## Explosives Act, 1895.

## Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 13th day of July, 1898.

WHEREAS by an Order, dated the 11th day of November, 1896, His Excellency the Governor in Council, acting under the powers on him conferred by "The Explosives Act, 1895," was pleased to define the composition, quality, character, and classification of certain Explosives therein set forth, and to prohibit the manufacture, keeping, importation, and sale of Explosives other than those mentioned in the said Order: And whereas it is deemed desirable to add to the list of Explosives authorised by such Order to be imported and manufactured in the Colony: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby define the composition, quality, and character of the undermentioned Explosives, and order that they be added to the said list, and classified as follows:—

Rendite.—Consisting of Potassium, Nitrate, Sulphur, Picric Acid, and Wood Meal, with or without the addition of Graphite (free from grit), provided that—

- The amount of Picric Acid or Graphite shall not exceed two per cent. (2°/<sub>s</sub>) of the finished Explosive.
- 2. All the ingredients shall be thoroughly purified.

## Exemption from Duty-Fungicides and Insecticides.

W HEREAS by the 115th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892," power is given to the Governor, by Special Order in each case, to exempt from payment of duty, or any proportion thereof, under circumstances of an exceptional nature, to be stated in such Order, any goods upon which duties of Customs may be leviable; Now THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in view of the urgent need to promote the use of Fungicides and Insecticides in the fruit-growing industry, does hereby order that all Fungicides and Insecticides ordinarily used and applicable to use in such industry, imported into this Colony solely for such purpose, shall be exempt from the payment of duty.

BY THE QUEEN.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA, R.

We do hereby, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

- 1. A branch of our Mint shall be established at or near Perth in our Colony of Western Australia, on such site as the Governor of the Colony in Council may approve.
- 2. Gold coins may be coined at the branch Mint so established, and shall be of the same denominations, designs, weights, and fineness, and subject to the allowance of the same remedy, as gold coins coined at Our Mint in England.
- 3. The Master of Our Mint shall prepare and transmit dies for the gold coins to be coined at the branch Mint at Perth.
- 4. The gold coins coined in pursuance of this proclamation at the branch Mint at Perth shall be deemed to have been issued from Our Mint, and shall be current and a legal tender in like manner and to the like extent as if they had been coined and issued in England.
- 5. (i.) If any person brings to the branch Mint at Perth any gold bullion, the Deputy Master of that branch shall assay coin and deliver out the same to such person upon payment for every ounce Troy of gold of standard fineness, of a charge of three halfpence where the amount brought at one time does not exceed five hundred ounces, and of a penny in any other case, provided that
  - (a) where the gold bullion so brought is such that it cannot be brought to the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout without refining the whole or some portion of it, the Deputy Master shall demand for assaying and refining the same such additional charge as the Governor in Council may from time to time fix, and until such charge is paid to him may refuse to receive, assay, or coin such bullion; and

- (b) where the bullion brought to the branch Mint for coinage is finer than the standard fineness of the coin to be coined thereout, there shall be delivered to the person bringing the same such additional amount of coin as is proportionate to such superior fineness;
- (c) no undue preference shall be shown to any person as respects the bullion brought to the branch Mint, and every person shall have priority according to the time at which he brought it;
- (d) the Governor of Western Australia in Council may make regulations for carrying into effect the provisions of this Article with respect to gold bullion, and the bringing, coining, and delivery out thereof, and in particular for regulating the time and conditions at and under which it is to be so brought, assayed, coined, and delivered out, and the minimum amount which may be so brought.
- (ii.) The charges under this article for coining, assaying, and refining shall be collected by the Deputy Master in accordance with the said regulations either as a payment in advance or as a deduction from the coin delivered out, or otherwise, and shall be accounted for and paid over in such manner as the Governor in Council directs to the Colonial Treasurer of Western Australia to be by him paid into the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.
- 6. Subject to the provisions of this proclamation, the branch Mint at Perth, shall, for the purposes of the coinage of gold coins be deemed to be part of Our Mint, and accordingly
  - (a.) the Deputy Master shall comply with all directions he may receive from the Master of Our Mint, whether as regards the returns to be made, or the delivery of coin for public use, or the transmission of specimen coins to England or otherwise; and
  - (b) the said specimen coins shall be subject to the trial of the pyx under Section 12 of "The Coinage Act, 1870," so, however, that they shall be examined separately from the coins coined in England; and
  - (c) the Deputy Master and other officers and persons for the purpose of carrying on the business of the branch Mint may be appointed, promoted, suspended, and removed, and their duties assigned and salaries awarded, under Section 15 of "The Coinage Act, 1870."
- 7. The Governor of Western Australia in Council shall cause the store of gold bullion and coin at the branch Mint at Perth to be inspected half-yearly, and cause the persons inspecting the same to report thereon to the Deputy Master of the branch Mint, stating the exact amount of bullion and coin inspected by them; and such report shall be transmitted by the Deputy Master to the Master of Our Mint in London.
- 8. The Master of Our Mint shall in the execution of this proclamation act in accordance with any regulations made or directions given by the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury.
  - 9. In this proclamation,-
    - The expression "Mint" means Our Royal Mint in England;
    - The expression "Governor" includes the officer for the time being administering the Government of the Colony;
    - The expression "Deputy Master of the branch Mint" includes any person who lawfully exercises at such branch Mint the authority of Deputy Master of Our Mint.
- 10. This proclamation shall come into force in Our Colony of Western Australia, on the expiration of six months from the date thereof, unless it is sooner promulgated in the Colony, and in that case, on such promulgation.
  - Given at Our Court at Balmoral the thirteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the Sixtyfirst year of Our Reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

Whereas We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, did on the thirteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, issue Our Royal Proclamation establishing a branch of Our Royal Mint at Perth, in Our Colony of Western Australia, and by Article ten

thereof did direct that such Proclamation should come into force in the said Colony on the expiration of six months from the date thereof, unless it was sooner promulgated in the Colony, and in that case on such promulgation:

And whereas it has been represented to Us that it is desirable to postpone the date at which the said Proclamation is to come into force;

We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

- (1.) Article ten of Our Proclamation respecting a branch of our Mint at or near Perth, in Our Colony of Western Australia, bearing date the thirteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, is hereby rescinded; and there shall be substituted for it the following Article:
  - This Proclamation shall come into force in Our Colony of Western Australia on the expiration of nine months from the thirteenth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, unless it is sooner promulgated in the Colony, and in that case on such promulgation.
- (2.) This Proclamation shall come into force on the twelfth day of April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, unless it is sooner promulgated, and in that case on such promulgation.
  - Given at Our Court at Windsor, this seventh day of March, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and in the sixty-first year of Our Reign.

