Municipality of Norseman.

COPY OF BY-LAW REFERRED TO.

By-law for the regulation of Hawking within the Municipality of Norseman, under the provisions of "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895."

- 1. All persons hawking fruit, fish, meat, poultry, game, or vegetables within the bounds of the Municipality of Norseman shall be required to pay a license fee of £2 2s. per annum, payable in advance.
- 2. All persons committing a breach of this By-law shall be subject to a penalty of not exceeding £10, recoverable in a summary manner before justices.

The above By-law was passed and adopted at a meeting of the Norseman Municipal Council held on February 9th, 1899.

Municipality of Claremont.

BUILDING BY-LAWS.

Whereas by "The Building Act, 1884," the Acts amending the same, and "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," it is enacted that every Municipality shall have power at all times to make, repeal, alter, or amend By-laws for the several purposes specified in the said Acts, and may by such

By-laws inflict penalties not exceeding £20: AND WHEREAS on the 19th December, 1898 (minute 200) the Municipal Council of Claremont did enact a certain By-law in respect to Building Fees, and it is deemed expedient to repeal the same. Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Municipal Council of Claremont as follows.

By-law passed 19th December, 1898, relating to Building Fees is hereby repealed.

Interpretation.

- 1. In the construction of these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires, the several words mentioned in the 2nd section of "The Building Act, 1884," shall have the same meaning as is attached to such words by the said section:
 - a. The expression "building" shall mean any building or erection of whatsoever nature hereafter erected or wholly or substantially erected.
 - b. The expression "level of ground" means the mean level of the ground as determined by the Surveyor.
 - c. The expression "foundation" applied to a wall having footings means the solid ground or artificially formed support on which the footings of the wall rest, but in the case of a wall carried by a bressummer means such bressummer.
 - d. The expression "ground storey" means the storey of a building to which there is an entrance from the outside on or near the level of the ground, and where there are two such storeys then the lower of the two.

Provided that no storey of which the upper surface of the floor is more than four (4) feet below the level of the adjoining pavement shall be deemed to be the ground storey.

- e. The expression "basement storey" means any storey of a building which is under the ground storey.
- 7. The expression "first storey" means that storey of a building which is next above the ground storey, the successive storeys above the first storey being the second storey, the third storey, and so on to the topmost storey.
- g. The expression "external wall" means an outer wall, or vertical enclosure of any building not being a party wall.
- h. The expression "party wall" shall apply to every wall used or built as a separation of any building from any other building, such buildings being occupied by different persons.
- occupied by different persons.

 i. The expression "floor area" applied to a building means the superficies of a horizontal section thereof, made at the point of its greatest surface, inclusive of the external walls, and of such portions of the party walls as belong to the building, and of all verandah and balcony floors, covered ways, and light courts.
- j. The expression "square" applied to the measurement of the area of a building means the space of 100 superficial feet.
- k. The expression "human occupation" applied to a room means a room in which some person passes the night or which is used as a living room, including a room with respect to which there is a probable presumption (until the contrary is shown) that some person passes the night therein, or that it is used as a living room.

THE BUILDING ACT, 1884, AND AMENDMENTS.

BY-LAW No. 1.

LICENSE FEES (SECS. 5 AND 6).

1. No person shall erect hoarding or fence, or deposit any materials on the street or pavement, without first obtaining a license from the Town Surveyor. The fees to be paid for such license shall be Five shillings per month or any part of a month.

Any person offending against this By-law shall incur a penalty not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

2. Every person intending to erect any building, or alter, add to, or repair any building within the Municipality of Claremout shall, three days before commencing to erect, alter, or add to the same, make application in the form of Schedule 1 to these By-laws, and deposit with the Surveyor,

for his approval, and leave in his custody, a copy of the drawings showing the plan, elevation, and sections of such proposed building, addition, or alteration, together with full and complete specifications of the work proposed to be done, and together also with the plan of the locality showing the position of such building, and no person shall commence to erect, alter, or add to any such building until the Surveyor shall have signified his approval of such plans and specifications by the issue to such person of a certificate of such approval, to be called a building license.

- a. All drawings, including plans, sections and elevations, must be on drawing paper or tracing linen of sufficient size to permit of the approval of the Surveyor being endorsed thereon;
- b. The scale to which drawings are made must be shown thereon, and also expressed in words.

