HEREAS by a certain Deed Poll bearing date the 3rd day of September, 1844, under the hand of the then Governor and the Public Seal of our Colony of Western Australia, the lands known and therein described as Leschenault Location No. 1, and consisting of One hundred and three thousand acres were granted unto William Hutt, of Conduit Street, in the County of Middlesex; Edmund William Jerningham, of Henrietta Street, Covent Garden, in the County of Middlesex; Henry Buckle, of Mark Lane, in the City of London; John Chapman, of Leadenhall Street, in the City of London; CHARLES ENDERBY, of Great St. Helen's, in the City of London, and James Irving, of Welbeck Street, in the County of Middlesex, Esquires: And WHEREAS by the said Deed Poll it was made lawful for us, our heirs and successors, or for any person or persons acting in that behalf by our or their authority, to resume and enter upon possession of any part of the said lands which it might at any time by us, our heirs and successors, be deemed necessary to resume for works of public utility or convenience, and such lands so resumed to hold to us, our heirs and successors, as of our or their former estate, without making to the said grantees respectively any compensation in respect thereof, so that the lands so resumed should not exceed one-twentieth part in the whole of the lands aforesaid: Now, know YE that I, the Governor of the said Colony, acting for and on behalf of, and by the authority of Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, do hereby proclaim and give notice that under the provisions of the said Deed Poll contained those portions of land, containing

in the aggregate one rood and eleven and eight-tenth perches, as coloured pink on Resumption Plan 86 in the Department of Lands and Surveys, also that portion of land containing eight acres and three roods, as bordered green in Diagram 989 in the Department of Lands and Surveys (all contained in the said Leschenault Location) 1, have been this day resumed for the purposes of quarrying stone and carrying it by railway for use in the construction of the Bunbury Harbour Works.

WHEREAS by the 115th Section of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892," power is given to the Governor, by Special Order in each case, to exempt from payment of duty, or any proportion thereof, under circumstances of an exceptional nature, to be stated in such Order, any goods upon which duties of Customs may be leviable; Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, having considered it highly desirable to encourage the Smelting of Ores within this Colony, does hereby order that all Argentiferous Lead Ore imported for use in the Smelting of Gold Ores shall be exempt from the payment of duty.

#### The Immigration Restriction Act, 1897.

Whereas the Governor is empowered by Section 16 of "The Immigration Restriction Act, 1897," to make Regulations for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor of Western Australia, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following Regulation:

"That a Fee of Two pounds shall be charged for all Certificates granted under Section 6 of the above-mentioned Act."

# Municipal By-Laws.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Perth, 29th September, 1898.

Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Claremont.

#### Municipality of Claremont.

By-Law for regulating sundry Matters relating to Traffic, etc., in the Municipality of Claremont, AND PAYMENT OF CARRIAGE LICENSES.

#### Unlawful Acts.

A person who commits within the Municipality any of the following acts, that is to say:-

Removing Timber.
(a.) Cuts or removes, without the consent, in writing, of the Mayor, timber, earth, sand, gravel, stone, or other material from a road.

#### Erecting Structures.

(b.) Erects, without the consent aforesaid, a structure upon a road so as to encroach thereon.

#### Depositing Earth, etc.

(c.) Deposits, without the consent as aforesaid, earth, stone, timber, or other material or rubbish upon a road.

#### $Crossing\ Water-tables,\ etc.$

- (d.) Draws, without the consent as aforesaid, across the water-table of a road, except over a properly constructed pipe, approach, or culvert, a dray or other wheeled vehicle.
- (e.) Draws upon a road, timber, stone, or other material otherwise than on a wheeled vehicle, or suffers such material carried principally or in part upon a wheeled vehicle to drag or trail upon a road.

# Driving without Lights.

(f.) Drives without lights a vehicle on a public road after the hour of sunset and before sunrise.

#### Nuisances.

- (g.) Injures or pollutes any well or watering place which shall have been made or constructed by or be under the control of the Council.
- (h.) Deposits or casts upon a road or public place the carcase of a dead animal or any refuse or offensive matter.
- (i.) Causes or permits the drainage from a sewer, slaughter house, closet, or stable to discharge on any road or public places,

Shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this By-law, and be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5 for each such

#### LICENSES.

All licenses for carriages or carts, etc., shall be payable to the Officer appointed by the Council on the 1st of January in each year, in advance, as prescribed by Act 40 Vict., No. 5.

