaid, in pursuance of the power vested in me by

the said Act, do hereby alter the Boundaries of the Municipality of Broad Arrow, and declare them to be as follows:-

Bounded by lines starting from the North corner of late Gold Mining Lease 421, and extending $160^{\circ}~26'$ about 112 chains along the North-East boundary of and through chains along the North-East boundary of and through the East corner of the said lease; thence 70° 26′ about 110 chains; thence 340° 26′ about 120 chains; thence 250° 26′ about 87 chains; thence 318° 22′ about 12 chains and 30° 52′ 1 chain 3¼ links along the South-West and part of the North-West boundaries of Gold Mining Lease 139w; thence 237° 49′ 18 chains 22¼ links; thence 140° 2′ 1 chain 42¼ links and 230° 2′ 7 chains 87 links along parts of the North-East and South-East boundaries of Gold Mining Lease 690w; thence 143° 46′ 15 chains 13 links; and thence 70° 26′ 3 chains 37¼ links, along part of the North-West boundary of late Gold Mining Lease 421 aforesaid, to the starting point. starting point.

The boundaries set forth in the Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of the 26th February, 1897, are hereby cancelled.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations in relation to persons brought into Western Australia for employment in the Pearl Shell Fisheries:—

G. F. ELIOT, Acting Under Secretary.

- 1. No person brought into the Colony for employment in the Pearl Shell Fisheries, shall land, or be permitted to land, except within a duly proclaimed port Northward of the 27th parallel of South latitude; and within two days of landing a written agreement for employment, in the form in Schedule "A" hereto, shall be entered into between the employer and the person employed before an Inspector of Pearl Shell Fisheries, or an Officer of Customs. The agreement shall be made in duplicate, one of which shall be retained by the Inspector or Officer of Customs, who shall indorse thereon a bond in the form in Schedule B hereto, which bond shall be duly executed by the employer.
- 2. Upon an agreement being entered into as aforesaid, particulars of the same shall be registered by an Inspector or an Officer of Customs in the form in Schedule C hereto, and a certificate shall be given to the person employed in the form in Schedule D hereto, which shall be renewed annually.
- 3. Every engagement shall be for the term stated in the agreement; but at the expiration of every term of service it shall be lawful for the person employed to re-engage himself to the same or another employer, provided that on every re-engagement an agreement shall be entered into and registered, and a certificate obtained, as herebefore provided in the case of an original engagement.
- 4. Forthwith, after entering into every agreement as aforesaid, the person employed shall be actually engaged in the fishery, and shall not land, or be permitted to land, or remain on shore during the engagement, except as hereinafter provided, that is to say:—
 - (a.) In case of sickness, or for other sufficient reason, in the discretion of an Inspector or an Officer of Customs, a person employed may, with permission in writing signed by an Inspector or Officer of Customs, go on shore within the limits of the port named in the permit, and there remain for a period limited by the permit.
 - (b.) A person employed may, at the expiration of his engagement, with the like permission go and remain on shore within the limits of the port for a period not exceeding three months.
 - (c.) With the like permission, an employer may employ labourers on shore, within the limits of the port, in the case of a vessel being laid up for the hurricane season or for repairs.
- 5. On the discharge of any person employed as aforesaid, the employer shall forthwith pay into the hands of an Officer of Customs the passage money of the person employed from the port of registration to Singapore, but in the event of the person employed

duly entering into another lawful contract for employment within the Colony, instead of leaving the Colony, the said passage money shall be returned by the officer to the employer who shall have paid the same

6. Any breach of these Regulations shall be deemed a contravention of the said Act within the meaning of section 17 thereof, and shall subject the person offending to a fine not exceeding £50, and to be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, until such fine is paid, or in addition to such fine, but not in any case for a period exceeding three months.

Applicants must give their age, occupation, and birthplace, and send two unmounted Photographs, and state the Port from which they wish to leave and the Port which they wish to land at on their return to the Colony, and they will not be allowed to and at any other Port than that named.

Certificates authorising the return of Applicants will be delivered to them at the place of departure by the Chief Officer of Police at the Port, on the production of the Passage Ticket to the place outside the Colony to which they are proceeding.

IIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Councils of the Municipalities of Fremantle, Leederville, and Northam.

Municipality of Fremantle.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in and by virtue of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle makes the following By-laws for the prevention of the adulteration of milk, and ordains that the same shall be observed and enforced within the said Municipality:—

BY-LAW No. 63.

