## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Depend-; ;; &:, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the provisions of "The Elementary Education Act, 1871, Amendment Act, 1893," the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to constitute Educational Districts, and define and alter the boundaries of any District: Now THEREFORE I, the Governor aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the Boundaries of the following District Boards of Education, and do declare them to be as set forth in the following Schedule.

## PERTH DISTRICT.

[1898.

Bounded on the South by the Northern shores of Melville and Perth Waters and the Swan River; on the Westward, Northward, and Eastward by lines extending Northerly along the West and North-West boundaries of the City of Perth, the East boundary of Leederville to the North-East corner of Location Ac; thence North-North-Westerly parallel to the Wanneroo Road to the Southern boundary of Location Au; thence North-Easterly partly along the North-West boundaries of Locations Z and 1175 to the latter's North corner; thence South-Easterly along the North-East boundaries of Locations 1175, 1182, and 1141 to the latter's East corner, and thence South-South-Easterly to the South corner of Location W on the Swan River.

### WEST PERTH DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast; on the South by lines starting from the sea coast and extending Easterly partly along the North boundary of Location  $\mathbb{A}$  w to the Eastern Railway; thence South-Westerly along said Railway to Aberdare Road; thence East along said road to the North-West boundary of the City of Perth; on the East by the said North-West boundary and the Eastern boundary of Leederville extending North-Eastward and North to the North-Eastern corner of Location  $\mathbb{A}$ , thence North-North-Westerly parallel to the Wanneroo Road to the Southern boundary of Location  $\mathbb{A}$ ; thence North-Easterly partly along the North-West boundaries of Location Z and 1175 to the latter's North corner; thence North-North-Westerly to the South-East corner of Location 104, and thence North; and on the North by a Westerly line from a point situate West from the North-West corner of Swan Location 1352.

### FREMANTLE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast, including Garden Island; on the North and East by the Swan River upwards from its mouth, the Southern shore of Melville Water and the Canning River upwards to Bull's Creek; thence by lines extending South along the East boundary of Canning Location 27 to its South-East corner; thence South-Easterly partly along the South-West boundary of Location 21 to its South corner; thence East-South-Easterly along that location's South-West boundary to its South corner; thence Southerly to the West corner of Location 31, and South-Easterly along part of its South-West boundary, and thence Southerly to the North-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 16 and along that location's East boundaries. And on the South by an East line from the sea coast towards the 41-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road.

### NORTH FREMANTLE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast; on the South and East by the Swan River upwards from its mouth, the North shores of Freshwater Bay and Melville Water, and the West boundary of the City of Perth; and on the North by Aberdare Road, the Eastern Railway, and a West line partly along the North boundary of Location  $\mathbf{Aw}$ .

### SWAN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an East and West line partly along the North boundary of Swan Location 1352; on the West and South by lines starting from the West end of the North boundary at a point situate North of the South-East corner of Location 104 and extending South to the said South-East corner of Location 104; thence South-South-Easterly to the North corner of Swan Location 1175, thence South-Easterly along the North-East boundaries of Locations 1175, 1182, and 1141 to the latter's East corner; thence South-South-Easterly to the South corner of Location W; thence Easterly along the Swan River to the East corner of Location 'I', thence South-Easterly along the North-East boundary of Location 30 to the latter's East corner; thence South-Easterly to the West corner of Canning Location 145 and along part of its South-West boundary, and thence Southward and Eastward along the West and South boundaries of  $\Lambda$ 1774 and an East line; and on the East by a North line through the South-East corner of Location 95 at Bailup.

### CANNING DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North-West by the Eastern and Southern shores of Melville and Perth Waters; on the North-East by lines starting from the North corner of Swan Location 30 and extending South-East along its North-East boundary to its East corner; thence South-Easterly to the West corner of Canning Location 145 and along part of its South-West boundary; on the *south-West* by the Canning River upwards from Melville Water to Bul's Creek at the North-East corner of Canning Location 27; thence by lines extending South to that location's South-East corner; thence South-Easterly partly along the South-West boundary of Location 21 to its South corner; thence East-South-Easterly to the West corner of Location 16; thence South-Easterly along its boundary to its South corner; and on the South-East boundary of said Location 16, crossing the Canning River and along the North-West boundary of Location 38; thence East to the West boundary of Reserve 1774, and North and East along its Western boundaries to the South-West boundary of Location 145.