## Orders under "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880."

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that under the powers conferred upon him by "The Destructive Insects and Substances Act, 1880" (44th Vict., No. 5), His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to authorise the publication of the following Orders regulating the importation and disinfection of vine cuttings, buds, grapes, trees, plants, cuttings (other than vines), grafts, buds, seeds, pits, scions, and fruits respectively.

## Orders regulating the Importation and Disinfection of Vine Cuttings Buds and Grapes.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall within forty-eight hours of the arrival of such vine cuttings at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or a Local Inspector appointed in that behalf. In the event of the consignee or his agent failing to deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the said vine cuttings. If upon such seizure the said vine cuttings are found to be infected with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or vines or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said vine cuttings are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall dip the said vine cuttings as per Order 5 and hold the same to the order of the consignee or his agent for seven clear days from the time of disinfection.
- 2. The importation of vines with roots or of vines that have had their roots cut off is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited except as hereinafter provided and subject to these regulations which shall be strictly observed.
- 3. Grapes may be imported from South Australia subject to the regulations in force for the time being for the examination and disinfection of imported fruits.
- 4. Vine cuttings or buds may be imported from South Australia—provided that all such cuttings and buds shall be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed.
- 5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings and buds required by the preceding order shall be effected by dipping the same in a solution of one pound of Sulphide of Lime to twenty gallons of water the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings or buds shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in the Schedule hereunder.

6. After the vine cuttings have been dipped they shall if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen days for further disinfecting or if found to be infected with injurious insects which cannot in the opinion of the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be destroyed by the treatment required by Order No. 5 the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire.

- 7. Vine cuttings may be imported from any country or province other than South Australia provided that any person about to import such cuttings shall at the time of ordering the same furnish a duplicate of such order to the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and provided also that such cuttings shall not be imported for at least one month after the duplicate of such order shall have been so furnished as aforesaid.
- 8. All vine cuttings so imported pursuant to the next preceding order shall be absolutely surrendered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the port of debarkation for the purpose of being quarantined as hereinafter provided.
- 9. All vine cuttings imported as aforesaid from any country or province other than South Australia shall be quarantined by the Department of Agriculture for a period of not less than 12 months nor longer than two years upon such grounds as from time to time shall be set apart by the said Department by advertising in the Government Gazette as quarantine stations. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings as aforesaid shall at the time of delivering the same to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of being quarantined pay to the Secretary a sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 cuttings so delivered and at the expiration of the period of quarantine shall upon taking delivery of his rooted vines pay the further sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 rooted vines so delivered to him.
- 10. Any vine cuttings imported from any country or province other than South Australia which shall in the opinion of the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be affected with insects fungi blight or other diseases injurious to grape vines or other trees or plants shall be destroyed under the direction of the said Inspector and the expense connected therewith shall be borne by and recoverable from the importer of such vine cuttings.
- 11. The Department of Agriculture shall not be liable for any loss resulting from the destruction of any cuttings under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs or by reason of the infertility of any such cuttings while in or after leaving their custody or whilst under their control.

### Orders regulating the Disinfection of Imported Trees Plants Cuttings (other than Vines) Grafts Buds Seeds Pits Scions and Fruits.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings or buds) seeds pits or scions shall within forty-eight (48) hours after the arrival of any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the same to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and in the event of any such consignee or his agent failing to so deliver any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions within forty-eight (48) hours as aforesaid the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall have power to seize the same. If upon such seizure the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to vines or fruit trees or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall treat the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions as may be directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture and hold same until applied for by the consignee or agent provided that if the same be not applied for within seven clear days from time of seizure the same may be destroyed.
- 2. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits of scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees or plants they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests or their eggs larvæ or pupæ.

- 3. All peach nectarine apricot plum prune almond and all trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots and all peach or other pits cuttings buds or scions raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.
- 4. The importation of the fruits—apples pears and quinces into any port in Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude is absolutely prohibited.
- 5. The importation of fresh fruits of every description from the Province of Queensland is absolutely prohibited.
- 6. Fruit of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must before removal from the first port or place of debarkation be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and if found infested with insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees or to other trees shall be destroyed or otherwise treated as the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture may direct. If the fruit on examination be found to be free from disease and not infested with any insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases known to be injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate to that effect after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit was packed has been disinfected as prescribed by Order 7 and on receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection prescribed in the Schedule I. hereto. Where fruit is not packed or surrounded by any transportable material the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall if such fruit is found to be free from disease issue a certificate to that effect upon payment of the fee for inspection prescribed in the said schedule.
- 7. Transportable material of any kind used for packing or surrounding fruit is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation or from being offered for sale gift distribution or transportation until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping the same and keeping it continually submerged for a period of not less than two (2) minutes in boiling water containing in solution not less than one pound (1lb.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.
- 8. Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 7 before removal from the first port or place of debarkation.
- 9. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be disinfected by being dipped in a solution of one pound (1lb.) of whale oil soap (80 per cent.) to each and every gallon of water such whale oil soap solution being kept at a temperature of 1.15 to 120 degrees Fahrenheit. The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall remain in said solution not less than two (2) minutes. After the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been so disinfected they shall if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection or for further disinfection and if said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are then found to be infested they shall be destroyed by fire.
- 10. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony shall (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary of the Department of Agriculture) be further disinfected by fumigation with hydrocyanic acid gas as follows:—The said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions shall be covered with an air-tight box and for each and every one hundred (100) cubic feet of space therein there shall be used:—

For plants in pots and in leaf-

400 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

For fruit trees and shrubs—

530 grains of fused cyanide of potassium (58 per cent.) with one and three-quarter  $(1\frac{3}{4})$  ounces of fluid sulphuric acid.

