PURSUANT to the provisions of "The Insect Pests Amendment Act, 1898," I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby absolutely prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of fresh fruit of every description from the Colony of Queensland, and of citrus fruits from the Colony of New South Wales, and the introduction into any portion of Western Australia South of the 26th parallel of South latitude of apples, pears, and quinces, and of any fruit-plant, or part thereof, infested with the phylloxera, the San José or Pernicious scale, the Mining or Chionospis scale, the Wax scale, or with internal parasites, such as the larvæ of the fruit flies, nematodes, or bacterial diseases, with melanose fungus, or with any pests, parasites, or fungi, which may from time to time be declared by me by Order in Council: And I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do further prohibit the introduction into Western Australia of any plants or fruit whatsoever, except in accordance with the Regulations under the said Act.

AND I, the said Governor, with the advice aforesaid, do hereby appoint the undermentioned ports to be quarantine grounds, where plants and fruit, and the packages containing the same or with which the

same may have come in contact, may be detained for the purpose of being inspected, disinfected, destroyed, or otherwise disposed of:—

Amendment of the Boundaries of the Welling- ton and Blackwood Magisterial Districts.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of "The Magisterial Districts Act, 1886," the Governor is empowered to alter the boundaries of Magisterial Districts, either by separating part of a Magisterial District from and declaring that it shall no longer form part of such

Magisterial District, or by adding to a Magisterial District other land, whether theretofore included or not within the limits of a Magisterial District: NOW THEREFORE I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the tract of land containing twenty-seven and a-half square miles or thereabouts, and comprised within the following boundaries, namely:—

Bounded by a line starting from the intersection of the South boundary of the Minnipup townsite reserve with the West boundary of the Bunbury to Bridgetown railway line, bounded thence by the said boundary of railway line to its intersection with the South boundary of the Wellington Magisterial District; thence due West by the said boundary line about six and a-half miles; thence due North about five miles; thence due East about four and a-half miles to the starting point,

shall no longer form a part of the Wellington Magisterial District, but shall be added to and henceforth included in the Blackwood Magisterial District; and I do hereby alter the boundaries of the said Magisterial District accordingly.

Local Boards of Health By-Laws.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Local Boards of Health at Weeloona and Menzies.

By-Laws of the Weeloona Local Board of Health.

MADE in pursuance of the powers and authorities contained in "The Health Act, 1898."

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, words having the meaning assigned to them by "The Health Act, 1898," shall have the like meaning, with the following additions:—

"Weeloona" shall mean the townsite of Weeloona (sometimes spelt Wiluna), and all lands within four miles of such townsite.

"Board" shall mean the Local Board of Health and the persons hereafter from time to time elected as Chairman and Committee.

2. The Board shall meet for the transaction of general business the first Thursday in every month at 8 o'clock p.m. Special meetings may be called at any time deemed necessary by the Chairman, Secretary, or any two members of the Board, and four members shall form a quorum.

3. In the event of any member of the Board failing to attend three consecutive ordinary meetings without leave, the Board shall declare his seat vacant, and within a reasonable time submit to His Excellency the Governor in Council the name of a new member for approval.

4. All moneys belonging to the Board shall be placed to the credit of the Board with such bank as the Board may direct, and none shall be withdrawn therefrom except by cheque signed by the Chairman and countersigned by the Secretary or one other member of the Board to be appointed by the Board for that purpose, and no account shall be paid unless previously passed at a meeting of the Board.

5. The duties of the Secretary shall be to attend and take minutes of all meetings of the Board, keep accounts, and perform all the clerical work which may be necessary.

6. The duties of the Health Inspector (appointed by the Board) shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with "The Health Act, 1898," and to carry out its provisions under instructions from the Board; if necessary, to give his instructions and notices in writing to the occupiers or owners of houses as to the abatement or prevention of nuisances, or the removal of offensive matter or rubbish, and keep a record of all such instructions.

7. The owners or occupiers of all houses within the townsite boundary shall, within one calendar month after notice from the Inspector or Board to that effect, cleanse and fill up all existing cesspools on their premises, and in place thereof erect a separate closet for each house, to be constructed of either stone, bricks, bats, or wood and iron; such closets to be not less than 3ft. by 5ft. in the clear (inside measurement) and to be not less than 6ft. high in the lowest part; such closets to be provided with an approved pan or bucket. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.