1. The owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, occupier or occupiers, or the person or persons for the time being in charge of any dairy, cowhouse, cowkeeper's premises, building, erection, tenement, premises, utensil, can, or receptacle of any kind in, upon, or about which, or any portion of which any fresh milk shall be found, or shall be, to, or with which any other substance, whether fluid or solid, or any water, or any other substance whatever, has been added or mixed, shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £20 for each and every contravention of this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 64.

The owner or owners, proprietor or proprietors, or the person or persons in charge or possession of, or the vendors of any fresh milk kept, offered, or exposed for sale, carried about for distribution, or which is offered to be supplied or is supplied for human consumption, to, or with which any other substance, whether fluid or solid, or any water or other substance has been added or mixed, shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £20 for each and every contravention of this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 65.

For the purpose of detecting any contravention of the two foregoing By-laws, any officer of the Council of the Municipality of Fremantle, duly authorised, may at any time seize and take possession of a sample, not exceeding one pint, of any and all fresh milk found within the said Town or Municipality of Fremantle. The Inspector shall, on seizing and taking possession of the sample of fresh milk as aforesaid, in the presence of the person from whom it is seized or taken, if such person so desire, forthwith divide the same, as nearly as may be, into two equal portions, and shall put each portion into separate bottles or utensils, which shall then be corked up and sealed by the Inspector with a seal provided by the Board for the purpose; one of the said bottles or utensils shall then be handed by the Inspector to the person from whom the said sample has been seized and taken possession of, and the Inspector shall retain the other bottle or utensil, for the purpose of having the same analysed, and the Inspector shall submit the same for analysis with all possible expedition; and any person or persons obstructing such officer in the execution of his duty, or refusing to give or supply him with, or permit, or allow him to take a sample of any fresh milk under his, her, or their control, or in his, her, or their possession, shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law, and, upon conviction thereof, shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £20.

Further By-Laws of the Leederville Municipal Council, made in pursuance of the Powers and Authorities contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895."

BY-LAW No. 49.

- 1. All rates are due and payable at the Office of the Municipal Council, on or before the 14th day of January and the 14th day of July, in each respective half-year.
- 2. No person's name shall be placed on the Ratepayers' Roll of the 20th September, or will any person's claim be accepted at the Revision Court, held in October, who has not paid all rates and assessments due and payable by him (or her) to the Municipal Council, on or before the 30th June next preceding, and has been duly seized or possessed of land within the boundaries of the Municipality since 30th June of the preceding year.

The above By-law was adopted by the Council on the 3rd March, 1898.

By-Laws of the Council of the Municipality of Leederville, made under "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," for the Annual Registration of Cowkeepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk, and for prohibiting the Adulteration of Milk, and for the granting of Licenses.

BY-LAW No. 50.

1. In the construction of these By-laws the word "Person" shall include a "Corporation."

The "masculine" gender shall be deemed and taken to include "females," and the "singular" the "plural," and the "plural" the "singular."

2. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk in the Town of Leederville shall, on or before the first day of January in every year, make application to be registered in manner following, that is to say: by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk of the said Town an application in the following form, or to the like effect. Every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of One pound sterling if in possession of three or more cows, and if in possession of less than three cows shall pay a fee of 5s. each, per annum.

fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed; and on being satisfied that the applicant has made provision for the due observance of such By-law relative to dairies as may be in force for the time being under the Health Act, the Town Clerk shall issue a license in the form "A" set out in the Schedule attached hereto, which shall remain in force until the 31st day of December next ensuing.

- 4. No person shall carry on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until such person shall have obtained from the Town Clerk a license for that purpose, which said license shall be renewed every year on or before the 1st day of January.
- 5. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall deteriorate the quality of milk by the addition of water or any foreign liquid or substance, or in any way adulterate the same, or extract cream.
- 6. These By-laws shall apply to the whole of the area under the control of the Leederville Municipal Council as Local Board of Health.
- 7. Every person who shall commit a breach of these By-laws shall for every such breach or neglect be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

BY-LAW No. 12.

For Regulation and Registration of Dairies.

1. Every person or persons carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the Municipality of Northam, and every person or persons supplying milk to persons residing within the Municipality, whether such dairies are or are not within the

Municipality, shall, on or before the 1st day of June in each year, make application to be registered in the manner set forth in the Schedule J, or to like effect.

