By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by Proclamations dated respectively the 7th day of June, 1892, the 4th day of July, 1893, the 4th day of April, 1894, and the 27th day of September, 1894, issued under "The Game Act, 1892," various birds therein mentioned were in some instances preserved for a certain season in each year, and in other instances strictly preserved, and their destruction in any way wholly forbidden: AND WHEREAS it is deemed desirable to strictly preserve all birds on the Abrolhos Islands: Now, THEREFORE, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare all birds on the Abrolhos Islands to be strictly preserved, and their destruction in any way wholly forbidden; And whereas by "The Game Act, 1892," it is further provided that the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, may, by like Proclamation, declare any portion of the Colony or locality a Reserve for Native Game: Now, THERE-FORE, I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby declare the Abrolhos Islands a Reserve for Native Game, and all shooting, and taking or destroying eggs within the limits of such Islands are strictly prohibited.

W HEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to declare any portion of the Colony to be a Magisterial District, and to name such District, and to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of a Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that that portion of the Colony contained within the following boundaries:-

Bounded by lines starting from the Eastern Railway, and extending due South five miles towards the North-East corner of Helena Location 22; thence East-North-Easterly to the North-West corner of Avon Location F; thence East-North-Easterly along North boundaries of Avon Locations F and J to the North-East corner of Location J, and the rest of the North-East corner of Location J, and the rest of the North East corner of Location J, Locations F and J to the North-East corner of Location J, and thence due East; on the North by the Eastern Railway to the Clackline; thence Northwards along the branch Railway to Newcastle, to a spot West-South-Westerly from the North-West corner of Avon Location X; thence East-North-Easterly along Northern boundary of Location X to the East side of the Avon River; thence down said river to the North boundary of Avon Location U; thence East-North-Easterly along North boundary of Location U aforesaid, and on to the South-West corner of Avon Location 895; thence East-North-Easterly to the South-East corner of Avon Location 296: thence North-North-Westerly to the s95; thence East-North-Easterly to the South-East corner of Avon Location 296; thence North-Westerly to the North-West corner of Avon Location W; thence East-North-Easterly to the North-East corner of Location W aforesaid, and thence due East; on the East by a due South line produced through a spot 10 miles West of the trigonometrical station on Yorkrakine Hill,

shall be, and is hereby, constituted a Magisterial District, to be known as the

NORTHAM MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

And I do hereby with the like advice, alter the boundaries of the Victoria, York, and Toodyay Magisterial Districts respectively, and declare them to be as follows:-

BOUNDARIES OF THE VICTORIA MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an East line from the sea-coast to the summit of Mount Murchison; on the Eastward by a South-South-West line to the summit of Tallering Peak; thence South-Easterly to the summit of Tahering Feak; thence South-Easterly to the summit of Mugga Mugga Hill and onwards to the summit of Mount Gibson, which lies about 12 miles South-West from Ninghan Creek; thence Eastward to Trigonometrical Station K83 on the Western shore of Lake Moore; thence due East to the Western boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District, and along it South to a point due East of Mount Lesueur; on the South by a due West line passing through the summit of said Mount Lesueur to the sea-coast; and on the West by the said sea-coast and the islands adjacent.

BOUNDARIES OF THE YORK MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the *North* by an East-North-Easterly line, starting from a spot five miles due South from the Eastern starting from a spot five miles due South from the Eastern Railway towards the North-East corner of Helena Location 22, and extending to the North-West corner of Avon Location F; thence East-North-Easterly along the North boundaries of Avon Locations F and J to the North-East corner of Location J, and thence due East; on the West by a due South line to the South-East corner of Helena Location 22, and thence in a Southerly direction to the summit of Mount Dale; thence by a South-Easterly line from Mount Dale to a spot 20 miles due East from the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road; then in about the same direction to the Hotham River at Reserve 225A at Cojatotine Pool; on the Southward from the South end of the Western boundary, extending in a North-Easterly direction along the Hotham River upwards to Millingnalling Pool, and thence due East; and on the East by a due South line produced to a spot 10 miles West of the trigonometrical station on Yorkrakine Hill.