8. No closet shall be erected or used within 20 feet of any dwelling-house, and in such position as the Inspector or Board shall appoint. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

9. All houses shall be kept and maintained in such sanitary condition as shall satisfy the Inspector or Board, and all orders or notices given by the Inspector or Board for the removal or abatement of any nuisances shall be complied with by the owner, occupier, or agent of the houses or premises in which the nuisance is located, within the time specified in such order or notice. Any person guilty of a breach of this By-law shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £2.

10. No nightsoil or other offensive matter shall be deposited except where and in such manner as the Inspector or Board shall direct, under a penalty not exceeding £10.

11. The occupier or owner of all houses or premises shall, upon notice given by the Inspector or Board to that effect, remove all rubbish, ashes, filth, manure, or dung collected, placed, or found in or about their premises within such time as may be specified in such notice.

12. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, empty bottles, tins, rubbish, or other offensive matter in or upon any street or road in the Board's District shall, upon conviction thereof, in addition to the cost of removing the same, be subject to a penalty not exceeding £2.

13. It shall not be lawful for any person to keep or breed any kind of living swine within the district, save and except at such place or places as may be appointed by the Board.

14. It shall be incumbent on the owners and managers of all gold mining leases and machinery areas within the Board's District to erect and maintain closets for the use of their employees, such closets to be provided with either pits or pans. In case pits are used, a pit at least 10ft. deep to be provided for every 20 men employed, and in case of pans, a pan for every 10 men; said pits or pans to be kept in a sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Board or their Inspector.

In case of any breach, non-observance, or non-performance of any of the foregoing By-laws (a penalty for the breach whereof is not hereinbefore specially provided for), the person or persons guilty of such breach, non-observance, or non-performance shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty of not more than £10.

Menzies Local Board of Health.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

BY-LAWS.

UNDER the authority and provisions of "The Health Act, 1898," the Menzies Local Board has ordered and directed that the following By-laws be made for carrying into execution the provisions of the above Act, to apply to and have operation within the whole of the district under the jurisdiction of the Local Board:—

BY-LAW No. 1.

INTERPRETATION.

In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the interpretation clauses of "The Health Act, 1898," shall apply; also, the word "refuse" shall mean and include dust, ashes, rags, straw, empty tins, empty bottles, broken glass, bones, house and trade refuse, waste-paper, and all rubbish of whatsoever kind.

BY-LAW No. 2.

CESSPOOLS TO BE FILLED UP.

All existing cesspools within the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Board shall be carefully cleansed and filled up with sand or earth and well rammed to the satisfaction of the Inspector, within a calendar month of notice to that effect being given to the owner or occupier.

BY-LAW No. 3.

RECEPTACLES FOR EXCREMENTITIOUS MATTER.

1. The double-sealed-pan system shall be adopted by the Board throughout the district, and no other shall be allowed.

- (a.) Pans shall be galvanised iron, cylindrical, 14in. deep and 13in. in diameter; they shall be interchangeable.
- (b.) Each closet shall be supplied with a pan, as above.
- (c.) The Local Board reserves the sole right to supply the pans, and may charge for same any sum not exceeding the cost price.

BY-LAW No. 4.

REMOVAL OF NIGHTSOIL.

1. The removal of nightsoil from all closets shall, unless otherwise determined by the Local Board, be carried out by the Local Board.

2. At least once a week, or so much more frequently as the Local Board may direct, the pans in use at all private residences or premises shall be removed and be replaced by clean pans properly disinfected.

3. The pans in use at all hotels, boarding-houses, restaurants, stores, offices, and public buildings shall be removed and replaced by clean ones, as above, as often as may be required by the Inspector, but not less than once a week.

4. The used pans shall be covered with a tight-fitting lid, and removed in a suitable cart to the sanitary dépôt, and then emptied and cleansed.

5. The nightsoil shall be buried in trenches, and covered over with earth, at least 12in. in depth.

BY-LAW No. 5.

FIXING THE CHARGE FOR THE REMOVAL OF NIGHTSOIL AND TRADE AND HOUSE REFUSE.

