Mestern Australia,) By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerrard Mith, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c.,

DURSUANT to the provisions of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby absolutely prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of fresh fruit of every aescription from the Colony of Queensland, and of citrus trees from the Colony of New South Wales, and the introduction into any portion of Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude of apples, pears, and quinces, and of any fruit-plant, or part thereof, infested with the phylloxera, the San José or Pernicious scale, the Mining or Chionospis scale, the Wax scale, or with internal parasites, such as the larvæ of the fruit flies, nematodes, or bacterial diseases, with melanose fungus, or with any pests, parasites, or fungi, which may from time to time be declared by me by Order in Council: And I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do further prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of any plants or fruit whatsoever, except in accordance with the Regulations under the said Act.

AND I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby appoint the undermentioned ports to be quarantine grounds, where plants and fruit, and the packages containing the same or with which the same may have come in contact, may be detained for the purpose of being inspected, disinfected, destroyed, or otherwise disposed of:-

Albany, Bunbury, Busselton, Esperance, Fremantle, Geraldton, Hamelin,

PY virtue of the provisions of "The Quarantine Ordinance, 1868," I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Western

Australia and its Dependencies, do hereby adjudge and declare that it is probable that an infectious disease, known as the Bubonic Plague, and dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought into Western Australia by vessels coming from or having touched at any ports in the Empire of China, and also at the ports of Bombay, Madras, or Calcutta in the Empire of India.

Drawback Regulations.

Under the provisions of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1892

(55 Vict., No. 31, Sections 217, etc.)

Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, the 18th day of January, 1899.

HEREAS by Section 217 of the above Act the Governor may by order from time to time specify the articles on which a Drawback of Duty paid on importations into Western Australia may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed, and may also make Regulations for prescribing the conditions for carrying out the purposes of this part of the said Act: Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby approve of the following Regulations and Schedules annexed.

Drawback Regulations.

- 1. A drawback of duty paid on importation into Western Australia may be allowed on the exportation therefrom of any goods except those mentioned in Schedule 3, and at the rate upon which duty was paid on the original importation; provided that in no case the amount of drawback shall exceed the amount of duty paid on importation.
- 2. In order to enable the exporter to claim any such drawback, he shall comply with the following conditions:
 - (a) A notice in writing, in the form prescribed in Schedule 1, must be given to the Collector of Customs at the port of export at least two working hours before the intention to prepare.

(b) The usual export entry for drawback must be passed, and security given by bond prior to shipment of the goods, accompanied by the original invoice duly stamped, on which duty was paid on importation, distinguishing—

> Goods liable to ad valorem duty, specifying the rate, goods liable to fixed duty, specifying the rate and setting forth legibly, in respect to each class of articles, the quantities, weights, and values on which duty has been paid, and general description of same. The entry as required by the Collector having been passed, and the original invoice duly stamped with the Customs stamp, together with the notice, must be presented to the proper officer of Customs, before whom the following declaration must be made and subscribed by the exporter or his duly authorised representative, and in case such goods shall be exported by a firm, by its duly authorised representative or by a member of such firm :-

DECLARATION ON EXPORT WARRANT.

I, , do hereby declare that I am the Exporter (or I am the duly authorised representative of the Exporter, or I am a member of the firm of the Exporters) of the goods mentioned in this entry, that the quantities, values, or weights (as the case may be) and general description of the goods and rates of duty paid thereon are correct. I further declare that the said goods were properly cleared at the Customs, and duty paid on importation thereof at the rates specified in this entry, and that none of the said goods are the produce of or were manufactured in Western Australia, and that no Drawback or Rebate on account of damage, or for any other cause, has been claimed or paid on the said goods, and that the amount of Drawback claimed does not exceed the amount of duty paid.

(Signed) Exporter.

