WHEREAS by Section 15 of "The Health Act, 1898," the Governor may appoint any number of persons, not exceeding seven, to be a Local Board of Health for any District not forming part of a Municipal District: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby appoint the undermentioned persons to be a Local Board of Health for the District to be known as "Drakesbrook," and to include all lands comprised within the following boundaries:-

Bounded on the West by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the North by an East line passing along the South boundary of Murray Location 9 (being the South boundary of Coolup Agricultural area) to a point on a line extending in a South-South-Westerly direction to Survey Post F26 on the Murray River, from a point on another line extending from the 41-mile mark on the Perth-Albany Road in a South-South-Easterly direction to the Junction of the Hotham and Williams Rivers, said latter point being situate due West of the South-West corner of Reserve 334A; on the East by the first mentioned line, extending South-South-Westerly to the said Survey mark F26 on the Murray River, and along said River upwards to a point due East of Mt. Williams; and on the South by a West line passing through said Mt. Williams to the sea Coast.

AMENDMENT OF BY-LAWS Nos. 29 AND 34.

Whereas by "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895" (59 Vict., No. 10), it is enacted that every Council may make, publish, alter, modify, or repeal By-laws for the purposes enumerated in the said Act; and whereas, pursuant to the power contained in "The Municipal Institutions Act, 1895," the Council of the Municipality of Northam did enact certain By-laws, numbered 29 and 34 respectively, and it is deemed expedient to amend the same and make further provision in respect thereof: Now, therefore, in pursuance of the power given by the said Act, it is ordered and directed by the Council of the Municipality of Northam that the following shall be amended in the said By-laws:—

BY-LAW No. 29. COMMONAGE.

- 1. No person shall be allowed to run or depasture any stock upon the Common unless such stock are placed in the charge of the Town Herdsman, and until they shall have been registered at the office of the Council, and payment made of the annual registration fee of Five shillings for each head of stock.
- 2. All such registered stock shall be provided with a numbered disc (supplied by the Council), and any stock not so provided will be liable to be impounded as stray stock and the owner prosecuted under these By-laws.
- 3. In addition to the fees payable under Clause 1, there shall also be payable to the Town Herdsman by the owner of the stock depasturing herding fees not exceeding One shilling per head per week, as may be ordered by the Council.
- 4. The owners of all stock within the Municipality, whether intended to depasture on the Commonage or not, shall register such stock at the office of the Council during the month of January of each year, or within one month after coming into possession of such stock, and shall pay a registration fee as set forth in Clause 1.
- 5. No entire horse or bull over the age of six months (except the property of the Council) and no swine or camels shall be permitted to run on the Common; and any such stock found on the Common shall be impounded, and the owner thereof may be prosecuted under "The Cattle Trespass, Fencing, and Impounding Act, 1882."
- 6. Any person keeping goats within the Municipality shall register the same at the office of the Council, and shall pay a yearly registration fee of Two shillings per head.
- 7. No person shall graze any sheep on the Common without first obtaining a license from the Council and payment of such fees as may be ordered by the Council.
- 8. The By-law numbered 29, as gazetted in the Government Gazette of 29th April, 1897, is hereby rescinded, and the foregoing amended By-law is to be taken and read as the By-law for regulating the Commonage of the Municipality of Northam; and any person offending against the provisions as herein set forth shall be liable, on conviction before a Justice of the Peace, to a penalty not exceeding 40s., and, in addition, such Commonage fees as are provided for in these By-laws.

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

Council, under the powers conferred by "The
Stock Diseases Act, 1895," has been pleased to
amend Regulation 3 of the Regulations duly made
and published in the Government Gazette of the 6th
January, 1899, by adding at the end thereof the
words following:—

And shall not call at any port of the Colony other than Wyndham for a period of two months after such disinfection.

The amended Regulation will read as follows:—

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle, and shall not call at any port of the Colony other than Wyndham for a period of two months after such disinfection.

NDER the powers conferred by Royal Proclamation, dated 13th October, 1897, Section 5, Subsection D, the following Regulations, under which gold may be received and coined at the Branch of Her Majesty's Mint at Perth, Western Australia, have been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

The date upon which gold will be received at the Mint, in accordance with the following Regulations, will be publicly announced in due course.

Regulations under which Gold may be received and coined at the Branch of Her Majesty's Mint at Perth, Western Australia.

