HEREAS by Section 43 of "The Land Act, 1898," it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed of grant, to place any Reserve under the control of any Municipality, Road Board, or other person or persons, as a Board of Management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such Reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon, and for other purposes: AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Recreation Reserve 6495 (Pingelly Town Lot 371) should be placed under the control of the Moorumbine Roads Board as a Board of Management: Now, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned Reserve under the control of the Moorumbine Roads Board as a Board of Management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said Reserve, for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon, for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof, and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

TIS Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Excellence Council 1 Executive Council, has been pleased to confirm the following By-laws made by the Local Board of Health at Gullewa.

### By-Laws of the Gullewa Local Board of Health,

MADE in pursuance of the powers and authorities contained in "The Health Act, 1898."

1. In the construction and for the purposes of these By-laws words having the meaning assigned to them by "The Health Act, 1898," shall have the like meaning, with the following additions -

- "Board" shall mean the Gullewa Local Board of Health, and the persons her after from time to
- time elected as Chairman and Committee. "Rubbish" shall mean and include dust, as ubbish" shall mean and include dust, ashes, rags, straw, tins, boxes, broken glass, house and trade refuse, waste paper, and all refuse of whatsoever kind.

The Board shall meet for the transaction of general mess on every alternate Monday, at 8 p.m. Special business on every alternate Monday, at 8 p.m. Special meetings may be called at any time deemed necessary by the Chairman or any two members of the Board.

3. All moneys belonging to the Board shall be placed in a bank to the credit of the Board, and none shall be drawn therefrom except by cheque signed by the Chairman or any member of the Board and countersigned by the Treasurer and Secretary

4. The duties of the Secretary shall be to attend and take minutes of all meetings of the Board, keep accounts, and perform all other clerical work that may be necessary.

4A. Every adult male resident, who is the occupier or living in any house or place within the jurisdiction of the Gullewa Local Board of Health, shall pay the said Board One shilling (1s.) per week towards the proper maintenance of the sanitary condition of the district.

5. The duties of the Health Inspector shall be to make himself thoroughly acquainted with the Health Act at present in force, and to carry out its provisions under instructions from the Board; to visit occasionally-not less than once a month—the various portions of the Board's district, and, if necessary, give his advice or instructions to occupiers of premises as to the abatement or prevention of nuisances or removal of offensive matter; to keep a record of all such instructions given to abate nuisances, etc.; and to furnish the Board at each (fortnightly?) meeting with a written report of all such nuisances abated and the general sanitary state of the district.

He shall immediately communicate to the Medical Health Officer whenever it appears to him that the intervention of that officer is necessary in consequence of the existence of any nuisance injurious to health; and he shall attend to the instructions of the Medical Health Officer with respect to any measures which can be lawfully taken by him for preventing the spread of any infectious or contagious disease.

6. It is the duty of the Medical Health Officer to superintend the application of all sanitary measures, especially those ordered by the Board, and to advise the Board generally on all such matters.

The Medical Health Officer shall make frequent examinations of the district, and see that the duties of the Inspector are efficiently performed, and report any neglect of this officer.

He is to inspect premises that may be reported to him, or that he may have reason to believe are in a filthy or unwholesome condition; to examine premises where any process or manufacture causing effluvia is carried on, and, if necessary, report the same to the Board. He is also to in the carrying out of the Act referring to the sale of un wholesome food; and on all occasions to give the Board the benefit of his experience and skill.

He is to report to the Board with the least possible delay the appearance in the district of any epidemic, endemic or contagious disease, or any indications thereof, or any occurrence or circumstances affecting or likely to affect the public health; and he is to assist in carrying out and enforcing the necessary measures for mitigating, as far as possible, and preventing and checking the spread of epidemic and other diseases.

He is to furnish the Board during the months of January and July in each year with a report on the health, cleanliness, and general sanitary state of the district for the preceding six months, and at such other times as may be considered necessary by the Board.

7. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other premises shall be kept and maintained in such sanitary condition as shall satisfy the Inspector, and all orders given by the Inspector for the removal or abatement of any nuisance shall be complied with by the owner, occupier, or agent of the premises on which the nuisance is located.

8. All dwellings, shops, stores, tenements, hotels, offices, hospitals, or other premises shall be provided by the owner, substantially constructed closets, each closet to be fitted with a pan, bucket, or other receptacle, as may be ordered by the Board; and all such pans, buckets, or as the case may be, shall be emptied at least once a week, or oftener if required by the Inspector; and any person refusing or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws.

9. Every pan, bucket, or other receptacle for night-soil shall be free from leakage, and must be to the approval of the Inspector.

10. Any person who shall deposit broken glass, empty bottles, or tins, or other rubbish in any street or other place within the Board's district other than those places set apart for that purpose shall, on conviction thereof, in addition to the expense of removing the same, be subject also to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings.

11. No person shall burn or destroy any rubbish, offal, manure, or other offensive substance within the limits of the district or closely adjacent thereto, if such burning or destroyal creates or is likely to create a nuisance, except in such cases as, in the opinion of the Inspector or any member of the Board, any rubbish may, under certain conditions, be burnt, when such Inspector or member of the Board may give permission, verbally or otherwise, for such rubbish, offal, manure, etc., to be burnt.

12. In the event of any death or accident necessitating the slaughter of any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals within the limits of the Board's district, the carcase of such animal shall be removed to a safe distance beyond the limits of the district, and thoroughly burned and destroyed, to the satisfaction of the Inspector or any member of the Board, by the owner or person in charge of such horses, cattle, sheep, or as the case may be.

13. This Board may from time to time appoint any place or places within its district for the reception of nightsoil, manure, offal, or any rubbish or offensive matter, or may at any time cancel or vary such appointment; and the Inspector shall at all times have free access and admission to such places.

14. Whenever in these By-laws any act, deed, or thing is directed to be done, or any act, deed, or thing is prohibited from being done, any person who shall not comply with, do, or cause to be done or performed, or refrain from doing, or prevent being done any act, deed, or thing, shall be guilty of an offence against these By-laws, and in de-termining the responsibility of the person or persons against whom any action may be taken under these Bylaws, it shall be necessary alone to prove that such person or persons is the occupier, or are the occupiers of the premises whereon the offence is committed.

15. In case of any breach, non-observance, or non-performance of any of the foregoing By-laws, the person or persons guilty of such breach, non-observance, or non-performance of these By-laws shall, on conviction before any Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a sum not less than Five shillings nor more than Ten pounds.

16. All penalties recoverable under these By-laws shall be applied in the manner directed by Section 246 of the Public Health Act, 1898 (62 Vict., No. 24). W. J. GILBERT,

### Municipal By-Laws.

Colonial Secretary's Office,  $\frac{7}{9}\frac{7}{9}$ Perth, 2nd May, 1899. IS Excellency the Governor, by his Deputy, in Executive Council, has been pleased to con-firm the By-laws made by the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton with regard to the

BY-LAWS for the general control and management of the old Jetty at Geraldton (hereafter called the "Esplanade Pier"), a place of recreation the control and management of of which is vested in the Geraldton Municipal Council (59 Vict., No. 10, Sec. 99, Sub-sec. 22).

The Jetty shall be called the "Esplanade Pier." 1.

2. The Council reserves the right to let the Pier, and may make a charge or permit a charge to be made for admission.

The Pier shall be used for the purpose of pleasure 3. and recreation only.

No person shall be allowed to fish from any part of the Pier.

5. No person shall land fish on the Pier from any boat or other craft.

6. No person shall place any boat on the Pier for the purpose of cleaning, painting, or otherwise repairing the same.

7. No bathing shall be allowed from the Pier between the hours of 8 o'clock a.m. and sunset. 8. No horse or vehicle shall be allowed on the Pier,

except perambulators and fire engines. No person shall create any disturbance or commit any 9.

nuisance on the Pier.

