Beer Duty Act, 1898.

Regulations.

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 14th day of September, 1898.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor.

The Honourables

The Colonial Treasurer,

The Commissioner of Crown Lands,

The Minister of Mines, The Colonial Secretary.

HEREAS by "The Beer Duty Act, 1898," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for all or any of the purposes of the said Act, or for making allowances for drawback, or for spoiled stamps, or for beer which has become wasted, spoiled, or unfit for use, or for the disposal of damaged beer, or for altering the form of the Second and Third Schedules to the said Act, and that any such Regulations may prescribe penalties not exceeding Fifty pounds for the breach thereof; and further, that all such Regulations shall be published in the Government Gazette, and shall take effect from a date to be named therein: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say :-

Regulations under Beer Duty Act.

- 1. The duty of carrying out the provisions of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall, subject to the instructions of the Minister, devolve upon the Collector of
- The bond to be entered into by every brewer, in accordance with the seventh section of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall be in the form or to the effect in the First Schedule to these regulations.

- On all beer contained in vessels not specified or enumerated in section four of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, duty shall be paid on the actual number of gallons capable of being held in such vessel, but no brewer shall sell or remove from his brewery any beer in vessels other than those specified or enumerated in the said section, or in any vessels other than those approved of by the Minister under section eight of the said Act.
- One of the books required to be kept under the ninth and tenth sections of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall be in the form or to the effect in the Second Schedule in these regulations.
- The statements to be rendered monthly, in accordance with the provisions of the eleventh section of the Beer Duty Act, 1898, shall be in the form or to the effect in the Third Schedule to these regulations; and such statements shall be accompanied by a declaration in the form or to the effect in the Third Schedule to these regulations, and shall be signed by the brewer, or in the case of a company by the manager, managing director, secretary, or principal officer thereof.
- 6. Permits granted under the twentieth section of the Act will be supplied by the Collector of Customs, Fremantle, on the written application of the brewer, and shall be in the form and to the effect in the Fourth Schedule to these regulations.
- 7. Every permit granted as aforesaid shall be securely fixed upon the head of every vessel containing the beer proposed to be removed under such permit, and shall not be cancelled or destroyed until such beer is removed from the depôt, warehouse, or other building to which the same has been removed.
- 8. A duplicate permit shall be issued to the brewer, and on the removal of the vessel he shall write across such duplicate permit the words "removed accordingly." Such duplicate permit shall be returned to the Collector of Customs in such manner as may be directed by him. Any brewer not returning to the Collector of Customs, or not produc-

ing any duplicate permit when required by the Collector, shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.

- 9. Every brewer shall, before any beer is sold or removed from his brewery, mark or cause to be marked upon every vessel containing such beer the name or initials of the brewer by or for whom such beer was brewed, or in the case of a company, the name of the company by whom such beer was brewed. And every brewer shall, before any beer is sold or removed from his brewery, mark or cause to be marked u on every vessel a distinguishing number. Any brewer who shall mark or cause to be marked any two or more vessels with the same number shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.
- 10. When beer is being delivered or forwarded from any brewery, it must be accompanied by a cart note, and a duplicate cart note, upon each of which the words "duly stamped" shall be written or printed in red ink, and signed by the person to whom the beer is delivered. The cart note shall be handed to the person to whom the beer is delivered, and the duplicate shall be retained by the brewer.
- 11. No beer shall be removed from any brewery except between the hours of five o'clock in the morning and seven o'clock in the evening of the same day between the months of October and April, both inclusive, and between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of the same day between the months of May and September, both inclusive.
- 12. The written notice required to be given to the Collector of Customs, or other officer, under the twenty-eighth section of the said Act, shall be given twenty-four hours before the beer intended to be purchased as therein mentioned shall be removed; and no brewer shall remove beer purchased as aforesaid without giving such notice, or before the expiration of the time herein limited.
- 13. Whenever any malt or tun liquor in the first stages of fermentation, known as fermenting worts, of whatever kind shall be sold, as mentioned in the twenty-ninth section of the said Act, such unfermented worts shall not be removed except between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and six o'clock in the evening of the same day, nor until twenty-four hours' notice in writing has been given to the Collector of Customs, or other duly appointed officer, of the intention to remove the same, stating therein the brewery from which and to which such worts are to be removed.
- 14. In addition to the books required to be kept by brewers under the Beer Duty Act 1898, there shall be also kept at each brewery a book in the form or to the effect in the Fifth Schedule to these regulations, in which shall be entered the date of delivery, number, and contents of each vessel, also the name and address of the person to whom sent or delivered; and such book shall be open at all reasonable hours in the day time to the inspection of the Collector or other duly appointed officer, who may take extracts therefrom or transcripts thereof.
- 15. The duplicate statement mentioned in the eleventh section of the said Act shall be forwarded to the Collector of Customs, Fremantle.
- 16. Every person who shall commit a breach of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £2 and not exceeding £50.

