Any waypung it is a modified that to time direct: AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the said Act should apply to the whole of the Broad Arrow and North-East Coolgardie Goldfields : Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that on and after the 1st day of July, 1898, the said Act shall apply to the whole of the aforementioned Goldfields.

BY THE QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

We do hereby, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :-

1. A branch of our Mint shall be established at or near Perth in our Colony of Western Australia, on such site as the Governor of the Colony in Council may approve.

2. Gold coins may be coined at the branch Mint so established, and shall be of the same denominations, designs, weights, and fineness, and subject to the allowance of the same remedy, as gold coins coined at Our Mint in Exclored England.

3. The Master of Our Mint shall prepare and transmit dies for the gold coins to be coined at the branch Mint at Perth.

4. The gold coins coined in pursuance of this proclama-tion at the branch Mint at Perth shall be deemed to have been issued from Our Mint, and shall be current and a legal tender in like manner and to the like extent as if they had been coined and issued in England.

(i.) If any person brings to the branch Mint at Perth any gold bullion, the Deputy Master of that branch shall assay coin and deliver out the same to such person upon payment for every ounce Troy of gold of standard fineness, of a charge of three halfpence where the amount brought at one time does not exceed five hundred ounces, and of a penny in any other case, provided that—

(a) where the gold bullion so brought is such that it cannot be brought to the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout without refining the whole or some portion of it, the Deputy Master shall demand for assaying and refining the same such additional charge as the Governor in Council may from time to time fix, and until such charge is paid to him may refuse to receive, assay, or coin such bullion; and

- (b) where the bullion brought to the branch Mint for coinage is finer than the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout, there shall be delivered to the person bringing the same such additional amount of coin as is proportionate to such superior fineness;
- (c) no undue preference shall be shown to any person as respects the bullion brought to the branch Mint, and every person shall have priority according to the time at which he brought it;
- (d) the Governor of Western Australia in Council may make regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of this Article with respect to gold bullion, and the bringing, coining, and delivery out thereof, and in particular for regulating the time and conditions at and under which it is to be so brought, assayed, coined, and delivered out, and the minimum amount which may be so brought.

(ii.) The charges under this article for coining, assaying, and refining shall be collected by the Deputy Master in ac-cordance with the said regulations either as a payment in advance or as a deduction from the coin delivered out, or otherwise, and shall be accounted for and paid over in such manner as the Governor in Council directs to the Colonial Treasurer of Western Australia to be by him paid into the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

6. Subject to the provisions of this proclamation, the branch Mint at Perth, shall, for the purposes of the coinage of gold coins be deemed to be part of Our Mint, and accordingly

- (a.) the Deputy Master shall comply with all direc tions he may receive from the Master of Our Mint, whether as regards the returns to be made, or the delivery of coin for public use, or the transmission of specimen coins to England or otherwise; and
- (b) the said specimen coins shall be subject to the thial of the pyx under Section 12 of "The Coinage Act, 1870," so, however, that they shall be examined separately from the coins coined in Eveloped and England; and
- (c) the Deputy Master and other officers and persons for the purpose of carrying on the business of the branch Mint may be appointed, promoted, suspended, and removed, and their duties assigned and salaries awarded, under Section 15 of "The Coinage Act, 1870."

7. The Governor of Western Australia in Council shall cause the store of gold bullion and coin at the branch Mint at Perth to be inspected half-yearly, and cause the persons inspecting the same to report thereon to the Deputy Master of the branch Mint, stating the exact amount of builton and coin inspected by them; and such report shall be transmitted by the Deputy Master to the Master of Our Mint in London.

8. The Master of Our Mint shall in the execution of this proclamation act in accordance with any regulations made or directions given by the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury.

9.

- In this proclamation,---The expression "Mint" means Qur Royal Mint in England;
- The expression "Governor" includes the officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony;
- The expression "Deputy Master of the branch Mint" includes any person who lawfully exercises at such branch Mint the authority of Deputy Master of Our Mint.

10. This proclamation shall come into force in Our Colony of Western Australia, on the expiration of six months from the date thereof, unless it is sooner pro-mulgated in the Colony, and in that case, on such promulgation.

