(53 Vict., No. 4.)

WHEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

- (1.) To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- (2.) To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds, and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations.

His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or remove, in any manner whatever, any crayfish within the following area, from the date of publication hereof:—

Bounded on the *Northward* by a Westerly line from Rous Head to the Northern end of the five-fathom bank; on the *Eastward* by the sea coast; on the *South* by a West line therefrom to the South end of Coventry Reef; and on the *Westward* by the Western side of the five-fathom bank aforesaid.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all crayfish which shall have been taken.

5. The buyer, on receiving delivery of any fertiliser or feeding stuff, and before otherwise breaking the bulk thereof, shall, in the presence of the analyst, a Justice of the Peace, or a police constable, take three samples of the article and cause them to be marked with the date and place of sampling, the names of the persons present, the figures or trade mark on each package, sealed, and fastened up, and shall deliver or send by post (prepaid) one sample with the invoice or a copy thereof to the analyst, and shall deliver or send by post, as aforesaid, another sample to the seller, and retain the third sample for future comparison.

6. On the request of the buyer or seller of any fertiliser or feeding stuff, and on payment of the fee prescribed by Regulations Nos. one and two, the analyst, or some person appointed by him in that behalf, before or at the delivery of the article, shall take the samples on behalf of the buyer.

# "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

## Regulations.

*Department of Lands and Surveys,  
Perth, 16th November, 1898.*

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

GEO. THROSSELL,  
Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. All stock imported into Western Australia from the Australian Colonies and New Zealand shall be exempt from Section 13 of "The Stock Diseases Act of 1895," and shall be admitted to the Colony on the certificate of a Government Inspector, in addition to a declaration by the owner or breeder of the stock, or manager of the farm or station from which they come, to the effect that such stock were, at the time of departure from their farm or station, and had been for three months immediately preceding, to the best of his belief, free from disease, and had not, for such period, been in contact with diseased animals.

If coming from beyond the limits of the Australian Colonies and New Zealand, stock shall perform the following periods of quarantine:—

Sheep	...	...	14 days
Horses	...	...	14 "
Cattle	...	...	30 "
Camels	...	...	40 "
Pigs	...	...	30 "
Dogs	...	...	6 months
Goats, Deer, Llama, and Antelopes	...	...	30 days

And if, during the period of quarantine, any signs of disease be exhibited, then, if not ordered to be destroyed, such stock shall be kept in quarantine for such period as the inspector shall direct, and treated as he shall deem necessary.

2. All sheep and cattle intended for immediate slaughter may be landed on the permit of an inspector, and removed to such place as he may direct, and shall not be again removed alive without his written permission.

3. No stock which may lawfully be imported shall be landed at any port other than Fremantle, Albany, Champion Bay, Cossack, Eucla, and Esperance, unless they shall have been first inspected and passed by an inspector of stock at any one of the aforesaid ports.

4. All stock found on arrival by an inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall be forthwith destroyed or kept and treated in quarantine, as such inspector shall direct.

5. No person shall enter or leave a quarantine ground without the permission of an inspector *in writing*, and every person who shall enter shall, if the inspector so directs, disinfect himself and his clothes in such a manner as the inspector shall order.

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to the quarantine ground, including the Perth Zoological Gardens.

6. All expenses of landing, removing to, maintaining, and keeping in quarantine, and of disinfecting or otherwise treating any stock, and all expenses in connection therewith, shall be paid by the owner or consignee of such stock to the inspector upon demand, and before such stock shall be removed from quarantine.

7. All expenses of destroying any stock, or of disinfecting or destroying any fodder or fittings, shall be paid by the owner or consignee thereof to an inspector upon demand.

8. The owner or consignee of any stock, fodder, or fittings shall deposit with the inspector, upon demand, such sum of money as shall be deemed by such inspector sufficient to defray all the expenses of inspection, maintenance, disinfection, medicine, attendance, transshipment, or conveyance to or from the quarantine ground of such stock, fodder, or fittings respectively; of disinfecting the vessel or conveyance in which such stock, fodder, or fittings shall have been conveyed to the Colony, or to or from a quarantine ground; veterinary surgeon's fees for inspection, and all costs, charges, and expenses of every description in connection with or attendant upon the introduction of any stock, fodder, or fittings. If such sums be not forthwith paid on demand as aforesaid, such stock, fodder, or fittings may be sold by an inspector for the purpose of defraying such expenses, fees, costs, and charges.

9. Any stock found at any time to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or suspected by the inspector to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, or affected with tick, or lice, or any parasite, may be seized by an inspector and placed in quarantine, and there treated as the inspector may direct, at the owner's expense, until clean; or if the disease should be of such a nature that, in the opinion of the inspector, such stock should be destroyed, the inspector shall report the case to the Minister, who may order the destruction of such stock at the owner's expense.

10. An inspector on finding stock infected with disease may, as he shall think fit, declare such portions of the land on which such stock may be found at the time of the discovery of the disease a quarantine area, within the boundaries of which such stock shall be kept in quarantine, or, at the discretion of the inspector, be transferred to some proclaimed quarantine area until declared clean by an inspector.