The cyanide of potassium shall be placed in a generator and the chamber immediately closed tightly when the sulphuric acid shall be added. The chamber shall remain closed for not less than sixty (60) minutes. After the said

- trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions have been treated with the hydrocyanic acid gas as above directed they shall (if deemed necessary by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector) remain in quarantine fourteen (14) days for subsequent inspection and further treatment or destruction by fire if necessary.
- 11. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported or brought into the Colony shall be inspected upon arrival at the first port or place of debarkation and if found infested with injurious insects which cannot be destroyed by the remedies required by Rules 9 and 10 of these Orders they shall be seized and destroyed by fire.
- 12. Consignees must deliver within forty-eight (48) hours of arrival the fruit fruit trees packages and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection consignees or their agents must repack the fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material that have been disinfected and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.
- 13. Any fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection and not disinfected within forty-eight (48) hours by reason of the default of the consignee to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacking may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.
- 14. Agents and other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of fruits and of fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings) or buds seeds pits and scions shall pay for the inspection and if necessary the disinfection thereof the fees set out in Schedules I. and II. respectively:—

### Penalty for Removal of Survey Posts.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 16th August, 1897.

THE attention of owners of property and persons called to the provisions of the Act 4 & 5 Victoria, No. 20, which renders any person who wilfully injures or removes any survey post or landmark liable to a fine of not less than £10 or not exceeding £50, and in default of payment of such fine to imprisonment.

## Regulations for the Control and Management of the Pearl Shell Fishery at Sharks Bay.

2053 Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 12th May, 1898.

Is Excellency the Governor in Council, under the powers conferred upon him by "The Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery Act" (55 Vict., No. 9), has been pleased to repeal the Regulations approved on the 7th day of June, 1893, 13th December, 1893, and 19th June, 1896, respectively, and to make the following Regulations for the Control and Management of the Sharks Bay Pearl Shell Fishery in lieu thereof:—

- 1. The rent for a General License shall be at the rate of £4 per annum per boat, payable in advance at the date of application, and the term shall be for any period not less than three months and not exceeding one year. All licenses shall expire on the 31st December.
- 2. The rent for an Exclusive License shall be at the rate of not less than Sixpence per acre per annum, and shall be payable in advance on the 1st day of October in each year, and if not paid within fourteen days from date thereof it shall be lawful for the Inspector to cancel such license. Provided that, in respect of Exclusive Licenses over any blocks surveyed and set apart for such licenses, the rent shall be £10 per block irrespective of the area.
- 3. The term of an Exclusive License shall be computed from the first day of January preceding the date of approval of the application, and shall be for any period not exceeding fourteen years.
- 4. Licenses applied for during the year will be charged rent proportionate, calculated from the first day of January, April, July, or October last immediately preceding the date of approval of application, as the case may be.
- 5. Applications for general licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, and the applicant shall give the name of the owner and the name of the boat, provided that the Inspector may, in any case in which any boat is disabled or unable to work, allow another boat to be substituted for the boat so disabled or unable to work.
- 6. No person shall destroy or preventably permit to perish any immature pearl shell, nor shall collect, remove, or have in his possession such immature pearl shells, excepting under the conditions covered by Clause 13; and no person shall open any pearl shells except at such places as shall have been approved of by the Inspector.
- 7. The holder of a general license shall only be entitled to have two men at work in each boat; but if more are required, the permission of the Inspector in writing shall be necessary; and, if obtained, an additional fee of 5s. per month for each additional man so employed in such boat shall be paid in advance.
- 8. All boats licensed shall have a distinguishing number painted on the bow above the water line, and the licensee shall maintain such figures in a clear and legible manner during the currency of the license.
- 9. The owner or the agent of the owner of any licensed boat, before proceeding to work on any of the waters of Sharks Bay, shall bring the crew of such boat before the Inspector, who shall explain to such crew the regulations under which they are to work.
- 10. The Inspector may, in his discretion, prohibit the use of a dredge on any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, and this prohibition shall be absolute and continuous on all shallow or so-called "Pick-up banks."

- 11. It shall be lawful for the Inspector to at any time absolutely prohibit the obtaining of pearls and pearl shells, either by dredging, collecting by hand, or otherwise, from any portion of Sharks Bay, whether held under exclusive license or not, when in his opinion the working is likely to detrimentally exhaust the ground.
- 12. It shall be lawful for the Inspector, by notice in writing to the holders of general or exclusive licenses, to prohibit the collection and removal of pearl shell from any of the waters of Sharks Bay during the principal spawning season of the year the exact dates to be named in such notice.
- 13. No person shall retain any young or immature shell, and shall at once return them to the water, unless they are required for planting areas held under exclusive licenses, in which case they shall be so dealt with as not to be allowed to perish.
- 14. The Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any young or immature shell found in the possession of any person.
- 15. No person shall have or carry on board any boat or use a dredge without the permission of the Inspector, and the Inspector or other Officer may seize and remove any dredge found on board any boat or used contrary to this regulation.
- 16. The Inspector may authorise persons to collect mature shell on any portion of the waters of Sharks Bay which shall have been closed under the provisions of Section 12 of the said Act, but such shall not be collected except in deep water and by means of diving apparatus.
- 17. The Minister may set apart any portions of Sharks Bay as reserves for the growth and breeding of the pearl or other oyster; and no person shall dredge or otherwise obtain shell from any such reserve.

The Inspector may seize and remove any shell so obtained, and any other shell that may be found in possession of any person who may be found collecting shell by dredging or otherwise from any Government Reserve, and any person so found shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

- 18. No person shall trespass, or sail over, or anchor on any Government reserve, or other locality set apart by the Minister for the growth and breeding of any oyster; and no person, except the Inspector or licensee, shall trespass, sail over, or anchor upon any sections held under exclusive license.
- 19. Applications for exclusive licenses shall be made to the Inspector, as the authorised agent of the Minister, of areas of from 10 acres upwards, but shall not exceed two square miles. Each application shall be accompanied by an accurate description of the area applied for, and an application fee of £1.