10. No intoxicated person shall come on the Pier. 11. No child under the age of seven years shall go on the Pier unless accompanied by his or her parent or guardian.

12. No hand shall play, or other performance take place, or meeting be held on the Pier without the written permission of the Mayor or Council.

13. Any person wilfully damaging any part of the Pier shall be liable to a penalty, in addition to the payment of the costs incurred in the repair of such damage.

14. Any person committing any breach of any of these By-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds sterling.

15. In these By-laws the word "Pier" shall mean the Esplanade Pier, the word "Council" shall mean the Geraldton Municipal Council, and the word "Mayor" the Mayor of the Geraldton Municipal Council.

The Police authorities and the officers of the Council shall be at all times empowered to enforce these By-laws. Passed by the Council of the Municipality of Geraldton

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations under Sections 153 and 161 of "The Land Act, 1898," for the leasing of any Town or Suburban Lands which may be declared open for selection as Residential Lots :---

1. An application for a lease of town or suburban land declared open for selection as a Residential Lot shall be made in the form of Schedule "A."

2. The applicant shall be a male person above the age of 18 years, not being an Asiatic or African alien.

3. Applications shall be made to the Minister for Lands, but shall be lodged at the office of the Land Agent of the District within which the land is situate, or in case the land is situate within a Goldfield, then at the office of the Warden of such Goldfield, and shall be transmitted to the Minister by the Land Agent or Warden with his recommendation thereon.

4. Applications shall take priority in accordance with the provisions of Sections 17 and 18 of "The Land Act, 1898."

5. Every application shall set forth the number, position, and area of the Lot applied for, and shall be accompanied by a statutory declaration in the form of Schedule "B."

6. A fee of 10s. shall be payable with every application.

7. The Land Agent or Warden shall forward the application, with his recommendation thereon, to the Minister forthwith after the receipt thereof; and the Land Agent or Warden may, if he shall think fit under special circumstances, give to the applicant a conditional approval in the form of Schedule "C," which shall entitle the applicant to occupy the lot applied for, subject to these Regulations, pending the granting or refusal of the lease.

8. On an application being approved by the Minister, a lease shall be granted in the form of Schedule "D."

9. Every lease shall be limited to the natura surface of the land demised, and of so much of the land below the natural surface to a depth of 40 feet.

10. Every lease shall be granted for a term not to exceed 21 years, at the rent of 10s. per annum, payable in advance, the first payment to be made with the application, and every subsequent payment to become due on the 1st day of January in each succeeding year, and if default in payment thereof shall continue after the 1st day of March in any year the lease shall thereupon become forfeited.

11. Every Residential Lot leased under these Regulations shall be used as the habitual abode of the lessee, or some member of his family, for at least six months in every year, and shall not be used for any business purpose, or for any purpose other than that of residence.

12. Any Residential Lot leased, or agreed to be leased, under these Regulations, or any portion thereof, may be resumed by the Governor for mining purposes or for any public purpose, at three months' notice to the lessee, published in the *Government Gazette*; and immediately after the expiration of such three months, all the estate and interest of the lessee in the land demised, or the portion resumed, as the case may be, shall cease and determine as if the lease had never been granted : Provided that, on any such resumption, the lessee shall be entitled to receive from the Minister for Lands the fair value of any improvements existing on the said land, to be ascertained, in the absence of agreement, by one competent person to be appointed by the lessee and one by the Minister for Lands; any difference of opinion between the said valuers to be determined by the Resident Magistrate of the District or Warden of the Goldfield within which the land is situate acting as umpire.

13. In case of the refusal by the Minister of any application, notice thereof shall be given to the applicant by letter sent by post to the address given in the application, and the fee paid on the application and the deposit of rent shall thereupon be returned to the applicant on demand.

14. No person shall hold any Residential Lot within the distance of two miles from any other Residential Lot held by him.

15. No lessee shall transfer or underlet the premises demised by any lease, or any part thereof, except with the consent of the Minister in writing first obtained, after production by the lessee of the lease, and a statutory declaration by the transferee in the form of Schedule "B," and on payment of a fee of 5s.