- 1. Gold in deposits of not less than twelve ounces will be received at the Mint daily (Saturdays and holidays excepted), between the hours of 11 a.m. and 3 p.m.
 - 2. Each parcel requiring a separate assay will be treated as a separate deposit.
- 3. The value of each deposit shall be determined upon the report of the Assay Department, which report shall be final.
- 4. The value of each deposit will be calculated as follows:—Standard gold at £3 17s. $10\frac{1}{2}$ d. per ounce Troy, and any silver, in excess of 10 per cent. of the weight of the metal after melting, at a rate per ounce to be fixed by the Deputy Master from time to time.
 - 5. The following charges will be made for Coinage, Assaying, and Refining:—

Under Over 500 ozs. std. 500 ozs. std.

- (a.) For Coinage (the charge fixed by the Royal Proclamation of the 13th October, 1897) $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. an oz. 1d. an oz.
- (b.) For Assaying and Refining: The charges shown in the Schedule attached to these Regulations.

Minimum charge for Assaying, Refining, and Coining-10s.

- 6. Additional charges, to be fixed by the Deputy Master, will also be made when:--
 - (a.) A deposit contains more than two per cent. of base metal.
 - (b.) It is necessary to subject the metal to any extra treatment before it can be converted into coin.
- 7. The value of the deposit, less the Mint charges, will be paid to the Depositor:
 - (a.) By cheque, in the case of deposits of less than 1,000 ozs. gross weight.
 - (b.) In all other cases, in coin for the even thousands of pounds, and by cheque for the balance; or wholly by cheque if desired.

Payments will be made on Tuesdays and Fridays next after the expiration of three weeks from the date of the deposit.

Cheques will be transmitted by post when required.

- Note.—These arrangements for the payment of depositors will be adhered to as far as possible, but the Deputy Master cannot be held responsible for any delay arising from accidents to machinery, great pressure of work, or other unavoidable cause.
- 8. Deposits made during the last fortnight of March, June, September, and December will be dealt with as having been received on the first day of the following month.
 - 9. All deposits will be dealt with strictly in the order in which they are received.
- 10. The Deputy Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable, and it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the public service.

The Fishery Act, 1889.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 8th March, 1899.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, under the powers conferred by "The Fishery Act, 1889," has been pleased to make the following Regulations.

R. CECIL CLIFTON, Under Secretary for Lands.

Fishing by a set net in the Swan River (except during the months of January, February, March, and April in each year) is allowed within the limits and subject to the conditions following:—

From the Causeway Bridge upwards to the Upper Swan Bridge. The mesh must not be less than three inches from corner to corner, to be measured from point to point when stretched out; the length of the net must not exceed 50 yards; two or more nets must not be coupled together, and a net must not be set across a deep water channel which does not exceed the length of the net allowed. No dragging or splashing to be allowed.

Every person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and shall forfeit the implements used and all fish which shall have been taken.

- $6.\ \, \text{A}$ fee of 10s. shall be payable with every application.
- 7. The Land Agent or Warden shall forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, to the Minister forthwith after the receipt thereof; and the Land Agent or Warden may, if he shall think fit under special circumstances, give to the applicant a conditional approval in the form of Schedule "C," which shall entitle the applicant to occupy the lot applied for, subject to these Regulations, pending the granting or refusal of the lease.

The Stock Diseases Act, 1895

Regulations.

Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth, 15th December, 1898.

IIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

GEO. THROSSELL, Commissioner of Crown Lands.

- 1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.
- 2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberley Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.
- 3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.
- 4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparently clean, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.
- 5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.
- 6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows:—
 - (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
 - (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
 - (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.

(4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it

The hides or skins shall remain on the saltingfloor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

- 7. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."
- 8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 500$.

Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.
- "Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats
- "Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

T is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations in connection with the Land Surveyors Licensing Board, appointed under the above Act, and of the cancellation of those approved on 19th February, 1896.