The Local Board may charge and recover such fees and charges as set out in the schedule below, in the manner as empowered by the Act.

BY-LAW No. 6.

SCAVENGERS AND NIGHTMEN TO BE LICENSED.

1. No person other than the Local Board's employes shall remove from any premises or place any sewage, soil, filth, dung, ashes, dust, rubbish, manure, nightsoil, or any other matter unless previously licensed by the Local Board.

2. The fee to be paid by licensed scavengers and nightmen shall be 10s. per annum, to be paid half-yearly in advance.

3. No licensed person shall ask, demand, or receive for the removal of any refuse matter, as set out above, more than is set out in the schedule of charges marked "A."

4. Licensed persons shall remove all refuse matter as often as required by the owner or occupier of any premises, or as may be required by the Inspector or these By-laws, and shall use every care and despatch and cleanliness in the performance of their duties; they shall at all times obey the lawful orders of the Inspector; they shall also provide suitable carts and baskets for the carrying out of their work; and they shall at all times behave with civility in the discharge of their duties.

5. The Inspector may cancel or suspend the license of any person who commits a breach of, or neglects or fails to observe these By-laws.

6. Every licensed person offending, by neglect or otherwise, against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a fine of not more than £5, nor less than 5s., for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 7.

REGULATING THE CARRIAGE OF MEAT, BREAD, AND FRUIT.

1. No person shall bring, or cause to be brought, or carried through any street or lane, in any cart or vehicle, any butcher's meat, bread, or fruit, unless such meat, bread, or fruit be protected from the sun and dust.

2. Every cart or other vehicle, and every construction or covering for carrying and protecting meat, bread, or fruit, shall be kept in a clean and healthy state.

BY-LAW No. 8.

REGULATING DAIRIES.

1. Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the Municipality shall register their names and addresses at the office of the Local Board, and shall pay a registration fee of 10s. annually.

2. Every dairyman or purveyor of milk shall keep his dairy, milk-store, or shop, and all milk vessels for holding milk for sale or human consumption, and every place used in connection therewith, in a thoroughly clean and healthy condition, and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 9.

REGULATING BAKERIES.

1. No person shall be at liberty to carry on any bakery, or bread or confectionery store, unless and until the premises have been examined and passed as suitable by the Inspector.

2. All bakeries and bread and confectionery stores shall be at all reasonable times open to the inspection of any of the officers of the Local Board; and all troughs, tanks, and all other utensils and appliances used in such premises shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition to the satisfaction of the Board's officers.

BY-LAW No. 10.

REGULATING THE REMOVAL OF PIGWASH.

1. No person shall remove any pigwash or other filthy matter, unless such pigwash or filthy matter be carried in water-tight barrels or tanks securely covered to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any offensive smell therefrom.

2. Every tank or barrel, and every receptacle used for the storage and reception of any pigwash or filthy matter, and every conveyance or vehicle used for the carriage or removal of any matter, as above, shall be kept in a clean and proper sanitary condition.

3. No pigwash or filthy matter shall be removed from any place or premises between the hours of 8 o'clock in the morning and 6 o'clock in the evening, except by permission of the Local Board.

BY-LAW No. 11.

REGULATING CONDENSING PLANTS AND THE SALE OF WATER.

1. All condensing plants, and all utensils and tanks used in connection therewith, shall be kept in a thoroughly clean condition; and all places used for the storage and sale of water shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of the officers of the Local Board.

2. No person shall sell any water of less measure than that set forth on the cart-note, and all tanks or other vessels used for the carting or storing water must be covered in to the satisfaction of the Inspector.

BY-LAW No. 12.

PREVENTING THE SALE OF DISEASED OR UNWHOLESOME FRUIT.

1. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any shop or place any fruit which is diseased or unwholesome; and any fruit, which in the opinion of any officer appointed by the Local Board, that may be stored in any premises or place, is diseased or unwholesome shall be destroyed; and all cases or packing material which surrounded such fruit shall also be destroyed forthwith, on receiving written notice to that effect from such officer.

BY-LAW No. 13.

REGULATING THE KEEPING OF CATTLE OR OTHER ANIMALS.

1. Every occupier or owner of a building wherein or whereon any horses, cattle, swine or other animal may be kept shall provide, in connection with such building or other premises a suitable receptacle for dung, soil, filth, or other offensive or noxious matter which may be produced from time to time in the keeping of such animals.