BY THE QUEEN. A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, did on the thirteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, issue Our Royal Proclama-tion establishing a branch of Our Royal Mint at Perth, in Our Colony of Western Australia, and by Article ten thereof did direct that such Proclamation should come into force in the said Colony on the expiration of six months from the date thereof, unless it was sooner promulgated in the Colony, and in that case on such promulgation :

And whereas it has been represented to Us that it is desirable to postpone the date at which the said Proclamation is to come into force;

We dc hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows :---

(1.) Article ten of Our Proclamation respecting a branch of our Mint at or near Perth, in Our Colony of Western Australia, bearing date the thirteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, is hereby re-scinded; and there shall be substituted for it the following Article:

This Proclamation shall come into force in Our Colony of Western Australia on the expiration of nine months from the thirteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, unless it is sooner promulgated in the Colony, and in that case on such promulgation.

(2.) This Proclamation shall come into force on the twelfth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, unless it is sooner promulgated, and in that case on such promulgation.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this seventh day of March, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixtyfirst year of Our Reign.

BY-LAW No. 55.-REGULATING PROCESSIONS.

1. No procession of persons, with or without vehicles (except for funeral, military, or police purposes) shall parade or pass through any street or public place within the Municipality, unless and until the consent in writing of the Mayor, or of some Committee of the Council shall be of the Mayor, or or some Committee of the Council shall be first obtained, and then only by such route and at such time as shall be specified in such consent. The cost of advertising the route shall, at the discretion of the Mayor be payable in advance by applicants. 2. Every member of any procession acting in contra-vention of this By-law shall be liable for each such offence to a provide payable in a

BY-LAWS FOR FREMANTLE MUNICIPAL MARKETS In pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in, under, and by virtue of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the Town of Fremantle makes and ordains that the following By-laws for the government, general regulation, good rule, and cleanliness of the Fremantle Markets shall be observed and enforced.

By-LAW NO. 63.-DESIGNATION OF MARKETS.

For the purposes of these By-laws the Fremantle Municipal Markets shall consist of all those buildings, sheds, yards, etc., situated at the corner of South Terrace and Henderson Streets, with the rights of way leading to the said buildings, yards, etc., from Henderson and Norfolk Streets, within the Town of Fremantle.

Regulations

2. The stalls, buildings or erections, yards, etc., together with all other sheds, buildings or erections which may here-after be built or erected shall be the appointed places where butchers' meat, fish, poultry, eggs, butter, cheese, vegetables and provisions shall be sold or disposed of, and shall be open for the use of growers, producers, and others on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays during the year (except when such days shall fall on Christmas Day) and on such other days as the Fremantle Council shall order and determine.

3. That the market, shops, stalls, yards, etc., shall be appropriated for the sale of wares, merchandise, dairy and farm produce, and all other marketable commodities.

4. That any person resisting the Inspector or his assistants in the discharge of his or their duty shall, in-dependently of any other penalty which he or she may incur for assault or otherwise, be guilty of a breach of these By-laws and be punishable accordingly.

5. That the Market shall, except as herein otherwise ordered, be opened at three o'clock in the morning on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, and on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays at sunrise, between the first day of October and the last day of March, both inclusive, in each year, and at four o'clock, a.m., during the rest of the year.

6. That the Market shall, except as herein otherwise ordered, be closed at sunset throughout the year, except on Saturdays and the working day previous to Christmas Day, when it shall remain open until eleven o'clock in the evening.

7. That no person shall sell or expose for sale, or other-wise dispose of, any goods, vegetables, dairy or farm pro-duce, provisions, or other merchantable commodities in the said Market, without first having obtained permission from the Market Inspector to do so, and paid the rent or dues demandable in respect thereof. in such a place, or in such a way, as to cause any obstruction in the yards, buildings, or enclosures in the said Markets, or occupy any other place than such as shall be appointed therefore by the Market Inspector, and shall neglect or refuse to remove the same on being required so to do by the Inspector, or his assistants, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws and be punishable accordingly.