In all applications for exclusive licenses, the length of the licensed area shall not exceed twice its width.

In those parts of Sharks Bay which have been surveyed into blocks each application must comprise one complete block as surveyed. All applications for exclusive licenses shall take priority according to the order of their being lodged with the Inspector. In the event of two or more simultaneous applications for the same area, the priority shall be determined by lot by the Minister.

20. The Inspector shall give notice, by affixing a notice on the notice board of his tent or office for seven days, that an application has been made, and shall hear and report all objections that may be raised to the granting of such exclusive license in open Court. Provided that such notice shall not be necessary in the case of applications for surveyed areas.

- 21. The Minister shall not be bound to entertain any application, and he may invite tenders for any license or licenses, but shall not be bound to accept the highest or any tender. The Inspector may, in open Court, refuse to recommend the granting of an exclusive license over the area applied for.
- All holders of exclusive licenses shall cultivate the areas held by them in a bonû fide manner, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by planting, and protecting the oysters on the area; and the holders of exclusive licenses shall be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as the holders of general licenses.
- The holder of an exclusive license neglecting or offending against these Regulations shall, upon conviction, in addition to the penalties provided by these Regulations, render his license liable to forfeiture by the Governor in Council.
- 24. The Inspector may visit, inspect, and report on all portions of Sharks Bay, whether reserved, held under exclusive license, or otherwise.
- It shall be lawful for any person who thinks himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Inspector to appeal against such act or decision to the Minister, whose decision in all cases shall be

26. Any person offending against the provisions of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £50.

## Regulations under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been placed to cil has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," Clause 21.

- 1. All applications received upon the day the lots in an Area are thrown open will be considered as being received at the same time, whether received at the Head Office or at any of the Branch Offices; after that day applications shall take priority according to the order of their being received at the Head Office or any of its Branches.
- 2. Every person making an application shall make a Statutory Declaration according to the Form prescribed, or with such variation as the Minister may approve.
- 3. Every application must be for a lot or lots as surveyed on the ground.
- 4. In the event of there being more than one application for the Conditional Purchase of the same portion of land, the persons appointed by the Government to select the person to whom the land shall be sold may appoint a time and place where they may sit as a Court and hear evidence as to the qualifications of applicants.

## Regulations under "The Homesteads Act, 1893."

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations, under the provisions of "The Homesteads Act, 1893.

Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

- Suburban Lands throughout the Colony taa. have formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.
- 2. At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. In every case the balance of purchase money shall be paid, within two years, by eight equal instalments on the first days of January, April, July, and October; the first instalment to be paid on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown Grant and Registration being paid with the last instalment.
- In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the required fencing is not completed within one year from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money or fees that may have been paid. Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money and fees being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire; but no Crown Grant will be issued until the Commissioner of Crown Lands is satisfied that the required fencing has been completed.

## Regulations.

### Residential Lots.

12074

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 8th April, 1898.

Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations, under Section 44 of the Homesteads Act, to apply to any Town or Suburban Lands situate within the boundaries of any proclaimed Goldfield which may be declared open for selection as Residential Lots:—

- 1. Application for leases of the natural surface of any lots within the prescribed area to a depth of 20ft. may be made to the Commissioner of Crown Lands. through the Warden, by any male person above the age of 18 years, upon the following terms:—
- 2. The application shall be in the form prescribed, and shall be lodged with the Warden, and shall set forth the number, area, and position of the lot applied for.
- 3. The rent payable in respect of each lot shall be £1 per annum, which shall, in the first instance, be lodged with the application, and subsequently paid annually on the first day of March, in accordance with the provisions of Clause 101 of the Land Regulations. When paying the annual rent the holder of each lot shall make a statutory declaration that the conditions of residence hereinafter set forth have been complied with or fulfilled. A fee of £1, in addition to the first year's rent, shall accompany each application.
- 4. The Warden shall forward the application, together with his recommendation thereon, to the Commissioner of Crown Lands immediately after receipt thereof, and he may thereupon deliver to the applicant an approval notice in the form hereinafter provided, and the production of such notice shall be sufficient evidence of the right of the holder thereof to occupy the lot therein mentioned under these regulations, pending the decision of the Commissioner of Crown Lands thereon. Should the application be approved, a lease in the form prescribed will be issued to the applicant on the surrender by him of the approval notice, but should the application be refused, notice of such refusal will be gazetted, and the rent paid will be refunded to the applicant on application to the Warden.
- 5. The lot leased shall be used solely as the habitual abode of the holder or members of his family for at least six months in each year, and for no other purpose whatever.
- 6. The holder of any lot may surrender the same at any time, and shall at the time of surrender furnish to the Warden a detached list of the nature and value of improvements existing on such lot. The lot so surrendered shall then be thrown open for re-selection, and may be applied for as provided for by these regulations. Any person to whom such lot is granted shall pay to the Warden the value of any improvements then existing on such lot, which value shall thereupon be paid by the Warden to the original holder. Should the person re-applying object to the value set upon the improvements by the original holder, a valuation shall be made by two arbitrators, one appointed by each party, and in accordance with the provisions of "The Arbitration Act, 1895," the Warden being the umpire in case of disagreement, and the cost of such arbitration shall be borne by the original holder or the person re-applying, as the arbitrators may direct.
- 7. No person who shall have surrendered or forfeited a lot shall be eligible to select another lot within a mile of the lot originally held by him, until six months shall have elapsed from the date of surrender or forfeiture of such lot.

- 8. The Governor may at any time exempt from the operations of these regulations any portion or portions of any town or suburban lands so set apart, which may be required for mining or other purposes.
- 9. Any lot or lots or portions thereof that may have been granted as a residential lot may be resumed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, on the payment to the holder of such lot or lots the fair value of any improvements existing on such lots at the time of resumption, such value to be ascertained in the like manner as prescribed by Clause 6 hereof. The resumption shall take effect upon notice thereof to the holder, in writing under the hand of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, being served on the holder or published in the Government Gazette.
- 10. All leases granted under these regulations shall expire on the 31st day of December following the date of grant, and may be renewed from year to year, at the option of the Commissioner of Crown Lands. The acceptance of rent shall be conclusive evidence of such renewal.
- 11. No person shall be entitled to hold more than one lot at a time.
- 12. Lots held under these regulations shall not be transferable.
- 13. On proof satisfactory to the Warden that any of the conditions contained in the foregoing Regulations have not been complied with, the Warden may declare the lot liable to forfeiture, and in such case he shall report the matter to the Commissioner of Crown Lands, by whom the lot may be declared forfeited. All lots forfeited shall be thrown open for re-selection. All improvements on any forfeited lot shall be the property of the Crown.