2. Such receptacle shall be constructed in such a manner and of such material, and shall be maintained in such a manner so as to prevent the escape of any of the contents thereof or any soakage therefrom.

3. The owner or occupier of such premises shall, at least once a week, remove or cause to be removed all dung or other offensive matter from such receptacle, and shall convey such dung or offensive matter to the rubbish depot, and there destroy same by fire.

4. No person shall turn loose so as to be at large, or permit to be at large, or be a nuisance to any person, any horse, cattle, camel, goat, dog, or any other animal belonging to him or under his charge, in any street, lane, reserve, or other public place within the Municipality.

BY-LAW No. 14.

REGULATING PIGGERIES.

1. No person shall be at liberty to keep any kind of living swine within the municipal boundary.

2. No person shall be at liberty to keep any kind of living swine in any part of the district under the control of the Local Board, unless and until such premises or places to be used as a piggery have been examined and approved by the Inspector and licensed by the Local Board.

3. A registration fee of £2 must be paid to the Local Board during the first week in January in each year for every such licensed premises.

BY-LAW No. 15.

REGULATING THE KEEPING OF INFLAMMABLE MATERIALS.

1. Except as to an amount not exceeding five pounds in weight, the keeping of powder, dynamite, or other explosives in or upon any premises not licensed for that purpose within the district is absolutely prohibited.

2. No person shall permit on any premises owned or occupied by him any accumulation of straw, paper, shavings, empty cases, or other inflammable material.

3. Any person who, after two hours' notice from the Inspector, shall neglect to remove such inflammable material shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, on conviction, shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding £10, and to a further penalty of £5 per day for each day during which such By-law shall not be complied with.

BY-LAW No. 16.

REGULATING POULTRY YARDS.

1. No person shall be at liberty to keep any premises as a poultry yard at a lesser distance than 25 feet from any dwelling.

2. Every poultry yard shall always be kept in a clean condition, and disinfected at least once a week with lime, ashes, or other suitable disinfectant.

BY-LAW No. 17.

REGULATING OFFENSIVE TRADES.

1. The owner or occupier of any place, building, or premises used for the purpose of carrying on any offensive or noxious trade, business, or manufactory, as set forth in Section 146 of the Act, whether established before or after the passing of the said Act, shall register the same at the office of the Local Board during the first week in January in each year, and shall pay to the Local Board an annual fee of £2 for each such trade, business, or manufactory.

2. Every premises or place so registered shall be kept in a clean and sanitary state, and shall be whitewashed as often as may be required by the Board or its officers.

BY-LAW No. 18.

REGULATING EARTH CLOSETS.

1. No person shall erect, within the district, any water closet, earth closet, privy, or urinal the walls of which are not of stone, wood, and iron, or brick, and every closet shall be equipped with the sealed pan adopted by the Board. The doors of every closet shall be so constructed as to be close fitting, and shall at all times be kept in a state of thorough repair. The trap-door shall be so constructed as to admit the pan, and shall be placed facing the right-of-way.

2. No closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected at a lesser distance than 20 feet from any business place or dwelling, unless with the express permission of the Board; every such closet, privy, or urinal shall be erected as near the right-of-ways as conveniently can be, and every such structure shall be ventilated to the satisfaction of the Board's officers.

3. The occupier of every house or premises, whether public or private, shall cause to be kept in every closet or privy belonging thereto a box containing either dry earth, sand, lime, sawdust, carbolic powder, or other disinfectant approved by the Board; and shall cause all nightsoil or other matter which may be deposited in such pan or receptacle in such closets or privies to be immediately deodorised or disinfected with a sufficient quantity of the disinfectant kept in such box.

BY-LAW No. 19.

REGULATING THE DEPOSIT OF RUBBISH.

1. The owner or occupier of every house or premises shall, on receipt of written notice from the Inspector, and within the time specified in such notice, provide such and so many receptacles or bins of the material and of the dimensions as may be required by the Inspector for the reception of refuse or other matter.

2. The owner or occupier of every premises, as above, shall regularly collect all refuse or rubbish from such premises and place the same in the receptacles, and he shall not permit or suffer such receptacle to overflow or become offensive.