Now the condition of the above-written obligation is such that if the said , his executors or administrators, shall pay or cause to be paid as directed by the said Act the duty payable by him or them under the said Act on all beer made by or for him or them before the same is sold or removed for consumption or sale, or for the purpose of being bottled, or before the same is bottled at the brewery, except as otherwise provided by the said Act; and further if the said shall in all respects faithfully comply, without fraud or evasion, with the requirements of the said Act and regulations made or to be made thereunder, then this obligation shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

Regulation under "The Fishery Act, 1889."

 $5\frac{50}{98}3$

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 24th August, 1898.

W HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

To regulate the size of the meshes of nets to be used for the capture of any species of fish:

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net of less than three inch mesh or gauge (the mesh to be measured from point to point when stretched out and when in working order, or at the time of fishing) in any part of the Swan and Canning Rivers now open for net fishing.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used, and all fish which shall have been taken.

Clause 80.—Size of Protection Area, North of the Tropic of Capricorn and beyond the limits of a Mining District, 80 chains by 80 chains; within the limits of a Mining District, 40 chains by 40 chains.

Clause 84.—The size of Reward Claims which shall be given for the discovery of payable minerals in any creek, river, or ordinary alluvial ground beyond the limits of a Mining District and North of the Tropic of Capricorn, shall be 320 acres; within the limits of a Mining District and one mile or more from the nearest boundaries of occupied workings, 160 acres.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that the following Regulations for the Competition for the Government Exhibitions have been approved by the Honourable the Minister of Education.

REGULATIONS.

The Exhibitions will be divided into Senior and Junior classes.

Five Senior Exhibitions of the value of £25 each, tenable for one year, will be offered for candidates of either sex between the ages of 16 and 18 years, and five Junior Exhibitions of the value of £15 each, tenable for a similar period, will be offered for candidates of either sex between the ages of 14 and 16 years.

The course of examination for seniors and juniors will be, respectively, that laid down for Senior and Junior Adelaide University Examinations.

Candidates must not be less than 14 or more than 18 years of age on the 1st day of November in the year in which the examination is held.

The examination will be held in Perth, and will commence on the 21st day of November.

A preliminary examination will be held by the Department on the 7th and 8th of October, in the following subjects:—

English.
English Composition.
Arithmetic.
Dictation.

No candidate will be allowed to proceed to the final examination unless successful in the preliminary examination.

The Department will pay the fees for the first ten junior candidates and for the first six senior candidates who pass the preliminary examination.

Candidates who qualify will be required to produce baptismal certificate, or satisfactory proof of age, before the Exhibition or Certificate is issued.

Applications for admission to the examinations must be made on the prescribed forms, which may now be obtained from the Education Department. Applications will not be received after 1st October.

SYLLABUS OF JUNIOR EXAMINATION.

Every candidate shall be required to satisfy the Examiners in three of the following subjects, but no candidate shall be examined in more than five:—

- 1. English :--
 - (a.) Outlines of the History of England.
 - (b.) English Literature—Poems of England (Macmillan), with repetition of Nos. 14, 15, 17, 26, and 32.
 - (c.) Outlines of Geography, especially the Geography of Australasia.
 - The Elements of Physical Geography:--
 - The Earth.—Its form, motions, measurements, and mapping of its surface.
 - The Sea.—Divisions, depth, saltness, form and nature of the ocean floor, waves, currents, and tides.
 - The Land.—Continents and islands, coast lines, mountains, plains, and valleys.
 - Distribution of rain, river systems, lakes, and inland seas.

Text Book—Geikie's Elementary Lessons in Physical Geography.

Candidates who satisfy the Examiners in two of the above will pass in English; but to obtain a *credit* they must satisfy the Examiners in all three.

- 2. Latin.
- 3. Greek.
- 4. French.
- 5. German.
 - (a.) Unseen passages of simple narrative prose.
 - (b.) Composition. Simple sentences to test knowledge of Grammar and the more common constructions of Syntax.
 - (c.) Grammar.

(Use of Dictionary allowed for a and b).

Only such candidates as satisfy the Examiners in grammar and in easy composition can obtain a credit in any of the above four languages. In French and German it will also be necessary to satisfy the Examiners in the translation into English of easy passages from some books not specified.