- 2. Upon approval of the application by the Council, and the payment by the applicant of a registration fee of Twenty shillings, a license shall be issued by the Town Clerk, in the form of Schedule K hereto attached.
- 3. No person shall carry on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until such person shall have obtained from the Town Clerk a license for that purpose, which said license shall be renewed every year, on or before the 1st day of June.
- 4. All cattle in dairies shall be submitted for inspection by the owner thereof, at such places and at such times as the Council may order, by a Veterinary Surgeon, or officer appointed by the Council, and shall, if required, be submitted to the Tuberculin Test; and any cattle found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the Veterinary Surgeon or officer aforesaid unfit for use for dairying purposes, shall be forthwith removed by the owner thereof from such dairy, and if suffering from disease may be ordered to be destroyed.
- 5. Any contagious or infectious disease in either man or animal on the premises must be immediately reported to the Inspector or other officer of the Council, and no person so suffering, or having been in contact with a person suffering from such disease, shall milk any cow, or handle any milk utensil, or assist in any way in the business until he has furnished a medical certificate to the Health Officer that all danger of contamination has ceased.
- 6. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall deteriorate the quality of milk by the addition of water or any foreign substance or liquid, or in any way adulterate the same
- 7. All milk vessels, dairies, stores, or milk shops, and places used in connection therewith, shall be kept in a thoroughly clean and wholesome condition to the satisfaction of the Council or their officers.
- 8. Any person supplying milk to any other person for money or value shall be deemed to be a purveyor of milk within the meaning of this By-law.
- 9. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding $\pounds 5$.

THE care and protection of the Aborigines having now devolved upon the Government, it is to be considered part of the public duty of Resident Magistrates, Resident Medical Officers, and Police Officers to assist in every way in promoting the welfare of the Natives and in providing relief to the aged, infirm, and sick, due regard being given to the practice of strict economy.

In cases of sickness Medical Officers are expected to attend Natives as part of their public duties, in the same way as they attend indigent persons.

In order to carry out these measures it is desirable that monthly lists should be furnished to the Aborigines Department, giving as far as possible information as to the names, sex, ages, and condition of the Natives to whom relief has been given, care being taken that, as a general rule, no able-bodied Natives who can provide for their own maintenance should receive rations.

Accounts should be rendered monthly, certified by a Resident Magistrate, a Government Medical Officer, or a Police Officer.

Regulations for the Control and Management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.

²0.5.8 Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 12th May, 1898.

IIS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, 13th December, 1893, and 19th June, 1896, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof:—

- 1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of £4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.
- 2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days from date thereof it shall be lawful for the Inspector to cancel such license. Provided that, in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block irrespective of the area.
- 3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.
- 4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.
- 5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.
- 6. No person shall destroy of preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.
- 7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.
- 8. All boats liceused shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.
- 9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.
- 10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so-called "Pick-up banks."

- 11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand, or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.
- 12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year; the exact dates to be named in such notice.
- 13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.
- 14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.
- 15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.
- 16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.
- 17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

The Inspector may seize and remove any shell so obtained, and any other shell that may be found in possession of any person who may be found collecting shell by dredging or otherwise from any Government Reserve, and any person so found shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

- 18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.
- 19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed two square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of £1.

In all applications for exclusive licenses, the length of the licensed area shall not exceed twice its width.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas,

- 21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may, in open Court, refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.
- 22. All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a bonû fide manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting, and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.
- 23. The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.
- 24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.
- 25. It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be final.

PENALTIES.

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

Orders under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880."

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under the powers conferred upon him by "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44th Vict., No. 5), His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to authorise the publication of the following Orders regulating the importation and disinfection of vine cuttings, buds, grapes, trees, plants, cuttings (other than vines), grafts, buds, seeds, pits, scions, and fruits respectively.

Orders regulating the Importation and Disinfection of Vine Cuttings Buds and Grapes.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall within forty-eight hours of the arrival of such vine cuttings at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or a Local Inspector appointed in that behalf. In the event of the consignee or his agent failing to deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the said vine cuttings. If upon such seizure the said vine cuttings are found to be infected with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or vines or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said vine cuttings are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall dip the said vine cuttings as per Order 5 and hold the same to the order of the consignee or his agent for seven clear days from the time of disinfection.
- 2. The importation of vines with roots or of vines that have had their roots cut off is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited except as hereinafter provided and subject to these regulations which shall be strictly observed.
- 3. Grapes may be imported from South Australia subject to the regulations in force for the time being for the examination and disinfection of imported fruits.
- 4. Vine cuttings or buds may be imported from South Australia—provided that all such cuttings and buds shall be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed.
- 5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings and buds required by the preceding order shall be effected by dipping the same in a solution of one pound of Sulphide of Lime to twenty gallons of water the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings or buds shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in the Schedule hereunder.