3. Every receptacle, as aforesaid, shall be kept in such place as the Inspector may point out, and so as to be convenient for the discharge of the contents thereof.

4. Every owner or occupier of every house or premises to which a receptacle, as aforesaid, is attached or used shall cause the same to be emptied at least once a week, or as often as the Inspector may direct.

5. The owner or occupier of every premises, as above, shall, after notice from the Inspector, and within the time limited in such notice, replace by a new and approved receptacle any receptacle that the Inspector may deem worn out or unfit for use.

BY-LAW No. 20.

REGULATING THE REMOVAL OF OFFENSIVE MATTER.

Every person who shall convey any refuse, rubbish, manure, or any offensive matter, or receptacle emitting a stench through or along any street or lane, shall, previous to and during the whole time of such conveyance, cause such refuse, rubbish, manure, offensive matter, or receptacle to be covered with lime or suitable substance, or shall adopt such other precautions as respectively may be necessary to prevent the emission of noxious or offensive effluvia therefrom.

BY-LAW No. 21.

REGULATING THE DEPOSIT OF OFFENSIVE MATTER.

No person shall deposit or discharge any refuse matter, dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, dung, manure, or soil collected, placed, or found in or about any yard, house, stable, cow-house, pigsty, lane, street, or place whatsoever, or the carcass of any dead fowl or any dead animal in any place within the district, other than the place set apart by the Board for that purpose, and known as the "Rubbish Depot."

BY-LAW No. 22.

REGULATING THE DISPOSAL OF THE CARCASSES OF DEAD ANIMALS.

In the event of death or any accident necessitating the slaughter of any horse, cattle, sheep, or other animal, the carcass of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the Municipality or any mining camp, and there thoroughly burned and destroyed to the satisfaction of the Inspector, by the owner or person in charge of such animal, as the case may be.

BY-LAW No. 23.

REGULATING THE BURNING OF OFFAL AND OTHER OFFENSIVE MATTER.

No person shall burn any offal, rags, clippings, or parings of leather, or any offensive matter so that the same shall be offensive to any person or resident in the neighbourhood of such burning.

BY-LAW No. 24.

REGULATING THE REMOVAL OF SLOPS, ETC.

1. Any person who shall be so ordered by the Local Board or its officers shall provide and maintain proper water-tight vehicles or receptacles fitted with close-fitting lids or covers for the purpose of receiving or carting away any slops, suds used in any laundry or dwelling, house refuse, food, or other matter or substance which is likely to become offensive by reason of exposure.

2. All such vehicles or receptacles shall be kept in such convenient places so as to be readily removed as may be directed by the Inspector, and so as not to be a nuisance to any person, and shall be kept in a thoroughly sanitary state, and removed at least once a week, and cleaned and disinfected both inside and out.

BY-LAW No. 25.

REGULATING THE DEPOSIT OF OFFENSIVE LIQUID, ETC.

No foul or offensive water or other offensive liquid, and no garbage, sweepings, or other refuse matter or thing shall be pumped, emptied, swept, thrown, or otherwise discharged or deposited into or upon any street, lane, yard, vacant land or other place, whether public or private, other than the place as set out in By-law No. 21 of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 26.

PENALTIES.

Any person guilty of an offence against any of these By-laws not otherwise specially provided for shall be liable for every such offence, besides any costs or expenses that may be incurred in the taking of proceedings against such person, as well as any costs and expenses which may be incurred in remedying such default, as provided for in "The Health Act, 1898," or these By-laws, to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £10, and to a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5 for each day during which such offence shall be continued; and such penalty or penalties shall be recovered as provided for in the said Act.

BY-LAW No. 27.

RESTRICTING CONTRACTS.

1. No individual householder shall contract for the removal of nightsoil; and no individual householder shall contract for the removal of any other refuse or offensive matter whatever, except with the persons licensed by the Board and in accordance with these By-laws.

2. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such offence.

BY-LAW No. 28.

PROTECTING CATCHMENT AREAS.

No person shall deposit any offensive matter, or rubbish, or refuse of any kind in or near the watercourse of any reservoir, or catchment area, or open drain of any dam or reservoir of the water supply of the Municipality, under penalty not exceeding the sum of £10 for each such offence.

