W HEREAS by "The Transfer of Land Act, No. 22), the Governor is empowered, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, to revest in Her Majesty, or her heirs or successors, all or any lands whereof Her Majesty now is, or Her Majesty or her heirs or successors may hereafter become the registered proprietor or proprietors: And whereas Her Majesty is now the registered proprietor of Avon Locations 124 and 672, registered in the Office for the Registration of Deeds and Office of Titles, as enrolled No. 972, and in Volume XII., Folio 296 respectively: Now Therefore I, Sir Alexander Campbell Onslow, Knight, Chief Justice of Western Australia, Governor's Deputy, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do, by this my Proclamation, revest in Her Majesty the Queen, her heirs and successors, Avon Locations 124 and 672 aforesaid, as of her or their former estate.

"The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

Order in Council.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered by Order in Council, to be published in the Government Gazette, from time to time to prohibit the importation or introduction into the Colony, either by sea or land, of stock from any country or place, or to permit such introduction by land to be made at such inland places, or their importation by sea at such parts of the sea-coast in Western Australia, being "ports" within the meaning of the laws of the Customs for the time being, subject to such restrictions and regulations as he shall see fit: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony, by his Deputy, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby prohibit the introduction of Imported Stock into this Colony, except in conformity with, and subject to the Regulations made under the sixth section of the above Act, hereto appended. \*

## Regulations under "The Fishery Act, 1889."

(53 Vict., No. 4.)

8938

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 10th November, 1898.

HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things-

- (1.) To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- (2.) To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds, and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations.

His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or remove, in any manner whatever, any crayfish within the following area, from the date of publication hereof:-

Bounded on the Northward by a Westerly line from Rous Head to the Northern end of the five-fathom bank; on the Eastward by the sea coast; on the South by a West line therefrom to the South end of Coventry Reef; and on the Westward by the Western side of the five-fathom bank

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all crayfish which shall have been taken.

The Regulation published in the Government Gazette of the 23rd September, 1898, is hereby cancelled.

## "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

## Regulations

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 16th November, 1898.

TIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

GEO. THROSSELL, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. All stock imported into Western Australia from the Australian Colonies and New Zealand shall be exempt from Section 13 of "The Stock Diseases Act of 1895," and shall be admitted to the Colony on the certificate of a Government Inspector, in addition to a declaration by the owner or breeder of the stock, or manager of the farm or station from which they come, to the effect that such stock were, at the time of departure from their farm or station, and had been for three months immediately preceding, to the best of his belief, free from disease, and had not, for such period, been in contact with diseased animals.

If coming from beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies and New Zealand, stock shall perform the following periods of quarantine:—

And if, during the period of quarantine, any signs of disease be exhibited, then, if not ordered to be destroyed, such stock shall be kept in quarantine for such period as the inspector shall direct, and treated as he shall deem necessary.

- 2. All sheep and cattle intended for immediate slaughter may be landed on the permit of an inspector, and removed to such place as he may direct, and shall not be again removed alive without his written permission.
- 3. No stock which may lawfully be imported shall be landed at any port other than Fremantle, Albany, Champion Bay, Cossack, Eucla, and Esperance, unless they shall have been first inspected and passed by an inspector of stock at any one of the aforesaid ports.
- 4. All stock found on arrival by an inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be forthwith destroyed or kept and treated in quarantine, as such inspector shall direct.
- 5. No person shall enter or leave a quarantine ground without the permission of an inspector in writing, and every person who shall enter shall, if the inspector so directs, disinfect himself and his clothes in such a manner as the inspector shall order.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the quarantine ground, including the Perth Zoological Gardens.

- 6. All expenses of landing, removing to, maintaining, and keeping in quarantine, and of disinfecting or otherwise treating any stock, and all expenses in connection therewith, shall be paid by the owner or consignee of such stock to the inspector upon demand, and before such stock shall be removed from quarantine.
- 7. All expenses of destroying any stock, or of disinfecting or destroying any fodder or fittings, shall be paid by the owner or consignee thereof to an inspector upon demand.