6. Mathematics:

Arithmetic.—Questions on the elementary processes of arithmetic, including fractions, decimals, practice, rectangular areas and volumes, square root, percentages, simple interest, profit and loss, exchange, compound interest, and stocks and shares.

Geometry.—The substance of Euclid Books I. and II., with Exercises.

Algebra.—To Simple Equations (inclusive).

- * Questions will also be set in the substance of Euclid Books III. and IV., with Exercises, and in Algebra to Quadratic Equations and Surds (both inclusive).
 - * Candidates for a pass only need not attempt these.

The standard for a Pass will be—Arithmetic, the substance of Euclid, Books I. and II., with Exercises, and Algebra to Simple Equations.

- 7. Physical and Natural Science:-
 - (a.) Elementary Physics-

The Elementary laws of mechanics, hydrostatics, light, heat, sound, electricity, and magnetism.

Text Book recommended—Wright's Text Book of Physics; the very elementary portions only.

Note.—Candidates should work a few simple experiments, such as may be found in Worthington's First Course of Laboratory Practice, or Gregory's Elementary Practical Physics (Macmillan).

(b.) Elementary Chemistry-

The elementary chemistry of the acid-forming elements, based upon Remsen's Elements of Chemistry (a text book for beginners), 2nd Edition, pages 1–165.

(c.) Elementary Botany and Physiology-

Botany.—The questions will be confined to the general structure of the flowering plant, with especial reference to the following illustrative plants:—Sweet William, Wallflower, Abutilon, Pea, Almond, Sow-thistle, Snapdragon, Jonquil, and Wild-oat.

Candidates will be required to describe in technical language the organs of fresh plants, and to fill up "Schedules." (See Oliver's Lessons in Elementary Botany). Candidates should provide themselves with forceps and magnifying glass.

Physiology.—Text Book recommended—Elementary Physiology (Foster and Shore).

Candidates will be required to show a practical acquaintance with the position, appearance, and general structure of the principal organs of the body.

Candidates must satisfy the Examiners in one of these divisions, and no candidate shall be examined in more than two.

SYLLABUS OF SENIOR EXAMINATION.

Every candidate shall be required to satisfy the Examiners in at least three of the following subjects, of which one must be No. 1 of Division A, and of the remaining two one must be selected from the other subjects of Division A, and one from the subjects of Division B:—

11. Botany and Phisiology :--

Botany.—The more conspicuous morphological variations of the sexual organs in each of the following orders, with particular reference to the more commonly occurring genera of the local flora: Ranunculaceæ, Leguminosæ, Myrtaceæ, Proteaceæ, Goodenoviæ, Compositæ, Schrophularinaceæ, Epacrideæ, Orchideæ, and Liliaceæ.

Questions may be set with reference to the type plants enumerated in the Syllabus for the Junior Examination of the previous year.

Candidates will be required to classify specimens (with or without the aid of the "Flora") illustrative of any of the above-mentioned orders. They should also provide themselves with forceps and magnifying glass.

- (b.) Details of the great mountain systems of the world. Nature and position of high plains. Low plains, their relations to geological structure, their position, distribution, and characteristics. Different kinds of valleys.
- (c.) Ocean—Divisions, depth, density, temperature, and colour. Form and nature of the ocean floor. Movements of the ocean. Waves and currents.
- (d.) Distribution of rain. Subterranean circulation of water. Springs, their origin, temperature, and mineral contents.
- (e.) River systems of the world. Deltas. Extent and peculiarities of lakes.
- (f.) Snow line. Glaciers. Icebergs.
- (g.) Distribution of winds in both hemispheres. Special local winds and their causes.
- (h.) Phenomena and causes that produce or modify climate.
- (i.) Volcanic and earthquake phenomena.
- (j.) The simple facts of the vertical and horizontal distribution of plants and animals on the land and in the sea; the influence of physical and climatic circumstances on the distribution of terrestrial life.

Text Book recommended.—Geikie's Elementary Lessons in Physical Geography.

Geology-

Questions will be confined to the undermentioned topics in the Elements of Physical Geology:—

Proofs of the origin of stratified rocks resulting from the degradation of the land produced by the action of rain, rivers, frosts, glaciers, icebergs, accumulations of organic debris, etc.

The transport of matter by rivers, the formation of the deltas, etc., and the general accumulations of great deposits of marine and fresh water strata.

The theory of the origin of salt lakes.

Proofs that large areas of the earth's surface are now being slowly elevated above or depressed beneath the sea. The relations of coral reefs and of earthquake and volcanic phenomena to this branch of the subject.