### The Stock Diseases Act, 1895.

MAY 5, 1899.7

#### Regulations.

#### Department of Lands and Surveys, Perth. 15th December, 1898.

II IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following additional Regulations under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

### GEO. THROSSELL,

### Commissioner of Crown Lands.

1. No cattle shall be allowed to leave the East Kimberley Quarantine Area except at the Port of Wyndham.

2. All cattle leaving the East Kimberley Quarantine Area for any other part of the Colony of Western Australia shall be shipped direct to a spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, situated 12 chains South-Eastward from Robb's Jetty, where, on landing, they shall be deemed to be quarantined until slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as directed, in writing, by an Inspector of Stock.

3. Vessels engaged in the shipment of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area to the spot opposite to Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after the landing of the cattle.

4. Cattle may only be removed from Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, on the written permit of an Inspector of Stock that such cattle are apparently clean, and such cattle shall be forwarded in trucks by rail direct to such place on the Eastern Goldfields as shall be specified in the permit, where they shall remain in quarantine until slaughtered, and the trucks used for the carriage of such stock shall be thoroughly disinfected with steam immediately after use.

5. All expenses in connection with the disinfection of vessels and railway trucks used in the conveyance of cattle from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area and Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine areas and all expenses incidental to the quarantining of such cattle shall be borne by the owners of such cattle, and all disinfections shall be carried out to the satisfaction of an Inspector of Stock.

6. All hides and skins removed from cattle slaughtered within the East Kimberley Quarantine Area Reserve 6320, Owen's Anchorage, or any other temporarily-proclaimed quarantine area to which East Kimberley cattle may be removed, on the permit of an Inspector of Stock, shall not be removed from any of the said quarantine areas unless the said hides or skins have been treated and disinfected, as follows:—

- (1.) The hides or skins shall be fully opened out and laid down one on top of the other with the hair or outer side lowermost on a properly prepared floor of concrete or other impervious substance on which a layer of salt has been spread.
- (2.) The inside of the hides or skins shall be covered with strong, coarse, dry salt, to the extent on an average of not less than 12lb. to each hide, and they shall be built up and salted in this way till a stack is formed from which the brine is allowed to drain freely off.
- (3.) The hides or skins shall remain in the stack for not less than seven days.

(4.) When salted each of the hides or skins shall be turned in from the head, then from the butt, and then folded up so as that the salt shall be retained and every part of them shall come in contact with it

The hides or skins shall remain on the saltingfloor until an Inspector of Stock has certified in writing that the above requirements have been complied with.

7. All imported stock carried in vessels which at any time after these Regulations shall come into force shall have been employed during the next preceding three months in the East Kimberley cattle trade shall be subject to the Regulations applicable to cattle shipped from the East Kimberley Quarantine Area, in lieu of the declaration and certificate required under Sections 12 and 13 under "The Stock Diseases Act, 1895."

8. Every person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £500.

#### Interpretation Clauses.

- "East Kimberley Quarantine Area" shall mean all that portion of the Kimberley District East of the 127th meridian of longitude.
- "Inspector of Stock" shall mean the Chief Inspector of Stock, and every Inspector appointed under the provisions of this Act or any person authorised by the Government to act as an Inspector.
- "Quarantine" shall mean the complete isolation of cattle from all other stock.
- "Owner" shall mean any owner or consignee, whether joint or sole, superintendent, or person in possession or charge of stock, or any agent or any such owner.

"Vessel" shall mean all steam or sailing boats

"Cattle" shall mean any bull, cow, ox, steer, heifer, or calf, or the carcase, or any portion of the carcase thereof, respectively.

