By His Excellency Lieut.-Colonel Sir GEBARD SMITH, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

**DURSUANT** to the provisions of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby absolutely prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of fresh fruit of every description from the Colony of Queensland, and of citrus trees from the Colony of New South Wales, and the introduction into any portion of Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude of apples, pears, and quinces, and of any fruit-plant, or part thereof, infested with the phylloxera, the San José or Pernicious scale, the Mining or Chionospis scale, the Wax scale, or with internal parasites, such as the larvæ of the fruit flies, nematodes, or bacterial diseases, with melanose fungus, or with any pests, parasites, or fungi, which may from time to time be declared by me by Order in Council: And I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do further prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of any plants or fruit whatsoever, except in accordance with the Regulations under the said Act.

AND I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby appoint the undermentioned ports to be quarantine grounds, where plants and fruit, and the packages containing the same or with which the same may have come in contact, may be detained for the purpose of being inspected, disinfected, destroyed, or otherwise disposed of :-

and declare that it is probable that an infectious disease, known as the Bubonic Plague, and dangerous to the health of Her Majesty's subjects, may be brought into Western Australia by vessels coming from or having touched at any ports in the Empire of China, and also at the ports of Bombay, Madras, or Calcutta in the Empire of India.

### The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898.

13853Order in Council.

At the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 25th day of January, 1899.

Present:

His Excellency the Governor. The Honourables-The Commissioner of Railways, The Minister for Lands, The Attorney General, The Colonial Secretary.

W HEREAS by "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," the Governor, by Order in Council gazetted, may from time to time make such Regulations as he deems necessary for prescribing the manner in which diseased plants or fruit and infected packages shall be treated, cleansed, or destroyed, or otherwise disposed of; providing for the registration of all orchards, vineyard, nurseries; and prescribing the matter in respect whereof fees shall be payable under this Act; fixing the amount of such fees, the mode of the payment, and the recovery thereof: AND WHEREAS I, Lieut.-Colonel Sir Gerard Smith, K.C.M.G., Governor, &c., &c., &c., deem it necessary that Regulations should be made for the purposes of

the said Act: Now THEREFORE I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following Regulations for the purposes aforesaid.

### Orders regulating the Importation and Disinfection of Vine Cuttings Buds and Grapes.

1. All consignees agents or other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of vine cuttings to the Colony of Western Australia shall within forty-eight hours of the arrival of such vine cuttings at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or a Local Inspector appointed in that behalf. In the event of the consignee or his agent failing to deliver the said vine cuttings to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector within the prescribed time the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall seize the said vine cuttings. If upon such seizure the said vine cuttings are found to be infected with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or vines or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said vine cuttings are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or ther trees or plants the said Inspector shall dip the said vine cuttings as per Order 5 and hold the same to the order of the consignee or his agent for seven clear days from the time of disinfection.

2. The importation of vines with roots or of vines that have had their roots cut off is absolutely prohibited. The importation of grapes vine cuttings and buds is also prohibited except as hereinafter provided and subject to those regulations which shall be strictly observed.

3. Grapes may be imported from South Australia subject to the regulations in force for the time being for the examination and disinfection of imported fruits.

4. Vine cuttings or buds may be imported from South Australia—provided that all such cuttings and buds shall be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be landed.

5. The disinfecting of vine cuttings and buds required by the preceding order shall be effected by dipping the same in a solution of one pound of Sulphide of Lime to twenty gallons of water the cuttings to be immersed for ten (10) minutes. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings or buds shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in the Schedule hereunder.

6. After the vine cuttings have been dipped they shall if deemed necessary by the said Chief Inspector or the Local Inspector remain in quarantine for a further period of fourteen days for further disinfecting or if found to be infected with injurious insects which cannot in the opinion of the said Chief Inspecter or Local Inspector be destroyed by the treatment required by Order No. 5 the said vine cuttings shall be destroyed by fire.

7. Vine cuttings may be imported from any country or province other than South Australia provided that any person about to import such cuttings shall at the time of ordering the same furnish a duplicate of such order to the Secretary for Agriculture and provided also that such cuttings shall not be imported for at least one month after the duplicate of such order shall have been so furnished as aforesaid.