Provided that the whole amount of fees for inspection of any one shipment by the same owner shall not exceed £5.

12. The Chief Inspector of Stock may give permission in writing to any occupier of land in Western Australia, who is also the occupier of land in South Australia adjoining such first mentioned land, for stock to be brought from such land to adjoining land within the Colony for the purpose of depasturing or being kept on such land for any period therein mentioned, not exceeding six calendar months at any one time; provided that such stock shall not, by reason of such permission, become "introduced" stock, nor allowed to be on any land in Western Australia, except on land mentioned in such permission.

13. Any owner intending to introduce any cattle by land into Western Australia shall give notice thereof in writing to the Inspector of Stock in the district into which they are to be introduced, in the form of Schedule A hereto, such notice to be delivered not less than seven days before the introduction of such cattle, and shall produce a certificate of a duly qualified Government inspector that such cattle have been successfully inoculated against pleuropneumonia immediately prior to their departure for Western Australia.

14. The crossing place for stock in the Kimberley District, *viâ* South Australia, shall be at the Ord Station; and the crossing place for stock in the Eucla District, *viâ* South Australia, shall be where the present road from South Australia crosses, about eight miles North-East from Eucla.

15. No stock adjudged by an inspector to be diseased shall cross the border into Western Australia, and any person so introducing such diseased stock shall be subject to a penalty of Five pounds per head.

16. Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Two hundred pounds, or imprisonment not exceeding six months where not otherwise provided.

17. Whenever any expenses, fees, costs, or charges have been incurred by an inspector under these Regulations, he may sell the stock, fodder, or fittings in respect of which the same were incurred, for the purpose of defraying all or any such expenses, fees, and charges.

18. An inspector, on suspecting any animal to be affected with tuberculosis, may subject such animal to the tuberculin test, and the owner, if required by the inspector, shall render all necessary assistance to facilitate the operation.

19. The Regulations dated the 12th day of August, 1896, are hereby cancelled.

Regulations under “The Fishery Act, 1889.”

966+  
97

Department of Lands and Surveys,  
Perth, 13th October, 1898.

WHEREAS by Section six of “The Fishery Act, 1889,” it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

1.

To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine;
2.

To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease;

and to impose such reasonable penalties not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures as the Governor in Council may think fit for any breach of such Regulations.

His Excellency the Governor in Council does by these Regulations declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine within in any part of Warnbro’ Sound (otherwise known as Safety Bay) during the season commencing on the first day of October and ceasing on the thirty-first day of December in each and every year till further notice.

And also, that it shall be unlawful for any person to fish with a line within the said Sound or Bay except between the times of five o’clock a.m. and eight o’clock a.m. during each day of the aforementioned season.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty (£20) pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

Clause 80a.—That a prospecting area for diamonds or other precious stones in districts North of the Tropic of Capricorn shall be of an area as follows:—

(a.) If outside the limits of a Mining District, 320 acres.

(b.) If inside the limits of a Mining District, 160 acres.

Such prospecting area to be held if payable diamonds or other precious stones be not found in the interim for a period of 12 months with the right of renewal, at the discretion of the Minister after report by the Warden, of the whole or any part thereof.

Clause 84a.—The area of a Reward Claim for the finding of payable diamonds or other precious stones within such prospecting area North of the Tropic of Capricorn shall be 20 acres.

### POLICE DISTRICTS.

#### PLANTAGENET.

Bounded on the *South* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the *East* by the East boundary of the Colony; on the *West* and *North* by the Frankland River upwards from its North to its junction with the Gordon River; thence North-North-Westerly to the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarrup Rivers, and onward to the junction of the Murray and Hotham Rivers; thence Westerly along the Murray River to a point situate South from the South-East corner of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Timber Company's Concession; thence North to a point situate West from the South-West corner of Avon Location 1730; thence East, partly along that location's South boundary; thence Northerly along the Great Southern Railway; thence East along part of the South boundary of Location 1729; thence South-Easterly along a public road from Moorumbine, via Yettelin, through the Wickiepin Agricultural Area; thence East, partly along the South boundary of C.P. 385, to the Wallelemining Brook; thence North-Easterly along said brook to a point situate West from the North-West corner of Williams Location 97; thence East to a point situate 10 miles West from the meridian of the cairn on Yorkrakine Granite Rock; thence North to a point situate West from a point 90 miles South from survey mark H 26 on Koorarawalyee Granite Rock; thence East to a point situate 52 miles East from the meridian of Mount Ridley; thence North to a point situate East of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; thence East to the 125th meridian East longitude; thence North to the 30th parallel of South latitude; and thence East to the East boundary of the Colony.

#### SOUTH-WESTERN.

Bounded on the *West* and *South* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the *North* and *East* by lines starting from the sea coast, and extending Easterly through the summit of Mount William, along Logue's Brook and the Murray River to the latter's junction with the Hotham; thence South-South-Easterly to the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarrup Rivers, and onwards to the junction of the Gordon and Frankland Rivers; thence Southerly along the Frankland River to sea coast.