- (c) Every facility desired must be given to the officer to enable him to superintend the examination of the said goods, and to take a correct account according to the invoice thereof.
- (d) Upon the completion of the examination the goods must be secured to the satisfaction of the proper officer, and dispatched in charge of a carrier (duly licensed under the Customs laws) into the Customs export shed, or delivered to the officer in charge of exports, or, if not so forthwith removed, they must be deposited in some secure place, approved by the Collector of Customs, under the lock of the Crown until removal.
- (e) No claim for drawback will be entertained unless the debenture in the form prescribed in Schedule 2 be rendered duly completed, unless otherwise authorised by the Minister directing the Customs
- (f) Such proof shall be given to the Collector of Customs as may be required that full duty was paid on importation.

- (g) Words and expressions used in these Regulations and the Schedules thereto shall have the meaning assigned to them respectively in any Act relating to the Customs.
- (h) The exporter may, in writing, authorise any of his clerks in the following form to pass drawback entries, and make the required declarations on the same, provided such authority is previously lodged with and approved by the Collector of Customs:—

- 3. No drawback will be due or payable until the Collector of Customs at the port of export has received the drawback debenture duly completed, nor until such drawback debenture has been examined by the proper officer and certified as correct by him, nor until such drawback debenture has been approved by such Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorised by him.
- 4. Debentures may be paid as soon as may be practicable after a certificate of landing by the Collector of Customs at the port or place to which the goods have been shipped (unless shipped as "stores") is received by the Collector of Customs; but nothing contained in these Regulations shall be held to compel the Collector of Customs to pay over any claim for drawback which he may consider it inadvisable from any cause whatever to allow.
- 5. Exporters of goods for drawback shall pay to Her Majesty a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per hour, or any portion of an hour, during the time an officer is employed under the Regulations, and any other expense incurred as certified by the Collector of Customs, and no drawback shall be passed for payment until such expenses have been paid.
- 6. All claims for drawback must be made to the Collector of Customs, Fremantle, who will (if they are correct) pass them for payment at the Treasury, Perth.
- 7. No drawback of duty will be payable on any goods not exported in original packages as imported, or on any portion of such package, as the Collector of Customs may allow, which have not first been inspected by an officer of Customs, who will certify on the entry that such has been done, specifying whether the quantities, values, or weights (as the case may be) are correct, except on goods for "ships' stores," which may be exported in such quantities and under such conditions as the Collector shall allow.
- 8. Should the Collector of Customs desire it, any goods may be examined after having been passed by the Drawback Officer, and the unpacking and repacking of such goods shall be conducted by or at the expense of the exporter.

- No drawback of duty will be allowed on any goods which, by reason of damage or decay, have become of less value for home consumption than the value of drawback claimed, and all goods so damaged or decayed which may be entered for drawback shall be forfeited, as provided by Section 218 of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892.
- 10. The declaration on the drawback debenture shall be made before a Justice of the Peace, and any other declaration may be made before a Justice of the Peace or a duly authorised officer of Customs.
- 11. The hours of business for Drawback Officers are from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., except on Saturdays, when they cease at 1 p.m. Should exporters require an extension of time, an overtime application must be made to the Collector of Customs, on approval of which such extension will be allowed.

WHEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor, by Order in Council gazetted, may from time to time make such Regulations as he deems necessary for prescribing the manner in which diseased plants or fruit and infected packages shall be treated, cleansed, or destroyed, or otherwise disposed of; providing for the registration of all orchards, vineyard, nurseries; and prescribing the matter in respect whereof fees shall be payable under this Act; fixing the amount of such fees, the mode of the payment, and the recovery thereof: AND WHEREAS I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir GERARD SMITH, K.C.M.G., Governor, &c., &c., &c., deem it necessary that Regulations should be made for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following Regulations for the purposes aforesaid.

Orders regulating the Importation and Disinfection of Vine Cuttings Buds and Grapes.