8. All vine cuttings so imported pursuant to the next preceding order shall be absolutely surrendered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector at the port of debarkation for the purpose of being quarantined as hereinafter provided.

9. All vine cuttings imported as aforesaid from any country or province other than South Australia shall be quarantined by the Department of Agriculture for a period of not less than 12 months nor longer than two years upon such grounds as from time to time shall be set apart by the said Department by advertising in the *Government Gazette* as quarantine stations. The consignee agent or other person engaged or concerned in the importation of any such vine cuttings as aforesaid shall at the time of delivering the same to the Department of Agriculture for the purpose of being quarantined pay to the Secretary for Agriculture a sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 cuttings so delivered and at the expiration of the period of quarantine shall upon taking delivery of his rooted vines pay the further sum of 2s. 6d. for every 100 rooted vines so delivered to him.

10. Any vine cuttings imported from any country or province other than South Australia which shall in the opinion of the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector be affected with insects fungi blight or other diseases injurious to grape vines or other trees or plants shall be destroyed under the direction of the said Inspector and the expense connected therewith shall be borne by and recoverable from the importer of such vine cuttings.

11. The Department of Agriculture shall not be liable for any loss resulting from the destruction of any cuttings under the provisions of the preceding paragraphs, or by reason of the infertility of any such cuttings while in or after leaving their custody or whilst under the control.

### Orders regulating the Disinfection of Imported Trees Plants Cuttings (other than Vines) Grafts Buds Seeds Pits Scions and Fruits.

All consignees agents or other persons engaged or 12.concerned in the importation into Western Australia of any fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings or buds) seeds pits or scions shall within forty-eight (48) hours after the arrival of any such fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions at the first port or place of debarkation in the Colony of Western Australia deliver the same to the said Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and in the event of any such consignee or his agent failing to so deliver any such fruit fruit trees plants hours as aforesaid the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector shall seize the same. If upon such seizure the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with any injurious insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to vines or fruit trees or to other trees or plants the said Inspector shall immediately destroy the same by fire but if the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions are found on inspection to be free from injurious insects (or their germs) or from fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit fruit trees vines or other trees or plants the said Inspector shall treat the said fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions as may be directed by the Secretary for Agriculture and hold same until applied for by the consignee or agent provided that if the same be not applied for within seven clear days from time of seizure the same may be destroyed.

13. All trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions imported into the Colony of Western Australia are hereby required to be disinfected by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector immediately upon arrival at the port or place where they are to be unloaded. If any of the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are found to be infested with insects (or their germs) or with fungi blight or other diseases injurious to fruit or to fruit trees or to other trees or plants they shall remain in quarantine for a period of fourteen (14) days or until the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector can determine whether the said trees plants cuttings grafts buds seeds pits or scions are free from injurious insect pests or their eggs lavvæ or pupæ.

14. All peach nectarine apricot plum prune almond and all trees budded or grafted upon peach stocks or roots and all peach or other pits cuttings buds or scions raised or grown in any place where the "peach yellow" or the "peach rosette" are known to exist are hereby prohibited from being imported into the Colony of Western Australia.

15. The importation into any port in Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude of the fruits apples pears and quinces and of any fruit plant or part thereof infested with the phylloxera the San José or Pernicious scale the Mining or Chionospis scale the Wax scale or with internal parasites such as the larvæ of the fruit flies nematodes or bacterial diseases with melanose fungus or with any pests parasites or fungi which may from time to time be declared as such by the Governor in Council under Section three of the Insect Pests Amendment Act 1898 is absolutely prohibited. 16. The importation into any port in Western Australia of fresh fruits of every description from the Colony of Queensland and of citrus fruits from the Colony of New South Wales is absolutely prohibited.