Explanations of common geological terms, as clay, sand, gravel, horizontal and inclined strata, anticlines and synclines, unconformability, dip, joint, fault.

The candidates will also be required to make sketches, and name unlabelled specimens of the commoner rocks of this country. They should provide themselves with scales and compasses.

Helena Vale Local Board of Health.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in it by virtue of the Public Health Act, 1886, Amendment Acts, 1892, 1893, and 1895, of Western Australia, the Helena Vale Local Board of Health hereby make the following By-laws, which shall be in force within the jurisdiction of the said Local Board of Health, and shall come into operation on the date of the publication of the same in the Government Gazette of this Colony.

ORDERS OF THE HELENA VALE LOCAL BOARD OF HEALTH.

Duties of Officer of Health.

It is the duty of the Officer of Health to superintend the application of all sanitary measures, especially those ordered by the Local Board and to advise the Local Board generally on all such matters.

The Officer of Health shall make frequent examination of the town, and see that the duties of the inspector are efficiently performed, and report any neglect of this officer.

He is to inspect premises that may be reported to him, or that he may have reason to believe are in a filthy or unwholesome condition, to examine premises where any process or manufacture causing effluvia is carried on, and, if necessary, report the same to the Local Board.

He is also to assist the Local Board with his presence and advice, if necessary, in the carrying out of the Act referring to the sale of unwholesome food, and on all occasions to give the Local Board the benefit of his experience and skill.

He is to report to the Local Board, with the least possible delay, the appearance in the town of any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease or any indications thereof, or any occurrence or circumstance affecting or likely to affect the public health; and he is to assist in carrying out and enforcing the necessary measures for mitigating, as far as possible, and preventing and checking the spread of epidemic and other diseases.

He is to furnish the Local Board, during the months of January and July in each year, with a return showing the births and deaths which have occurred in the town during the six months preceding, accompanied by a report on the health, cleanliness, and general sanitary state of the town for that period.

He shall issue to the inspector such orders and instructions as he may deem necessary, and the Inspector is required to report to him direct upon all matters appertaining to his duties. Any special matter contained in such reports necessary to be brought under the notice of the Local Board shall be forwarded by the Officer of Health in the usual manner.

Duties of Inspector.

He shall, by inspection of the town, as occasion may require, keep himself informed in respect of any nuisance existing therein that requires abatement.

On receiving notice of the existence of any nuisance in the town or of the breach of any By-law, he shall, as early as possible, visit the spot and inquire into the alleged nuisance or breach of By-law.

He shall report to the Officer of Health any noxious or offensive business, trade, or manufacture, and the breach or non-observance of any By-law made in respect of the same.

He shall from time to time, and forthwith upon any complaint, visit and inspect the shops kept and used for the sale of butchers' meat, poultry, fish, or any shop, store, bakery, dairy, warehouse, bonded or free store, auction-room, customhouse shed, or any place or premises or any part thereof which he may have reasonable grounds for believing is kept or used for the sale, or storage, or preparation for sale of any animals, or carcases of animals, or any meat, poultry, game, flesh, fish, fruit, vegetables, corn, bread, flour, tea, sugar, or milk, or any articles used, or which he may have reasonable grounds for believing are intended to be used as food for human consumption, and in case any such article appears to him to be intended for the food of man, and to be unfit for such food, he shall immediately report the same to the Officer of Health.

He shall, at irregular periods, visit all yards and butchers' establishments, and shall report forthwith to the Officer of Health any case of private slaughtering contrary to law.

He shall give immediate notice to the Officer of Health of the occurrence of any contagious disease of a dangerous nature, and he shall attend to the instructions of the Officer of Health with respect to any measures which can be lawfully taken by him for preventing the spread of any such disease.

He shall immediately report to the Officer of Health any case of over-crowding in any licensed house.

He shall immediately communicate to the Officer of Health whenever it appears to him that the intervention of that officer is necessary in consequence of the existence of any nuisance injurious to health.

For providing and maintaining suitable Closets and Urinals, and for prohibiting cesspits.

The owner of every house or premises within the Municipality of Helena Vale shall, after notice, cause to be constructed on said premises a suitable closet provided with the pans approved by the Council. Such closet shall be maintained and ventilated to the satisfaction of the officers of the Council, with a proper outlet at side or back of closet for removal of cesspan, proper door for same being hung on side, and shall in no case be situated at a less distance than 23ft. from any dwelling house or place of business, except by express permission of the Council first obtained.