#### BY-LAW.

A BY-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICI-PALITY OF CLAREMONT.

Whereas by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," Section 99, Sub-section 21, it is enacted that "It shall be lawful for 99, Sub-section 21, it is enacted that "It shall be lawful for the Council to make, publish, alter, modify, amend, or repeal such By-laws and Regulations as it shall seem meet for regulating its own proceedings:" Be it therefore enacted by the Council of the Municipality of Claremont, that from and after the date of this By-law coming into operation, the proceedings and business of the said Council shall be con-ducted a condition to the following Boundations calls which ducted according to the following Regulations only, which shall be, and be called the Standing Orders of the said Council:

#### ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

- 1. The business of the Council shall be conducted on all occasions with open doors, except when in committee.
- The Council shall commence business so soon after the time stated in the summons as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum, which quorum shall consist of not less than four members, exclusive of the Mayor or councillor chosen to preside; but if, at the expiration of twenty minutes from the time speci-fied in the summons, there is not a quorum present, the Council shall stand adjourned.
- 3. Should the Mayor not be present, the meeting shall elect a chairman from the councillors present, who shall preside during the absence of the Mayor, and in the construction of these Standing Orders the term Mayor shall mean Mayor or councillor who is appointed to preside.
- 4. At all meetings of the Council when there are not four members present or when the Council is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than four members present exclusive of the Mayor, such circumstance, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book, and the meeting shall stand adjourned.
- 5. At all meetings of the council the minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and at the conclusion of the business at each meeting the draft minutes shall be read and rectified, if necessary, at the discretion of the Mayor without discussion.
- 6. Immediately after the confirmation of the minutes, the Mayor may make any communication to the Council he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Council to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at that time.

# LETTERS, PETITIONS, MEMORIALS.

- Letters, petitions, and memorials shall then be read, and amounts of tenders for works declared.
- 8. Immediately before the orders of the day are called on reports of committees and officers shall be laid on the table.

# ORDERS OF THE DAY.

- 9. The orders of the day shall be numbered and disposed of in the order in which they appear on the paper, reports of committees being numbered as the first orders for the day.
- 10. Any member of the Council may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the Town Clerk at least six clear days previous to the meeting at which it is intended to consider the same, and the sub-stance of such notice shall be communicated by the Town Clerk to the Members of Council in the summons for such meeting, and all such notices of motion shall be considered orders of the day.

- 11. No order of the day shall be proceeded with when called on unless the member who gave the notice, or some member authorised by him in writing to proceed thereon be present, but the same shall lapse in the order in which it stands upon the paper.
- 12. If at any adjournment of the Council any orders of the day on the notice paper have not been called on, such orders of the day shall be set down on the notice paper for the next sitting day at the end of the regular business.
- $13.\,\,$  Consideration of tenders shall be taken in committee of the Council.

#### ORDERS OF DEBATE.

- 14. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment or of discussing any matter under consideration must rise in his place uncovered and address the Mayor, and no member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, in which case he shall sit down and the member calling to order shall, in the first place, name the Standing Order on the strength of which he rises, and, if found to be correct by the Mayor, shall be heard in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.
- 15. Any member proposing a motion or an amendment shall put it in writing and sign and deliver it to the Mayor after it has been duly seconded, and the Mayor shall read the same before being discussed, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the Council.
- 16. Any member may require the enforcement of any Standing Order of the Council by simply noticing that such Order is disobeyed.
- 17. The members in speaking shall designate each other by their respective titles of Mayor or Councillor as the case may be; the Mayor shall decide which is entitled to preaudience.
- 18. No member shall speak twice upon the same question except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last carried; nevertheless any member who may have been misrepresented or misunderstood shall be allowed to explain immediately; the amendment or the original motion as the case may be, shall be put to the vote immediately after the mover has replied.
- 19. The Mayor shall, without waiting for the interposition of the Council, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in explanation where he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
- 20. Any member moving a motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question; but any member who may have signed the proposition paper either as proposer or seconder to enable the reports of the committee of Council to be put to the vote for adoption or otherwise by the Council shall not be held to have spoken thereon by such act, but may address the Council on matters contained in such reports.
- 21. Any member moving a suspension of the Standing Orders or any of them shall be entitled simply to state the grounds of such motion, and the nature and objects of the motion which he may seek to make thereon, but no discussion shall take place upon any such motion.
- 22. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives to any other member, and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.
- 23. Any member may require the Town Clerk to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.
- 24. The Mayor, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision shall be final in that particular case.
- 25. Any member who shall use any expression capable, in the opinion of the Mayor, of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the Council, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the Council.
- 26. No member shall converse aloud except to call to order, or make any noise or disturbance whilst any member is speaking or whilst any other matter is being read or opened, and in case of such noise or disturbance being persisted in after the Mayor has called to order, the Mayor shall call upon the members making such disturbance by name, and every such person will incur the displeasure and censure of the Council.
- 27. When the Mayor is putting a question no member shall walk out of or across the Chamber, nor when a member is speaking shall any member hold discourse to interrupt him, except to order, nor pass between him and the Chair.