THE following By-laws are published in accordance with the provisions of Section 64 of "The Roads Act, 1888."

## The Roads Act, 1888.

### By-Laws of the Cottesloe Roads Board.

THE Cottesloe Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1888," and the Amendment Acts, 1889 and 1894, the Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Acts mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Cot esloe District, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said district from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

#### INTERPRETATION.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- "The Act."—"The Roads Act of 1888," and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter as far as the Act allows.
- "District."—The Cottesloe Roads Board District.
- "Board."—The Cottesloe Roads Board.
- "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as chairman of the Board.
- "Member."—A member of the Board.
- "Secretary."-The Secretary of the Board.
- "Road or Reserve."—A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- "Street" shall mean and include every public street, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district under the control of the Board which the public are permitted to use.
- "Footpath or Footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot-passengers, and whether the same be made, or kerbed, or otherwise.
- "Owner."—Any person in possession or receipt either of the whole or of any part of the rents or profits of any house, building, land, or tenement.
- "Occupier."—Any person who shall have occupied any ratable property within the district during the period specified in the Act.
- "Cycle."—A bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
- "Cyclist."—A person riding, impelling, or otherwise using or having the management or control of any cycle.
- "Person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.
- "Masculine" shall include the feminine.
- "Permission of the Board."—The consent of the Board given in writing.
- "Jetty."-Any jetty under the control of the Board.
- "Vehicle."—Any cart, dray, carriage, van, omnibus, trap, or other conveyance (not being a hand-cart) with or without springs.

#### APPOINTMENTS.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

#### DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

To attend all Board meetings.

To attend committees when considered necessary.

To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports of committees.

To conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.

To answer all questions on the Board's business.

To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance-sheets prepared and printed yearly.

To supervise the preparation of the rate-books and Board's electoral lists; examine proofs of latter and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also, to attend all courts of revision or appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections, and preparing papers, etc., for the clerks.

To summon the members to board and committee meetings.

The secretary shall keep the cash-book, as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board; the said books shall be kept written-up every fortnight, ready for the inspection of the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time, during office hours, desire to see them.

He shall check all accounts sent into the Board, and see that all accounts for works (exceeding Five pounds in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and shall see that, with all returns made, the heels of the receipt books accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the Board; he shall report to the Board at their next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary vouchers attached thereto.

He shall pay into the bank, within forty-eight hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board any sum or sums of money that may be received by him on behalf of the Board.

He shall have the cash-book and bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board, and shall produce them at each meeting thereof. Should any member of the Board desire to see them at any time, during office hours, the secretary shall produce them for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the secretary. The secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

At each ordinary meeting of the Board an approximate balance-sheet shall be produced, showing, as nearly as possible, the financial position of the Board as regards payments already made, its present as ets and liabilities (which latter shall specify and include moneys voted for special purposes which have not yet been undertaken or contracted for), and no further expenditure of any nature shall be incurred unless this balance-sheet shall be then produced.

#### MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

## Notice of Meetings.

Notice shall be given by the chairman or secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least three days before such meeting, and "notice in writing" of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days. The chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence, or if after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board, chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be), shall preside.

#### Meetings.

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the chairman and any three members of the Board to exclude the public when, in their opinion, it is expedient to do so.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time and in the manner prescribed by the 9th Section of the Act, but the chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at an ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present, and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting was called.

At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quarum present, such circumstances, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute-book.

#### Order of Business.

The ordinary business at all meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:--

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meetings, if any.
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes.
- (c.) Reading of correspondence (in and out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto.
- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment.
- (e.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and committee reports, and consideration thereof.
- (f) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.
- (g.) Ordinary business of the Board.

No discussion shall take place upon the minutes except as to their accuracy, or for the rectification of any clerical error.

Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes, the chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary; and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at the time.

#### Voting.

Each member, including the chairman, shall have one vote, and such chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote, in addition to his ordinary vote; and all questions at such meetings shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

#### Minutes of Meeting.

In addition to the minute book-prescribed to be kept by the 10th Section of the Act, a rough minute-book shall be kept, in which all items of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there noted by the secretary, and subsequently entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute-book.

#### Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

#### Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject-matters of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board, or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

#### Speaker must not digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

#### Motions and Amendments.

A motion once moved at a meeting cannot be withdrawn unless by the consent of the Board.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendment, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.

A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the chairman.

In submitting a motion or amendment, the chairman must put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried, the motion, as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

#### APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES.

The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members, as a committee, to inquire into any matter and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no com-

mittee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee shall comprise two members.

#### FINANCE ACCOUNTS.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the chairman at the ordinary meetings, and, after being certified as correct, shall be so initialled by him, and paid by cheque.

An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received, from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by Government), shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the chairman and countersigned by another member of the Board and by the Secretary.

All moneys shall, within two days after they have come into the hands of the Board or of any officers, servants, or clerks, for the use of the Board, be paid into such bank.

Money granted by Government shall be paid to the Board's credit at the Treasury, and shall only be operated upon to pay actual creditors for work executed on the specific object for which the money was granted.

#### URGENT WORK.

The chairman with one member may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5, but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

#### UNAUTHORISED EXPENDITURE.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or of these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

#### OFFENCES, OMISSIONS, OR NEGLECTS.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 10$ .

- (1.) Riding or driving horses, cattle or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage upon or along any footway.
- (2.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel surface drain, or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (3.) Burning any shavings or other materials or matter in any footway, carriage road, or open or public place, or any private place, to the annoyance of the public.
- (4.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (5.) Allowing the dripping of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway.
- (6.) Placing any advertisement board, placard, or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof, or if on property under the control of the Board, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (7.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway, or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (8.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance, by offensive smell or otherwise, is caused.
- (9.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, football, catapult, air-gun or firearm, or playing at any game to the annoyance or danger of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footway or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footway or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (10.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person or property.