9. That no person shall, except with the consent of the 9. That no person shall, except with the consent of the Inspector, place any nail, hook, peg, or anything else what-ever, in any part of the wood, stone, brick or ironwork of any shop or stall, or other place, or in any way fit up or enclose any shop or stall or other place; or if any person having done any of the aforementioned things shall neglect or refuse to remove such, when required to do so by the Inspector, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of there are have and he purisheable accordingty. these By-laws and be punishable accordingly.

10. That any person who shall sweep or cause to be swept any dirt or rubbish into or upon any of the streets, gutters, footways, yards, or other places of the said markets, and allow the same to remain there, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws and be punishable accordingly.

11. That the holder of any shop, stall, or stand in the said market who shall fail or neglect to thoroughly cleanse his or her shop, stall, or stand, and the footway, gutter, or yard in front thereof, daily shall be deemed to have com-mitted a breach of these By-laws, and be punishable accordingly.

12. That any person who may be desirous of having his or her name or calling affixed to any shop or stall, or to have the said shop or stall enclosed in any particular way, or to make any alteration thereto, shall apply to the Muni-cipal Council of Fremantle for permission to do so, and the cipal Council of Fremantie for permission to do so, and the Council may refuse to allow any of the aforesaid things to be done, or may grant permission for them or any of them to be done; and, if permission be granted, then the name, calling, enclosure, or alteration applied for shall be done under the direction of the Market Inspector, and all costs and charges incurred thereby shall be borne and paid by such applicant.

13. That any person who shall have his or her name or calling affixed to any shop or stall, or make any enclosure or alteration of any kind thereto without first having obtained permission for such from the Municipal Council of Fre-mantle, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws, and be punishable accordingly.

14. That the holder of any shop, stall, store, or stand, within the said markets, shall at all times keep the same clean and in good order, and failing to do so, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws, and be punishable accordingly.

15. That no person shall keep in any place within the said markets, any bad smelling, offensive, or foul matter of any kind whatever; and any person keeping any bad smelling, offensive, or foul matter, after being ordered by the Inspector to remove the same, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws.

16. That any person, who shall have any cart, waggon, carriage, barrow, truck, basket, box, or any other vehicle or receptacle within any part of the said markets, contrary to the direction of the Inspector, shall be guilty of an offence under these By-laws, and be punishable accordingly.

No person shall sell or offer for sale, or dispose of anything whatsoever within the said markets after they are closed, and any person doing so will be deemed guilty of an offence under these By-laws. Provided that this regulation shall not be taken to apply to the holders of lock-up stalls and shops within the market.

Any person who may go into, or appear in the said markets in a drunken or disorderly state, or excite any riot or disturbance, or use any profane, indecent, or abusive language (whether calculated to lead to a breach of the peace or not), or be guilty of any gross or indecent conduct or behaviour, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of these By-laws.

No person (except the caretaker and his family) shall be allowed to sleep within the said market during the time it is closed without first having obtained the consent of the Fremantle Municipal Council, and any person doing so shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws.

20. Any person affixing any name, sign, signboard, or in any way write any figures, device, mark, or deface any of the walls or buildings, or post any bill, notice, paper, or any other matter on any of the walls, frames, flooring, doors, windows, or any other place within the said markets without first having obtained permission for that purpose from the Fremantle Municipal Council shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws.

21. That any person wishing to use the weighing machine within the said markets must do so under the superintendence of the Inspector, and to pay to the Inspector the dues or tolls for the use of the weighbridge; any infringement of this rule will be deemed a breach of these Pur laws. these By-laws.

22. That all dues, tolls, rent, fees, etc., for using the stalls, yards, stands, stores, weighbridge, etc., shall be in accordance with the Schedule hereto annexed, and such dues, tolls, rent, fees, etc., must be paid to the Inspector, and a license obtained for the use of the stalls, yards, stands, stores, weighbridge, etc., before being used.

23. Any person using any of the stalls, yards, stands, stores, weighbridge, or any other place within the said markets must comply with the instructions of the Inspector or his assistants, and failure to do so will be deemed a breach of these By-laws.