- 28. Any member may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the Corporation relating to the question or matter under discussion.
- 29. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but, if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon an amendment being accepted it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.
- 30. Upon the adoption of any amendment such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.
- 31. The mayor shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative, and he may do so as often as it is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority.
- 32. The Council shall vote by a show of hands, but any member of the Council may call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall, until the vote is recorded, stand up, and those in the negative retain their seats. All division lists shall be entered on the minutes.
- 33. No member shall reflect upon any vote of the Council except for the purpose of moving such vote to be rescinded.
- 34. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Council, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained.
- 35. No motion the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the Council, shall be entertained during the same municipal year unless a call of the whole Council has been duly made for the purpose, and no motion for rescinding any resolution of the Council which shall have been negatived by the Council shall again be entertained during the same municipal year unless by consent of at least six members of the Council.
- 36. A debate may be adjourned on a motion, without any previous notice of motion, duly seconded and without discussion, either to a later hour of the same day or to any other day.
- 37. The member upon whose motion any debate shall be adjourned by the Council shall be entitled to pre-audience on the resumption of the debate.
- 38. If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the Council being counted out, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion without notice.
- 39. Every member present in the Council when the question is then put will be required to remain and vote.
- 40. In case of any equality of votes the Mayor shall give a casting vote, and any reasons stated by him shall be entered in the minutes and proceedings.

#### Suspension of Standing Orders.

- 41. In cases of urgent necessity any Standing Order or Orders of the Council may be suspended on motion duly made and seconded without notice, provided that such motion has the concurrence of at least six members of the Council.
- 42. Every member of the Council who shall commit a breach of any section of this "part" of these By-laws, or who shall move or attempt to move any motion or amendment embodying any matter as to which the Council has no legal jurisdiction, or who shall in any other way raise or attempt to raise any question, or shall address or attempt to address the Council on any subject which the said Council has no legal right to entertain or discuss, or who shall use any other language which, according to the common usage of gentlemen, would be held disorderly, or who shall say or do anything calculated to bring the Council into contempt, shall be deemed to be out of order.
- 43. The Mayor may, without the interposition of any other member of the Council, call any councillor to order whenever, in the opinion of such Mayor, there shall be a necessity for so doing.
- 44. Every member of the Council shall have the right of calling the attention of the Mayor to any motion, amendment, statement, argument, or observation moved, raised, or made by any other member which such first-named member may consider out of order.
- 45. A councillor called to order shall withdraw while the question of order is being discussed and decided on, unless specially permitted to offer an explanation, retraction, or apology; but on obtaining such special permission such councillor may explain, retract, or apologise for the matter

or remark alleged to have been out of order, and if such explanation, retraction, or apology be deemed satisfactory, no further discussion on the question of order shall be permitted.