- 1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall within forty-eight hours of the arrival of such vine cuttings at the first port or place of de-barkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or a Local Inspector appointed in that behalf. In the event of the consignee or his agent failing to deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall seize the said vine cuttings. If upon such seizure the said vine cuttings are found to be infected with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or vines or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said vine cuttings are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall dip the said vine cuttings as per Order 5 and hold the same to the order of the consignee or his agent for seven clear days from the time of disinfection.
- 2. The importation of vines with roots or of vines that have had their roots cut off is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited except as hereinafter provided and subject to those regulations which shall be strictly observed.
- 3. Grapes may be imported from South Australia subject to the regulations in force for the time being for the examination and disinfection of imported fruits.
- 4. Vine cuttings or buds may be imported from South Australia—provided that all such cuttings and buds shall be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed.
- 5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings and buds required by the preceding order shall be effected by dipping the same in a solution of one pound of Sulphide of Lime to twenty gallons of water the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings or buds shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in the Schedule hereunder.

- 6. After the vine cuttings have been dipped they shall if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen days for further disinfecting or if found to be infected with injurious insects which cannot in the opinion of the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be destroyed by the treatment required by Order No. 5 the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire.
- 7. Vine cuttings may be imported from any country or province other than South Australia provided that any person about to import such cuttings shall at the time of ordering the same furnish a duplicate of such order to the Secretary for Agriculture and provided also that such cuttings shall not be imported for at least one month after the duplicate of such order shall have been so furnished as aforesaid.
- 8. All vine cuttings so imported pursuant to the next preceding order shall be absolutely surrendered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the port of debarkation for the purpose of being quarantined as hereinafter provided.
- 9. All vine cuttings imported as aforesaid from any country or province other than South Australia shall be quarantined by the Department of Agriculture for a period of not less than 12 months nor longer than two years upon such grounds as from time to time shall be set apart by the said Department by advertising in the Government Gazette as quarantine stations. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings as aforesaid shall at the time of delivering the same to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of being quarantined pay to the Secretary for Agriculture a sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 cuttings so delivered and at the expiration of the period of quarantine shall upon taking delivery of his rooted vines pay the further sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 rooted vines so delivered to him.
- 10. Any vine cuttings imported from any country or province other than South Australia which shall in the opinion of the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be affected with insects fungi blight or other diseases injurious to grape vines or other trees or plants shall be destroyed under the direction of the said Inspector and the expense connected therewith shall be borne by and recoverable from the importer of such vine cuttings.
- 11. The Department of Agriculture shall not be liable for any loss resulting from the destruction of any cuttings under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs, or by reason of the infertility of any such cuttings while in or after leaving their custody or whilst under the control.

Orders regulating the Disinfection of Imported Trees Plants Cuttings (other than Vines) Grafts Buds Seeds Pits Scions and Fruits.

12. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings or buds) seeds pits or scions shall within fortyeight (48) hours after the arrival of any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the same to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and in the event of any such consignee or his agent failing to so deliver any such fruit fruit trees plants his agent failing to so deriver any stein fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions within forty-eight (48) hours as aforesaid the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall seize the same. If upon such seizure the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to vines or fruit trees or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall treat the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions as may be directed by the Secretary for Agriculture and hold same until applied for by the consignee or agent provided that if the same be not applied for within seven clear days from time of seizure the same may be destroyed.