24. That no animal of any description shall be allowed within the said markets except those used in drawing vehicles into the said markets, and any person keeping or allowing to be kept any animal within the markets shall be deemed guilty of an offence under these By-laws.

25. That any person being allotted a stall, store, or place within the market, and using any animal to draw any vehicle into the market, shall at once, after taking up a position, remove the animal to the stables or outside of the markets. Failing to do so will be deemed to be a breach of these By-laws.

26. The duties of Inspector shall be generally as follows :-

- (1.) To carry out the combined duties of Inspector and Caretaker.
- (2.) To live on the premises.
- (3.) To keep the markets clean, and carry out the market regulations.
- (4.) To see that all business at the markets is properly conducted.
- (5.) To open the Markets at the appointed times, viz.: On Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, at 3 a.m., and on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fri-days, at sunrise, between the first day of October and the last day of March, both inclusive, in each year, and at 4 o'clock a.m. during the rest of the year.
- (6.) To close the Markets at the appointed time, viz.: At sunset, except Saturdays, when the time of closing shall be 11 p.m.
- (7.) To appoint stands for carts and other vehicles, and issue licenses for the same daily, and receive the proper fees for such licenses.
- (8.) To attend to the weighbridge and collect dues for the use thereof.
- (9.) To keep books of account of all fees and dues collected.
- (10.) To hand over all fees, dues, and moneys collected according to instructions from the Town Clerk.
- (11.) To carry out all instructions of the Council or Market Committee.
- (12.) To light the Markets at such times as may be necessary, and to put out all lights at the proper time.
- (13.) To preserve order and regularity in the Markets.
- (14.) To inspect all articles exposed for sale in the Markets, and to prohibit the sale of any that be unfit for human consumption.
- (15.) To appoint stands for all goods exposed for sale, or disposed within the said markets.
- (16.) To keep the lavatories clean and in good order.
- (17.) To keep all fire extinguishing appliances in proper order, in their proper places, and at all times ready for immediate use.
- (18.) And generally to carry out all duties pertaining to the office of Inspector and Caretaker.

27. That all fees, dues, and rents to be collected by the Inspector shall be in accordance with the Schedule hereto annexed marked A,

28. Any person guilty of an offence against these Bylaws shall be liable for such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of $\pounds 20$, in addition to any costs which the justices hearing the complaint may in their discretion award.

BY-LAW RE CROSSINGS OVER FOOTWAYS.

WHEREAS by the 99th Section of the "Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," it is enacted that every Municipality shall have power to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws for the several purposes specified in the said Act; and whereas by the Sixth Sub-section of the aforesaid section it is enacted that the Council may prescribe the width of, and the mode in which, and the materials whereof crossing places for vehicles and animals from any street to private residences over any footway shall be constructed: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Council of the City of Perth, as follows :—

W.A.

1. All crossings of footways shall not be less than 8 feet in width nor more than 20 feet, and shall be constructed in the following manner :—

- (a.) Where footway is asphalted and timber-kerbed, the crossing shall be constructed of properly prepared granite sets, 9in. x 5in. x 6in. in depth, grouted with good Portland cement mortar, and graded and completed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.
- (b.) Where footway is gravelled or otherwise formed and timber-kerbed, the crossing shall be composed of capstone bottoming 7in. in depth, with a top layer of gravel 4in. thick, well rolled and graded, and completed to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

2. Every person who shall commit a breach of this Bylaw shall for every such breach or neglect be liable to a penalty of not exceeding $\pounds 20$.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that under the powers conferred upon him by "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44th Vict., No. 5), His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to authorise the publication of the following Orders regulating the importation and disinfection of vine cuttings, buds, grapes, trees, plants, cuttings (other than vines), grafts, buds, seeds, pits, scions, and fruits respectively.

Orders regulating the Importation and Disinfection of Vine Cuttings Buds and Grapes.

1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall within forty-eight hours of the arrival of such vine cuttings at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or a Local Inspector appointed in that behalf. In the event of the consignee or his agent failing to deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the said vine cuttings. If upon such seizure the said vine cuttings are found to be infected with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said vine cuttings are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall dip the said vine cuttings as per Order 5 and hold the same to the order of the consignee or his agent for seven clear days from the time of disinfection.