- 8. The owner or consignee of any stock, fodder, or fittings shall deposit with the inspector, upon demand, such sum of money as shall be deemed by such inspector sufficient to defray all the expenses of inspection, maintenance, disinfection, medicine, attendance, transhipment, or conveyance to or from the quarantine ground of such stock, fodder, or fittings respectively; of disinfecting the vessel or conveyance in which such stock, fodder or fittings shall have been conveyed to the Colony, or to or from a quarantine ground; veterinary surgeon's fees for inspection, and all costs, charges, and expenses of every description in connection with or attendant upon the introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings. If such sums be not forthwith paid on demand as aforesaid, such stock, fodder, or fittings may be sold by an inspector for the purpose of defraying such expenses, fees, costs, and charges.
- 9. Any stock found at any time to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or suspected by the inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or affected with tick, or lice, or any parasite, may be seized by an inspector and placed in quarantine, and there treated as the inspector may direct, at the owner's expense, until clean; or if the disease should be of such a nature that, in the opinion of the inspector, such stock should be destroyed, the inspector shall report the case to the Minister, who may order the destruction of such stock at the owner's expense.
- 10. An inspector on finding stock infected with disease may, as he shall think fit, declare such portions of the land on which such stock may be found at the time of the discovery of the disease a quarantine area, within the boundaries of which such stock shall be kept in quarantine, or, at the discretion of the inspector, be transferred to some proclaimed quarantine area until declared clean by an inspector.
- 11. Fees for examination of stock imported from beyond the Australasian Colonies shall be as follows:—

Provided that the whole amount of fees for inspection of any one shipment by the same owner shall not exceed  $\pounds 5$ .

12. The Chief Inspector of Stock may give permission in writing to any occupier of land in Western Australia, who is also the occupier of land in South Australia adjoining such first mentioned land, for stock to be brought from such land to adjoining land within the Colony for the purpose of depasturing or being kept on such land for any period therein mentioned, not exceeding six calendar months at any one time; provided that such stock shall not, by reason of such permission, become "introduced" stock, nor allowed to be on any land in Western Australia, except on land mentioned in such permission.

- 13. Any owner intending to introduce any cattle by land into Western Australia shall give notice thereof in writing to the Inspector of Stock in the district into which they are to be introduced, in the form of Schedule A hereto, such notice to be delivered not less than seven days before the introduction of such cattle, and shall produce a certificate of a duly qualified Government inspector that such cattle have been successfully inoculated against pleuropneumonia immediately prior to their departure for Western Australia.
- 14. The crossing place for stock in the Kimberley District,  $vi\hat{a}$  South Australia, shall be at the Ord Station; and the crossing place for stock in the Eucla District,  $vi\hat{a}$  South Australia, shall be where the present road from South Australia crosses, about eight miles North-East from Eucla.
- 15. No stock adjudged by an inspector to be diseased shall cross the border into Western Australia, and any person so introducing such diseased stock shall be subject to a penalty of Five pounds per head.
- 16. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two hundred pounds, or imprisonment not exceeding six months where not otherwise provided.
- 17. Whenever any expenses, fees, costs, or charges have been incurred by an inspector under these Regulations, he may sell the stock, fodder, or fittings in respect of which the same were incurred, for the purpose of defraying all or any such expenses, fees, and charges.
- 18. An inspector, on suspecting any animal to be affected with tubercolosis, may subject such animal to the tuberculine test, and the owner, if required by the inspector, shall render all necessary assistance to facilitate the operation.
- 19. The Regulations dated the 12th day of August, 1896, are hereby cancelled.

W HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- I. To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine;
- 2. To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease;

and to impose such reasonable penalties not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit for any breach of such Regulations.

His Excellency the Governor in Council does by these Regulations declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine within in any part of Warnbro' Sound (otherwise known as Safety Bay) during the season commencing on the first day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December in each and every year till further notice.

And also, that it shall be unlawful for any person to fish with a line within the said Sound or Bay except between the times of five o'clock a.m. and eight o'clock a.m. during each day of the aforementioned season.

## SCALE OF ALLOWANCES TO PUBLIC OFFICERS TRAVELLING ON DUTY, &c.

#### DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS.

Subject to the general Regulations for allowance and subsistence, published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th November, 1898, it is notified that so much of the Regulations and General Instructions to Officers of the Public Works Department as are contained on pages 6, 7, and 8 of the Book of "General Instructions," and referring to Allowances, etc., are hereby cancelled, and the following is substituted in ieu thereof:—

#### LOCOMOTION EXPENSES.

- 1. Locomotion expenses will be allowed to Pubic Officers travelling by order, to the extent of the actual and reasonable amount paid for transport by such mode of conveyance as is available either by land or water. When travelling by land, and no public conveyance is available, a Public Officer not in receipt of an allowance for forage, if using his own conveyance, may be paid a mileage rate not exceeding 6d. per mile both ways.
- 2. It must be distinctly understood that Public Officers are not empowered to engage vehicles where there are public conveyances plying and available.
- 3. Unless specially authorised, cab fares will not be allowed when the distance can be traversed by the ordinary modes of conveyance by rail, tram, or omnibus.
- 4. All railway fares are to be paid by ticket order, as no officer will be given a refund if he pays cash, except on special approval by the head of his division.

