Mestern Australia, to wit.

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c.,

GERARD SMITH.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act; And whereas it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a Quarantine Station at Owen's Anchorage, near Fremantle: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Quarantine Station near Fremantle, for the purposes of the said Act, all that piece or parcel of land situate at Owen's Anchorage, near Fremantle:—

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 1 chain 4 links South, and 22 chains 93 links West from the North-West corner of Cockburn Sound Location 83, and extending 165° 40′ 4 chains 50 links, 181° 3′ 3 chains 76_{10}° links, 164° 11′ 4 chains 99_{10}° links, 175° 29′ 20 chains 74 links to the sea coast, 339° 36′ 7 chains 51 links, 341° 52′ 14 chains, 340° 36′ 7 chains 65_{10}° links, 338° 52′ 4 chains 53_{10}° links,

and 75° 40′ 7 chains $34\frac{5}{10}$ links to the starting point.

HEREAS by the 17th Section of "The Health Act, 1898," the area of any district defined for the purposes of a Local Board appointed by Order in Council may, from time to time, be extended or contracted by the Governor by Order in Council: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby contract the area at present under the control of the Local Board of Health at Coolgardie to a distance of half-a-mile from the boundaries of the Townsite of Coolgardie, instead of three miles, as set forth in the Order of Council dated the 22nd day of January, 1896, and published in the Government Gazette of the 24th January, 1896.

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, the 18th day of January, 1899.

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to make, vary, alter, or revoke such regulations as may be deemed expedient for the purposes therein stated: And whereas certain regulations were made on the 16th of November, 1898, and duly published in the Government Gazette: AND WHEREAS by one of such regulations, numbered 12, it is provided that the Chief Inspector of Stock may give permission, in writing, to any occupier of land in Western Australia, who is also the occupier of land in South Australia adjoining such first-mentioned land, for Stock to be brought from such land to adjoining land within the Colony, for the purpose of depasturing, or being kept on such land for any period therein mentioned, not exceeding six calendar months at any one time; provided that such Stock shall not, by reason of such permission, become "introduced" Stock, nor allowed to be on any land in Western Australia, except on land mentioned in such permission: Now, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby revoke the said regulation, and all permits which may have been given pursuant thereto.

Regulations for the Management of the "Mount Eliza Depôt" and the "Female Home," Perth.

- 1. The Inspector of Charitable Institutions will have the general control and supervision of the "Mount Eliza Depôt" and the "Female Home," Perth, both being Poor Houses within the meaning of the Act, 46 Vict., No. 8, under instructions from the Honourable the Colonial Secretary.
- 2. The Master of the Depôt and the Matron of the Home will, under the general authority of the Inspector of Charitable Institutions, carry out such instructions as they may receive from him, and will be held responsible for the Rules and Regulations being strictly adhered to in every respect.

GENERAL RULES FOR INMATES.

- 3. All persons received into either of the Institutions may be searched on admission, and also on their return at any time when out on leave.
- 4. They will be required, on admission, to thoroughly wash and cleanse themselves, and will be supplied with suitable clothing.
- 5. Inmates are not allowed, unless under special circumstances, to leave food, clothing, or articles of any description in the wards.
- 6. The hours for rising, for meals, for labour, and for retiring to rest are as follows:—

Rising 6.30 a.m. (summer months).
Rising 7 a.m. (winter months).

Breakfast ... 7:30 a.m.

Employment 9 a.m. till 11:45 a.m.

Dinner ... 12 noon

Employment 1 p.m. till 4.45 p.m.

Tea ... 5 30 p.m.

Retiring to rest 8 p.m.

7. These hours must be strictly observed, and the various times announced by the ringing of the bell. The bell to be rung a quarter of an hour before each meal.

