# PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c.,

HEREAS by "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895," it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to acquire and set apart, by Proclamation in the Government Gazette, such ground as may be required for one or more Quarantine Stations, on which the necessary sheds and appurtenances may be erected for the purposes of the said Act; And Whereas it is deemed expedient by me, the said Governor, to set apart a Quarantine Station at Owen's Anchorage, near Fremantle: Now Therefore I, the said Governor, in exercise of the powers in me vested as aforesaid, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby set apart as a Quarantine Station near Fremantle, for the purposes of the said Act, all that piece or parcel of land situate at Owen's Anchorage, near Fremantle:—

Bounded by lines starting from a point situate 1 chain 4 links South, and 22 chains 93 links West from the North-West corner of Cockburn Sound Location 83, and extending 165° 40′ 4 chains 50 links, 181° 3′ 3 chains  $76\frac{5}{10}$  links, 164° 11′ 4 chains  $99\frac{7}{10}$  links, 175° 29′ 20 chains 74 links to the sea coast, 339° 36′ 7 chains 51 links, 341° 52′ 14 chains, 340° 36′ 7 chains  $65\frac{7}{10}$  links, 338° 52′ 4 chains  $53\frac{3}{10}$  links, and 75° 40′ 7 chains  $34\frac{5}{10}$  links to the starting point.

#### Municipality of Cue.

By-Law No. 69.

For prohibiting the camping of Camels within the Board of Health boundaries.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to lead, keep, camp, or otherwise detain any camel or dromedary within the Municipality between the hours of sunset and sunrise without first having obtained permission from the Board of Health so to do.
- 2. Any person offending against the requirements of this By-law shall for each such offence be liable to a fine not exceeding  $\pounds 2$  per head per night.

# Local Boards of Health By-Laws.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-Laws made by the Local Boards of Health at Wagin, East Fremantle, Bridgetown, and Golden Valley.

#### Wagin Local Board of Health.

In accordance with the provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," the following By-laws have been framed to regulate the business of the above Board:—

- 1. This Board shall meet for the transaction of general business on the first Tuesday evening in each month, at 7:30 p.m.; four members to form a quorum. Special meetings may be called at any time, when deemed necessary, by the Chairman or any two members of the Board.
- 2. The moneys are to be received and disbursed by the Treasurer, subject to the control of the Board.
- 3. The duties of the Secretary shall be to attend and take minutes of all meetings of the Board, keep accounts, prepare a statement of receipts and expenditure when desired by the Board, and perform all other elerical work that may be necessary.
- 4. The duties of the Inspector shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the Public Health Act at present in force, and to carry out its provisions, under instructions from the Board; to visit occasionally, not less than once a month, the various portions of the Board's district, and, if necessary, give his advice or instructions to occupiers of premises as to the abatement or prevention of nuisances or removal of offensive matter; to keep a record of all such instructions given to abate nuisances; and to furnish the Board at each meeting with a report of all such nuisances abated, and the general sanitary state of the district.
- 5. The Inspector shall report to the Board any case of over-crowding in any house.
- 6. The Board shall appoint a person or persons to act as nightman or nightmen within its district, and such persons shall be appointed in writing, signed by the Chairman of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary of the Board thereof.
- 7. The nightman appointed by the Board shall at all times be amenable to and obey the instructions of the Board and its officers, and see that no leakage of nightsoil or refuse takes place during its removal to the site appointed by the Board for that purpose.
- 8. The nightman shall not ask or demand for the removal of nightsoil more than the sum specified in his tender for the work.
- 9. The nightman shall not remove any nightsoil or bring any nighteart within the limits of the townsite except between the hours of  $11~\rm p.m.$  and  $5~\rm a.m.$
- 10. The nightman shall provide a vehicle for the transit of nightsoil; such vehicle to be approved of by the Board.
- 11. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, or other premises shall be kept and maintained in such a sanitary condition as shall satisfy the Inspector, and all orders given by the Inspector for the removal or abatement of any nuisance shall be complied with by the owner, occupier or agent of the premises on which the nuisance is located.
- 12. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, or other premises shall be provided by the owner, occupier or agent thereof with a sufficient number of substantially constructed closets (each closet to be fitted with a pan, bucket, or other receptacle to be approved by the Inspector), and all such pans, buckets, or as the case may be, shall be emptied at least once a week, or oftener if required by the Inspector. The nightman appointed by the Board, and no other person, being employed for that purpose, and any person refusing or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence against this section.
- 13. No occupier shall permit or suffer the receptacle attached or used with the premises of which he is the occupier or one of the occupiers to be leaky, overflow, or become offensive.