17. Fruit fruit trees plants cuttings buds seeds pits or scions of any kind (not otherwise prohibited) not grown in Western Australia must before removal from the first port or place of debarkation be examined by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and if found infested with any insect or insects (or their germs) or with any fungi blight or other diseases not specified in Order 15 known to be injurious to fruit or fruit trees or to other trees shall be destroyed or otherwise treated as the Secretary for Agriculture may direct. After inspector shall issue a certificate after the cases or packing or transportable material in which such fruit was packed has been disinfected as prescribed by Order 18 and on receipt of the fee for inspection and disinfection prescribed in Schedule I. hereto.

18. Soil or compost in pots cases or packages and transportable material of any kind used for packing or surrounding fruit is hereby prohibited from being removed from the first port or place of debarkation or from being offered for sale gift distribution or transportation until the said material (unless otherwise directed by the Secretary for Agriculture) has been disinfected by dipping the same and keeping it continually submerged for a period of not less than two (2) minutes in boiling water containing in solution not less than one pound (11b.) of concentrated potash to each and every ten (10) gallons of water.

19. Fruit cases containing vegetables or vegetable matter other than fruit imported into the Colony are also hereby required to be disinfected as per Order 18 before removal from the first port or place of debarkation.

20. Consignees must deliver within forty-eight (48) hours of arrival the fruit fruit trees packages and transportable material requiring disinfection to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector and unpack and prepare them for disinfection. After disinfection consignees or their agents must repack the fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material that have been disinfected and remove the same within twenty-four (24) hours.

21. Any fruit fruit trees vine cuttings packages or transportable material delivered to the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector for disinfection and not disinfected within fortyeight (48) hours by reason of the default of the consignee to provide the necessary labour for unpacking and repacking may be destroyed by the Chief Inspector or Local Inspector.

22. Agents and other persons engaged or concerned in the importation of fruits and of fruit trees plants cuttings buds (other than vine cuttings) or buds seeds pits and scions shall pay for the inspection and disinfection thereof the fees set out in Schedules I. and II. respectively :---

### Registration of Orchards Vineyards and Nurseries.

23. The owner or occupier or person in charge of any orchard garden nursery vinery vineyard or hot-house or any land used for the purpose of growing or cultivating any plants shall register the same with the Secretary for Agriculture at Perth in the form of the accompanying schedule and at the same time forward for registration fee the sum of 2s. 6d. for an area of one acre or under and the sum of 5s. for an area exceeding one acre.

Any person failing to comply with this order is liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 100$ ,

#### SCHEDULE.

### Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898.

Fee of ( ) herewith.

24. All packages sent away from any nursery containing fruit fruit trees vines or other vegetation intended for sale distribution or gift must be legibly marked with the name and address of the consignor and consignee and a descriptive invoice of the contents must accompany same together with a certificate to the effect that such contents have been disinfected as may be prescribed from time to time by the Secretary for Agriculture and are free from insects fungi blight and all other diseases attacking fruit fruit trees and other vegetation.

25. Any vendor of fruit grower dealer or auctioneer who shall sell or attempt to sell or offer or expose for sale any fruit fruit trees plants or other vegetation affected with the phylloxera the San José or Pernicious scale the Mining or Chionospis scale the Wax scale or with internal parasites such as the larvæ of the fruit flies or nematodes or bacterial diseases or melanose fungus or with any other diseases which may from time to time be declared as such by the Governor in Council shall be liable on conviction to the penalty not exceeding One hundred Pounds (£100) and an Inspector or other authorised person shall seize and destroy such infected fruit and the cost of such seizure and destruction shall be at the expense of and recoverable from the person selling or offering the said fruit for sale gift or distribution.

### Drawback Regulations.

Under the provisions of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1892 (55 Vict., No. 31, Sections 217, etc.)

W HEREAS by Section 217 of the above Act the Governor may by order from time to time specify the articles on which a Drawback of Duty paid on importations into Western Australia may be allowed on exportation therefrom, and the amount of drawback to be so allowed, and may also make Regulations for prescribing the conditions for carrying out the purposes of this part of the said Act: Now THEREFORE His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby approve of the following Regulations and Schedules annexed.