R. CECIL CLIFTON, Under Secretary for Lands.

- 1. The Board shall meet for the despatch of business on the first Wednesday of every January, April, July, and October, and shall have power to adjourn to any intermediate period; provided that, if the first Wednesday be a public holiday, the Board shall meet on the following Wednesday.
- 2. At the first meeting of the Board, which shall be held in the month of January in each year, the members present shall choose one of their number to be the Chairman for the ensuing year, but the omission to choose a Chairman at such meeting shall not invalidate any act done by the Board.
- 3. The Chairman shall have power to call a special meeting for the consideration of any business which he may wish to submit to the Board.
- 4. The Chairman, or, in his absence, the Secretary, shall convene a special meeting of the Board, upon the written requisition of three members setting forth the objects for which the meeting shall be called, within three days after the receipt of the requisition.
- 5. Twenty-four hours' notice in writing, at least, shall be given of any special meeting of the Board to every member of the same, and shall be sent by post to, or delivered at, the address of such member.
- 6. At every meeting of the Board the Chairman, if present, shall preside, and, in his absence, a Chairman shall be chosen by a majority of the members present.
- 7. Any member of the Board shall be entitled to receive a fee of one guinea for attendance at any meeting convened in accordance with these Regulations, and for each day or part of a day engaged in conducting any examination.
- 8. Any member who shall not be present at any Board within fifteen minutes of the time appointed for the meeting of the same shall not be entitled to any remuneration for his attendance.
- 9. All questions which shall be proposed or considered at any meeting of the Board shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present; each member to have one vote, and in case of an equal division of the votes the Chairman shall have a casting vote besides his ordinary vote.
- 10. All proceedings of the Board shall be entered in a journal to be kept for the purpose, and at each meeting of the Board the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read and confirmed or amended, and the presiding Chairman shall sign them as confirmed or amended.
- 11. All moneys received by the Board shall be placed to its credit at such bank as the members may from time to time direct, and all payments shall be made by cheques on such account, signed by one member of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary for the time being.
- 12. The Secretary shall attend every meeting and enter minutes of all the proceedings of the Board, and keep all the books and accounts, conduct the correspondence under the direction of the Chairman, and transact any other business the Board may require. He shall keep a register in which he shall enter the names of all Licensed Surveyors, with the particulars of their certificates, and shall cause such register to be revised forthwith after the issue, cancellation, or suspension of any license. He shall be entitled to a salary such as the Board may from time to time determine.

Roads Act, 1888.

Amended By-laws of the Dundas Roads Board.

THE Dundas Roads Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act, doth hereby make and publish the following By-laws:—

Whereas by "The Roads Act, 1888," and the Amendment Act, 1889, the Board of any district is empowered to make By-laws for all or any purposes in the said Acts mentioned: It is hereby resolved by the Board of the Dundas district, by and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that the following By-laws shall be in force within the said district from the date of the publication thereof in the Government Gazette.

INTERPRETATION.

In these By-laws the following terms shall, unless the context otherwise indicates, bear the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

- "District."—The Dundas Roads Board District.
- "Chairman."—The member acting for the time being as Chairman of the Board.
- "Member."—A member of the Board.
- "Secretary."—The Secretary of the Board.
- "The Act."—The Roads Act of 1888, and all amendments thereto, or which may come into force hereafter as far as the Act allows.
- "Road or reserve."—A public road or reserve, as the case may be, under the control of the Board.
- The word "street" shall mean and include every public street, road, square, thoroughfare, or other place within the district which the public are permitted to use.
- "Footpath or footway" shall include any part of a street set apart for the sole use of foot passengers, and whether the same be made or kerbed, or otherwise.

The word "person" shall include the plural and also a body corporate.

DUTIES OF SECRETARY.

To attend all Board meetings.

To attend all committees.

To take notes of all minutes and prepare reports of committees.

To conduct all correspondence and to give the other officers instructions as directed by the minutes.

To answer all questions on the Board's business.

To see that the accounts are audited once a year, and the balance sheets prepared and printed yearly.

To supervise the preparation of the rate books and Board's electoral lists, examine proofs of latter and arrange for distribution of copies prior to elections; also to attend all courts of revision or appeal, making the necessary arrangements for the elections and preparing papers, etc., for the elerks.

To summon the members to Board and Committee meetings.

The Secretary shall keep the cash book as well as any and all other books required to show the receipts and expenditure made by the Board; the said books shall be kept written up every month ready for the inspection of the Board or any member of the Board who may at any time during office hours desire to see them.

He shall check all accounts sent in to the Board and see that all accounts for works (exceeding Five pounds in amount) have stated on them the authority under which such works have been done, and shall check all returns made by the collectors or other of the Board's officers, and

shall see that, with all returns made, the heels of the receipt books accompany the returns; he shall supervise and attend to the due payment of all money coming through the hands of the Board's officers and payable to the credit of the corporation; he shall report to the Board at their next meeting any officer neglecting to make his returns, as provided, with the necessary youchers attached thereto.

He shall pay into the bank, within forty-eight hours after receipt, to the credit of the Board any sum or sums of money that may be received by him (amounting in the aggregate to Ten pounds or upwards) on behalf of the Board.

He shall have the bank pass-book made up in readiness for the meetings of the Board; and shall produce it at each meeting thereof; or should any member of the Board desire to see it at any time during office hours the Secretary shall produce it for his inspection. No money shall be paid into the bank to the credit of the Board by any officer of the Board except by or through the Secretary. The Secretary shall give all receipts on printed forms. The Secretary shall readily and cheerfully obey all lawful commands or orders of the Board, and shall attend to all other matters affecting the finances of the Board and not herein specified.