The receptacle of every closet shall be constructed of galvanised iron, it shall be water-tight, and the floor of the closet upon which it stands shall be cemented or otherwise made impervious, and the receptacle shall be emptied at least once a week.

No urinal with cesspool attached shall hereafter be constructed in the said Municipality, unless the urinal is built in a substantial and suitable manner for the use required thereof, and unless the walls of the cesspool, 6in. below the level surface of the ground around it, be built of stone or concrete of the thickness, as respects stonework, of 12in., and concrete of 9in., and of the following dimensions, viz., 4ft. long, 3ft. wide, 4ft. deep, and so constructed and cemented, and made water-tight. All drains connecting the urinal with cesspool to be constructed so as to be water-tight. Cesspool to be covered with a strong wood top, over which a layer of earth must be placed to prevent effluvia arising therefrom. All cesspools must be emptied of their contents when notice to that effect has been duly served upon the owner or occupier of the premises, and no urinal erected after the date of this regulation coming into operation, shall, unless constructed as hereinbefore is provided, be suffered to remain after six days' notice in writing from any officer of the Municipality to remove or fill up the same.

Duties of Nightman.

The local Board will provide an office at which may be left daily, between 10 and 11 a.m., notices from occupiers of premises whose pails or pans need emptying, and where a list of such pails or pans shall be kept.

The nightman must enter upon the list a note opposite to each place mentioned in it, stating whether the work has been done, and if not the cause of the neglect.

If the nightman omit to empty any pail or pan, he must, the following morning, give in at the office notice of such omission, specifying where it has occurred and the cause of it.

The nightman must, at the end of each week, furnish an accurate statement of the number of pails or pans emptied during the week, and if any have been omitted, the number and cause of such omissions.

The nightman must post up neatly and without soilure inside each privy closet a notice (which shall be furnished to him for that purpose by the Local Board) of the night appointed for the emptying of such pail or pan, and shall immediately report at the office when any such notice shall have been obliterated or removed, and shall substitute and place a fresh copy in lieu thereof upon being furnished with one from the office for that purpose. The nightman shall be granted by the occupier of the premises visited by him in the discharge of his duty free ingress and egress to the same when requested; night keys for the opening of such gates; and it shall be the duty of the nightman after emptying the pails or pans to close and lock such gates, and return (on demand) each key to the person in charge of the premises to which it shall give access.

The nightmen will be required to conduct themselves towards the occupiers in a civil, obliging, and inoffensive manner; to perform the specified work with as little noise or disturbance as possible; and to re-instate and leave the premises clean, and, save as to the removing of the soil, in as nearly as possible the same condition in which they found them.

The soil must be carefully transferred from the pails or pans, which must be thoroughly and cleanly emptied, and every cart in which any soil shall be placed shall, on the same night, be driven to the place for the discharging of the soil from such cart, without deviation from or delay upon the road.

For the purpose of this service the town will be divided into as many districts as the Health Board may determine from time to time, and the nightman shall empty the whole of the pails or pans in each district in accordance with the list supplied.

Any man employed in connection with this service who makes any application or demand for liquor or reward of any kind from any householder for the performance of any work prescribed by these regulations shall, upon proof of such application or demand, be dismissed from employment.

The whole of the work must be done within such hours as shall be appointed by the Local Board.

The nightcarts used in conveying soil from pails or pans must be cleansed daily by the nightman and rendered inoffensive, and once in every week shall be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by such material as shall be supplied to him by the said Local Board for that purpose.

PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws the term "Hospital" shall mean a private hospital, as defined by section 24 of 59 Victoria 35.
- 2. Every private hospital or lodging house within the meaning of the said Act approved by the said Local Board of Health, whether heretofore or hereinafter estallished within the district of such Local Board, shall obtain a license and be registered at the office of such Local Board.
- 3. Every license and registration so obtained shall, subject to the powers of the said Local Board to cancel or revoke the same, be in force for 12 calendar months from the date of the granting thereof.
- 4. The said Local Board shall have the power at any time, and whether in the case of a private hospital heretofore or hereafter established, to refuse to grant, or to revoke or cancel any such license or registration, if, in the opinion of the said Local Board, the same, whether by reason of the drainage therefrom or from any other cause whatsoever, endangers or injuriously affects, or is likely to endanger or injuriously affect, persons or property in the neighbourhood thereof, or if default shall be made in the observance or performance of any of these, or any other By-laws or regulations for the time being in force under the

