HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Councils of the Municipalities of Perth and Coolgardie.

Municipality of Perth.

WHEREAS under "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," Section 99, Sub-section 27, the Council of every municipality shall have the power to make By-laws dealing with streets and footways, the Council of the City of Perth doth order as follows:—

1. No horse, ass, mule, camel, or other animal shall be left unattended in any street or thoroughfare, except the same be securely and effectively tethered to a bridle post.

2. The rider or person in charge of any horse, ass, mule, camel, or other animal left unattended and untethered as aforesaid, shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, and any such animal may be seized by any police constable or corporation officer, and removed to a place of safe custody.

3. No vehicle shall be left in any street or thoroughfare so as to obstruct the same or any portion thereof, and no vehicle to which any animal is attached shall be left unattended in any street or thoroughfare unless the near wheel or wheels thereof shall be locked or otherwise secured by means of a strap or chain, so as to effectually prevent the rotation of such wheel or wheels.

4. The owner or person in charge of any vehicle which shall be left in any street or thoroughfare, so as to obstruct the same or any portion thereof, and the driver of any vehicle to which any animal is attached, which shall be left unattended in any street or thoroughfare, and the wheels thereof shall not be secured as aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings, and any such vehicle and animal may be seized by any police constable or corporation officer, and removed to a place of safe custody.

5. Any vehicle standing in any street or thoroughfare shall at all times be placed and kept so that the same and any horse attached thereto shall be parallel with the kerb or the nearest footpath.

6. No person while riding or driving any horse or other animal or any vehicle shall pass or attempt to pass any other horse or animal or vehicle proceeding in the same direction, except on the right hand side thereof.

7. Every person who shall offend against By-laws numbered 5 and 6 shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty of not exceeding Forty shillings.

Municipality of Coolgardie.

BY-LAW No. 49.

MAKING A CHARGE OF ONE SHILLING PER CALENDAR MONTH, FOR THE REMOVAL OF HOUSEHOLD RUBBISH AND REFUSE.

1. From and after the 18th day of July, 1898, and until further notice, every householder or occupier of any house or tenement shall deposit household rubbish or refuse in a suitable receptacle, and shall have the said rubbish or refuse removed twice weekly by the Sanitary Contractor or any of his employees, and shall pay to the said Sanitary Contractor the sum of One shilling per calendar month for such service, as clearly set forth in Clause 30 of the Sanitary Contract; and the said Contractor is hereby authorised to sue for and recover all amounts that may be due and owing for such service, provided that it shall be optional on the part of any householder or occupier to make any private arrangement with the owner of any licensed vehicle for the service as aforesaid, and in such case due notice in writing shall be given to the Secretary of the Local Board of Health of such intention.

2. Every householder or occupier of any house or tenement shall, from and after the date above mentioned, enter into one or the other of the foregoing arrangements, failing which he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to direct that General Order No. 26 and the amendments thereto be cancelled, and that from and after the 1st day of September, 1898, Witnesses (other than Government Officers) duly summoned and attending to give evidence at any Criminal Session of the Supreme Court, before any Court of Quarter or General Sessions of the Peace, or before Justices in Petty Sessions, or on any Inquest, shall be paid only on the following scale:—

2. Female Witnesses shall be paid, according to their position, at rates not exceeding two-thirds of the above scale.

3. Children under the age of 14 shall be paid at rates not exceeding one-half of the above scale; children over the age of 14 and under the age of 18, at rates not exceeding two-thirds.

4. Government Officers will be reimbursed their actual expenses, according to their position in the Government Service, comparatively with persons in the above scale.

5. Resident Medical Officers shall be paid at the rate of fifteen shillings per diem.

6. In computing the compensation to be paid for loss of time, Witnesses (other than Government Officers) summoned from a distance where there is no railway or coach available, shall be entitled to receive one day's allowance for every fifteen miles (one way) that they may have to travel, beyond the allowance for every day that they may be in attendance at the Court. Witnesses (other than Government Officers) summoned and travelling by rail or coach shall receive one day's allowance for each complete day, exceeding six hours, and half a day's allowance for every portion of a day while travelling, beyond the allowance for every day that they may be in attendance at the Court, unless the journey can be performed on the same day as they attend in Court.

7. Witnesses shall be paid at the rate of eightpence per mile one way, where no train or coach is available, but Witnesses travelling by railway, coach, or steamer shall receive the actual fare.

8. All medical men in actual practice (other than Resident Medical Officers) attending Court outside a radius of 20 miles from their places of business shall receive an allowance for loss of time of £2 2s. a day in lieu of the amount stated in above scale.

9. Jurors attending on Inquests shall be paid at the rate of ten shillings a day for each day of attendance, and the sum of eightpence per mile of distance one way between their respective places of residence and the place where the Inquest is held, unless a train or coach is available, when the actual fare shall be paid.

“The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.”

Regulation.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulation under section six of “The Stock Diseases Act, 1895:—

Any person who, without the written authority of the Chief Inspector of Stock, carries, collects, keeps, or sends through the Post Office or otherwise, or is in any way knowingly concerned in the carriage, collection, keeping, or sending of any ticks or eggs of ticks shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds on conviction.

Regulation under “The Fishery Act, 1889.”

Department of Lands and Surveys,
Perth, 24th August, 1898.

WHEREAS by Section six of “The Fishery Act, 1889,” it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

To regulate the size of the meshes of nets to be used for the capture of any species of fish:

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net of less than three inch mesh or gauge (the mesh to be measured from point to point when stretched out and when in working order, or at the time of fishing) in any part of the Swan and Canning Rivers now open for net fishing.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used, and all fish which shall have been taken.

August was remarkably wet, in all Western and South-Western districts especially. The greatest average for any district was at the extreme South-West corner, where 914 points were recorded. Diminishing thence Northwards, we find 791 in the Perth District, and 510 around Geraldton. These records have been exceeded only twice in the case of Geraldton, and three times at Perth. The greatest amount registered at any one station was 1218 at Jarrahdale. Throughout the interior agricultural areas, on a line parallel to the coast and about 50 miles inland, the fall varied from 451 in the Mingenew District to a little over 6 inches as the South coast was approached. Another 50 miles inland it dropped down to between 3 and 4 inches. On the Goldfields, it varied from 73 points at Lawlers to 221 at Mount Margaret, 182 throughout the Coolgardie District, and 500 at Esperance. Our records do not, unfortunately, extend back beyond 1893, but in those five previous years no such rain has been experienced in August. On the Murchison, from 1 to 2 inches were recorded.

Turning now to the monthly means, we get some idea of the reason for the unusual quantity of rain, for the mean barometer at Perth (30.008 at the Botanical Gardens) is the lowest ever recorded for August, and is 0.110 below the average for previous years. If, in order to account for this, we turn to the daily weather maps, we find that the Southern coast has been visited repeatedly by a series of barometric depressions, which have brought squalls and heavy showers, varied by hot dry North and North-East winds. In fact, the temperature on the 24th was higher than ever previously recorded in August since 1879.

The climatological tables show the usual great ranges of temperature which prevail in this Colony. In fact, during any month, a person might pick almost any climate to suit his fancy, unless he happens to be a keen votary of skating. The average day temperatures range from 89.9 on the North coast to 61.2 at Breaksea Island, and the night from 68.8 at Wyndham to 42.7 at Katanning and Southern Cross, the monthly extremes ranging from 96.0 at Derby to 28.0 at Southern Cross.