MEETINGS AND PROCEEDINGS.

Notice of Meetings.

Notice shall be given by the Chairman or Secretary of ordinary or special meetings at least seven days before such meeting, and also of every meeting adjourned for a term exceeding two days. The Chairman, if present, shall preside at all meetings of ratepayers and of the Board, and in his absence or after being present he shall retire, one of the members of the Board chosen by the ratepayers or members present (as the case may be) shall preside. (Act, Sec. 11.)

Meetings.

Meetings of the Board shall be of two kinds, ordinary and special. It shall rest with the Chairman and any three members of the Board to exclude the public when in their opinion it is expedient to do so, providing the business before the Board warrants such action being taken.

A special meeting may, on the requisition of three members of the Board, be called at any time in the manner prescribed by the 9th Section of the Act, but a Chairman may call a meeting of the Board as often as he may think proper. No business shall be transacted at any ordinary or special meeting unless at least three of the members of the Board, inclusive of the Chairman or member of the Board chosen to preside in his absence, shall be present, and no business shall be transacted other than that for which the special meeting is called. (52 Vict., 16, Sec. 9.)

Any three members may require the Board room to be cleared of strangers, and the Chairman, or other presiding chairman, shall immediately give directions to have the order executed.

At all meetings of the Board, when there is not a quorum present, or when the Board is counted out, which counting out shall take place whenever there shall be less than a quorum present, such circumstance, together with the names of the members then present, shall be recorded in the minute book.

As the first business at all meetings of the Board, the minutes of the preceding meeting shall be read aloud with a view to their confirmation.

Immediately after confirmation of the minutes the Chairman may make any communication to the Board which he may deem advisable, or bring under consideration any business he may think necessary, and it shall be competent for any member of the Board to ask a question or questions, but he shall confine himself to the question simply, and no debate shall ensue thereon at any time.

Voting.

Each member, including the Chairman, shall have one vote, and such Chairman shall, in case of equality of votes, have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote, and all questions at such meeting shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present.

Minutes of Meeting.

In addition to the minute book prescribed to be kept by the 10th Section of the Act, a rough minute book shall be kept, in which any item of business transacted by the Board at a meeting shall be then and there entered by the Secretary, and subsequently re-entered by him in the manner prescribed by the Act in the minute book.

Minutes of special or ordinary meetings shall be confirmed at the next ordinary subsequent meeting.

Order of Bysiness.

The order of business at all ordinary meetings shall be as follows, that is to say:—

- (a.) Reading and confirmation of minutes of last ordinary and of special meetings, if any;
- (b.) Consideration of business arising out of minutes;
- (c.) Reading of correspondence in and (out), and taking such immediate action as may be deemed expedient in regard thereto;
- (d.) Passing of accounts for payment;
- (e.) Presentation of petitions or memorials and committee's reports, and consideration thereof;
- (j.) Consideration of tenders and ratification of contracts.

Petitions.

Every petition or memorial shall be respectful and temperate in its language, and shall be presented to the Board by a member only; and any member presenting a petition or memorial to the Board shall affix his name to the beginning thereof, with the number of signatures; and any member presenting a petition or memorial shall acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Board. The nature and prayer of every petition or memorial shall be stated to the Board by the member presenting the same.

Tenders.

Tenders for work shall be opened and dealt with when the subject matters of the tenders come on to be considered at the meeting of the Board or by a committee appointed for the purpose.

Speaker must not digress.

A member having audience shall not digress from the subject of debate.

Motions and Amendments.

 Λ motion once moved at a meeting cannot be with drawn unless by the consent of the Board.

One or more amendments may be proposed on a motion before the Board. When more than one amendment is moved, the question shall be first put on the last amendments, then on the next in succession, and then on the original motion, in the reverse order in which they are moved.

A motion or amendment not seconded cannot be discussed by any member except the mover, nor put by the Chairman.

In submitting a motion or amendment, the Chairman must put the question, first in the affirmative, and then in the negative.

When an amendment is carried, the motion as amended thereby becomes a substantive motion, upon which a further amendment may be moved before it is finally dealt with.

APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEE.

The Board may at any meeting appoint three or more members as a committee to inquire into any matter, and make a report and recommendation thereon, but no committee shall incur any financial liability, or in any way commit the Board to any responsibility whatever without express and specific authority conferred by the By-laws or by a resolution of the Board.

The quorum of a committee of three shall comprise two members.

FINANCE ACCOUNTS.

All accounts, bills, and vouchers shall be submitted to the Board by the Chairman of the ordinary meetings, and after being certified as correct shall be paid by cheque.