### Drawback Regulations.

1. A drawback of duty paid on importation into Western Australia may be allowed on the exportation therefrom of any goods except those mentioned in Schedule 3, and at the rate upon which duty was paid on the original importation; provided that in no case the amount of drawback shall exceed the amount of duty paid on importation.

2. In order to enable the exporter to claim any such drawback, he shall comply with the following conditions:—

- (a) A notice in writing, in the form prescribed in Schedule 1, must be given to the Collector of Customs at the port of export at least two working hours before the intention to prepare.
- (b) The usual export entry for drawback must be passed, and security given by bond prior to shipment of the goods, accompanied by the original invoice duly stamped, on which duty was paid or importation, distinguishing—
  - Goods liable to ad valorem duty. specifying the rate, goods liable to fixed duty, specifying the rate and setting forth legibly, in respect to each class of articles, the quantities, weights, and values on which duty has been paid, and general description of same. The entry as required by the Col-lector having been passed, and the original invoice duly stamped with the Customs stamp, together with the notice, must be presented to the proper officer of Customs, before whom the following declaration must. be made and subscribed by the exporter or his duly authorised representative, and in case such goods shall be exported by a firm, by its duly authorised representative or by a member of such firm :-

#### DECLARATION ON EXPORT WARRANT.

I, , , do hereby declare that I am the Exporter (or I am the duly *authorised* representative of the Exporter, or I am a member of the firm of the Exporters) of the goods mentioned in this entry, that the quantities, values, or weights (as the case may be) and general description of the goods and rates of duty paid thereon are correct. I further declare that the said goods were properly cleared at the Customs, and duty paid on importation thereof at the rates specified in this entry, and that none of the said goods are the produce of or were manufactured in Western Australia, and that no Drawback or Rebate on account of damage, or for any other cause, has been claimed or paid on the said goods, and that the amount of Drawback claimed does not exceed the amount of duty paid.

#### Exporter.

(c) Every facility desired must be given to the officer to enable him to superintend the examination of the said goods, and to take a correct account according to the invoice thereof.

- (d) Upon the completion of the examination the goods must be secured to the satisfaction of the proper officer, and dispatched in charge of a carrier (duly licensed under the Customs laws) into the Customs export shed, or delivered to the officer in charge of exports, or, if not so forthwith removed, they must be deposited in some secure place, approved by the Collector of Customs, under the lock of the Crown until removal.
- (e) No claim for drawback will be entertained unless the debenture in the form prescribed in Schedule 2 be rendered duly completed, unless otherwise authorised by the Minister directing the Customs.

- (f) Such proof shall be given to the Collector of Customs as may be required that full duty was paid on importation.
- (g) Words and expressions used in these Regulations and the Schedules thereto shall have the meaning assigned to them respectively in any Act relating to the Customs.
- (h) The exporter may, in writing, authorise any of his clerks in the following form to pass drawback entries, and make the required declarations on the same, provided such authority is previously lodged with and approved by the Collector of Customs:—

, the undersigned, carrying on business at , under the style of , do hereby authorise , whose signature appears in the margin, to act as representative, in compliance with the Drawback Regulations, to make the declaration to the entry.

3. No drawback will be due or payable until the Collector of Customs at the port of export has received the drawback debenture duly completed, nor until such drawback debenture has been examined by the proper officer and certified as correct by him, nor until such drawback debenture has been approved by such Collector of Customs or other officer duly authorised by him.

4. Debentures may be paid as soon as may be practicable after a certificate of landing by the Collector of Customs at the port or place to which the goods have been shipped (unless shipped as "stores") is received by the Collector of Customs; but nothing contained in these Regulations shall be held to compel the Collector of Customs to pay over any claim for drawback which he may consider it inadvisable from any cause whatever to allow.

5. Exporters of goods for drawback shall pay to Her Majesty a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per hour, or any portion of an hour, during the time an officer is employed under the Regulations, and any other expense incurred as certified by the Collector of Customs, and no drawback shall be passed for payment until such expenses have been paid.

6. All claims for drawback must be made to the Collector of Customs, Fremantle, who will (if they are correct) pass them for payment at the Treasury, Perth.