- 14. Any person who shall deposit any refuse or rubbish in any street or other place within the Board's district other than the place set apart for that purpose shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing same, be subject also to a penalty not exceeding £2.
- 15. The occupier of any premises shall not allow the dung of any cattle to remain in such a condition or in such a manner as to pollute any water likely to be used for domestic purposes.
- 16. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offalmanure, or other offensive matter within the limits of the Townsite of Wagin if such burning or destroyal creates a nuisance, without having first obtained the consent in writing of the Board so to do.
- 17. In the event of any death or accident necessitating the slaughter of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals within the limits of the board's district, the carcase of such animal shall be removed within four hours of such death to a distance outside the limits of the townsite of Wagiin by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be. Any person guilty of a breach of this section shall be subject, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than £5, in addition to any expense incurred by the Board in having such animal removed.
- 18. No nightsoil, refuse, or other rubbish shall be removed to any other place than that appointed by the Board for that purpose.
- 19. Whenever in these By-laws the word "Board" is used it shall be taken to mean the Wagin Local Board of Health, and the word "Inspector" shall be taken to mean the Inspector of Nuisances for the time being appointed by the said Board or any other person duly appointed to act in his stead.
- 20. Wherever in these By-laws any act, deed or thing is directed to be done, or any act, deed or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing or prevent being done any act, deed or thing shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws.
- 21. In the event of any breach of any of the foregoing By-laws to which no penalty is herein attached, the person or persons guilty of such breach shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a sum of not more than Five pounds or a penalty not exceeding Five shillings per day during which any breach of any By-laws may continue.

# By-Laws of the Golden Valley Local Board of Health.

Made in pursuance of the powers and authorities contained in "The Public Health Act, 1886," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Amendment Act, 1892," "The Public Health Act, 1886, Further Amendment Act, 1893," and "The Public Health Act, Further Amendment Act, 1895."

- 1. In the construction and for the purpose of these By-laws, words having a meaning assigned to them by "The Public Health Act, 1886," and any amendment thereof, shall have the like meaning with the following additions therefor—
  - (a.) "Golden Valley" shall mean within the limits of jurisdiction of the Golden Valley Board of Health, which shall comprise Golden Valley Townsite and the district extending within a radius of two miles from the Post Office.
  - (b.) "Board" shall mean the Local Board of Health appointed by the Governor by Order in Council and the persons hereafter from time to time duly appointed as members of the Board for the district.
  - (c.) "Inspector" shall mean the Inspector for the time being or any person lawfully acting in his place and stead.
  - (d.) "Nightman" shall mean any person who for reward shall remove or shall assist to remove any nightsoil or urine, and also any person driving a nightcart.
  - (e.) "Nightcart" shall mean any dray, cart, barrow, or other carriage whatsoever used by any nightman for the conveyance of any nightsoil or
- 2. These By-laws shall, immediately they are published in the *Government Gazette*, come into operation and be in force in Golden Valley.
- 3. This Board may from time to time appoint any place or places within Golden Valley for the reception of nightsoil, urine, offal, or any other rubbish or offensive matter, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment; and the Inspector shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.
- 4. The Board shall meet for the transaction of general business on every alternate Tuesday at 8 p.m. Special meetings may be called at any time deemed necessary by the Chairman or any two members of the Board; four members, inclusive of the Chairman, to form a quorum.
- 5. Any member absenting himself from three (3) ordinary consecutive meetings of the Board, without the consent of the Board, shall have his seat declared vacant.
- 6. All moneys shall be placed in the Western Australian Bank, at Kanowna, to the credit of the Board, and none shall be drawn therefrom except by cheque signed by the Chairman or Acting Chairman and Secretary.

# DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

7. The duties of the Secretary shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the provisions of "The Health Act, 1886," and the amendments thereto, and to carry out its provisions, under instructions from the Board; to keep a monthly record of all accounts, notices issued to abate nuisances, and the result thereof and minutes of the Board meeting; to summon and attend all meetings of the Board, and perform such other clerical work as may be necessary.

#### DUTIES OF HEALTH OFFICER.

- 8. It is the duty of the Health Officer to superintend the application of all sanitary measures, especially those ordered by the Board, and to advise the Board generally on all such matters.
- 9. The Health Officer shall make frequent examinations of the area under the jurisdiction of the Board, and see that the Inspector's duties are properly performed, and report any neglect of this officer.
- 10. He is to assist the Board with his presence and advise, if necessary, in the carrying out of the Act referring to the sale of unwholesome food, and also to report the appearance in the district of any epidemic or contagious disease, and at all times to give the Board the benefit of his experience and skill.
- 11. He is to furnish the Board with lalf-yearly reports of the health, cleanliness, and general sanitary state of the district.

#### DUTIES OF INSPECTOR.

- 12. He shall, by inspection of the district, as occasion may require, keep himself informed as to any breach of the By-laws or any nuisance existing that requires abatement.
- 13. He shall from time to time, and forthwith upon any complaint, visit and inspect the shops kept and used for the sale of butcher's meat, poultry, fish, fruit and vegetables, bread or flour, and in case any such articles appear to him to be intended for the food of man and to be unfit for such food, he shall immediately report the same to the Board.
- 14. No person shall deposit any nightsoil or urine in any place whatsoever other than the place or places provided by By-law No. 3; and no person shall transport such nightsoil or urine from any place within the district to the said place or places so provided as aforesaid, unless he be a nightman or other person duly licensed as hereinafter provided.
- 15. Every house or tenement within Golden Valley shall have a privy or earth closet erected in such position as shall be approved by the Inspector, and such privy or closet shall in all cases be not less than thirty feet from the nearest house or tenement.

Any owner or occupier of a house or tenement who shall not comply with or shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this or the preceding By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5.

- 16. All existing cesspools shall be cleansed and filled up to the satisfaction of the Inspector within one month after notice in writing to that effect being given by the Inspector to the owner or occupier of the premises whereon such cesspool shall be, and no cesspool shall hereafter be opened or maintained within the district.
- 17. Every privy or earth closet shall, within fourteen days after the publication of these By-laws, be supplied by the occupier of the house to which it belongs with a pan or receptacle for nightsoil, which shall be constructed of iron 18 inches long, width 13 inches, and the height 15 inches, and shall have two fixed handles thereto.
- 18. The occupier of any premises whereon any earth closet, privy, or urinal is erected shall keep the same, and the pans and receptacles for nightsoil and urine clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause such earth closet, privy, or urinal to be properly emptied and cleansed once at least in every week, or oftener if required by the Inspector; and the occupier shall cause a sufficient supply of disinfectants to be from time to time provided, for use in the aforesaid earth closet, privy, or urinal, and shall cause such disinfectant to be frequently and effectively applied to the contents of such earth closet, privy or urinal.
- 19. No earth closet, privy, cesspool, or urinal, or other receptacle for nightsoil or urine shall be emptied, nor any blood, offal, or other offensive refuse whatever removed from any house or premises within Golden Valley except between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m.; and no nightsoil, blood, offal or other offensive refuse matter shall be transported in Golden Valley except as aforesaid.
- 20. Every nightman shall be entitled to charge and receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil or urine shall be removed such sum or sums of money as are mentioned in Schedule B hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said schedule.
- 21. Every nightman, prior to his carrying on his business, shall obtain from the Inspector a license so to do in the form in Schedule A hereto. Such license shall be subject to the condition contained in By-laws 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, and shall be obtained upon an application, in writing, which shall contain the true name and address of the applicant, and shall be accompanied by a certificate from two or more householders in Golden Valley certifying to the fitness of the applicant to hold such license. The In-