An account shall be opened with such bank as the Board may direct, and all money received from whatever source (with the exception of money granted by the Government) shall be paid into such bank to the credit of the Board, and no account shall be paid except by cheque signed by the Chairman and one or more members of the Board, together with the signature of the Secretary.

All moneys exceeding Ten pounds shall, within two days after they have come into the hands of the Board or of any officers, servants, or clerks, for the use of the Board, be paid into such bank.

Money granted by Government shall be paid to Board's credit at Treasury, and shall only be operated upon to pay actual creditors for work executed on the specific object for which money was granted.

URGENT WORK.

The Chairman with one member may, in case of urgency, authorise the expenditure of a sum not exceeding £5, but shall in every case report the same at the next meeting of the Board.

UNAUTHORISED EXPENDITURE.

Every item of expenditure and every liability incurred by any committee or member of the Board, otherwise than under the authority of the Act or these By-laws, shall be deemed unlawful expenditure.

APPOINTMENTS.

No permanent appointment shall be made to an office under the Board until an advertisement has been published in one or more local newspapers calling for applications from persons competent to fill such appointment. All appointments shall be made by resolution passed by the Board.

NUISANCES.

"Abattoirs" or "slaughter-house" shall mean and include the buildings and places commonly called abattoirs or slaughter-houses, and every building or place used for slaughtering cattle or animals of any description.

Any person who establishes or newly carries on within the district of the Board, without their consent in writing, any of the undermentioned trades, businesses, or occupations, viz:—

Manure works:

Works for boiling down meat, bones, or offal;

Bone mills and bone manure depôts;

Fellmongeries, tanneries, and wool-scouring establishments;

Glue factories;

Piggeries;

Soap or candle works or factories;

Fish curing establishments;

shall be guilty of an offence under these By-laws.

The Inspector may from time to time visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house, or yard or other place, for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept cleansed, and must be kept thoroughly clean to the satisfaction of such officer.

Any person guilty of any of the following offences omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding £20:—

- (1.) Riding or driving horses, cattle, or other animals, or wheeling any barrow, or driving any carriage upon or along any footpath.
- (2.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having first been obtained.
- (3.) Burning any shavings or other materials or matter in any footway, carriage road, or open or public place.
- (4.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building, without having first obtained the permission of the Board.
- (5.) Emptying any privy or cess-pool, or carting away any night-soil, or other offensive matter, without permission or a license from, and without having given such security as it is required by the Board.
- (6.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place, or depositing any rubbish within three chains of any road.
- (7.) Allowing the dripping of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway.
- (8.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (9.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the permission of the Board having been first obtained.
- (10.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance, by offensive smell or otherwise, is caused.

- (11.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise.
- (12.) Throwing or discharging any stones or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.
- (13.) Having any awning on any footpath in any public street or thoroughfare not being eight feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (14.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place, without permission of the Board, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such Board.
- (15.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (16.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any entire horse for show, hire, or sale.
- (17.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the Board.
- (18.) Any carter plying for hire without a license after 31st January in each year.

Any owner or occupier of any house, land, or premises within the district, who shall allow any impure water or any foul liquid matter of any description to flow from such house, land, or premises into or upon any street, footway, or gutter; and any person who shall throw or place thereon or therein any impure water or any foul liquid matter of any description shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law, and, upon conviction, shall pay a penalty not exceeding £5.

Any owner, occupier, manager, or other person in charge of any land or premises, who shall allow water from any shaft to flow into, upon, or across any road, footway, or gutter without the permission of the Board first had and obtained, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5, and to the cost of repairing any such road, footway, or gutter damaged by reason of allowing water to flow as aforesaid.

The occupier of any house shall have upon the premises a pit for the purpose of containing deposits of night-soil, urine, and household refuse matter, such pit to be of not less than twelve feet deep and of not less than two feet by three feet section, and such pits shall be filled in before the accumulations of deposits reach within four feet of the surface.

SIGNBOARDS, ETC.

Any person who shall erect any signboard, signs, awnings blinds, overhanging lamps, or other things over or near any footway or roadway, without first obtaining the consent of the Board in writing, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £2 for every such offence.

GENERAL REGULATION OF TRAFFIC.

Every person having the care or conduct of any carriage shall keep the same on the left or near-side of the road, except in case of actual necessity or other sufficient reason for deviation, and shall not interrupt or interfere with any person or carriage passing or attempting to pass his carriage.

Any person who between sunset and the following sunsise shall, in, upon, or along any of the public roads within the District drive any vehicle without having a lamp or lantern securely fixed and lighted at the off-side of the front of such vehicle, shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5 for every such offence.

STALL LICENSES.