- 13. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees or plants they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests or their eggs larvæ or pupæ.
- 14. All peach nectarine apricot plum prune almond and all trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots and all peach or other pits cuttings buds or scions raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.
- 15. The importation into any port in Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude of the fruits apples pears and quinces and of any fruit plant or part appears and dames and of any return part of part thereof infested with the phylloxera the San José or Pernicious scale the Mining or Chionospis scale the Wax scale or with internal parasites such as the larve of the fruit flies nematodes or bacterial diseases with melanose fungus or with any pests parasites or fungi which may from time to time be declared as such by the Governor in Council under Section three of the Insect Pests Amendment Act 1898 is absolutely prohibited.
- 16. The importation into any port in Western Australia of fresh fruits of every description from the Colony of Queensland and of citrus fruits from the Colony of New South Wales is absolutely prohibited.
- 17. Fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must before removal from the first port or place of debarkation be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and if found infested with any insect or or Local Inspector and it found infested with any insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases not specified in Order 15 known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees or to other trees shall be destroyed or otherwise treated as the Secretary for Agriculture may direct. After inspection and disinfection the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall issue a certificate after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit was packed has been disinfected as prescribed by Order 18 and on receipt of the fee for inspection and dis-infection prescribed in Schedule I. hereto.
- 18. Soil or compost in pots cases or packages and transportable material of any kind used for packing or surrounding fruit is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation or from being offered for sale gift distribution or transportation until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary for Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping the same and keeping it continually submerged for a period of not less than two (2) minutes in boiling water containing in solution not less than one pound (1lb.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.
- Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 18 before removal from the first port or place of debarkation.
- 20. Consignees must deliver within forty-eight (48) hours of arrival the fruit fruit trees packages and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection consignees or their agents must repack the fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material that have been disinfected and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.
- Any fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection and not disinfected within forty-eight (48) hours by reason of the default of the consigned to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacting may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local In-

Municipality of Norseman.

BY-LAWS.

For the regulation of the construction of Buildings in the Municipality of Norseman, under the provisions of "The Building Act. 1884," and the Building Act Amendment Acts, 1887 and 1895.

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

The several words mentioned in the second section of "The Building Act, 1884," shall, where used in these Bylaws, have the same construction as is provided for by such section, except that the words "Council," "Mayor," "Town Clerk," and "Surveyor" shall mean the Council, Mayor, Town Clerk, or Surveyor, respectively, of the Municipality of Norseman.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO BUILD.

2. Every person intending to commence to build, take down, alter, add to, or repair any building, or to do any act whereby any public street may be obstructed or rendered dangerous or inconvenient to persons passing over or near thereto, shall give three clear days' notice in writing to the Surveyor of his intention so to do, and shall deposit drawings and specifications of the proposed works. Such notice shall be delivered at the Municipal Offices, and shall contain particulars of the site and nature of such intended building, work, or other act. The Surveyor shall thereupon grant a license in the form "A" of the schedule hereto, and shall also give such directions as he shall think fit for the erection of hoardings or fences, and a platform and handrail for the protection of passengers; and such directions shall be complied with to the satisfaction of the Surveyor before the commencement of such building, work, or act. Every breach of this By-law shall subject the person guilty of such breach to a penalty of £5, and a further penalty of £1 for each day the same continues, recoverable in a summary manner before Justices.

Notice of Intention to use area in Public Street, etc., for Deposit of Materials.

3. Every person wishing to deposit any stones, bricks, lime, rubbish, timber, iron, or other materials, on any public street, or to make any excavation on any land abutting on, or adjoining or contiguous to any public street, shall first make application for, and obtain from the Surveyor, a license so to do. Such license shall be given in the form "A" in the schedule hereto. Having paid the fees and the deposit stated in the said form, he may then occupy the site, subject to the conditions stated in such license. Any infringement of this By-law shall subject the person guilty of such infringement to a fine of £5 for every day such infringement continues, to be recovered in a summary manner before Justices.

HOARDINGS TO BE KEPT IN REPAIR.

4. Every person who shall be required to erect any hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail under the two last preceding By-laws shall keep the same in good and sufficient repair, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, so long as it shall, in his opinion, be necessary for the public safety; and every such person shall, immediately on receipt of notice from the Surveyor that such hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail is out of repair, and requiring him to repair same, forthwith repair the same to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, and shall be liable to a penalty of £I for every day the same shall continue in disrepair after the receipt by him of such notice.

Hoardings, etc., to be Lighted.

5. Every person erecting such hoarding, fence, platform, or handrail, or obstruction of any kind in the public street, shall cause the same to be well and sufficiently lighted at night, and shall be liable to a penalty of £1 for every night on which the same is not so lighted.

Power to Surveyor to Enforce preceding By-laws.