- said Act, or if, in the opinion of the said Local Board, the same is, from any cause whatever, relating either to the building or to the conduct or management thereof, undesirable in the interests of public health.
- 5. Any person opening, occupying, or conducting, or keeping open, occupied, or conducting any private hospital after the making of these, or any other By-laws or regulations hereafter to be made by the said Local Board under the said Act, unless such private hospital shall be duly registered, or after registration thereof has been revoked or cancelled, and any person nursing or otherwise assisting at any such private hospital, after written notice that the same is opened, occupied, or conducted in contravention of this By-law, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings for every such offence, and a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and not less than Five shillings for every day during which such breach shall be committed or continue.
- 6. Any person desiring to open, occupy, or conduct, or to keep open, occupied, or conducted any hospital within the jurisdiction of the Local Board of Helena Vale shall make written application to the Board stating—
 - (a.) The locality of the premises proposed to be licensed and registered;
 - (b.) The number of patients to be taken in, and the minimum number of nurses to be constantly employed;
 - (c.) What provision is made for the sanitary arrangements, including the collection and disposal of all filth, house refuse, slops, etc., etc.;
 - (d.) The name and address of the applicant, and the qualifications possessed by him or her.
- 7. Such application shall be accompanied with a plan of the premises proposed to be licensed and registered, and also with a certificate signed by the Officer of Health that the premises are in every way fit to be licensed and registered, and that due and proper provision has been made to observe these By-laws; and also accompanied with a certificate signed by the Nuisance Inspector that the sanitary arrangements are in every way satisfactory.
- 8. Within seven days after the application aforesaid is lodged with the Town Clerk of Helena Vale, the applicant shall advertise notice in two daily papers published in Perth or Fremantie in Form A in the Schedule. Such advertisement shall be inserted in seven issues of each of the said papers, and copies of such issues lodged with the said Town Clerk.
- 9. No license or registration shall be granted in respect of any premises when any part of the buildings on such premises is within 20ft. of any other building or erection.
- 10. No person shall apply for or be granted a license or registration unless the Officer of Health shall certify in writing that the applicant is a certified nurse or in every manner qualified to be the keeper of a hospital. Nurses must have experience in nursing, and the number of nurses maintained shall be that recommended by the Officer of Health.
- 11. If an application is granted, the applicant shall receive from the said Town Clerk a certificate of registration in the Form B in the Schedule, subject to such conditions as the said Local Board may impose.
- 12. All vehicles employed in removing any person suffering from typhoid fever or any infectious or contagious disease shall be disinfected by having seat and floor sprinkled with a disinfectant before leaving premises, and the person in charge of hospital shall superintend the carrying out of same.
- 13. In all cases of infectious and contagious diseases disinfection shall take place under the supervision of the Officer of Health or Inspector or his deputy, subject to Clause 12.
- 14. There shall be no greater number of patients or other persons permitted to occupy or be in the said premises than the number which can be accommodated with space according to the undermentioned conditions:—
 - Each patient must have at least 500 cubic feet of air, and each fever patient must have at least 1,000 cubic feet of air.
 - No patient shall be placed or permitted to be in any part of the premises other than those which are specified in the application to be used by or for patients only.
 - No patient shall be put or allowed to remain in any part of the premises which the Officer of Health may at any time deem unfit for patients or such patient.