- (11.) Having any awning, verandah or blinds on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being of the full width of 10ft., and 8ft. clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning, verandah, or blinds, over the footway, or erecting any signboard, sign awning, blind, overhanging lamp, or other thing over or near any footway or road, without first having obtained the permission of the Board.
- (12.) Blasting any rock, stone or timber, in or near any public place, without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (13.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (14.) Making a cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (15.) Any carter plying for hire without a license.

#### GENERAL REGULATION OF TRAFFIC.

Every person having the care or conduct of any vehicle shall keep the same on the left or near side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or vehicle passing or attempting to pass his vehicle.

No person between sunset and the following sunrise shall, in, upon, or along any of the public roads or streets within the district, drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted on the off side of the front of such vehicle.

No person shall ride or drive any horse or other animal along any road or street at a speed exceeding eight miles per hour.

The driver of every vehicle or the rider of every horse or other animal turning for the purpose of proceeding in an opposite direction, or turning the corner of any road in the district, shall bring the horse or other animal to a walking pace before commencing to turn.

No person having the care or control of any horse or other animal or of any vehicle shall allow the same to remain in any road or street of the district, or to obstruct any portion of such road or street for a longer period than necessary for loading or unloading the same. Provided that where suitable bridle posts are available a horse may be securely fastened thereto for any time not exceeding half an hour, and that immediately upon the request of any officer of the Board or police constable such horse-shall be removed.

#### STALL LICENSES.

No person shall keep, manage or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise, unless such person be licensed by the Board.

Licenses for stalls shall be in the Form A in the Schedule.

No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license or between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m.

The following fees shall be paid for licenses for stalls, and shall be paid in advance on the first Monday in every month, and if payment be not made when due the license shall be void:—

For every stall, 20s. per month.

Every licensed stall-holder shall at all times obey the lawful directions of the traffic inspector or other authorised officer of the Board.

If any person to whom a stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer or assign his license, such license shall be null and void, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself.

#### CYCLES.

Every cyclist within the district shall observe the rules of the road laid down for vehicular traffic.  $\,$ 

No cyclist shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footway within the district.

No cyclist shall, between the hours of sunset and the following sunrise, ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached to such cycle a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, which lamp shall at all times be kept lighted.

Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback, or any vehicle is being approached or passed.

No person shall leave any cycles in or on any road, street or footway so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested by any constable or officer of the Board. No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.

When a cyclist meets or overtakes any horse or other animal, and such horse or animal becomes restless or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount and shall remain dismounted as long as may be necessary to avoid accident.

No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any roads or streets in the district, or across the intersection of any road or street, at a pace exceeding three miles an hour.

## TO PREVENT OBSTRUCTIONS ON THE FOOTWAY OF THE STREETS.

No person without having first obtained the permission of the Board shall allow any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, ware, merchandise or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street, footway or jetty (under the control of the Board) within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing same.

No person shall place, lay, deposit, shoot or discharge any rubbish or materials whatsoever on the surface of any street, road, footway, jetty or public reserve within the district, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.

Every person shall, after having received from the Board, as in the last preceding section provided, a permit to deposit rubbish or materials on the surface of any street, road, footway, jetty or public reserve, have and keep sufficient and continuous light burning thereon from sunset to the following sunrise during the time such rubbish or materials shall remain and continue so deposited.

## TO PREVENT DAMAGES TO FOOTWAYS AND OTHER BOARD PROPERTY.

No person, without having first obtained the permission of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy or injure any footway, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, kerbing, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings or other properties of the said Board, or under the control thereof.

#### PRESERVATION OF TREES, ETC.

Any person who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, or remove from its place any tree, shrub, or plant standing in any of the streets, enclosures, or public places of, belonging to, or under the care or superintendence of the Board, or who shall carelessly, wilfully, or wantonly injure, destroy, carry away, remove out of its place, or ride or drive against any of the tree-guards, fences, or other protection to any such trees, shrubs, or plants as aforesaid, shall forfeit for every such offence a penalty of not more than £10.

#### THROWING DANGEROUS SUBSTANCES ON FOOTWAYS.

Any person who shall throw vegetable substances or any offensive, noxious, or dangerous substances upon any footway within the district shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £1 for every such offence. Any person or persons placing or causing to be placed, or broken in or upon any road, pathway, reserve, or park lands under the control or supervision of the Board, any glass, metal, or earthenware bottles or utensils, without having first obtained the permisssion of the said Board so to do, shall be liable, beyond the cost and charges incidental to the removal of any such glass, metal or earthenware, to a fine, upon conviction, not exceeding £2, in addition to amount of damages caused thereby.

## TO PREVENT RUBBISH BEING DEPOSITED ON THE FORESHORE OR IN THE SEA.

No person shall deposit any bottles, broken glass, crockery, empty tins, rubbish, or offensive matter, solid or liquid, on the foreshore or in the sea within the boundaries of the district.

## PARK LANDS, RESERVES, AND RECREATION GROUNDS.

All park lands and recreation grounds shall be open to the public daily for recreation purposes, excepting as otherwise provided for in these By-laws. The Board shall have the power to grant exclusive right to use and occupy any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves placed under its control within the district, for holding public sports or amusements, to any responsible person or persons; and any person or persons obtaining such right shall be responsible for the proper care of all fences, buildings, and trees or other improvements upon or enclosing such park lands, recreation grounds, and reserves, and shall pay to the Board a fee to be fixed for admission on such occasions.

No horses, cattle, or vehicles shall be allowed on any park land or recreation ground without the permission of the Board.

All persons using or being upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves shall at all times conduct themselves in a becoming manner, and any person creating any disturbance or annoyance to the public shall be liable to be expelled from such lands by any police constable or officer of the Board.

The Board may, in its discretion, prohibit any games or gymnastics from being played or carried on by any person or persons upon any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves on any Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

No person shall sell or expose for sale any goods, wares, fruit, or merchandise in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves without first having obtained the permission of the Board, and shall pay a fee, the amount of such fee not to exceed £10.