- spector shall not be bound to issue a license to any person and shall not, without the consent of the Board, issue a license to any person who has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws.
- 22. Every such license shall remain in force only to the 31st day of December next ensuing the issue thereof, subject, however, to the condition that the Board may (whether the nightman has been convicted of any offence against these By-laws or not), upon being satisfied that a nightman has been guilty of any misconduct or impropriety whilst engaged in his business or any offence against these By-laws at any time cancel such license or suspend the operation of the same for such period as the Board may think fit.
- 23. If a nightman shall change his abode during the currency of his license, he shall within two days next after making such change, give to the Inspector notice in writing of such change, specifying his new address, and shall at the same time produce his license to the Inspector, who shall indorse a memorandum therein specifying a new address of the licensee.
- 24. Every nightman shall at all times when engaged in carrying on his business have his license with him, and shall be bound, upon demand, to produce the same to the Inspector or other person lawfully authorised to demand such production, and shall not at any time part with the custody or possession of his said license.
- 25. Every nightman shall, before using any nightcart, produce the same for examination by the Inspector, who shall, upon being satisfied of its fitness, register the same as a nightcart with a number in a book to be kept by him for that purpose, and shall hand to the nightman a memorandum of the number of such nightcart upon the register. No cart, dray, barrow, or carriage shall be used as a nightcart until so registered, and the number of such registration fixed thereon. Every nightman shall have painted, and at all times keep conspicuous upon the right side of any nightcart used by him, in white letters not less than two inches in length, and of a proportionate breadth upon a black ground, his name together with the words "Licensed Nightman," and together also with the registration number of the cart in figures not less than four inches in length and of a proportionate breadth.
- 26. Every nightman shall keep any nightcart used by him water-tight and free from leakage, and such cart shall be provided with a cover so as effectually to prevent the splashing out or spilling of any of the contents thereof, or the escape of any offensive smells therefrom. Every nightman shall, within twenty-four hours after being requested so to do by the owner or occupier of any premises whereon are any receptacles for nightsoil or urine requiring cleansing, properly cleanse and remove the contents of such receptacles, and the nightman shall be entitled to charge in respect of such cleansing such sum and sums of money as are mentioned in the Schedule B hereto.
- 27. Any nightman who shall be guilty of a breach of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and his license may be forfeited or suspended by the Board.
- 28. The occupier of any premises shall, once at least in every week, remove or cause to be removed the house refuse from such premises.
- 29. The occupier of any premises whereon there are accumulations of offal, blood, filth or offensive matter shall remove or cause to be removed such accumulations as often as the Board may determine and notify such occupier.
- 30. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, empty bottles or tins or other rubbish in any street or other place within Golden Valley, other than those places set apart for that purpose, shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing same, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £2.
- 31. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offal, manure or other offensive substance within the limits of the Townsite of Golden Valley, or adjacent thereto, if such burning or destroyal creates or is likely to create a nuisance, except as in such cases as in the opinion of the Inspector or the Board any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt, when such Inspector or the Board may give permission for such rubbish, offal, manure, etc., to be burnt.
- 32. In the event of the death from natural causes of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals, or accident necessitating the slaughter of such animals within the limits of Golden Valley, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the limits of the Townsite of Golden Valley, and thoroughly burned and destroyed to the satisfaction of the Board or the Inspector by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or, as the case may be. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall be subject, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than 5s. and not more than £10.

- 33. No person shall, without the consent in writing of the Board, keep any swine within Golden Valley townsite.
- 34. Every occupier or owner of any premises whereon any horse or other beast of draught or burden or any cattle may be kept, shall keep the stables attached thereto clean, and remove or cause to be removed the accumulations of manure from time to time, so that they shall not become offensive.
- 35. The occupier of any business premises fronting, adjoining, or abutting on any street, shall once at least in every day, Sundays excepted, cleanse the footways adjoining such premises, and no rubbish shall be swept into the
- 36. No person shall allow filth or rubbish to accumulate on his unoccupied land in the townsite.
- 37. Except where otherwise provided, anyone committing a breach of these By-laws shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

