SIR,—I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of an Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, dated the 20th of October, 1898, for giving effect to the Treaty between Her Majesty and the President of the Republic of Bolivia, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, signed at Lima on the 22nd of February, 1892, the ratifications of which were exchanged at Lima on the 7th of March, 1898.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

EXTRADITION TREATY.-REPUBLIC OF BOLIVIA.

Balmoral, 20th October, 1898.

AT THE COURT AT BALMORAL the 20th day of October, 1898.

Present:

THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY, Duke of Fife, Earl of Kintore, Lord George Hamilton.

Whereas by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1895, it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, Her Majesty may, by Order-in-Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that Her Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of Her Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions, and qualifications as may be deemed expedient.

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the Twenty-second day of

And whereas a Treaty was concluded on the Twenty-second day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, between Her Majesty and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Bolivia, for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Excellency the President of the Republic of Bolivia, having judged it expedient, with a view to the better administration of justice and to the prevention of crime within the two countries and their jurisdictions, that persons charged with or convicted of the crimes or offences hereinafter enumerated, and being fugitives from justice, should, under certain circumstances, he reciprocally delivered up, have named as their Plenipotentiaries to conclude a Treaty (that is to say):

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Her Chargé d'Affaires ad interim Mr. George Jenner;

And His Excellency the President of the Republic of Bolivia, Señor Don José Manuel Braun, Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary in Peru;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective Full Powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon and concluded the following Articles:—

ARTICLE I.

The High Contracting Parties engage to deliver up to each other, under certain circumstances and conditions stated in the present Treaty, those persons who, being accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences enumerated in Article II, committed in the territory of the one Party, shall be found within the territory of the other Party.

ARTICLE II.

Extradition shall be reciprocally granted for the following crimes or

- 1. Murder (including assassination, parricide, infanticide, poisoning), or attempt or conspiracy to murder.
 - 2. Manslaughter.
- $3.\,$ Administering drugs or using instruments with intent to procure the miscarriage of women.
- 5. Carnal knowledge or any attempt to have carnal knowledge of a girl under 16 years of age, if the evidence produced justifies committal for those crimes according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties.
 - 6. Indecent assault.

- 7. Kidnapping and false imprisonment, childstealing.
- 9. Bigamy.
- 10. Maliciously wounding or inflicting grevious bodily harm.
- 11. Assault occasioning actual bodily harm.
- 12. Threats, by letter or otherwise, with intent to extort money or other things of value.
- 13. Perjury, or subornation of perjury.
- Burglary or housebreaking, robbery with violence, larceny, or embezzlement.
- 16. Fraud by a bailee, banker, agent, factor, trustee, director, member, or public officer of any company, punishable with imprisonment for not less than one year by any law for the time being in force.
- 17. Obtaining money, valuable security, or goods by false pretences; receiving any money, valuable security, or other property knowing the same to have been stolen or unlawfully obtained.
- 18. (a.) Counterfeiting or altering money, or bringing into circulation counterfeited or altered money.
 - (b.) Knowingly making, without lawful authority, any instrument, tool, or engine adapted and intended for the counterfeiting of the coin of the realm.
 - (c.) Forgery, or uttering what is forged.
- 19. Crimes against Bankruptcy Law.
- 20. Any malicious act done with intent to endanger the safety of any person travelling or being upon a railway.
 - 21. Malicious injury to property, if such offence be indictable.
- 22. Piracy and other crimes or offences committed at sea against persons or things which, according to the laws of the High Contracting Parties, are extradition offences, and are punishable by more than One year's imprisonment.
- 23. Dealing in slaves in such manner as to constitute a criminal offence against the laws of both States.

The extradition is also to be granted for participation in any of the aforesaid crimes, provided such participation be punishable by the laws of both Contracting Parties.

Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the State applied to in respect of any other crime for which, according to the laws of both the Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant can be used.

ARTICLE III.

Either Government reserves the right to refuse or grant the surrender of its own subjects or citizens to the other Government.

ARTICLE IV.

The extradition shall not take place if the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or the person claimed on the part of the Government of Bolivia, has already been tried and discharged or punished, or is still under trial in the territory of the Republic of Bolivia or in the United Kingdom respectively for the crime for which his extradition is demanded.