### JARRAHDALE DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by lines starting from the South corner of Canning Location 16 and extending North-East along its South-East boundary, the Canning River, and the North-East boundary of Location 38; thence East to the West boundary of  $\Lambda$  1774, and thence South and Easterly along that reserve's West and South boundaries and an East line; on the West by lines starting from the South corner of Location 16 aforesaid and extending South to the West corner of Location 31, and South-Easterly along part of its South-West boundary; thence South to the North-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 16 and along part of that location's East boundaries; on the South by an East line through the 41-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road; and on the East by North and West lines along part of the East and North boundaries of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Timber Concession, and a North line towards the South-East corner of Location 95 at Bailup.

### MURRAY DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an East line from the sea coast to the 41-Mile post on the Perth-Albany Road; on the East by a Southerly line from said mile post to the Hotham and Williams River junction; on the West by the sea coast; along the North boundary of Wellington Location 422 to the Murray River, and along that river upwards to the junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers.

### GINGIN DISTRICT.

Bounded on the North by an East line from the sea coast partly along the North boundary of Swan Location 1373; on the *East* by a South line towards the South-East corner of Location 95 at Bailup; on the South by a West line partly along the North boundary of Swan Location 1352; and on the West by the sea coast.

Exemption from Duty—Fungicides and Insecticides.

### Order in Council.

W HEREAS by the 115th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892," power is given to the Governor, by Special Order in each case, to exempt from payment of duty, or any proportion thereof, under circumstances of an exceptional nature, to be stated in such Order, any goods upon which duties of Customs may be leviable; Now THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in view of the urgent need to promote the use of Fungicides and Insecticides in the fruit-growing industry, does hereby order that all Fungicides and Insecticides ordinarily used and applicable to use in such industry, imported into this Colony solely for such purpose, shall be exempt from the payment of duty.

W HEREAS by "The Public Health Act Further Amendment Act, 1895," the Governor may, by Order in Council, from time to time appoint a Local Board of Health for any locality to be defined in such Order: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby appoint the undermentioned persons to be a Local Board of Health 'for the localities known as "Boranup," "Karridale," "Hamelin," and "Augusta," including all land comprised within the following boundaries :---

Boranup.—All land within a radius of one mile from the Boranup Timber Mill.

Karridale.—All land within a radius of one mile from the Karridale Timber Mill.

Hamelin.—Reserve 6017∧, 500 acres (Hamelin Bay). Augusta.—Augusta Townsite.

INSTRUCTIONS TO THE HIGH COMMISSIONER, WESTERN PACIFIC.

Under and by virtue of the provisions of Articles 4 and 6 of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893,---

I, the Right Honourable Joseph Chamberlain, Her Majesty's Prin-cipal Secretary of State for the Colonies, do hereby direct that juris-diction under the said Order in Council shall be exercisable in relation to the British Settlement known as Pitcairn Island, situated in the Pacific Ocean, in Longitude 130° 6' W., and in Latitude 25° 3' S.

And I hereby further direct that these Instructions shall be pub-lished in the *Government Gazette* of Fiji, and in the manner specified in the 146th Article of the said Order in Council, and that all persons within the limits of the said Order in Council as hereby further defined shall govern themselves accordingly.

## Downing Street, 21st May, 1898.

SIR,—With reference to my Circular Despatches of 15th July, 1895, 18th February, 1896, 23rd February, 1897, and 15th May, 1897, respecting Colonial nominations for Naval Cadetships, I have the honour to transmit to you a copy of a letter from the Admiralty, stating that the Civil Service Commissioners have pointed out that the reprints of the papers set at the examinations would be of assistance to candidates in the Colonies in preparing for the examination, and enclosing certain papers on the subject.