BY-LAW No. 29.

REGULATING PRIVATE HOSPITALS.

1. Every person keeping, or intending to keep, or open any private hospital within the district shall register the same at the office of the Local Board; and each applicant shall state the number of patients to be admitted, the number of nurses or assistants to be maintained, and the class or classes of disease or cases to be admitted for treatment at any such hospital; and the Board reserves the right to revoke or cancel any such license or registration.

2. The officers of the Local Board shall at all reasonable times have access to such hospitals, for the purpose of inspection as to drainage, good management, and sanitary regulations; and no such building shall be registered unless it be passed by the Board's officers as a fit and proper place to be used as a hospital.

3. Every person in charge of a private hospital shall keep a register of all cases admitted into and treated in any such hospital; and such register shall be produced for inspection at the request of any officer, inspector, or servant of the Local Board.

4. Any person in charge of any such hospital shall, at the request of the Officer of Health for the Board, provide for the isolation or removal of any patient suffering from scarlet fever, diphtheria, variola, varicella, puerperal fever, erysipelas, measles, or any other infectious or contagious disease.

5. In every hospital, as aforesaid, there shall be one nurse, whose qualifications shall be approved of by the Local Board, and one assistant to every 10 patients.

6. The fee for registration shall be 10s.

7. No person, after the confirmation and gazetting of this By-law, shall keep open, occupy, or conduct any hospital in contravention of this By-law, under penalty not exceeding the sum of £20, and to a further penalty not exceeding 20s. for each day during which such offence is continued by such person.

WHEREAS by Section six of "The Fishery Act, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, by Regulations to be published in the *Government Gazette*, amongst other things—

1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine."

2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease."

"And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:—"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine, during a period of four calendar months in each and every year, commencing on the first day of March, in that portion of Peel's Inlet described hereunder:—

No. 3 Bank.

Conditions of sale of Crown Lands advertised to be sold by auction at _____ on the _____ day of _____ 189 .

1. The land offered for sale is particularised in the notice headed "Land Sales," published in the *Government Gazette* of the _____ day of _____ 189 , and in the Schedule hereto, and will be sold subject to the terms and conditions of "The Land Act, 1898," and the Regulations thereunder.

2. The lots will be offered separately, and in the order in which they appear in the said notice.

3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise the lot in dispute shall be put up again and resold.

4. Each lot shall be offered at the upset price, and, if no advance be made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser at that price; but if any advance be made, the highest bidder shall be the purchaser as aforesaid. Biddings shall advance at the rate of not less than 10 per cent. on the upset price. Should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded in due course.

5. HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

GEO. THROSSELL,
Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.

2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberley Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.

4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparently clean, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.

5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows:—

- (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
- (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
- (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.
- (4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it.

The hides or skins shall remain on the salting-floor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

7. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £500.

Interpretation Clauses.

"East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.

"Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.

"Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.

"Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.

"Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats

"Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

THE attention of Hotel and Boarding-house Keepers is directed to the following clause of the Post and Telegraph Act, which imposes a penalty upon such persons for the retention of unclaimed Postal Letters (which letters may have been delivered to their respective houses, in accordance with addresses thereon), for any period exceeding two months. As it is reported that a large number of such letters are still lying unclaimed in the racks of the various hotels, etc., the proprietors are hereby warned that non-compliance with this section will subject them to the penalty referred to:—

57 Victoria, No. 5, Section 31.

- (1.) Telegrams, letters, packets, newspapers, and parcels sent by post and addressed to a person at a house licensed under "The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Act, 1880," or any Act amending or in substitution for that Act, or at a house where lodgers are received, and which have been received by the owner, occupier, or manager of such a house within two months immediately preceding the commencement of this Act, or at any time thereafter, shall be deemed to be under the control of the Postmaster General until delivered to the person to whom the same are addressed.
- (2.) If the same are not so delivered within two months after the receipt thereof by the owner, occupier, or manager, and if instructions to the contrary are not received from the person to whom the same are addressed, they shall be returned to the nearest Post Office, and thence transmitted to the General Post Office.
- (3.) Any owner, occupier, or manager of any such house who wilfully neglects or omits to return a letter, telegram, parcel, packet, or newspaper aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).