- 46. If any Councillor, on being called to order, shall ask such permission to explain, retract, or apologise as aforesaid, the Mayor may, of his own authority, grant or refuse such permission as he may think fit, unless any Councillor shall require the sense of the Council to be taken on this question. In such case it shall be the duty of the Mayor to take the sense of the Council at once, without discussion as to whether such permission shall be granted. And when any such explanation, retraction, or apology shall have been made or offered by permission of the Mayor, the latter shall in a like manner decide, or if required so to do, shall take the sense of the Council as to whether such explanation, retraction, or apology is considered sufficient: If such permission be refused, or if such explanation, retraction, or apology be considered insufficient, the question of order shall be considered and decided before any further business is proceeded with: Provided that if such Mayor shall have decided the question of order before any Councillor shall have required the sense of the Council to be taken in reference thereto, such question of order shall not be reopened; and provided further that nothing herein contained shall be held to affect the right of such Mayor to decide finally as hereinbefore provided upon any such point of order after the same shall have been discussed.
- 47. The Mayor when called upon to decide points of order or practice shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he shall deem applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting upon the same.
- 48. Whenever it shall have been decided as aforesaid that any motion, amendment, or other matter before the Council is out of order, the same shall be rejected; and whenever anything said or done in Council by any Councillor shall be similarly decided to be out of order, such Councillor shall be called upon by the Mayor to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as the case may require.
- 49. Any Councillor who shall have been called to order, and who, after having been twice directed to withdraw as aforesaid, shall refuse to do so, or who shall persist in any line of conduct or argument or of observations which shall have been decided as aforesaid to be disorderly, or who shall refuse to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as aforesaid when required so to do, or who shall be guilty of any other act of disorder as defined in section 42 of this By-law, shall refuse to make such explanation, retraction, or apology as a majority of the Councillors then present shall consider satisfactory, shall be liable, on con-

viction before two Justices of the Peace, for the first offence to a penalty of not less than Ten shillings nor more than Five pounds, and on second conviction for the like offence he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Ten pounds, and on third conviction and for every further conviction for the like offence he shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Two pounds nor more than Twenty pounds.

50. Whenever any Councillor shall have committed an offence under this By-law, the Mayor shall forthwith lay or cause to be laid an information before a Justice of the Peace for the purpose of summoning the offending Councillor, and shall afterwards appear and prosecute the charge.

# Regulation under "The Fishery Act, 1889"

(53 Vict., No. 4).

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 14th September, 1898.

W HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Guzette, amongst other things:—

To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease;

To regulate the size of the meshes of nets to be used for the capture of any species of fish; And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceed-

ing Twenty Pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net of less than three inch mesh or gauge (the mesh to be measured from point to point when stretched out, and when in working order, or at the time of fishing) on and after the 1st January, 1899, in any part of the Swan and Canning Rivers now open for net fishing.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, or conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

The Regulation published in the Government Gazette of the 2nd September instant is hereby cancelled.

(53 Viet, No. 4.)

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 14th September, 1898.

W HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease,

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20), and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit for any breach of such Regulations:

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take or remove, in any manner whatever, during the months of November, December, January, and February in every year, any "Crayfish."

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all crayfish which shall have been taken.

Additions to Regulations 80 and 84—Protection Areas and Reward Claims North of the Tropic of Capricorn.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following additions to Regulations 80 and 84, under the provisions of "The Mineral Lands Act, 1892."

Clause 80.—Size of Protection Area, North of the Tropic of Capricorn and beyond the limits of a Mining District, 80 chains by 80 chains; within the limits of a Mining District, 40 chains by 40 chains.

Clause 84.—The size of Reward Claims which shall be given for the discovery of payable minerals in any creek, river, or ordinary alluvial ground beyond the limits of a Mining District and North of the Tropic of Capricorn, shall be 320 acres; within the limits of a Mining District and one mile or more from the nearest boundaries of occupied workings, 160 acres.

The above Reward shall be in addition to the number of claims to which the party should be otherwise entitled in ordinary alluvial claims, and may be marked off in one block, in any rectangular shape at the option of the prospector. Provided that no side of the block shall be less than 10 chains.

# Albany Sea Jetties.

REGULATIONS FOR THE WORKING, MANAGEMENT, AND USE OF THE ALBANY SEA JETTIES, FRAMED BY THE GOVERNOR IN EXECUTIVE COUNCIL OF THE 28th September, 1898, in accordance with THE PROVISIONS OF "THE JETTIES REGULATION Act, 1878" (42 Vict., No. 18).

- 1. The Albany Sea Jetties shall, in future, be under the control and management of the Commissioner of Railways for Western Australia and the officer or officers duly authorised by him on that behalf, by whom all trucking will be performed. And for the purpose the said Commissioner is hereby authorised to run locomotives and railway trucks and carriages of every description upon the said jetties.
- Owners of vessels and lighters using the Albany Jetties for delivering or receiving cargoes will be required to pay to the Pier Master in respect of berthing dues :-

One penny per ton of 2,240lbs.

Minimum—5s. per vessel, 2s. 6d. per lighter.