## (A) SUBSISTENCE ALLOWANCE.

- 5. For all salaried officers continuously employed (excluding Supervisors and Inspectors, and other officers temporarily employed for special service, or when it is specifically agreed that the salary is to cover all allowances, etc.), the following scale is to be followed:—
  - 6. Public Officers receiving salaries of £500 a year and over ... 15 0
    7. Receiving from £300 and under £500 a year ... 12 6
    8. Receiving from £200 and under £300 a year ... 10 0 absence and three meals.
    9. Receiving under £200 a year ... ... 7 6
- 10. One-fourth deduction will be made from above allowances for each item of expense not necessarily incurred in any day by a Public Officer travelling on duty.
- 11. Vouchers must show each day's movements, and state the time of departure for and arrival at places.
- 12. Public Officers travelling on the Coolgardie, Yilgarn, Murchison, and Dundas Goldfields will be allowed 25 per cent. additional to the above-named subsistence rates.
- 13. No allowance, except railway train fare and a maximum charge of Two shillings and sixpence, will be allowed to Public Officers having to travel on duty by railway train or other conveyance, and able to return within nine hours to their head-quarters.
- 14. No allowance will be paid to Public Officers while travelling on duty on board vessels in cases where the passage money is paid by the Government.
- 15. In all cases where an Officer is detained more than ten days in one place 25 per cent. reduction will be made in the amount of daily allowance payable to him for time in excess of ten days.
- 16. No public officer will be allowed to charge a daily allowance who, in travelling, stays at a place where he has not to pay for his accommodation.
- 17. No allowance, except as above, to be drawn by any public officer in respect of travelling or personal expenses.

## (B) CAMP ALLOWANCES.

18. In the field in Camp: Three shillings per day.

#### (C) BACK COUNTRY ALLOWANCES.

19. When stationed on works where the officers' head-quarters or camp for the time being is on the Coolgardie, Yilgarn, Dundas, or Murchison Goldfield, or in any portion of the Colony North of the 26th parallel of latitude, an allowance will be made as under:—

If in receipt of a salary under £150 per annum ... £20 per annum

If in receipt of a salary over £150 and not exceeding £250 25 ,

- 20. Allowances under headings A and B must not be concurrent, but an allowance under headings A or B may be concurrent with an allowance under heading C.
- 21. Allowances under heading C may only be drawn when an officer is permanently stationed in the localities named, and will not be paid where an officer is on an official visit to such localities.
- 22. Where officers are temporarily employed for special services each case is to be specially considered and arranged on its merits, but in no case must allowances exceed those laid down in scale under heading A.
- 23. If moved direct from one work to another, while still continuously in the service of the Government, Supervisors and Inspectors will be paid actual reasonable expenses out of pocket incurred in travelling to the new work, on production of receipts of the payees.
- 24. The head-quarters of Supervisors and Inspectors shall be considered to be the work or works on which they are engaged, and while at such head-quarters they shall not ordinarily be entitled to any subsistence allowance.
- 25. When necessarily obliged to come to Head Office, however, or when called upon to move about a great deal between places at considerable distances from each other, and only stationed for a few days at one place, Supervisors and Inspectors shall receive actual reasonable out-of-pocket expenses for food and lodging, on production of receipts of payees, not exceeding 7s. 6d. per day.
- 26. Wages-men 4s. per night up to seven days; after that nil. If travelling by ship no allowance will be made.
- 27. Any officer using his own instruments in the course of his official duty will be granted the following allowance:—

For a theodolite, with chains and ranging rods, 10s. per month.

For a level, chain, and one or more levelling staves, 10s. per month.

28. Any officer residing permanently on a goldfield or other district where fresh water cannot be obtained free of charge shall be allowed a quantity not exceeding 200 gallons per month, the cost of which will be defrayed by the Department; provided a receipt for payment for the water is attached in the usual way to the voucher. Where, however, there is a Government well or condenser within easy access, the water shall be obtained there.

The foregoing Regulations are to take effect from the 1st December, 1898.