#### Bakehouses.

- 38. Every bakehouse shall be kept in a cleanly state and free from any effluvia arising from privy or water closet or any other nuisance.
  - (a.) All the internal walls of the rooms of every bake-house, and all the ceilings and tops of such rooms, and all the passages of such bakehouse shall be lime-washed once at least every six months.
  - (b.) The troughs and all utensils used in the bakehouse shall be kept clean to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.
  - (c.) No place on the same level as any bakehouse and forming part of the same building shall be used as a sleeping apartment, unless it is sufficiently separated from the bakehouse by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and such apartment being sufficiently ventilated.
  - (d.) No person suffering or who has recently suffered from any infectious disease shall be employed or allowed to reside on the premises.
  - (e.) No live stock or poultry shall be kept within 50ft. of the bakehouse.
  - (f.) No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the district, or carry, or cause to be carried through the district thereof, on any cart or other vehicle, any bread or pastry intended for human consumption, unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed that the rays of the sun and the rain and dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such bread or pastry, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof; and every person acting in contravention to this By-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

# BUTCHERIES.

- 39. Every butcher's shop shall be kept in a cleanly state, and free from any effluvia arising from privy or water closet, or any other nuisance.
  - (a.) All the internal walls of the rooms of every butcher's shop, and all the ceilings and tops of such rooms, and all the passages of such butcher's shop, shall be lime-washed once at least every six months.
  - (b.) The troughs and all utensils used in the butcher's shop shall be kept clean to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector.
  - (c.) No place on the same level as any butcher's shop, and forming part of the same building, shall be used as a sleeping apartment, unless it is sufficiently separated from the butcher's shop by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and such apartment being sufficiently ventilated.
  - (d.) No person suffering, or who has recently suffered from any infectious disease, shall be employed or allowed to reside on the premises.
  - (e.) No live stock or poultry shall be kept within 50 feet of the butcher's shop.

(f.) No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the district, or carry or cause to be carried through the district thereof, on any cart or other vehicle, any butcher's meat or carcase of meat intended for human consumption, unless such cart or other vehicle be so constructed that the rays of the sun and the rain and dust are not allowed to fall on or be capable of reaching such meat or carcase of meat, and that proper sitting accommodation be provided for the driver thereof; and every person acting in contravention to this By-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

KEEPING OF FOWLS AND ANIMALS DEEMED A NUISANCE.

- 40. No person shall keep within the district of Golden Valley any fowls or animals whatsoever which shall be deemed a nuisance, either to their neighbours or the public, or which may be deemed injurious to health by the Medical Health Officer.
- 41. Where the penalty is not named for the contravention of any of these By-laws, the penalty shall be for each and every offence a sum not exceeding £10.

#### BY-LAWS.

W HEREAS by "The Metropolitan Waterworks Act, 1896" (incorporating "The Waterworks Act, 1889") the Metropolitan Waterworks Board (hereinafter called "the Board") is empowered to make By-laws for the purposes therein mentioned, and by such By-laws to impose penalties as therein mentioned: Now THEREFORE the Board, in exercise and by virtue of the powers conferred by the said Act, and of all other powers in that behalf vested in or exercisable by the said Board, do repeal By-laws Nos. 5, 6, and 24, and Form "F," and substitute in lieu thereof By-laws Nos. 49, 50, 51, and Schedule "F1," and amend Form "A" by inserting after the words "Water supply," in the last line of the requisition clause, the words "and pay all charges in advance": and further add Schedules "J," "K," "L," "A1," "A2," and "A3."

# Supply of Water in consideration of Rates Paid.

49. The prescribed quantity of water which any consumer is entitled to receive in any one year in consideration of the rates paid is that quantity of water the total cost of which, if paid for at the current price, viz., 2s. per 1,000 gallons, would amount to a sum equal to the amount of rates paid for the same period.

Any consumer using more than the prescribed quantity of water will be required to take the whole of his supply by meter.