BOUNDARIES OF THE TOODYAY MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by a line starting from the sea-coast, and extending due East, passing through the summit of Mount Lesueur to the West boundary of the Yilgarn Magisterial District; on the West by the sea-coast, in-cluding the islands adjacent; on the South and South-West by lines extending East from the coast aforesaid to a spot on the North branch of the Moore River, where the South boundary of Melbourne Location 93 at Gillingarra crosses it. theree daynwards along the said North branch to the it; thence downwards along the said North branch to the junction of the North and East branches of the Moore River; thence in a South-South-Easterly direction to the 60th Mile mark on the road from Perth to New Norcia; thence to the South-West corner of Swan Location 95, at Bailup; thence by a South-Easterly line to a spot on the Eastern Railway due North from the North-East corner of

Helena Location 22; thence by the said Eastern Railway to the Clackline; thence Northwards along the branch Railway to Newcastle, to a spot West-South-Westerly from the North-West corner of Avon Location X; thence East-North-Easterly along Northern boundary of Location X to the East side of the Avon River; thence down said river to the North boundary of Avon Location U; thence East-North-Easterly along North boundary of Location U aforesaid, and on to the South-West corner of Avon Location 895; thence East-North-Easterly to the South-East corner of Avon Location 296; thence North-North-Westerly to the North-West corner of Avon Location W; thence East-North-Easterly to the North-East corner of Location W aforesaid, and thence due East; on the East by a due North line produced through a spot 10 miles West of the trigonometrical station on Yorkrakine Hill. By-Law No. 5.—Municipal Rates.

1. All Municipal Rates shall be payable half-yearly, and the Collector for the time being duly appointed by the Council shall, at the commencement of each half-year, leave with the person liable to pay the same, or at his residence, a notice of the amount due by such person, and requiring payment within fourteen days, and shall afterwards apply personally for payment for the same, and if the amount be not paid at the expiration of fourteen days after such applications. plication, shall take legal proceedings for its recovery.

Municipality of Perth.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the City of Perth may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for the regulating or prohibiting of bathing in any, or in any part of any river, creek, stream, sea, or any other open public water within the limits of, or abutting on the boundary of the Munici-

pality.

(b.) Setting apart any place or any portion of any such water for the sole use of either sex.

(c.) Fixing the hours within which persons may bathe, clothing.

(d.) Authorising the erection and use of bathing houses, sheds, or machines, and providing for such other matters as appear expedient for preserving decency or promoting the convenience of the public in connection with bathing.

(e.) For the general management of public baths, and the conduct of visitors thereat, and for fixing the sums to be

paid for the use thereof.

(f.) For the division of such baths, so as to afford sufficient separate accommodaton for the sexes, and private baths for either. (g.) For the regulation in public baths or hot and cold

baths and shower baths, vapour and medical baths, the requisites to be supplied, and the sums to be paid therefor.

The Council of the City of Perth doth hereby make the following By-laws, that is to say:—

1. All By-laws heretofore made on the matters and

things contained herein are hereby repealed.

2. Throughout these By-laws the expression "Council" means the Mayor, Councillors, and citizens of the City of Perth.

"Person" shall mean male or female.

The singular shall include the plural, and the plural the singular.

3. Every person resorting to the baths shall before being admitted to any bath or bath-room, obtain by payment from the person authorised a ticket whereon shall be stated, in addition to such other particulars as the Council may from

time to time direct, the class or description of bath to which such person shall be entitled to be admitted.

Such person, before being admitted to use such bath, shall, upon application of any person appointed or acting as an attendant of such bath, deliver such ticket to such attendant.

4. A person shall not, by forcible or improper means, seek admission to any bath-room or compartment which shall

be occupied by any person using a separate bath.

5. A person shall not, by forcible or improper means seek admission to any swimming bath at any time when such swimming bath, or the dressing rooms, closets, boxes

or compartments attached thereto, shall be occupied by the full number of persons authorised to use, at one and the same time, such swimming bath, or dressing rooms, closets, boxes, or compartments.