- Every contagious or infectious case and the attendant nurse shall be kept isolated from all other patients.
- 15. No alteration shall be made to any registered premises or any part thereof unless with the approval of the Officer of Health and the written consent of the said Town Clerk.
- 16. Persons of different sexes shall not occupy the same apartment, unless married couples or children under the age of ten years. More than one married couple shall not occupy the same room at one time.
 - 17. The keeper of every hospital shall-
 - (a.) At all times give access to the premises to the Officer of Health, and Inspector, and other servants or persons authorised by the said Local Board, and permit the Officer of Health to see and examine all patients;
 - (b.) Forthwith report to the Inspector, in writing, all cases of fever or other infectious or contagious cases;
 - (c.) Cause all refuse, rags, etc., to be burnt on the premises with appliances to be approved by the Officer of Health.
 - (d.) Provide separate pans for the collection and removal of all excrementitious matter from fever, infectious, and contagious diseases.
 - (e.) Forthwith provide, and at all times keep, all such materials and appliances as the Officer of Health may deem advisable for the use of patients or medical practitioners in charge of patients.
 - (f.) Forthwith carry out all such orders and directions as the Officer of Health may from time to time give relating to the sanitation, drainage, and good management of the premises, and the care and comfort of the patients, or any of them, at any time occupying the premises.
 - (y.) Forthwith carry out all such orders and directions which may be given from time to time by the Inspector relating to the sanitary arrangements and the collection and disposal of all nightsoil, house refuse, rags, slops, dirty water, and other matters.
 - (h.) At all times keep a register showing the name and address of each person admitted, the place from which he comes, and where the illness was contracted, the complaint from which he is suffering, and the medical practitioner under whose care the patient is, the date of admission, and the date of leaving, and whether the patient is discharged cured or otherwise, and, in case of death, the cause of death. Such register shall be signed by the practitioner in charge of the case, and provision shall be made in such register to enable patients and practitioners to record (if they so desire) any complaints against the hospital or his or her treatment therein.
 - (i.) Every register as aforesaid shall be the absolute property of the Local Board, and be at all times open to the inspection of the Officer of Health, and also of any medical practitioner attending any case at the hospital, and shall be kept in such place where it is open at all times to inspection by such persons, and, when filled, shall be handed to the said Town Clerk.
 - (j.) Shall not be absent from the registered premises for more than a week at a time without the written consent of the Officer of Health, and, during an absence, must appoint a competent person approved of by the Officer of Health to be in charge.
 - (k.) Shall not transfer the said premises, or permit any other person to carry on the business of a hospital in the said premises unless such other person has first applied and obtained a certificate of registration as keeper of the said premises.
 - (1.) At all times exercise a personal supervision over the premises and the persons employed therein, and see that all directions given by the medical practitioner in charge of any patient is faithfully and diligently carried out.
 - (m.) At all times keep the said premises and the yard attached thereto, and all outhouses and buildings, closets, and privies, and all household linen, beds, and bedding, appliances and material thoroughly cleansed and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Officer of Health.

- 18. The Local Board may forthwith cancel any registration if the keeper of the premises, or any person employed by such keeper, being permitted to be on the premises, shall commit any breach of, or shall neglect or fail to observe any of these By-laws, or any of the provisions of the Health Acts, or any order or direction given by the Officer of Health or Inspector or other competent officer of the Board.
- 19. All applications for renewal of registration shall be lodged with the Local Board, and the Local Board may, in its discretion, refuse any such renewal without being required to assign reasons.
- 20. Any person desiring to be qualified to become a nurse or attendant in any hospital may apply for a certificate to the Officer of Health, who may direct the said Town Clerk to grant or refuse such certificate, and may require the applicant to pass such examination as the said officer may think fit.
 - Any certificate granted by the said Town Clerk shall be in the Form C, and may be cancelled at any time in the discretion of the Officer of Health; but until so cancelled the person named therein shall be qualified to nurse or assist in any hospital registered under these By-laws.

These By-laws shall apply to the whole of the district of Helena Vale Board of Health, and to every hospital therein whether heretofore or hereafter established.

Lodginghouses.

- 21. The term "lodginghouse" shall bear the meaning as defined in Section 14 of the said Act (59 Victoria 35).
- 22. Any person desirous of keeping a lodginghouse shall make written application to the said Local Board, stating the locality of the premises proposed to be registered, and the number and sizes and dimensions of all rooms, and the number of rooms to be used for sleeping purposes, and the maximum number of beds to be used, and the number of persons to sleep in each such room, and shall, together with such application, send a ground plan of the premises and a certificate of character, in the Form A in the Schedule, signed by six respectable inhabitant householders and rate-payers of Helena Vale.
- 23. No registration shall be granted until the applicant lodges with the said Local Board a written certificate by the Officer of Health and Surveyor that the premises are properly and securely built, properly ventilated and drained, and in a sanitary state, and that the provisions of these Bylaws have been complied with.
- 24. There shall be no greater number of lodgers or other persons permitted to occupy any sleeping apartment, or to sleep in any apartment in the said premises than the number which can be accommodated with space according to the following conditions:—
 - (1.) In every apartment one person for each space of not less than 500 cubic feet contained in such apartment.
 - (2.) Two children under 10 years of age shall be counted as one person.
 - (3.) In the case of any apartment the walls of which do not reach from floor to ceiling the amount of space in such apartment shall not be deemed greater than if such walls did reach from floor to ceiling.
 - (4.) No room shall be registered or used as a sleeping apartment if it be in the basement or below the level of the ground, or if it be used as a kitchen, scullery, dining, or general sitting room, nor unless such room have a window admitting light and capable of being opened for the admission of fresh air.
 - (5.) No premises shall be registered unless the same be healthily situated and watertight, and otherwise in repair, inside and out, and unless the same have—
 - (a.) A supply of water and all conveniences for cooking and washing; and
 - (b.) A yard attached open to the sky and properly drained so as to run dry and effectually take off all waste water; and
 - (c.) A dust bin in the yard of sufficient size to contain the dust, ashes, and household garbage and refuse likely to accumulate during two weeks; and
 - (d.) A separate closet or privy for each 14 lodgers of each sex; and
 - (e.) Provision to the satisfaction of the Inspector for the collection and disposal of household slops, waste water, etc.