Consignees and shippers will be required to pay a charge of Two shillings per ton on all goods landed or shipped at the Jetties, such charge including all labour in trucking on the Jetties, the tonnage to be computed according to the undermentioned scale:

All goods not enumerated in the foregoing scale, 2s. per ton of 40 cubic feet, or dead weight 2s. per ton of 2,240lbs., at the Pier Master's option.

- Jetty dues on all goods must be prepaid to the Pier Master, unless the consignee or consignor has a duly authorised ledger account with the Department.
- Before commencing to discharge inward cargoes, ship masters or their agents shall hand to the Pier Master a freight list of the cargo, which shall include mark, number, shipper, consignee, weight, or measurement.
- Inward cargoes shall be delivered on to railway trucks or trollies, and, so far as is practicable, ship masters shall deliver cargoes according to the entries on bills of lading or manifests.
- 7. To insure prompt and correct deliveries to consignees, special efforts shall be made by ship masters to deliver goods of the same nature and brand together, i.e., where bag stuffs are available they shall be delivered together, where cases are available they shall be delivered together, etc.
- 8. Outward cargoes to be delivered in the same order as inward cargoes. Goods for different ports to be kept separately.
- 9. No goods shall be landed or placed on the jetties without written authority from the Pier Master.
- 10. If it shall appear that goods are being landed and cannot, in the opinion of the Pier Master, be removed in time to prevent a "block," the Pier Master may give notice, in writing, to the masters or persons in charge of vessels or lighters, from which goods are being discharged, to stop discharging .cargo, and upon such notice being given, no further cargo shall be discharged until such time as the Pier Master may direct.
- The official hour for trucking will be from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. between the 1st October and the 30th April, with an interval of one hour each for breakfast and dinner, and on Saturdays the hours will be from 6 a.m. to 1 p.m. From the 1st of May to 30th September 7.30 a.m, till 5 p.m., with an interval of one hour only for dinner. On Saturdays 7:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.
- On goods trucked after hours, on Holidays, or on Sundays, at the request of Shipping Agents, or others, the Pier Master will levy, in addition to the ordinary rates, the amount of overtime charges incurred.
- Cargoes which are partly free and partly for bond shall be taken to the Receiving Warehouses, where they will be tallied by Officers representing respectively the Customs and Railway Departments.
- 14. The hours of duty of Officers fulfilling the duties referred to in Regulation No. 13 shall be the same as those enumerated in Regulation No. 11.
- Should the Pier Master consider it necessary to work overtime, his order will be absolute, and the Officers named in Regulation No. 13 shall adhere strictly to his instructions,

- 16. If free goods are not removed from the Receiving Warehouses within 24 hours from the time they are placed therein, a storage charge of 6d. per ton or 1d. per package per day will be made.
- 17. Goods not cleared at the Custom House will be kept in the "Receiving Warehouses" for 24 consecutive hours after delivery ex ship, to enable consignees to have time to clear or enter them for bond. If at the end of 24 hours goods are uncleared, they will be delivered to Customs at the "Queen's Warehouse," but if entered for bond they shall be reloaded into Railway trucks and delivered to the Custom House Department, and a charge of 1s. per ton (minimum 3d. per consignment) will be made for haulage from the "Receiving Warehouses" to Customs Bond Stores.
- 18. Cargoes going direct into bond shall be tallied by Railway and Ship's Officers. The Railway Officer shall, if requested, give receipts for all deliveries ex ship.
- 19. The Railway Department will deliver bonded goods on trucks and trollies into Customs stores, between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. from October 1st to 30th April, and from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. from May 1st to September 30th, and the Customs employees shall push the trucks and trollies out of Customs stores when emptied. On Saturdays work will cease at 1 p.m.
- 20. The Railway trucks must not be detained in Customs stores for a longer period than four hours. The trollies to be discharged immediately.
- 21. Steam crane dues will be levied at the rate of Five shillings per hour; fraction of an hour to be reckoned as one hour. Hand cranes, 2s. 6d. per hour.
- 22. The Harbour Master and Pier Master shall arrange together where each vessel or lighter is to be berthed, consideration being given, amongst other things, to the discharging conveniences on jetty.
- 23. The Harbour Master will have the entire control of berthing and removing all ships, boats, or vessels coming to the jetties, under the following Regulations:
  - a. No vessels, boats, or flats shall be fastened to any part of such jetty or jetties, except to such ring-bolts or fastenings as are or may be provided for the purpose; and no vessels, boats, or flats shall lie alongside such jetties, unless so fastened. All vessels, boats, or flats so fastened shall also be anchored or moored in such manner as to relieve such jetties as much as possible from the weight of such craft; and in no case shall more than one tier of such vessels, boats, or flats lie alongside or be fastened to any such jetty or jetties, or be moored or fastened to other vessels, boats, or flats lying alongside any such jetty or jetties, except by special permission of the Harbour Mostar.
  - b. Such vessels, boats, or flats shall not be moored or so fastened as aforesaid, except for the purpose of loading or unloading, nor for any longer period during the authorised hours than shall be reasonably required for such purpose.
  - c. Passenger boats only may lay alongside the steps at any such jetty or jetties, for such time as may be necessary to embark or disembark passengers.
  - d. All such boats, vessels, or flats lying alongside any such jetty or jetties shall, on the approach thereto of a passenger steamer, be hauled off to a sufficient distance to enable her to disembark or embark passengers.