7. No drawback of duty will be payable on any goods not exported in original packages as imported, or on any portion of such package, as the Collector of Customs may allow, which have not first been inspected by an officer of Customs, who will certify on the entry that such has been done, specifying whether the quantities, values, or weights (as the case may be) are correct, except on goods for "ships' stores," which may be exported in such quantities and under such conditions as the Collector shall allow.

8. Should the Collector of Customs desire it, any goods may be examined after having been passed by the Drawback Officer, and the unpacking and repacking of such goods shall be conducted by or at the expense of the exporter.

No drawback of duty will be allowed on any 9 goods which, by reason of damage or decay, have become of less value for home consumption than the value of drawback claimed, and all goods so damaged or decayed which may be entered for drawback shall be forfeited, as provided by Section 218 of "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1892.'

10. The declaration on the drawback debenture shall be made before a Justice of the Peace, and any other declaration may be made before a Justice of the Peace or a duly authorised officer of Customs.

11. The hours of business for Drawback Officers are from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., except on Saturdays, when they cease at 1 p.m. Should exporters require an extension of time, an overtime application must be made to the Collector of Customs, on approval of which such extension will be allowed.

# Regulation for the Sale of Town and Suburban Lands.

1. Town and Suburban lands shall be sold subject to the conditions of sale set forth in the Schedule, and the purchase money shall be payable in the instalments therein stated.

#### SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Conditions of sale of Crown Lands advertised to be sold by auction at on the day of 189

1. The land offered for sale is particularised in the notice headed "Land Sales," published in the Government Gazette of the day of 189, and in the Schedule hereto, and will be sold subject to the terms and conditions of "The Land Act, 1898," and the Regulations thereunder.

2. The lots will be offered separately, and in the order in which they appear in the said notice.

3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise the lot in dispute shall be put up again and resold.

4. Each lot shall be offered at the upset price, and, if no advance be made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser at that price; but if any advance be made, the highest bidder shall be the purchaser as aforesaid. Biddings shall advance at the rate of not less than 10 per cent. on the upset price. Should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded in due course.

5. The purchaser shall, immediately after the sale, pay to the Minister for Lands or his agent a deposit in cash at the rate of 10 per cent. upon the total amount of the purchase money, unless he has already paid a sufficient deposit on application, and any such deposit shall be considered as payment of the purchase money so far as the same will extend.

6. The balance of purchase money, in the case of Town Lots, shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or his agent, by two equal instalments at the end of three and six calendar months from the day of sale, and in the case of Suburban Lots within twelve months from the day of sale, by four equal quarterly instalments, on the first days of January, April, July, and October, the first instalment being payable on the first day of the quarter next following the date of sale; the fees for Crown grant and registration in both cases being payable with the last instalment of purchase money.

7. In any case where the value of improvements on a lot is added to the upset price, as prescribed by Section 29 of "The Goldfields Act, 1895," and the lot is knocked down to any other than the owner of such improvements, the value of the same shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or his agent immediately after the sale.

8. Each Suburban Lot shall be fenced on the surveyed boundaries, within two years from the date of sale, with a substantial fence, not being a brush fence, proved to the satisfaction of the Minister for Lands to be sufficient to resist the trespass of great and small stock, including sheep but not including pigs or goats; and in default thereof the land shall be forfeited, together with all purchase money and fees which may have been paid : Provided that the Minister for Lands may, if he think fit, dispense with the division fences between two or more adjoining lots purchased by one person, or may, if he thinks fit, accept other substantial improvements in lieu of fencing.

9. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if, in the case of Suburban Lots, the required fencing is not completed within two years from the date of sale, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money and fees that may have been paid.

10. ### The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

### Regulations.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 15th December, 1898.

IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

### GEO. THROSSELL, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.

2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberley Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.

4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparently clean, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.

5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

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6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows:—

- (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
- (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
- (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
- (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the saltingfloor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

7. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding  $\pounds 500$ .

### Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.
- "Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats
- "Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

### The Roads Act, 1888.

### BY-LAWS OF THE YALGOO ROADS BOARD.

THE Yalgoo Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws, viz. :--

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1888", and the Amendment Act, 1889, the Board of this district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Acts mentioned : It is hereby resolved by the Yalgoo District Roads Board, by and with the approval of the Governor in Council, that the following By laws shall be in force in the said district of Yalgoo from the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

In the undermentioned By-laws the terms shall, unless otherwise indicated, bear the meaning as shown below :—

"District" shall mean Yalgoo Roads Board District.

"Board" shall mean Yalgoo Roads Board.

"Chairman" shall mean the member acting for the time being as Chairman.

"Member" shall mean any member of the Board.

"Secretary" shall mean Secretary of the Board.

"Supervisor" shall mean Supervisor of the Board.

"The Act" shall mean "The Roads Act, 1888," and amendments appertaining thereto.

"Road" or "Reserve" shall mean any road or reserve in the Yalgoo Roads Board District.

"Person" shall mean any person or persons or corporate body.

DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

To attend all Board and committee meetings and take minutes. To prepare reports of committees. To conduct all correspondence and give instructions to any other officer of the Board under instructions from the Board.

To answer all questions in connection with the Board's business and accounts, etc.

To see that the accounts of the Board are audited once a year, and to have balance sheets prepared yearly and inserted in the *Government Gazette*.

To prepare rate book and Roads Board electoral lists; also to arrange and attend the Revision Court and make necessary arrangements for same, and prepare papers and lists for elections.

To summon all members to Board or committee meetings.

The secretary shall keep cash book, ledger, cart licenses, and all other books of the Board, and keep vouchers and receipts, and all the inward correspondence of the Board; also a press copy of all outward correspondence of the Board, and shall keep the books posted up monthly for the Board's inspection.

He shall also prepare all contracts and specifications for work, submitting same for the Board's approval before they are signed, and shall also see all accounts sent into the Board are correct and charged up to their proper accounts in the ledger.

He shall pay into the W.A. Bank, Geraldton, to the Board's credit, at once, any sums exceeding £10 which he may have in hand, received from cart licenses, fines, etc., etc.

### DUTIES OF SUPERVISOR.

He shall examine all roads, bridges, wells, drains, reserves, etc., in the Board's district, and report on same to the Board, and shall visit any part of the district the Board may direct him to.

He shall also have control of all roads and contracts, and shall supervise works which are being carried on by the Board, and report at each meeting. He shall also measure up all work carried on by the Board and give a written report on such work when finished.

No money shall be paid by the Board until such work has been passed by the Supervisor as good and up to specification.

In the event of the Supervisor condemning any work and the contractors not being satisfied, the Board shall appoint two members of the Board to visit such work (together with the contractors and supervisor), and they shall report at the Board's next meeting.

#### BY-LAWS.

1. Meetings of the Board shall take place on the first and third Fridays in each month, at the office of the Board, Selwyn Street, Yalgoo, at 2 p.m.

2. Any three members of the Board shall form a quorum for the transaction of ordinary business.

3. A special meeting of the Board may be called on a requisition signed by three members of the Board, but the Chairman can call a special meeting when he deems it advisable.

4. At all meetings of the Board, should a quorum not be present, the secretary shall note down in the minute book the circumstance, and also the members present.

5. Minutes of special and ordinary meetings shall be read and confirmed at the next ordinary meeting of the Board.

6. Any member absenting himself from three consecutive meetings (ordinary) of the Board shall forfeit his seat, unless he shall give a satisfactory excuse, in writing, before the third time he is absent.

7. Any member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

8. The chairman with one member can authorise the expenditure of up to £5 in cases of urgency, but shall in every case report same at the next meeting of the Board.

9. The Board shall exercise their power to abate nuisances throughout their district, except where there exist Local Boards of Health.

10. No person or persons shall leave dead horses, cattle, pigs, sheep, goats, or any other animal within 100 yards of any road, well, track, or reserve under the Board's jurisdiction, and all such animals shall be burnt. Any person neglecting this Bv-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 40s. The Board shall have power to burn any such animal left dead in the bush that they may find in their district, charging same to the owner.