No person shall keep, manage, or conduct any movable or temporarily fixed stall in or near any street for the sale of any meat, fruit, vegetables, drinks, eatables, or articles of merchandise, unless such person be licensed by the Board.

Licenses for stalls shall be in the Form Λ in the Schedule.

No licensed stall shall be placed or allowed to stand in any street or position other than that mentioned in the license, or between the hours of 10 p.m. and 8 a.m.

The following fees shall be paid for licenses for stalls, and shall be paid in advance on the first Monday in every month, and if payment be not made when due the license shall be void:—

For every stall, 20s. per month.

No person to whom a stall-holder's license is granted shall lend, transfer, or assign his license, and no person shall borrow or make use of any such license granted to a person other than himself.

TO PREVENT ACCIDENTS FROM RIDING, ETC., OF BICYCLES, ETC.

Throughout this By-law the expression "cycle" means a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede; and the expression "cyclist" means a person riding a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

No person shall ride or impel a cycle upon any footpath within the district.

No person shall within the hours of sunset and sunrise ride a cycle within the district unless there is attached thereto a lamp which shall exhibit a white light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and at all times to be kept lighted.

Every cyclist shall carry a bell, which shall be rung as a signal whenever any person on foot or on horseback or vehicle is being approached or passed.

No person shall leave any cycle in or on any street or footpath so as to become an obstruction, and every person shall remove his cycle immediately upon being requested by any constable or officer of the Board.

No person shall pass at a speed exceeding eight miles an hour any person who shall be riding or driving any horse or any animal.

When a cyclist meets any horse or animal, and such horse or animal becomes restless, or appears likely to get beyond the control of the person in charge thereof, such cyclist shall dismount, and shall remain dismounted until such horse or animal has been passed.

No person shall ride any cycle round the corner formed by the junction of any streets in the district, or across the intersection of any of the said streets, at a pace exceeding six miles an hour.

TO PREVENT OBSTRUCTIONS ON THE FOOTPATUS OF THE STREETS.

No person shall permit any boxes, cases, coal, sand, firewood, goods, ware, merchandise, or other articles or effects to remain on any part of any street, or on any part of the footpaths within the district after sunset, nor in any case for a longer period than shall be necessary for housing or removing same.

To prevent Damage to Footpaths and other Board Property.

No person, without first having obtained the written sanction of the Board, shall break up, cut down, damage, destroy, or injure any footpath, drain, gutter, culvert, bridge, road, public way, tree, plants, gate, fence, post, lantern, lamp-post, implements, materials, buildings, or other properties of the said Board or under the control thereof

No person shall damage or destroy, by means of horse team, wagon, dray, or any other means, any road or portion of road under construction or repair. Any person found guilty of such damage or destruction shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

TO PREVENT TREES FALLING ACROSS ROAD.

No person shall leave a burning camp fire by the roadside, and proper precaution against such fire spreading not being taken shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

No person shall wilfully set fire to standing trees on road side. Any offender shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding $\pounds 5$.

Any person cutting timber on the side of a road shall not leave any branches, stack any timber, or in any way obstruct such road between its surveyed lines. Any offender shall forfeit and pay, upon conviction, a penalty not exceeding £5.

PENALTIES.

Where any person by these By-laws or any of them is required to do or perform any act, and such act is not done or remains undone or unperformed, it shall be lawful for the Board to perform the same, and charge the cost and expenses against such person, and the amount thereof may be recovered summarily.

Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these By-laws, or commits or permits any breach or neglect thereof, shall be

deemed guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and where not otherwise provided shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20 for every such offence.

The By-laws published in the Government Gazette of 13th May, 1898, are hereby cancelled.

Department of Lands and Surveys, 90 Perth, 15th March, 1899.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to make the following Regulation under the provisions of Part IV. of "The Land Act, 1898":—

REGULATION FOR THE SALE OF SUBURBAN LANDS FOR CULTIVATION.

Suburban lands set apart for cultivation shall be sold subject to the conditions of sale set forth in the Schedule hereto, and the purchase money shall be payable in the instalments therein stated.

SCHEDULE REFERRED TO.

Conditions of sale of Suburban Lands advertised to be sold by auction at on the day of 189 .

1. The land offered for sale is particularised in the notice headed "Land Sales," published in the Government Gazette of the day of 189, and in the Schedule hereto, and will be sold subject to the terms and conditions of "The Land Act, 1898," and the Regulations thereunder.