## MURCHISON.

Bounded on the *North* by the Tropic of Capricorn; on the *East* by the East boundary of the Colony; on the *West* by lines starting from a point in the Tropic of Capricorn in line between Trigonometrical Station  $\bigwedge_{10}$  and Mount Bresnahan, and extending South-Easterly to Mount Bresnahan, thence South-Westerly, 37 miles, towards Trigonometrical Station K 20, thence South-South-Easterly to Mount Fraser, thence South-South-Westerly to Mount Lulworth, thence South-Westerly through Warra Warra Hill towards Mugga Mugga Hill; and on the *South* by an East line through a point about 4 miles South from Wyemando Hill to a point situate 15 miles East from the meridian of Mount Ida; thence North about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles, thence East about  $74\frac{1}{2}$  miles through survey mark AN (conjoined) 33 at Doyle's Well to a point situate 2 miles 10 chains West from the meridian of survey mark B 82 at Brickey's Soak, thence North to the 26th parallel of South latitude, and thence East to the East boundary of the Colony.

## WEST KIMBERLEY.

Bounded on the *South* by the parallel of latitude of  $19^{\circ} 30'$  South; on the *West*, *North*, and *East* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent, extending Northerly to Collier Bay; thence by lines extending South-Easterly generally along the summit of the King Leopold Ranges to the Margaret River Gorge; along said river upwards to its junction with the Mary River; and thence South to the South boundary before described.

## WESTERN.

Lulworth; thence South-Westerly, through Warra Warra Hill, towards Mugga Mugga Hill; thence East to the Southernmost corner of the Murchison Goldfield, being a point situate about  $4\frac{1}{2}$  miles East and 4 miles South from Wyemando Hill; thence South to a point situate East from the North-East corner of Melbourne Location 927; and thence West to said corner, and along that location's North and West boundaries, the North boundary of Location 926, and a West and South line to the North-East corner of Location 938, a West line to the Hill River and said river downwards to its mouth; on the *West* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent.

## ROEBOURNE.

Bounded on the *South* by the Tropic of Capricorn; on the *East* by the East boundary of the Colony and on the *North* and *West* by the parallel of  $19^{\circ} 30'$  South latitude, the sea-coast Westwards to the mouth of the Robe River, and including the islands adjacent, said river upwards to Yerra Bluff, and by lines extending South-Easterly through the summit of Mt. Dempster to Mt. Rica; thence to Mt. Wall; thence to Trig. Station  $\bigwedge_{10}$  and onwards towards Mt. Bresnahan to the Tropic of Capricorn.

## ASHBURTON.

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending East along the Tropic of Capricorn from the sea coast to a point in line between Mounts Palgrave and Agamemnon; thence Northward to Mount Palgrave; thence South-Easterly to a point situate 37 miles from Mount Bresnahan in direction of Trig. Station K 20; thence North-Easterly to Mount Bresnahan; thence North-Westerly to Trig. Station K 10 onwards to Mount Wall; thence to Mount Rica; thence through Mount Dempster to Yerra Bluff on the Robe River, and by said river downwards; on the *North* and *West* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent.

## EAST KIMBERLEY.

Bounded on the *East* by the Eastern boundary of the Colony; on the *North*, *West*, and *South* by the sea coast, extending Westwards to Collier Bay, and including the islands adjacent; thence by lines extending South-Easterly generally along the summit of the King Leopold Ranges to the Margaret River Gorge, along said river upwards to its junction with the Mary River; thence South to latitude  $19^{\circ} 30'$  South, and thence East to the Eastern boundary of the Colony aforesaid.

## METROPOLITAN.

Bounded on the *West* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the *North*, *East*, and *South* by lines starting from the sea coast at a point situate West from the South-West corner of Swan Location 1351, and extending East towards said corner to a point situate North from the West corner of Swan Location 28; thence South to said corner; thence South-Easterly, partly along the South-West boundary of said Location 28, to a point situate West from the North-West corner of the Canning Jarrah Timber Company's Concession; thence East, partly along said boundary to its East end; thence South along the East boundary of said concession; thence West, partly along the South boundary of said concessions to the East boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 16; thence North along this boundary to that location's North-West corner; thence North-North-Westerly to the South-East corner of Canning Location 25; thence North along that location's East boundary; thence Westerly along the left bank of the Canning River, the Southern shores of Melville Water, and the left bank of the Swan River to a point situate South from Minnim Cove; and finally North and West, crossing the Swan River, and along the East and North boundaries of North Fremantle Townsite, to the sea coast.

## FREMANTLE.

Bounded on the *West* by the sea coast, including Rottnest and the other islands adjacent; on the *North*, *East*, and *South* by lines starting from the North-West corner of North Fremantle Townsite, and extending East and South along that townsite's North and East boundaries, and across the Swan River; thence Easterly along the left bank of the Swan River, the Southern shores of Melville Water, and the left bank of the Canning River, to the East boundary of Canning Location 25; thence South along said boundary,