- (6.) Nothing herein contained shall authorise any lodginghouse-keeper to permit any apartment to be used as a sleeping apartment, except such as is specified in his application and to the number so specified.
- The Local Board may refuse to register any premises without being required to assign reasons
- 26. If any application is granted the applicant shall, on payment of a fee of Five shillings, be entitled to a certificate of registration in the Form B, subject to such conditions (if any) as the said Local Board may determine, and on such certificate being issued (and while it remains uncancelled) the premises shall be duly registered.
- 27. The keeper of every lodginghouse shall put up and keep exhibited in a conspicuous place in each sleeping apartment a notice signed by the said Town Clerk stating the number of persons allowed to sleep in each room.
- 28. No alteration shall be made to any licensed premises unless with the previous consent of the said Town Clerk in writing.
- 29. The keeper of every lodginghouse shall whenever required by any police constable or officer, or any officer or servant of the Local Board, produce his certificate of registration for inspection.
- Persons of different sexes shall not occupy the same sleeping apartments, except married couples or parents with their children under ten years of age, or except children under ten years of age.
- 31. More than one married couple shall not occupy the same sleeping apartment at any one time.
 - 32. The keeper of every lodginghouse shall—
 - (a.) Limewash or otherwise cleanse, to the satisfaction of the Inspector, the walls and ceilings of all sleeping apartments in the first week of each of the months of April and October in each year.
 - (b.) Cause the floors of all rooms, apartments, passages and stairs of such premises to be kept at all times clean, to be swept and cleansed from dust once at least daily before 10 o'clock in the forenoon, and the floors to be scrubbed and washed once at least every week.
 - (c.) Cause the yard and out-premises to be swept daily, and to be kept at all times clean and free from filth, the seats and floor of all closets or privies to be scrubbed and washed daily, and the walls to be limewashed at least every month.
 - (d.) Cause all house refuse, garbage, dirt, ashes, and other matter to be emptied into a watertight and sufficient dust-bin, and to cause such to be emptied and disinfected at least once a week
 - (e.) Provide sufficient washstand and fittings, with a supply of water, soap, and clean towels in every sleeping apartment for females or married couples, and shall, for male lodgers, provide sufficient accommodation and appliances, soap, and towels for washing, either in the sleeping apartments of such lodgers or in a convenient room set apart and fitted for the purpose.
 - (f.) Keep all beds, blankets, rugs, covers, and sheets, and all towels and house linen free from vermin, and in a wholesome condition.
 - (g.) Wash every sheet and all household linen at least once every seven days.
 - (h.) Cause every sleeping apartment to be at all times furnished with toilet utensils, and a bedstead and sufficient bedding, that is to say, a bed or mattress, two sheets, a rug, and not less than one blanket in winter for each lodger.
 - (i.) Cause the fireplace and chimney and other aper tures for ventilation in every sleeping apartment to be kept open, and the doors and windows of all such apartments to be kept open from nine o'clock in the forenoon to five o'clock in the afternoon every day, unless during such time as injury might result because of wet or tempestuous weather, or while there is any person sick in such apartment.
 - (j.) Forthwith comply with and carry out all such instructions as he may receive from the Inspector or Officer of Health, and which may, in the opinion of such Officer or Inspector, be advisable in the interests of health, or to secure the observance of these By-laws.
- No keeper of a lodginghouse shall suffer or permit any immoral conduct or behaviour on the registered premises.

- 34. The Local Board may forthwith cancel and revoke the registration of premises whereon there has been, in the opinion of the said Local Board, with or without the know-ledge of the keeper thereof, any breach or non-performance of any of these By-laws or of any of the provisions contained in the said Act.
- No registration shall remain in force after the first day of January following the grant thereof.
- All applications for renewals of registration shall be made on or before the first day of November in each and every year.
- 37. The Local Board may, in its discretion, refuse to renew any registration without being required to assign reasons.
- 38. The said Town Clerk shall keep a register in accordance with Section 17 of the 59 Vict. 35, in the Form C in the Schedule. Such register shall be open to inspection on payment of a fee of 2s. 6d. for each search.
- 39. In the cases of lodging houses where lodgers are not taken for a day or less, the Local Board may exempt any such houses from the operation of any of these By-laws.
- 40. Every person offending against any of the foregoing By-laws shall, for every such offence, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10 and not less than 5s.