- 6. A person shall not, by forcible or improper means, seek admission to any bath before any person who, by priority of payment, shall be entitled to prior admission to such bath.
- 7. A person shall not knowingly use any bath of a higher class or description than that of the bath for which he shall have obtained a ticket of admission.
- 8. Every person shall, while waiting on the premises for admission to any bath or bath-room, remain only in such portion of the premises as shall be set apart as a waiting room for intending bathers.
- 9. A person shall not, after using any bath or quitting any bathroom, loiter or remain without any reasonable excuse in any passage leading to or from any bath or bath-
- 10. A person shall not, at any time, after being admitted to any swimming bath, or while occupying any dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment attached thereto, enter or seek admission to any other dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment when occupied by any person without the consent of such person, or otherwise knowingly intrude upon or interfere with the privacy of any other person using such swimming bath or occupying any dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment attached thereto.
- 11. A person shall not, at any time, after being admitted to or while occupying any bathroom or compartment containing a separate bath, enter or seek admission from such bathroom or compartment to any adjoining bathroom or compartment when occupied by any person without the consent of such person, or otherwise knowingly intrude upon or interfere with the privacy of any person occupying any adjoining bathroom or compartment.
- 12. No man, or boy above seven years old, resorting to the baths shall enter or use any bath which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any woman or girl, or child under seven years old.
- 13. No woman or girl, or child under seven years old resorting to the baths, shall enter or use any bath which shall be appointed or appropriated for the use of any man, or boy above seven years old.
- 14. Every person resorting to the baths shall, at all times, exercise reasonable and proper care in the use of any bath or bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment.
- 15. A person resorting to the baths shall not, at any time, carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with the use and efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, or machinery in connection with any bath, or carelessly or negligently injure any furniture, fittings, or conveniences of any bath, bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment.
- 16. A person shall not, at any time, carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towel or other linen or other article supplied for his use.
- 17. A person shall not, at any time, while being upon the premises, by any disorderly or improper conduct, disturb or interrupt any other person in the proper use of any bath, bath-room, dressing-rooms, closet, box, or compartment, or any officer, servant, or person appointed by the Council, or employed by the lessee, in the proper execution of his duty.
- A person shall not cause or allow any dog belonging to such person, or under his control, to enter or remain in any bath, bath-room, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, or in any passage leading to or from any bath or bath-room.
- 19. A person shall not, at any time, while being upon the premises, use any indecent and offensive language, or behave in an indecent and offensive manner.
- A person shall not, at any time, while being in any swimming bath, use any soap or other substance or pre-paration whereby the water in such swimming bath may be rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of the bathers.
- 21. A person shall not wilfully and improperly foul or pollute the water in any separate bath or in any swimming bath, or wilfully and improperly soil or defile any towel, bathing drawers, or bathing dress supplied for his use, or any bathroom, dressing-room, closet, box, or compartment, or any furniture or article therein.
- A person shall not, at any time while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious, or contagious disease, enter or use any swimming bath or any separate bath.
- 23. A person shall not deface by writing, or otherwise, the walls or any portion of the baths.
- 24. A person under the influence of intoxicating liquor shall not be permitted to enter the baths.
- 25. A person shall not smoke on the platforms, or in the sheds, or dressing boxes.

- 26. Any towel or other linen or other article supplied to any person must be returned before the person using same leaves the building.
- A person shall not be allowed to remain on the bath premises for a longer period than one hour.
- 28. A person shall not commit a nuisance on any part of the premises.
- 29. No person shall climb up or sit upon either the partition division, between the ladies' and gentlemen's baths, or the surrounding fence.
- The baths shall be opened on every week day from the 1st November to 31st March inclusive, at the hour of 6 in the forenoon, and close at the hour of 9 in the afternoon; and from the 1st April to the 31st October, inclusive, the baths shall be opened on every week day at the hour of 6 in the forenoon, and close at the hour of 8 in the afternoon. The said baths shall be opened on every Sunday at the hours of 6 in the forenoon and 3 in the afternoon, and closed at the hours of 12 noon and 8 in the afternoon respectively.
 - 31. The scale of charges for a bath shall be as follows:-Boys and girls under 16 years of age, 2d. Adults, 3d., or 12 tickets for 2s. 6d.

 For the use of towels, 1d. each.

 trunks, for men and boys, 1d.

 ladies' costumes, 3d.