- 8. Inmates able to work are to be kept fully occupied during the hours appointed for labour.
- 9. Inmates will not be allowed to smoke in the sleeping wards, or remain in the wards during the day unless they are unable to move about or are sick.
- 10. All immates who are not incapacitated by sickness or infirmity will be required to take their meals at the time and in the place appointed. Inmates neglecting to do this shall not have their food reserved, unless they have been temporarily employed otherwise.
- 11. The inmates of the Mount Eliza Depôt while at meals will, for the sake of order, be divided into messes of not more than twelve men each, with a Messman over each, who shall fetch the food from the kitchen, and apportion it in fair and equal proportions to the respective members of his mess. The Messman shall at the close of each meal collect the knives, forks, and spoons used by his mess, and shall return the same with the plates and dishes to the kitchen.
- 12. Inmates shall not throw away or destroy food of any description.
- 13. Inmates shall not purchase or receive any extras or presents without the permission of the Inspector of Charitable Institutions or the officer in charge of either institution. No present shall consist of or include intoxicating liquor.
- 14. If an inmate return to either of the institutions in a state of intoxication, or is found while resident there in this condition, he or she shall be deemed to have committed a breach of the Regulations
- 15. Written communication shall not be sent out of either of the institutions by the inmates, except through the officer in charge.
- 16. Inmates of the Mount Eliza Depôt or the Female Home, Perth, who may receive, by way of gift or otherwise, any sum or sums of money shall report the same to the Master in the one case, and the Matron in the other, who may, if they think fit, require such inmate to deposit such sum or sums of money, and it shall be dealt with as the Inspector of Charitable Institutions may direct.
- 17. Swearing, indecent conversation, unruly conduct, and gambling of every description are strictly prohibited.
- 18. Visitors will not be allowed access to the inmates without the consent of the Inspector of Charitable Institutions or of the officer in charge of either of the institutions. Ministers of religion may be allowed to visit the inmates at such times as shall not interfere with existing arrangements.
- 19. Inmates will not be allowed outside the Mount Eliza Depôt, or the Women's Home, or the grounds attached thereto, without the consent of the Master of the Depôt or the Matron of the Home.
- 20. Inmates who may desire their discharge from either of the institutions must give the officer in charge of the institution 48 hours' notice of their intention to leave; the names of those desirous of leaving to be forwarded daily to the Inspector of Charitable Institutions.
- 21. Any money in the possession of any person other than an Imperial pensioner, who is an inmate either of the Mount Eliza Depôt or of the Female Home, Perth, and who is receiving relief therein, shall be daily applied in payment for the relief of such person at the rate of One shilling per diem.

- 22. Any money in the possession of an Imperial pensioner, who is an inmate of either of the said Institutions, and who is receiving relief therein, shall be daily applied in payment for the relief of such person at the rate of Ninepence per diem.
- 23. In calculating the number of days an immate of either of the said institutions remains an inmate, a broken day shall count as a whole day.
- 24. In the event of any person who is an inmate of either of the said institutions ceasing to be an inmate before such money has been exhausted by such daily payment, the unexpended balance of such money shall be returned to such person on leaving the Institution.
- 25. Inmates wilfully transgressing any of the Regulations render themselves liable to be dismissed forthwith, or to be punished under "The Poor Houses Discipline Act, 1888," which states:—"That notwithstanding the third section of 'The Poor Houses Discipline Act, 1882,' it shall be lawful for any Justice of the Peace to order an inmate of a Poor House, who shall be convicted before him of a breach of any rule or regulation made under the said Act, to be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding one month, and to be also kept upon a diet of bread and water for any part of the said term not exceeding seven days."
- 26. A copy of the above Rules and Regulations shall be placed in a conspicuous place for the information of the inmates.

DUTIES OF OFFICIALS, MOUNT ELIZA DEPÔT.

THE MASTER.

- 27. To exercise a direct and personal supervision over the internal arrangements of the whole Institution, and be responsible for the due maintenance of order, discipline, economy, cleanliness, and general efficiency.
- 28. To see that punctuality is observed throughout the Depôt, and that the hours of rising, serving of meals, hours of work, and retiring to rest are strictly adhered to.
- 29. To examine into the quality of the food and other articles supplied to the Institution, and to report forthwith to the Inspector of Charitable Institutions any infringement of the contract.
- 30. To see that all food supplied to the inmates is properly cooked and served, and that it be sent into the dining hall, in accordance with the dietary scale.
- 31. To be responsible for the faithful discharge of the duties of the various officials, and to see that they act in accordance with the rules laid down for their guidance.
- 32. The Master will have a discretionary power to apportion any other duties to the officials at any time he considers such is necessary.
- 33. Any infringement of the rules, or misconduct on the part of any of the officials, to be at once reported to the Inspector of Charitable Institutions.
- 34. The Master must be particularly careful that no waste of food occurs at the Institution, and that no clothing or bedding be condemned until absolutely useless.
- 35. To see that all medical comforts—unless in cases of emergency—are only distributed when ordered by the visiting medical officer.