## PRICE OF SUPPLY BY MEASURE.

- 50. All water supplied by measure (whether under express agreement or otherwise) shall be at the rate of 2s. for every one thousand gallons consumed: Provided that in cases where the consumption is over five hundred thousand gallons per annum a reduction may be made upon such terms and conditions as the Board may fix.
- 51. Any person desirous of obtaining a supply of water outside the boundary of the Municipality of Perth may apply on such of the Forms A, A1, or A2 in the Schedule as may be applicable, and thereupon the Board may connect and, if necessary, affix a meter to the premises of the applicant.

If the Board connects the premises, the water supplied shall be upon the terms contained in such of the agreements in Forms J, K, and L as may be applicable, and the consumer shall enjoy such supply upon and subject to the same terms and conditions

as if such agreement had been executed by him: Provided that if such consumer refuses to sign an agreement whenever required, the supply may forthwith, without notice, be cut off.

#### FORM F1.

Form of Agreement for Supply of Water by Meter in Perth. Full Meterage.

An Agreement made this day of 189, between the Metropolitan Waterworks Board (hereinafter called "the Board") of the one part, and (hereinafter called "the Consumer") of the other part, whereby it is agreed as follows:—

- 1. All water which may be supplied hereunder by the Board shall be supplied through a meter provided by the Board.
- 2. The cost of fixing such meter shall be paid on demand, and all costs and charges at any time during this agreement incurred by the Board in repairing the meter shall be paid on demand.
- 3. The consumer will, when and as often as demanded, pay to the Board for all water supplied to the consumer according to the said meter, at the rate of two shillings per thousand gallons.

When and as soon as the consumer pays the water rates due or payable in respect of the premises, he shall, as against all water supplied during the year in respect of which such rates are paid, be credited with the amount of rates so paid.

This agreement in no manner limits or affects the liability of the consumer to pay such water rates.

4. The said Board and all workmen and servants employed by them shall have full right and liberty to enter upon the said premises from time to time, at all reasonable hours, for the purpose of fixing the said meter and keeping the same in repair and in proper working order and of taking the register thereof; and the Board shall also have the right of removing the same at any time it may think fit.

In the event of the meter reader not being able to take the register of the meter at any time in consequence of the ordinary means of ingress to the premises being closed, the consumption during such period shall be taken and deemed to have been consumed during the period for which the register is next taken, and shall be considered as water supplied during the year in which such register is taken.

- 5. The said consumer will keep the said meter properly protected from all accident or damage, and, in the event of any repairs being required, will immediately give notice thereof to the said Board.
- 6. The quantity of water which shall be registered by the said meter as having been supplied shall be taken as the quantity actually supplied. If the said consumer shall be at any time dissatisfied with any particular reading of the said meter, and shall be desirous of having the same tested, he shall give written notice thereof to the said Board within seven days from receiving written notice of such reading, and thereupon the said meter shall be tested by passing through it into a vessel of known capacity sufficient water to fill such vessel; and if, upon such testing, it shall appear that the said meter registered more than was actually passed through it at such testing, then the said Board will bear the expenses of and incidental to such testing, and will also allow to the said consumer a proportionate rebate upon the quantity of water which shall be objected to as registered to have passed through the said meter as aforesaid; but if the meter, upon such testing, shall not register more than the quantity that shall have actually passed through it, then the consumer shall pay to the said Board, in addition to the sum hereinbefore agreed to be paid by him, all expenses of and incidental to such testing: Provided that the expense of each and every test shall be fixed by the said Board, and shall in no case exceed the sum of Twenty shillings: Provided also that the said consumer shall not be at liberty to avail himself of the said right to test the said meter for any three months other than those next preceding his giving written notice to the Board of his dissatisfaction and desire to have the said meter tested as aforesaid. In the event of the said meter failing to register, from any cause whatever, the Board may fix the quantity consumed by comparison with the previous reading.
- 7. In addition to the liabilities of the said consumer, under the preceding clauses, he shall continue to pay the said Board for water used upon the premises at the rate aforesaid after he shall have left or removed from the said premises, unless, on leaving or removing therefrom, the said Board shall receive written notice from the said consumer of his desire to be released from his agreement.