- e. Any steam vessel plying on the coast of this Colony shall be permitted to lie alongside any jetty for the purpose of discharging and taking in cargo at all hours of the day and night, consistently with the Regulations.
- f. All steamers when lying at a jetty shall have and use two up-and-down fenders made of rope, and outside the up-and-down fenders a fore-and-aft rope fender of sufficient length and thickness to keep the guard streak entirely clear of the fender piles.
- g. All foreign-going vessels shall be moored alongside the jetties in such positions as may be indicated by the Harbour Master, who may, if necessary, direct the removal of other craft for that purpose.
- h. Vessels shall unload in the order in which they arrive, and are placed in a list to be kept by the Harbour Master. Application to be placed in order on such lists according to arrival must be made to the Harbour Master on the day preceding that on which the vessel will unload. If such application be not made, the next vessel on the list shall have precedence, but the vessel forfeiting her turn may be placed next in succession. Vessels will load according to the order of application to the Harbour Master, and shall, when required by him, give place to discharging cargo. Vessels arriving from or bound to foreign ports shall have precedence of coasting and other craft.
- i. In the event of any vessel or vessels being moored alongside any of the jetties in such way as to exclude any other vessel or vessels whose owners or masters wish also to moor her or them alongside consistently with the Regulations, the Harbour Master may order the removal of such vessel or vessels to another berth or berths, and such vessel or vessels shall forthwith be removed accordingly.
- j. When the Harbour Master may deem it unsafe, through stress of weather, for a vessel to remain alongside a jetty, he shall direct the immediate removal of such vessel, and the Master or other person in charge of such vessel shall remove such vessel accordingly.
- 24. The Pier Master will supply water to shipping at the charge of 1s. per one hundred gallons, and which said charge shall be collected by him.
- 25. No person shall fish on such jetties, to the obstruction of the traffic.
- 26. Stones, bricks, clay, sand, lime, coals, coke, or other fuel shall not be landed or placed on the floors of the jetties. Firewood for the use of passenger steamers and other vessels or boats shall be taken direct from the truck to the vessel. No goods shall be handed over the rails of the jetties.
- 27. No bullock or horse teams, or any wheeled vehicle other than a railway truck drawn by any quadruped or quadrupeds, shall be driven on or permitted to go on, and no riding on horseback will be permitted on the jetties.
- 28. No stones or other kind of substance whatever shall be thrown into the water from such jetties, or from vessels moored alongside such jetties.
- 29. No person shall make fast any tackle, purchase, or other gear, to any part of the crane, or place or use any private derrick, crane, or other lifting machine without special permission obtained from the Pier Master.

- Not more than one ton shall be lifted with single half-inch chain, or two tons with a single block added. On a single five-eighth chain not more than 33cwt. shall be lifted, or 66cwt. with one single block added. For heavier weights the number of parts of the chain shall be increased in proportion to the weight to be lifted; but not more than five tons shall be lifted by any crane without special arrangements with the Pier Master.
- 31. No person or persons shall land or place, or cause to be landed or placed upon the jetties, or upon the approach to the jetties, any decayed or decaying vegetables or other thing whatsoever likely to become a nuisance.

Any person or persons violating the above Regulations is liable, on conviction, to forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £20 (42 Vict., No. 18, Section 3).