- 36. It is also the duty of the Master to make a thorough inspection of the whole establishment not later than 10·30 a.m. each day, and to minutely examine as to the state of the beds, bedding, and general cleanliness of each ward.
- 37. He shall also ascertain, from personal inquiry and observation, as to whether the officials have seen to the washing of the inmates under their charge.
- 38. He shall also make absolutely certain that the inmates regularly change their underclothing, at least once a week, and that no vermin of any description is to be found either on the beds or on the bodies of the men. Vermin found at any time to be specially noted in a book, and the particulars placed before the Inspector of Charitable Institutions on his next visit following. The Master must see that every effort is made, not spasmodically but regularly, to get rid of all vermin that may exist in the Depôt.
- 39. In addition to this, he shall visit the wards and other offices daily at uncertain times, in order to secure complete supervision and efficiency throughout the establishment. He shall also go round the Institution the last thing each night before he himself retires to rest.
- 40. It shall be the duty of the Master to see that all officials have a regular time for being absent from the Depôt on leave, and that they shall be absent at no other time unless specially authorised by the Master, who must enter all such extra leave in the diary.
- 41. The officials' leave time-table is not to be enforced until it has been submitted to the Inspector of Charitable Institutions for his approval.
- 42. The Master will submit a brief weekly report to the Inspector of Charitable Institutions. This report will deal in a general way with any important matter occurring throughout the week. It will specially state complaints by the inmates as to their treatment, any infringement of the rules by the officials, or complaints as to the quantity or quality of food supplied by contractors. This report should reach the Inspector's office on Monday of each week, and should deal with the events of the preceding week.
- 43. It is the duty of the Master to pick the men suitable for work, and to arrange with the Labour Master the duties they are to perform.

STOREKEEPER.

- 44. To receive all stores, fuel, clothing, and other material, and to carefully inspect and weigh or count all articles sent in for the use of the Depôt, and to keep a regular account of the same. Any deficiency in quantity or quality to be at once reported to the Master.
- 45. To issue all stores, boots, clothing, medical comforts (such as brandy, beer, etc., etc.), as instructed by the Master.
- 46. To keep the ration and store books, and prepare the daily return of immates, as well as the distribution of rations. This return, after being signed and its accuracy certified by the Master, to be forwarded each day to the Inspector of Charitable Institutions.
- 47. To receive and take charge of all swags and private clothes, which shall be disinfected before being put in the store.

- 48. To see that particulars of each man's rations are duly and correctly entered on the board placed at the head of each bed.
- 49. To take stock of the provisions and balance the store book at the end of each month.
- 50. To see that all articles served out for the use of the Institution are stamped with the Depôt stamp, and that all unserviceable articles are returned to the store.
- 51. To generally assist the Master, and in his absence take charge.
- 52. It is also the duty of the Storekeeper to see that the Depôt bell is rung at the respective hours appointed for rising, for meals, for labour, and for retiring to rest.

LABOUR MASTER.

- 53. To see that all the inmates are up, washed, and dressed at the regular hour; that the beds are properly folded, and the wards kept thoroughly clean and well ventilated.
- 54. To take charge of the men at their work, and see that they are kept busy during the hours set apart for this purpose.
- 55. To receive inmates on admission, to see that they are bathed, and, if necessary, have their hair cut.
- 56. To take charge of private clothes or other belongings the inmates may have on admission, and pass the same over to the Storekeeper.
- 57. To assist the cooks during the serving of the food, and to see that it is properly distributed among the inmates.
- 58. To go round all the wards each evening when on duty at 9 o'clock, and to see that all inmates are in bed and lights turned down.
- 59. It is the duty of the Labour Master to report immediately to the Master if he finds, in passing through the wards, any absentees, or if any special circumstances come under his notice demanding attention.
- 60. The Labour Master may recommend for the consideration of the Master any of the working inmates who deserve, from diligence in their duties, special extras.

SICK WARD ORDERLY.