- 1. "To prescribe limits in or about the mouth of, or within any river, creek, stream, estuary, or other inlet of the sea within which it shall not be lawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine."
- 2. "To determine the times and seasons at which the taking of any species of fish shall commence and cease."
- "And to impose such reasonable penalties, not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and forfeitures, as the Governor in Council may think fit, for any breach of such Regulations:"

His Excellency the Governor in Council does, by this Regulation, declare it to be unlawful for any person to fish by means of any net or fixed engine, during a period of four calendar months in each and every year, commencing on the first day of March, in that portion of Peel's Inlet described hereunder :—

#### No. 3 Bank.

IS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, by his Deputy, has been pleased to approve of the following By-laws under Section 14 of "The Cemeteries Act, 1897" (61st Vict., No. 23), for the management of the Karrakatta General Cemetery (Reserve  $\frac{\Lambda}{745}$ ).

### R. CECIL CLIFTON,

By virtue of all powers in that behalf vested in the Trustees of the Karrakatta General Cemetery, the said Trustees make the following By-laws :---

1. All fees and charges payable to the Trustees, as set forth in the Schedule A, shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned.

2. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the Cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule B. Upon such application being approved by the Trustees, and upon payment of the prescribed fees, they shall cause to be issued to the person so applying an "Order for Burial," in the form contained in the Schedule C.

3. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the Trustees in such time as to allow at least five working hours' notice being given to the Superintendent at the Cemetery prior to the time fixed for burial. An extra charge shall be made for applications within such time. No free interment shall be allowed, unless the application, together with the Magistrate's order therefor, be handed in at the office in such time as to allow of at least six working hours' notice being given as above.

4. The Trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves, or graves to be re-opened as and when required.

5. Before any interment is allowed, the "Order for Burial" shall be handed to and retained by the Superintendent.

6. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. No coffin not complying with this By-law shall be admitted to or be interred in the cemetery.

7. Every grave shall be at least 7ft. deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground.

8. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.

9. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the Cemetery, nor shall any coffin be allowed to enter the Cemetery, unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a Coroner's order for burial is handed to the Superintendent, at the latest, upon the funeral entering the Cemetery. The certificate will be retained, but the Coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.

10. Unless otherwise ordered the principal entrance to the cemetery shall be open daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. during the remaining months of the year.

11. The hours for burial shall be as follows :----

1st September to 30th April	Week days, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 5 p.m.
lst May to 31st August	Week days, from 8 a.m. to 4 <sup>:</sup> 30 p.m. Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4 <sup>:</sup> 30 p.m.

and no burial shall be allowed to take place, nor any coffin allowed to enter the Cemetery at any other hour except by written permission of the Trustees.

12. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the Cemetery gates, and such time shall be rigidly and punctually observed.

13. No hearse, mourning coach, or other vehicle shall enter the Cemetery or proceed except at and by such roads as directed by the Superintendent or other officer of the Trustees from time to time. Any driver or other person failing or neglecting to observe such directions may be forthwith expelled from the Cemetery.

14. Children under the age of ten years entering the Cemetery must be in charge of some responsible person.

15. Smoking shall not be allowed within the Cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

16. No dogs shall be admitted into the Cemetery, and any found there shall be liable to be destroyed.

17. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower, border, or any erection, or in any way infringing these By-laws, shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

18. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the Cemetery any trade, business, or calling, either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertisement whatsoever, and any person infringing this By-law shall be expelled from the Cemetery.

19. No person employed by or under the Trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever, nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the Cemetery other than the remuneration he receives from the Trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity, or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.

20. Subject to the By-laws, the Superintendent shall exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the Cemetery, including the conduct of all funerals and interments within the Cemetery.

21. Any person requiring an "Exclusive Right of Burial" in any part of the Cemetery shall apply to the Trustees, in writing, specifying the location of the grave, and whether it is proposed to erect a brick grave or vault, and in such case submitting plans and specifications of the proposed work. Such application shall also state the names of any already deceased persons whose remains it is proposed to inter therein. 22. Upon being satisfied of the matters aforesaid, and of the suitability of the said work, plans, and specifications, the Trustees may authorise the construction and erection thereof, or, if no work is to be done, may issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

23. Upon the completion of the work aforesaid, the Trustees may, if and when such work is done to their complete satisfaction, issue a "Grant" in the Form "E" in the Schedule.