6. After the vine cuttings have been dipped they shall if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen days for further disinfecting or if found to be infected with injurious insects which cannot in the opinion of the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be destroyed by the treatment required by Order No. 5 the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire.

- 7. Vine cuttings may be imported from any country or province other than South Australia provided that any person about to import such cuttings shall at the time of ordering the same furnish a duplicate of such order to the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and provided also that such cuttings shall not be imported for at least one month after the duplicate of such order shall have been so furnished as aforesaid.
- 8. All vine cuttings so imported pursuant to the next preceding order shall be absolutely surrendered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the port of debarkation for the purpose of being quarantined as hereinafter provided.
- 9. All vine cuttings imported as aforesaid from any country or province other than South Australia shall be quarantined by the Department of Agriculture for a period of not less than 12 months nor longer than two years upon such grounds as from time to time shall be set apart by the said Department by advertising in the Government Gazette as quarantine stations. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings as aforesaid shall at the time of delivering the same to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of being quarantined pay to the Secretary a sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 cuttings so delivered and at the expiration of the period of quarantine shall upon taking delivery of his rooted vines pay the further sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 rooted vines so delivered to him.
- 10. Any vine cuttings imported from any country or province other than South Australia which shall in the opinion of the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be affected with insects fungi blight or other diseases injurious to grape vines or other trees or plants shall be destroyed under the direction of the said Inspector and the expense connected therewith shall be borne by and recoverable from the importer of such vine cuttings.
- 11. The Department of Agriculture shall not be liable for any loss resulting from the destruction of any cuttings under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs or by reason of the infertility of any such cuttings while in or after leaving their custody or whilst under their control.

Orders regulating the Disinfection of Imported Trees Plants Cuttings (other than Vines) Grafts Buds Seeds Pits Scions and Fruits.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings or buds) seeds pits or scions shall within forty-eight (48) hours after the arrival of any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the same to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and in the event of any such consignee or his agent failing to so deliver any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions within forty-eight (48) hours as aforesaid the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the same. If upon such seizure the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to vines or fruit trees or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall treat the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions as may be directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and hold same until applied for by the consignee or agent provided that if the same be not applied for within seven clear days from time of seizure the same may be destroyed.
- 2. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees or plants they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests or their eggs larvæ or pupæ.

- 3. All peach nectarine apricot plum prune almond and all trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots and all peach or other pits cuttings buds or scions raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.
- 4. The importation of the fruits—apples pears and quinces into any port in Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude is absolutely prohibited.
- 5. The importation of fresh fruits of every description from the Province of Queensland is absolutely prohibited.
- 6. Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must before removal from the first port or place of debarkation be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and if found infested with insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees or to other trees shall be destroyed or otherwise treated as the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture may direct. If the fruit on examination be found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate to that effect after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit was packed has been disinfected as prescribed by Order 7 and on receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection prescribed in the Schedule I. hereto. Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall if such fruit is found to be free from disease issue a certificate to that effect upon payment of the fee for inspection prescribed in the said schedule.
- 7. Transportable material of any kind used for packing or surrounding fruit is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation or from being offered for sale gift distribution or transportation until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping the same and keeping it continually submerged for a period of not less than two (2) minutes in boiling water containing in solution not less than one pound (1lb.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.
- 8. Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 7 before removal from the first port or place of debarkation.
- 9. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be disinfected by being dipped in a solution of one pound (1lb.) of whale oil soap (80 per cent.) to each and every gallon of water such whale oil soap solution being kept at a temperature of 115 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit. The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall remain in said solution not less than two (2) minutes. After the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been so disinfected they shall if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection or for further disinfection and if said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are then found to be infested they shall be destroyed by
- 10. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be further disinfected by funigation with hydrocyanic acid gas as follows:—The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall be covered with an air-tight box and for each and every one hundred (100) cubic feet of space therein there shall be used:—