This month was unseasonably warm in Perth, the mean maximum temperature at the Botanic Gardens, 69.4, has only been exceeded once since 1881, and the mean minimum, 52.9, is the highest since 1878. The monthly mean is also the highest since that year. The mean barometer was about an average. The day temperature, as usual, shows a decided increase from the coast Eastwards, thus:—Fremantle, 65.6; the Observatory, 67.9; Botanic Gardens, 69.2; York, 70.5; and Southern Cross, 73.7. The weather has commenced to be warm on the Goldfields, the mean maximum rising from 66.1 last month to 73.7 this month at Coolgardie, and at Cue from 69.5 to 78.2. In the tropics also a decided increase has taken place, especially inland at Hall's Creek. The nights were still cold in Eastern districts, the lowest mean minimum being 43.8 at York and Southern Cross, and 45.4 at Katanning. No frosts were recorded during the month, the lowest temperature on the surface of the ground being 29.0 at Katanning.

Only one severe storm occurred during the month. This was of the usual winter type, and confined chiefly to the coastal districts. Otherwise, the usual variations of weather were experienced; but the influence of the coastal storms has apparently ceased to be felt on the Coolgardie Goldfields, where there was practically no rain throughout the month. The rainfall in the South-West portions of the Colony was, on the whole, slightly below the average for previous years, the defect being greatest in coastal districts North of Perth. In the tropics, as usual at this time of year, no rain fell, except between Wyndham and Hall's Creek.

#### TELEPHONE REGULATIONS.

#### TELEPHONE BUREAUS.

Telephone Bureaus are established at the General Post Office and the following Telegraph Offices:—

Perth Railway Station, Claremont, Cottesloe, Head Office (Fremantle), Town Hall (Fremantle), and Railway Station (Fremantle), where Subscribers to the Perth, Fremantle, Guildford, North Fremantle, and Cottesloe Exchanges can be communicated with, during Office hours, viz.:—At Head Offices (Perth and Fremantle), from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m.; Railway Station Offices (Perth and Fremantle), Town Hall (Fremantle), and Claremont, from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m.; and at Cottesloe from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Sundays, all Stations from 7 to 8 a.m. and from 6 to 7 p.m.

Fee for a conversation of five minutes, or fraction thereof, Sixpence.

No person will be allowed the use of the Telephone for more than ten minutes consecutively, if any other applicants are waiting for same.

Should the line be engaged, applicants will be registered and connected in the order of priority.

1. Persons may become Subscribers of the Telephone Exchange at Perth, Fremantle, North Fremantle, Cottesloe, or Guildford, for local service only, on payment of the following annual subscriptions for places within three (3) miles of the Exchange:—

Commercial Subscribers, including all Places of Business, and Legal Practitioners, etc.

Within a mile radius of the Telephone Exchange ... ... £7
Every additional quarter of a mile ... ... ... £1

Domestic Subscribers, including all Private Houses at which no Business is carried on (excepting the Medical).

Within a mile radius of the Telephone Exchange ... £5

Every additional quarter of a mile ... ... ... £1

Subscribers (commercial or domestic) will be entitled to use the trunk lines to communicate with Subscribers to other Exchanges on payment of an annual rental of 5s. per mile or fraction thereof.

The use of any trunk line must not, as a rule, exceed five (5) minutes at one time,

A Subscriber having one connection to two Exchanges, or two connections to one Exchange, will be entitled to use the trunk line for which he subscribes from both Telephones by paying one fee only.

- 2. Each Subscriber will be provided with one complete set of instruments connected by a special wire with the Telephone Exchange to which he subscribes. An extra charge will be made for extension bells, switches, and any additional instruments.
- 3. Partners in firms can have their names published separately in the Telephone Lists upon payment of the sum of Five shillings (5s.) per annum for each additional name.
- 4. If a connection with a Telephone Exchange necessitates the erection of a new line of poles beyond the three miles limit, then the additional annual charges for every mile after the third mile will be at the rate of  $\pounds 2$  10s. for every such mile or fraction thereof.
- 5. In the event of such line being used for additional wires, a proportionate reduction will be made to the original Subscriber for every wire so erected, from the date of opening of additional line, but in no case will the reduction be more than £1 10s. per mile after the third mile or fraction thereof.
- 6. If a Subscriber wishes to connect a second office or residence with the Telephone Exchange, under the same Exchange number, he will have to pay (in addition to the ordinary subscription) a yearly rental of £3 2s. 6d. for a second instrument and switch, and £1 for every additional quarter of a mile or fraction thereof of wire required for such additional connection. If however, no additional wire is required, or if the total length of wire from the Exchange does not exceed one mile, then the Subscriber shall only be required to pay the annual rental of additional instruments, etc.
- 7. Persons occupying offices in the same building can jointly subscribe to the Telephone Exchange under the same Exchange number, on paying, in addition to one ordinary subscription, £3 a year for each additional set of instruments fixed in the several offices of the said joint subscribers, who will have to provide an attendant for their own local switchboard, or should additional instruments not be required, on paying £2 a year for each additional name to be inserted on the list of subscribers.