 The North point must be indicated on all plans, and the thickness of the walls figured in inches.
- c. On the locality plan the site must be coloured pink, the proposed building red, existing buildings grey, and any land to be dedicated and left open for the use of the public blue. The intended lines of drainage must also be shown, and the intended size, depth, and outfall of each drain, and the details of the arrangement proposed to be adopted for the ventilation of the drain;
- d. All plans, drawings, and specifications must be signed by the building owner or his duly authorised agent.
- 3. The walls of all buildings shall be constructed in the manner and of not less than the thickness prescribed in the following Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

THICKNESS OF WALLS.

That in all buildings erected after passing these By-laws, intended for human occupation, the thickness of the walls shall not be less than the following:—

For one storey work (stone) all ex- terior walls	14in.	thick
For one storey work (brick) not less than	9	,,
Partition walls, in stone, not less	7.0	,,
than Partition walls, in brick, not less	12	,,

Basement storey walls, for house of one storey	20	,,

The footings in all cases to be at least four inches thicker than the upper walls.

PARTY WALLS (SEC. 12).

4. All partitions between separate houses or other buildings erected or altered in future, whether such houses or other buildings shall belong to one or more owners, shall be of not less than 12in. stone or 9in. brickwork, and shall entirely separate the woodwork of the two roofs at least 3 inches; the said party walls shall be carried up at least 9in. above iron, tile, or slate roof, and 15in. above shingled roof. Any person neglecting to comply with these provisions shall incur a penalty of not exceeding £20.

To regulate the construction of Water Closets or Earth Closets (Sec. 19).

5. Every house or other building shall have attached to it water closets or earth closets of the following construction: the size above floor to be not less than 4ft. x 5ft., and not less than 6ft. 6in. high on the lowest side; it must also have a stench pipe, at least 3in. in diameter, to lead from the seat through the roof 1ft. 6in. above the same. Any person violating any of these provisions shall incur a penalty of an amount not exceeding £5.

Walls, etc.

6. Every wall constructed of brick or stone, or other similar substance, shall be properly bonded and solidly put together with mortar or cement, and no part of such wall (except coping) shall overhang the general building line of any street, road, or footpath, and all return walls shall be properly bonded together.

BUILDING FEES.

7. There shall be paid to the Municipal Council, in respect of services under this Act, the amount specified in the following Schedule, viz.:—

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- 8. The above fees to be paid by the person applying for the license, on delivery of the same, and recoverable summarily before any two Justices of the Peace.
- 9. Signboards, signs, awnings, blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things shall not be placed over or near any footway or roadway within the Municipality without the written consent of the Council be first obtained therefor.
- 10. The Council may at any time order the securing, removing, or filling up of any cellar, ways, or openings which may now or hereafter be in or under any footway.
- 11. The Council may at any time order the removal, at the expense of the owner or occupier, of any verandahs or balconies which obstruct the footway or roadway or are dangerous, and all other obstructions to the footways or roadways, whether the same have before the commencement of these By-laws been or may hereafter be erected.
- 12. The Council may at any time order the painting, at the expense of the owner, of all lamp-posts, telegraph, telephone, and electric lighting poles on any public place, and the painting shall be done in such hours and in such manner as shall be prescribed by the Surveyor, and he may order the removal, at the expense of the owner, any poles or posts which in his opinion are bent, dangerous, unsightly, or not in use.
- 13. The Council may at any time prohibit the erection of, or order the removal, at the expense of the owner, of any fence which the Surveyor may consider to be dangerous, also of fences with barbed wire abutting on public places.
- 14. Iron spikes or other projections, broken glass, or barbed wire shall not be placed or fixed on any premises abutting upon a street.
- 15. And generally where anything shall have been done or omitted to be done in contravention to these By-laws, it shall be lawful for the Surveyor, under authority of the Mayor or Council, at his discretion, to enter on the premises, and to remove, or cause to be removed, any building or other thing which has been erected in contravention thereof, or to do, or cause to be done, any act or thing which should have been done in pursuance thereof, and the costs of so doing shall be borne and paid by such owner or other person, in addition to any penalty to which he may be liable in respect thereof under these By-laws.
- 16. Nothing in these By-laws shall prevent any contractors' or builders' temporary offices, sheds, and workshops from being erected of wood or iron on any building site during building operations, provided that special application be made to and permission be granted by the Surveyor.
- 17. Verandahs or balconies are not to be erected over any public footway within the limits of the Municipality of Claremont, unless the consent of the Surveyor, in writing, be first obtained, and such erections must be constructed and maintained in accordance with the specifications and conditions adopted by the Council.
- 18. No portion of any verandah or balcony over any road or pathway now or hereafter to be erected shall be enclosed, nor shall any alteration in the construction or design of any verandah or balcony be permitted without the consent of the Council be first had and obtained in writing.
- 19. Any person who contravenes or does not comply with any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

- 20. These By-laws shall apply to all properties abutting on the following streets:-
 - (a). The Perth-Fremantle Road (now Claremont Avenue) within the Council boundaries.
 - (b). Bay View Terrace, from Gugeri Road to Pensioner Terrace.
 - (c). Pensioner Terrace, from North-East corner of P 241 to the North-East corner of P 260.
- 21. No roof, or portion of any roof, covered with shingle or other inflammable material shall be covered with any other material unless the shingles or other inflammable material be first removed.