If the person claimed on the part of Her Majesty's Government, or on the part of the Government of Bolivia, should be under examination for any other crime in the territory of the Republic of Bolivia or in the United Kingdom respectively, his extradition shall be deferred until the conclusion of the trial, and the full execution of any punishment

ARTICLE V.

The extradition shall not take place if, subsequently to the commission of the crime, or the institution of the penal prosecution or the conviction thereon, exemption from prosecution or punishment has been acquired by lapse of time, according to the laws of the State applying or applied to.

It shall likewise not take place when, according to the laws of either country, the maximum punishment for the offence is imprisonment for less than one year.

ARTICLE VI.

A fugitive criminal shall not be surrendered if the offence in respect of which his surrender is demanded is one of a political chararacter, or if he prove that the requisition for his surrender has, in fact, been made with a view to try or punish him for an offence of a political character.

ARTICLE VII.

ARTICLE VII.

A person surrendered can in no case be kept in prison or be brought to trial in the State to which the surrender has been made, for any other crime, or on account of any other matters, than those for which the extradition shall have taken place, until he has been restored, or has had an opportunity of returning, to the State by which he has been surrendered.

This stipulation does not apply to crimes committed after the ex tradition.

ARTICLE VIII.

The requisition for extradition shall be made through the Diplomatic Agents of the High Contracting Parties respectively.

The requisition for the extradition of an accused person must be accompanied by a warrant of arrest issued by the competent authority of the State requiring the extradition, and by such evidence as, according to the laws of the place where the accused is found, would justify his arrest if the crime had been committed there.

If the requisition relates to a person already convicted, it must be accompanied by the sentence of condemnation passed against the convicted person by the competent Cuort of the State that makes the requisition for extradition.

A sentence passed in contumaciam is not to be deemed a conviction, but a person so sentenced may be dealt with as an accused person.

ARTICLE IX.

If the requisition for extradition be in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the competent authorities of the State applied to shall proceed to the arrest of the fugitive.

ARTICLE X.

A fugitive criminal may be apprehended under a warrant issued by any Police Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority in either country, on such information or complaint, and such evidence, or after such proceedings, as would, in the opinion of the authority issuing the warrant, justify the issue of a warrant if the crime had been committed or the person convicted in that part of the dominions of the two Contracting Parties in which the Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, or other competent authority exercises jurisdiction; provided, however, that in the United Kingdom the accused shall, in such case, be sent as speedily as possible before a Police Magistrate in London. He shall, in accordance with this Article, be discharged, as well in the Republic of Bolivia as in the United Kingdom, if within the term of sixty days a requisition for extradition shall not have been made by the Diplomatic Agent of his country in accordance with the stipulations of this Treaty. The same rule shall apply to the cases of persons accused or convicted of any of the crimes or offences specified in this Treaty, and committed on the high seas on board any vessel of either country which may come into a port of the other.

ARTICLE XI.

The extradition shall take place only if the evidence be found sufficient, according to the laws of the State applied to, either to justify the committal of the prisoner for trial, in case the crime had been committed in the territory of the same State, or to prove that the prisoner is the identical person convicted by the Courts of the State which makes the requisition, and that the crime of which he has been convicted is one in respect of which extradition could, at the time of such conviction, have been granted by the State applied to; and no criminal shall be surrendered until after the expiration of fifteen days from the date of his committal to prison to await the warrant for his surrender.

ARTICLE XII.

In the examinations which they have to make in accordance with the foregoing stipulations, the authorities of the State applied to shall admit as valid evidence the sworn depositions or statements of witnesses taken in the other State, or copies thereof and likewise the warrants and sentences issued therein, and certificates of, or judicial documents stating, the fact of a conviction, provided the same are anthenticated as follows:—

- $1. \ \ A$ warrant must purport to be signed by a Judge, Magistrate or officer of the other State.
- 2. Depositions, or affirmations, or the copies thereof, must purport to be certified, under the hand of a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State, to be the original depositions or affirmations, or to be true copies thereof, as the case may require.
- 3. A certificate of, or judicial document stating, the fact of a conviction must purport to be certified by a Judge, Magistrate, or officer of the other State.
- 4. In every case such warrant, deposition, affirmation, copy, certificate, or judicial document must be authenticated either by the oath of some witness, or by being sealed with the official seal of the Minister of Justice, or some other Minister of the other State: but any other mode of authentication for the time being permitted by the law of the country where the examination is taken may be substituted for the foregoing.