6. It shall be lawful for the Surveyor, without reference to the Council, to take immediate steps to enforce any of the preceding By-laws, and he may cause any such hoarding or other obstruction that has been erected without his license, or which has been erected or continued in breach of the conditions of any such license, to be removed, or any such excavation to be filled in, or injuries to the public street repaired at the cost and expense of the person erecting or making the same, and such costs and expenses shall be recoverable from the person so making the same, as well as the penalties hereinbefore imposed.

MATERIALS OF PARTY WALLS.

7. Party walls in reference to the component materials thereof: Every part of such party wall must be built of sound bricks or stone, or artificial stone, or of such bricks or stone or artificial stone together laid in, and with mortar or cement, and in such manner as to produce solid work; and as to the woodwork which it may be desired to connect with the party walls of any building, the bearing ends of wooden beams, brestsummers, girders, trimming joists, and the ends of partitions, heads and sills, and the bearing ends of the main timbers of any roof and wood bricks may be laid into the substance of a party wall; but no such beam, brestsummer, girder, joist, partition, head or sill, nor any part of a roof being wood, nor any wood bricks, must be laid or placed within 2in. of the centre of any party walls and no other woodwork of any kind must be laid into, placed upon, or be run or driven into any part of the substance of any party wall. But if the ends of timber be carried in iron shoes or stone corbels, then such iron shoe; or stone corbels must be built into the wall at least one-half the thickness of such wall; and the top of every party

wall must be finished with one course of sound, hard bricks, set on edge in good mortar or cement, or by a coping of any other properly secured and sufficiently waterproof and fireproof covering.

Roofs to Buildings.

8. With regard to the roof, flat, and gutter of any building, and of any projection therefrom, and also balconies, verandahs, and shop fronts: They must be so arranged and constructed, and so supplied with gutters and pipes as to prevent the water therefrom dripping on to or running over any public way, and all such rain pipes, eaves, and gutters are to be made of metal.

COVERING FOOTPATHS, ETC.

9. In the case of any building being erected abutting on the footpath of a public street, or of any plastering operations being intended to be performed above the first story of any building, the builder or other persons having charge of such building or the plasterer shall, before proceeding to build further than the first story of such building so being erected, or with any plastering as aforesaid, give notice thereof, in writing, to the Surveyor, who shall thereupon give directions to such builder, person, or plasterer, for the covering of such footpath as he shall think fit, and any builder, person, or plasterer who shall fail to give such notice or shall proceed with such building or plastering without having complied in all respects with the directions of the Surveyor, or without keeping such covering or other erection directed by him in an efficient state of repair to the satisfaction of such Surveyor, shall incur a penalty of £5 for each day in which such default shall occur or continue.

ROOMS IN REGARD TO HEIGHT.

10. With regard to rooms in other parts of the building, in reference to the height thereof: Every room used, or intended to be used, for the purposes of habitation must be at the least the height of nine feet from floor to ceiling.

VENTILATION OF ROOMS.

11. Every room used for the purpose of habitation, or for the assemblage of people for any purpose whatever, shall be well and properly ventilated to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

Verandars.

12. Awnings or verandahs to be erected over footpaths are to be in accordance with drawings and specifications approved of by the Surveyor, and accordingly adopted by the Council. The minimum height to be Sft.; the verandah to be painted and kept in repair to the satisfaction of the Surveyor, who shall have power to order such repairs to the verandahs generally as he may deem necessary. In the event of neglect, or of the Surveyor observing the necessity for removal or repair, it must be commenced within seven days from the receipt of notice from the Surveyor, and must be completed within fourteen days from such notice, or otherwise the verandahs will be removed as nuisances, the cost of such removal to be borne by the owner or occupier, and to be recoverable from him in a summary manner before Justices.

FACTORY CHIMNEYS.

13. As to the chimney shaft for the boiler furnace of any steam engine, or for any brewery, distillery, or manufactory, such shaft may be erected of any height, so that it be built in such manner and of such strength and dimensions as shall be satisfactory to the Surveyor, upon special application in each case.