You will have the goodness to bring this matter to the knowledge of applicants for nominations, and point out to them where the reprints can be purchased. If, however, there should not be sufficient time for the applicants to provide themselves with copies from this country, it may be desirable that you should lend copies to parents and schoolmasters for a limited period, in order to enable them to judge of the qualifications of students, and facilitate the commencement of an adequate preparation.

## Municipal By-Laws.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-Laws made by the Councils of the Municipalities of Geraldton and Perth.

### Municipality of Geraldton.

WHEREAS under the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," Sec. 123, it is necessary to define by a Bylaw under the Act the description, style, and materials of fences ordered to be erected by the Council, the following By-law, as an addition to By-law 32, has been made and passed by the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton :---

The description of fence erected under the provisions of Sec. 123 of 59 Vict., No. 10, shall be as follows:—  $5 \ge 3$  posts 7ft. long, sunk 2ft. 6in. in the ground, 9ft. centres, three rails of  $3 \ge 2$  checked into posts nailed at every bearing with two 4in. nails, to be covered with  $3 \ge 1$  pickets touching each other, alternate pickets at least 4ft. 6in. high, and the others at least 2ft. 6in. high, the long pickets to be secured with five 2in. nails, and the short ones with four 2in. nails—or such other fence as may be approved by the Council.

### Municipality of Perth.

WHEREAS by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (58 Vict., No. 10), Section 99, Sub-section 27, the Council of the City of Perth is empowered to make By-laws for regulating or prohibiting the use of bicycles and other velocipedes or perambulators in or upon the streets, roadways, and footways, and requiring and regulating the carrying of a lighted lamp after sunset by all bicycles and other velocipedes, and the carrying and sounding of a bell by the riders thereof by day or night: BE IT THEREFORE, and it is hereby ordered and directed by the Council of the City of Perth, in exercise of the power aforesaid, and of any other powers or authorities in that behalf exercisable by the said Council, that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation—

1. All By-laws heretofore made on the matters and things contained herein are hereby repealed.

2. Throughout this By-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

3. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot-passengers, provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

4. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted so as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way; and whenever any such person shall overtake with such machine any wagon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle (excepting any trancar), or any horse or other beast of burden, such person shall keep such machine to the right or off-side of such vehicle or horse or other beast of burden; and any person overtaking with such machine any wagon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or any foot-passenger proceeding along the carriage-way, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such wagon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or such horse or other beast of burden, or such foot-passenger, by sounding a bell, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

6. In every case where a person driving or riding a machine meets any horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden shall on such meeting become restive or alarmed, or shall cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such horse or other beast of burden, the person driving or riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.

7. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine along or across any street or any other public thoroughfare furiously or negligently, or at such a rate of speed as to endanger the safety of any person or to the injury of any person, vehicle, or property in the street or thoroughfare along or across which such machine is being driven, ridden, or impelled.

8. No person shall ride, drive, or impel any machine along any street or any other public thoroughfare in such manner or in such order that more than two machines shall be travelling side by side in the same direction, except when such machines shall form part of a duly authorised parade or procession.

9. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction thereof, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

### Regulations respecting the Sale of Suburban Lands that have formed Portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896."

Suburban Lands throughout the Colony that 1. have formed portions of Areas acquired under "The Agricultural Lands Purchase Act, 1896," shall, after being surveyed into lots of convenient size, be offered for sale by public auction, as provided in Clauses 40, 41, and 42 of the Land Regulations of 1887, but subject to the condition that each lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries with a good and substantial fence, as prescribed in the aforesaid Land Regulations, within one year from the date of sale.

At all such sales, should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded, and the purchaser shall on the fall of the hammer deposit an amount equal to ten per cent. of the purchase money, and such deposit shall be considered as part payment thereof, so far as the same will extend. ### The Legal Practitioners Act, 1893.