No person shall damage or injure any tree, shrub, or plant in any park lands, recreation grounds, or reserves. Any person effending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

#### QUARRIES AND TIMBER.

Any person who shall quarry or remove stone or other materials on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a license therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

Any person who shall cut or remove any timber or bush on the lands belonging to, or in charge of, or under the control of the Board, without a licence therefor, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### Bathing.

The Board shall have power of authorising or sanctioning the erection of bathing-houses, sheds, or machines, and all rules and regulations appertaining to the same shall be submitted to the Board for their approval or otherwise before such authority or sanction is given.

All bathers shall have the body clothed from the waist to the thighs with bathing trunks.

No male over 12 years of age shall bathe between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. from 1st May to the 30th October, or between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. from 1st November to 30th April, on that portion of the sea beach situated between a point opposite the termination of Gibney Street, on the South, and a point opposite the termination of Eric Street, on the North. Bathers outside these limits shall be clothed as before provided.

Any person or persons contravening any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5; and it shall be lawful for any constable or officer of the Board, without warrant, to arrest any person so offending, and to carry him before any justice of the peace, to be dealt with according to law.

Any person wilfully exposing himself when undressing for the purpose of bathing, or before dressing after having bathed, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### BARBED WIRE FENCES.

No person shall erect a fence of barbed wire abutting on any public street within the district.

Any person offending against this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

#### CONSTRUCTION OF FOOTWAYS, CROSSING-PLACES.

It shall be lawful for the owner of any land fronting or adjoining any street or public way, requiring access thereto with horses and vehicles from such street to such land across any existing made footway, kerbing, channel, or gutter, having first had and obtained the permission of the Board, to construct a crossing of such dimensions and materials, and in such form and manner, as the regulations of the Board for the time being require, or as may be directed by the Secretary, in writing, and shall thereafter keep and maintain the same in good and safe repair. Any person not complying with the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.

Every person who wilfully, and without lawful excuse, shall ride, or drive, or wheel any carriage, cart, or other vehicle, or shall ride any cycle upon, along, or across any footway, kerbing, or water channel, or gutter by the side of any street, road, or public way, save in each such case upon and by or at some properly constructed crossing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the Board such sum not exceeding £10, by way of compensation for any damage done to the

footway, kerbing, or channel, as the Justice adjudicating upon the information shall, on the hearing thereof, order.

#### LAMPS, POSTS, ETC.

No lamp-post, bridle-post, telegraph, telephone, or electric lighting pole, or flagstaff shall be erected by any person in any street without the permission of the Board, and shall be placed in such position, and shall be painted once at least in every three years, as may be directed by the Board; and the Board may order the removal by the owners of all bent, dangerous, or unsightly posts or poles. Any person offending against this By-law shall forfeit and pay, on conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

PRESCRIBING THE REMOVAL OF VERANDAHS AND BALCONIES ETC., AT EXPENSE OF OWNER OR OCCUPIER.

Any verandah or balcony which obstructs the footway or roadway, or is dangerous, and all other obstructions on the footways or roadways, or overhanging same, shall be removed when ordered, within such time as shall be notified by the Board; and all expenses incurred in removing same shall be borne by the owner or occupier of such verandah, balcony, or other obstruction, whether removed by the Board or otherwise; and any person whatsoever interfering or obstructing any officer or person employed by the Board in carrying out this By-law, on conviction, shall pay a sum not exceeding £10.

#### Encroachments or Obstructions to be removed.

On the order of the Board the secretary or other appointed officer may direct the removal within fourteen days of any building, fence, or other obstruction or encroachment in or upon any street, lane, or public place under control of the Board.

In any case where, after service of notice for such removal, any such encroachment or obstruction has not been removed within the specified time, it shall be lawful for the officer appointed by the Board to remove the same at the cost and charges of the person so offending, and to proceed against the offender for the breach of this By-law, the penalty for which breach shall not be more than £20 for every day or part of a day during which such offence shall be committed or continued after the expiry of the notice prescribed herein.

#### JETTIES, ETC.

- 1. All jetties, wharves, piers, and landing places on the seashore, constructed out of the funds of the Board, shall henceforth be under the control of the Board.
- 2. No person shall land at, use, or enter upon any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place, except in accordance with these regulations.
- 3. No vessel or boat (except small rowing boats) shall come alongside or remain fastened to any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place unless in charge of a competent person, and all passenger steamers also shall carry a duly certificated engineer.
- 4. No vessel or boat shall be moored or made fast to any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place, or any part thereof, except to such mooring piles, ring bolts or other fastenings as are or may be provided, and no vessel shall be alongside any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place unless so fastened.
- 5. No vessel or boat loading or discharging cargo shall come alongside any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place until the cargo is ready to be loaded, or vehicles are ready to receive delivery in the case of a vessel discharging, and no vessel or boat shall occupy a berth at any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place while waiting to load or discharge cargo, but only when actually occupied in loading or discharging, and between sumrise and sunset, and on week days, except by the written permission of a duly authorised officer of the Board.
- 6. No vessel or boat shall be fastened to or remain alongside any jetty, wharf, pier or landing place longer than is necessary, and shall immediately be removed therefrom on the master or person in charge of such vessel receiving orders to that effect from the Board or officer duly authorised by the Board.
- 7. All cargo or other material must be removed from any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place within 24 hours of the time it is deposited there, or immediately upon the receipt of notice from the Board or officer appointed by the Board.
- 8. Any cargo remaining on any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place over night must remain at the owner's risk for any damage done by or thereto.
- 9. In the event of any person or persons refusing or neglecting to remove any cargo or other material from any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place when required so to do by the Board or its representative, such cargo or material may be ordered to be removed, and the cost of removal shall

be borne by the party or parties responsible, who shall, in addition to such cost, be liable to the penalty prescribed for

breach of these regulations.