ARTICLE XIII.

If the individual claimed by one of the High Contracting Parties in pursuance of the present Treaty should be also claimed by one or several other Powers on account of other crimes or offences committed upon their respective territories, his extradition shall be granted to that State whose demand is earliest in date.

ARTICLE XIV.

If sufficient evidence for the extradition be not produced within two months from the date of the apprehension of the fugitive, or within such further time as the State applied to, or the proper Tribunal thereof, shall direct, the fugitive shall be set at liberty.

ARTICLE XV.

All articles seized which were in the possession of the person to be surrendered at the time of his apprehension shall, if the competent authority of the State applied to for the extradition has ordered the delivery of such articles, be given up when the extradition takes place; and the said delivery shall extend not merely to the stolen articles, but to everything that may serve as a proof of the crime.

ARTICLE XVI.

 $\,$ All expenses connected with extradition shall be borne by the demanding State.

ARTICLE XVII.

The stipulations of the present Treaty shall be applicable to the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, so far as the laws for the time being in force in such Colonies and foreign possessions respectively will allow.

The requisition for the surrender of a fugitive criminal, who has taken refuge in any of such Colonies or foreign possessions, shall be made to the Governor or chief authority of such Colony or possession by the chief Consular officer of the Republic of Bolivia in such Colony or possession.

Such requisition may be disposed of, subject always, as nearly as may be, and so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, to the provisions of this Treaty, by the said Governor or chief authority, who, however, shall be at liberty either to grant the surrender or to refer the matter to his Government.

Her Britannic Majesty shall, however, be at liberty to make special arrangements in the British Colonies and foreign possessions for the surrender of Bolivian criminals who may take refuge within such Colonies and foreign possessions, on the basis, so far as the law of such Colony or foreign possession will allow, of the provisions of the present Treaty.

Requisitions for the surrender of a fugitive criminal emanating from any Colony or foreign possession of Her Britannic Majesty shall be governed by rules laid down in the preceding Articles of the present Treaty.

ARTICLE XVIII.

The present Treaty shall come into force ten days after its publication, in conformity with the forms prescribed by the laws of the High Contracting Parties. It may be terminated by either of the High Contracting Parties by a notice not exceeding one year, and not less than six months.

The Treaty, after receiving the approval of the Congress of the Republic of Bolivia, shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Lima as soon as possible.

In witness whereof the respective Plenipotentiaries have signed the same, and have affixed thereto the seal of their arms.

Done at Lima, on the twenty-second day of February, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two.

And whereas the ratifications of the said Treaty were exchanged at Lima on the seventh day of March, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Her by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the fourth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, the said Acts shall apply in the case of Bolivia, and of the said Treaty with the President of the Republic of Bolivia.

Provided always, that the operation of the said Acts shall be and remain suspended within the Dominion of Canada so long as an Act of the Parliament of Canada passed in One thousand eight hundred and eighty-six, and entitled "An Act respecting the extradition of Fugitive Criminals," shall continue in force there, and no longer.

Regulation under the Land Act, 1898.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 29th December, 1898.

IIIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Part IV. of "The Land Act, 1898":—

REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF TOWN AND SUBURBAN LANDS.

1. Town and Suburban lands shall be sold subject to the conditions of sale set forth in the Schedule, and the purchase money shall be payable in the instalments therein stated.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Conditions of sale of Crown Lands advertised to be sold by auction at on the day of $189 \quad .$