- 61. To see that all inmates of the sick ward are kept thoroughly clean, that the bedding is changed regularly, and that the bedsteads are well washed from time to time.
- 62. It is the duty of the Sick Ward Orderly to see that each inmate observes the regulations for personal cleanliness, by washing and cleaning himself daily, and that those who are too infirm to perform this duty themselves are assisted in doing so, and if necessary are to be washed by the Orderly himself
- 63. He shall see that all inmates, unless otherwise ordered by the medical officer, are bathed at least once a week.
- 64. He shall see that the food supplied to the sick ward is fairly distributed, and that it is in accordance with the regulation scale or the instructions of the Medical Officer, as shown on the inmates' board.
- 65. It is his duty to see that all medicines prescribed for the inmates of the sick ward are given at the proper time, and to assist in the kitchen at the distribution of food, or in any other way, as the Master may direct.

Соок

66. To be responsible for the meals being ready at the appointed time.

- 67. To see that the food is properly cooked and served, and that the correct quantity has been received from the Storekeeper.
- 68. It is the duty of the Cook to report at once to the Master any deficiency in the quantity of food supplied from the store or if the quality is inferior.
- 69. To see that the kitchen and all cooking utensils, etc., are kept thoroughly clean, and that no inmates are allowed to enter the kitchen unless employed there.

Assistant Cook.

70. The Assistant Cook shall be held specially responsible for the preparation of all farinaceous food, beef tea, etc., and shall prepare all soft food required by sick inmates, and shall render all necessary help in the kitchen or elsewhere, as may be required.

Infirmary Orderly.

- 71. It is the duty of the Infirmary Orderly to give his special attention to the Infirmary Ward; to see that it is kept thoroughly clean, and in good order, and that the inmates are properly attended to, and that the instructions of the Nurses are carried out.
- 72. It is also his duty to visit, when required, any men who may be sick in any of the other wards, and, when necessary, attend to the inmates during the night.

THE NURSES.

- 73. It is the duty of the nurses to give their entire attention to the sick, either in the Infirmary or in any of the other wards, as required.
- 74. They shall see that all medicines and diet, as prescribed by the Medical Officer, are administered at the proper time and in accordance with the instructions given.
- 75. To pay strict attention to the bedding and other articles of furniture under their charge, and to suffer no dirt or rags to remain in any part of the ward.
- 76. The Nurses are under the control of the Master, and are responsible to him for due discharge of their duties.
- 77. So far as the medical treatment of the inmates is concerned, they will follow the orders of the Medical Officer.
- 78. Any serious case of illness suddenly arising must be at once reported to the Master, in order that immediate intimation may be made to the visiting Medical Officer.
- 79. The nurses are only to leave the Institution at the times duly arranged, unless specially authorised to do so by the Master.

DUTIES OF THE OFFICIALS, FEMALE HOME, PERTH.

THE MATRON.

- 80. To see to the due maintenance of order and discipline among the inmates of the "Home," and to be responsible for the cleanliness, economy, punctuality and general efficiency of the whole Institution.
- 81. To take charge of all immates on admission, and to see that they are thoroughly cleansed and provided with clean clothing.

- To take charge of all clothing and other effects belonging to the inmates.
- 83. To superintend the management of the kitchen, and to see that the food is properly cooked, and fairly and equitably distributed among the
- 84. To be responsible for the efficient performance of the duties of all the officials.
- The Matron will have a discretionary power to apportion any other duties to the officials at any time she considers such is necessary.
- 86. To require all inmates capable of work to give their services on behalf of the Institution, either at needle work, washing, cooking, cleaning, or in the performance of any other duty they are capable of performing.
- 87. To superintend the making and mending of all clothing required by the inmates.
- 88. It will be the duty of the Matron to visit the wards at uncertain times throughout the day, in order to secure complete supervision and efficiency throughout the Institution.
- To keep the ration and store books, and prepare the daily return of immates and the distribution of rations; the return to be forwarded each day to the Inspector of Charitable Institutions.

SUB-MATRON AND NURSE IN CHARGE OF MATERNITY WARD.

- 90. To have charge of the Maternity Ward under the direction of the Matron.
- 91. It will be the duty of the Sub-Matron to see that order and discipline are maintained, and that the cleanliness of the ward and of the inmates are carefully supervised.
- To act as midwife at each confinement, and in case of emergency to communicate at once with the Matron, in order that the Medical Officer may be
- 93. The Sub-Matron shall visit all wards, washhouse and yards throughout the whole Institution not later than 10 o'clock each day; she shall see that everything is clean and orderly. In the event of anything being out of order, she shall at once inform the Matron.
- 94. The Sub-Matron will assist the Matron in other parts of the building when required.