2. The importation of vines with roots or of vines that have had their roots cut off is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited except as hereinafter provided and subject to these regulations which shall be strictly observed.

3. Grapes may be imported from South Australia subject to the regulations in force for the time being for the examination and disinfection of imported fruits.

4. Vine cuttings or buds may be imported from South Australia—provided that all such cuttings and buds shall be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed.

5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings and buds required by the preceding order shall be effected by dipping the same in a solution of one pound of Sulphide of Line to twenty gallons of water the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings or buds shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in the Schedule hereunder.

6. After the vine cuttings have been dipped they shall if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen days for further disinfecting or if found to be infected with injurious insects which cannot in the opinion of the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be destroyed by the treatment required by Order No. 5 the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire. 7. Vine cuttings may be imported from any country or province other than South Australia provided that any person about to import such cuttings shall at the time of ordering the same furnish a duplicate of such order to the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and provided also that such cuttings shall not be imported for at least one month after the duplicate of such order shall have been so furnished as aforesaid.

8. All vine cuttings so imported pursuant to the next preceding order shall be absolutely surrendered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the port of debarkation for the purpose of being quarantined as hereinafter provided.

9. All vine cuttings imported as aforesaid from any country or province other than South Australia shall be quarantined by the Department of Agriculture for a period of not less than 12 months nor longer than two years upon such grounds as from time to time shall be set apart by the said Department by advertising in the *Government Gazette* as quarantine stations. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings as aforesaid shall at the time of delivering the same to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of being quarantined pay to the Secretary a sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 cuttings so delivered and at the expiration of the period of quarantine shall upon taking delivery of his rooted vines pay the further sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 rooted vines so delivered to him.

10. Any vine cuttings imported from any country or province other than South Australia which shall in the opinion of the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be affected with insects fungi blight or other diseases injurious to grape vines or other trees or plants shall be destroyed under the direction of the said Inspector and the expense connected therewith shall be borne by and recoverable from the importer of such vine cuttings.

11. The Department of Agriculture shall not be liable for any loss resulting from the destruction of any cuttings under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs or by reason of the infertility of any such cuttings while in or after leaving their custody or whilst under their control.

Orders regulating the Disinfection of Imported Trees Plants Cuttings (other than Vines) Grafts Buds Seeds Pits Scions and Fruits.

1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings or buds) seeds pits or scions shall within forty-eight (48) hours after the arrival of any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the same to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and in the event of any such consignee or his agent failing to so deliver any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions within forty-eight (48) hours as aforesaid the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the same. If upon such seizure the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to vines or fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall inmediately destroy the same by fire but if the said fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall treat the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions as may be directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and hold same until applied for by the consignee or agent provided that if the same be not applied for within seven clear days from time of seizure the same may be destroyed.

2. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits o scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees or plants they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests or their eggs lavvæ or pupæ. 3. All peach nectarine apricot plum prune almond and all trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots and all peach or other pits cuttings buds or scions raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.

4. The importation of the fruits—apples pears and quinces into any port in Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude is absolutely prohibited.

5. The importation of fresh fruits of every description from the Province of Queensland is absolutely prohibited.

6. Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must before removal from the first port or place of debarkation be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and if found infested with insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees or to other trees shall be destroyed or otherwise treated as the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture may direct. If the fruit on examination be found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate to that effect after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit was packed has been disinfected as prescribed by Order 7 and on receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection prescribed in the Schedule I. hereto. Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall if such fruit is found to be free from disease issue a certificate to that effect upon payment of the fee for inspection prescribed in the said schedule.

7. Transportable material of any kind used for packing or surrounding fruit is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation or from being offered for sale gift distribution or transportation until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping the same and keeping it continually submerged for a period of not less than two (2) minutes in boiling water containing in solution not less than one pound (11b.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.

8. Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 7 before removal from the first port or place of debarkation.

9. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be disinfected by being dipped in a solution of one pound (11b.) of whale oil soap (80 per cent.) to each and every gallon of water such whale oil soap solution being kept at a temperature of 115 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit. The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall remain in said solution not less than two (2) minutes. After the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been so disinfected they shall if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection or for further disinfection and if said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are then found to be infested they shall be destroyed by fire.

10. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be further disinfected by fumigation with hydrocyanic acid gas as follows:—The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall be covered with an air-tight box and for each and every one hundred (100) cubic feet of space therein there shall be used :—

For plants in pots and in leaf-

400 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

For fruit trees and shrubs-

530 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and three-quarter $(1\frac{3}{4})$ ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

The cyanide of potassium shall be placed in a generator and the chamber immediately closed tightly when the sulphuric acid shall be added. The chamber shall remain closed for not less than sixty (60) minutes. After the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been treated with the hydrocyanic acid gas as above directed they shall (if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector) remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection and further treatment or destruction by fire if necessary.

11. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first port or place of debarkation and if found infested with injurious insects which cannot be destroyed by the remedies required by Rules 9 and 10 of these Orders they shall be seized and destroyed by fire.

12. Consignees must deliver within forty-eight (48) hours of arrival the fruit fruit trees packages and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection consignees or their agents must repack the fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material that have been disinfected and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.

13. Any fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection and not disinfected within fortyeight (48) hours by reason of the default of the consignee to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacking may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.

14. Agents and other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of fruits and of fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings) or buds seeds pits and scions shall pay for the inspection and if necessary the disinfection thereof the fees set out in Schedules I. and II. respectively :--

Penalty for Removal of Survey Posts.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 16th August, 1897.

THE attention of owners of property and persons employed in fencing the boundaries of land is called to the provisions of the Act 4 & 5 Victoria, No. 20, which renders any person who wilfully injures or removes any survey post or landmark liable to a fine of not less than £10 or not exceeding £50, and in default of payment of such fine to imprisonment.

Regulations for the Control and Management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.

2053

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 12th May, 1898.

Ferth, 12th May, 1898. IIS Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, 13th December, 1893, and 19th June, 1896, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof :—

1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of \pounds 4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.

2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days from date thereof it shall be lawful for the Inspector to cancel such license. Provided that, in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block irrespective of the area.

3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.

4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.

5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.

6. No person shall destroy or preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.

7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.

8. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.

9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.

10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so-called "Pick-up banks." 11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand, or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.

12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year the exact dates to be named in such notice.

13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.

14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.

15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.

16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.

17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

The Inspector may seize and remove any shell so obtained, and any other shell that may be found in possession of any person who may be found collecting shell by dredging or otherwise from any Government Reserve, and any person so found shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 50$.

18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.

19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed two square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of $\pounds 1$.

In all applications for exclusive licenses, the length of the licensed area shall not exceed twice its width.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas.

AZETTE, W.A.

21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may, in open Court, refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.

22. All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a $bon\hat{a}$ fide manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting, and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.

23. The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.

24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.

25. It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be final.

PENALTIES.

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of $\pounds 50$.

Ferth, 2nd June, 1898. IIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," Clause 21.

1. All applications received upon the day the lots in an Area are thrown open will be considered as being received at the same time, whether received at the Head Office or at any of the Branch Offices; after that day applications shall take priority according to the order of their being received at the Head Office or any of its Branches.

2. Every person making an application shall make a Statutory Declaration according to the Form prescribed, or with such variation as the Minister may approve.

3. Every application must be for a lot or lots as surveyed on the ground.

4. In the event of there being more than one application for the Conditional Purchase of the same portion of land, the persons appointed by the Government to select the person to whom the land shall be sold may appoint a time and place where they may sit as a Court and hear evidence as to the qualifications of applicants.

II IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

1. Suburban Lands throughout the Colony tnahave formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.

2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within two years, by eight equal instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.

3. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within one year from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.

The mean isobar map for the month is of the usual winter type, showing high pressure in the upper Coolgardie Fields and the Murchison. This probably extends across to the centre of the continent, and is the cause of our normal N. and N.E. winds at this time of year. The isotherms show that the coldest regions of the Colony last month, both by day and night, were inland, between Katanning and the Goldfields, the lowest mean night minimum being 40°3 at Southern Cross. In Perth the temperature was considerably lower than usual; the day temperature mean maximum (61°6 in the Gardens) was in fact the lowest ever recorded, and the mean of the month 54°1 was 1°9 below the average for the previous 22 years, and lower than any other June since 1887. Severe frosts were experienced on several nights in country districts.