- 8. The Board reserves to itself the right of terminating this agreement at any time on giving notice, by general advertisement or otherwise, seven days before such termination.
- 9. The meter rent shall be paid punctually on the 1st day of January in each year.
- 10. If default is made in payment of any moneys under paragraphs 2 or 3, or in payment of any meter rent on the date aforesaid, the Board may, without any further notice or demand, cut off the supply of water to the premises, and such supply shall not be restored until all moneys due are paid, together with the cost of cutting off and restoring the supply. Such cutting off shall not prejudice or affect the liability of the said premises to be assessed for water rates in the usual way.
- 11. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained, all rights, powers, and privileges given to or conferred upon the Board by "The Waterworks Act, 1899," or "The Metropolitan Waterworks Act, 1896," or any regulations now or hereafter in force made under the said Acts, or either of them, shall remain in full force, and this agreement shall be expressly subject thereto.

- 5. The district member will not have or use more than one tap, and will place the stand-pipe for the same in a place to be first approved by the Board.
- 6. This agreement may be terminated at any time by the Board advertising notice in a newspaper or by either party giving notice in writing not less than one month before the expiration of a half-year.
- 7. In addition to its other rights and privileges, the Board may, without any notice or demand, cut off the supply of water for non-payment of the minimum charge on the days mentioned, or for non-payment of the proportion of excess charges, immediately upon demand, and for any breach of any of the Board's By-laws or of the Acts relating to waterworks.
- 8. The Board does not agree or bind itself to supply or continue the supply of any water under this agreement, and the Board shall not be responsible or liable for any stoppage of the water supply for any reason or purpose whatever, nor shall this agreement be prejudiced or affected thereby.
- 9. Until the termination of this agreement as aforesaid, the district member shall remain liable for all water supplied to the said premises, notwithstanding that the district member may have ceased to occupy such premises.
- 10. All the powers, rights, and remedies which are or may be vested in the Board by any Act or Acts or any By-laws now or hereafter in force shall remain in full force and virtue unprejudiced and unaffected by this agreement; and, except so far as this agreement provides to the contrary, the By-laws of the Board now or hereafter to be in force shall apply as if herein set forth.

# The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

#### Regulations.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 15th December, 1898.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

GEO. THROSSELL, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

- 1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.
- 2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberly Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.
- 3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.
- 4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparently clean, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.
- 5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other emporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas and all

- expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.
- 6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows:—
  - (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
  - (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
  - (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
  - (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the saltingfloor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

- 7. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."
- 8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 500$ .

# Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.
- "Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats.
- "Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

# Regulations under "The Fishery Act, 1889." (53 Vict., No. 4.)

 $\begin{array}{ccc} s_{\frac{9.3}{10.6}}s & & Department\ of\ Lands\ and\ Surveys, \\ & & Perth,\ 10th\ November,\ 1898. \end{array}$ 

HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- (1.) To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- (2.) To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds, and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations.

His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Council does, by these Regulations, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, or remove, in any manner whatever, any crayfish within the following area, from the date of publication hereof:—

Bounded on the Northward by a Westerly line from Rous Head to the Northern end of the five-fathom bank; on the Eastward by the sea coast; on the South by a West line therefrom to the South end of Coventry Reef; and on the Westward by the Western side of the five-fathom bank aforesaid.

Every person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and shall forfeit the implements used and all crayfish which shall have been taken.

The Regulation published in the *Government Gazette* of the 23rd September, 1898, is hereby cancelled.

1. Town and Suburban lands shall be sold subject to the conditions of sale set forth in the Schedule, and the purchase money shall be payable in the instalments therein stated.

- 1. The land offered for sale is particularised in the notice headed "Land Sales," published in the Government Gazette of the day of 189, and in the Schedule hereto, and will be sold subject to the terms and conditions of "The Land Act, 1898," and the Regulations thereunder.
- $2. \,$  The lots will be offered separately, and in the order in which they appear in the said notice.
- 3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise the lot in dispute shall be put up again and resold.
- 4. Each lot shall be offered at the upset price, and, if no advance be made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser at that price; but if any advance be made, the highest bidder shall be the purchaser as aforesaid.