For plants in pots and in leaf-

400 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and a half (1½) ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

For fruit trees and shrubs-

530 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and three-quarter (13) ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

The cyanide of potassium shall be placed in a generator and the chamber immediately closed tightly when the sulphuric acid shall be added. The chamber shall remain closed for not less than sixty (60) minutes. After the said

- trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been treated with the hydrocyanic acid gas as above directed they shall (if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector) remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection and further treatment or destruction by fire if necessary.
- 11. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first port or place of debarkation and if found infested with injurious insects which cannot be destroyed by the remedies required by Rules 9 and 10 of these Orders they shall be seized and destroyed by fire.
- 12. Consignees must deliver within forty-eight (48) hours of arrival the fruit fruit trees packages and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection consignees or their agents must repack the fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material that have been disinfected and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.
- 13. Any fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection and not disinfected within forty-eight (48) hours by reason of the default of the consignee to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacking may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.
- 14. Agents and other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of fruits and of fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings) or buds seeds pits and scions shall pay for the inspection and if necessary the disinfection thereof the fees set out in Schedules I. and II. respectively:—

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

- 1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony that have formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.
- 2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within two years, by eight equal instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.
- 3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within one year from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.

Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, under Section 44 of the Homesteads Act, to apply to any Town or Suburban Lands situate within the boundaries of any proclaimed Goldfield which may be declared open for selection as Residential Lots:—

- 1. Application for leases of the natural surface of any lots within the prescribed area to a depth of 20ft. may be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands. through the Warden, by any male person above the age of 18 years, upon the following terms:—
- 2. The application shall be in the form prescribed, and shall be lodged with the Warden, and shall set forth the number, area, and position of the lot applied for.
- 3. The rent payable in respect of each lot shall be £1 per annum, which shall, in the first instance, be lodged with the application, and subsequently paid annually on the first day of March, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 101 of the Land Regulations. When paying the annual rent the holder of each lot shall make a statutory declaration that the conditions of residence hereinafter set forth have been complied with or fulfilled. A fee of £1, in addition to the first year's rent, shall accompany each application.
- 4. The Warden shall forward the application, together with his recommendation thereon, to the Commissioner of Crown Lands immediately after receipt thereof, and he may thereupon deliver to the applicant an approval notice in the form hereinafter provided, and the production of such notice shall be sufficient evidence of the right of the holder thereof to occupy the lot therein mentioned under these regulations, pending the decision of the Commissioner of Crown Lands thereon. Should the application be approved, a lease in the form prescribed will be issued to the applicant on the surrender by him of the approval notice, but should the application be refused, notice of such refusal will be gazetted, and the rent paid will be refunded to the applicant on application to the Warden.
- 5. The lot leased shall be used solely as the habitual abode of the holder or members of his family for at least six months in each year, and for no other purpose whatever.
- 6. The holder of any lot may surrender the same at any time, and shall at the time of surrender furnish to the Warden a detached list of the nature and value of improvements existing on such lot. The lot so surrendered shall then be thrown open for re-selection, and may be applied for as provided for by these regulations. Any person to whom such lot is granted shall pay to the Warden the value of any improvements then existing on such lot, which value shall thereupon be paid by the Warden to the original holder. Should the person re-applying object to the value set upon the improvements by the original holder, a valuation shall be made by two arbitrators, one appointed by each party, and in accordance with the provisions of "The Arbitration Act, 1895," the Warden being the umpire in case of disagreement, and the cost of such arbitration shall be borne by the original holder or the person re-applying, as the arbitrators may direct.
- 7. No person who shall have surrendered or forfeited a lot shall be eligible to select another lot within a mile of the lot originally held by him, until six months shall have elapsed from the date of surrender or forfeiture of such lot.

- 8. The Governor may at any time exempt from the operations of these regulations any portion or portions of any town or suburban lands so set apart, which may be required for mining or other purposes.
- 9. Any lot or lots or portions thereof that may have been granted as a residential lot may be resumed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, on the payment to the holder of such lot or lots the fair value of any improvements existing on such lots at the time of resumption, such value to be ascertained in the like manner as prescribed by Clause 6 hereof. The resumption shall take effect upon notice thereof to the holder, in writing under the hand of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, being served on the holder or published in the Government Gazette.
- 10. All leases granted under these regulations shall expire on the 31st day of December following the date of grant, and may be renewed from year to year, at the option of the Commissioner of Crown Lands. The acceptance of rent shall be conclusive evidence of such renewal.
- 11. No person shall be entitled to hold more than one lot at a time.
- 12. Lots held under these regulations shall not be transferable.
- 13. On proof satisfactory to the Warden that any of the conditions contained in the foregoing Regulations have not been complied with, the Warden may declare the lot liable to forfeiture, and in such case he shall report the matter to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, by whom the lot may be declared forfeited. All lots forfeited shall be thrown open for re-selection. All improvements on any forfeited lot shall be the property of the Crown.