THE NURSE.

- 95. It is the duty of the Nurse to give attention to the sick, either in the Convalescent Ward or in any of the other wards, as required.
- She shall see that all medicines and diet, as prescribed by the Medical Officer, are administered at the proper time and in accordance with the instructions given.
- She shall pay strict attention to the cleanliness of the Convalescent Ward, and will see that the inmates, as well as the beds and bedding, are kept clean and in good order.
- 98. The Nurse is under the control of the Matron, and will assist her in any other way as she may direct.

THE CHILDREN'S NURSE.

99. The Children's Nurse will devote her attention to the children in the "Home."

- 100. It is her duty to see that all the children are kept clean and tidy, and have their food served regularly and in proper quantities.
- 101. She shall see that the floor of the Nursery. and that all the beds and bedding, and other furnishings, are kept clean and in good order.
- 102. She shall give strict attention to the clothing of the children, and see that it is kept in a thorough state of repair.
- The Nurse shall also assist in the distribution of the dinner to all the inmates throughout the "Home," and see that it is fairly and equitably divided among the various divisions.
- 104. She shall also assist in any other way as the Matron may direct.

Regulations for Private Warehouses.

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895

Regulations.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 15th December, 1898.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

GEO. THROSSELL, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

- 1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.
- 2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberly Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.
- 3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.
- 4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparently clean, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.
- 5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas and all

expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

- 6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows:—
 - (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
 - (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
 - (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
 - (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the saltingfloor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

- 7. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."
- 8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 500$.

Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.
- "Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats.
- "Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

(53 Vict., No. 4.)

5 2 3 8 Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 10th November, 1898.

HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- (1.) To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- (2.) To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds, and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations.

His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or remove, in any manner whatever, any crayfish within the following area, from the date of publication hereof:—

Bounded on the *Northward* by a Westerly line from Rous Head to the Northern end of the five-fathom bank; on the *Eastward* by the sea coast; on the *South* by a West line therefrom to the South end of Coventry Reef; and on the *Westward* by the Western side of the five-fathom bank aforesaid.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all crayfish which shall have been taken.

- 2. Each license will be available only by the person named therein as licensee, and will not be transferable except by the special permission of the Conservator of Forests or other officer authorised for the time being to issue licenses.
- 3. No tree or trees shall be felled so as to obstruct any road, track, or water course. Anyone infringing this Regulation shall forfeit his license, and will render himself liable to prosecution.
- 4. All persons cutting timber under one or more licenses extending over three (3) months in any one year shall brand all timber cut by them with a brand registered in the office of the Woods and Forests Department, Perth, and in default shall forfeit all such timber, and shall be liable to the penalties for the breach of this Regulation.
- 5. Piles, poles, dead and fallen timber, and matured timber upon Reserves and State Forests, may be sold by the Conservator of Forests upon such terms and conditions as may be approved by the Minister for Lands.
- 6. The cutting or removal of Kurrajong trees of any kind or size whatever is absolutely prohibited throughout the Colony.
- 7. Every licensee must show his license whenever production thereof is demanded by an officer of the Woods and Forests Department.
- 8. Where any person or persons, without express written authority, strip bark from any standing tree for the bark only, the Conservator of Forests and the officers of the Woods and Forests Department acting under him are required to prosecute such person or persons as for a malicious injury to property under the Statute in that behalf.
- 9. The cutting of piles and poles upon Timber Leases is only allowed as necessary thinnings of the forests, and when it can be shown that these are

being removed indiscriminately without regard to the future maintenance and welfare of the forests, the Minister for Lands may intimate this irregularity to the lessee, and instruct an officer to point out to the lessee how this thinning should be done, whose directions shall be adhered to by the lessee, and any departure therefrom shall entitle the Minister to forfeit the lease.

- 10. A license to cut and remove piles, poles, and balks shall only authorise the licensee to cut and remove the same from such Crown lands as may be described in the body of the license, and subject to such conditions as to size and thinning of the forest as the Conservator of Forests, with the approval of the Minister for Lands, may direct.
- 11. The Minister may grant a permit to any person to cut and remove a certain number of specified trees from any unoccupied Crown lands or timber reserves as he may think fit, on the terms and conditions to be in such permit prescribed.