- All children attending schools may be admitted by ticket, provided always that tickets shall be obtained through the school master or mistress, who shall be provided with tickets at the rate of 100 for 8s. 4d.; the children to provide towels and drawers or pay the ordinary price for same.
- 32. No person shall bathe in any swimming bath without wearing a proper bathing costume.
- 33. No person shall pull down, deface, or otherwise injure any copies of these By-laws.
- 34. Every person who shall offend against any of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding £20.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," Section 99, the Council of the City of Perth may make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for the suppression and restraint of brothels and houses of ill-fame and repute, the said Council doth hereby order as follows:

- Upon representation of any three respectable ratepayers that any house or premises within the Municipality, and near to the residence of such ratepayers, is a brothel or a house of ill-fame, it shall be lawful for the Council to cause the proprietor, or any person having the control or management or being the occupier of such house or premises, to furnish to the Council a list of names, ages, sexes, and occupations of all the inmates of the said house or premises; and upon non-compliance with such request, or premises; and upon non-compliance with such request, or if, upon consideration, the Council consider the house to be a brothel or a house of ill-fame, they shall declare the same to be a nuisance; and shall cause a notice, in writing, to be served upon the proprietor, or any person having control or management or being the occupier of such house or premises, or any person resident or being therein, to discontinue or abate the said nuisance within forty-eight hours after the receipt of such notice. And if, after the expiration of forty-eight hours after the receipt of such notice, such nuisance be not so abated, the proprietor, or any person having control or management or being the any person having control or management or being the occupier of such house or premises, shall be liable to be proceeded against for such nuisance, and shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £20.
- 2. Any person letting any house or premises, knowing that such house is about to be used or is being used by the tenant or occupier thereof as a brothel, shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £20 for each offence.

"The Immigration Restriction Act, 1897."

GOVERNMENT

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations in relation to persons brought into Western Australia for employment in the Pearl Shell Fisheries :-

G. F. ELIOT. Acting Under Secretary.

- 1. No person brought into the Colony for employment in the Pearl Shell Fisheries, shall land, or be permitted to land, except within a duly proclaimed port Northward of the 27th parallel of South latitude; and within two days of landing a written agreement for employment, in the form in Schedule "A" hereto, shall be entered into between the employer and the person employed before an Inspector of Pour Shall Fisheries or an Officer of Customs. The agreement shall be made in duplicate, one of which shall be retained by the Inspector or Officer of Customs, who shall indorse thereon a bond in the form in Schedule B hereto, which bond shall be duly executed by the employer.
- 2. Upon an agreement being entered into as aforesaid, particulars of the same shall be registered by an Inspector or an Officer of Customs in the form in Schedule C hereto, and a certificate shall be given to the person employed in the form in Schedule D hereto, which shall be renewed annually.
- Every engagement shall be for the term stated in the agreement; but at the expiration of every term of service it shall be lawful for the person employed to re-engage himself to the same or another employer, provided that on every re-engagement an agreement shall be entered into and registered, and a certificate obtained, as herebefore provided in the case of an original engagement.
- Forthwith, after entering into every agreement as aforesaid, the person employed shall be actually engaged in the fishery, and shall not land, or be permitted to land, or remain on shore during the engagement, except as hereinafter provided, that is to say:
 - (a.) In case of sickness, or for other sufficient reason, in the discretion of an Inspector or an Officer of Customs, a person employed may, with permission in writing signed by an Inspector or Officer of Customs, go on shore within the limits of the port named in the permit, and there remain for a period limited by the permit.
 - (b.) A person employed may, at the expiration of his engagement, with the like permission go and remain on shore within the limits of the port for a period not exceeding three months.
 - (c.) With the like permission, an employer may employ labourers on shore, within the limits of the port, in the case of a vessel being laid up for the hurricane season or for repairs.
- 5. On the discharge of any person employed as aforesaid, the employer shall forthwith pay into the hands of an Officer of Customs the passage money of the person employed from the port of registration to Singapore, but in the event of the person employed

duly entering into another lawful contract for employment within the Colony, instead of leaving the Colony, the said passage money shall be returned by the officer to the employer who shall have paid

Any breach of these Regulations shall be deemed a contravention of the said Act within the meaning of section 17 thereof, and shall subject the person offending to a fine not exceeding £50, and to be imprisoned, with or without hard labour, until such fine is paid, or in addition to such fine, but not in any case for a period exceeding three months.