Roebourne Commonage By-Laws.

III Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following By-Laws of the Roebourne Commonage, made by the Council and Burgesses of the Town of Roebourne.

GEO. THROSSELL, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

BY-LAWS.

The Council and Burgesses of the Town of Roebourne do hereby make and publish the following By-laws for the regulation and good management of the Roebourne Commonage:—

- 1. That all stock running on the commonage otherwise than in accordance with the following By-laws be treated as trespassing stock.
- 2. That with the exception of stock owned by bond fide travellers, travelling teamsters, and packers, as hereinafter provided for, no stock of any description shall be allowed to run or depasture on the common free of charge, and that the following charges shall be payable in advance in respect of all stock so running or depasturing thereon. Persons residing within the boundaries of the Roebourne Municipality only to have the right to run stock upon the commonage.
 - Horses and Cattle shall be charged at the rate of 20s. per head per annum, 12s. 6d. per half-year, or 7s. per head per quarter or part of a quarter: Provided, however, that no person, firm, or company shall be allowed to run more than eight head of horses and cattle at any one time. All stock under twelve months old, the progeny of stock running on the common, being bona fide property of any ratepayer, shall not be charged for.
 - Sheep.—Only sheep kept for killing by bonû fide butchers, for supplying the public, shall be allowed to run and depasture on the common, and such sheep shall be charged at the rate of 3d. per head per annum. 150 to be the largest number allowed on the commonage at one time, if only one butcher carrying on business in Roebourne; should there be more than one butchering establishment, 100 sheep to be the largest number allowed to be depastured at any one time by each butcher or firm of butchers.
 - Goats for milking purposes shall be charged at the rate of 2s 6d. per head per annum.
 - Billies and Wethers at the rate of 5s. per head per annum; but no person, firm, or company shall be allowed to run more than three head of goats at any one time, and all goats over the age of six months for which the above commonage fees shall not be paid shall be liable to be destroyed in accordance with Sub-sections 1 and 2 of Section 4 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).
 - Swine or Camels shall under no circumstances be permitted to run on the commonage.
- 3. That any person or persons running stock on the commonage may change such stock from time to time, provided that he or they do not at any time exceed the number for which he or they shall have paid commonage fees.
- 4. That it shall be compulsory upon all persons making use of the commonage, as heretofore provided, to furnish the town clerk or ranger of the common with a list, giving correct description of all stock placed by them upon the common, within 12 hours of placing such stock thereon, and to obtain from such officer a certificate showing the number and description of such stock.
- 5. Bond fide travellers, teamsters, and packers shall be allowed to run their horses or cattle on the commonage for the space of Four clear days free of all charge; should that period, however, be exceeded, they shall be charged at the rate of 6d. per head per day or part of a day for all horses and cattle. In no case are such horses and cattle to remain on the commonage under this regulation longer than Seven clear days at any one time. The council shall, in all cases, be the sole judge of what constitutes a bond fide traveller, teamster, and packer.

- 6. No travelling stock, with the exception of those travelling to and from the Port of Cossack, shall be allowed to cross the commonage. The owner or drover in charge of such last mentioned stock to give written notice of his intention to travel such stock, and to comply strictly with Section 29 of "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act of 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).
- 7. That all annual fees shall be due and payable on the 1st day of December in each year, and the town clerk shall at any time, with the approval of the Mayor or any two councillors, have authority to take legal proceedings for the recovery of any fees unpaid.
- 8. That no stock on which commonage fees are due shall be removed from the common, unless with the written sanction of the town clerk, until after all such fees have been paid in full.
- 9. That stray stock proved to be accidentally upon the common shall not be liable to pay commonage fees, but shall be treated in all respects as trespassing stock.
- 10. That no entire horse, pig, or bull over the age of six months (except the property of the council) shall be allowed on the common; and in addition to the penalty hereinafter prescribed and recoverable under these By-laws against the owner thereof, if known, any such horse or bull found thereon shall be liable to be dealt with in manner prescribed by "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882" (46 Vict., No. 7).
- 11. The ranger for the time being shall have authority to demand particulars of stock depasturing on the common.
- 12. For each and every breach of any one of these By-laws the owners of stock running on the commonage shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s., exclusive of costs and in addition to the commonage fees, as provided in these By-laws. Such penalty and fees may be recovered and enforced in a summary manner before any one or more Justices of the Peace, in manner prescribed by the 14th Vict., No. 5, and shall in no way affect any fines and fees recoverable under By-laws of the Council regulating fees and fines to be paid in respect of poundage of stock.
- 13. All previously existing commonage By-laws are hereby repealed.

