2. The purchases will be made in Calcutta, Madras, and Bombay by Remount Agents under the orders of the Director, Army Remount Department.

The Remount Depôts will be open for the reception of horses from the 1st of November, 1899, to the end of the purchasing season.
 Horses and mares of all breeds will be received; but they must be within the prescribed age, 4 to 6 years, and in the case of Australian horses, 15 hands 1 inch to 16 hands high.

5. Greys will not be purchased for Horse and Field Artillery.

6. The average price for an Australian or Cape remount has been fixed at £45 sterling, which will be paid in rupees at the Indian port of purchase at the exchange rate for demand bills on London declared to be the opening rate for the day on which payment is made in the ordinary course of business by the Bank of Bengal, Madras and Bonhay, according to the place of purchase. The average price for Arabs and Persians is Rs. 700, and horses of this class should not be less than 14 hands 2 inches in height. Every horse presented or purchased will be valued separately, and higher or lower prices may be given under such rules as may be made by the Director, Army Remount Department, but the averages fixed above are not to be exceeded on the whole number purchased in any class.

THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA ACT, 1885.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict., Ch. 60, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Sessions of the Federal Council subsequent to the First Session thereof shall be held in such Colony as the Council shall from time to time determine, and, further, that the Council shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation, and shall meet at such time and such place as shall be named in the Proclamation : And whereas in the Seventh Session of the Proclamation: And whereas in the Seventh Session of the Federal Council held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, during the month of January, in the sixtieth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, it was, on the twenty-eighth day of the said month of January, determined by the said Council that the next Session thereof should be held at Melbourne, in the Colony of Victoria: Now therefore. I the Right Honourable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and commander-in-Cinet in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred on me, do, by this my Proclamation, summon the Federal Council of Australasia, as constituted by the said Act, to meet at the Parliament Buildings in Melbourne, in Victoria aforesaid, on Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, at the hour of Eleven in the forenoon, for the despatch of business.

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

Regulations.

III S Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under The Stock Diseases Act, 1895 :---

GEO. THROSSELL, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, except at the Port of Wyndham.

2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberly Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where on landing they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.

4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparantly clean; and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.

5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas, and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected as follows:—

- 1. The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost, on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
- (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
- (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
- (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the saltingfloor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been comdlied with.

7. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade, shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock" Diseases Act, 1895."

8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £500.

Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act, or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.
- "Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats.

"Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any

portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

- (1.) To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- (2.) To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds, and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations.

His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or remove, in any manner whatever, any crayfish within the following area, from the date of publication hereof:—

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

Every manager of a battery or other machinery erected for extracting gold from any ore or auriferous earth shall, where practicable, within seven days after the expiration of each month, furnish the Warden, through the Mining Registrar of the district, with a statement, in the form of Schedule 11, hereto annexed, of the quantity of ore or during each month, and the proceeds thereof in gold. Provided always that where such ore or auriferous earth shall have been received from a locality outside the district

in which the battery or machinery is situate, such state-ment shall be furnished to the Mining Registrar of the district from which the ore or auriferous earth shall have been received.

Any battery or machinery owner neglecting or refusing to furnish this return will be liable to a penalty, on con-viction before the Warden, of a fine not exceeding £50. (*Vide* Section 20 of "The Goldfields Act, 1895, Amendment Act, 1898.")



REGULATION NO. 98 (AS REVISED.)

Monthly Returns to be furnished.

The holder of a lease, claim, or any ground taken up for gold mining purposes, shall, where practicable, within seven days after the expiration of each month, furnish the Warden, through the Mining Registrar of his district, with a state-ment in the form of Schedule No. 22, hereto annexed, of the quantity of ore or auriferous earth treated on such lease, claim, or gold mining area during the month, and its proceeds thereof in gold.

Provided always that where such ore or auriferous earth is treated at any works outside the mining district in which the ore or auriferous earth is obtained, such statement shall be furnished within a reasonable time after the holder shall be apprised of the result of such treatment, to the Warden, through the Mining Registrar of the district in which the mine is situate.

Any holder of ground taken up for gold mining purposes neglecting or refusing to furnish such statement shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50. (*Vide* Section 20 of "The Goldfields Act, 1895, Amendment Act, 1898.")