- 1. The land offered for sale is particularised in the notice headed "Land Sales," published in the Government Gazette of the day of 189, and in the Schedule hereto, and will be sold subject to the terms and conditions of "The Land Act, 1898," and the Regulations thereunder.
- 2. The lots will be offered separately, and in the order in which they appear in the said notice.
- 3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise the lot in dispute shall be put up again and resold.
- 4. Each lot shall be offered at the upset price, and, if no advance be made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser at that price; but if any advance be made, the highest bidder shall be the purchaser as aforesaid. Biddings shall advance at the rate of not less than 10 per cent. on the upset price. Should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded in due course.
- 5. The purchaser shall, immediately after the sale, pay to the Minister for Lands or his agent a deposit in cash at the rate of 10 per cent. upon the total amount of the purchase money, unless he has already paid a sufficient deposit on application, and any such deposit shall be considered as payment of the purchase money so far as the same will extend.
- 6. The balance of purchase money, in the case of Town Lots, shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or his agent, by two equal instalments at the end of three and six calendar months from the day of sale, and in the case of Suburban Lots within twelve months from the day of sale, by four equal quarterly instalments, on the first days of January, April, July, and October, the first instalment being payable on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown grant and registration in both cases being payable with the last instalment of purchase money.
- 7. In any case where the value of improvements on a lot is added to the upset price, as prescribed by Section 29 of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," and the lot is knocked down to any other than the owner of such improvements, the value of the same shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or his agent immediately after the sale.
- 8. Each Suburban Lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries, within two years from the date of sale, with a substantial fence, not being a brush fence, proved to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands to be sufficient to resist the trespass of great and small stock, including sheep but not including pigs or goats; and in default thereof the land shall be forfeited, together with all purchase money and fees which may have been paid: Provided that the Minister for Lands may, if he think fit, dispense with the division fences between two or more adjoining lots purchased by one person, or may, if he thinks fit, accept other substantial improvements in lieu of fencing.
- 9. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if, in the case of Suburban Lots, the required fencing is not completed within two years from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money and fees that may have been paid.

- 10. Immediately after the sale the purchaser shall declare to whom or in whose name he requires the Crown Grant to issue; the name of the grantee or grantees shall be inserted in the form of application to purchase, and no alteration therein shall be made without the sanction of the Minister for Lands.

Regulations.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under The Stock Diseases Act, 1895:—

GEO. THROSSELL,

Commissioner of Crown Lands.

- 1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, except at the Port of Wyndham.
- 2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberly Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where on landing they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.
- 3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.
- 4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparantly clean; and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.
- 5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas, and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.
- 6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected as follows:—
 - 1. The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost, on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
 - (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
 - (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
 - (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the saltingfloor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been comdlied with.

- All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade, shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."
- 8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £500.

Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act, or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.
- "Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats.
- "Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

IS Excellency the Deputy Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve that the additions to Regulations 80 and 84 of "The Mineral Lands Act, 1892," passed in Executive Council on the 7th September, 1898, and published in the Government Gazette of 9th September, 1898, be rescinded, and that in lieu thereof the following Clauses be substituted.

Clause 80a.—That a prospecting area for diamonds or other precious stones in districts North of the Tropic of Capricorn shall be of an area as follows:—

- (a.) If outside the limits of a Mining District, 320 acres.
- (b.) If inside the limits of a Mining District, 160 acres.

Such prospecting area to be held if payable diamonds or other precious stones be not found in the interim for a period of 12 months with the right of renewal, at the discretion of the Minister after report by the Warden, of the whole or any part thereof.

REMARKS.

he month has been on the whole seasonable. In Perth both day and night temperatures were slightly in excess of the averages for previous years, but the weather a mostly bright and pleasantly warm. The effect of the sea breezes is very marked. Thus the mean maximum day temperature is 75.2° at Rothness, 77.8° at atle, 81.1° at the Observatory, 83.9° at the Botanical Gardens, 89.0° at York, and 92.5° at Southern Cross. The region of cooleat nights is as usual a little inland he neighbourhood of Katanning, where the mean minimum was 52.9°. The South coast upheld its reputation for a delightful summer climate. The mean in day temperature was only 72.9° at Cape Leeuwin, 72.8° at Albany, and 63.1° at Breaksea Island. Only once did the thermoneter just reach 90° at Cape Leeuwin perature being very high throughout. At Peak Hill, Cossack, and Onslow the mean maximum day temperature was over 100°°, and the highest readings 109.0°, and 115.0° respectively. This region did not even have the benefit of cool nights, for the mean minimum was 74.0° at Peak Hill, 74.7° at Cossack, and 77.4° at Onslow, ty as high as the hottest day experienced at Breaksea. A severe storm of the 'willy-willy' type visited the North-West country during the latter part of the month, at indications appeared on the 24th, but the worst of the storm was experienced during the 27th, 28th, and 29th, and during those three days Derby registered over. "willy-willy" was reported generally throughout the Colony.