By-Laws of the Local Board of Health of the District of Coolgardie.

THE HEALTH ACT, 1898.

The Municipal Council of Coolgardie being the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, and by virtue of "The Health Act, 1898," and of every other authority enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes and publishes the following By-laws, viz. :-

Interpretation of Terms.

In the construction of the following By-laws-

- "Act" shall mean "The Health Act, 1898," and any Acts amending the same.
- "Municipality" shall mean within the limits of Coolgardie Municipality.

- "Occupier" shall mean every householder and the inhabitant occupier of any land, or if there is no habitant occupier of any land, or in there is no habitant occupier, the person entitled to the possession thereof, and shall include leaseholder, and also the person who is for the time being entitled to receive the rents and profits of the land or premises in connection with which the word is used, and whether on his own account or as the agent or trustee for any other person, or who would be entitled to receive the same if the land or premises were let at a rent.
- "Board" shall mean the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie.
- "Land" shall include besides land, all messuages, houses, buildings, and other structures erected thereon.
- "District" shall mean the area for the time being under the control of the Local Board of Health for the District of Coolgardie.
- "Inspector" shall mean the person or persons appointed by the Board for the due carrying out of visions of the Act, and shall include any Acting or Assistant Inspector.
- "Health Officer" shall mean the person appointed as Officer of Health under the provisions of the Act, and any Acting or Assistant Health Officer.
- "Person" shall include a Partnership, Company, or Corporation.
- "House" shall mean and include tents and dwellings of any kind, and churches, schools, hotels, licensed victuallers' premises, factories, workrooms, common or other lodging houses, or other buildings or premises whether temporary or otherwise, and whether erected upon fee simple lands, reserves, municipal lands, or on Crown lands.

BY-LAW No. 1.

The occupier of any premises whereon any closet is The occupier of any premises whereon any closet is erected shall keep the same and the receptacles for night-soil clean and free from offensive smell, and shall cause such closet to be cleaned once a week at the least, and the said receptacles to be emptied once a week at the least. The pan adopted by the Board for use within the district of Coolgardie shall be of ivon 14‡in. high, 13½in. diameter, fitted with a tight fitting light in light for the same and the same an fitted with a tight fitting lid 14in. diameter, and known as Munro's patent.

BY-LAW No. 2.

No nightman or any of his employees shall parade or pass any nightcart or other offensive vehicle through or over the streets or roads, or any of them, of the district, or remove or suffer to be removed any nightsoil or urine before the hour of eleven o'clock at night nor after the shall cause to be removed all carts belonging to him and used for any of the purposes aforesaid entirely outside the precincts of the town before the hour of five o'cleck in the morning.

BY-LAW No. 3.

The mode of removal of each receptacle in each closet shall be as follows:—The nightman shall remove each receptacle and at once cover the same with a suitable lid to be provided by him, and upon every such removal, shall carefully place a cleansed pan of the pattern approved by the Board in lieu of every pan so removed; and each pan shall be dealt with as prescribed in the next following clause hereof, that is to say:-

Each receptacle which shall have been removed from a closet and sealed with a lid, as prescribed in the foregoing clause, shall be then removed by the nightman in a cart of a pattern to be approved by the Board, and the contents of all such receptacles shall be deposited in such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Board. Until otherwise directed the nightman shall deposit the contents of all such receptacles in trenches to be excavated at his own expense in such place or places as shall be fixed by the Board, and treated with disinfectant and covered with earth to such depth as the Board may from time to with earth to such depth as the Board may from time to time direct.

BY-LAW No. 4.

Every nightman shall be entitled to charge, and to receive from the occupier of any premises from which any nightsoil shall have been removed, such sum or sums of money as are specified in Schedule B hereto, and no nightman shall ask, demand, or receive more than the moneys mentioned in the said Schedule.

BY-LAW No 5.

Every occupier shall place all rubbish from his house and yard in suitable receptacles, and shall cause such rubbish to be deodorised when necessary.

BY-LAW No. 6.