It will probably be interesting to know how the above figures compare with those of previous years. A glance at the rainfall map exhibited in the Observatory show-case at the G.P.O. Hall will convey a better idea than pages of description, but it may be said that:—

(3) In the South-West Division it was about an average in the neighbourhood of Perth, slightly below to the North, and considerably above to the South, the Bunbury district being 7½in, in excess of previous years. In the central agricultural areas from Newcastle directly Southward right through to Dardanup, it was higher than usual, but farther East again it reached an average.
(4.) On the Goldfields there was not a sufficient number of past records to establish an average, but the amount registered was very small, especially on the Murchison. The lower Coolgardie Goldfields fared better, beging received nearly 10in.

(5.) On the South Coast it was generally slightly below the mean for previous years, except at Balladonia, where it was 3½in. in excess.

^(1.) In the tropics, North of Cossack, the fall was remarkably heavy, being in some cases double, and even treble, the mean for previous years. At Wyndham and Broome the fall has only once been exceeded. At Derby, LaGrange Bay and Cossack it was largely in excess of any previous record. The latitude of Cossack seems to put a definite limit to this plenteous supply, for at Onslow the amount (390 points) was only half the mean for previous years.

If the same are not so delivered within two months after the receipt thereof by the owner, occupier, or manager, and if instructions to the contrary are not received from the person to whom the same are addressed, they shall be returned to the nearest Post Office, and thence transmitted to the General Post Office.
- Any owner, occupier, or manager of any such house who wilfully neglects or omits to return a letter, telegram, parcel, packet, or newspaper aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

By-Laws for the Karridale Local Board of Health.

WHEREAS by "The Health Act, 1898," it is enacted that every Local Board of Health may, from time to time, and subject to the approval of the Central Board of Health, make, alter, modify, amend, or repeal By-laws

for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution: Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given by the said Act, it is directed by the Karridale Local Board of Health that the following By-laws shall form and be the By-laws of the Karridale Local Board of Health:—

- 1. These By-laws shall come into operation immediately they are published in the *Government Gazette*, and be in force throughout the district of the Karridale Local Board of Health.
- 2. The Board shall meet for general business at the Karridale Hall on the first Saturday in each month, at the hour of 8 p.m., and special meetings may be called at any time by the Chairman and Secretary, or by any two members of the Board.
- 3. Any member absenting himself from three consecutive ordinary meetings, without the consent of the Board, shall have his seat declared vacant.
- 4. In the construction and for the purpose of these By-laws, the list of words having meanings assigned to them by "The Health Act, 1898," shall have the like meaning, with the following additions thereto:—
 - "Karridale" shall mean the area under the control of the Karridale Local Board of Health.
 - "Board" shall mean the Karridale Local Board of Health.
 - "Nightman" shall mean any person licensed or otherwise duly appointed by the Board for the removal of nightsoil or other refuse matter.
 - "Night-cart" shall mean any dray, cart, barrow, or other vehicle whatsoever used by any nightman for the conveyance of nightsoil or other refuse matter.
 - "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector of Nuisances for the time being, or any person appointed by the Board to act in his place or stead.
 - "Rubbish" shall mean broken glass, empty bottles, empty tins, old boots, rags, and all other refuse matter which in the opinion of the Health Officer constitutes a nuisance.
- 5. The duties of Secretary shall be to keep a record of all accounts, notices issued to abate nuisances and the results thereof, and to attend and take minutes of all Board meetings; to prepare the annual balance sheet, and to perform such other clerical work as may be necessary.
- 6. The duties of the Health Officer shall be to superintend the application of all sanitary matters ordered by the Board, and shall visit, inspect, and report upon the various parts of the Board's District and see that the duties of the Inspector are properly and efficiently carried out, and shall report to the Board any neglect of that officer; he shall inspect premises that may be reported to him or that he may have reason to believe are in an unwholesome condition and affecting health; he shall also assist the Board with his presence and advice, if considered necessary, and he shall on all occasions give the Board the benefit of his medical experience and skill.
- 7. The duties of Inspector shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the Public Health Act in force for the time being, and with these By-laws, and shall carry out their provisions under instructions of the Board and its Health Officer; to visit occasionally and at uncertain times, not less than once a week, the various portions of the Boards District, and, if necessary, give his advice and instructions to occupiers of premises as to the abatement or prevention of nuisances, the deodourising or removal of offensive matter; to keep a record of all such instructions to abate nuisance, etc., and to furnish the Board at each monthly meeting with a report of all such nuisance and the general sanitary state of the district, and to do such other things as the Board may require or the Health Officer may direct.
- 8. All dwellings, tenements, shops, stores, offices, or other premises shall be kept and maintained in such a sanitary condition as shall satisfy the Inspector, and all orders given by the Inspector for the abatement of any nuisance shall be complied with by the owner, occupier, or agent of the premises on which the nuisance is located.