Aborigines Department, Perth, 1st May, 1898.

THE care and protection of the Aborigines having now devolved upon the Government, it is to be considered part of the public duty of Resident Magistrates, Resident Medical Officers, and Police Officers to assist in every way in promoting the welfare of the Natives and in providing relief to the aged, infirm, and sick, due regard being given to the practice of strict economy.

In cases of sickness Medical Officers are expected to attend Natives as part of their public duties, in the same way as they attend indigent persons.

In order to carry out these measures it is desirable that monthly lists should be furnished to the Aborigines Department, giving as far as possible information as to the names, sex, ages, and condition of the Natives to whom relief has been given, care being taken that, as a general rule, no able-bodied Natives who can provide for their own maintenance should receive rations.

Accounts should be rendered monthly, certified by a Resident Magistrate, a Government Medical Officer, or a Police Officer.

Regulations for the Control and Management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.

Is Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, 13th December, 1893, and 19th June, 1896, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof:—

- 1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of £4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.
- 2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days from date thereof it shall be lawful for the Inspector to cancel such license. Provided that, in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block irrespective of the area.
- 3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.
- 4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.
- 5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.
- 6. No person shall destroy or preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.
- 7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.
- 8. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.
- 9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.
- 10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so-called "Pick-up banks."

- 11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand, or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.
- 12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year the exact dates to be named in such notice.
- 13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.
- 14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.
- 15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.
- 16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.
- 17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

The Inspector may seize and remove any shell so obtained, and any other shell that may be found in possession of any person who may be found collecting shell by dredging or otherwise from any Government Reserve, and any person so found shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

- 18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.
- 19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed two square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of £1.

In all applications for exclusive licenses, the length of the licensed area shall not exceed twice its width.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas.

- 21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may, in open Court, refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.
- 22. All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a bonâ fide manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting, and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.
- 23. The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.
- 24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.
- 25. It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be final.

Penalties.

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

Orders under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880."

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 26th May, 1898.

It is hereby notified, for general information, that under the powers conferred upon him by "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44th Vict., No. 5), His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to authorise the publication of the following Orders regulating the importation and disinfection of vine cuttings, buds, grapes, trees, plants, cuttings (other than vines), grafts, buds, seeds, pits, scions, and fruits respectively.

Orders regulating the Importation and Disinfection of Vine Cuttings Buds and Grapes.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall within forty-eight hours of the arrival of such vine cuttings at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or a Local Inspector appointed in that behalf. In the event of the consignee or his agent failing to deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the said vine cuttings. If upon such seizure the said vine cuttings are found to be infected with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or vines or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said vine cuttings are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall dip the said vine cuttings as per Order 5 and hold the same to the order of the consignee or his agent for seven clear days from the time of disinfection.
- 2. The importation of vines with roots or of vines that have had their roots cut off is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited except as hereinafter provided and subject to these regulations which shall be strictly observed.
- 3. Grapes may be imported from South Australia subject to the regulations in force for the time being for the examination and disinfection of imported fruits.
- 4. Vine cuttings or buds may be imported from South Australia—provided that all such cuttings and buds shall be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed.
- 5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings and buds required by the preceding order shall be effected by dipping the same in a solution of one pound of Sulphide of Lime to twenty gallons of water the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings or buds shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in the Schedule hereunder.

6. After the vine cuttings have been dipped they shall if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen days for further disinfecting or if found to be infected with injurious insects which cannot in the opinion of the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be destroyed by the treatment required by Order No. 5 the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire.