11. All carts, carriages, waggons, and other vehicles in this district shall be licensed by March 31st in each year (license fee 5s. per wheel per annum). Any person neglecting to take out the necessary license by the above date shall be liable to a fine not exceeding 40s. for such offence, in addition to the ordinary license.

12. Any person wilfully damaging any gate, fence, or other property of the Board shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £5, in addition to the cost of repairing the damage.

13. Any person polluting or otherwise damaging any well, creek, drain, or reserve under the Board's jurisdiction, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.

14. All tenders shall be accompanied by a deposit of 5 per cent. on total amount of contract, and also with the signature of two persons willing to become sureties for the due completion of work, the said deposit to be returned when the tender is accepted and the contract is signed. The Board may, however, keep the deposit as security for the fulfilment of the contract in the event of suitable sureties not being forthcoming.

15. Any person offending against these By-laws or against "The Roads Act, 1888," and Amendment, 1889, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding  $\pounds 20$ .

### Regulation under "The Fishery Act, 1889."

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 31st January, 1899.

HEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Govern*ment Gazette, amongst other things—

- 1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine."
- 2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease."
- "And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine, during a period of four calendar months in each and every year, commencing on the first day of March, in that portion of Peel's Inlet described hereunder:—

#### No. 3 Bank.

Bounded by lines starting from the South-East corner of Murray Location 5, and extending East-South-Easterly about 330 chains to the South-West corner of Bank No. 2, thence North to the North shore of Peel's Inlet, and along it Westerly to the East end of Creery Island, and along its South coast Westerly to its Southernmost point, and West to the starting point (as coloured red on plan on exhibit at Court House, Pinjarrah, and Post Office, Mandurah, respectively).

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than £20, and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

### From Telegraphic Reports.

#### REMARKS.

The most interesting meteorological feature of the month was the storm which passed right across the Continent, from the North-West coast to Adelaide. The North-West had been visited at the close of last month by a very severe storm, an account of which appeared in the "Notes" for December. During the first few days of January the heavy rain continued at a few coast stations, and isolated thunder storms, sometimes account puide by heavy downpours, were occasionally expreienced in the Tropics. The first indication of the above-mentioned disturbance, however, was given on the 12th, when the s.s. "Tangier" encountered a "willy-willy" somewhere off the North-West coast. Next morning a few places in the North-West recorded light to moderate rain, and the disturbance evidently travelled at once inland; for on Saturday, the 14th, remarkably heavy rain fell in the Marble Bar and Nullagine districts. It then seems to have passed across the desert, in a more or less South-Easterly direction, passing North of the Coolgardie Goldfields on the 16th, giving Mt. Margaret heavy rain in South Australia. On the morning of the 19th it had reached Cape Northumberland, and next day was in the neighbourhood of Trasmania.

The mean temperature at Perth was very slightly below the average for previous years. On the whole, the weather was tolerably pleasant for midsummer, except towards the latter end of the month, when it became hot and sultry with occasional thunderstorms.

As usual, the mean maximum day temperature shows a very rapid increase from the coast Eastwards—e.g., Rotnest 78'3, Fremantle 80'9, Observatory \$5'4, Gardens 87'4, and York 91'6. The inland localities, however, benefited at night, the mean minimum at York being 59'4, and at Rotnest 64'9. The hottest place in the Colony, especially during the day, seems, as usual, to be between the Murchison and the North-West coast, the maximum being 100'1 at Cossack, 1015 at Hamelin Pool, and 99'1 at Cue. Compared with these the corresponding figures on the South coast look outle refreshing, Cape Leeuwin being 73'4, Albany 73'3, and Breaksea 69'4; the highest temperature recorded during the month was only 50'6 at Cape Leeuwin and 76'0 at Breaksea Island.

If the same are not so delivered within two months after the receipt thereof by the owner, occupier, or manager, and if instructions to the contrary are not received from the person to whom the same are addressed, they shall be returned to the nearest Post Office, and thence transmitted to the General Post Office
- (3.) Any owner, occupier, or manager of any such house who wilfully neglects or omits to return a letter, telegram, parcel, packet, or newspaper aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).