- 2. The lots will be offered separately, and in such order as the auctioneer shall at the time determine.
- 3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise the lot in dispute shall be put up again and resold.
- 4. Each lot shall be offered at the upset price, and, if no advance be made, the applicant for the same shall be declared the purchaser at that price; but if any advance be made, the highest bidder shall be the purchaser as aforesaid. Biddings shall advance at the rate of not less than Ten shillings when the upset price of the lot is £10 or under, or £1 if the upset price exceeds £10. Should the applicant not be the purchaser, his deposit will be refunded in due course.
- 5. The purchaser shall, immediately after the sale, pay to the Minister for Lands or his agent a deposit in cash at the rate of 10 per cent. upon the total amount of the purchase money, unless he has already paid a sufficient deposit on application; and any such deposit shall be considered as payment of the purchase money so far as the same will extend.
- 6. The balance of purchase money shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or his agent within five years from the date of sale, by equal half-yearly instalments on the first day of March and the first day of September in each year, the Crown Grant fees being payable with the last instalment of purchase money: Provided that nothing shall prevent the balance of the purchase money being paid at an earlier date should the purchaser so desire, but no Crown Grant shall issue until the Minister for Lands is satisfied that the prescribed conditions have been fulfilled.
- 7. In any case where the value of improvements on a lot is added to the upset price, and the lot is knocked down to any other person than the owner of such improvements, the value of the same shall be paid to the Minister for Lands or his agent immediately after the sale.
- 8. The purchaser shall, within two years from the date of sale, substantially fence in the whole of his land with a fence of the description prescribed by the said Act, and within three years shall plant at least one-tenth of the area with vines or fruit trees, or cultivate it bona fide as a vegetable garden, or otherwise clear and cultivate one-quarter of the said area: Provided that the Minister for Lands may, if he think fit, dispense with the division fences between two or more adjoining lots purchased by one person, or may, if he think fit, accept other substantial improvements in lieu of fencing.

 9. In default of payment of any one of the several
- 9. In default of payment of any one of the several instalments of purchase money within 30 days after the dates mentioned, or if the conditions as to fencing and cultivation have not been complied with within the times prescribed, the land shall be absolutely forfeited, together with all purchase money and fees that may have been paid.
- 10. Immediately after the sale the purchaser shall declare the full name, address, and calling of the person in whose name he requires the Crown Grant to issue, and the same shall be inserted in the form of application to purchase.
- 11. On payment of the final instalment of the purchase money, provided that all the conditions of fencing and cultivation have been complied with, and the said fencing and cultivation maintained, a Crown Grant shall be issued on application and payment of the prescribed fee of Thirty shillings.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for the erection of Private Telephone Lines in Country Districts, framed under the provisions of the Post and Telegraph Act (57 Vict., No. 5, Section 68, Sub-section 31).

Regulations for the Erection of Private Telephone Lines in Country Districts.

- 1. Any person wishing to erect a private telephone line must submit a plan and specification showing the route to be followed, especially marking where roads are to be crossed or entered upon, and describing the nature and dimensions of the materials to be used in the construction of the line, and any other particulars which may be required; upon receipt of which the Postmaster General may direct an officer of the Post and Telegraph Department to examine such plan and specification, and, if necessary, make an inspection of the route, the cost of such examination and inspection to be borne by the person wishing to erect the line; and should the report of such officer disclose that the line will not in any way interfere with or endanger any other line of telegraph, whether belonging to the Postmaster General, the Commissioner of Railways, or any private person, and that the material and method of erection described in the specification are satisfactory, the Postmaster General may, upon payment of the necessary fees, grant permission to erect: Provided, however, that such permission shall in no case be granted where a line is to run from a point in the vicinity of a telegraph office to another point in a like vicinity, or in the event of the route of such proposed line being along any public road, railway, or track, or over or across any private land other than land belonging to the person desirous of erecting such private line, unless and until the necessary authority of the local authority or the owners of such private land (as the case may be) shall have been obtained, and satisfactory evidence to that effect shall have been forwarded to the Postmaster General.
- 2. If the line crosses a road, track, or other public place, the height of the wire above the highest portion of the road, track, etc., shall not be less than eighteen (18) feet, and the poles carrying the wire at such places shall be of a substantial character, and be strutted or stayed, if necessary, to stand the strain of the wire.
- 3. All fittings upon such poles, such as brackets, pins, insulators, wire, etc., shall be of approved material and make
- 4. The person to whom such permission has been granted shall, upon the completion of the line, report the fact to the Postmaster General, when an officer of the Post and Telegraph Department may be sent to inspect the line and report whether the work has been satisfactorily carried out; the cost of such inspection shall be borne by the person who erected the line. If the work be not to the satisfaction of the inspecting officer he shall issue instructions as to what is required, and on the defects being made good a license to use the line may be issued.
- 5. Should the person to whom permission has been granted to erect the line fail to make good the defects pointed out, the Postmaster General may take such steps as he may deem necessary to remove the portions objected to, and license to use the line shall not be issued until the requirements of the Postmaster General have been satisfactorily complied with.
- 6. On completion of the line to the satisfaction of the Postmaster General, a license to use it will be issued. No fee shall be charged in respect of a line which does not extend beyond the boundary of the licensee's own land. Where the line is not exclusively within the boundary of the licensee's own land, but crosses such boundary, or runs along or across a railway, public road, or track, a license fee of One pound per annum, payable in advance, shall be charged, irrespective of the length of the line. This fee covers the use of two instruments only. If any further instruments are added to the same line, or if the line be