- 9. All dwellings, tenements, shops, stores, offices, or other premises shall be provided by the owner, occupier, or agent thereof with a sufficient number of closets constructed according to a specification to be approved by the Board, and each said closet to be fitted with a pan or receptacle of such size, material, and construction as shall be approved by the Board, and all such pans or receptacles shall be emptied at least once a week (or oftener if required by the Inspector) and any person refusing or neglecting to empty or cause to be emptied shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- 10. Every pan or other receptacle of nightsoil shall be maintained by the occupier in a thoroughly efficient condition, free from leakage, and of the size, shape, material, and construction ordered by the Board, and shall by means of disinfectants, or other approved means, be kept clean and free from offensive smell by the occupier of the premises.
- 11. The occupier of any premises whereon there are accumulations of any rubbish or offensive matter shall remove or cause to be removed all such accumulations within one week of notification by the Inspector.
- 12. No person shall deposit any rubbish or offensive matter in any place within the Board's District other than those places set apart for that purpose.
- 13. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish or other offensive substance within the limits of the Board's District if such burning or destroying is likely to create a nuisance without first having obtained the written consent of the Inspector.
- 14. Every occupier of premises within the Board's District shall provide a suitable box or bin of such size and construction as shall be approved by the Board for the reception and storage of household refuse and rubbish, and shall be kept in such position as shall be directed by the Inspector, and such box or bin shall be emptied as often as the Inspector shall deem it necessary.
- 15. No owner or occupier of stables shall permit accumulations of dung to remain upon the premises until they become a nuisance.
- 16. No person shall, without the written consent of the Board, be allowed to keep any swine within the limits of the Board's District, and such consent may be cancelled at any time if, in the opinion of the Board or its Health Officer, the condition of the sties is such as to prove a public nuisance.
- 17. In the event of any death or accident necessitating the slaughter of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals within the limits of the Board's District, the carease of such animal shall be removed and buried at a depth of at least four feet below the surface of the ground, within 24 hours of such death or accident, by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be.
- 18. The Board may from time to time appoint any places within its district for the reception of nightsoil, rubbish, or other offensive matter, and may at any time cancel or vary such appointment, and the Inspector shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.
- 19. All closets existing at the time these By-laws come into force, and which do not meet with the approval of the Board, shall be disinfected and removed or destroyed to the satisfaction of the Inspector by the occupier of the premises within 14 days from the time he shall have received notice to do so.
- 20. All existing cesspits shall be deodourised and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector by the occupier of the premises whereon they exist.
- 21. Where anything is by these By-laws made under the authority of "The Health Act, 1898," directed to be done or forbidden to be done, or where authority is given by the Board under the direction of the Central Board to any of its officers or servants to direct anything to be done or to forbid anything to be done, and such act so directed to be done remains undone, or such act so forbidden to be done is done, in every such case the person making such default as to such direction and prohibition respectively shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the said Health Act, 1898.

- 22. In the case of any breach, non-observance, or non-performance of any of the foregoing by-laws, the person or persons guilty of such breach, non-observance, or non-performance shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a sum of not more than Ten pounds, except in such cases as are otherwise provided for in the Act.
- 23. In determining the responsibility of the person or persons against whom any action may be taken under these By-laws, it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person or persons is the occupier or are the occupiers of the premises whereon the offence is committed.
- 24. All penalties recoverable under these By-laws shall be applied in the manner directed in Section 246 of "The Health Act, 1898."