By-Laws, Fremantle Local Board of Health.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in, under, and by virtue of "The Public Health Act 1886," and the several Acts amending the same vested in it, the Local Board of Health of Fremantle hereby determines and ordains that the By-Laws numbered 49, 51, 72, and 76, confirmed by order of the Central Board of Health, on the 24th day of June, 1896, now in force in the Municipality of Fremantle, are hereby repealed, and the following By-Laws are hereby substituted in lieu thereof:—

By-Law 49.

No person shall sell milk produced from cows fed upon any substance deleterious to the quality of milk to be sold in the said town, or sell or cause to be sold in the said town unwholesome milk.

By-Law 51.

Every person offending against any of the provisions of either of the foregoing By-Laws, numbered respectively 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, and 50, shall for every breach thereof forfeit and pay a penalty of a sum of not less than 5s. and not exceeding £10, and a penalty of a sum of not less than 5s. and not more than £5 for each and every day during which such breach shall be continued.

By-Law 72.

The occupier of any premises shall twice in each week cleanse and empty every privy and closet furnished with a movable receptacle for fœcal matter, belonging to such premises, and shall employ a licensed nightman and no other person for such purpose.

By-Law 76.

Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-Laws shall be liable for every such offence to forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than 5s., and a penalty of a further sum of not exceeding £5 and not less than 5s. for every day which the offence or breach shall be continued.

In pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in, under, and by virtue of "The Public Health Act, 1886," and of the several Acts amending the same vested in it, the Local Board of Health of Fremantle makes the following additional By-Laws, and ordains that the same shall be observed and enforced within the Municipality of Fremantle:—

138. "The Municipality of Fremantle" means the whole district within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Health, Fremantle.

In the construction of these By-Laws the Interpretation Clause of "The Public Health Act, 1886," as amended by the 59th Vict., 35, shall apply, and the word "Inspector" shall mean any officer of the Local Board of Health, Fremantle, duly authorised to act under the said "Public Health Act, 1886," and any amendments thereof.

"Refuse" shall mean and include dust, ashes, rags, straw, tins, boxes, broken glass, house and trade refuse, waste paper, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, and all rubbish of whatsoever kind.

139. No person shall deposit or discharge, or permit cause, or suffer to be deposited or discharged, any refuse in any place in or part of the Municipality of Fremantle, except in such place or places as the Local Board of Health of Fremantle (hereinafter called the Board) may from time to time by public notice direct.

Any such public notice shall be published three times in at least one newspaper circulating in Fremantle, and may at any time be cancelled.