10. The owner or owners of every vessel shall be personally liable for all damage to any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place, done or occasioned by any person employed in such vessel, or in the loading or discharging thereof, also for any penalties incurred by the master or crew or person employed on or in connection with such vessel, and any repairs rendered necessary may be executed by the Board, and the cost of such repairs shall be paid by the owner or owners liable for such damage within seven days after demand, and may be recovered by the Board summarily or otherwise, and any default in payment shall render such owner or owners liable to the penalty provided for contravention of these regulations.

11. In case of two steamships approaching the same jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place at the same time from opposite directions, the steamship bound down the coast shall give way to the steamer bound up the coast.

12. In case of two steamships approaching the same jetty, or landing place at the same time in the same direction, the steamship on the outer course shall give way to the

13. Steamship on the outer course shall give way to the steamship on the inner course.

13. Steamships landing or shipping passengers at any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place shall provide suitable gangways of not less than 2ft. 6in, in width, having a handrail on both sides, and after sunset these gangways shall be

sufficiently lighted.

14. No vessel or boat, except small rowing boats, shall approach any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place after sunset without burning the lights usually used by steamers or

- 15. No raft shall be moored within 100 yards of any jetty, wharf, pier, or landing place over night, nor shall any raft be moored in the fairway by day or by night, and any raft moored over night shall burn two bright lights from sunset to sunrise, one at each end, and fixed at least 8ft. above water level.
- 16. No vessel or boat, except small rowing boats or boats under 2½ tons' displacement, shall moor or anchor, within 500ft. of any jetty, wharf, pier, landing place, beacon or fairway without burning a riding light from sunset to sunrise.
- 17. No fishing nets shall be hung on nor spread about any part of any jetty, wharf, pier, landing place, or beacon.

  18. No bullock team shall be allowed on any jetty, fore-

shore, wharf, pier, or landing place.

19. No person or persons shall remove, damage, or destroy any life-buoy on any jetty, wharf, pier, landing place, or beacon, or use the same for any purpose other than saving life.

20. No explosives, as defined by Section 4 of the Statute 59 Vict., No. 38, shall be landed or discharged on any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier, or landing place without the permission of the Board or officer duly authorised by the Board.

21. No stones, rubbish, asbes, or any other substance shall be thrown into any part of the sea or discharged upon my jetty foreshore culvant when in into or landing place.

any jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier, or landing place, except at such places, if any, as may be defined for such purpose.

22. No advertisement, notice, or placard shall be exhibited upon any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier, beacon, or landing place without the permission of the Board having

been first obtained.

23. No person shall, under any pretext whatever, light, place, or keep a fire upon, or so near as to endanger any jetty, pier, wharf, culvert, or other work of the like nature, being public property under the control of the Board, constructed wholly or partially of wood, and any person so offending shall, upon conviction of every such offence, forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £10.

24. All cargo carted or conveyed on to any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place, shall be carefully removed from the vehicles carrying the same into the vessel receiving the same, and shall in no case be thrown from such vessel on to the jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place; provided that this regulation shall not apply to sand, stone, gravel, soil or manure, which is carefully loaded on any such jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place by special permission of the Board.

25. When any goods, merchandise, or plant of any description are placed on any intry foreshore wheat pier or

26. When any goods, incrementation, or plant of any description are placed on any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place, for shipment or ex-ship, the removal of the same shall proceed concurrently with the delivery on such jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place.

26. No person or persons shall in any way whatsoever make use of any jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier or landing place under construction or before the same shall have been expend to the mublic have been opened to the public.

27. No person or persons shall obstruct any officer of the Board in carrying out the repairs, construction or additions to any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place.

28. The Board may at any time, temporarily or perma-20. The board may at any time, temporarily or permanently, close any jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier or landing place for repairs, alterations, additions, inclemency of weather, or for any other cause whatever, by posting a notice on same to that effect, or otherwise publicly declaring such jetty, foreshore, culvert, wharf, pier or landing places to be closed. to be closed.

29. No drains for other than storm waters shall be led into the sea without the permission of the Board, and any existing drains shall be removed within three months from date of publication of these regulations, unless the permission to retain same shall be obtained from the Board in the

meantime.

30. No person or persons shall remove or cause to be removed from any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place, or the approaches thereto, any gravel, stone, timber, trees, shrubs, grasses or other material without the permission of the Board or officer duly authorised by the Board.

31. No jetty, wharf, pier or landing place shall be deemed opened for public use until notice thereof shall have been

published in the Government Gazette.

32. No person or persons shall erect any bench, shearlegs, crane, stocks, or other plant whatever, or in any way obstruct any jetty, foreshore, wharf, pier or landing place without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.

#### Penalties.

33. Where any person or persons by the foregoing Bylaws, or any of them, are required to do or perform any act or thing, and any such act or thing remains undone, the Board may cause the same to be performed and charge

cost and expenses against such person or persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

34. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act or thing contrary to any of these By-laws shall, on conviction for every offence, breach, or neglect, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (except when otherwise provided)

the sum of £20.

Where any person by these By-laws, or any of them, is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same and charge the costs and expenses against such persons, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

36. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and be liable, when not otherwise provided for, to a fine or penalty

not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

### PENALTIES TO BE PAID TO THE BOARD.

37. All penalties and other sums recovered under the provisions of these By-laws shall, unless otherwise provided, be paid to the Board, and shall become the property of and form part of the ordinary income of the district, except so much as may be payable to any informer.

#### LICENSE FEES.

All license fees due under the Act shall be paid to the secretary of the Board not later than the first day of February in each year.

Rates shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the first day of January and the first day of July, to the Secretary, at the office of the Board.

#### STALL-HOLDER'S LICENSE.

#### Cottesloe Roads Board.

Any foreign company carrying on business contrary to this part of this Act shall be liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds for every day on which it shall so carry on business; and any attorney of such company, or any other person, who shall on behalf of such company wilfully and knowingly assist in the carrying on of such business contrary to this part of this Act, shall incur a penalty of Five pounds for every day on which he shall so assist.

Effect of non-compliance.

(2.) If any foreign company shall carry on business contrary to this part of this Act the validity of any contracts, dealings, or transactions in relation to such business shall not be affected by this part of this Act, but such company shall not be entitled to bring or maintain any action, set-off, counter claim, or legal proceeding in respect of any such contract, dealing, or transaction until it shall have complied with this part of this Act.