Notice to remove Dangerous Buildings.

14. Where any building shall, in the opinion of the Surveyor, be ruinous or dangerous, under the meaning of Clause 16 of "The Building Act, 1884," the Surveyor shall give notice to the owner thereof to remove or renovate the same, and every such owner shall forthwith comply with such order under a penalty of £10.

TEMPORARY BUILDINGS.

15. With regard to the granting of permission for the erection of temporary buildings, special permission may be granted by the Council, for a period to be stated, for the erection of temporary buildings for special purposes, all the walls of which may be wood or iron; subject to whatever conditions the Council may lay down in each individual case.

Power to Surveyor to enter and remove.

16. And generally, where anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention to these By-laws, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor, at his discretion, to enter on the premises and to remove, or cause to be removed, any building or other thing which has been erected in contravention thereof, or to do or cause to be done, any act or

thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the costs of so doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person, in addition to any penalty to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these By-laws.

Sanitary.—Before commencing to build, a privy shall be erected for the use of the workmen, and all the requirements of the sanitary authorities strictly complied with.

Reinstatement.—At the expiration of the period for which this license is granted, or sooner if possible, the hoarding shall be cleared away, and the footpath, kerbing, channelling, and readway made good to the satisfaction of the Surveyor.

HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the Government Gazette, amongst other things—

- (1.) To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine.
- (2.) To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease.

And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds, and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations.

Additional By-Laws of the Cottesloe Roads Board. Bathing.

- 1. The Board shall have power of authorising or sanctioning the erection of bathing-houses, sheds, or machines, and all rules and regulations appertaining to the same; and no bathing-house, shed, or machine shall be placed upon the sea-beach, unless the leave of the Board has first been obtained.
- 2. All bathers shall have the body clothed from the waist to the thighs with bathing trunks, except as otherwise provided.
- 3. No male over 12 years of age shall bathe between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. on that portion of the sea-beach situate between a point opposite the termination of the Northern side of Gibney Street on the South and a point opposite the termination of the Southern side of Napier Street on the North, except he be clothed in a dress made of serge, flannel, or flannelette, extending from the shoulders to the knees. Bathers outside these limits shall be clothed as before provided. Any person or persons contravening any of the provisions of this By-law shall forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding £5.
- 4. Any person wilfully exposing himself when undressing for the purpose of bathing, or before dressing after having bathed, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
- 5. It shall be lawful for any police officer, member or officer of the Board, without warrant, to arrest or summon any person offending against either of the three lastmentioned By-laws, and to bring him before any Justice of the Peace to be dealt with according to law.

THE K attention of Hotel and Boarding-house Keepers is directed to the following clause of the Post and Telegraph Act, which imposes a penalty upon such persons for the retention of unclaimed Postal Letters (which letters may have been delivered to their respective houses, in accordance with addresses thereon), for any period exceeding As it is reported that a large number of such letters are still lying unclaimed in the racks of the various hotels, etc., the proprietors are hereby warned that non-compliance with this section will subject them to the penalty referred to:

57 Victoria, No. 5, Section 31.

- (1.) Telegrams, letters, packets, newspapers, and parcels sent by post and addressed to a person at a house licensed under "The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Act, 1880," or any Act amending or in substitution for that Act, or at a house where lodgers are received, and which have been received by the owner, occupier, or manager of such a house within two months immediately preceding the commence-ment of this Act, or at any time thereafter, shall be deemed to be under the control of the Postmaster General until delivered to the person to whom the same are addressed.
- (2.) If the same are not so delivered within two months after the receipt thereof by the owner, occupier, or manager, and if instructions to the contrary are not received from the person to whom the same are addressed, they shall be returned to the nearest Post Office, and thence transmitted to the General Post Office.
- (3.) Any owner, occupier, or manager of any such house who wilfully neglects or omits to return a letter, telegram, parcel, packet, or newspaper aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