- extended so as to connect further stations under the one proprietorship, a further fee of One pound per annum for each additional instrument or station connected will be charged.
- 7. Where a line is erected partly on existing Government poles, a sum of Two pounds per annum per mile, payable in advance, shall be charged for the portion erected on Government poles, in addition to the license fee mentioned (Two pounds per annum). The wire on such poles will be erected and maintained by the Department, and the licensee will be required to enter into an agreement to pay the prescribed fees for a period of at least five years from the completion of that portion.
- 8. If a line connect with a telegraph office, the following shall be the charges payable in respect thereof:—
 - For every telephone communicating with any telegraph office a fee of One pound per annum shall be payable in advance. A further charge of Two pounds per annum shall be payable in advance for the maintenance of the telephone in use at the telegraph office, which will be supplied by the Department. The telephone for the use of the licensee may be either provided by him or be purchased from the Department, but must be maintained by the licensee.
- 9. Every message passing in either direction over any private line connected with any telegraph office, except as provided for in Regulation 10, will be considered as a telegram, and charged for at the following rates:—
 - (a.) For every message intended for transmission over the Department's wires in the usual way, the ordinary telegraphic charges will be made;
 - (b.) For every message intended for delivery from the telegraph office in which the telephone is fixed, sixpence for the first ten words, not including address and signature, and one penny for every additional word;
 - (c.) For every message handed in at the office in which the telephone is fixed for transmission over the telephone wire to the licensee's office, sixpence for the first ten words, not including address and signature, and one penny for every additional word:
 - (d.) The licensee shall deposit with the officer in charge of the telegraph office with which the line is connected a sum sufficient to meet the cost of all business passing over the line, and must accept the statement of the officer as to the charges.
- 10. If the licensee of a line connected with any telegraph office desires to call any person to speak to him on such line, the following charges will be made:—
 - For a messenger sent to call any person residing within the usual radius for free delivery of telegrams, to the telegraph office, threepence;
 - To call persons from beyond the radius of free delivery of telegrams, the usual porterage charges will be made:
 - If any person desires to speak from any telegraph office to the licensee of a line connected with such office, permission will be given conditionally on such conversation being solely on the business of the licensee;
 - Any attempt to use licensed lines for other than the business of the licensee will be met by a with-drawal of the license to use such line, and the forfeiture of any payments made.
- 11. The Postmaster General may direct an official inspection of such lines to be made periodically, and the officer making such inspection may direct the licensee to make such alterations or repairs as may to him appear necessary, and the licensee shall immediately carry out the same. In the event of his failing to do so within a reasonable time, the officer shall report to that effect, and the license to use such line may be cancelled.
- 12. Except in the case of a telephone line erected partly on Government poles, and which portion is therefore maintained by the Department as provided above, the licensee shall be wholly responsible for the repair and maintenance of the line, and he shall undertake to maintain the same in a thoroughly efficient manner at his own cost, and any alterations, repairs, or other works which the Postmaster General may, in the interest of the public safety or convenience, order to be done, shall be charged to the licensee, and may be recovered by the ordinary process of the law.

- 13. The licensee shall be solely responsible for any damage which may arise to life, limb, or property which may be caused by the poles, wire, or other portions of the line erected by the licensee.
- Where the line does not connect with a telegraph office the licensee shall undertake that it shall be used for his own private purpose only, or by those authorised by him, with the approval of the Postmaster General, to connect by telephone *en route*, and in no case shall he charge or accept a fee for the use of the line or for the transmission of any communication over the same; and in the event of it being proved that he has done so at any time, the license issued in respect of such line may be cancelled.
- 15. In the event of a licensee's line being found to interfere in any way with the future erection of any lines by the Postmaster General or the Commissioner of Railways, the Postmaster General may direct the licensee's line to be altered, removed, re-erected in another position, or otherwise dealt with as may be deemed necessary.
- Where it is possible for the existing wires of the Department to be used, special arrangements will be made to meet each case.