The rainfall throughout the Colony was, on the whole, above normal, except on the Goldfields, where it was the heaviest yet recorded, the records extending back for ten years at Southern Cross and six at Coolgardie; the Goldfields not only participating, perhaps more than usual, in the storms which always sweep along on their Easterly course South of the coast line, but in addition were favoured with a fall of a somewhat unusual character on Saturday and Sunday, the 5th and 6th inst. In this case the rain apparently came down from the N.W. coast and passed Southwards to Esperance and Albany, Western districts receiving none. Unfortunately meteorological stations are very thinly scattered in the desert regions of the Eastern interior, and it is difficult therefore to trace the cause of this downpour, but that it is of tropical origin there can be but little doubt, and still less that it was heartily appreciated.

In coastal districts the usual winter storms brought copious rains with occasional destructive gales and rough seas.

A By-law for prescribing the position and providing for the manner of construction of Privies.

IN pursuance of the powers and provisions contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," the Local Board of Health of Perth ordains as follows, that is to say :---

1. All By-laws heretofore made in connection with any matter contained herein are hereby repealed, and this By-law shall have operation in all parts of the City of Perth.

2. Every person who shall construct a privy in connection with a building shall construct such privy at a distance of 10 feet at the least from a dwelling-house or public building, or any building in which any person may be, or may be intended to be, employed in any manufacture, trade, or business.

3. He shall not construct such privy within the distance of 15 feet of any well from which any water is supplied for use, or is used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or otherwise in such a position as to endanger the pollution of any such water.

4. He shall construct such privy in such a manner and in such a position as to afford ready means of access to such privy for the purpose of cleansing such privy, and of removing filth therefrom, and in such a manner and in such a position as to admit of all filth being removed from such privy, and from the premises to which such privy may belong, without being carried through any dwelling-house or public building or any building in which any person may be, or may be intended to be, employed in any manufacture, trade, or business. 5. He shall provide such privy with a sufficient opening for ventilation, as near the top as practicable, and communicating directly with the external air.

6. He shall cause the floor of such privy to be flagged or paved with hard tiles or other non-absorbent material, and he shall construct such floor so that it shall be in every part thereof at a height of not less than six inches above the level of the surface of the ground adjoining such privy, and so that such floor shall have a fall or inclination towards the door of such privy of half an inch to the foot.

7. Every person who shall construct a privy in connection with a building shall construct such privy for use in combination with a movable receptacle for filth, and shall construct over the whole of the floor space immediately beneath the seat of such privy a flagged, concreted, or asphalted floor, at a height of not less than three inches above the level of the surface of the ground adjoining such privy; and he shall cause the whole extent of each side of such space between the floor and the seat to be constructed of flagging, slate, or good brickwork, at least nine inches thick, and rendered in good cement or asphalted.

8. He shall construct the seat of such privy, the aperture in such seat, and the space beneath such seat, of such dimensions as to admit of a movable receptacle for filth of dimensions as follows:—Height, 15 inches; diameter, 14 inches; being placed and fitted beneath such seat in such a manner and in such a position as may effectually prevent the deposit upon the floor or sides of the space beneath such seat or elsewhere than in such receptacle, of any filth which may from time to time fall or be cast through the aperture in such seat.

9. He shall construct the seat of such privy so that the whole of such seat, or a sufficient part thereof, may be readily removed or adjusted in such a manner as to afford adequate access to the space beneath such seat for the purpose of cleansing such space, or of removing therefrom or placing and fitting therein the regulation receptacle for filth.

10. Every privy shall be so placed and constructed that the same, when finished, shall be properly covered in and screened from the view of the public and the occupiers of adjoining properties.

11. Any person who contravenes or does not comply with any of the provisions of this By-law shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 'I'en pounds for every breach of such By-law, or a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued; but the Justice before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered, may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.