Private lines erected beyond a radial distance of twenty miles of Perth, special arrangements and terms may be made with the Postmaster General.

- 9. In cases where natural difficulties occur as to construction and maintenance of lines, the Government reserve the right of charging special rates.
- 10. In cases where the subscriber is willing to supply poles, material, labour, etc., or pay the cost of construction, special arrangements and charges may be made with the Postmaster General.

- 11. The Postmaster General reserves the right to utilise a private line for Exchange purposes at any time.
- 12. The lessee of any private line must not permit the use of such line for any other purpose than his own business. Any breach of this rule may involve the removal of the line and instruments, without prejudice to the right of the Postmaster General to claim the rent for the remainder of the term.

#### III.-GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- 13. Should a Subscriber or Lessee change his residence, or wish his instruments to be shifted, he will be required to pay the whole or such proportion of the cost of the work as the Postmaster General may determine, and the subscription to be adjusted according to the altered length of the line.
  - 14. The rental of the Telephone, apparatus, lines, etc., is to be paid half-yearly in advance.
- 15. Should any Subscriber or Lessee allow his rent, or subscription, or any other sum due by him to the Department in connection with the Telephone system, to remain unpaid for fourteen days after the same shall have become due, the Postmaster General shall have the power to cancel the agreement, disconnect the line, and remove the instrument without further notice, or without prejudice to any proceedings for the recovery of any moneys then due or otherwise.
- 16. The Postmaster General may disconnect and withdraw the right to use any private line, or may exclude from the Telephone Exchange any Subscriber, or cause to be removed any instruments allotted to the use of such Subscriber, who allows the Telephone instruments in his custody or control to be damaged, or destroyed, or put to any illegal or improper purpose, or use any improper or insulting language; and such Subscriber shall have no claim for damages or otherwise in consequence of the removal or exclusion of the instrument under such circumstances.
- 17. Subscribers will be liable for all damages to instruments, wire, etc., beyond ordinary wear and tear, and shall pay the costs of the instruments, wire, etc., in the event of partial or total destruction by fire or other causes.
- 18. All instruments, apparatus, battery, lines, etc., are the exclusive property of the Government.
- 19. The Postmaster General or his officers shall at all times have free access to the premises for the purpose of inspecting all instruments, wires, etc., and also at the end, or sooner determination of the agreement, for the purpose of removing the same.
- 20. The Government shall not be held responsible for any errors, omissions, or delay in the transmission or non-transmission, delivery or non-delivery of any messages arising from any cause whatsoever.
- 21. Where any connection with an Exchange is over three miles in length, the applicant will be required to hold the same for three years, and to give a special bond to the satisfaction of the Postmaster General for the purpose of guaranteeing the payment of all charges and expenses incurred in relation to such connection. If under three miles, the agreement to be for a period of one year certain, terminable on giving one calendar month's notice, in writing.
- 22. The Telephone Exchanges at Perth, Albany, Coolgardie, Kalgoorlie, Boulder, and Fremantle are open day and night, except Christmas Day, when they are closed between 6 and 11 p.m. All other Exchanges are open on Week Days from 8 a.m. to 11 p.m., and on Sundays and Holidays from 9 a.m. to 11 p.m., except on Christmas Day and Good Friday, when they will close at 7 p.m.
- 23. No alterations, additions to instruments, wires, etc., will be allowed without permission of the Postmaster General; any Subscriber transgressing this rule renders himself liable to be disconnected without notice.
- 24. The Postmaster General reserves the right of refusing to connect any applicant with the Exchanges, or of erecting any private line.
- 25. Telephones must only be used by the Subscriber, or his family, or employees, and exclusively on his own business. Any infringement of this Regulation will render the Subscriber liable to have the Telephone disconnected, without prejudice to the right of the Postmaster General to claim for rent or any other charges that may be due.
- 26. No line shall be sublet or transferred without the consent and approval of the Postmaster General.