- 140. The owner of every house shall, on written notice from the Health Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or bins of the material and of the dimensions in the Schedule hereto mentioned, as may be directed by the Inspector. Provided that in no case shall the owner be required to provide more than one such receptacle for each part of such house which shall be occupied by a separate tenant.
- 141. The occupier for the time being of every house, or part thereof, shall regularly collect all refuse on or from the premises occupied or used by him, and place the same in the said receptacle, and not elsewhere.
- 142. No occupier shall permit or suffer the receptacle attached or used with the premises of which he is the occupier, or of which he is one of the occupiers, to overflow or to become offensive.
- 143. Every occupier of a house, or of part of a house, to or with which a receptacle as aforesaid is attached or used shall cause the same to be emptied by a licensed person at least twice every week: Provided that, in the case of buildings used for purposes other than private residences, the occupier shall cause the said receptacles to be emptied as often as the Inspector shall direct.
- 144. Every receptacle as aforesaid shall be kept in such positions as the Inspector may direct, so as to be convenient for the discharge and removal of the contents thereof.
- 145. The owner of every house shall, after notice from the inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle which the inspector may deem to be worn out or unfit for use.
- 146. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, where any house is unoccupied or is occupied by numerous tenants, or where for any other cause the Board thinks it desirable, the said Board may give written notice to the owner, either personally or by leaving the same on the premises, requiring such owner to observe and carry out these By-laws in the same manner as if he were the occupier thereof, and in such case such owner shall be responsible in the same manner and to the same extent as if he were the occupier of such premises, and be liable to the same penalties.
- 147. If default or neglect be made in observing any of these By-laws by any owner or occupier, the Board may do all things and incur all expense necessary to observe the same; and all costs and expenses so incurred and things done shall be paid for by such owner or occupier, as the case may be, and may be sued for and recovered accordingly.
- 148. The occupier of any premises who shall remove or cause to be removed, for the purposes of sale or use as manure any refuse, liquid or solid, rubbish, or manure produced upon his premises shall not, in the process of removal, deposit, or cause to be deposited, such refuse, rubbish, or manure upon any footway, pavement or carriage way.

For the purpose of such removal he shall in any case use or cause to be used a suitable vessel or receptacle, cart, or carriage, properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents thereof. If, in the process of such removal, any person shall slop or spill, or cause or allow to fall upon any footways, pavement, or carriage ways, any such refuse, rubbish, or manure, he shall forthwith remove same, and shall immediately thereafter thoroughly sweep, or otherwise thoroughly cleanse such place.

- 149. Every person who shall convey any refuse, rubbish, or manure emitting a stench through and along any street shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such refuse, rubbish, or manure to be covered with lime or other suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be reasonably necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive effluvia from such refuse, rubbish, or manure.
- 150. Every occupier of a building or premises wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, or swine may be kept, shall provide, in connection with such building or premises, a suitable receptacle for dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may from time to time be produced in the keeping of such animals in such building or upon such premises. He shall cause such receptacle to be constructed that the bottom or floor thereof shall not in any case be lower than the surface of the ground adjoining such receptacle.

He shall also cause such receptacle to be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and to be maintained at all times in such a condition, as to prevent any escape of the contents thereof or any soakage therefrom into the wall of any building.

- He shall, twice at least in every week, remove, or cause to be removed, from the receptacle provided in accordance with the requirements of this By-law, all dung, manure, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter produced in or upon such building or premises and deposited in such receptacle.
- 151. The occupier of any premises shall not keep cattle or deposit the dung of any cattle in such a situation or in such a manner as to pollute any water supplied for use, or used, or likely to be used, by man for domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of men, or any water used or likely to be used in any dairy.
- 152. Except in cases where any sewage, soil, filth, dung, ashes, dust, rubbish, or manure are produced on his own premises, and are removed for sale or applied for his own use as manure, no person shall remove from off any premises any such matters unless previously authorised or licensed by the Board, or unless by special written leave of the Board.
- 153. Any person guilty of any breach of, or neglect, or failure to observe, or perform any of the foregoing By-laws, or any notice or order given thereunder shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £10, or less than 5s.; or in case of a continued breach or neglect, shall pay a penalty not exceeding £5 or less than 5s. for each day during which such breach or neglect continues.
- 154. The Board may in its discretion issue to persons of respectable characters licenses to be called "Dustman's Licenses," and every licensed person shall pay therefor a fee of 5s, per month, and every license shall be terminable as hereinafter mentioned, or on one month's notice, and shall in all cases be subject to these By-laws.
- 155. No licensed person shall ask, demand, or receive, for the removal of any refuse, more than the sum set forth in the Schedule hereto mentioned, and every such person shall be entitled to demand and sue for from the owner or occupier, as the case may be, such fee, but no more.
- 156. Licensed persons shall remove all refuse as and when required by the owner or occupier, as the case may be, or by these By-Laws, and use all despatch, care and cleanliness in the performance of their duties; they shall at all times obey the orders and directions of the Health Inspector and his assistants; they shall provide carts and baskets, of design approved by the Inspector; they shall have all carts painted on each side thereof the words "Licensed Dustman" in letters at least four inches long; they shall register their names and addresses with the Inspector, and inform him of any change thereof, and they shall at all times behave with civility in the discharge of their duties.
- 157. The Inspector may cancel or suspend the license of any person who commits a breach of or neglects or fails to observe these By-laws.