Every occupier shall cause the contents of all receptacles for rubbish to be removed, by a duly licensed scavenger at least twice weekly, to such place or places as shall from time to time be fixed by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 7.

Every occupier shall keep his receptacles in an inoffensive condition.

BY-LAW No. 8.

Every occupier shall cause the closet or closets situated on the premises occupied by him to be provided with a sufficient number of receptacles for nightsoil of the pattern approved by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 9.

Every Nightman shall cause every receptacle for nightsoil, after the disposal of the contents as specified in Bylaw No. 3, to be cleansed by superheated steam.

BY-LAW No. 10.

Every occupier shall provide a double pan service for every closet on the premises occupied by him.

Every occupier or any person having the management or control of any house or premises within the District shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a box cause to be kept in every closer belonging thereto a box containing dry earth, ashes, sawdust, or such materials as the Council may approve, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in any pan or receptacle in such closet to be, immediately on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorant or disinfectant sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorise or disinfect the contents of such pan or receptacle.

BY-LAW No. 12.

Every person committing any breach of the foregoing By-laws shall be liable for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued to a penalty of not less than 5s. nor more than £5.

BY-LAW No. 13.

No person shall remove nightsoil from any house or premises within the boundaries of the Board, unless he shall have first obtained from the Board a license authorising him to do so.

BY-LAW No. 14.

No license shall be issued to any person not approved of by the Board.

BY-LAW No. 15.

The license shall be in the form of Schedule A hereto, and subject to the conditions contained in the license, and to the provisions of the Actand of these By-laws.

BY-LAW No. 16.

Every nightman shall forfeit and pay to the Board the penalties hereinafter specified in case he shall commit any of the acts following.

- a. For neglecting to remove any pan at the time and in the manner appointed for the purpose, Five shillings.
- b. For any and every repetition of such neglect within three months of a neglect in removing any pan, Ten shillings.
- c. For each neglect to substitute a clean pan for every pan removed, Five shillings.
- d. For each neglect to place a cleansed pan in its proper position for use, Five shillings.
- e. For each neglect to clean or keep deodorised any pan, nightcart, or other vehicle, One pound.
- f. For every neglect or failure to properly dispose of nightsoil as soon as it is deposited at the depôt, Five pounds.
- g. For depositing any load or part of any load of nightsoil, slops, rubbish, or refuse at any other place than the place appointed by the Board, Ten pounds.
- h. For neglecting to close the door or gate of any yard, or the door of any closet which was closed when the nightman entered, Five shillings.
- i. For permitting any nightcart or other offensive vehicle to remain in or pass through the town or any part thereof during prohibited hours, One pound.

- j. For neglecting to cleanse any public latrine in the manner and at the time appointed for so doing, Two pounds.
- k. For spilling the contents or any part of the contents of any pan within any premises, Ten shillings.
- l. For not reporting any failure to cleanse any pan on the night appointed for so doing, Five shillings.
- m. For neglecting to comply forthwith with any reasonable order of the Board, Five pounds.
- For any failure to replace a pan when so ordered by the Board, One pound per day.
- o. For any and every neglect to steam soiled pans, Five shillings per pan.
- p. For allowing any refuse, rubbish, or slops removed in carts other than those specially set apart for that purpose to be given to pigs, Ten pounds.
- q. For any failure or neglect on the part of any night-man or any of his employés to keep books in accordance with the direction of the Board, One pound per day.
- r. For any charge collected from any householder for work done which shall be in excess of the rates specified herein and satisfactorily proved to the Board, Five pounds.

- 1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine."
- 2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease."
- "And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations."

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine, during a period of four calendar months in each and every year, commencing on the first day of March, in that portion of Peel's Inlet described hereunder:—

The Land Agent or Warden shall forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, to the Minister forthwith after the receipt thereof; and the Land Agent or Warden may, if he shall think fit under special circumstances, give to the applicant a conditional approval in the form of Schedule "C," which shall entitle the applicant to occupy the lot applied for, subject to these Regulations, pending the granting or refusal of the lease.
- 8. On an application being approved by the Minister, a lease shall be granted in the form of Schedule "D."

- 5. Twenty-four hours' notice in writing, at least, shall be given of any special meeting of the Board to every member of the same, and shall be sent by post to, or delivered at, the address of such member.
- At every meeting of the Board the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and, in his absence, a Chairman shall be chosen by a majority of the members present.
- Any member of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of one guinea for attendance at any meeting convened in accordance with these Regulations, and for each day or part of a day engaged in conducting any examination.
- Any member who shall not be present at any Board within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for the meeting of the same shall not be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance.