24. Every such Grant shall be subject to the By-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the "Order for Burial" aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the written consent of the Trustees.

25. Every coffin placed in any such bricked grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered with a slab of stone, slate, or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the Trustees.

26. If application be made for an "Order for Burial" in any grave or vault of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced.

27. Any person desiring to place or erect any monument, tombstone, or enclosure in any part of the Cemetery must first obtain the written consent and approval of the Trustees, and otherwise comply with Section 23 of the Act.

28. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which, if required by the Trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the grave.

29. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent or other officer appointed by the Trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the contractor for the erection.

30. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the Cemetery by the person causing the same.

31. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing any work within the Cemetery, deposit with the Secretary to the Trustees the sum of 10s., which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding By-laws are not complied with to the satisfaction of the Superintendent.

32. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as possible, be prepared before being taken to the Cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at such entrance as the Superintendent shall direct, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in. broad shall be permitted to enter the Cemetery.

33. No catacomb shall be allowed.

34. Subject to the approval of the Trustees, each applicant for an "Order for Burial" shall, within three months from date of the application, enclose the grave mentioned in such application with a kerbing of tiles, slate, or stone, and shall cause to be placed thereon a number-plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. No mounds shall be allowed.

35. No wooden fence, railing, cross, or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.

36. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the Superintendent.

37. All workmen, whether employed by the Trustees or by any other person, shall at all times, whilst within the boundaries of the Cemetery, be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workman permitting any breach of these Regulations and Bylaws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said Superintendent, shall be removable from the Cemetery.

38. Licenses for grave dressing or decorating may be issued by the Trustees in the form contained in Schedule G; such licenses to be renewed annually in the month of January.

39. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules :----

- (a.) No rubbish, soil, sand, or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
- (b.) No sand, soil, or loam shall be taken from any portion of the Cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the Superintendent.
- (c.) The dressing of all graves and the wheeling and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the Superintendent.
- (d.) Work in all cases to be carried on with due despatch, and only during regulation hours.

40. In every case where the funeral train from Roe Street platform, Perth, is availed of, the coffin shall be placed in the Funeral Car provided for that purpose by the Undertaker, and all railway charges paid by him.

The train will be met at Karrakatta Station by the Board's Coffin Car and employés, and the coffin will be borne to the assigned grave by them at the expense of the Board.

41. The Undertaker or any one of his assistants shall be allowed to accompany the Funeral Train and enter the Cemetery with the funeral for the purpose of discharging the usual duties of an Undertaker.

42. Save as otherwise provided in the last preceding Regulation, no Undertaker, nor any assistant or servant of any Undertaker, shall be allowed in the said train, or to enter the said Cemetery, or in any other manner be connected with the funeral after the coffin has been deposited in the Funeral Car at the Roe Street platform as aforesaid.

43. Prior to conducting any interment within the Cemetery or making use of the Cemetery for any purpose connected with interments every Undertaker shall pay to the Trustees an annual fee of  $\pounds 2$  2s., and shall at the time of making such payment give his assent in writing to such conditions as the Trustees may deem fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a "Permit," to hold good until the first day of January following, and unless in the possession of such a "Permit" no Undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the Cemetery.

The foregoing By-laws, with the accompanying Schedules, were duly framed and presented to a meeting of the Board of Trustees held at their office on Monday, the 16th day of January, 1899, and adopted.

The mean barometer at Perth was one of the lowest on record, and throughout the Colony South of the latitude of Geraldton the mean readings of the barometers were lower than for previous years. At the Perth Gardens the mean maximum day temperature was  $2^{\circ}5$  below the average, and the mean minimum night temperature  $1^{\circ}4$  above. The rainfall, 332 points, is also considerably in excess of the average, 179 points, and on only three occasions has this been exceeded, viz.—in 1882, 497 points; 1889, 399 points; and in 1893, 363 points. The nights inland between Karridale and the Coolgardie Goldfields have been quite cold, as a glance at the following table will show :-