- 7. Vine cuttings may be imported from any country or province other than South Australia provided that any person about to import such cuttings shall at the time of ordering the same furnish a duplicate of such order to the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and provided also that such cuttings shall not be imported for at least one month after the duplicate of such order shall have been so furnished as aforesaid.
- 8. All vine cuttings so imported pursuant to the next preceding order shall be absolutely surrendered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the port of debarkation for the purpose of being quarantined as hereinafter provided.
- 9. All vine cuttings imported as aforesaid from any country or province other than South Australia shall be quarantined by the Department of Agriculture for a period of not less than 12 months nor longer than two years upon such grounds as from time to time shall be set apart by the said Department by advertising in the Government Gazette as quarantine stations. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings as aforesaid shall at the time of delivering the same to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of being quarantined pay to the Secretary a sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 cuttings so delivered and at the expiration of the period of quarantine shall upon taking delivery of his rooted vines pay the further sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 rooted vines so delivered to him.
- 10. Any vine cuttings imported from any country or province other than South Australia which shall in the opinion of the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be affected with insects fungi blight or other diseases injurious to grape vines or other trees or plants shall be destroyed under the direction of the said Inspector and the expense connected therewith shall be borne by and recoverable from the importer of such vine cuttings.
- 11. The Department of Agriculture shall not be liable for any loss resulting from the destruction of any cuttings under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs or by reason of the infertility of any such cuttings while in or after leaving their custody or whilst under their control.

Orders regulating the Disinfection of Imported Trees Plants Cuttings (other than Vines) Grafts Buds Seeds Pits Scions and Fruits.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings or buds) seeds pits or scions shall within forty-eight (48) hours after the arrival of any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the same to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and in the event of any such consignee or his agent failing to so deliver any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions within forty-eight (48) hours as aforesaid the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the same. If upon such seizure the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to vines or fruit trees or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall treat the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions as may be directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and hold same until applied for by the consignee or agent provided that if the same be not applied for within seven clear days from time of seizure the same may be destroyed.
- 2. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees or plants they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests or their eggs larvæ or pupæ.

- 3. All peach nectarine apricot plum prune almond and all trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots and all peach or other pits cuttings buds or scions raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.
- 4. The importation of the fruits—apples pears and quinces into any port in Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude is absolutely prohibited.
- 5. The importation of fresh fruits of every description from the Province of Queensland is absolutely prohibited.
- 6. Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must before removal from the first port or place of debarkation be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and if found infested with insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees or to other trees shall be destroyed or otherwise treated as the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture may direct. If the fruit on examination be found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate to that effect after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit was packed has been disinfected as prescribed by Order 7 and on receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection prescribed in the Schedule I. hereto. Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall if such fruit is found to be free from disease issue a certificate to that effect upon payment of the fee for inspection prescribed in the said schedule.
- 7. Transportable material of any kind used for packing or surrounding fruit is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation or from being offered for sale gift distribution or transportation until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping the same and keeping it continually submerged for a period of not less than two (2) minutes in boiling water containing in solution not less than one pound (11b.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.
- 8. Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 7 before removal from the first port or place of debarkation.
- 9. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be disinfected by being dipped in a solution of one pound (1lb.) of whale oil soap (80 per cent.) to each and every gallon of water such whale oil soap solution being kept at a temperature of 115 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit. The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall remain in said solution not less than two (2) minutes. After the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been so disinfected they shall if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection or for further disinfection and if said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are then found to be infested they shall be destroyed by fire.
- 10. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be further disinfected by funnigation with hydrocyanic acid gas as follows:—The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall be covered with an air-tight box and for each and every one hundred (100) cubic feet of space therein there shall be used:—

For plants in pots and in leaf-

400 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ ounces of fluid sulphuric acid

For fruit trees and shrubs-

530 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and three-quarter $(1\frac{3}{4})$ ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

The cyanide of potassium shall be placed in a generator and the chamber immediately closed tightly when the sulphuric acid shall be added. The chamber shall remain close! for not less than sixty (60) minutes. After the said

- trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been treated with the hydrocyanic acid gas as above directed they shall (if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector) remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection and further treatment or destruction by fire if necessary.
- 11. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first port or place of debarkation and if found infested with injurious insects which cannot be destroyed by the remedies required by Rules 9 and 10 of these Orders they shall be seized and destroyed by fire.
- 12. Consignees must deliver within forty-eight (48) hours of arrival the fruit fruit trees packages and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection consignees or their agents must repack the fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material that have been disinfected and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.
- 13. Any fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection and not disinfected within forty-eight (48) hours by reason of the default of the consignee to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacking may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.
- 14. Agents and other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of fruits and of fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings) or buds seeds pits and scions shall pay for the inspection and if necessary the disinfection thereof the fees set out in Schedules I. and II. respectively:—

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

- 1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony that have formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.
- At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within two years, by eight equal instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.
- In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within one year from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.

Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, under Section 44 of the Homesteads Act, to apply to any Town or Suburban Lands situate within the boundaries of any proclaimed Goldfield which may be declared open for selection as Residential Lots:—

- 1. Application for leases of the natural surface of any lots within the prescribed area to a depth of 20ft. may be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands. through the Warden, by any male person above the age of 18 years, upon the following terms:—
- 2. The application shall be in the form prescribed, and shall be lodged with the Warden, and shall set forth the number, area, and position of the lot applied for.
- 3. The rent payable in respect of each lot shall be £1 per annum, which shall, in the first instance, be lodged with the application, and subsequently paid annually on the first day of March, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 101 of the Land Regulations. When paying the annual rent the holder of each lot shall make a statutory declaration that the conditions of residence hereinafter set forth have been complied with or fulfilled. A fee of £1, in addition to the first year's rent, shall accompany each application.
- 4. The Warden shall forward the application, together with his recommendation thereon, to the Commissioner of Crown Lands immediately after receipt thereof, and he may thereupon deliver to the applicant an approval notice in the form hereinafter provided, and the production of such notice shall be sufficient evidence of the right of the holder thereof to occupy the lot therein mentioned under these regulations, pending the decision of the Commissioner of Crown Lands thereon. Should the application be approved, a lease in the form prescribed will be issued to the applicant on the surrender by him of the approval notice, but should the application be refused, notice of such refusal will be gazetted, and the rent paid will be refunded to the applicant on application to the Warden.
- 5. The lot leased shall be used solely as the habitual abode of the holder or members of his family for at least six months in each year, and for no other purpose whatever.
- 6. The holder of any lot may surrender the same at any time, and shall at the time of surrender furnish to the Warden a detached list of the nature and value of improvements existing on such lot. The lot so surrendered shall then be thrown open for re-selection, and may be applied for as provided for by these regulations. Any person to whom such lot is granted shall pay to the Warden the value of any improvements then existing on such lot, which value shall thereupon be paid by the Warden to the original holder. Should the person re-applying object to the value set upon the improvements by the original holder, a valuation shall be made by two arbitrators, one appointed by each party, and in accordance with the provisions of "The Arbitration Act, 1895," the Warden being the umpire in case of disagreement, and the cost of such arbitration shall be borne by the original holder or the person re-applying, as the arbitrators may direct.
- 7. No person who shall have surrendered or forfeited a lot shall be eligible to select another lot within a mile of the lot originally held by him, until six months shall have elapsed from the date of surrender or forfeiture of such lot.

- 8. The Governor may at any time exempt from the operations of these regulations any portion or portions of any town or suburban lands so set apart, which may be required for mining or other purposes.
- 9. Any lot or lots or portions thereof that may have been granted as a residential lot may be resumed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, on the payment to the holder of such lot or lots the fair value of any improvements existing on such lots at the time of resumption, such value to be ascertained in the like manner as prescribed by Clause 6 hereof. The resumption shall take effect upon notice thereof to the holder, in writing under the hand of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, being served on the holder or published in the Government Gazette.
- 10. All leases granted under these regulations shall expire on the 31st day of December following the date of grant, and may be renewed from year to year, at the option of the Commissioner of Crown Lands. The acceptance of rent shall be conclusive evidence of such renewal.
- 11. No person shall be entitled to hold more than one lot at a time.
- 12. Lots held under these regulations shall not be transferable.
- 13. On proof satisfactory to the Warden that any of the conditions contained in the foregoing Regulations have not been complied with, the Warden may declare the lot liable to forfeiture, and in such case he shall report the matter to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, by whom the lot may be declared forfeited. All lots forfeited shall be thrown open for re-selection. All improvements on any forfeited lot shall be the property of the Crown.