WHEREAS by "The Legal Practitioners' Act, 1893" (hereinafter called the Act), the Barristers' Board thereby constituted is empowered to make and prescribe such rules as to the Board may seem meet for the matters and purposes in the Act mentioned. AND WHEREAS it is desirable to make and prescribe additional rules with respect to the admission and qualification and examination of candidates for admission as Practitioners. And WHEREAS the said Board now consists of RICHARD WILLIAM PENNEFATHER, the Attorney General of the Colony of Western Australia; ROBERT BRUCE BURNSIDE, the Crown Solicitor of the said Colony; and SEPTIMUS BURT and STEPHEN HENRY PARKER and GEORGE LEAKE, Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, residing and practising in the said Colony; and Messrs. RICHARD SEPTIMUS HAYNES, ALFRED BOWMAN KIDSON, BENJAMIN HARVIE DARBYSHIRE, MATTHEW LEWIS MOSS, and JAMES MONTGOMERY SPEED, duly elected members of the said Board : Now THEREFORE the said Board, by virtue of the powers vested in them by and under the Act, do hereby, at a meeting held at the office of the Attorney General, at Perth, this 22nd day of July, 1898, make and prescribe the following rules :--

1. Every applicant for admission as a Practitioner by virtue of any one or more of the qualifications enumerated in Sub-sections a, b, c, or d of Section 14 of "The Legal Practitioners' Act, 1893," shall, prior to his becoming entitled to a certificate in Form L to the rules made and prescribed by the Barristers' Board on the 5th day of March, 1894, pass an examination in the Statute Law of Western Australia, and shall produce to the Board a certificate on Form B in the Schedule to these rules.

2. Every person shall, 14 days prior to undergoing such examination, lodge with the Secretary to the Board an application in Form A in the said Schedule, and pay to the Board the sum of  $\pounds 5$  5s. for each such examination.

3. Every such examination shall be conducted by such person or persons, being legal practitioners, at such times and places as the Board may from time to time appoint or direct. No fee paid for any examination at which the candidate fails to present himself, or which he shall fail to pass to the satisfaction of the Board, shall be available for any subsequent examination, nor shall any such fee be returned.

4. These rules shall be read and construed with the rules of the Board made and prescribed on the 5th day of March, 1894.

The month has been characterised by the usual winter weather. High barometers North of Perth, and a succession of "lows" traversing the ocean South of the Continent in an Easterly direction. These were accompanied by heavy coastal squalls from North-West and West as the centre of the "low" passed. A storm of an unusual character was experienced on the 28th. It struck the West Coast in the neighbourhood of Perth, and seems to have travelled overland in the direction of Esperance Bay. The barometer fell very rapidly to a minimum of 29.44 at 2 p.m. at Perth (from 29.96 at midnight on the 27th) and rose almost as rapidly. The principal storms occurred on the 1st to 3rd, 12th, and 28th; the last one, as might be expected, was felt well inland. The others gave very heavy rains in the South-West, but these were mostly confined to coastal districts.

The total fall for the month was higher in the Bunbury District (7½ inches), decreasing gradually Northward to 1½ inches near Geraldton. In a line parallel to the coast, but about 50 miles inland, it increased from an inch near Mingenew to nearly 6 inches in the Dardanup District. Going Eastward from Perth it fell off rapidly from 5 inches near the coast to little over half an inch at Southern Cross. The Coolgardie and Murchison Districts fared very badly, and all North of Onslow no rain fell. Compared with past records, the monthly fall at Perth was about an average, but the total from 1st January to the end of July has been only 16:80, as against 20:92 for previous years. During the winter months (May, June, and July) the fall has been 15:35 this year, or 2 inches below the average for past years.

Turning our attention to the temperature statistics, it is interesting to note how very much colder the nights are inland than in coastal districts. The coldest place from which we receive reports for July is Southern Cross, where the mean minimum is 38.5, or nearly 11° lower than Perth, or  $16\frac{1}{2}$ ° below Rottnest. Sharp frosts were experienced on several occasions, the temperature on the surface of the ground falling to 24.5 at Katanning, 24.6 at Southern Cross, 26.0 at York, and 31.6 at Perth. The temperature at Perth was considerably in excess of that for previous years, the mean maximum (65° 5) being 1°.6, and the mean minimum (49°.7) nearly 4° above the average.
